suspected foot bruise in his left hind that was discovered Friday morning, but connections said during a press conference in the Belmont press box after the 10th race Friday that he is doing well. "Right now we are in," said spokesperson Nobutaka Tada. "I expect him to run. If he stays like this, he's OK." Tada added, "The hoof was a bit warm. We will monitor it closely. It's not just the heat, but

how he walks, how he behaves. If he is not well, we will scratch him, of course." The chestnut did not go to the track Friday morning, and was tubbed with Epsom salts and ice water through the day. **Belmont cont. p2, 10-12** 

#### WHAT'S NEW

More copy, both positive and negative, has surrounded New Approach (Ire) (Galileo (Ire)) than any other contender in today's G1 Vodafone Derby at Epsom, but for the purists it is a relief that last year's champion juvenile will be on the famed Downs. The chestnut lost his unbeaten tag by a nose to Henrythenavigator in the G1 2000 Guineas at Newmarket and was firmly put in his place by that rival in The Curragh equivalent May 24, but the indications are that this trip will play more to his strengths. After the recent about-face on his participation and the minor scrimmaging over his customary ponying to the start, trainer Jim Bolger is happy to let his charge do the talking. "It was never my intention to demean the Epsom Derby and this is a wonderful race and a great place to be," he explained. "[New Approach] can be very strong when he wants to go, so we decided after his second run that it wouldn't be a good idea to let him do too much going to the start. In the race, he will settle anywhere or will make the running if there is no pace, as he is very versatile." Epsom Derby cont. p4-5

#### SHE'S GOT THE LOOK

With all the attention turned on the usual superpowers ahead of yesterday's G1 Juddmonte Oaks, the aptly named **Look Here (GB)** (Hernando {Fr}) delivered a 33-1 shock in some style when ripping apart a talented field assembled for the Epsom Classic. Runner-up in the

May 10 Listed Lingfield Oaks Trial, Julian Richmond-Watson's homebred made a major leap forward with a passable imitation of some of this race's best. Swooping to the front at the quarter pole under Seb Sanders, she used her push-button acceleration to account for Ballydoyle's maiden Moonstone (GB) (Dalakhani {Ire}) by 3 3/4 lengths. "I made a hash of it in the Oaks Trial, but that was a trial and it benefitted us as I found out a lot about her that day," Sanders commented after steering home his first domestic Classic winner. "I could have sat on her a lot

longer, but a horse appeared on my outside and I knew she'd get home and has a lovely turn of foot. No one has asked me anything about her here today, but deep down I knew she'd run a massive race because she gave me a lovely feel at Lingfield." Oaks cont. p3

## TDN Feature Presentation... Continued GRADE 1 BELMONT STAKES

A cloudy morning Friday at Belmont gave way to sunny skies by afternoon, and the mercury is expected to climb to 94 by today's post time. Triple Crown hopeful Big Brown (Boundary) had an uneventful Friday morning (story, p10) and later had an acrylic-and-fiberglass patch applied to the inside of his left front hoof to protect his well-documented quarter crack. The procedure took 40 minutes "The patch is on and everything looks perfect," said hoof specialist Ian McKinlay. "There were no problems whatsoever." That wasn't the case with Casino Drive, who stayed in the barn with a suspected foot bruise as his connections continue to weigh his participation. The half to Jazil and Rags to Riches galloped over a muddy/sealed track Thursday. "It is hard to say when it happened," Nobutaka Tada commented. He added slyly, "Especially as you guys know he did not go that fast."

#### A New Tale?

Tale of Ekati (Tale of the Cat) underwent a "very minor procedure" after a slow breeze May 26, *Daily Racing Form* reported. "He displaced his palate in the work," trainer Barclay Tagg told *DRF*. Look Here showed talent on her first outing by upsetting 1-3 chalk Doctor Fremantle (GB) in a mile Salisbury maiden in October and, by the time she reappeared at Lingfield, that rival had captured the G3 Chester Vase. Not fully wound up for her prep, her narrow runner-up effort to Miracle Seeker (Rainbow Quest) read respectably afterwards without setting the world alight, but her jockey was evidently brimming with confidence. That knowledge allowed him to keep the bay anchored towards the rear and wide out of the crowding early as Johnny Murtagh set a generous early pace on Adored (Galileo {Ire}). Traveling stronger than all as the battalions surged at the top of the stretch, she quickened by the 5-2 favorite Lush Lashes (Galileo {Ire}) with a quarter-mile remaining and sealed the result in a matter of strides before keeping up a relentless gallop to the line. "It was astonishing and I could scarcely believe my eyes when she took it up and went clear," said winning trainer Ralph Beckett. "Seb was very confident beforehand and very cool in the race and she got a copybook ride--he was able to relax her off a good gallop which suited us." He added, "There is nothing of her--she's very light and weighs less than most of my two-yearolds and there is no working her, but she's a very forward-going filly and pretty straightforward at home...I deliberately didn't enter her for the G1 Irish Oaks [at The Curragh July 13], as she is quite edgy and didn't feel at this stage that traveling is the best thing for her, so I would be more tempted to wait for the [Aug. 21] G1 Yorkshire Oaks. I trained her two siblings; both needed to be kept fresh and she is the same, but I hope her owner keeps her in training next year as she's got be a better model then." Look Here hails from the family of Pursuit of Love (GB), who was euthanized this week (see Friday's TDN). #### Calling Card...

Luca Cumani saddled Kahyasi (Ire) and High-Rise (Ire) to win this prize in 1988 and 1998, respectively, and by a freak of coincidence, has one of the favorites in the edition which falls on the eighth year of the millennium. The colt in question is Curtain Call, owned by a syndicate including Juliet Cooper, Patrick Cooper, Jimmy George and TDN's Bill Oppenheim. Trained by Jessie Harrington last term, he split New Approach (Ire) and Henrythenavigator in a heavyweight renewal of the G2 Futurity S. at The Curragh in August before returning there to capture the G2 Beresford S. the following month. Fifth in Doncaster's G1 Racing Post Trophy in October, he was spelled and made a successful return in a Nottingham conditions event Apr. 23, and has attracted support since his spin around these contours last week. "Things couldn't have gone better," Cumani's wife Sara commented. "On the day he'll be looking at what's going on and be interested. He's very athletic and I think Epsom will be fine for him and he has experience, having raced six times." Aidan O'Brien had eight runners last year and saddles five this time; they are all owned in partnership by the triumvirate of Susan Magnier, Michael Tabor and Derrick Smith. Johnny Murtagh, whose previous rides include steering Sinndar (Ire), High Chaparral and Motivator (GB) to victory since the turn of the century, faced a dilemma, but came out on the side of King of Rome. "The trainer is happy with very them, but King of Rome stuck out as the one who has made the most progress and his last bit of work was good," Murtagh stated. "I rode them all in work and he gave me a good feel and is a big, strong horse who will stay and like the ground." Runner-up to the Murtagh-ridden stable companion Alessandro Volta in the May 10 G3 Lingfield Derby Trial S., he has since given all the right signals to sway Ballydoyle's retained jockey. Godolphin have yet to replicate the triumph of Lammtarra in 1995, but at least Frankie Dettori has the monkey off his back 12 months on from his watershed moment on Authorized (Ire). The powerful axis combine with Rio de la Plata this time and, while there is no questioning his class after his juvenile successes in the G2 Vintage S. at Goodwood in August and the G1 Prix Jean-Luc Lagardere at Longchamp in October, his stamina has to be proven. Runner-up in the G1 Poule d'Essai des Poulains back at that Parisian venue May 11, he will be entering unchartered territory as he swings off Tattenham Corner. "I was pleased with Rio de la Plata in the Poule d'Essai des Poulains at Long-champ, where he ran a really good race from a bad draw," Saeed bin Suroor said. "He's in good form and raring to go. The mile-and-a-half trip will be a new experience for him, and it is important for him to relax throughout the race." River Proud scratched, p9

While Jim Bolger waited to saddle Lush Lashes (GB) in the Oaks, he was on hand to witness Soldier of Fortune, the colt he bred and who used to share the same paddock as Teofilo (Ire) in his formative days, capture an ultra-competitive renewal of this contest. John Magnier has been the chief beneficiary of the Coolcullen magnate's nurturing so far and after a masterclass of Ballydoyle tactics played out, was greeting back his third winner of this prestigious prize. Fifth in the Derby on this card 12 months ago, Soldier of Fortune made giant strides thereafter and was a different proposition when annexing the G1 Irish Derby by nine lengths at The Curragh four weeks later. After winning Longchamp's G2 Prix Niel in September, he was beaten just over two lengths when fifth in the G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe back there the following month, but faced a tough task on his first subsequent start taking on Getaway (Monsun {Ger}) and company. Restrained by Johnny Murtagh while keen from the outset, he tracked that rival in the main group as Colm O'Donoghue and Song of Hiawatha (Sadler's Wells) led Seamus Heffernan and Macarthur. It was the latter who had his rivals stretched when kicking on after Tattenham Corner, but Soldier of Fortune had his measure when he rolled by passing the furlong marker and was out of reach from the rallying Youmzain. "Macarthur is a tough nut to crack, but mine is a very good horse and the way he worked the other morning there was no choice between them," Murtagh commented. O'Brien added, "He's a very natural horse--he's one of those where it is probably only a matter of minding him and we were delighted with the progress he made from three to four. They only went a level pace and Frankie [on Red Rocks (Galileo {Ire})] pulled the field back off them, so Macarthur was gone. I couldn't believe they could get there from where they were, but Johnny nursed him, put him to sleep and let the race unfold." Youmzain may take in the G2 Hardwicke S. at Royal Ascot June 21, while Andre Fabre was offering no excuses for the fifth-placed Getaway.

While rumors swirled through the backstretch regarding Casino Drive's questionable GI Belmont S. status, Big Brown (Boundary) made his way to the track a couple of minutes after the renovation break on an

overcast Friday morning. A very large crowd gathered behind the rail by the gap on the clubhouse turn, including Darley's Jimmy Bell and trainer Bob Baffert. Always a cool customer, the striking bay calmly walked toward the turn and set up shop toward the outer rail at the 1 1/4mile marker for a couple of minutes. As the duo took in the scene, champion Indian

"I bet these two would make a nice baby," Harris said to Nevin with a smile.

Hall of Fame jockey Angel Cordero Jr., aboard a Todd Pletcher trainee, simply quipped, "Champion," as he passed by Big Brown. Javier Castellano, the regular pilot of the brilliant Ghostzapper, flashed a smile as big as Belmont Park as he checked out the unbeaten son of Mien. At one point, an exercise rider even stopped to take a photo of Big Brown with his camera phone.

Given his cue to get down to business, Big Brown walked to the backstretch before going for an easy lope in the Park. The IEAH Stables' colorbearer returned to the aforementioned marker following his routine gallop, then headed back toward the gap as photographers continued to click away. The mighty crowd bolted back to the barn area to catch a glimpse of his bath, and continued to photograph and record his every move while he was led back to his stall by Nevin.

Earlier in the morning, Ready's Echo (More Than Ready) exited the Todd Pletcher barn around 8 a.m. as

an Allen Jerkens trainee across the way began to act up. Sporting red and black saddle cloths, a group of Dominick Schettinotrained runners also became unruly as they passed by on the right, with one bucking and kicking the Pletcher barn. The GII Peter Pan S. third-place finisher remained as cool as the other side of the pillow while this scene developed, and went about his business as usual on the training track as a light mist fell. Guided toward the gap after his work was done, Ready's Echo appeared to want to do more,

#### WRITERS UP

#### HIDDEN BROOK: FRONT-ROW CENTER AT BELMONT

Thirty years ago, Affirmed survived an epic battle with Alydar to become racing's 11th Triple Crown winner. Jack Brothers, just 16 years old at the time, watched the race from the fourth floor of the Belmont Park clubhouse.

"I didn't have a seat, but I had a perch on a stairwell,"



Brothers recalled. "The security guards didn't really want you up there, but if you climbed up a minute to post time, they were too busy to bother you. That's where I watched the race."

The native New Yorker won't have to Jack Brothers dodge security to get a bird's-eye view of the Belmont this year. Brothers and his

partners in Hidden Brook--Dan Hall, Mark Roberts, Sergio de Sousa and trainer Danny Vella, as well as Brothers' son Chris--will be sitting with owner Paul Pompa Jr. and his family when Big Brown takes to the gate for his Triple Crown bid.

You could say Team Hidden Brook discovered Big Brown--they picked him out of the 2006 Keeneland April catalogue and bought him for Pompa for \$190,000. Brothers will be leading the cheers for the imposing bay today, but back in 1978, his loyalties weren't with Affirmed or even Alydar.

"I worked on the backstretch for Woody Stephens from the time I was 16, beginning with the year that Believe It chased Alydar and Affirmed," he remarked. "I was a die-hard Believe It fan. I still have the scar on my index finger where he bit me. I loved Affirmed and Alydar, but I was rooting for Believe It."

Raised just outside the gates of Belmont Park, Brothers started sneaking into the track when he was 12 years old.

"At the time, there'd be 15-20,000 people at the track on a weekday, and if Forego ran on the weekend, the crowd was 50,000," he said, "It was a big deal. I followed a lot of the handicap horses, but especially Forego. When Secretariat retired, Forego was the ball carrier. I don't think I missed a single start that he made in New York, and that's what got a grip on me."

Brothers began his career in racing as soon as he was old enough to get licensed.

"I worked for Woody for seven consecutive seasons in New York," he said. "I walked hots, then I was swing man. I did a little bit of everything, whatever was needed. We had Danzig there, Conquistador Cielo--a bunch of superstars."

During his stint in the Stephens shedrow, Brothers worked with the most regally bred horses on the backstretch. He studied the sales catalogues as well, and it wasn't long before he decided that he wanted to concentrate on the commercial breeding side of the business. In the early '80s, he worked for a regional sales company created by trainers P.G. Johnson, Frank Martin and Johnny Campo that catered to the New Yorkbred market.

That company folded after three or four years, and Brothers went out on his own as a bloodstock agent.

"I built up a good clientele of local horsemen," he remarked. "Frank Stronach was obviously my biggest client, but that opportunity didn't come around until the early '90s. I was buying broodmare prospects for him, and that's when Frank suggested a more formal relationship."

Brothers started out working with Adena Springs' then-fledgling U.S. racing operation. That evolved into a position handling seasons sales and marketing for the Adena stallions. It was while working for Adena that he crossed paths with his partners in Hidden Brook.

"The common denominator for us was Adena Springs," Brothers said. "Not only were we co-workers, but we were also very good friends."

One of the group became the catalyst for Hidden Brook.

"Serge [de Sousa] was really the one who had a bug to do some things on his own and be more independent," Brothers explained. "Then Mark [Roberts], Dan [Hall] and I showed an interest; Danny Vella, who trained for Frank at the time, got involved as well, so it was the five of us. In 2001 or 2002, we started to shop properties."



In December of 2002, the quintet Sergio de Sousa bought 600 acres in Paris, Kentucky, from Arthur Hancock, and Hidden Brook was born.

Outlining the various responsibilities of the crew, Brothers said, "Sergio is the day-to-day manager; he is the go-to guy. Dan and Mark have a strong background in farm management, and I consider my role to be recruiting and sales--just trying to grow the business and expand our clientele."

Hidden Brook started out boarding broodmares in 2003, and one of the first on the farm was Pretty Discreet, in foal to Forestry. She dropped a colt that spring who went on to become GISW Discreet Cat.

It was at this time that the association with Pompa began. Cont. p12

"He had a referral from somebody to board one of his mares at Hidden Brook, and the relationship pretty much evolved from that first mare," Brothers said. "We started to have a little more dialogue and become a little more involved day-to-day. We were at the September sale and Paul was quizzing us about what we were doing, so we short-listed some horses for him. The first one we bought for him was Watchmon."

A \$165,000 KEESEP yearling in 2003, the son of Maria's Mon won the 2005 GIII Jamaica H. and earned \$317,247. It was an excellent start for the collaboration.

"Paul was shifting gears--he wanted to be a little more diverse," Brothers said. "He had a very strong claiming operation, and he was looking to round out his stable with some young stock. I think he considers young stock the future as far as building a program. You have to get beyond the claiming ranks if you're going to establish a real racing stable."

In addition to adding to his string, Pompa decided to try his luck at pinhooking. In 2006, after Hidden Brook handled the yearling acquisitions, he scored not once, but twice. A Not for Love colt bought for \$200,000 at Fasig-Tipton July in 2005 went on to fetch \$550,000 at Fasig-Tipton Calder, and a son of Tiznow purchased for \$280,000 at Keeneland September resold for \$600,000 at the same sale.

But that left the Pompa stable a little short on youngsters.

"When Keeneland April came around, we had sold the two best colts we'd bought for him, and he was looking to round out his stable a little bit," Brothers said. "We were on a mission to get a couple of colts. We had trouble getting by the vet with our short list, so it came down to Big Brown, and he was our single purchase at the sale."

Hidden Brook and Pompa pinhooked one right out of the park at Calder this year, getting a sales-topping \$2.1 million for a son of Street Cry (Ire) that had been picked up for \$425,000 at Keeneland September. As with the previous pinhooking successes, Dave Scanlon handled consigning duties.

Hidden Brook has no plans to handle two-year-old consignments, but the partnership was at the forefront when it came to selling breeding stock last year. As agent for Adena Springs, they sent Spun Sugar (Awesome Again) through the ring at Keeneland November, and she was led out the highest-priced in-foal mare sold in the U.S. in 2007, bringing \$4.5 million from Shadwell. Amorama (Fr) (Sri Pekan), another Hidden Brook consignee from the Adena band, brought \$2.1 million from Cecil Seaman at that venue.

"We're really excited about the possibility of growing the sales side of Hidden Brook," Brothers said. "Frank has been very supportive, giving us a big shot to sell horses like Spun Sugar and Amorama, and we had \$20 million in sales just for him last year. Naturally, as Adena has shifted gears to be more active on the selling side, it has been a big endorsement for us to have them come on board and put

It is with his closest compadres--and in one of the best seats in the house--that Brothers will be watching the 140th edition of the Belmont, although he admitted with a laugh, "I am kind of tempted to sneak up to the fourth floor of the clubhouse and watch it on my own. But I can't slip past security like I used to."

And what does Brothers expect from Big Brown this afternoon?

"I think he is poised to break the 30-year jinx," he said. "I think he is sitting on another big race, and I know he is in capable hands. I think people will see history made." -- Andy Belfiore

Ran very big to win the Florida Derby, and even bigger in Louisville, that negative 4-3/4 being the best Derby figure Thoro-Graph has ever given out, by guite a bit. His Preakness was good, but still a serious regression, and we do not believe that he would have run that much better even if ridden hard to the end. Big efforts take their toll, and when you're also dealing with a horse with a history of soundness problems, the effects are magnified. Big Brown's recent foot problems can be seen as a symptom, and the missed training doesn't help his cause. Now he'll be making his third start in five weeks, while dealing with the effects of two big efforts, three if you count the Florida Derby. There is a reason that ten horses in a row have lost when in this position—the Triple Crown places a tremendous amount of stress on a young horse in a short time frame. Big Brown is the best horse here, but he is likely to regress further, and that would bring him back to several other horses.

Is slow and there's no reason to expect dramatic improvement.

#### 3 Macho Again Macho Uno 20-1

Did a lot of developing from a relatively slow twoyear-old top to a big number in winning the Derby Trial, and was able to get second in a weak Preakness despite going back. We were originally inclined to expect this to be a classic 0-2-X, and it still might be. But when you take out the bad efforts over synthetic tracks the pattern looks a little different, so we'll call him a borderline contender.

#### Denis of Cork Harlan's Holiday 12-1

Jumped up with a big one in his third start, after which his connections wisely gave him extra rest. He still bounced in the Illinois Derby, then began moving forward again in the Derby. Now he's had five weeks rest since his last, and 11 weeks since the big effort. We expect a big effort, maybe even a new top, which puts in this at a price.

#### Casino Drive 7-2 Mineshaft

Will take lots of action based on his pedigree and his

here-but most three-year-olds bounce after running that fast, and many horses that have run well right off the plane have bounced when wheeled back. It's also of note that this colt worked a lot better for the Peter Pan than he has for the Belmont. This one is a contender with question marks that outweigh his odds.

#### Da' Tara Tiznow 30-1

Didn't run that fast at two, and took until late April to run faster. He was able to pair that effort up at Pimlico, but the cumulative effect of those two efforts is likely to cause a bounce now, when he would need a big jump to contend.

#### Tale of Ekati Tale of the Cat 20-1

Was a precocious juvenile that didn't develop at all as the year went on, but jumped way forward to win the Wood in his second start this year. He figured to bounce in the Derby and did, and now we're at a pivotal point in this colt's career. He has had five weeks rest and nine since the big effort, and he should run well now, which makes him a contender.

#### 8 **Anak Nakal Victory Gallop** 30-1

Was a good, solid two-year-old, but failed to even match those juvenile figures in his first two starts at three. He jumped forward to a new top that was concealed by a wide trip in the Wood (2w4w, upper left), before bouncing in the Derby. This colt has five weeks rest, a pedigree that screams late development and distance, and has only developed 3 points from his two-year-old top, so he could have another forward move coming. Zito horses have run well in the Belmont, and while this one starts out slower than several in here, we think he's the most likely to run a new top.

#### 9 Ready's Echo More Than Ready 30-1

Ran well in his seasonal debut, bounced on poly, then ran a slight new top behind Casino Drive last time. This guy is lightly raced and has good rest into this, with a decent pattern. He should run well, for him, but he has some lengths to make up against several of these.

#### 10 Icabad Crane **Jump Start** 20-1

Wasn't that fast going into the Preakness, and while he improved that day, the rail trip he got made that effort look better than it was. He's too slow to contend






