A day after his Triple Crown hopes were dashed in the GI Belmont S., IEAH Stables and Paul Pompa, Jr.'s Big Brown (Boundary) appeared to be in good shape, connections reported. "We went over him good after the race, and again this morning, and there's nothing physically that's shown up," IEAH's Michael lavarone, speaking by cell phone from his daughter's soccer game on Long Island, said Sunday morning. "I'm as confused as anybody. Unless something shows up, we're going to look to maintain his regular training schedule, which will be to breeze in a couple of weeks, and point him for the [GI] Travers S. [at Saratoga Aug. 23]." Big Brown, who suffered his first career defeat in the Belmont, walked the shedrow Sunday morning with Michelle Nevin, assistant trainer to Rick Dutrow, Jr. and the colt's regular exercise rider. the track might have been too deep and dry for Big Brown. "I'm understanding they had an issue without water and they weren't able to water the track and it got deep--I don't know," he said. "We're perplexed-nobody can figure this one out. The horse did not displace [his palate], he scoped fine, there's no mucous, everything is ice cold. The horse that won, [Big Brown] had beaten him by 23 lengths in the [GI] Florida Derby and so, I don't know. We just have to watch him carefully and make sure we didn't miss anything." Big Brown is scheduled to join Rick Dutrow's barn at Aqueduct within a couple of days. "We want to keep him at Belmont for a day and make sure we didn't miss anything," said lavarone, a photograph of whom hugging the horse appeared in many newspapers Sunday morning. "I love this horse," he said. "I've grown tremendously attached to this horse emotionally. I wanted him to know he could run dead last or first and we would still love him."

Da' Tara in Fine Fettle...

Hall of Fame trainer Nick Zito reported on Sunday morning that **Da' Tara** (Tiznow), upset winner of the GI Belmont S., came out of the race in great shape and could face a rematch with Big Brown in the Aug. 23 GI Travers S. at Saratoga. "Da' Tara, obviously the main

goal is the Travers," said Zito. "I learned one thing--[he] likes to be close to the pace. He broke his maiden going wire-to-wire. So, probably the [GII] Jim Dandy S. [at Saratoga July 27] and the Travers." Zito said that Anak Nakal (Victory Gallop), who dead-heated for third in the Belmont with Ready's Echo (More Than Ready), also returned in good shape. "We'll see what the boys want to do with Anak Nakal, but the Travers

could be for him, too," Zito said. "Hopefully, knock wood, he'll be a good four-year-old." In winning his second Belmont and his fifth Triple Crown event overall, Zito opined that capturing all three legs of the series is one of the toughest accomplishments in sports. "Look at the horses who didn't make it, besides the recent ones," he said. "Northern Dancer. Majestic Prince. Everything has to go right for the Derby. Everything has to go right for the Preakness. And everything has to go right for the Belmont. But you'll see another Triple Crown winner. We were spoiled in the '70s, with Affirmed and Seattle Slew and Secretariat. No offense to the great trainers and owners of yesterday, but racing has gotten a lot more competitive. There aren't the old outfits anymore like the Vanderbilts. We still have the Phippses, thank God, but now it's a very competitive business." Zito smiled as he recounted his feelings watching the Belmont unfold. "I was jumping up and down," said Zito. "Big Brown wasn't Big Brown, and he wasn't making his move. I said, well, if he's not making his move and we're coasting pretty good, I'm starting to get real excited."

'Denis' Tired But Fine...

GI Belmont S. runner-up **Denis of Cork** (Harlan's Holiday) was tired but otherwise in good order Sunday morning. "It was extremely hot yesterday, but he's doing well," trainer David Carroll said. "I was very pleased by his effort, but without someone else joining the early pace, it was just too much for us to close on the winner." Carroll said that Denis of Cork, too, might target the Aug. 23 GI Travers S. "He belongs in the major races, and there's a big win in him that will come out," said Carroll. Denis of Cork is scheduled to fly back to Kentucky early this morning.

Tale of Ekati Exits Belmont With Gash...

Charles Fipke's **Tale of Ekati** (Tale of the Cat) came out of his sixth-place effort in the Belmont with a gash on the outer bulb of his right-hind heel, according to trainer Barclay Tagg. Tale of Ekati shadowed Da'Tara for about a mile before fading. "He was fine until he got stepped on," Tagg said. "I don't know how bad it is. I know he is walking sore on it. Anytime a 1,000-pound horse steps on your heel at 40-miles-an-hour, it's not pretty. I don't know how long the gash will take to heal. Each gash and each horse is different. It should heal in about a month, but you never know."

Casino Drive to Fly Home Tuesday...

Hidetoshi Yamamota's GII Peter Pan S. hero Casino Drive (Mineshaft), an 11th-hour defection from the Belmont because of a stone bruise on his left-hind hoof, was doing well Sunday morning and is scheduled to begin his long trip back to Japan early Tuesday. He will be joined by stablemates Spark Candle (A.P. Indy) and Champagne Squall (Ire) (Daylami {Ire}). "We are watching Casino Drive carefully still, but there is no sign of fever or soreness," said stable spokesman Nobutaka Tada. "We are disappointed he did not get to run, but we are very grateful to everyone here who supported us. We wish we could stay here, but if we did, we would have a three-month quarantine in Japan."


While Zarkava has no peers when it comes to finishing panache, she has her own idiosyncracies in the early part of her races and requires gentle nudging by

Soumillon to find her rhythm. That was evident in the Pouliches at Longchamp May 11 and again here, where she idled throughout the early stages in rear before switching on after her rabbit Saniida (Ire) (Polish Precedent) took up the running. By the time she swung around the chateau, she was traveling with ease and the result was already in no doubt as Prima Luce (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}) led the field in early stretch. Arriving with a thundering run in the centre of the track with Gagnoa in

her slipstream, she overhauled Goldikova with 1 1/2 furlongs remaining before establishing clear daylight under minimum pressure. On ground officially described as good to soft, Zarkava posted a spectacular time, suggesting the drying weather had produced a quicker surface than that. This was also her first step outside of Longchamp, where she had dominated the G1 Prix Marcel Boussac on Arc day and Apr. 13 G3 Prix de la Grotte, as well as the Pouliches. Trainer Alain de Royer-Dupre has a return to the Bois de Boulogne for a certain 1 1/2-mile contest in mind now. "I didn't expect to see her so far back early on, but there was a good pace and we could see from the earlier races that the track was riding well and horses were coming from behind," he added. "She produced tremendous acceleration and won as the class horse she is. I can now definitely think of the [Oct. 5] G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe for her and she will get a break before having one run beforehand." Andre Fabre was delighted with the effort of Gagnoa, who split the French 1000 Guineas one-two. "She has run a great race and probably will be even better over 1 1/2 miles," he said. 

Lethal Heat, who lost her unbeaten record in the May 11 GIII Railbird S. last out, got back to winning ways with a thrilling victory in this one. Lethal Heat won her first two career starts on the grass at Santa Anita in March, then handled the switch to the main track to win the GIII Santa Paula S. Mar. 30. Third in the Railbird in her first try on Hollywood's Cushion Track, Lethal Heat was content to track in second as Gambler's Justice (Lit de Justice) and Tasha's Miracle ensured honest fractions up front. Lethal Heat joined the leaders while racing three wide into the far turn, took a narrow advantage in upper stretch, and outfought Tasha's Miracle to the line. Longshot Smooth Performer came with a stout rally and just nabbed place honors in the three-horse photo.





The 6-5 favorite Million Dollar Run (Tejano Run), who broke her maiden in the Railbird, was forced to steady leaving the first turn and could do no better than fourth. "Rafael [jockey Bejarano] was just holding on

and she dragged him around to the finish line," said the winning trainer and coowner Barry Abrams. "This is a learning experience for her, and she's only going to get better from here. Once she learns how to relax, she can be any kind of a

horse. This one is Breeders' Cup eligible--she's the only one we nominated. I don't know where she will be next. I was planning on running her in the American Oaks, but I think Bel Air Sizzle might have that spot taken. I don't need to run two. This filly's good on the turf and synthetic--we see a lot of options." Vodka, Japan's champion two-year-old filly of 2006, finished a decent fourth in the G1 Dubai Duty Free Mar. 29 before placing second in the Victoria Mile at Tokyo last time May 18. With Yasunari Iwata in the irons here, Vodka stayed close to the early leaders in fifth, rallied to take over 300 meters out and drew off to win impressively. "Today, sitting on her back, I felt the shiver through my spine feeling the strength within this extraordinary filly, and any doubts that I had about winning today was put to an end as the confidence in her grew the moment we stepped onto the track for the post parade," Iwata said. "I knew she was quick out of the gate, so we rushed to secure a good position in the inside which worked out well. From there, I think we got along really well throughout the journey and once at the homestretch, she responded like a Derby winner and went like a bullet. The speed that drew her away from the last 200 meters never faltered and I knew at that moment that nobody was going to catch us."

Arcadia's Angle scored at Compiegne in October and Saint-Cloud the following month before finishing runner-up to Gris Tendre (Fr) (Slickly {Fr}) in the latter track's Listed Prix Omnium II on his sophomore bow Mar. 24. Beaten just over two lengths when fourth in the G3 Prix de Fontainebleau at Longchamp Apr. 13, the bay returned to the winner's spot after the May 17 Listed Prix de Pontarme at Maisons-Laffitte. Taken over to the rail to lead from his wide draw early, he kicked at the top of the stretch and, after keeping Yorktown at bay, had done enough to ensure victory from the late-closing Senlis. "He has not stopped improving since the start of the season and got a brilliant ride from Christophe [Patrice-Lemaire] today," conditioner Pascal Bary commented. "He's a tough horse and never gives up and, after winning his listed and Group 3, has to go up in class, so we'll take our time to decide and it maybe the G1 Prix Jacques le Marois [at Deauville Aug. 17]." 

Spirito del Vento came to the fore when taking this race 12 months ago before finishing third in the G3 Prix Quincey at Deauville in August and annexing the G2 Prix Daniel Wildenstein at Longchamp in October. Shipped to Sha Tin for the G1 Hong Kong Mile, he was far from disgraced in sixth there before returning to fill third spot in both the Mar. 30 G3 Prix Edmond Blanc and May 1 G2 Prix du Muguet at Saint-Cloud. Reserved in rear early, the bay swooped wide to lead passing the furlong marker and, despite drifting across the runnerup, was allowed to keep the race by the stewards. Trainer Jean-Marie Beguigne has a trip to Royal Ascot on the agenda now. "He took some time to recover from his trip to Hong Kong, but I don't think that was the only reason for his two moderate efforts this year as he didn't handle the right-handed track at Saint-Cloud," he explained. "He won as brilliantly as last year and, as there is only one Group-1 race geldings can run in, he has to go to Royal Ascot for the [June 17] Queen Anne. It is not me to bring horses back nine days after a run, but he seemed very fresh afterwards and we have nothing to lose." Click for the Racing Post chart.



A few months later, Skip Away won Monmouth's Iselin H .-- a Grade II event--by a nose over Stormin Fever while carrying 131 pounds. If he does run, Curlin will be conceding from between 10 and 15 pounds to his rivals. Considered as definite for the Stephen Foster are: Grasshopper (Dixie Union) (117), Brass Hat (116), Barcola (Old Trieste) (113), and High Blues (High Yield) (113), with possible contenders including: Einstein (118), Delightful Kiss (Kissin Kris) (114), Jonesboro (Sefapiano) (114), Red Rock Creek (Numerous) (113) and Sam P. (Cat Thief) (113). Curlin is slated to work this morning at Churchill.


'Two Step' Tests Two Turns in Affirmed:


