NASHOBA'S KEY DIES

Multiple Grade I winner **Nashoba's Key** (Silver Hawk--Nashoba {Ire}, by Caerleon) was euthanized yesterday morning after suffering a catastrophic injury to her left hock. Bred in California by her owner Warren B. Wil-



liamson, the five-year-old won the first seven starts of her career, including the GI Vanity H., the GII Milady Breeders' Cup H. and the GII Clement L. Hirsch H. over sythetic tracks and the GI Yellow Ribbon S. on the turf. A 3-1 chance in the GI Breeders'

Nashoba's Key (2003-2008) Cup Filly and Mare Turf, the bay Horsephotos endured a tough trip over the boggy going, but was beaten

just two lengths in fourth. In two starts this season, she was runner-up in the Sunshine Millions Filly and Mare Turf before taking the GI Santa Margarita H. Mar. 9. "In a freak accident at 5:30 a.m. this morning at Hollywood Park, Nashoba's Key kicked the wall of her pen and broke her hind leg," trainer Carla Gaines said in a one-paragraph release. "She was euthanized shortly thereafter. She brought a lot of joy to everyone's lives that were lucky enough to be associated with her and we will all miss her very much." Nashoba's Key posted a record of 10-8-1-0 and earnings of \$1,252,090.

PANTY RAID RETIRED

Glencrest Farm and Dan Tayloe's Panty Raid (Include --Adventurous Di, by Private Account), a Grade I winner on turf and Polytrack and a Grade II winner on the dirt, has been retired from racing due to a torn suspensory. Bred in Kentucky by Heaven Trees Farm, the dark bay filly was a \$110,000 Fasig-Tipton Kentucky yearling purchase, then was resold to Glencrest for \$275,000 as a Keeneland April Two-Year-Old in 2006. Victorious in one start that season, she took the GII Black-Eyed Susan S. in May and displayed her versatility by annexing the GI American Oaks in her first and only try on the turf last July. She added a score in the GI Juddmonte Spinster S. in the fall and was one of three Todd Pletcher-trained sophomore fillies to become a finalist for the Eclipse Award. She retires with a career record of 10-5-1-1 and earnings of \$1,052,380, but is not scheduled to be bred in 2008.



Prado Named on Casino Drive...

Jockey Edgar Prado, who dashed the Triple Crown aspirations of War Emblem and Smarty Jones with massive upsets in the GI Belmont S., has been tabbed to ride second favorite **Casino Drive** (Mineshaft) in the final jewel of this year's series June 7. "The reason we decided on Edgar was his experience in the Belmont. I think he is the best choice for the " said Nobutaka Tada, racing manager for Japanese businessman Hidetoshi Yamamoto. "On behalf of the owner and the



trainer [Kazuo Fujisawa], we appreciate the interest from all of the jockeys from all over the country in riding him in the Belmont. The fact that so many jockeys were interested in riding him encouraged us even more to run in the Belmont. There are so many good jockeys here and it was a very difficult decision to pick up the right one." Prado will be riding in his ninth Belmont, having upset the 2002 renewal with 70-1 Sarava before spoiling the most recent Triple Crown bid

with 36-1 Birdstone in 2004. Meanwhile, Casino Drive was out for a "vigorous gallop" Wednesday morning at Big Sandy. Tada says not to expect a whole lot more leading up to the race. "At the moment, we are pleased with him and we will not go any faster in the mornings," he said. "We walk him fast one hour before he goes to the track, warming up muscle and tendon; it's good. Then, we go to the track. Then, he walks again nearly one hour to cool down. That's what we do in Japan, and we will do it here."

Big Brown (Boundary), the GI Kentucky Derby and GI Preakness S. hero, made his second straight appearance at the track after spending the Memorial Day weekend in the barn of Rick Dutrow Jr. About 25 minutes after Casino Drive left the building, the strapping colt appeared with exercise rider Michelle Nevin and



had a more serious gallop. Ian McKinlay, who has been enlisted to help Big Brown overcome his quarter crack issues, remains upbeat about the colt's progress. "The foot has cooled out and he's getting pretty antsy, as you can see, in the barn, so the best thing for him is to get him to the track and let him do what he wants to do," McKinlay offered. He continued, "The first thing we looked at [Wednesday] morning, you can go around the hairline and where there was an abscess it drained,

so you have a pocket and physically you can feel a little hole. It's definitely improving. Both feet are the same temperature. When one foot is warmer than the other is when you have a problem. The skin is drying right out and the horse seems fabulous." While wire mesh currently holds the crack together, McKinlay anticipates applying a patch of acrylic adhesive along with some fiberglass mesh tomorrow. "We're just trying to stay out of the way and let nature take its course," he said.

Tomcito Breezes Seven-Eighths...

Tomcito (Street Cry {Ire}) tuned up for the Belmont yesterday morning, going seven furlongs in a leisurely 1:29.88 for trainer Dante Zanelli Jr. It was his first

move since undergoing a myectomy three days follwing his distant seventh-place effort to Casino Drive in the GII Peter Pan S. May 10. Alan Garcia, who will have the mount in the Classic, was aboard the colt for the first time yesterday morning. "He did what we wanted," the trainer commented. "The idea

was to let him stretch out and get [Alan] Garcia adjusted to him. He was happy with the breeze. I didn't want to do anything fast." Garcia replaces Cornelio Velasquez, who rode Tomcito in the Peter Pan. "My uncle started Alan Garcia in Peru, and this is what the owners and my uncle wanted," said Zanelli. "This is taking away nothing from Cornelio, he rode a good race, it was just that the horse displaced [his palate]."

Allegretto makes her seasonal return as she bids for back-to-back successes in this marathon contest. Following her defeat of Balkan Knight here 12 months ago, the Chevelev Park colorbearer was also successful in the G2 Goodwood Cup and Longchamp's G1 Prix Royal-Oak on either side of a highly creditable second to Peeping Fawn in the G1 Yorkshire Oaks. Royal and Regal will pose a major threat and has proven himself in the top league as a stayer when winning the G3 Jockey Club Cup at Newmarket in October and Newbury's G3 John Porter S. on his return Apr. 19. He was only denied in the shadow of the post by Geordieland (Fr) in the May 16 G2 Yorkshire Cup and escapes a penalty. Thundering Star is a fascinating contender as the first British runner from the Mike de Kock team housed here and last year's G1 Canon Gold Cup hero will offer a line to France's big staying hope Coastal Path (GB), having trailed that rival when eighth in the G3 Prix de Barbeville at Longchamp Apr. 27.



EXPLANATION OF FARM BILL BENEFITS FOR EQUINE INDUSTRY

Members of the equine industry will benefit from two provisions contained in the Farm Bill that became law last week:

Equine Equity Act The Equine Equity Act, secured in the Farm Bill by Sen. Mitch McConnell (R-KY), is a provision that amends the depreciation schedule for racehorses to a uniform three years. Under previous tax law, racehorses were depreciated over either three or seven years, depending on their age when "placed in service." Beginning January 1, 2009, all racehorses (including yearlings) will be depreciated over three years, which more accurately reflects the years a horse is likely to race.

Disaster Relief Horse breeders are now eligible for the first time for emergency federal loans following disasters such as hurricanes, floods, ice and drought. Other livestock producers have been eligible for these loans in the past. Also, horse breeders who suffer losses in areas that are declared disaster areas by the United States Department of Agriculture (USDA) will receive relief funds under a new disaster assistance program. Disaster relief is available upon enactment of the Farm Bill.

Mrs. Lindsay sets a lofty standard here, having established herself as one of the world's leading distaffers in her brief career so far. Runner-up to West Wind (GB) in the G1 Prix de Diane at Chantilly in June, she improved enough to reverse that form in Longchamp's G1 Prix Vermeille in September before capturing the GI E. P. Taylor S. at Woodbine in October. She was fifth on her seasonal bow in a red-hot renewal of the G1 Prix Ganay in which the first three home, Duke of Marmalade (Ire), Saddex (GB) and Sageburg (Ire), have all gone on to win Group 1s. Last year's G3 Hessen Pokal winner Fair Breeze returned to beat Claire et Bleu by four lengths in the G3 Prix Allez France at Chantilly Apr. 29, while Andre Fabre relies on the German import Guardia, who has improvement to find on her fourth in the Listed Euroselect-Preis at Cologne in September.

Last year's G1 St Leger hero Lucarno encounters a swollen field on his first subsequent start for the John Gosden team also responsible for the progressive Pipedreamer. While the former's finest hour came over the extended 14 furlongs of the Doncaster Classic, he had enough speed to finish fourth in the G1 Epsom Derby and win York's G2 Great Voltigeur S. over a mile and a half. Last year's Cambridgeshire H. winner Pipedreamer, who represents Cheveley Park Stud, showed he was up to this standard when third behind the subsequent G1 Lockinge S. runner-up Phoenix Tower in the G3 Earl of Sefton S. at Newmarket last time Apr. 17. "It's obviously a big step up again, but he ran really well in the Newmarket race last time and that was slightly muddling," the Stud's Managing Director Chris Richardson told PA Sport. "The ground should be fine for him I think and we'll learn a bit more about him. I think a good run will guide us with regard to what we aim for in the future."

STORM EASES CHANTILLY GROUND

Chantilly has been hit by a storm which has significantly eased the going ahead of Sunday's G1 Prix du Jockey-Club. A release from France Galop outlined a measure of the impact on ground conditions. "A violent storm hit the area on Tuesday night with 21 millimetres of precipitation measured the following morning at the racecourse, which ground is rated as very soft," the statement read. "Light showers are also expected on Wednesday and Thursday, but the weather should be fine the next three days." Officials predict that the Jockey-Club course should be good-to-soft on Sunday.

Moynahan Defects at Forfeit Stage...

At yesterday's forfeit stage Paul Cole withdrew the G1 2000 Guineas sixth **Moynahan** (Johannesburg) and Brian Meehan the Sangster family's G2 Royal Lodge S. winner **City Leader (Ire)** (Fasliyev). Connections of the G1 1000 Guineas heroine **Natagora (Fr)** (Divine Light {Jpn}) have yet to confirm a jockey, while Aidan O'Brien has confirmed that Susan Magnier's **Achill Is-Iand (Ire)** (Sadler's Wells) will take his place in the lineup under Johnny Murtagh and Godolphin are set to declare **Ibn Khaldun** (Dubai Destination). Today sees a supplementary stage and the balloting system will have to be applied if, as expected, the number totals more than 20. Among those who could miss out are His Highness the Aga Khan's pair of **Beret Rouge (Ire)** (Red Ransom) and **Montmartre (Fr)** (Montjeu {Ire}).

UNE HISTOIRE DU CHATEAU

Considered the jewel of all French Classics, Sunday's G1 Prix du Jockey-Club, or French Derby to apply its anglicized mantle, will be the 168th renewal of the Chantilly showpiece since first being staged on Apr. 24, 1836--56 years after the Epsom barometer and 30 years in advance of the Irish equivalent. The initial running, instituted at the behest of Lord Henry Seymour and named in honor of Britain's then-ruling authority, took place over 2,500 meters and Seymour had double cause for celebration when his orange-and-black colors were carried by Frank (Fr) to defeat four rivals in the inaugural running. The distance first experienced a change, to the 12-furlong standard, in 1842, and that trip remained in place, but for the outbreak of war, before another 300 meters was pruned off in 2005. The race has guested at three other tracks; at Versailles in 1848, at Longchamp on seven occasions--including in 1942 when a record field of 28 went to post--and at Tremblay, over a temporary 2,300 meters, in 1943 and 1944. A dead-heat has occurred five times, two of which were decided by a run-off, and this year marks the 100th anniversary of the last time it happened. Ragmar (Fr)'s nose defeat of Polaris Flight in 1996 is the narrowest winning margin recorded for the contest, while Old Vic (GB)'s seven-length romp in 1989 remains the widest. Unusually for a Classic, two different horses with the same name, Monarque (Fr), have prevailed in the event. The first, a son of The Emperor, was victorious in 1855 for breeder Alexandre Aumont and the second, a son of Saxifrage, was triumphant in 1887 for Alexandre's son, Paul. This season will witness Natagora (Fr)'s attempt to become the ninth filly to claim the rosette and the first filly to win since Saltarelle (Fr)'s success in 1874. Daniel Wildenstein's Moonlight Dance was the last distaffer to make the line up, but finished unplaced in 1994. Until 1946, the Jockey Club was restricted to horses born and bred in France, but it wasn't until 1982 that the first foreign success was provided by Robert Sangster's Assert (Ire).

The owner's green, blue and white silks were back in the winner's circle one year later, courtesy of Caerleon, but Sangster was denied a hat trick in 1984 when Darshaan (GB) finished ahead of Sadler's Wells. That renewal, which also featured Rainbow Quest hitting the board, is considered by many purists to be the finest ever staged and its lasting legacy is the winner and runner-up's continued mention in the same sentence. Ghislaine Head's Bering (GB) recorded the fastest time over the 'old' distance, when clocking 2:24.10 in 1986. His Highness the Aga Khan's Darsi (Fr) sets the current standard at 2:05.80. Other notable records for the contest include Marcel Boussac's 12 wins as an owner, His Highness the Aga Khan is second best with six, Tom Jennings' 10 victories as trainer and Yves Saint-Martin's nine as jockey.

EXCEED AND EXCEL COLT TOPS NATIONAL **SALE WEDNESDAY** A colt by Exceed and Excel (Aus) topped yesterday's second session of the Magic Millions National Weanling Sale at the Gold Coast. The weanling sold for A\$360,000 to the bid of leading Singapore trainer Michael Clements, acting on behalf of New Zealand-based Noble Bloodstock. He is out of dual-winning Canadian mare Miss Behave (Bold Revenue) and was consigned by Scone-based Bellerive Stud, agent. "He's one of the nicest horses in the sale," Clements said. "We are delighted to be able to buy him." The session topper may see the sale ring again soon, but Clements left open the option of racing the colt. "We'll just wait and work on the options--but we would be more than happy to race him," he said. "He looks a real racehorse." Through two of three sessions of the weanling sale, Magic Millions has sold 279 lots for a total of A\$15,348,000 and an average of A\$55,000. The clearance rate is 84.04 percent. The sale continues today at 11 a.m. and is followed by a general session on Friday.

FUSAICHI PEGASUS TO SHUTTLE TO CHILE

Kentucky Derby winner **Fusaichi Pegasus** (Mr. Prospector--Angel Fever, by Danzig) will shuttle to Chile for the 2008 Southern Hemisphere breeding season. The 11-year-old stallion, who stands at Ashford Stud in Kentucky, will shuttle to Liliana Solari's Haras Don Alberta in Chile. He had previously shuttled to Coolmore Australia, where he sired champion sophomore of 2007 Haradasun (Aus). Fusaichi Pegasus, who captured the roses in 2000, is also the sire of Grade I winners Roman Ruler and Bandini.

KY HORSEMEN DEMAND PURSE REPAYMENT The Kentucky Horsemen's Benevolent and Protective Association claims on behalf of its membership that upwards of \$3 million is owed to horsemen in unpaid revenue from wagering and has asked a federal judge to force Churchill Downs to repay funds lost due to the 20-percent cut in purses enacted May 14. The KHBPA has also accused CDI of breaching the contract currently in place by not honoring a clause which treats bets made through advance-deposit wagering platforms as on-track bets and by lowering purses without the consent of the horsemen. The group also contends that it has not seen any wagering revenue from Churchill's TwinSpires.com in 2007 and 2008. The clause governing advance-deposit wagers was included in contracts "a number of years ago," Douglas McSwain, an attorney for the horsemen, told Blood-Horse. "We didn't want to have to battle them in this fashion, but we've been left with no choice," McSwain told the publication. The horsemen also assert the purse cuts were retaliatory in nature and therefore also in breach of the existing contract.

NYRA Franchise Talks Could Restart:

New York Governor David Paterson is considering taking another look at the New York Racing Association franchise, according to *The Blood-Horse*. NYRA was awarded a 25-year franchise by Eliot Spitzer, who preceded Paterson in holding the state's top office before resigning in March after a prostitution scandal. Paterson served as Spitzer's lieutenant governor. During that deal, NYRA gave up ownership claims on Aqueduct, Belmont and Saratoga while receiving over "\$100 million in bailout and loan forgiveness." Paterson acknowledged that it would be difficult for his administration to nullify the deal enacted under Spitzer. NYRA, still operating under a temporary agreement, must have that either renewed or approved by Paterson prior to the beginning of the Saratoga meeting.

Santa Anita Asphalt Base Could Be Replaced:

Plans to simulate the effects of a drenching rainstorm at Santa Anita Park have been canceled after lan Pearse of Pro-Ride Racing Australia announced that preliminary testing has shown the asphalt base at the track does not drain sufficiently, or in some cases, not at all. "I dug quite a few holes in the profile [surface] and filled them up with water," Pearse told the *Blood-Horse*. "Eighty to 90 percent of them didn't drain at all, and the other 10 percent drained slowly. I could see that the asphalt layer wasn't draining. I'm recommending removing the surface and putting in a brand new base. The options [for replacement] would be a porous asphalt base or a specialized grid layer." It is now more likely that the base will be replaced, possibly in mid-July. That would impact training operations at the Arcadia oval, which alternates with Hollywood Park as off-site stabling while racing is on at Del Mar. Santa Anita President Ron Charles told the Blood-Horse that if the decision is made to go ahead with the replacement of the base, negotiations would take place with Hollywood Park so that horses could train over that surface.


