Trainer Mick Channon is looking at Sunday's G1 Irish 1000 Guineas for Jaber Abdullah's Nahoodh (Ire) (Clodovil {Ire}), who yesterday headed a field of 20

remaining in the Curragh Classic. A luckless fifth behind Natagora (Fr) in the G1 1000 Guineas at Newmarket May 4, last year's G2 Lowther S. winner may be joined by Liam Mulryan's G3 C.L. Weld Park S. winner **Eva's** Request (Ire) (Soviet Star), while stable companion

Nijoom Dubai (GB) (Noverre)--eighth in the G1 Poule d'Essai des Pouliches at Longchamp last Sunday--is doubtful. "I might run one or two," said Channon. "Nahoodh could run, but I don't think Nijoom Dubai will." Jim Bolger, who saddled last year's star Finsceal Beo (Ire), has a smart pair still in contention in G3 Musidora S. heroine Lush Lashes (GB) (Galileo {Ire}) and 1000 Guineas third Saoirse Abu (Mr. Greeley), but Bolger told Racing Post that the former was unlikely to line up. "[Saoirse Abu] will probably be my only runner in the race," he told the Post. "She has come out of Newmarket very well, and I am very happy with her." Dermot Weld has a duo engaged in Dr Ronan Lambe's G3 Leopardstown 1000 Guineas Trial S. and G3 Derrinstown Stud 1000 Guineas Trial winner Carribean Sunset (Ire) (Danehill Dancer (Ire)) and Moyglare Stud Farm's G1 Moyglare Stud S. and G1 Prix Marcel Boussac third Mad About You (Ire) (Indian Ridge {Ire}). "Both Mad About You and Carribean Sunset have been left in the race, but we will wait and see what the ground is like before we make a final decision on what will run for us," Weld told the Post. Aidan O'Brien has left in a team of six, headed by Diane Nagle and Susan Magnier's 1000 Guineas ninth Kitty Matcham (Ire) (Rock of Gibraltar {Ire}).

On the Undercard...

In the G1 Tattersalls Gold Cup at The Curragh, Susan Magnier and Michael Tabor's G1 Prix Ganay winner Duke of Marmalade (Ire) (Danehill) and last year's G1 Irish Derby hero Soldier of Fortune (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}) are two of the five Ballydoyle entries among the list of 11, which also includes Michael Ryan's dual Guineas heroine Finsceal Beo (Ire) (Mr. Greeley) and Paul Reddam's 2006 GI Breeders' Cup Turf hero Red Rocks (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}).

TALE OF EKATI SHARP IN BELMONT WORK

GI Kentucky Derby fourth Tale of Ekati (Tale of the Cat) worked a bullet four furlongs yesterday at Belmont Park in a razor-sharp: 46.84, the fastest of 37 at the distance, and a full second quicker than the next fastest. Charles Fipke's GI Wood Memorial S. winner skipped the Preakness. but is likely to try Derby winner Big Brown (Boundary) once more when both tackle the 1 1/2 miles of the GI Belmont S. June 7.



FROM THE DESK OF...

END OF AN ERA

The retirements, on successive days, of Sadler's Wells (age 27) and Storm Cat (age 25) truly mark the end of what has been a Golden Age in the world of sires. It's been a Northern Dancer era, too: every year but one this century, four of the top five sires by APEX A Runner Index have been sons or grandsons of Northern Dancer: Danzig, Storm Cat, Nureyev, and Sadler's Wells. That was until Nureyev died; then he was replaced by Danehill. The only non-Northern Dancer horse among the top five is A.P. Indy--himself 20 years old next year. Now, none of those five great Northern Dancer sons or grandsons is still active: Danzig, Nureyev, and Danehill have died; Sadler's Wells and Storm Cat are now retired. Truly the end of an era.

Much has been written about Sadler's Wells' incomparable achievements and legacy. His son Galileo, officially 'private,' is probably the most expensive sire in the world right now and, with Montjeu having sired two Epsom Derby winners in his first three crops, the Sadler's Wells branch of Northern Dancer now looks far more likely to survive as a sire line than it did five years ago. When you look at the seven distinct branches of Northern Dancer (at least, this is how I classify them; others no doubt see it differently), Nijinsky and Lyphard are going to be pressed to survive long-term--there aren't enough of them, and they're not very commercial. Nureyev is dubious, unless his grandson Pivotal (by Nureyev's otherwise unremarkable son, Polar Falcon) saves the Nureyev sire line the same way A.P. Indy saved Bold Ruler. Deputy Minister (by Northern Dancer's son, Vice Regent) may keep going in North America. That leaves Sadler's Wells and Danzig (looks very healthy, and prolific, to me) in Europe, and Storm Cat.

Storm Cat, a grandson of Northern Dancer by Storm Bird, presents an interesting case. Like Danzig, Storm Cat always had exceptional ratings for two-year-olds-he was leading sire of two-year-olds in North America a record seven times, one more than even the legendary Bold Ruler. And, like Danzig, Storm Cat worked very well in Europe. Both his overall A Runner Index (4.37) and his European A Runner Index (3.76) had dropped off in their most recent readings (racing of 2001-2007); even so, they hadn't dropped off that much, considering an average sire rates 1.00. Throughout his career, Storm Cat's European A Index would have been closer to 5.00. There's no doubt he worked in Europe, though by comparison, we could say Danzig had always been tried in Europe from the word go (that was the mid '80s), whereas the Storm Cats started coming to Europe later in his career, after he had proven himself to be one of the top sires in North America.

Though he stood in Kentucky, Danzig's line is flourishing in Europe, while, so far, Storm Cat's line has been based in North America. Even his best European son, Giant's Causeway, stood just one season at

Coolmore before the lure of Kentucky's bigger mare base saw him move to Coolmore's Kentucky farm, Ashford. (There are more than twice as many foals born in North America each year than in Great Britain, Ireland, and France combined, especially for expensive stallions.) The fact that Giant's Causeway has been a much better sire in North America (where he has a 4.26 A Runner Index, including a good deal of grass racing) than in Europe (1.37 A Runner Index) does nothing to counter the perception that Storm Cat is more of an

American line. In fact, this season's runaway early European freshman sire leader, the dual Irish 2003 Group 1-winning two-year-old One Cool Cat, is the first Storm Cat-line horse to show really promising form as a sire in Europe. I would expect his line to grow in Europe, especially when you see horses like Sageburg (Johannesburg) winning races like the G1 Prix d'Ispahan.

The influence of Storm Cat already should not be understated. Top assistant Brianne Stanley and I keep a file of 'sires we need to know about' in North America and Europe. There are currently 1,565 stallions we try and keep track of, and very nearly 10 percent of them (145, or 9.3 percent, to be precise) are either by Storm Cat himself (105), or trace to him in male line. No fewer than 72 sons of Storm Cat were assigned 2001-2007 APEX ratings. The accompanying tables (p5-6) lists 60 Storm Cat-line sires, 40 by Storm Cat himself, and another 20 by eight of his sons, and one grandson (Johannesburg). Of the 40 on this list by Storm Cat himself, 34 now have foals of racing age, of which 27 have been assigned APEX ratings (click here to see a list of all 145 Storm Cat-line sires).


Being somewhat subjective as usual, the bolded sires on the published table are those which I think promote Storm Cat's case as a sire of sires and author of a sire line. There are 15 bolded sires on this list, 11 by Storm Cat himself, and four by three of his sons. The Storm Cats are arranged in order of the year they first went to stud, the first bolded horses being Forest Wildcat (2001-2007 A Runner Index 1.89) and Hennessy (1.79 and sire of Johannesburg), whose first foals were both 1998, racing in 2000. From the 2000 sire class came Stormy Atlantic and Tale of the Cat, each of which has himself been leading sire of two-year-olds in North America. Stormy Atlantic currently ranks sixth on the 2008 North American general sire list (from bloodhorse.com); Tale of the Cat ranks seventh. Cont. p5-6



The first foals by 1999 GI King's Bishop S. winner Forestry arrived in 2001 and raced in 2003. He's been a leading sire by APEX A Runner Index (3.16) since he was first rated. His first crop included 12 stakes winners, including GI Carter H. winner Forest Danger; his third crop included the brilliant GI Cigar Mile H. winner Discreet Cat; and his fourth crop included the record horse sold at auction, the \$16-million flop The Green Monkey. All three are now at stud. The 2002 sire class included Giant's Causeway (2.73 A Runner Index), currently third on the General Sire List for the second straight year, as well as other successful sires Catienus (1.95 A Runner Index) and Bernstein (2.71).

The 2004 sire class included **Pure Prize** (3.16), maybe a better sire than people expected. The 2005 class includes **Van Nistlerooy**, definitely a surprise package to everyone. He was fourth on the 2007 North American freshman sire list, and continues to look like he's going to make a really useful sire. Then this year we have **One Cool Cat**. There are a few more interesting ones on deck; **Consolidator** and **Grand Reward** have their first yearlings this year, for example. In addition, five of Storm Cat's sons have already sired stallions who now have runners.

These include Harlan, sire of **Menifee** and **Harlan's Holiday**; Hennessy, who of course sired Johannesburg, and has a GI King's Bishop winner in the form of Henny Hughes still to come; and Tale of the Cat, whose son Lion Heart is at this early stage North America's leading freshman sire of 2008. That gives the Storm Cat line the early leader on both sides of the Atlantic.

In the wings (yet to have runners) are the two promising sons of Forestry, Forest Danger and Discreet Cat, as well as four very interesting horses from Giant's Causeway's first two crops: Footstepsinthesand and Shamardal in Europe, and Aragorn and First Samurai in Kentucky; plus the first five-figure stud fee sons of Stormy Atlantic (Stormello) and Storm Cat's grandson Johannesburg (Scat Daddy, Teuflesberg).

The Storm Cat line has its knockers; you hear plenty about wind problems, and knees. That's not my area, so I just don't know. But it does look like this is a sire line which is expanding (including into Europe), not contracting. We're a long ways from knowing a lot of answers, but the evidence suggests this line is particularly good for two-year-olds, and handles any surface. I'd say there's plenty more to come from the Storm Cat sire line. I suspect he's a pretty good broodmare sire, too: there's a pretty interesting list of sires whose best runners are all out of Storm Cat mares. That suggests another all-important ingredient--'class.'

LION HEART COLT TOPS FASIG MIDLANTIC

Trainer Steve Klesaris and owner Jeff Puglisi have been very active this spring at the two-year-old sales, and they kept up the momentum at the Fasig-Tipton Midlantic Preferred Sale at the Maryland State Fairgrounds in Timonium. At yesterday's second and final session, Klesaris went to a sale-topping \$575,000 for a colt from the first crop of Coolmore's Grade I winner Lion Heart (Tale of the Cat). Selling as hip 402, the dark bay colt was produced by the 24-year-old mare Bye the Bye (Balzac), also the dam of dual Group 1 winner Schossberg (Broad Brush). Consigned by Crupi's New Castle Farm, the colt, a \$190,000 KEESEP yearling, breezed a quarter in :21 flat at the May 15 under-tack show. "He was an outstanding individual," said Klesaris after signing the ticket as Puglisi Racing. "I saw 600 or whatever head, and he just stood out. He breezed brilliantly, he handled himself really well--he was a real professional." Cont. p2

Consolation for One That Got Away...

Earlier this year, at the OBS February Sale, Klesaris and Puglisi were the underbidders on Pride, a Lion Heart filly who went to Michael Tabor, et al, for \$475,000. That filly came out and won at first asking at Keeneland Apr. 25, going 4 1/2 furlongs in a swift :50 4/5. The pair weren't about to let vesterday's topper get away, too. "Our position was that we liked him a whole lot and we were prepared to go to battle to get him," said Klesaris. "That's what you have to do if you really want something." Klesaris added that he wasn't surprised by the price. "I would think if he was in the bigger sale, if he was in Miami, he would have brought more, but who knows?" Klesaris said, adding that he expected to go right on with the youngster. "He'll be at Fair Hill Training Center by tomorrow morning. He'll get turned out in a paddock for a week or so, and then we'll let him go." The leading buyer at the sale, Puglisi purchased nine horses for \$1.374 million. That included hip 475, a Northern Afleet colt for \$180,000; hip 18, a filly from the first crop of Grade I winner Tapit (Pulpit) for \$130,000; and hip 387, a filly, also by Lion Heart, for \$100,000. "Klesaris estimated that he and Puglisi had purchased upwards of 30 two-year-olds this spring. Despite their participation, action was down at the sale. Average took a 13.5-percent hit, to \$48,188, while the median slumped 18.8 percent, to \$28,000.

Flay Lands Top-Priced Filly, by Successful Appeal...

As a shareholder in successful young sire Successful Appeal, chef Bobby Flay is always on the lookout for promising offspring by the Walmac stallion. He believes he landed a good prospect yesterday in the form of hip 532, a daughter of the Deputy Minister mare Foxy Coxy who was the top-priced filly of the sale on Flay's \$250,000 offer. "She's a member of Successful Appeal's first Kentucky crop, and we expect some really great things from him," said Flay, who said he was turned onto the filly by bloodstock agent Mike Ryan. "Mike thought that she didn't look like the typical Successful Appeals, but that she had a chance to be good early," said Flay. The dark bay, consigned by Scanlon Training Center, will go to the barn of trainer Todd Pletcher. Flay also added a pair of colts yesterday through another bloodstock agent, Bob Feld. Feld went to \$50,000 for hip 256, by Forest Wildcat, and to \$100,000 for hip 577, by Malibu Moon. It was Flay's first purchases this year at the juvenile sales. "I'd been looking, but hadn't bought anything," he said. On Monday, a horse that Flay purchased privately last year, GI Hollywood Starlet runner-up Grace and Power (More Than Ready), rallied to be second, beaten just a head, in Woodbine's GIII Selene S. "She came out of the race fine, and we're hoping to make it out to California for the [GI] American Oaks [at Hollywood July 5]," Flay said. -L Marquardt

Canadian Racing Hall of Fame Announces Inductees:

The Canadian Horse Racing Hall of Fame announced its 2008 inductees yesterday. Four horses and four people will be honoured at the Hall of Fame Induction Ceremony Aug. 28 at the Mississauga Convention Centre in Ontario. The 2008 equine inductees are Sam-Son Farms' Smart Strike (Mr. Prospector) and Wilderness Song (Wild Again); the richest Canadianbred trotter of all time, Peaceful Way (Angus Hall); and pacing Horse of the Year Real Desire. The human division is led by multiple Sovereign Award winning trainer Robert P. Tiller; Louis E. Cauz, Managing Director of the Hall of Fame and Woodbine Entertainment's Archivist and Historian; Quebec-based breeder Pierre Levesque; and the late Cliff Chapman, former publisher of The Canadian Sportsman. The newest inductees were elected by the respective 20-person thoroughbred and standardbred Election Committees.

Sam-Son Legacy Lives On...

The half-brother to Hall of Fame champion filly Dance Smartly, Smart Strike won six of eight lifetime starts, including the 1996 GI Phillip Iselin H. and GIII Salvator Mile. Trained by Mark Frostad for the late Ernie Samuel, the striking bay retired with earnings of \$337,376 after suffering a leg fracture in the fall of 1996. In 2007, Smart Strike set a single-season record for earnings by his progeny of more than \$14 million. The 16-year-old stallion, who stands at Lane's End Farm in Versailles, was represented by GI Preakness S. winner Curlin, who capped off the 2007 season with a victory in the GI Breeders' Cup Classic and a U.S. Horse of the Year title. Curlin also won the G1 Dubai World Cup earlier this March. Smart Strike's is also responsible for English Channel, winner of last year's GI Breeders' Cup Turf and eventual Turf champion.

Wilderness Song, winner of the GI Spinster S. in 1991, earned a Candian Champion Older mare title in 1992. Conditioned throughout her career by Jimmy Day, the bay won 15 of 37 starts before retiring in 1993 with earnings of \$1,482,005, placing her second among females in Canada, only behind her high-profile champion stable mate, Dance Smartly. Now 20 years of age, Wilderness Song is the dam of Go To The Sun, third in the 2004 Summer S.





New Zealand Thoroughbred Racing and the New Zealand Racing Board has given Racing Matamata approval to begin the final evaluation stage before beginning construction on the country's first synthetic track. Four venues were short-listed last year for the installation of a synthetic track: Awapuni, Cambridge, Matamata and Riccarton. After studying venue design briefs for all four, NZTR and NZRB selected Racing Matamata to begin working with the Synthetic Track Project Team and a civil engineering consultant to draw up a budget for installing the new surface at Matamata Racecourse. Explaining the decision to proceed with planning at Matamata, NZTR Chief Executive Paul Bittar said, "We selected Matamata for this final assessment stage principally because it meets the three key criteria that we set down. Namely, it provides a racing, trials, and training option; it services a large on-site, local and regional horse population; and it is well-positioned to deliver the best early measure as to the performance of the synthetic track."

New Zealand report cont.

Bittar continued, "Matamata also provides the optimum layout and integration of a synthetic track alongside a turf track. Its proposed 18-meter wide synthetic track on the outside of the course proper allows us to have 14 starters." Once the detailed design work is completed, it will be considered by the two boards before final approval is granted.
