BB TUNES UP FOR HIS DATE WITH HISTORY

On a hot and sticky Tuesday morning at Belmont Park, Triple Crown hopeful **Big Brown** (Boundary) had his final major breeze for Saturday's GI Belmont S.,

working a bullet five furlongs in 1:00.03 over Big Sandy following the renovation break at around 9 a.m. With regular exercise rider Michelle Nevin in the irons, the GI Kentucky Derby and GI Preakness S. winner rattled off splits of :23 3/5 and:35 1/5 before galloping out six furlongs in 1:14

2/5. "I feel as good as I can possibly feel about Big Brown," trainer Rick Dutrow Jr. said. "I feel very good. I was not expecting to see anything other than what we saw, but still, you've got to go through it. We jumped over a big hurdle today. As long as you get one breeze in him, that's fine. That's all we were looking for when we left Baltimore, just one breeze. We don't need for him to get on his belly, we don't need to do anything different, special, nothing like that. It's all simple stuff." Nevin was pleased with the move as well. "He's been galloping a little rough, wanting to do more," she said. "He was pretty strong today just because he was ready to go. I am very, very happy with the way he went, and I am relieved it is over."

Eight To Challenge in "Test of the Champion"

A field of nine three-year-olds is expected to be entered today for the final leg of the Triple Crown.

Dutrow, who remains ever confident in Big Brown, isn't concerned with the competition, the added distance or the post position draw. "He is by far the best horse in the race," the conditioner remarked. "I've seen him run and I've seen the other horses run. It's simple." He added, "I would like to draw outside, but

the post position isn't going to get him beat." Those from the Big Brown entourage on hand to watch yesterday's workout included IEAH co-President Michael lavarone, IEAH Vice President of Investor Relations Michael Sherack (see p3, In This Corner), Hidden Brook's Jack Brothers and TVG analyst Frank Lyons. According to Dutrow, the strapping bay will walk Wednesday and jog Thursday before galloping and having an acrylic and fiberglass patch placed on his hoof Friday. Post positions for the final leg of the Triple Crown, determined by a traditional draw, will be assigned today.

While Big Brown rightfully garnered all the attention late Tuesday morning as he put the finishing touches on his bid to become the 12th Triple Crown winner. there was a touching moment on the backstretch earlier in the day that the large crowd in attendance may have missed. Casino Drive (Mineshaft) led his stablemates through an easy gallop around the main track at around 7:30 a.m. Following the trio's routine post-exercise 40minute walk around the barn area, Nobutaka Tada, spokesperson for owner Hidetoshi Yamamoto and trainer Kazuo Fujisawa, took 16 toddlers from Belmont's Anna House for a tour through the backstretch. (Ed. note: the Anna House is the on-track day care center for children of backstretch workers). The tour guide served as crossing guard as they traversed Belmont's backstretch streets and treated the youngsters to a close-up look at GII Peter Pan S. hero Casino Drive, who was in a fenced-in area alongside his current home at Barn 17.



Big Brown is a rock star and he knows it. He does, however, go about his business in a more professional manner than the musician celebrities who frequently find their star tarnished because of the temptations surrounding them. Granted, the path of stall to race-track to bath and back to stall might not be full of many pitfalls, but Thoroughbreds tend to get themselves in unique brands of trouble at a moment's notice.


Big Brown is all business in his approach. It seems as though he hasn't been rattled once since the Triple Crown began.

Exercise rider Michelle Nevin probably put it best when she said they have a simple relationship--she lets him do what he wants and, as a result, he'll let her do what she wants. Neither demands too much of the other, and their job becomes one. Easy enough, right? Tell that to the exercise rider on the many others who act like kindergarten kids on the first day of school.

Big Brown breezed Tuesday in his normal matter-offact fashion. He exudes an easy-going brilliance (sorry, Easy Goer, no disrespect, as you'll always be one of my favorites) in the way he moves and covers ground.

Coming through the lane, you'd never have thought he'd put in an initial three-eighths in :35 1/5 and finish as nicely as he did. Back at the barn after Big Brown cooled out, Rick Dutrow Jr. could relax. He told me, "What else would you want? He went beautiful. We've never asked this colt for anything in the mornings, not once since we've had him." Is that raw talent, or what?

Big Brown, avoiding the pratfalls in life as a Thoroughbred rock star, wouldn't even indulge in the postworkout peppermint that Rudy Rodriguez, jockey and exercise rider for Dutrow, offered as he walked him. "Rick, he's all business, he doesn't even want his mint today," he offered. I couldn't resist. "It's okay, you can have the mint then, Rudy." --Mike Sherack, IEAH

Bolger Explains Approach...

Trainer Jim Bolger defended his decision to leave New Approach (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}) in Saturday's G1 Epsom Derby, despite effectively ruling Princess Haya of Jordan's colt out of the Blue Riband previously. Last year's champion juvenile, runner-up in both the May 3 G1 2000 Guineas at Newmarket and the Curragh's Irish equivalent last Saturday, was a surprise name among the 18 contenders declared yesterday for the 229th renewal of the mile-and-a-half Classic. "Hopefully, leaving him in [at the previous forfeit stage] will turn out to be a fortuitous mistake," the Coolcullen conditioner said. "He had come out of the race at The Curragh exceptionally well, he didn't lose any weight and was getting above himself, so I began thinking with the changing weather at Epsom that maybe it could be an opportunity after all. I contacted John Ferguson on Sunday and he was in agreement with going there, having spoken to Sheikh Mohammed, so I'm happy to be in the line up at this stage." Bolger added a proviso that New Approach would not be risked on ground faster than good, an outcome which appears unlikely after the significant rain in Surrey in recent days. "He will only run if the ground is good or easier; if it were good-to-firm he wouldn't run," Bolger cautioned. "We seem to be in a no-win situation with him, as we were in trouble when we weren't going, and are in trouble now he is. It would be nice if people accepted that we live in a changing world, and this is just one more change."

Tajaaweed: For Want of a Shoe...

Sheikh Hamdan bin Rashid Al Maktoum's **Tajaaweed** (Dynaformer) was the subject of a minor scare yesterday, but is fully expected to make the Derby line-up Saturday. The owner/breeder's Racing Manager Angus Gold confirmed that the G3 Dee S. winner had lost a shoe, but connections were not overly concerned. "All that has happened is that when the stable staff went to feed him last night they had noticed he had lost a shoe," Gold told *PA Sport*. "As a precaution, they have decided to leave him alone with the shoe off today and providing all is well with him, they will put one back on tomorrow morning. He did not get out of the box and he is not lame anyway, so--providing there are no problems tomorrow when they put the shoe back on--he should be ready to rock and roll."

Weld Looking to Conquest...

As expected, Moyglare Stud's Casual Conquest (Ire) (Hernando {Fr}) was supplemented to the Epsom Classic at a cost of £75,000, and trainer Dermot Weld is hoping that the impressive May 11 G2 Derrinstown Stud Derby Trial winner can justify the bold step. "I'm very happy with Casual Conquest and his preparations, and he's in good form," Weld commented. "He's a huge horse who is inexperienced, and whether he handles the track only time will tell, but we decided to let him take his chance." The other supplementary entries on Monday were Khalid Abdullah's G3 Chester Vase scorer Doctor Fremantle (GB) (Sadler's Wells) and Michael Spencer's G1 Poule d'Essai des Poulains third TDN Rising Star" River Proud (Proud Citizen). Of the former, Juddmonte's Racing Manager Lord Grimthorpe said, "We are very happy with Doctor Fremantle's progress. He has come on well in recent weeks and Sir Michael [Stoute] was pleased with his work on Saturday. I think you have to go with the attitude that you are going to try and win the race, otherwise it becomes rather a waste of time, but I think he certainly has the make and shape for it." River Proud's conditioner Paul Cole is unsure whether or not his contender will stay the trip, but is confident he has the attributes to do so. "I believe his father was second over a mile-and-a-half, but you would expect Gone West to have an influence of speed and, like half the field, there is a possibility that he won't stay the trip," Cole reasoned. "He was staying on really strongly in the French Guineas as if further might suit him well. If they had gone another quarter of a mile in that race then he would have finished in front."

Supplements Boost Prize Fund...


The three additional entries to the Epsom Derby have boosted the total prize fund for Saturday's Blue Riband from £1,250,000 to £1,413,500. "The three supplementary entries contribute £54,500 each, so the race value will increase by £163,500," explained Director of Racing Andrew Cooper. "It's worked out by taking the equivalent of a three-year-old entry, which is £20,500, off £75,000 and the balance goes into the race. The £20,500 by three is used towards the guaranteed prize fund."

More Rain at Epsom...

Epsom's Clerk of the Course Andrew Cooper yesterday expressed hope that Monday night's further rainfall would be the last drenching the track would get before Saturday. "We have had 10 millimetres of rain overnight and earlier [Tuesday] morning and we are planning to change the going to soft, good to soft in places later this afternoon," Cooper explained. "It is still overcast at the moment and we are getting light drizzle, but it is forecast to move out to the east, and we are not anticipating much more rain for later in the week. There is a chance we may get a shower or two, but nothing major, and the ground at the moment is probably as soft as it is going to get."

Zarkava Leading Diane Hunt...

His Highness the Aga Khan's unbeaten Zarkava (Ire) (Zamindar) headed the 25 fillies remaining yesterday in Sunday's G1 Prix de Diane at Chantilly. Alain de Royer-Dupre holds a strong hand in the 1 5/16-mile Classic, with the Aga Khan's G1 Poule d'Essai des Pouliches winner one of five, including the same owner's Sanjida (Ire) (Polish Precedent) and Alnadana (Ire) (Danehill Dancer {Ire}), as well as Aliette Forien's G1 Prix Saint-Alary heroine Belle et Celebre (Fr) (Peintre Celebre) and William Preston's G3 Prix Cleopatre winner Leo's Starlet (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}). Among possible opponents is Wertheimer & Frere's Goldikova (Ire) (Anabaa), runnerup in the May 11 Longchamp Classic and the sole entry from the Freddy Head stable. Aidan O'Brien has left in a quartet of fillies who also hold entries in Friday's G1 Epsom Oaks, including Michael Tabor, Derrick Smith and Susan Magnier's Listed Cheshire Oaks winner Sail (Ire) (Sadler's Wells). The Jim Bolger-trained Lush Lashes (GB) (Galileo {Ire}) and Prima Luce (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}) also hold cross-Channel entries. While the former is expected to ship to Epsom instead, the latter may line up at Chantilly; Bolger has also entered the recent dual handicap (May 25 and May 28) scorer Teacht an Earraig (Galileo {Ire}). Khalid Abdullah's G1 Fillies' Mile runner-up Proviso (GB) (Dansili {GB}) is set to represent the Andre Fabre stable alongside Tabor, Smith and Magnier's Gagnoa (Ire) (Sadler's Wells), who was a place in front of her stable companion when second in the Prix Saint-Alary.



Arc Vision For d' Etat...

Jacques Detre and Vicky Libaud's G1 Prix du Jockey-Club hero Vision d'Etat (Fr) (Chichicastenango {Fr}) will be freshened up before a likely tilt at the Oct. 5 G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe at Longchamp. Trainer Eric Libaud told Racing Post yesterday that the unbeaten Chantilly Classic hero would have a break before running in a trial for the Autumn showpiece. "He is now going to have a holiday and, as we think he will stay further, there is a possibility that he could be trained for the Arc de Triomphe with a possible run before," Libaud told the trade daily.

Natagora Aiming for Deauville...

Trainer Pascal Bary yesterday confirmed that **Natagora (Fr)** (Divine Light {Jpn}) would have a summer break before being prepared for a tilt at the G1 Prix Rothschild [formerly d'Astarte] Aug. 3 at Deauville. Following Stefan Friborg's G1 1000 Guineas heroine's third in Sunday's G1 Prix du Jockey-Club, Bary told *Racing Post*, "All is well with the filly, and she is now going to have a two-month holiday. We will now stick to a mile and the next target will be the Prix Rothschild at Deauville, and this could be followed by the [Sept. 7] G1 Prix du Moulin de Longchamp."



SHALT NOT TOPS MAGIC MILLIONS TUESDAY

Shalt Not (Aus) (St Covet {Aus}), the dam of star juvenile filly Amelia's Dream (Aus) (Redoute's Choice {Aus}), proved the most coveted lot at Tuesday's session of the Magic Millions National Broodmare Sale on the Gold Coast, earning a bid of A\$1.05 million from Cambridge Stud. The stud's manager, Marcus Corban, signed the ticket on behalf of Sir Patrick Hogan. A listed winner who amassed A\$827,335 herself, the 11-year-old mare is in foal to Testa Rossa (Aus). "We had the one bid right at the end and were able to get her," said Hogan. "Mares like her are rarely up for auction, and we are thrilled to be able to get her. Amelia's Dream looked the one to beat in the Slipper, that's for sure. She certainly burst on the scene very quickly." That two-year-old filly was sidelined following her impressive win in the G2 Silver Slipper in March. Hailing from the Yarraman Park draft, Shalt Not is the dam of two other winners by Redoute's Choice, and has a 2006 colt by Exceed and Excel (Aus) as well as a Fastnet Rock (Aus) filly from 2007. Shalt Not will be boarded at Brooklyn Lodge in the Hunter Valley, and a decision will be made soon on her 2008 mate. "Obviously Redoute's Choice would be a good option, but I've got some stallions as good as him at home," Hogan added. Shalt Not, part of the supplementary catalogue, was one of two mares to break the seven-figure barrier at Tuesday's session.

MM National sale cont. Must Have Musidora...


The three-year-old filly Musidora (Aus) (Rock of Gibraltar {Ire}), offered without reserve, sold for an even A\$1 million to Melbourne-based bloodstock agent Mark Pilkington. Winner of the G3 Vanity S., the chestnut will head back to the David Hayes stable and will be pointed to the Melbourne Spring Carnival. "She's a filly who David [Hayes] has a very high opinion of," said Pilkington. "And he thinks there's a very bright future ahead for her before eventually heading to stud. Groupwinning mares off the track are in high demand, and with the prices being paid for well-bred yearling fillies, a million for her looks a good investment." Musidora, a daughter of the Bering (GB) mare Nice Dancing, hails from the immediate family of star stallions Encosta de Lago (Aus) and Flying Spur (Aus); her third dam is the grand producer Fanfreluche. Pilkington added, "She was being sold to dissolve a partnership and we will offer her to her former owners, but we have a number of stable clients who would love to be members of a new syndicate. David thinks she can measure up in the big mares races later in the year."

More Heights Wednesday?

G1 Stradbroke H. heroine La Montagna (Aus) (Monashee Mountain--Millennial {Aus}, by Hatta's Mill {GB}) has been retired and will be offered at the end of Wednesday's third session of the National Broodmare Sale. The five-year-old mare has earned over A\$1 million in winning seven of 22 career starts. "La Montagna is one of the finest mares to race in Queensland over recent years," Magic Millions managing director David Chester said. "She would be a pin up mare on any broodmare farm in the Southern Hemisphere."

BIG BROWN TOWN

Barring injury, it looks like the only way Big Brown (Boundary) can fail to become the first Triple Crown winner in 30 years is if he doesn't improve on his GI Preakness S. Beyer number (100) and Casino Drive (Mineshaft) or someone else improves past him at the 12-furlong trip. It's a big task for any three-year-old, and plenty of Belmonts have been won with figures in the low 100's. But the likelihood is he's just that much better than what seems like a substandard crop. He won the GI Kentucky Derby and Preakness by an average of five lengths each, and was never out of third gear at 1-5 in the Preakness. He's likely to be reopposed by the Derby third, fourth, and seventh Denis of Cork (Harlan's Holiday), Tale of Ekati (Tale of the Cat), and Anak Nakal (by Victory Gallop out of a Quiet American mare, so inbred 3x3 to Fappiano, which by itself gives him four crosses of Dr. Fager); Preakness second and third Macho Again (Macho Uno) and Icabad Crane (Jump Start); GII Peter Pan first and third Casino Drive and Ready's Echo (More Than Ready); and a second Zito longshot (and possible pacemaker), Da' Tara (Tiznow). Casino Drive, Denis of Cork, and Macho Again are all from their sires' first crops.

My guess is that Big Brown will become the first Triple Crown winner since Affrimed in 1978, with Casino Drive improving to chase him home, and maybe the longshot Anak Nakal to improve for the trip and complete the trifecta. But the logical bet is Big Brown/all/all, and hope for longshots in second and third. It still reminds me of 1977 (yeah, I'm that old), when Seattle Slew was much the best in an otherwise ultimately nondescript crop. It didn't stop him from becoming a top-class sire, and it needn't stop Big Brown, either. But he will almost certainly need to run faster than he did in the Preakness to complete the mission.

That Other Derby...

Then there's that other Derby, the one at Epsom, also run at the Classic 12-furlong distance, but earlier the same day, about 11 a.m. New York time. This has been a real "will he--won't he?" affair. Six weeks ago, trainer Jim Bolger declared that last year's undisputed European champion two-year-old, New Approach (Galileo) wasn't going to run. Having subsequently finished second to Henrythenavigator (Kingmambo) in both the G1 English 2000 Guineas and G1 Irish 2000 Guineas at a mile, Bolger evidently had a big change of heart last weekend, and now New Approach is an intended runner

The ante-post favorite for the race all winter, he was trading as the 6-1 co-second favorite yesterday on Betfair, the betting exchange which is often the most reliable guide to the real odds. The Ballydoyle team was thinking long and hard about running 'Henry,' clearly, but his best form is all on faster ground, so when the rains came at Epsom, they abandoned the plan and he was not among the 18 entered at the 'five-day' stage on Monday.

Having also deliberated for the last two weeks over whether to run, new favorite Casual Conquest (Hernando) was among three horses supplemented, for £75,000 each, on Monday. Casual Conquest ran a Racing Post Rating (RPR) of 118 when trouncing Coolmore's Washington Irving (Montjeu) and previous G3 Ballysax S, winner Moigen (Red Ransom) in last month's G2 Derrinstown Derby Trial at Leopardstown, in only his second career start. The fact that Epsom, a course not necessarily designed for 16.3-hand threeyear-olds like Casual Conquest, would be just his third career start, gave trainer Weld and connections a long pause for thought, but when the time came, they anted up and entered. Also supplemented on Monday were Juddmonte's G3 Chester Vase winner Doctor Fremantle (Sadler's Wells, RPR 113), and the G1 Poule d'Essai des Poulains third, River Proud (RPR 115), from Proud Citizen's first crop. With 18 still left in, Casual Conquest was the 4-1 favorite yesterday afternoon on Betfair. Our own Curtain Call (RPR 113+), by Sadler's Wells out of a Darshaan half-sister to Casual Conquest's sire, Hernando, was virtually co-second favorite, at just under 6-1, fractionally shorter than New Approach (RPR 123, in the better of his two Guineas seconds, at Newmarket). As he missed his date in the G3 Lingfield Derby Trial due to the firm ground three weeks ago, Curtain Call didn't have a chance to improve on his easy conditions race win in April. The Derby is usually won in the low 120's (by my scale, Big Brown's Beyer 109 in the Kentucky Derby equates to 121 on the Racing Post and Timeform scales), so Curtain Call will have to improve to win it. We're confident, at least, that he has the pedigree to do it, and he's in the right hands (Luca Cumani) if he's good enough.

Last year's Irish two-year-old form has certainly dominated the Derby betting in the last couple of weeks. New Approach, Curtain Call, and Henrythenavigator ran one-two-three in last year's G2 Futurity S. at the Curragh, though in Henry's defense, the ground was obviously softer than he likes that day. New Approach went on to win two seven-furlong Group 1s, the National S, and the Dewhurst, and finished the season the unbeaten champion-two-year-old of Europe. Curtain Call, then trained by Jesse Harrington in Ireland, who did a brilliant job with him before his winter transfer to Luca, came back to win the G2 Beresford S. impressively, but then was one of five probable Derby starters to flop behind Ibn Khaldun, City Leader, and Feared in Flight in the G1 Racing Post Trophy at Doncaster the end of October. What happened there? Our horse was flat as a pancake that day, and finished fifth, He must have not been the only one, though, because River Proud (seventh), Frozen Fire (eighth), Tajaaweed (10th), and King of Rome (11th) all finished behind him.

Henrythenavigator and New Approach have made last year's Irish juvenile form look even better, with their two Guineas one-two finishes this spring. Casual Conquest, who won his only start at two in a seven-furlong maiden race at Leopardstown in September, wasn't a member of this gang back then, but he is now; and the three that are now due to run in the Derby--Henrythenavigator excepted (no doubt on his way to try and emulate Giant's Causeway and Rock of Gibraltar as a top Ballydole mile-to-10-furlong horse)--are the first three favorites, since Casual Conquest, Curtain Call, and New Approach were all trained in Ireland last year as two-year-olds.

Sir Michael Stoute's yard houses the three leading British contenders, according to the bookmakers: G2 Dante S. winner Tartan Bearer (Spectrum) is a full brother to Golan, who won the G1 English 2000 Guineas at a mile, but then placed in both the G1 Epsom Derby and G1 Irish Derby behind Galileo, and came back to win the following year's G1 King George and Queen Elizabeth S., at 12 furlongs, over Nayef.



Tartan Bearer ran an RPR 118 when winning the Dante, and was the lowest-priced of the Stoute trio yesterday, as the 8-1 fourth choice. Sheikh Hamdan's Tajaaweed (Dynaformer) ran an RPR 115 when winning the G3 Dee S.; he was trading at 11-1, with G3 Chester Vase winner Doctor Fremantle (RPR 113), at 14-1, completing the Stoute trio.

The two best-backed Ballydoyle horses as of yester-day were two more Montjeu colts: Dante second Frozen Fire (RPR 118) at 17-1, and G3 Lingfield Derby Trial second King of Rome (RPR 107), at 25-1; it looks like one of them will be Murtagh's mount. 

EIGHT BELLES TO BE BURIED AT DERBY

MUSEUM Churchill Downs Inc. and Fox Hill Farm's Rick Porter announced vesterday that Porter's GI Kentucky Derby runner-up Eight Belles (Unbridled's Song) will be buried at the Kentucky Derby Museum. In addition, the Churchill Downs Foundation and Porter will each donate \$25,000 to the Eight Belles Memorial Fund, and Churchill is renaming the GIII La Troienne S., run on the Derby undercard, in honor of the filly. "Churchill Downs and the entire Kentucky Derby family were devastated by the fatal injury to Eight Belles, and the shock of her tragic loss continues to resonate through our company and our industry as a whole," said CDI Executive Vice President Steve Sexton. "Since her death, we have been exploring ways to pay tribute to her memory while supporting positive changes that will improve the health, safety and overall welfare of all racehorses. We are proud to announce these initiatives in honor of the courage and brilliance that Eight Belles displayed in the Kentucky Derby, and we are committed to continued efforts on her behalf and on behalf of all of our equine athletes." The Eight Belles Memorial Fund was established by the Thoroughbred Charities of America, and supports the research into racehorse injuries and the retraining of Thoroughbreds for careers after they retire from the track. Eight Belles's final resting place will be in the Museum courtyard, at the base of a tree to be planted in her honor. The graves of four Derby winners are near by. "The past month has been a time of indescribable highs and crushing lows for me and my family," said Porter. "We watched Eight Belles run the race of her life in the Kentucky Derby, and that should have been our proudest moment as well as hers. Instead, it all changed in an instant. We're still grieving and struggling to accept her loss, but even in the midst of our sorrow, we are determined to see something positive come from her death. We are thankful for the support of Churchill Downs throughout this process and are glad to assist in funding the memorial efforts on behalf of our beloved filly. We're very grateful for the short time we had her in our lives."





On occasion, I enjoy heading to New York City with my nephew, who is a marathon runner. We start our day off by taking the train from Long Island to Penn Station. Some of our favorite pitstops include parks and hotel lobbies; in particular, the lobby of the Trump Plaza, which always offers interesting sights. Rockefeller Center is a must-see as well. The first food stop is typically in Little Italy. There is a restaurant on Houston Street where I always order sangria and some guacamole dip (Dos Caminos at Houston and 475 W. Broadway). After our snack, we head on down to Battery Park and spend some time enjoying the sights, especially the Statue of Liberty. The trip to Battery Park this time of year will be particularly special in that it is right around Memorial Day. Being there is a huge reminder of the freedom that our country has to offer. After the sojourn to Battery Park, we head towards Central Park and always enjoy stopping at Tavern on the Green. It has a great atmosphere and the walls are adorned with pictures of immortals such as JFK. The glass-enclosed dining room offers a very open and bright place to have lunch. Once I had lunch next to Alex Rodriguez (A-Rod), who was undoubtedly signing some million-dollar contract. Finally, to finish up the day, we head to the mall on the south side of the park and wander around, possibly even stopping for another bite to eat. The trip to the city always ends up lasting all day, and we are exhausted by the end. However, despite the physical exhaustion, I always feel as though my batteries have been recharged.

Full disclosure: I was introduced to Gallagher's through my association with owner Marlene Brody, for whom I consign horses. Let that take nothing away from the fact that this is one fabulous steakhouse. Opened 80 years ago as a speakeasy during Prohibition, the restaurant was purchased by Jerome Brody during the '60s. The meat is dry-aged in-house in a meat-aging room, cooked on an open hickory coal grill, and served by real New York waiters--no waitresses in mini-skirts here. The dark wood tables and red and white checkered tablecloths add to the authentic New York feel. A wide variety of seafood and a half-roasted chicken are also offered (and a seasonal vegetable plate for vegetarians, if they can handle being in a restaurant with meat hanging in the lobby), but the steak is the star. I like the filet mignon or the grilled rib eye. Sides are a la carte--go for the hash brown potatoes and the creamed spinach. I like to sit in the back, near the open kitchen and the grill. The PEB mural on the wall is worth the visit all by itself. Located in the theater district, it's a good spot before or after your show. If you're looking for a real New York experience with real New York waiters, this is the place. Tell them you're in the horse business, and they'll treat you like a real star!

My favorite dish is toasted ravioli, which I have never found outside of St. Louis. There are also numerous choices of draft beer and the staff is great. The prices are moderate and reservations are recommended.

Everything is moderately priced and the best thing is that they will honor your reservation, no matter what!

Vivolo offers an option for fine Italian dining in a turn-of-the-century townhouse. It is owned by the Vivolo family, who loves horse racing and are always open to talking horses. The wood-paneled rooms, fresh flowers and candles create a relaxing and romantic atmosphere. I always find downstairs to be the best place to sit, especially since there is always a fireplace going when it is cold outside. There is a great wine list and I always order the pasta special. The prices are a bit more expensive, but well worth the cost. Reservations are recommended.

For a pub with an authentic Irish-ambiance, Parnell's is the place to be! Set in contemporary rural Oklahoma, this is a tale of a Midwestern American family facing an unexpected reunion driven by the disappearance of the father. Each character, from the drugged-up, scathingly acidic matriarch, Violet, to the pill-popping mother and three mysterious sisters, add flavor to the intriguing plot. This is a must-see for devotees of serious drama, as it was recently honored with seven Tony Award nominations, including Best Play. (Running time, 3 hours 20 minutes.)

Based in Germany, it addresses the issues and questions of adolescence and is a story of uncontrolled emotions, first loves and everlasting regrets.
