Big Brown Arrives at Belmont...

With two-thirds of the Triple Crown already in the bag, **Big Brown** (Boundary) boarded a Brook Ledge van

a little after 10 a.m. Monday and was sent to Belmont Park. Trainer Rick Dutrow Jr., who left Pimlico in his car accompanied by exercise rider Michelle Nevin, followed the van. The colt, who arrived at Belmont at approximately 2:30 p.m., was bedded down in stall eight of Bobby Frankel's barn, the same stall that

Belmont S. winner Empire Maker occupied in 2003. "I am feeling pretty confident about things," said Dutrow. "I can see that he is sharp. [Sunday] he was bouncing and [Monday] the same thing. He is doing good and

that makes everything so much easier." Assessing his chances three weeks down the road, Dutrow added, "Everyone can see he is a special kind of horse. As long as we can keep him well within himself, we'll have a chance. Everybody is very excited about him and how can you not be? It looks like he has a chance at being one of the best ever. If we get beat in the Belmont, we are going to be among a whole lot of horses that almost got there,

so we need to win this race. He looks like by far he is the best horse going into [the Belmont]."

CURLIN DRILLS AT CHURCHILL

Reigning Horse of the Year Curlin (Smart Strike) breezed five furlongs in 1:02.80 at Churchill Downs Monday in preparation for his upcoming start in the GI Stephen Foster H. June 14. With rider Carlos Rosas in the saddle, the Stonestreet and Midnight Cry Stable's representative ranked as the 17th fastest of 31 who worked at the distance. "I thought he went beautiful," said trainer Steve Asmussen. "I think we're in a very good spot with him and he seems to be coming around as expected." The work

was the powerful chestnut's third since his winning effort in the G1 Dubai World Cup Mar. 29.

DISFUNCTION HANGS ON FOR VIGIL WIN

Despite being sent off at generous odds of 11-1 in yesterday's GIII Vigil H., **Disfunction** (Vying Victor)

proved himself extremely capable, taking Woodbine's Victoria Day feature in track-record time. Flanked by Lake Secret and Sail From Seattle through a crisp opening quarter-mile in:22 1/5 and a sparkling half in:43 3/5, the bay, who was widest of the three, turned up the heat on his foes turning for home, streaked to the front

after six furlongs in 1:07 2/5 and was all out to hold off the late charge of **Storm Caller** (Stormy Atlantic) by 3/4 of a length. "He's been a surprise to us all along," said trainer Julia Carey after recording her first career stakes victory. "I never dreamed he would be this good. He was really green at the beginning and won in spite of it. He's just learning a lot and getting better." **Cont. p2**

Asmussen Sophomores Work at Churchill...

Trainer Steve Asmussen sent out a string of gradedstakes performers for morning works yesterday, led by GII Louisiana Derby winner Pyro (Pulpit), who breezed five furlongs in 1:04.40. Eighth in his latest start in the Kentucky Derby May 3, the bay will be pointed toward the June 14 GIII Northern Dancer S. Z Fortune (Siphon {Brz}), 10th in the Derby, covered the same distance in 1:02.20. Asmussen indicated that the Zayat Stables' colt will run in the GII Ohio Derby at Thistledown May 31. Also sent out for a spin, GII Indiana Derby and GIII West Virginia Derby winner Zanjero (Cherokee Run) breezed four panels in :49.80 ahead of an intended start in the GIII Lone Star Park H. May 26, while GII Fantasy S. runner-up Alina (Came Home) negotiated five furlongs in 1:02.90 in preparation for the GIII Dogwood S. at Churchill Downs May 31.

Denis of Cork Readies For Belmont...

Denis of Cork (Harlan's Holiday) turned in his first major work since a third-place finish behind Big Brown in the May 3 Kentucky Derby, going five furlongs in 1:01 at Churchill Downs Monday. Ridden by James Lopez, the colt posted the fifth fastest of 31 works at the distance. The winner of the GIII Southwest S. winner is expected to make his next start in the GI Belmont S. June 7. "He's just starting to come back to himself," said trainer David Carroll, who conditions the colt for William Warren, "He finished up strong in the Derby and galloped out. With all the rain we've had here, I didn't do a whole lot with him after the Derby--you don't have to do a whole lot with him. [Yesterday] we just let him stretch his legs, and he just went beautiful." The colt is expected to breeze twice more before the Belmont. "It's good to get his head back in the game," Carroll added. "We'll see what happens in the Belmont." Ridden by Calvin Borel in the Derby, the bay will be accompanied by Robby Albarado in the 1 1/2-mile Classic.

Offered for \$40,000 in a Woodbine claimer last October, Disfunction closed out the season with a fourth in a 6 1/2-furlong allowance over that track in December. Sent to Gulfstream for the winter, the gelding won in his first attempt on the dirt Jan. 28, but tired to fourth after showing plenty of early speed in a Gulfstream allowance Mar. 9. Brought back to Woodbine's Polytrack, the British Colombia-bred romped home by 6 1/2 lengths in a \$60,000 optional claimer Apr. 19. "[Trainer] Julia [Carey] said to me, 'This horse can win this race. He has a lot of talent and we haven't seen the best of him yet.' It was rightly said," said winning rider Emile Ramsammy, who was winning his third Grade III race of the weekend following tallies in the Selene S. and Marine S. "If you wondered what the definition of 'Disfunction' was," added Ramsammy. "He's a four-year-old gelding setting the track record at Woodbine." HENRY HEADS BAKER'S DOZEN FOR GUINEAS

Susan Magnier's **Henrythenavigator** (Kingmambo) yesterday headed a 13-strong entry for Saturday's G1 Irish

2000 Guineas at The Curragh. Ballydoyle's G1 2000 Guineas winner will renew rivalry with Princess Haya of Jordan's New Approach (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}) following his nose defeat of that rival in the May 3 Classic. "Henry will run in the Irish 2000 Guineas, as long as the ground is good to firm," confirmed Aidan O'Brien, who left in five at yesterday's five-day

stage. The Ballydoyle quintet also includes G3 Killavullan S. winner Jupiter Pluvius (Johannesburg). Matthew Green's Stubbs Art (Ire) (Hawk Wing), who was third at 100-1 at Newmarket, was supplemented by trainer David Elsworth. Other notables include Khalid Abdullah's G3 Leopardstown 2000 Guineas Trial S. winner Famous Name (GB) (Dansili {GB}), Godolphin's G1 Racing Post Trophy hero Ibn Khaldun (Dubai Destination) and Fab Oak Stable's Breeders' Cup Juvenile Turf winner Nownownow (Whywhywhy), who will be making his seasonal debut.

CLOWANCE TO EPSOM Trainer Roger Charlton yesterday confirmed that Seasons Holidays' Clowance (GB) (Montjeu {Ire}) will run in the G1 Juddmonte Oaks at Epsom. Following her success in Friday's Listed Swettenham Stud Fillies' Trial S. at Newbury, connections are keen to take in the June 6 Classic. "She's done everything we've asked of her and, although Montjeus can be complicated, she is a well-balanced and tough filly and I'd say her temperament is good," Charlton said. "She stays well, but whether she's good enough we'll find out. She should have a good chance of being in the first four."

In a six-runner contest for the G2 Dante S., Britain's premier Derby trial, the betting public wasn't greatly interested in Tartan Bearer, who drifted up to 10-1. While this was a fair-enough reflection of the form of a colt who had raced only in maiden company, the odds would surely have been much much shorter had the runners been assessed purely on whether they had a Derby-winning pedigree.

Tartan Bearer's brother **Golan** had started joint-favorite for the 2001 Derby on the strength of his last-to-first victory in the 2000 Guineas. Golan would

probably have won an ordinary Derby, but he had the misfortune to be born in the same year as the excellent Galileo and was beaten into second. However, Golan subsequently confirmed his prowess over the Derby distance by taking the following year's King George.

Tartan Bearer's family--so

skillfully developed by the Ballymacoll Stud team--had previously won the 2004 Dante S. and the Derby with **North Light** (now a resident of Adena Springs). This female line traces to Coventry Belle, a sister to the 1940 1000 Guineas and Oaks winner Godiva. Incidentally, it's well worth mentioning that Coventry Belle was born two years after her half-sister Her Slipper, who ranks as the seventh dam of none other than Big Brown. The possibility therefore exists that the Kentucky Derby and the Derby will fall to colts from the same extensive Carpet Slipper family.





Insights Cont.

The bottom half of Tartan Bearer's pedigree is totally saturated with Derby winners. He's the sixth living foal out of Highland Gift, a daughter of the runaway 1991 Derby winner **Generous**. His second dam, Scots Lass, is by Shirley Heights, the 1978 winner, and his third dam, Edinburgh, was a daughter of Charlottown, who scraped home in 1966. Altogether, Highland Gift has three Derby winners--Nijinsky, Mill Reef and Charlottown--among her four great-grandsires, the exception being Master Derby, a son of the Kentucky Derby winner Dust Commander.

Highland Gift jarred her knees on fast ground on her debut, over 1 1/2 miles, but returned six months later to win very easily over 1 1/4 miles on soft going. She would surely have stayed 1 1/2 miles, because she is a half-sister to Bonny Scot, a listed winner over 1 1/4 miles at two who also demonstrated his stamina with his third in the G1 St Leger.

This concentration on excellent mile-and-a-half performers in the bottom half of Tartan Bearer's pedigree compensates for the fact that his sire, Spectrum, was probably best at up to 1 1/4 miles, as he showed with his victories in the Irish 2000 Guineas and Dubai Champion S. Spectrum's only attempt at 1 1/2 miles came in the 1995 Derby, from which he emerged sore, stiff and with muscle problems in his back.

This son of Rainbow Quest was exported to South Africa in 2004 after generally failing to live up to expectations during his years at Coolmore. Tartan Bearer, who is therefore a member of his final Irish crop, has the potential to become the third Northern Hemisphere Group 1 winner by Spectrum, following Golan and the Grand Prix de Saint-Cloud winner Gamut.

Remarkably, all three of these colts are graduates of Ballymacoll, which maintains a broodmare team of under 30 mares, and all three come from the same family. Gamut's dam, Greektown, is a half-sister to Tartan Bearer's second dam, Scots Lass.

The original inspiration for sending Highland Gift to a son of Rainbow Quest no doubt owed a lot to the considerable success Ballymacoll enjoyed with that fine racemare Sought Out. This Group 1 winner was sired by Rainbow Quest from Highland Gift's second dam Edinburgh. Sought Out, who has found new fame as the dam of North Light, won four group races at up to 2 1/2 miles and she passed on a large measure of her stamina to another of her sons, the Group 3 winner Cover Up. Cover Up was by a sprinter-miler, Machiavellian, and North Light is by another in Danehill. Stamina tends to be this family's long suit and it produced another good stayer--the Group 2 winner Multicoloured--when Edinburgh's daughter Greektown visited Rainbow Quest.

There is therefore no real cause to doubt that Tartan Bearer will cope with the extra distance when he lines up at Epsom, where he will attempt to become the fourth Dante S., winner in the last five years to win the Derby.

It is premature to speculate about Tartan Bearer's possible future as a stallion (which isn't going to be helped by the fact that his brother Golan is now a member of Coolmore's jumping sector). However, it would be good to see a top-class recruit from this male line, as the Blushing Groom line is struggling for survival in Britain and Ireland.


Rainbow Quest sired numerous good sons, but his long-term influence depends largely on his daughters, who earned him the title of champion sire of broodmares in 2003 and 2004. Arguably his best stallion son has been the Derby winner Quest For Fame, who enjoyed another Group 1 success in Australia last week when his son Sarrera landed the Doomben Cup.

It is going to be interesting to see what impact Spectrum has on racing in South Africa--a country which also became home to Rainbow Quest's Arc-winning son Saumarez. The profile of South Africa's horses has been boosted considerably in recent years, a perfect example being Jay Peg, who recently added the G1 Singapore Airlines International Cup to his victory in the Dubai Duty Free.

Jay Peg may have been bred in South Africa, but he has an interesting international pedigree featuring 4x3 inbreeding to the exceptional broodmare Lassie Dear. The bloodstock world is definitely getting smaller and smaller.

A colt by E Dubai brought top price of \$230,000 at Monday's opening session of the Fasig-Tipton Midlantic Preferred Two-year-olds in Training Sale held at the Maryland State Fairgrounds in Timonium. Consigned by Nick de Meric, the New York-bred, who breezed a quarter mile in :21 4/5 during the first under-tack show May 14, was purchased by Donald Brooks. Out of the Spectacular Bid mare Twice Forbidden, hip 286 is a half to Don Corleone (Incurable Optimist) and Tin Cup Chalice (Crusader Sword), both winners in restricted stakes in the Empire State. The \$135,000 SARAUG yearling has been nominated to the Aspirant S. for New York breds. Leading the ladies during the first session was hip 85, a bay by Not For Love who brought \$220,000. Secured by Walnut Green LLC, the first foal out of Polish Nana (Polish Numbers) was offered by Eisaman Equine, agent. The New York-bred filly, who is from the family of GII Pennsylvania Derby winner Love of Money and stakes winner Astrid, is nominated to the NATC Futurity, Maryland Million and Breeders' Cup. The first session concluded with gross figures falling from \$9,158,700 in 2007 to \$7,213,300 this term, while average also tumbled 12.3 percent to \$45,654 for 158 head sold. 

Overdose's connections were overjoyed. "That was what we had hoped for," said a spokesman. "He is still unbeaten and always wins impressively, but we did not know just how good he really is. We will now tour Europe and see how he comes along and we might return here for the [Aug. 31] G2 Goldene Peitsche, but Longchamp is another option." -Christa Riebel
