O'BRIEN FIRMS UP ROYAL TEAM

Aidan O'Brien has named his main Royal Ascot contenders, with Susan Magnier's **Henrythenavigator** (Kingmambo) set to represent the operation in the opening day's G1 St James's Palace S. Having by-passed Saturday's G1 Epsom Derby, the dual Guineas hero will stay at a mile for the £250,000 contest. "Henrythenavigator is well and the plan is to run him in the St James's Palace S.," O'Brien told *Racing Post*. "When running him in the Derby was ruled out, the Ascot race looked the obvious next step for him. We will take it one race at a time with Henry and we're not looking beyond Royal Ascot for him at this stage. There is no point in looking too far ahead." The Ballydoyle conditioner will send G1 Prix Ganay and G1 Tattersalls Gold Cup winner **Duke of Marmalade (Ire)** (Danehill) to Wednesday's G1 Prince of Wales's S., while **Yeats (Ire)** (Sadler's Wells) will bid to emulate Sagaro (GB) in winning a third renewal of the G1 Ascot Gold Cup Thursday. "Another Gold Cup bid with Yeats has always been the plan and that is what we are looking at," O'Brien continued. "**Septimus (Ire)** (Sadler's Wells) is also in the race, but he hasn't had a run this year and, while he is in work, we are not sure about plans for him just yet." O'Brien also named a pair of four-year-old Danzig colts, the 2007 G1 Poule d'Essai des Poulains hero **Astronomer Royal** and **US Ranger**, on course for Saturday's G1 Golden Jubilee S., while **Haradasun (Aus)** (Fusaichi Pegasus) looks set to take in Tuesday's G1 Queen Anne S.

Royer-Dupre Ponders Sageburg Supplement...

His Highness the Aga Khan and his daughter Princess Zahra may go head-to-head in Tuesday's G1 Queen Anne S. after trainer Alain de Royer-Dupre announced that he is considering adding the G1 Prix d'Ispahan winner **Sageburg (Ire)** (Johannesburg) to the £250,000 mile contest, which is set to feature **Darjina (Fr)** (Zamindar). The stable companions were first and second, respectively, in the May 18 Longchamp feature and connections will have to pay £25,000 to supplement Sageburg today if they decide to forego the following day's G1 Prince of Wales's S. "It is possible that I will saddle both Darjina and Sageburg in the Queen Anne S., but nothing is finalised for the moment," de Royer-Dupre told *Racing Post*. The conditioner added that Scuderia Zaro's recent G3 Chartwell Fillies' S. winner **Sabana Perdida (Ire)** (Cape Cross {Ire}) would represent the stable in Wednesday's G2 Windsor Forest S.

DIVINE PARK TO STAND AT AIRDRIE

James Barry's **Divine Park** (Chester House--High in the Park, by Ascot Knight), recent winner of the G1 Metropolitan H. at Belmont Park, will enter stud at Airdrie Stud near Midway, Kentucky, after Brereton and Elizabeth Jones announced their purchase of a majority interest in the breeding rights to the four-year-old. "The entire Airdrie team is really excited to have what is possibly America's most brilliant miler in line to stand at Airdrie Stud when he retires from the track," the former Governor of Kentucky commented. "Divine Park fits the mold of a number of our young stallions as an absolute physical knockout that will excite the most discriminating breeders." Victorious in his first three trips to the post in 2007, including the one-mile GIII Withers S., Divine Park is currently on a three-race winning streak for trainer Kiaran McLaughlin, having taken the GIII Westchester H. by five lengths prior to his success in the Met Mile. "It's very exciting to have such a quality horse on line for the future and equally exciting to team up with quality people like owner James Barry and trainer Kiaran McLaughlin," Jones added. Bred in Kentucky by Runnymede Farm Inc., Divine Park has a career record of 8-6-0-0 and earnings of \$607,935. He is being pointed towards the G1 Whitney H. July 26.

Tariq to Tackle Queen Anne...

Saleh Al Homaizi and Imad Al Sagar's **Tariq (GB)** (Kyllachy {GB}) will return to the scene of his G3 Jersey S. success 12 months ago for Tuesday's G1 Queen Anne S. Peter Chapple-Hyam sent the four-year-old to the Limekilns gallop in Newmarket and he came through his seven-furlong spin with flying colors. The owners' Racing Manager Tony Nereses told *PA Sport*, "It went very well and Tariq will certainly go for the Queen Anne as long as everything goes okay up to next week. We were very happy and we feel he has improved a little bit since his run at Newbury [when third in the G1 Lockinge S]."

Benbaun prepares for the double...

Trainer Mark Wallace is considering taking in both Tuesday's G1 King's Stand S. and Saturday's G1 Golden Jubilee S. with Philip Ransley, Steve Birks and Stephen Hillen's **Benbaun (Ire)** (Stravinsky). Hero of the 2007 G1 Prix de l'Abbaye, the seven-year-old will tackle the "Choisir double" if he bounces out of the opening day's sprint. "He goes for the King's Stand and, depending how he gets on there, we'll think about the Jubilee," Wallace told *PA Sport*. "He could well run in both, but it depends how he is."

In the 'Loup'...

Elie Lellouche has announced that Ecurie Wildenstein's G2 Prix d'Harcourt winner **Loup Breton (Ire)** (Anabaa) will take his place in the line-up for Wednesday's G1 Prince of Wales's S.. His trainer told *Racing Post*, "Our intention is to run Loup Breton in the Prince of Wales's S. and he will work on Thursday. Christophe Lemaire will ride the colt at Ascot."

'Path' to Gold...

Khalid Abdullah's unbeaten four-year-old **Coastal Path (GB)** (Halling) is set to clash with Yeats (Ire) in Thursday's G1 Ascot Gold Cup. The homebred, trained by Andre Fabre, has captured the G3 Prix de Barbeville and G2 Prix Vicomtesse Vigier this season. "It is the intention to run him in the Ascot Gold Cup, with Stephane Pasquier in the saddle," Fabre said.

'Geordie' Up for the Cup...

Mountgrange Stud's G2 Yorkshire Cup hero **Geordieland (Fr)** (Johann Quatz {Fr}) will also be in opposition to Yeats as he bids to go one better than his second to that rival 12 months ago. Trainer Jamie Osborne reported the seven-year-old to have come through his work in pleasing fashion. "He did his last bit of galloping this morning and I couldn't have been happier," Osborne commented.

Cheveley Park Stud's G1 1000 Guineas runner-up **Spacious (GB)** (Nayef) is set to tackle Friday's G1 Coronation S., according to trainer James Fanshawe. Not seen since finishing a half-length behind Natagora (Fr) in the May 4 Newmarket Classic, the homebred has been enjoying some tune-ups with the stable's stalwart **Cesare (GB)** (Machiavellian), who is bound for Tuesday's G1 Queen Anne S. "She worked for the first time last Saturday and worked again yesterday with Cesare and, touch wood, she seems in good form," her conditioner said. "[The stud's owners] Mr. and Mrs. Thompson are keen to go for the Coronation, and she's on schedule."

Secret Missile...

Bridget Swire's **Sakhee's Secret (GB)** (Sakhee) delighted connections in a serious workout yesterday ahead of next Saturday's G1 Golden Jubilee S. Last year's G1 July Cup winner will start the likely favorite for the six-furlong sprint. Trainer Hughie Morrison told *PA Sport*, "It all went well and we were pleased with him--it's all systems go for the Golden Jubilee. He'll have a little spin next Tuesday, but he won't be asked to quicken up like he was today." Morrison also reported Michael Kerr-Dineen's Listed European Free H. scorer **Stimulation (Ire)** (Choisir {Aus}) on course for Wednesday's G3 Jersey S. "We are very happy with him," he added. "He appears to have taken his races extremely well and he'll have a spin on Friday or Saturday."

NAHOODH MOVED TO JOHNSTON **Nahoodh (Ire)** (Clodovil {Ire}) has been transferred from the Mick Channon stable to join Mark Johnston's Middleham-based string, *Racing Post* reported yesterday. The luckless G1 1000 Guineas fifth was reported to be sore following her seventh-place finish in last Sunday's G1 Irish 1000 Guineas. The grey was purchased by Sheikh Hamdan bin Mohammed Al Maktoum on the eve of her run in the Curragh Classic. "Nahoodh has moved to Sheikh Hamdan bin Mohammed's trainer, which is Mark Johnston," bloodstock advisor John Ferguson told the trade daily. "It's too early to tell what her program might be, as she has only just arrived there."

FROM THE DESK OF...

CLASSIC WEEKEND

There were four Classics run last weekend: the G1 Epsom Oaks on Friday; the G1 Epsom Derby and Big Brown's bid for Triple Crown glory in the G1 Belmont S. on Saturday; and the G1 Prix de Diane on Sunday. Two of them ran to form, two did not. While beforehand it looked like Big Brown's bid was the biggest story, it turned out to be that old standby, the original, the Epsom Derby that seemed to be the weekend's most significant race.

This year's Derby did run to form, in spite of all the controversy preceding it. New Approach (**Galileo**) was Europe's unbeaten two-year-old champion of 2007, and he had run *Racing Post* (speed) Ratings (RPR) of 123 and 121 when finishing second to Henrythenavigator (**Kingmambo**) in both the G1 English and Irish 2000 Guineas at a mile. He was the fastest horse in the race; on form it was only a question of whether he would go that far. He did it, but there are two points to make about his run. First, he didn't help himself at all by not settling for very nearly the first half-mile of the race, so much so that one seasoned racewatcher is reported to have turned to his wife and said, "That's it; he can't win." Also, though, there was a lot of praise for Kevin Manning's ride, as he 'found a gap' on the rails which won him the race. I watched the head-on replay of the stretch run a number of times; Manning didn't find a gap, he made one. He dove for the rail, stopping Frankie Dettori on Rio de la Plata (eventually seventh) and just about cannoned into two other horses. He was going to finish in front of all three of the horses he impeded, but there was no doubt whatsoever in my mind he impeded them. In the States there would have been a stewards' inquiry for sure, and he might not have kept the race. As it was, Manning was suspended for three days. Big deal.

The G2 Dante winner Tartan Bearer, from **Spectrum's** last European crop, emulated his full brother Golan by finishing second in the Derby. He's a big, rangy chestnut, and ran a copybook race, making up ground relentlessly from the rear of the field. He would certainly have won had Manning not made his gap, and he finished well clear of G2 Derrinstown Derby Trial winner Casual Conquest (**Hernando**). Trainer Sir Michael Stoute supplied two of the first four, as the well-supported G3 Chester Vase winner Doctor Fremantle (**Sadler's Wells**) reported home fourth.

In fact, of the five horses which went off under 10-1, four filled the first four places; only our own Curtain Call (**Sadler's Wells**), who eventually went off the 7-1 fifth choice, didn't finish in the first five.

We had a great day out, and Epsom did a fantastic job on the hospitality side as far as we were concerned, though I hope they improve the sight lines when all the work there is finally done. None of our team really saw the race very well--too many hats in the way. It didn't matter that much, because some combination of horse and/or jockey failed to read the script for the fairytale ending. He had a bad trip, finding plenty of trouble, and cruised home in 10th after the jockey surrendered about a furlong out. Fortunately, he came back sound, and we hope he'll be back in action soon and prove that run all wrong.

One thing is certain: when you see it, you realize not every horse will handle Epsom. It's almost a rollercoaster course, with a steep uphill climb, and an essentially downhill run with two sharp left-hand turns before rising again for an uphill finish. It takes no prisoners, that's for sure. New Approach was assigned an RPR of 126 for his win--the same as Henrythenavigator in the Irish 2000 Guineas, and which translates, in my rule-of-thumb scale, to a Beyer 114. Tartan Bearer was assigned an RPR 125, with Casual Conquest on 118, the same as his figure in the G2 Derrinstown.

Though our horse was unable to deliver the curtain call we were hoping for his sire, Sadler's Wells, New Approach's first win for his Derby-winning sire, Galileo, means he or **Montjeu** have sired the winners of three of the four Epsom Derbies in which they could have had runners, Sir Percy (**Mark of Esteem**) in 2006 being the only exception. Montjeu, of course, has sired 2005 winner Motivator and 2007 winner Authorized. For a line which seemed uncertain to survive five years ago, in a race which hasn't lost that much of its luster, after all, that's a pretty good recommendation for the Sadler's Wells sire line.

The other Classic in which the form was upheld last weekend was the G1 Prix de Diane, aka the French Oaks, run at 2100m (10 1/2 furlongs). Unbeaten Zarkava (**Zamindar**) ran her string to five-for-five with an impressive three-length victory over Gagnoa (Sadler's Wells), G1 Poule d'Essai des Pouliches second Goldikova (**Anabaa**); and last year's G1 Fillies' Mile second, Proviso (**Dansili**). Zarkava ran an RPR 124 on Sunday, completing a coveted treble, beginning with last year's G1 Prix Marcel Boussac (RPR 115) on Arc day, and including the 'Pouliches' (RPR 120). This treble was also completed by the brilliant Divine Proportions (Kingmambo) in 2005; she won the same three races with RPRs of 114-123-123. Divine Proportions, who won her first nine races before ending her career with a fourth to Dubawi in the G1 Prix Jacques le Marois, was more about speed, though. She had also defeated colts in the G1 Prix Morny over six furlongs (RPR 117), but was never asked to go further than the Diane distance. Trainer Royer-Dupre sees Zarkava as likely to stay further, however. She is to be pointed for the G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe. When a three-year-old filly improves from a Group 1 win in 115 at the end of her two-year-old year, to 120 at a mile, and 124 at 10 1/2 furlongs, we probably want to take her pretty seriously for the Arc, too.

Upset Specials...

Then there were the 30-1 shots: Look Here (**Hernando**), 33-1 with the bookies and 55-1 on the Tote (anything strike you about that?) when running out a decisive winner of the G1 Epsom Oaks; and Da' Tara (**Tiznow**), 38-1 all-the-way winner of the Triple Crown-busting G1 Belmont S. when the near-100 degree heat, or something, got to Big Brown. I read where somebody commented it would have been a perfect spot to lay Big Brown to hit the board, and play a \$336 Trifecta with all x all x all, leaving out Big Brown. That would have paid about \$3,800, including the two dead-heats. Now, why didn't I think of that? **Cont. p6**

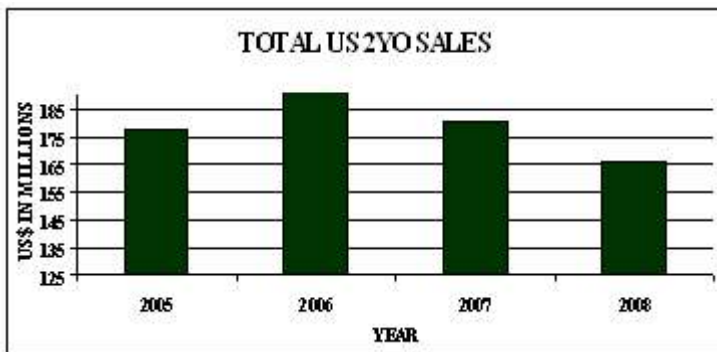

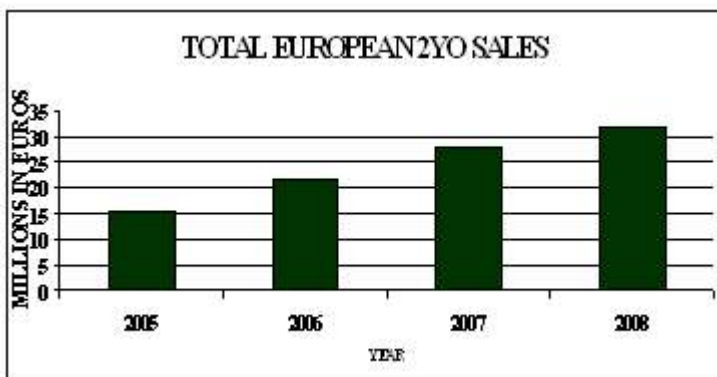

Both Andrew Caulfield, in yesterday's *TDN*, and Tony Morris, in the *Racing Post*, covered Hernando in a good deal of detail yesterday. He's always been recognized as a good sire, but, being a decidedly middle-distance version, he's been far more an owner-breeder's horse to use than a commercial sire. His current (through the end of 2007) APEX A Runner Index is 2.12; it has almost always been over 2.00. Pretty good for a middle-distance sire. His ABC Runner Index, on which the age ratings are based is 1.57; as you'd expect, his two-year-old rating (1.12, though earlier it was well below 1.00) is lowest, with all his ratings for three-year-olds and up at 1.50+. Both Look Here and Derby third Casual Conquest won their only starts at two (so wouldn't have earned enough to register on the ABC scale), Look Here in October, Casual Conquest in September. Hernando also has an awesome record in North America from his few runners there--a North American A Runner Index of 13.16!

While the Derby (RPR 126) and the two Oaks (Epsom 120, France 124) suggested this crop of European three-year-olds in well up to, if not above average, the Belmont seemed to confirm this as a substandard group of North American three-year-old colts. Andy Beyer commented to me that speed was holding all day at Belmont, which might help explain why a 'non-winner of two' could lead all the way, and in fact draw off, in the 12-furlong Belmont. His Beyer speed figure was only 99. Big Brown aside (and remember, Big Brown supporters, Northern Dancer himself didn't win the Belmont), we are struggling to find horses in this crop who can break 100. If you have one, run it in a graded race right away. Of course, the real test comes beginning next month, as the three-year-olds on both continents start to take on older horses. Until those results come in, it's mostly speculation, but it does look like the current crop of North American three-year-old colts is going to have to improve in order to be competitive against their elders.

PAYS TO DREAM RETIRED Graded stakes winner **Pays to Dream** (High Yield--Changing Ways, by Time for a Change) has been retired from racing after suffering a fractured sesamoid in his right front leg while running third in Saturday's GI Manhattan H., according to *Daily Racing Form*. "Obviously, very disappointing, but as [Hall of Fame trainer] Woody [Stephens] said, 'The sun will come up tomorrow,'" Donk said. Pays to Dream captured this year's GII Dixie S. and was third in last year's GII Jamaica H. and GIII Saranac S. On the board in nine of 12 starts, he retires with five wins and earnings of \$377,741.

LITTLE SISTER DIES **Little Sister** (Valid Appeal--Mepache, by Iron Constitution) suffered a stomach rupture and died last month at Three Chimneys Farm in Lexington. The 14-year-old mare won the 1997 GIII Azalea Breeders' Cup S. and eight other stakes races while earning \$720,568 during her four-year racing career. She is the dam of seven foals and four winners, including multiple stakes winner **Takedown** (Point Given).

Churchill to Market Test New Wagering Format:


Churchill Downs will begin market testing a new wagering format which allows patrons to bundle win, exacta and trifecta plays at a lower price per bet on-track Wednesday. "The Matrix," which costs a minimum total of \$9, enables bettors to name three horses on one ticket, providing 15 possible combinations. If any of the three horses wins, two of them run one-two, or all three of them run 1-2-3, the player collects an increasing payout for the number of correct selections. The Matrix is not a separate pool wager, but the United Tote system fractionalizes the total amount of the wager and places an equal amount into the win, exacta and trifecta wagering pools. "The Matrix is racing's first package bet, offering up a large number of possibilities for a bundled price that starts well below what the entire package would usually cost," said Churchill Downs Incorporated Vice President Tom Aronson. "It also allows players to set their own price anywhere above that minimum, which helps take the guesswork out of how much a ticket with a lot of combinations will ultimately cost."
