EIGHT BELLES NECROPSY RESULTS RELEASED

A necropsy report released Thursday confirmed that GI Kentucky Derby runner-up Eight Belles (Unbridled's Song) suffered compound fractures of both legs at the fetlock joints, resulting in her death. The report, ordered by the Kentucky Horse Racing Authority (KHRA), found no pre-existing bone abnormalities, according to Dr. Lafe Nichols, chief state veterinarian. There was also no evidence of any disease or condition affecting the filly's cardiovascular and pulmonary systems or other major organs. Owner Rick Porter said that a preliminary report concluded no catastrophic heart attack or ailment. The post-mortem was performed at the Livestock Disease Diagnostic Center at the University of Kentucky. At a meeting to be held May 19, the KHRA will be asked by chairman Robert Beck Jr. to form a work group to study health and safety issues. "Nothing is more important to the racing industry than the safety of the competitors," said Lisa Underwood, executive director of the KHRA.

BEARER OF GLAD TIDINGS

🗘 "TDN Rising Star" 🗘 Tartan Bearer (Ire) (Spectrum {Ire}) swooped to conquer at 10-1 in York's G2 Dante S. yesterday which went some way towards clearing a murky Derby picture. Coming into the traditional trial as the lowest-rated by virtue of a sole success in a Leicester maiden Apr. 26, the Ballymacoll homebred bridged the gap to overcome Frozen Fire (Ger) (Montjeu {Ire}) and the 4-6 favorite Twice Over (GB) (Observatory {GB}) by a head and 2 1/2 lengths. "He had progressed a lot since Leicester and we felt we were entitled to come here," commented trainer Sir Michael Stoute following the chestnut's last-to-first success. "I was a little bit concerned that the ground would be quick enough for him, but he went over it well. He's a horse we've always loved, as he has a great temperament rather like [full-brother] Golan (Ire)." SPEED APLENTY IN REVIVED SPECIAL

There seems to be a common denominator in today's return to the stakes calendar of the GI Pimlico Special H. and that is speed. Nearly half of the nine horses entered is at their best when on or near the lead, which could set things up for a horse like Grasshopper (Dixie Union). He was beaten at odds-on in his last two, first by Circular Quay in the GII New Orleans H. at the Fair Grounds Mar. 8 and in the GIII Westchester H. at Belmont Park Apr. 30. But a performance similar to the one he turned in to win the GIII Mineshaft H. in New Orleans Feb. 9 puts him right on the wire today. The flashy dark bay rated kindly on that occasion and split horses decisively en route to an easy victory. "We like the way the race is coming up," trainer Neil Howard told Daily Racing Form. "There's enough speed in there if all goes well he'll be a little further back." Cont. p4

Tartan Bearer was runner-up to the useful Foolin Myself (GB) over an inadequate seven furlongs at Newmarket on debut in November and, after recovering from a slight setback, was 2-5 to open his account when stepped up to 10 furlongs on his sophomore bow. That Leicester performance looked better the further he traveled and his subsequent homework had convinced connections to take the plunge. Settled last of all by a watchful Ryan Moore off the honest early gallop here, he was asked for his effort soon into the straight and arrived alongside Twice Over in the centre of the track with a quarter-mile remaining. Dealing with that rival quickly, he had Frozen Fire to account for thereafter and edged into an advantage inside the final 150 yards before digging in determinedly. "I must admit, I thought he might just struggle today but the boss was spot on," Moore said.

"It was a nice race and they went a good even pace, but when he got to the front he idled and then really knuckled down in the last furlong when the O'Brien horse came to me. He's a very honest horse and I don't see why he won't stay a mile and a half and handle Epsom, but we'll see in a month's time." Stoute has a fifth blue riband in mind now. "He doesn't do flashy homework, but he'll travel well behind anything and has a good cruising speed," he continued. "He will run in the Derby with Tajaaweed." Frozen Fire may renew rivalry in the June 7 Classic, but Henry Cecil revealed that Twice Over may now sidestep the contest. "I am not blaming the ground, as all the others went on it," he told PA Sport. "He came there and emptied out and he was disappointing really. Whether he needs to come back in distance or not I don't know. It is up to the Prince, but I don't think he'll run in the Derby after that."

Promising Lead took a while to blossom last term and after finishing runner-up in this meeting's Listed Michael Seely Memorial Fillies' S. was only fourth in the Listed Hoppings S. at Newcastle the following month. After gaining her first stakes win in Salisbury's Listed Upavon Fillies' S. in August, the homebred excelled when a head second to Satwa Queen (Fr) in the G1 Prix de l'Opera at Longchamp on her final start in October. She was the only one the Knavesmire faithful wanted to know beforehand and showed why in the race with a straightforward comeback score, tracking the strong pace before leading approaching the final quarter and quickly asserting. "She's a very good, proper Group 1 filly and had much too class for these," jockey Ryan Moore commented. "I was in front too early and she doesn't do a lot when she gets there, so she'll come on a lot for this." Promising Lead's dam is a half-sister to the great broodmare Hasili (GB), as well as to the dams of champions Leroidesanimaux (Brz) and Three Valleys. The last year the Pimlico Special was staged in 2006, a horse who had made its previous appearance in Dubai returned on the relatively short rest to add the Grade I feature. That horse was subsequent Horse of the Year Invasor (Arg), and while **A. P. Arrow** might not be in that class, he represents the main competition this afternoon. Third to **Student Council** (Kingmambo) in the GII Hawthorne Gold Cup H. Sept. 29, the chestnut

closed 2007 on a high note, taking the GII Clark H. at Churchill Downs Nov. 23. Runner-up to Spring at Last in the GI Donn H. at Gulfstream to kick off his six-year-old campaign, he was last seen finishing 8 3/4 lengths behind Curlin when fourth in the GI Dubai World Cup Mar. 29. "He

ran well," trainer Todd Pletcher told DRF, referring to the World Cup. "He was obviously no match for Curlin. If we were in with the goal to try and finish second, maybe we could've been, but we kept him closer to the pace than he wants to be and he ran hard like he always does." Student Council won the GI Pacific Classic before scoring in Chicago, but has not been the same since and comes into this off a disappointing seventh in the grassy GIII Connally Breeders' Cup Turf H. at Sam Houston Apr. 5. Sir Whimsey (Jump Start) merits a long look as he makes his return to a conventional dirt surface. The two-length winner of a nine-furlong Gulfstream allowance Jan. 16, the dark bay stretched out to today's distance to win the Mar. 1 GII Gulfstream Park H. by a half-length. He tested out Keeneland's synthetic track in his latest and gave a decent account of himself when third in the GIII Ben Ali S. Apr. 20. Perhaps the classiest of the speed types is Wanderin Boy (Seeking the Gold). Second to Invasor in 2006, the chestnut entire won a sloppy renewal of the 2007 GIII Alysheba S., his lone victory from five starts. Third in this year's Alysheba, he could catch another off track this afternoon and would certainly not be inconvenienced should that happen.

Last year's winner Sergeant Cecil returns to his happiest hunting ground with a reputation to restore following four off-the-board efforts since his defeat of Geordieland in this heat 12 months ago. Previously successful in the G2 Lonsdale Cup and Ebor H. here in 2006, the popular veteran has looked a shadow of his former self and trailed home a distant also-ran behind Royal and Regal in the G3 John Porter S. at Newbury last time Apr. 19. Unlike the Sergeant, that rival is on the up and was adding to his win in the G3 Jockey Club Cup at Newmarket in October. "His owner Peter Savill and I are planning to see the first couple of races tomorrow and see how the ground is riding," trainer Michael Jarvis told PA Sport. "But the horse is very fit and we're hoping we can run him. His former trainer thought the horse was versatile and that he could handler faster ground, but just how fast we wouldn't know until he runs on it." Honolulu was third in the G1 St Leger at Doncaster and Ascot's G3 Cumberland Lodge S. in September before finishing down the field in the GI Canadian International and represents a Ballydoyle team packed with talented stayers. Geordieland was also runner-up in the G1 Ascot Gold Cup in June and G2 Doncaster Cup in September following his second here, and trainer Jamie Osborne is hoping the cards can fall right this time. "He nearly won this race last year, but you could argue it's going to take a better performance to win it this year, with Honolulu and Royal and Regal," he told PA Sport. "They are potentially two horses who could be high-class stayers. We couldn't be happier with him. He looks exceptionally well and his work has been very good."


Bsharpsonata was off the board for the first time this year when fifth in the May 2 GI Kentucky Oaks. The bay set the pace over a sloppy Churchill strip, but tired late and hit the wire six lengths behind winner Proud Spell. "She kicked well until the last part, and I think she got tired on that heavy track," jockey Eric Camacho said. "That track just didn't favor her that day." It's a quick turnaround for the Cloverleaf homebred, but she faces a softer field here. "She bounces back quick," Camacho added. "She's...itching to go." Seattle Smooth ships in from the West Coast for trainer Julio Canani. A \$340,000 FTKJUL yearling, she bounced back from a fifth in the Mar. 8 GI Santa Anita Oaks to romp hone six lengths in front in the Apr. 12 Bay Meadows Oaks. Edgar Prado picks up the mount. Sweet Vendetta, second behind subsequent GI Ashland S. winner and Kentucky Oaks runner-up Little Belle in the Feb. 24 Busher S. at the Big A, cruised by four lengths in the Mar. 19 Andover Way S. in the slop at Aqueduct, but bled in that race and makes her first appearance since. She has raced on Lasix in every start.



Big Brown Gallops Around Old Hilltop...

Big Brown looked the picture of health and well-being as he did 1 1/2 laps over the Pimlico main track yesterday morning. "It went good," said trainer Richard Dutrow Jr., who accompanied the colt on the cargo plane which transported him to Baltimore-Washington Airport late Wednesday evening. "I was very happy with it. He was comfortable, cool, relaxed, galloped good. We're as happy as we can be right now." The conditioner remains slightly concerned running back on just two weeks' rest, but said that his charge should be able to work out a trip from post position seven. "It seems like it's a long enough run to the first turn and our horse has got positional speed," Dutrow said. "He can place himself there early, if need be, and he can set off if he needs to. I'm guessing that he's going to be forwardly placed going into the first turn. I'm sure he and Kent will fall into a nice little spot where they're comfortable, rather than being on the lead. It's up to them when they come out of the gate, as far as that goes, but I see us getting a most comfortable trip."

now," said trainer Eddie Plesa Jr. "Every time she has a horse in, she's at the races. She just drives her car and goes to the track." Plesa has trained for Oxenberg and her late husband, Bernie, for a quartercentury. "Trainers can look back, the older you get,

and say, 'I had this person for this much time, this person for this much time, this person for this much time," Plesa continued. "She's been with me for all that time that I've had horses for a lot of different people. She's a wonderful person. Her husband was the nicest, kindest person I've met in my life." As for his Preakness starter, Plesa thinks he's in with a shot. "He's what you call a push-button horse," he stated. "He'll do what you want him to do. He's not one-dimensional. He has the tactical speed to lay where you want him. The jockey can direct him any way; he's not going to run off with him. He's a very versatile horse. He's probably one of the most versatile horses I've ever trained." Chuck C. Lopez has the call from the 13 hole.

"It's a bit quick

back for [Big Brown]. We've got a little fresher horse." Adding blinkers for the first time, Riley Tucker makes his fifth start in the span of 89 days tomorrow, but comes off the fastest effort of his career, a third to Behindatthebar (Forest Wildcat) in the GII Coolmore Lexington S. at Keeneland Apr. 19. Edgar Prado, one of the leading riders in Maryland history, has the call in the Preakness.



Giant Moon an Intriguing Longshot...

New York invader Giant Moon (Giant's Causeway) galloped two miles and schooled at the gate yesterday at Belmont Park as he prepares for Saturday's test. Trainer Richie Schosberg said he received a phone call from the Pimlico starter to talk about preparing Giant Moon for the Preakness. "In big races like this, they just want to make sure that everything goes according to plan as best as possible," Schosberg said. "I school horses before they run almost every time. It doesn't matter how old they are. I think it just really gets their juices flowing. It lets them know that race time is coming soon. They get in there and relax and it's like, `Hey man, I'm really, really close to a race.' It gets them ready." The New York-bred carries interesting form into the race. An on-pace runner while going undefeated in his first four trips to the post, he was ninth in the GIII Gotham S. Mar. 8, but made a couple of runs from off the pace to finish fourth, beaten just two lengths, in the GI Wood Memorial S. Apr. 5. He raced on a dead rail that afternoon and, given the fourth-place Kentucky Derby finish of the victorious Tale of Ekati, Giant Moon looms an interesting exotics horse on Saturday. Ramon Dominguez, two-for-three aboard Giant Moon, has the return call. "Certainly Ramon knows his way around there and the best part of the track, and he knows my horse," Schosberg added. "I think we've got everything going as best we can.

BIG FUN FOR COHEN

Please forgive Andy Cohen if he's looking beyond Saturday's GI Preakness S. Born and raised in Brooklyn, New York--a stone's throw from Belmont Park--the semi-retired Wall Street executive would love nothing more than to be on hand if Big Brown, the colt he owns in partnership with IEAH Stables, Paul Pompa Jr. and Gary Tolchin, is in position to become racing's first Triple Crown winner in 30 years.

"I couldn't imagine it in a million years. That would be about as good as it gets," the 51-year-old said yester-day by phone from Baltimore. "You'd have to like our chances."

But first things first.

It's been something of a meteoric rise to prominence for Cohen, who got his feet wet in the Standardbred business, owning a few trotters in the early 2000s. A few years back, Cohen was introduced to IEAH principle Mike lavarone and decided to become an investor in the new venture. The stable's success has been nothing short of remarkable over the last three years, given the success of GI Breeders' Cup Mile winner Kip Deville, G1 Dubai Golden Shaheen hero Benny the Bull and now Big Brown. Sometimes, Cohen admits, he needs to pinch himself to make sure he's not dreaming.

"It's been unbelievable," he stated. "When we met, no one ever imagined that in three years' time that these guys could do what they've done. It's been an incredible ride. I'm getting a little bit spoiled. Every time we run, I think we're going to win a Grade I race. It's been a lot of fun, I've really enjoyed it, a lot more than my old job. I don't go in very much any more."

Successful though he was in his professional career, Cohen admits that he was basically interested in recreation when he joined forces with the IEAH team.

"It sounded like fun," he explained. "I really wasn't looking at it like it was going to be a money-making kind of thing. I was looking to have a good time. We got one good horse, then another good horse and another and it's been terrific. Now we have horses that can go on to become stallions. It keeps growing and we seem to be doing all the right things."

IEAH and partners bought Big Brown off his maiden victory over the Saratoga turf last summer, but connections didn't really know what they had until the strapping bay colt aired in a Gulfstream allowance in March. A little more than three weeks later he overcame the 12 hole to add the GI Florida Derby and made light work of the field in the GI Kentucky Derby. No one could really fault his confidence going into tomorrow's Classic, given Big Brown's total domination of the field in the Derby 13 days ago. And, rest assured, confidence remains high--very high.

"Thankfully Big Brown didn't disappoint us," Cohen commented.



"He ran a great race [in the Derby] and he's doing great right now. It doesn't seem like he has a care in the world. I think he likes the attention. He's doing everything right and he's going into the race perfect."

Cohen acknowledges that he has learned how to deal with the frequent trips to the winner's circle and has gradually become less demonstrative about winning, as evidenced by the following anecdote.

"The first big race we won, [IEAH Vice President of Investor Relations] Mike Sherack had an extra set of silks with him and we were on our way to the winner's circle and I was a little bit out of my mind, so I grabbed the silks and said, 'Let me put them on,'" Cohen related. "They were very tight-fitting--it wasn't my best look, but it was fun. I've calmed down a little bit now. I know that Mike's kids and Rich's kids wore the silks at the Breeders' Cup, so I guess I've handed

over the gauntlet to the kids. They looked a lot better on them than they did on me."

Married with two children, ages 17 and 21, things could scarcely be better for Cohen.

"I'm having the time of my life," he says.

MOYGLARE CONSIDER EPSOM CONQUEST

Moyglare Stud's Casual Conquest (Ire) (Hernando {Fr}) is still under consideration for the June 7 G1 Epsom Derby after connections indicated they might supplement the unbeaten colt. Following his impressive six-length defeat of Washington Irving (Ire) in Sunday's G2 Derrinstown Stud Derby Trial at Leopardstown, the French and Irish equivalents had been touted as more likely targets for the homebred. However, the Stud's Manager Stan Cosgrove suggested yesterday that the £75,000 fee could be paid if trainer Dermot Weld gives the green light. "He still has his options open and it's a possibility to go to Epsom, but he's just had the two runs and he might just be a little inexperienced," Cosgrove told PA Sport. "We'll see how everything goes for a while--we only need to supplement him four days before the race. It's really up to the trainer and the jockey [to make a decision about supplementing]."



THOROUGHBRED SAFETY COMMITTEE

HOLDS FIRST MEETING The Jockev's Club's Thoroughbred Safety Committee held its first meeting Wednesday afternoon to discuss its objectives. The seven-member panel convened for the two-hour conference call. "I thought it was a very useful meeting," said Committee Chairman Stuart Janney III in a teleconference yesterday. "We decided on some of the topics we are going to address and who we want to hear from on these topics, and we can now begin assembling these groups and individuals. We can build on the good work done during the two Welfare and Safety Summits." He added, "We want to see how far along we are in implementing the things called for during the Summits. Our concerns are clearly along those lines; where the recommendation has sound grounding in science and research, we want to see that it gets done." Janney did not expand on the specific topics to be addressed, instead saying, "I don't think we will focus specifically on what happened at the Kentucky Derby, but many issues have been raised, and if it has been thrown out there as an area of concern, we're going to want to address it. That's not to say, at the end of everything, we won't look at some of the issues and say, 'We don't believe that's a problem.' I'd be surprised if that's not the conclusion on some issues, but I think it's important that the Committee has an opinion about them." While Janney acknowledged that The Jockey Club has only limited authority to enforce change in the industry, he remarked, "We want to use this as a bully pulpit. We can go to other people in the industry and say, 'This is how we feel--how can you help us?" The Committee has scheduled two upcoming meetings, set for May 27 in Lexington and June 4 in New York.

NETJETS PROMOTION YIELDS 500K FOR

JOCKEY FUND A NetJets Kentucky Derby Day promotion raised \$500,000 for the NTRA Charities Permanently Disabled Jockeys Fund, it was announced Thursday, "The fund is a lifesaver to riders injured during the course of their careers, and we are privileged to join with these partners to support them through this gift," Richard Santulli, NetJets chairman and CEO, said in a statement. NetJets contributed \$200,000 on behalf of the 20 riders who competed in the Kentucky Derby, and made an additional contribution of \$100,000. Santulli and Bill Casner, owner of WinStar Farm and chairman of the Thoroughbred Owners and Breeders Association (TOBA), made personal donations of \$100,000. "Their generosity and dedication is making a difference in the lives of disabled riders," added NTRA President and CEO Alex Waldrop. Waldrop said it was the single largest donation in the history of the fund. Jockey John Velazquez will present the gift Friday morning at Pimlico to fund representatives Waldrop and former jockey Jackie Fires. NetJets will also sponsor riders competing in Saturday's 133rd running of the Preakness S. The Preakness jockeys will donate the sponsorship money to The Jockey Club Foundation, which provides financial assistance to needy members of the Thoroughbred industry and their families, and the Grayson-Jockey Club Research Foundation, which researches equine health and soundness issues.

FARM BILL PASSES CONGRESS The Farm Bill. which includes a provision to amend the depreciation schedule for racehorses, has passed Congress. The House voted 318-106 to pass the bill Wednesday, and the Senate followed suit yesterday by a vote of 81-15. President Bush has said he will veto the bill because of the total cost, which is close to \$300 billion, but Congress can override the veto by a two-thirds majority. It seems likely based on this week's voting that the veto will be overridden. Under current tax law, racehorses are depreciated over either three or seven years, depending on their age when they begin training. Legislation contained in the Farm Bill allows an owner to recover his/her costs over the period of time that the horse is likely to race. The legislation also makes breeders eligible for emergency federal loans in the case of a disaster, and provides relief funds to farmers and ranchers who are hit by losses in USDA-declared disaster


