Longchamp's punters were out in force yesterday, and while odds of 3-10 on **Zarkava (Ire)** (Zamindar) looked skinny, His Highness the Aga Khan's homebred

### FLYING FALCO

It had been a long wait for the Wertheimer family, but Falco (Pivotal {GB}) ended the stable's 14-year drought in Longchamp's G1 Poule d'Essai des Poulains as he

sprang a 21-1 upset yesterday. In a renewal which was inevitably affected by the draw, the homebred stole a march on the late closers Rio de la Plata (Rahy) and River Proud (Proud Citizen) to score by three lengths and a short head, respectively. In doing so, he

recorded a fifth French 2000 Guineas win for the blue-and-white silks, but the first since Green Tune's triumph in 1994. For trainer Carlos Laffon-Parias, it represented a first victory in the mile Classic. "This is not a total surprise to me, as I have always thought highly of him," he said. "Even though this was a big jump up in class, I was quite confident he would run a big race." Cont. p2

# Poule d'Essai des Pouliches cont. A Star in the Making...

Zarkava earned an instant **O "TDN Rising Star"** tag when winning the first of her three starts over this track and trip in September before displaying devastat-

ing acceleration to best Conference Call (Anabaa) by 2 1/2 lengths in the G1 Prix Marcel Boussac on Arc day. It was the same margin back to that rival in the Prix de la Grotte, and her ability to handle deep ground on that occasion removed a potential chink in her armor. Settled towards the rear early by a confident Christophe

Soumillon yesterday, she was steadied on the final turn before being asked to take closer order when straightened up. She arrived wide of Goldikova and Olivier Peslier with 1 1/2 furlongs remaining, and her turn of foot overpowered that rival. Zarkava was allowed to coast to the line and still set a new race record. "She has progressed easily and I am sure she will stay further, which is also suggested by the way she won today," Alain de Royer-Dupre remarked. "The G1 Prix de Diane [Chantilly, June 8] will probably be next." His Highness the Aga Khan added, "It is such a thrill for the breeding operation, as she descends from the only daughter of Petite Etoile to stand at stud and has brought the family back again. I was never worried at any stage today, as the field was strung out by the fast pace and I knew she had plenty of racing room--she quickened so brilliantly." The Wertheimers' Racing Manager Pierre-Yves Bureau said of the runner-up, "She showed her true quality on suitable ground today and will follow the normal path for three-year-old miling fillies, so it will be the G2 Prix de Sandringham [at Chantilly June 1] next followed by the G1 Prix d'Astarte [at Deauville Aug. 3]." Falco lacked the solid form credentials of many of his rivals beforehand and had just one win to his name in a course-and-distance conditions event on his latest start Apr. 17. He had previously been a neck runner-up to Hello Morning (Fr) at Chantilly in September and 3/4-of-a-length second to Trincot (Fr) on his three-year-old bow at Compiegne Mar. 25. Breaking well under Olivier Peslier, he was kept wide and out of trouble in sixth early as the Ballydoyle rabbits Lucifer Sam (Storm Cat) and One Great Cat (Storm Cat) set a searching gallop. Moving up smoothly to take over approaching the quarter pole, the bay opened up and was beyond recall as Frankie Dettori emerged from the pack to chase on Rio de le Plata, and River Proud flew at the death. # Poule d'Essai des Poulains cont. On to the French Derby?

Winning trainer Carlos Laffon-Parias said, "I only realised late on that I had to train him pretty hard, and that is probably why he was beaten first time this season, but I was impressed with him last time. He will be in all the major races, but I am confident he stays, so he might run in the G1 Prix du Jockey-Club [French Derby at Chantilly June 1] or stay at a mile for the G1 St James's Palace S. [at Royal Ascot June 17]." River Proud was originally slated to break from post 14, but became upset after being loaded into the gate and broke his stall; he had to be moved and was forced to exit from the widest box in 20. The bay still had only one rival behind at the top of the straight before making an eyecatching rush to almost wrest second. Godolphin were not too downcast with the performance of Rio de la Plata, who was at an early disadvantage from his wide draw in 16. "Rio de la Plata ran very well to finish second--the draw was the excuse as he had a bad position in the stalls," Saeed bin Suroor said. "He is entered in all the top races over a variety of distances and we will see how he comes out of this race before deciding what comes next." Racing Manager Simon Crisford added, "All options are open and we are in no rush. We are likely to make a decision in the next couple of weeks." Paul Cole was another wondering what might have been had River Proud not been forced to race from a wider stall. "You have to behave in the stalls and he hasn't, which has probably cost him the French 2000 Guineas," he told PA Sport. "They moved him from stall 14 to stall 20, so he was on the wide outside. He's never been good in the stalls and has had to come from almost last position entering the straight. We've never had this sort of encouragement from him and he made up half a furlong very easily. He isn't an easy horse, but he is very talented."



A couple of backhanders thereafter were enough persuasion for him to run on stoutly and come six lengths clear at the post for an impressive win. A satisfied Dermot Weld said, "He's had a bit of a hold up at home, but has really come to himself in the last few weeks and I thought he was capable of winning." Casual Conquest holds entries in the French and Irish Derbies, but not at Epsom, and the master of Rosewell House reflected, "It's a pity the entry fee is too high for Epsom, but we'll go back and have a talk with the owner, although I imagine the [G1] Prix du Jockey-Club [at Chantilly June 1] is the likely option." 


# Million-Dollar Delivery...

The once-raced maiden Million Dollar Run (Tejano Run) was giving the field plenty of experience, but belied her lifetime record and charged home a muchthe-best victress in the GIII Railbird S. at Hollywood. A homebred of Jeff Nielsen's Everest Stables, Million Dollar Run was 9-2 as part of an entry when she ran second by a neck in her debut at Santa Anita Mar. 30. It was a good effort, but the 74 Beyer she earned that day seemed to indicate she was in way over her head in this field, which included the previously unbeaten winner of the GIII Santa Paula S., Lethal Heat (Unusual Heat). Million Dollar Run's task got a bit easier when that foe stumbled badly at the break, but she nonetheless had to fight hard for the win, pressing the pace through a half in :44 2/5 before kicking clear down the lane. "She ran so good [in her debut] and she has been training so good," said winning conditioner Marcelo Polanco about his and Nielson's decision to run. "Every single thing she did from the last race to this one came out perfect." Of future plans, he added, "We're going to be taking it day by day. The main thing is for her to come out of this sound."

The rags-to-riches story of My List just keeps on getting better. The four-year-old, purchased by trainer Nick Gonzalez for just \$1,200 as a yearling and later sold to Tucci Stables, was looking to take her third straight and second of 2008 as the crowd's second choice. That dark bay settled at the back of the pack, but launched a five-wide move in the lane and overtook the game 9-1 outsider One Across in deep stretch. Favored Street Sounds was a no-excuse third. My List came into her own at the end of 2007, when the miss, having won an \$80,000 claimer two months earlier, captured her first stakes as a 7-1 shot in the sevenfurlong Bessarabian S. at Woodbine Nov. 25. She was 5-1 when she posted the mild upset over Bear Now in her seasonal debut, the six-furlong GIII Whimsical S. Apr. 20, and proved with this score she is one of the better sprinting fillies in Canada. Her immediate future might include a stretch-out, however. "There's not another filly and mare sprint [for American-breds] until September," explained her trainer. "There's the Hill 'N' Dale S. coming up going 1 1/16 miles. We might try it." CURLIN NOMINATED TO ARC Reigning Horse of the Year and recent G1 Dubai World Cup hero Curlin (Smart Strike) has been nominated to Europe's most prestigious turf race, the G1 Qatar Prix de l'Arc de

Triomphe, run this year at Longchamp on Sunday, Oct. 5. What are some positive steps racing should take in the wake of the Eight Belles tragedy, both for the safety of the horses and in light of the mounting public criticism of the sport?

### STUART FITZGIBBON, CASTLETON LYONS

Numerous recent commentators have highlighted the dangers that our business and sport faces. I agree that

cohesion is missing from this industry and I speak as someone who has experienced this industry in Europe and the USA. As has been so often stated, we have no one body which can represent our interests in a unified way. Unified, progressive and technologically competent leadership are sorely needed by our industry in our new culture of 'YouTube,' especially as the various message blogs have a tendency to escalate



and exaggerate many issues that affect people around the world. We need to make industry-wide changes, and we need to be able to provide educational responses that effectively counter misconceptions and attacks.

There have been problems in England over the years with animal cruelty activists, principally in National Hunt racing, and the industry there reacted in a positive fashion. The English Grand National, which is a steeple chase viewed by a huge non-horse public (like the Kentucky Derby), used to have a certain fatality level which was ultimately deemed unacceptable to both serious and casual race fans alike. The authorities in England reacted by making this great race a lot safer by reducing the amount of runners and altering the size and angles of the fences. This has resulted in a relatively safe race which currently encounters only limited resistance from PETA-like groups. The key factor here is that responsive action was taken.

In the principal racing countries of Europe, there is a much more unified approach to decision-making and problem-solving. In the USA, there appear to be 50 states that run their own shows in such a way that tracks can do what they like, and medication rules are a constant bone of contention. In Ireland and England, an independent, professional person inspects the race tracks to deem if they are fit for racing and all must abide by their rules. The constant speed emphasis which track owners are obsessed with here in the U.S. is a worry, especially as independent oversight is non existent. Racetrack officials would probably have their tracks slowed down in certain European jurisdictions. I am not saying that a hard fast track is the only cause of breakdowns, but it surely must be a contributing factor.

There are also some very stringent whip rules in Europe which, although varying somewhat between countries, have reduced cruelty accusations toward jockeys riding today. Each European unified authority sets nationwide rules in a professional manner. The Turf Club of Ireland and the Jockey Club of Britain are actively involved in protecting the integrity of the sport and liaise very closely with one another. This does not make for a perfect world by any means, but it does make life better for participants in the sport. In fact, the British authorities have fought and lost many legal cases where industry personnel have been accused of 'stopping' races, but they still have the mandate to carry on with their duties of integrity protection.

A nationwide professional body needs to take control of racing in the USA that has the ability to make rules and regulations that apply in all states, and more importantly be given the mandate and resources to actually carry out this function. (The various regulatory bodies in Europe like the Irish Turf Club, English Jockey Club and Weatherbys have operated very effectively for a couple of centuries and survived because of their professionalism and ability to change and move with the times. The reader will have to make up their own mind whether or not this applies to the American Jockey Club.)

One of the reasons put forward by many experts as to the relative success and prosperity of the American nation is the fact that it is one big homogenous market of people and resources. I am afraid to admit that this supposed advantage has been eroded in the horse industry by a lack of leadership and cohesion. I am not sure if we have time for the huge overhaul that is needed, but we do have many interest groups that now need to stand up to the plate.

# KRIS STUEBS, KRIS S. BLOODSTOCK

Like many of us, I watched the Kentucky Derby amazed by what Eight Belles accomplished in running

second to Big Brown. However, moments later, I was trying to explain, like so many others, that the way the ambulance drivers pulled their vehicles up around the filly was not a positive sign for her. Since then, I have had friends not in the sport ask me a laundry list of questions about racing. And as I have in the



past, I go down the list of standard answers defending our sport. It was after reading the story by Bill Finley in the *TDN* last Wednesday, and following up with the provided links, that I felt it necessary to speak out.

First of all, it became alarmingly evident by the number of views of the raw footage of Eight Belles actually breaking down on You Tube that we can't let ourselves be driven by a bunch of tragedy hungry, race car accident types who delight in seeing horrible events like this happen. We need to face the troubles in this business for our own good and the good of honest horse lovers. The death of Eight Belles has obviously further damaged the reputation of the sport of horse racing and it will take far more than a Triple Crown winner to resurrect it. But as responsible participants in this sport we need to make an effort to improve safety for both the horses and the riders.

# 1) Mandate Uniform Natural Surfaces (dirt and turf)

First, there has been a lot of talk about changing to synthetic surfaces. I will be quick to say I am not "all in" on this idea. Obviously, there are very talented equine athletes that hate the surface, and there are very talented athletes that relish it. I believe that fact alone, aside from the overall safety of the surface, is enough to realize that synthetic is here to stay. However, the comment from Churchill Downs's track superintendent that he could not remember a Derby in over 40 years marred by such a breakdown is enough to investigate the actual safety of some natural surfaces over others, both dirt and turf. I believe the danger may lie in the variability of surfaces from track to track. Trainers have complained for years of the surfaces at many tracks around the country while praising the safety of others. Perhaps we should mandate uniform tracks with the same bases, the same dirt mixtures, as well as the same turf bases and turf types. Obviously this would involve a large investment and require a professional representing the industry willing to travel from track to track to oversee surface maintenance, but when you consider the cost of installing synthetic, maybe it's a reasonable idea.

# 2) Form a National Horse Racing Authority and Hire a Top Public Relations Officer

A National Racing Authority could oversee state racing authorities and the uniformity and safety of racing surfaces around the country. In addition, a National Racing Authority could employ a PR officer with the knowledge of the industry and the media to help control not only the negative stories like Eight Belles, but also so many of the positive stories that are buried on the occasional local newspaper page or hidden in the pages of lightly circulated magazines.

# 3) Limit the Use of the Whip--Mandate "In The Clear" and "Out of Contention" Rules

As a rider myself, I am not ignorant enough to say that there is not use for a whip when riding a horse. When used properly, obviously the whip is an honest tool for successful communication between horse and rider. Watching Eight Belles, I am careful to criticize the rider as I don't think he was abusive in the stretch. However, I have a problem with race horses being hit in the stretch when they are obviously in the clear. Talented jockeys very often sail home on race horses using only hands and heels to win races with ease. Maybe racing authorities should consider implementing a rule in racing that would not allow use of the whip on horses "in the clear" (at least two lengths from other horses) that maintain their paths. In addition, once a horse is out of contention of any purse money, maybe there should be a ban whipping horses bringing up the back of the field.

# 4) X-ray Requirement

After the horrific breakdown of Go for Wand in the Breeders' Cup, there had been some talk of requiring horses competing in nationally televised races to have a set of X-rays taken within 24 hours of the race and approved by the track vet. Now, with the wide use of digital X-rays, this is not only possible, but very easily done. While most racehorses don't have "clean" X-rays and exhibit normal wear and tear from daily training, maybe the racing authorities should consider requiring any horse that is to run in a nationally televised event to submit a current (within 24 hours) set of X-rays to the track vet for approval prior to running.

# 5) Hire Additional Well-Qualified Track Vets

When Teuflesburg broke down at Keeneland last year just after (Dream of Angels) (suffered a fatal injury) in the paddock prior to the race, it became apparent that one track vet was insufficient to handle that tragedy. Tracks should be required to keep at least two vets on hand on race days, and these vets should not only be well-qualified, but well-paid.

### 6) An Anonymous Forum

Finally, I think many violations of the safety of either horse or rider are not reported in this business because whistle blowers fear the repercussion from a trainer or an owner. Also, it is possible that people do not know who to report things to. Sometimes it is only a groom who has knowledge of violations in this game. There needs to be a way to report people who break the rules and compromise the safety of horse, rider, groom or hotwalker. Maybe we need to consider creating an easily accessible independent panel of professionals to consider such reports. With the dawn of the internet and other technologies, not only is accessibility a "non-issue," but anonymity should be easily feasible as well. Shouldn't we have an open ear to hear of obvious safety violations?

### MRS. CARLTON COLE, OWNER

It seems to me that there are two things that need to be addressed for the safety of the horses, which is really the most important thing. I read an article about tiny fractures that horses may have that don't show up in a way that would make a horse seem unsound, but are detectable in X-rays. I think there should be, for seemingly sound horses, in major races or maybe even in all races, a pre-race leg and ankle screening for these tiny fractures. Conceivably, they currently go by unnoticed, but when a horse is under stress, or exhausted, and they take a bad step, one leg goes, and then as we saw in the Derby, the other leg goes. I don't think Eight Belles was in any pain beforehand, and it was as big a surprise to her as to anybody. I think a routine X-ray or imaging scan would be very helpful and could conceivably be done to screen out the horses with any probability of a problem. They would not be allowed to run until subsequent X-rays show healing has taken place. The other thing that I believe contributes to breakdowns is the whip. I think whipping a tired horse to make it go faster doesn't accomplish anything positive and it should be abolished. In real race riding, a rider knows how to strategize. If nobody has a whip, it's all egual and the best horse wins. Those are the two things I believe need to be done, and I think they would save a lot of horses.

### SANDY STUART, BLUEGRASS T'BRED SERVICES

Watching the heavy rainfall on Oaks day had me thinking of the various track maintenance strategies that could be implemented to change the course's play



for Derby day. That said, I'm sure Churchill aimed to protect their franchise by creating the safest possible surface for Derby day. This burden shouldn't be left to the track. It's important we eliminate harmful post-race speculation by having the NTRA commission a trackmaintenance agency responsible for the research and su-

pervision of track maintenance, as well as race-day media commentary regarding safety standards that have been addressed. This would be a good investment for the owners and breeders who fund the NTRA. I want to know that optimal decisions are being made for the utmost safety of the horses, the jockeys and the track superintendent who may face criticism for the condition and safety of the track. No matter the type of surface, dirt or synthetic, owners, breeders and track operators need to fund the NTRA's research and supervision, so to ensure the best possible situation for horses, fans and the betting public. Thank goodness states are currently working toward banning performance-enhancing drugs from racing. Hopefully, we will next hear that states will ban the use of a whip in racing! Are the benefits of its use enough to estrange the casual fan? I don't want to over burden our NTRA's current structure with such tall responsibilities; instead, I would encourage NTRA leaders to gather diverse groups of horsemen into specific committees aimed at addressing these topics and others.


### **DUKE BURRIS, OWNER**

We need to eliminate the use of all medications, including Salix, and go to the European model. Then horses will not win and breed on when they are not sound. I raced a filly, Lucky Spell, who ran 69 times, sometimes 10 days between races, and retired sound. She mostly raced on dirt on the hard and fast Southern California circuit. Her progeny raced on Salix. The most starts by those horses was 19. Then the next generation gets bute, injections of various types, Salix, and we get 10 starts. You can't tell me the vets have not caused many of the current problems.

### **ROB WHITELEY, LIBERATION FARM**

First of all, I suggest that everyone carefully re-read and digest the thoughtful Letters to the Editor written by Arthur Hancock and Brereton Jones in the May 8

and 9 editions of the TDN.
Arthur refers to our industry as a ship without a rudder that is destined for the rocks, unless we utilize the Horse Racing Act of 1978 and submit to federal legislation and oversight to stay on course. However, if the federal government becomes the captain of our ship, we might as well take three torpedoes in our hull right now and end our suffering.



It would be a disaster to have the Feds *initiate* legislation that tells us what to do and how to do it. If federal legislation becomes a part of our enterprise, it needs to come when we have cohesively organized ourselves to a point where we, not the federal government, are the initiators of specifically and narrowly crafted federal statutes that serve our purposes of standardizing racing rules and enforcing compliance by all industry factions. Brerie underlines the importance of unity if we are to avoid unwanted federal interference.

In Brerie's words, "Change can come, but it will only come as a result of a unified effort...racing must have a National Governing Body that oversees the enforcement of standard rules in every state [and I don't mean the Federal Government]." Whether or not we end up involving the federal government to achieve standardization and accomplish strategic compliance objectives, it is clear that we must quickly come together in a more unified way.

We horsemen are mostly independent minded and competitive people who like to do our own thing. Therefore, the idea of unity may seem alien or objectionable to many of us. But joining together in this time of crisis, with common goals and shared purposes, is essential to our being able to stay afloat, endure and prosper. These are not merely storm clouds that we are seeing all around us. This is a tempest, and the angry turbulence carries the potential to become "a perfect storm." In the midst of this dangerous volatility, the phrase, "United we stand, divided we fall," has never had more meaning for us than it does now.

So how do we accomplish cohesiveness and unification? The first step is fully recognizing and accepting that, without unity, we will continue to sink or be sunk. Simply put, therefore, we can choose to work together to stay afloat, or we can all sink together.

The second step in achieving unity requires abandoning our business-as-usual "fiefdom model," whereby each entity operates as an independent special interest group, merely looking after its own territory or revenue without collaborating cooperatively or making sacrifices for the common good.

The third step is to establish a leadership entity or consortium (i.e., Brerie's "National Governing Body") that has our full support in creating and implementing standardized rules, practices and commonly held strategic objectives in all jurisdictions, nation-wide. Using Arthur's nautical imagery, accomplishing our goals requires exerting the authority and efficiency that comes from having one captain and one agenda. Once we have a captain, the rest of us, in the interest of self preservation, need to jump on board and join ranks as cooperative shipmates. If we need a motivating wind at our back, it should be the obvious fact that our ship is at grave risk, and the knowledge that when our ship goes down, we all go down.

Stating what is now clear to everyone, this is a special time, a time of crisis. We have reached a tipping point whereby our steadily sinking ship has opened too many gaping holes beneath the water line and the turbulent waves around us give ominous counterpoint to the unsettled horizon. Simply delivering the message that, "We have been studying the problems and will continue to do so," is inadequate. This is a time for action--the most effective and compelling action: direct, practical, collective, coordinated and focused action. Three months from now, our critics are not going to ask us what we think. They are going to ask us what we've done.

So, what do we need to do, other than join together with a cooperative spirit? Very simply, our immediate focus and use of funds should go toward addressing public perception and giving the public what it wants. The public wants three things: (1) drug-free racing; (2) safer track surfaces; and (3) no whipping. We can deliver all three, and it is to our shame that we haven't given them all three long ago, without them asking. OK, so some of the unreasonable zealots and their shrill, strident and generally poorly informed voices of outrage are offensive to our ears. But their message hits the mark. To use a Yogi-ism, "We must not forget what we must have forgotten." Somehow we have lost sight of the core maxim in our business: "We are also best served when we do right by the horse." Looking honestly into the mirror reveals that we must do much better by our horses and our fans.

Regarding drugs, the documented decline in average starts per horse is less likely a function of breeding practices than it is a function of our drug culture, the effects of drugs on horses, and the expedient substitution of drugs for proper training methods. Regarding track surfaces, we have done enough research to know that, despite guirks and foibles that still need to be addressed and fixed, synthetic tracks reduce catastrophic injuries. Regarding whips, large numbers of fans and onlookers, and a cross-section of seasoned horsemen, find it appalling to watch horses abused by harsh or excessive and often counter-productive whipping in nearly every race. Plain and simple, we can repair a lot of damage and appease our angry national audience by taking most drugs out of the racing barns and relying on basic horsemanship rather than veterinarians, installing synthetic tracks in every jurisdiction, and placing whips in jockeys' hands for safety purposes only. This is not just liberal, soft-hearted talk. This is hard-nosed logic and practical common sense. The formula is not complicated. When we properly serve and care for the horse, we bring in new fans and keep the ones we've got; and when we satisfy the fans, we build our business and help ourselves.





Now, the biggest question of all: How do we get organized structurally to right our ship? Who do we look to for leadership? I have been struck by the number of people who have expressed to me the opinion that the people who have "led" us into our predicament cannot possibly lead us out. Many working people in the trenches think that many of our industry leaders are complacent, self-serving, unimaginative, behind the curve and generally ineffective, either because they are encapsulated and protected by their wealth, or because they are not significant stakeholders. I, however, am much more optimistic than that. I believe that some people can rise to the occasion in times of crisis, when at other times they may not. And I believe that there are capable leaders in our midst who may emerge and surprise us with their strength of leadership, if given the proper support and structure.

So what should that structure be? Ask yourself, who do we already pay significant money to that conducts legislative initiatives, has a national presence, a logo that looks similar to the NBA, NFL and MLB, and has the recognized name, *National Thoroughbred Racing Association*? No other entity is positioned as well as the NTRA to bring us all together as a unified industry.

I believe, therefore, that we should empower the NTRA with a mandate to create a leadership coalition that pulls together major industry entities under one banner for the purpose of establishing standardized policy and procedures, speaking with a single voice, and providing a steady hand at the helm to chart our ship's course going forward. Given our dire industry circumstances and the prospect of a perfect storm approaching, the TRA and member tracks, The Jockey Club, TOBA, sales companies, and major horsemen's groups should climb on board with a cooperative spirit as members of the ship's crew. In short, we need to provide the NTRA with a mandate and the necessary support to create a strong and unifying leadership group that can work quickly to raise all our boats.



Of the 255 weanlings catalogued yesterday, 202 sold for an aggregate of NZ\$2,531,950, representing an average of NZ\$12,534 and a clearance rate of 87.4 percent. With 188 of the total 252 weanlings catalogued last year selling for NZ\$2,335,150, turnover was up 8 percent with 143 weanlings still to come. New Zealand Bloodstock Marketing Manager Petrea Vela was confident that yesterday's results signalled the growing strength of New Zealand's local market. "In a weanling catalogue that was dominated by fillies, it was a clear sign of the strength of New Zealand domestic racing and breeding that we can generate such a healthy average and aggregate for the day and still record an 87-percent clearance rate," said Vela. "Traditionally, the pinhookers underpin this sale, but [during yesterday's session], not only were the pinhookers very active, they also faced stiff competition from a raft of local buyers looking for weanlings to retain, which is a great boost for the industry." The remaining weanlings--including two supplementary entries--will go under the hammer, beginning at 10 a.m. Monday, followed by yearlings, two-year-olds, unraced stock and racehorses, and the initial draft of the 300 broodmares. The remaining broodmares will be offered Tuesday, May 13, with bidding commencing at 10 a.m. For complete results, visit www.nzb.co.nz.
