Triple Threats

BIG BROWN RETURNS TO THE TRACK

Big Brown (Boundary) jogged 1 1/2 miles over a muddy Belmont Park main track yesterday morning, the first exercise he has had since developing a quarter crack on the inside of his left front foot late last week.

"I guess we surprised everybody today," commented Mike lavarone, co-principal of IEAH Stables. "I think the decision to go to the track this morning was made late [Monday] night. Big Brown was just getting too aggressive in the barn. He needed to go to the track." Big Brown first developed hoof problems last fall, which ultimately cost him a chance at the Breeders' Cup Juvenile Turf. He had been sound through his four starts this season before this recurrence. He has been treated since by noted foot specialist Ian McKinlay. "We were con-

cerned on Friday when the quarter crack was first discovered," lavarone stated. "But Ian McKinlay had told us then that this was a straightforward quarter crack.

He has been on top of it ever since." He continued, "[Trainer] Rick [Dutrow] said he could breeze anytime up to Tuesday. We weren't concerned about the track today, even with the rain last night. The track wasn't that bad,

and quite frankly, as aggressive as he's been, it was safer for him to be on the track than in the barn."

High Rock may be joined by another Bousquet runner, Mayweather (GB) (Nayef), after Jean-Claude Rouget dwindled his initial entry to two. Andre Fabre could have a trio taking on the filly, headed by Sean Mulryan's G1 Criterium International winner Thewayyouare (Kingmambo). He was sixth in the G1 Poule d'Essai des Poulains at Longchamp last time May 11, and the owner's Racing Manager Herve Barjot expects him to have progressed off that effort.

"He was the only horse to finish really well and was not given a hard time in the Poulains," Barjot told *Racing Post*. "He is in very good form at the moment, but the Jockey-Club could be a bit of a folly as it is likely there will be 20 runners, so you will need a good draw and some luck during the race."

Fabre is also likely to saddle Wertheimer et Frere's G2 Prix Greffulhe winner Prospect Wells (Fr) (Sadler's Wells) as well as Democrate (GB) (Dalakhani {Ire}), who captured the G2 Prix Hocquart for owners Ecurie Skymarc Farm, Nils-Petter Gill and Mme de Moussac. Should he run, Democrate will be wearing new silks, however; it was announced yesterday that the colt has been sold to Sheikh Mohammed.


Aidan O'Brien has cut his numbers down to just Susan Magnier's G2 Royal Lodge S. and Breeders' Cup Juvenile Turf runner-up **Achill Island (Ire)** (Sadler's Wells) and the maiden **Sligo (GB)** (Sadler's Wells).

Other notables left in the 1 5/16-mile contest are Alec Head's G1 Criterium de Saint-Cloud hero Full of Gold (Fr) (Gold Away {Ire}), Moyglare Stud's G2 Derrinstown Stud Derby Trial winner Casual Conquest (Ire) (Hernando {Fr}), Godolphin's G1 Racing Post Trophy hero Ibn Khaldun (Dubai Destination) and Khalid Abdullah's G3 Leopardstown 2000 Guineas Trial S. scorer Famous Name (GB) (Dansili {GB}), who sidestepped Saturday's G1 Irish 2000 Guineas due to the fast conditions at The Curragh. The owner/breeder's Racing Manager Teddy Grimthorpe confirmed the Dermot Weld-trained colt a certain runner as long as the ground is on the soft side.

"He definitely would like some cut in the ground and it has been raining at Chantilly, so the intention would be to go," Weld commented. "It was far too firm for him at The Curragh, and I'm confident we made the right decision there. The form of the Leopardstown Guineas Trial has been quite solid."

Going conditions at Chantilly are currently good to soft, with more rain forecast before the weekend.

REDOUTE'S COLT TOPS NATIONAL OPENER

The Magic Millions National Sale got off to a promising start on the Gold Coast Tuesday during the first of four weanling sessions. The day was highlighted by a

39-lot dispersal from the late Robert Sangster's Swettenham Stud, which produced the session-topping A\$700,000 Redoute's Choice (Aus)--Twist My Heart colt (sirecam video). Local outfit Blue Sky Thoroughbreds purchased the colt, who is closely related to champion juvenile filly Fashions

Afield (Aus), a dual Group 1 winner in Australia.

"He's just a magnificent colt," Blue Sky's Julian Blaxland said of hip 119. "On the strength of the sale, we are delighted to get him for this sort of money." Blaxland said the colt was purchased for a syndicate of owners. "We're undecided at the moment whether he will come back through the sales as a yearling or whether we'll keep him to race."

Despite a pedigree steeped in Australian influences, the colt's dam, the Dayjur mare Twist My Heart, was bred and raced in America. Twist My Heart's dam, Wrap Around (Aus) (Bletchingly {Aus}), was a Group 1 winner in Australia in 1992 before being shipped to the States, where she won two of three for trainer Barclay Tagg, including a minor stakes at The Meadowlands. Twist My Heart was Wrap Around's third foal. Knocked down to Frank Stronach for \$100,000 at the 1997 Keeneland September Sale, Twist My Heart was stakesplaced in the U.S. before being purchased privately by Australian interests. Wrap Around's first foal, meanwhile, was the Wild Again mare Attire, who was also exported to Australia. That mare is the dam of the firstclass Fashions Afield, whose wins included the G1 A.J.C. Sires Produce S. and G1 Flight S.

Don't Swett It...

The second-highest-priced weanling at the National sale was an Encosta de Lago (Aus) filly (<u>sirecam video</u>) who was knocked down to Emerald Thoroughbreds' Bill Benson for A\$680,000. The filly, who also hailed from the Swettenham draft, was produced by Group 1 winner Larrocha (Aus) (Danehill).

Swettenham Stud's Adam Sangster, Robert's son, said he was delighted with the interest and prices on the farm's prized draft, which accounted for the majority of the day's top prices.

"I am particularly delighted with the cross section of purchasers," Sangster said. "It was glad to see such strong bidding on the lots. It's always sad to see the end of an era, but I'm excited about the new journey ahead. There's big shoes to fill!"

The Swettenham dispersal helped boost the session average to a record A\$68,917, up 34 percent from 2007's A\$51,428 despite the sale of a \$A1.15-million weanling last term. The clearance rate slumped a bit, however, from 89.6 percent a year ago to 84.3 percent. Far fewer horses sold in 2008, 150 compared to 215.

Magic Millions Managing Director David Chester said he was pleased with how the first session went.

"There was great value on offer across all levels of the market today," Chester said. "The astute buyers are here, and they are delighted with how the sale is going for them. The Swettenham Stud dispersal was, not surprisingly, well received by buyers, and again we thank the Sangster family for the honour of offering such a wonderful selection of young horses."

Chester added, "We've got some really attractive weanlings to come over the next few days, and we're sure the smart pinhookers will be in full swing."



The Belmont Stakes and Big Brown's bid for immortality to become racing's first Triple Crown winner since Affirmed in 1978 are now less than two weeks away. Big Brown went back to training today following a few days of down time due to minor hoof woes that we

now believe and hope are behind him. Having won the Derby and Preakness already this month, and clearly fit, the missed time shouldn't hurt and trainer Richard Dutrow Jr. has said if he can manage the colt the way he'd like to in the week before the Belmont Stakes, all should be fine.

Makes sense to us. Moving on... The Derby and Preakness wins were incredible experiences for all involved, but to win the Triple Crown would be beyond belief. Of

course, it has been well documented that IEAH Stables has New York roots. Co-presidents Michael lavarone and Richard Schiavo are from New York and our office is in Garden City.

I was born in Queens, moved to Valley Stream as a child, and went on to graduate from Elmont Memorial High School and St. John's University--yep, never far from Belmont Park and Aqueduct Racetrack, and wouldn't have had it any other way.

Belmont Park is particularly near and dear to my heart, as my parents, uncles, grandparents, etc., brought me there as far back as baby carriage days. My dad still tells the story of my uncles forgetting me as a toddler at a Belmont Park backyard television monitor, returning to my dad, and his asking them, "Where's Michael?"

Of course, the "Oops," look was clear on their faces, and all returned to the television to find me watching the horses as I had been when they left. I guess I never stopped watching.

Fast forward to high school--several strolls from class through the Elmont backstreets landed me at Belmont--and college, and an internship/scholarship placed me in the New York Racing Association press office at Saratoga between my junior and senior years. By the Belmont fall meet, I had a full-time job and was far more interested there than at school. Hey, I did still graduate with honors.

I worked for NYRA for about five years, gained great experience, met many who I can still count as friends today, had plenty of fun, and walked away with incredible memories.

I remember working at the track in 1998 when Real Quiet's Triple Crown bid fell a nose short to Victory Gallop's charge. Everything about it was awesome--the photo, the crowd rocking as I watched in the clubhouse, Tom Durkin's call. Of course, Kent Desormeaux, who

will ride Big Brown, was aboard Real Quiet, so we'll quickly forget about that and move on.

For as long as I can remember, watching tapes of the many Affirmed vs. Alydar battles have been highlights for me. In particular, their race-long Belmont Stakes fight with Affirmed's Crown on the line has been my favorite race for as long as I can remember. Here's hoping that changes on Saturday, June 7. --M Sherack

Duke of Marmalade, from Danehill's final crop (fouryear-olds this year) clinched his place in Coolmore's stallion yard with his second 10-furlong Group 1 win of the season in Sunday's G1 Tattersalls Gold Cup, following his earlier victory in France's G1 Prix Ganay. It was a dream weekend for Coolmore and Ballydoyle trainer Aidan O'Brien, who won no fewer than seven races over the two-day Irish Guineas meeting at the Curragh. The highlight, of course, was the win by Henrythenavigator (Kingmambo)--with a Racing Post Rating [RPR] of 126, which roughly translates to a Beyer 114-over New Approach (Galileo) in the GI Irish 2000 Guineas. They also won the G1 Irish 1000 Guineas with previous G1 Poule d'Essai des Pouliches third Halfway to Heaven (Pivotal), as well as the six-furlong G3 Greenlands S. with last year's G1 Poule d'Essai des Poulains hero Astronomer Royal (Danzig) and the Listed Marble Hill S. for two-year-olds with a Storm Cat filly, Heart Shaped. O'Brien also won the G3 Gallinule S. with his wife's Hebridean, who was bred to be a jumper, being from the second crop of the Coolmore jumps sire Bach (Caerleon), out of a mare by another Coolmore jumps sire, Dr. Massini (Sadler's Wells). They'd probably have won with the stable cat if they could have found a suitable race. Interestingly, both Guineas winners are by non-Coolmore sires, Kingmambo and Pivotal.

While a dream weekend like that dominates the headlines, there has been another developing story which is good news for the Coolmore legions this month, and that is the resurgence of their North American arm Ashford's third-crop sire (first four-year-olds), Johannesburg (Hennessy). The world's top two-year-old of 2001, Johannesburg went seven-for-seven, jumping from winning Newmarket's six-furlong G1 Middle Park S. to a convincing decision over Repent in the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile, run over 8 1/2 furlongs at Belmont, Historically, some top two-year-olds who never won again--Raise a Native, Sharpen Up, and his son, Diesis, are recent examples--have gone on to be top sires, but they don't get there by just siring good two-year-olds. They pass on the speed and precocity they displayed themselves, but they can only become top sires by consistently producing older horses, too, who go on to be good horses.

As we noted a few weeks ago, Johannesburg has been consistently upstaged among North American third-crop sires (Table, p8) by Darley's Street Cry (Machiavellian), sire of 2007 GI Kentucky Derby winner Street Sense in his first crop.

In both percentage terms (percentage of stakes winners to foals in their first crops, for example), as well as in terms of total Northern Hemisphere-sired progeny earnings, Street Cry is still well ahead of Johannesburg. Make no mistake, Street Cry is an absolutely topdrawer, World Top 12 sire. He has added two new graded stakes winners from his first crop this year: GI Apple Blossom H. winner Zenyatta and GIII Los Angeles H. winner Street Boss. That takes his total to 12 stakes winners from his first crop of 84 named foals for an almost unheard-of, these days, 14.3-percent stakes winners to foals.

Johannesburg has been on quite a roll recently. In the last three weeks, Johannesburg has sired no fewer than seven stakes horses, four of them stakes winners, headed by Sageburg, who upset better-fancied stablemate Darjina (Zamindar) in the G1 Prix d'Ispahan. Last weekend he ran one-three in Belmont's GII Vagrancy H. with the four-year-old fillies Looky Yonder and Baroness Thatcher, and his three-year-old colt Eaton's Gift, previously winner of the GII Swale S., captured the six-furlong Matt Winn S. at Churchill Downs on Preakness Day. Looky Yonder's win takes Johannesburg's total of first-crop stakes winners to 13, from 143 named foals, which is 9.1-percent stakes winners to foals; that's not in the same league as Street Cry's, but well above the 6-percent standard which, like it or not, now prevails.

Moreover, Johannesburg has, not surprisingly, now shot into the lead among North American third-crop sires in 2008 progeny earnings (from Bloodhorse.com), over \$230,000 ahead of now second-placed Jump Start (this year), and over \$500,000 ahead of Street Cry, currently fifth in 2008 progeny earnings. Mind you, Street Cry is still more than \$2 million in front of Johannesburg overall. However, Street Sense made over \$4.3 million of Street Cry's total of \$9.8 million to date; if you subtracted the top earner for each (Johannesburg's is Scat Daddy, \$1.3 million), Johannesburg would be \$1 million in front of Street Cry. On the other hand, Johannesburg had almost 50 percent more named foals in his first two crops than did Street Cry; in theory, he should have higher progeny earnings.

As I see it, here's what it all adds up to: Street Cry is already a member of that most elite of stallion clubs, what I call the World Top 12 (why not World Top 10? Because there are usually 12). Johannesburg has solidly established himself among the World Second 12. After a month like this, though, he too, is hovering on the fringes of the top 12, if not positively pounding on the door.

Just as Street Cry is \$2 million in front of him in terms of lifetime progeny earnings from Northern Hemisphere-sired crops, Johannesburg is \$1.6 million in

front of now third-placed Orientate (Mt.

Livermore), who has edged about \$100,000 ahead of Include (Broad Brush). As we noted when we reviewed these in some detail Apr. 30, the top 10 of this sire class all stand in Kentucky--no imports vet--and outside of the top two, all now have lifetime (Northern Hemisphere-sired) prog-

eny earnings between \$4.4 and \$6.2 million. The same 10 sires are also the top 10 on the 2008 third-crop list. The most upwardly mobile of these, as we noted four weeks ago, is Jump Start (A.P. Indy), now second in 2008 progeny earnings to Johannesburg. Interestingly, the first eight sires of this second 10, ranked 11th through 18th, all have cumulative progeny earnings from \$2.1 to \$3.3 million, and all stand, or stood (Three Wonders unfortunately had to be put down) outside Kentucky, though at least two of them, Came Home and Buddha, started out there.





"Following declines at Barretts's May sale, Fasig-Tipton's Mid-Atlantic Two-Year-Old Sale was down 14 percent in gross and 19 percent in average, with a low (for this sale) 50 percent clearance rate of those catalogued. With OBS June to come (and they've nearly been up all year), the North American Two-Year-Old market is down eight percent in gross, with seven percent fewer horses catalogued and sold from last year, so the overall average is down fractionally, less than two percent. Slightly more than half the horses catalogued have been sold in the ring.






