## **OUT OF THE PARK**

James Barry's **Divine Park** (Chester House) was a dual Grade III winner coming off a huge effort, but had yet to prove himself against top competition. Yesterday,

the four-year-old colt did just that in one of the most prestigious races in the country, the GI Met Mile at Belmont. Capitalizing on the hot pace set by classy Commentator (Distorted Humor), Divine Park overhauled the veteran in deep stretch

en route to his first Grade I tally. "He is an outstanding horse," said winning trainer Kiaran McLaughlin afterward. "From Day 1, we never lost confidence in him. The five pounds [from Commentator, 122 to 117] helped us out a lot." Breaking from post three, Divine Park was unable to keep up early and settled in sixth as Commentator rolled along on the front through :22 2/5 and :44 2/5 fractions. As they hit the quarter pole in 1:09 3/5, it looked as if the stalking **First Defence** (Unbridled's Song) would take advantage of the quick pace, but Commentator fought off that foe under jockey John Velazquez. Alan Garcia, meanwhile, had Divine Park going best on the far outside, and the pair fought their way past at the sixteenth pole and were going away late. **Cont. p2**

## Early Promise...

Divine Park looked like he might be a late player on the three-year-old scene last year after winning his first three races in early spring, including the GIII Withers S. over C P West at Aqueduct in April. But a knee injury suffered just before an intended start in the GII Ohio Derby in June sent the progressive colt to the sidelines for the remainder of the summer. He made it back in time for the Dec. 26 GI Malibu S. at Santa Anita, but failed to land a punch and lost his unbeaten record when ninth.

Divine Park hardly made amends in his next effort, running up the track in the GII General George H. at Laurel Feb. 18, but a driving triumph in an Aqueduct





optional claimer Mar. 28 righted the ship. He came back to post an impressive five-length score over Grasshopper in the Apr. 30 GIII Westchester H.--winning the one-mile event at Belmont in 1:32 3/5--which earned him a spot in the Met Mile. Despite the big effort, or maybe because of it, Kiaran McLaughlin was worried about the timing between the two races. "This was a little close to the Westchester, but

when you have a prestigious race like the Met Mile, whether 22 days or 26 days, you just have to go for it," he said. "He's a great horse." For winning jockey Alan Garcia, the race set up perfectly. "My horse was so comfortable and relaxed," Garcia said. "I started asking him at the quarter-pole. He gave me everything I wanted." ## Honor in Defeat...

The seven-year-old gelding Commentator, who was making his first start since romping by 13 3/4 lengths in the Mar. 8 GII Richter Scale H. at Gulfstream, pleased both jockey and trainer. "He tried so hard, it was unbelievable, but it set up for someone else," said rider John Velazquez. "He put out everything I asked him to give." Added trainer Nick Zito, "It was a great race, we just got a bad break. [Jockey Javier Castellano, aboard First Defence] put a lot of pressure on us, first inside to make us three wide, and then outside. But I'm not complaining. He's a great horse and I'm very proud. The [GI] Whitney H. [at Saratoga July 26] would possibly be his next start." The Met Mile's final time of 1:36.91 was the second slowest in the last 60 years; Exciting Story went in 1:37 in 2001.

Since finishing third in the El Cajon S. over Del Mar's main track last August, Daytona has failed to take the prize just once in seven starts, a streak that includes yesterday's driving score in the Shoemaker. Among his conquests have been the GI Hollywood Derby in November, the GII San Gabriel H. in December and the GIII Fair Grounds H. in February. Third to Proudinsky (Ger) in the GII Mervin H. Muniz Jr. H. at Fair Grounds Mar. 8, Daytona entered this off a neck win over Hyperbaric in the GII Arcadia H. at Santa Anita Apr. 5.

Breaking from the far outside, Daytona and jockey Alex Solis raced up to join Ever a Friend on the lead, but eased off and allowed their rival to post sensible :23 4/5 and :46 3/5 fractions. Daytona tired of the waiting game as they raced down the backstretch, and, by the time they rounded the far turn, the two horses

were neck and neck for the lead. It remained that way until the sixteenth pole, when Daytona flashed an burst of speed that Ever a Friend was unable to answer. Despite the brilliant finish, jockey Alex Solis said the race was won early. "My horse was so relaxed, at that point I felt I was in control," he explained. "I knew this horse could sit, because he's a way better horse than he used to be. You can do just about anything with him now." Trainer Dan Hendricks also felt comfortable with the

way the race was unfolding. "When I saw that they went:23 and change and he was so relaxed, I wasn't worried," he said. "Tyler's [Baze] horse broke super and just was right on the lead easy from the inside. Alex just did perfect. It was probably his most impressive race to date." Hendricks said that he hadn't yet mapped out Daytona's season. "There are a lot of different races; we'll talk it over and pick it out," he said. "The horse can run back in three weeks or he can run back in seven weeks. There's a lot of good races going a mile on the turf." grass fillies in the country with wins in the GI John C. Mabee H. in August and GI Matriarch S. in November. The bay, who had run a troubled eighth in the GI Breeders' Cup Filly & Mare Turf preceding the Matriarch, was purchased privately by Lael Stables from breeders Ken and Sarah Ramsey in January and was sportingly kept in training. Remaining in the care of trainer Bobby Frankel, her season got off to a lackluster start, however, when she was unable to close into dawdling fractions in the Jenny Wiley, running fifth by 1 3/4 lengths to Rutherienne.

Shipping west from her Belmont Park base, Precious Kitten was favored to turn the tables here. Precious Kitten broke alertly under jockey Rafael Bejarano, but was coaxed off the lead as Diamond Diva bounded out to set quick :22 1/5, :45 4/5 and 1:08 4/5 splits. Bejarano asked for more as they rounded the turn, and the pair wrested the lead away from the pacesetter before powering away. "I let her break and tried to get her to the lead, but when I saw that other horse rush up, I let her go and sat second," said Bejarano. "I was a little surprised that the other horse wanted the lead, but my filly was very relaxed with the trip." Added Humberto Ascanio, assistant to Frankel, "I don't know if he will ship her to New York or keep her here; he's going to let me know later on." Giant Gizmo won a Santa Anita allowance by three lengths in late December before making his stakes debut in the GII Strub S. Feb. 2. A well-beaten sixth that day to Monterey Jazz, he returned to notch an optional claiming victory Feb. 25, then received a twomonth break before trying stakes competition again in the GIII Alysheba S. over a sloppy Churchill Downs strip on Kentucky Oaks Day May 2. He handled the off-going in a sharp 3 3/4-length romp, and was looking for his first victory over a fast conventional dirt surface here. Under jockey Garrett Gomez, he broke out at the start and found himself in a four-wide position on the first turn. He moved up to striking position on the backstretch, made the lead nearing the quarter pole while still wide, and edged away for his second straight graded win. "I was a little disappointed going into the first turn," said Gomez. "I thought I would [only] be three wide. He was traveling well, and at about the half-mile pole, he was telling me to let him go ahead and do a little something. So I went ahead and let him out a notch and when we turned for home, he did all the rest. The horse I was really most worried about was ... Steve Asmussen's [Zanjero]. I've ridden him and I know what kind of horse he is. I knew he would be coming late, so I didn't want to sit there and wait on him. I wanted to make sure I got a jump on him." Freshened after that effort, she improved to be third in the Apr. 18 GIII Doubledogdare S. at Keeneland and was the 2-1 second choice to progress yet further here. Indescribable was rated in fifth through a pedestrian half in :49.47 and was caught in traffic on the turn, but jockey Jeremy Rose maneuvered his mount to the outside and she finished well, catching Leah's Secret in the last jumps. what had been done to Big Brown's quarter crack. "We just basically made a little trench and got him down to the wall, just about to the laminae; that's the sensitive part of the hoof," he said. "And we put in one set of sutures, which is like stitches, made of stainless steel wire, and we drew that crack together. And probably [Tuesday], he'll be in much better shape. Of course, Rick will check him first thing in the morning. I'm actually going to be at Monmouth, but everything should just keep progressing. What we're trying to

do is stabilize that heel so we can get quicker healing." Big Brown is scheduled to make his lone pre-Belmont breeze Saturday morning, though Dutrow said that could be moved to next Monday or Tuesday. Of plans for the upcoming week, Dutrow said, "We can most likely jog him [Tuesday], but I don't want to do that. I want lan to look at him again before we actually go to the track. If he looks great [Tuesday], I still won't jog him. I most likely will put Michelle [Nevin, exercise rider] on him and ride him around the shedrow. And I would be very happy if that happens. It's a little hiccup on the way over there, that's all it is. The time he has missed means nothing to me or him. This could also be a very good thing because he burnt his heels [in the Preakness] and it gives him time to get over that. No way missing four, five or six days is going to affect the outcome and his racing ability when he runs."

## Denis of Cork Sharp in Work at Churchill...

Mr. and Mrs. William Warren's **Denis of Cork** (Harlan's Holiday) turned in a sharp five-furlong drill at Churchill Downs Monday as he readies for another crack at Big Brown in the GI Belmont S. June 7. Third to that foe in the GI Kentucky Derby, Denis of Cork stopped the clock in :59 4/5 yesterday, the third-fastest of 21 at the

distance. Jockey Robby Albarado, who has the call in the Belmont, was aboard Denis of Cork, who galloped out six furlongs in 1:13. "He's training beautifully," said trainer David Carroll. "For two weeks after the Derby, it just took him a little bit of time to get back on his feet and get his energy back, but the last week he's training beautifully. He had a good work last week, but this week we

wanted a bit more from him. I just told Robby to let him go off 'twelves' and let him finish up and gallop out, and he did everything beautifully." The work marked the first time that Albarado had been in the saddle aboard Denis of Cork since the colt's victory in the GIII Southwest S. at Oaklawn Feb. 18. Albarado is replacing Calvin Borel, who rode Denis of Cork in the Derby. "He went really well, I thought it was a great work for him," said Albarado. "It was a nice, long maintenance work. He went fast, too, and was within himself. I'm excited about him and it sets him up great for the Belmont." Albarado said he's noticed a change in Denis of Cork from earlier in the year. "He's matured a lot and gotten a lot stronger. He must have a big set of lungs on him, because he gallops out really well and he refuses to pull up--I mean, he just wants to keep going and going. So I think the mile-and-a-half [of the Belmont] is going to be conducive to his style." Denis of Cork is scheduled for a final pre-Belmont breeze next Monday before flying to New York the following day. As of Monday, the expected field for the Belmont was: Anak Nakal (Victory Gallop), Big Brown (Boundary), Casino Drive (Mineshaft), Icabad Crane (Jump Start), Macho Again (Macho Uno), Tale of Ekati (Tale of the Cat) and Tomcito (Street Cry {Ire}). Trainer Todd Pletcher's Ready's Echo (More Than Ready) and Behindatthebar (Forest Wildcat) are also still possible.

## Tagg Not Pleased With Slow 'Ekati' Work ...

Trainer Barclay Tagg was not too pleased after GI Kentucky Derby fourth **Tale of Ekati** (Tale of the Cat) worked six furlongs in 1:18.97 at Belmont Park yesterday under jockey Eibar Coa. "Two works before a Classic race, and this is not what I wanted," muttered Tagg, who watched the breeze aboard Derby hero Funny Cide. "It's no wonder I'm always in a bad mood." Tagg said he didn't know what his plans would be now for the winner of Aqueduct's GI Wood Memorial S. Despite the slow time, Tale of Ekati was the fastest of three workers going six furlongs.

**CURLIN BREEZES AT CHURCHILL** Stonestreet Stables and Midnight Cry Stables' Curlin (Smart Strike) continued to train forwardly for his return to competition with a strong six-furlong work Monday at Churchill. Curlin, who worked in company with fellow four-year-old Forty Grams (Distorted Humor), finished on even terms with his workmate and covered the distance under exercise rider Carlos Rosas over a "fast" track in 1:12 1/5. The two works by the Steve Asmussen trainees were the only six-furlong moves on the Monday morning work tab. It marked the fourth published work for Curlin since he returned to serious training after his victory in the G1 Dubai World Cup Mar. 29. Asmussen, who flew to Texas later in the day for the Lone Star Million card, was on hand for the move. "I think he went well," said Asmussen. "He wasn't as smooth as he is when he's perfect, but he went really well." The GI Stephen Foster H. at Churchill June 14 has been mentioned as a possible target for Curlin's return, though nothing has been set in stone. Also on the worktab Monday were the Asmussen trainees Pyro (Pulpit) and Kodiak Kowboy (Posse), who worked in company together through five furlongs in an identical 1:03 3/5. Pyro is scheduled to run next in the GIII Northern Dancer S. at Churchill June 14.

CONQUEST DECISION IMMINENT Moyglare Stud's Casual Conquest (Ire) (Hernando {Fr}) faces a crucial racecourse gallop at Leopardstown on Wednesday as connections seek answers to the question surrounding his participation in the June 7 G1 Epsom Derby. Not entered at present, the Dermot Weld-trained G2 Derrinstown Stud Derby Trial winner needs to be supplemented on Monday if showing the right signs. "He's going to work left-handed on Wednesday after the races up at Leopardstown," the owner-breeder's Racing Manager Stan Cosgrove told *PA Sport*. "We'll make a decision after Wednesday. He's a big horse and we're just a little bit afraid of him coming down the hill. If there are 17 or 18 runners at Epsom, he could be in trouble and that's what we're worried about."

TAJ ON COURSE Sheikh Hamdan bin Rashid Al Maktoum's G3 Dee S. winner Tajaaweed (Dynaformer) continues to please en route to the June 7 G1 Epsom Derby. The Sir Michael Stoute-trained colt's success in the May 9 Chester trial received a boost on Saturday when the runner-up Unnefer (Fr) took the Listed Fairway S. The owner's Racing Manager Angus Gold told PA Sport, "Obviously, we were thrilled with him last time as he did it very well at Chester and as long as everything progresses smoothly in the next 10 days, I hope we'll be there. It was nice to see Unnefer at the weekend, it never does any harm. Maybe there isn't a standout in the Derby, but there are obviously some very decent horses in there. We'll see if he's up to it."

TUSCAN TEAM WILL APPEAL Trainer John Murphy has announced that he will lodge an appeal against the disqualification of Hubie de Burgh's Tuscan Evening (Ire) (Oasis Dream {GB}) from second to fourth in Sunday's G1 Irish 1000 Guineas at The Curragh. Beaten a head by Halfway to Heaven (Ire) in the mile Classic, she was placed behind the eventual fourthplace finisher Caribbean Sunset (Ire) after being judged to have carried that rival off a true line in the closing stages. "I thought it was grossly unfair and I think, while they did make contact, it definitely did not stop the other filly from her impulsion or the jockey from riding her," he told PA Sport. "The filly has come out of the race well. The [June 20] G1 Coronation S. at Royal Ascot is Plan A and we are going to enter her for the [June 18] G3 Jersey S. as well."

Although quality, rather than quantity, should always be the hallmark of any stallion's career, it remains a considerable shame that Kingmambo's opportunities have been restricted by ongoing health issues in recent years. According to Jockey Club figures, the Lane's End resident covered 65 mares in 2006 and 2007, having covered only 37 mares during an abbreviated 2005 season (when he was still a comparative youngster of 15).

The Classic-winning son of Mr. Prospector had previously covered around 100 mares in each of the four seasons from 2001 to 2004, but had tackled as many as 133 mares in 2000. Clearly his recent output has been rather seriously curtailed.

This has to represent a major setback for the Thoroughbred industry, considering the tremendous impact Kingmambo has made at Classic level, especially in Europe. Last weekend saw his son Henrythenavigator complete the 2000 Guineas double in England and Ireland, and that wasn't the only reminder of Kingmambo's growing influence. The following day's Tattersalls Gold Cup became the second successive Group 1 victory for Duke of Marmalade, whose dam is by Kingmambo. The previous weekend's main event in England, the G1 Juddmonte Lockinge S., had fallen to Creachadoir, a colt by King's Best, Kingmambo's previous 2000 Guineas winner. King's Best remains in fine form, completing a fine sprint double with his threeyear-old sons Calming Influence and Ancien Regime at Newmarket three days ago. We also saw another of Kingmambo's sons, Dubai Destination, come up with his second group winner from his first crop when Rosa Del Dubai scored in Italy, while Lemon Drop Kid's Saturday treble included Bronze Cannon, a possible Derby contender.

Bearing in mind that Kingmambo won the French 2000 Guineas and is out of the great Miesque, winner of 1000 Guineas in England and France, it is no great

surprise that his Classic impact has centred on Europe's various Guineas races. In addition to Henrythenavigator and King's Best, he has supplied two winners of the 1000 Guineas, in Russian Rhythm and Virginia Waters, and two of the French version, in Bluemamba and Divine Proportions, the latter also winner of the French Oaks.

However, his Classic success certainly hasn't been limited to a mile. As he has often been used as a means of injecting speed into stoutly bred mares, many of Kingmambo's offspring have shown more stamina than he did. He has had three Classic winners over a mile and a half, with Lemon Drop Kid taking the Belmont S., King Kamehameha the Japanese Derby and Light Shift the Oaks. He has even sired a St Leger winner in Rule of Law, and these longer Classic successes have tempted Henrythenavigator's connections to consider trying their outstanding miler in the Derby.

I am all for a bit of boldness--especially boldness which helps guarantee that the Derby remains a supreme test of the Thoroughbred--but can Henrythenavigator become only the second 2000 Guineas winner since Nijinsky in 1970 to win the Derby? That statistic underlines how unusual it is nowadays for a three-year-old colt to possess that rare combination of speed, stamina, agility and soundness required to win classics over a mile at Newmarket and a mile and a half at Epsom.

His connections' enthusiasm is based largely on the fact that his dam, Sequoyah, was a good fourth in the Irish Oaks on her only attempt at a mile and a half and is by Sadler's Wells, a sire of two Derby winners.

However, there are also some contra-indications. Kingmambo was never asked to tackle more than a mile in a 13-race career, and Sequoyah raced mainly at up to a mile, gaining her finest victory in the G1 Moyglare Stud S. over seven furlongs as a juvenile. The next dam, Brigid, was also untried beyond a mile, and Brigid's talented sister Or Vision did her winning at up to seven furlongs.

Sequoyah's previous visit to Kingmambo resulted in Queen Cleopatre, a Group 3 mile winner whose career ended before she had a chance of trying 1 1/2 miles. The furthest distance she tried was the 1 5/16 miles of the French Oaks, in which she just missed second place. There is consequently good reason for thinking that Henrythenavigator will stay 1 1/4 miles, especially as he is amenable to restraint. But he raises the perennial question of whether he will be able to produce his usual acceleration at the end of a truly run mile and a half. Much will depend on the state of the going and on whether any of the main contenders--such as Curtain Call--is prepared to force the gallop, to expose any non-stayers.

Sequoyah is a sister to Listen, winner of last year's G1 Fillies' Mile and she is also a sister-in-blood to Or Vision's son Saffron Walden, winner of the 1999 Irish 2000 Guineas for Aidan O'Brien before finishing only seventh in the Derby. Saffron Walden's high-class sister Insight never quite tackled a mile and a half, her longest race in a 17-race career being the Breeders' Cup Filly and Mare Turf over 1 3/8 miles. She took the Prix de l'Opera and the E.P. Taylor over shorter distances and finished a good third in the French Oaks. The records of Saffron Walden and Insight, coupled with the speed shown by Sequoyah as a juvenile, suggest that a mile and a half was a little too far for them.

As there is nothing in Kingmambo's pedigree to suggest that he can compensate for any possible weakness, I believe that a Derby victory by Henrythenavigator will owe more to sheer class than to stamina. He may be inbred 4x3 to Northern Dancer, but he is also inbred 3x4 to Raise A Native (and 4x4 to Special).

There is also conflicting evidence among Kingmambo's other good performers out of Sadler's Wells mares. El Condor Pasa, the Japanese superstar, recorded Group 1 victories over a mile and 1 1/2 miles as a three-year-old, and the very useful colts Akarem and Shahin both stayed at least 1 1/2 miles. Virginia Waters, on the other hand, seemed best at a mile, and Divine Proportions reverted to a mile after her French Oaks success.

It has been said that any horse certain to stay the Derby distance is probably going to be too slow to win. Well, Henrythenavigator certainly isn't too slow, but he will need to be something of a superhorse to add the Derby to his victory in the six-furlong Coventry S. at two--a double last achieved by the exceptional Mill Reef in 1970. But it would be fun to see him try.

## NO END TO DIRE STRAITS by Christa Riebel

Normally, the race meetings at Baden-Baden are a guarantee not only for great sport, but also for record betting turnover. Alas, those days appear long gone as Germany continues to suffer in its desperate situation. While the German Thoroughbred's worldwide reputation has been on the increase in recent years, sadly the domestic industry is unable to follow suit. All await the much needed structural reformation, but no information is forthcoming regarding it's nature and delivery date.

This year's Baden-Baden Spring Meeting saw the figures down from last year once again, with roughly €900,000 in betting turnover registered accounting for a drop of 15 percent on 2007. At least the action stood up, with the relative newcomer to the staying division Caudillo (Ger) (Acatenango {Ger}) capturing the G3 Betty Barclay-Rennen (See Friday's TDN). The meeting's highlight was the G2 Grosser Preis der Badischen Unternehmen (See Monday's TDN), which saw the unbeaten It's Gino (Ger) (Perugino) follow up his win in Longchamp's Listed Prix Seymour.

Among the week's promising maiden winners was Gestut Ittlingen's homebred Narcisco (Ger) (Fantastic Light), a three-year-old half-sister to the 2006 GII Las Palmas H. winner Beautyandthebeast (GB) from the family of the 2005 G1 Coronation S. heroine Maid's Causeway (Ire). She was a winner at Cologne on Sunday (See Tuesday's TDN) and was followed four days later at Frankfurt by Team Valor's sophomore Wunderkind (Ger) (Pivotal {GB}), a half-sister to two stakes winners including the 2001 GIII Will Rogers H. scorer Media Mogul (GB) (See Saturday's TDN). Stall Carpe Diem's highly-regarded three-year-old filly Deinum (Ger) (Sholokhov {Ire}) lived up to expectations by taking her maiden at Baden-Baden on Sunday (See Monday's TDN), while Gestut Wittekindshof's sophomore filly Night Heart (Ire) (High Chaparral {Ire}) also delivered the goods at Mulheim (See today's TDN). Her dam is a half-sister to the 1996 G2 Preis der Diana (German Oaks) heroine Night Petticoat (Ger), who in turn has produced the 2002 G1 Deutsches Derby winner Next Desert (Ire) and 2003 Diana heroine Next Gina (Ger).

The Badener Jugendpreis on the final day marks the first two-year-old race of the season and this year's winner was the filly **Eternal Flash (GB)** (One Cool Cat), whose sire continues to make a promising start to his stallion career (See Monday's TDN). She is a grand-daughter of the 1997 G1 Irish 1000 Guineas runner-up Strawberry Roan (Ire), who is a sister to the dual Classic-winning and Group One-producing champion Imagine (Ire).
