Twelve months ago, **Henrythenavigator** (Kingmambo) battled to success in the G2 Coventry S., and Susan Magnier's flagbearer continued to dictate the headlines

yesterday when taking the same card's G1 St James's Palace S. After defeating New Approach (Ire) in both the Newmarket's G1 2000 Guineas and The Curragh's equivalent three weeks later, the bay traded at 4-7

and proved the shortest-priced favorite to win this since the great Brigadier Gerard (GB) in 1971. He delivered his usual rush from rear to beat **Raven's Pass** (Elusive Quality) by 3/4 of a length in a new track-record time to give Aidan O'Brien his fifth winner. "He's a really special horse and is exceptional," O'Brien said. "We thought we'd never get another after the 'Rock' who could turn on the pace like that over a mile, but this fellow can. # HARADASUN SHINES IN QUEEN ANNE

A top-class runner in Australia, Coolmore and Frank Tagg's Haradasun (Aus) (Fusaichi Pegasus) proved toughest in a duel for Ascot's opening race, the G1 Queen Anne S. Positively ridden by Johnny Murtagh, the colt took over before the eighth pole and refused to buckle under pressure from the fillies Finsceal Beo (Ire) (Mr. Greeley) and Darjina (Fr) (Zamindar) and had a head advantage over the latter at the line. # TSC CALLS FOR STEROIDS BAN

The Thoroughbred Safety Committee, formed and announced by The Jockey Club May 8, issued its first recommendations Tuesday, calling for the elimination of all steroids in racing and training, a ban on toe grabs and several whip-related reforms. "Steroids, toe grabs and whip issues were all first identified at our Welfare and Safety of the Racehorse Summits," said Stuart S. Janney III, chairman of the Thoroughbred Safety Committee. "After closely examining each of them in detail and talking to many individuals with expertise in each area over the past several weeks, we feel strongly that these recommendations and actions will enhance the health and safety of both our equine and human athletes and further ensure the integrity of our sport. Numerous industry organizations have already expressed strong support for these recommendations, and we look forward to collaborating with them to get these changes implemented." Cont. p11

'Henry' Finds His Way Once Again...

TDN Rising Star" Henrythenavigator looked to have the world at his feet after he set a track record in the Coventry last year, but lost some gloss with two creditable defeats in unseasonably testing ground at

The Curragh. Despite his second to Saoirse Abu in the G1 Phoenix S. and third under a penalty behind New Approach in the G2 Futurity S., he entered winter quarters without great public expectations after sidestepping the fall's championship events. That was reflected in his inflated starting price of 11-1 in the May 3 Newmarket

Classic, and he rewarded those who had kept the faith when nosing out New Approach there. Murtagh was bullish before the rematch at The Curragh, and his mount showed why with a comprehensive dismissal of the subsequent G1 Epsom Derby hero. Untarnished by those efforts, the bay showed the same decisive speed to move up from behind on the final turn and early straight. Ted Durcan hit the front on Twice Over at the quarter pole, but his lead proved short-lived as Henrythenavigator quickened by before keeping the persistent challenge of Raven's Pass and Jimmy Fortune at bay in the run to the line.

"He is improving all the time and has settled down well," said Murtagh, who was already sporting the leading jockey's armband. "He travels well and has a devastating turn of foot. He even got me out of trouble, as I dropped my right rein when I went to change hands, but as soon as I got hold of him again he was gone. He's a great horse and such a professional."

O'Brien added, "He has speed, stamina, class, a pick-up and a great attitude, so it's hard to say we could ever get a better miler. Johnny has been telling us all the time what would happen, both before the Irish Guineas and here, and he obviously rode him with that confidence. Everything is open to him--he could drop back, step up or stay at a mile, so we'll all sit down and talk about the different routes."

John Gosden was delighted with the run of Raven's Pass. "He ran a blinder," the conditioner said. "The 2000 Guineas was a messy race for us, but he's right back to his best. The winner is a fabulous horse and they've broken the track record there, which says it all. The owners would like to run in the Breeders' Cup Mile at the end of the year, and we'll look at a program towards that." Twice Over's trainer Henry Cecil said, "They went very fast and the ground was a bit fast for him, too. Even still, he is probably more of a 10-furlong horse and has run a great race."



## HERE COMES THE SUN

Following his exploits under the care of Tony Vasil last season, a half share in Haradasun (Aus) (Fusaichi Pegasus) was reported to have cost Coolmore A\$22.5million, a tag justified by his pedigree and track prowess. He was successful in both the G1 George Ryder S. and G1 Doncaster H. during the 2007 Sydney autumn carnival, and demonstrated his versatility on his next two starts with seconds in the G1 Bigpond Queen Elizabeth S. over 10 furlongs and the six-furlong G3 Bletchingly S. Ending up with a third in the G1 Cox Plate at Moonee Valley in late October and an unplaced effort in Flemington's G1 Mackinnon S. a week later, the bay started out for Ballydoyle with a sixth in the G1 Lockinge S. at Newbury May 17.

Hardasun settled in second early tracking the Ballydoyle rabbit Honoured Guest (Danehill), who had led the field across to the stands' rail from the outset, and was left in front with Finsceal Beo as his stablemate capitulated passing the quarter pole. Galvanised by Johnny Murtagh to see off that threat, he had to dig

deep to repel the wide challenge of Darjina and Christophe Soumillon, but proved equal to the task.

"The last day was a bit messy and they went no pace," Murtagh explained. "He was just a bit fresh and I knew he was better today and,

over a stiff mile with plenty of pace, he would be hard to beat. The pacemaker did a great job and moved off the rail to give me the slip through, and my horse was brave and genuine, although he was a little bit tired in the last 50 yards. He's all heart and has a big engine and shows so much speed at home."

Winning trainer Aidan O'Brien added, "He has been very natural since day one and is a great cruiser who settles and quickens, so you can see why everybody in Australia was excited about him. We didn't know what to expect at Newbury, but in the Lockinge there was not much early pace before they sprinted. We were very happy with him as he really got going in the last furlong and a half. He looked like he'd get a mile and a quarter today, but we also had him in the sprint later in the week, so I'd say the trip doesn't matter."

Later on, Coolmore Australia's General Manager Michael Kirwan announced the immediate retirement of Haradasun. "He's done everything he needs to and he will now be retired," he told *racingandsports.com*. "We're looking forward to getting him back to the farm and have him settle in for his new career." # **VIVA L'ESPANA!**

Newly upgraded, the G1 King's Stand S. has become the Royal meeting's groundbreaker, but rather than Australia, it was Spain on top yesterday as **Equiano (Fr)** (Acclamation {GB}) got the better of 2006 hero **Takeover Target (Aus)** (Celtic Swing {GB}) by a half-length. Ignored at 22-1, the three-year-old brought some "Plus Ultra" to proceedings when making virtually all the running against the stands' rail under an enterprising Olivier Peslier ride and holding off Joe Janiak's charge in a thrilling finale. "This was a big ambition," his rider said. "He has lots of speed, so I told the trainer I would go from the front if nobody wanted to go on and it turned out right."

Equiano is a genuine European melting pot, having been bred and sold in France, campaigned in Spain by Mauricio Delcher-Sanchez and recently bought by Irishman James Acheson. Trained at the Hipodromo de la Zarzuela, the colt quickly made up into a smart juvenile for the man famed for his handling of the 2000 G1 Prix

Jean Prat winner Suances (GB). He was third in the Gran Criterium at La Zarzuela in October and shipped to France to fill the same spot in the G2 Criterium de Maisons-Laffitte the following month. After winning a conditions event at Chantilly May 20, the bay surrendered only to Marchand d'Or (Fr) in the G2 Prix du Gros-Chene back at that venue 16 days ago and arrived here the underdog.

Quickly away, he was steered by Peslier towards the stands' rail, where the group held a distinct advantage over National Colour (National Assembly) and Dandy Man (Mozart {Ire}) against the far fence.

As the latter got to the front over there, it was Takeover Target and Jay Ford who presented the greatest
threat to Equiano, but he continued to dig in for the
landmark win. For his new owner Acheson, the result
was a fairytale. "I was advised to buy the horse a few
weeks ago by my bloodstock agent, and something
similar happened a few years ago with a show jumper
we bought--six months later he won the World Championship," Acheson told *PA Sport*. "I didn't honestly think
he'd win today--I bought him more as a prospect for
next year. He'll be going to Barry Hills after today and
will be campaigned over here."

Janiak said of the runner-up, "The horse blew up a little bit, so there should be improvement to come, and the extra distance of the Golden Jubilee will suit him, too." Click for the Racing Post chart or the free brisnet.com catalogue-style pedigree. Video courtesy attheraces.

Last year's edition of this contest witnessed the emergence of Henrythenavigator, and Art Connoisseur laid down a marker as a legitimate heir to that superstar's crown with an imperious performance in this renewal. Stepping up from an Apr. 3 Leicester maiden win, he doubled up in a Newmarket conditions event 13 days later and was put in storage in anticipation of this Royal meet. Lining up here instead of Thursday's G2 Norfolk S., the bay faced up to his task with all 17 rivals in front of him after the initial strides. He angled into an open lane on the stands' side at the two pole and engaged turbo from there, treating every rival with disdain in the closing stages to secure an impressive success. "The original plan was to run in the Norfolk," said winning trainer Michael Bell. "But when he worked under Jamie [Spencer] for the first time last week, Jamie told me he'd win the Coventry, but I didn't think he'd win that well." Art Connoisseur has already attracted quotes as low as 12-1 for next term's G1 2000 Guineas, but Bell indicated a step-by-step approach would be the way forward. "He's got to prove he stays another furlong to start with. I'm not quite sure where he goes next, but races like the G1 Prix Morny [at Deauville Aug. 24] will be considered. We'll probably give him an opportunity to run over seven [furlongs] which will guide us for next year with regard to the Guineas." "We weren't sure whether to run this one because we thought Mullionmileanhour might be better. Named after the son of Queen Victoria when introduced in 1862, this contest emerged from a lull in 2000 with an outstanding performance from Dubai Millennium (GB) to mark its first running as a Group 1. Since then, it has been transformed into a cause celebre, and the winners' list reads Fantastic Light, Grandera (Ire), Nayef, Rakti (GB), Azamour (Ire), Ouija Board (GB) and Manduro (Ger).

Given those credentials, it's not surprise the Prince of Wales's S. has developed into one of Europe's key championship deciders, and **Duke of Marmalade** enters the latest renewal with the strongest credentials. Reportedly troubled by pins in his leg last term during a 2007 campaign highlighted by a runner-up finish in this meeting's G1 St James's Palace S., Susan Magnier and Michael Tabor's four-year-old has bounced back from remedial treatment with wins in the G1 Prix Ganay at Longchamp Apr. 27 and G1 Tattersalls Gold Cup at The Curragh last time May 25. In that respect, he is already a step ahead of former stable companion Dylan Thomas (Ire), who was second in the latter contest before his epic encounter with Manduro here 12 months ago.

Khalid Abdullah was successful in 1989 with Two Timing, and four years later added another renewal with Placerville and trainer Henry Cecil. The latter first collected this in 1977 with Lucky Wednesday (GB) and last won it with Bosra Sham in 1997, and saddles the exciting Phoenix Tower this time for Abdullah. Overcoming a considerable lay-off when taking the G3 Earl of Sefton S. at Newmarket Apr. 17, the four-year-old was beaten 3/4 of a length by Creachadoir (Ire) when runner-up in Newbury's G1 Lockinge S. on his latest outing May 17. He steps up in trip in a bid to go one better than his sire, who suffered a neck defeat at the hands of Faithful Son in 1998. "He has only been beaten once in the Lockinge which was a slowly-run race," the owner/breeder's Racing Manager Teddy Grimthorpe commented. "He rallied, but was caught for toe there and Henry has always had the idea that he would be a mile-and-a-quarter horse. Chester House was best at that trip and I think he will like fast ground." Godolphin are looking for a fifth renewal with Literato, who was secured following his success for the Jean-Claude Rouget barn in Newmarket's G1 Champion S. in October. His first two starts in the royal blue have proved an anti-climax and he needs to rebound from a disappointing sixth in the May 18 G1 Prix d'Ispahan at Longchamp. "I have been disappointed with Literato so far this season, but he is working well and is happy," Saeed bin Suroor said. "It will be a difficult race to win, but he's in good form and he's ready to race."

Sir Michael Stoute has yet to put his name on the honor roll since the race's upgrade, but had collected two renewals previously and relies on Patrick Fahey's Ask, who showed his prowess at further last year. He was running for the first time since being nosed out in the G1 Canadian International when taking Sandown's G3 Gordon Richards S. last time Apr. 25 and needs to prove he is as effective over this distance at this level. That also applies to Susan Roy's 2006 G1 St Leger hero Sixties Icon, who followed a second to Getaway (Ger) in the G2 Jockey Club S. at Newmarket May 4 with a smooth win against overmatched rivals in Goodwood's Listed Festival S. May 22. "We've decided to be a little bit brave," conditioner Jeremy Noseda said. "I just feel that he is in as good form as we've ever had him. We were happy with his last start and he isn't short of pace. I definitely think he will be in the frame. He has got a solid chance."

Cheveley Park Stud's **Pipedreamer** bids to provide John Gosden with a third edition following the dual-winning exploits of Muhtarram in 1994 and 1995 and needs to show progress off his third in the Earl of Sefton and May 29 G3 Brigadier Gerard S. at Sandown. The Stud's Managing Director Chris Richardson is aware of the test ahead for the four-year-old. "It'll be another tough ask for him, but this is a special meeting and we tend to try to target the good ones at Royal Ascot," he told *PA Sport*. "He's in good form and I know John is happy with him, so I suppose he has a decent each-way chance."


### Windsor Forest S. cont.

In the manner of so many of the Newmarket-based Stud's distaffers, she has progressed with age and looked up to this grade with wins in the Listed Snowdrop Fillies' S. at Kempton Apr. 12 and Newmarket's G3 Dahlia S. last time May 3. "It's exciting to have her improve again this year, but we see that with so many of Pivotal's horses," the Stud's Managing Director Chris Richardson told *PA Sport*. "If she can keep progressing throughout the year it will be great, and she looks a picture at the moment."

Alain de Royer-Dupre saddles Sabana Perdida, who was third here 12 months ago before capturing the G3 Prix du Pin at Longchamp in September. She recorded a seasonal debut win in Lingfield's May 10 G3 Chartwell Fillies' S. and her conditioner expects a bold show. "She's a very interesting filly and I think she's progressed this year," he commented. "In the beginning, she used to pull and be difficult, but she is completely mature now." Godolphin's Many Colours makes her return to Europe following two defeats by the subsequent G1 Dubai Sheema Classic heroine Sun Classique (Aus) in the Feb. 7 Listed Cape Verdi S. and Feb. 22 Listed Balanchine S. at Nad Al Sheba. Majestic Roi faces a stiff task under a five-pound penalty following her success in Newmarket's G1 Sun Chariot S. in October and needs to rebound off three subsequent off-the-board efforts. "She is a filly who seems to improve with racing and with three runs now under her belt this spring, we are expecting she will be competitive," commented the owner Jaber Abdullah's Racing Manager Bruce Raymond.

# Janney Stresses Proactivity in Press Conference...

During an afternoon teleconference, Janney insisted that the actions of and steps taken by the TSC, formed just five days after the catastrophic injuries to Eight Belles in the GI Kentucky Derby, are proactive in nature. "The Committee has determined to be reflective, not reactive, in reaching our conclusions," he said. "Changes we are putting forward now are the beginning of what we hope is a process to address many areas of our industry. These recommendations are not just first, but also very important." Addressing the three recommendations put forth in a press release yesterday, Janney stated, "Regarding steroids, they have no place in a horse on race day. While we recognize that a treatment involving steroids can be appropriate for therapeutic purposes, but only under vet care, we think racing, just like other sports, needs to present its athletes on raceday steroid-free. We believe all parties will be better served by flat shoes. The horse will be safer. The trainer, who will not be forced to weigh improved traction with the risk of injury; and the bettor, who will not have to calculate the effects of various shoes with track conditions. The riding crop is both a human issue and a perception issue for our industry. We believe that going to this padded and shorter riding crop, eliminating the over-the-shoulder stroke and urging increased surveillance by stewards and vets will be welcomed by jockeys, most trainers and the public." A series of additional meetings will take place over the next 60 days to further refine and investigate other pressing issues, including the use of therapeutic medications, illegal drugs and prohibited practices; best practices and accreditation standards for drug testing laboratories; research on safety factors associated with all types of racing surfaces; and breeding and training of Thoroughbreds. An update on any progress made will be presented at The Jockey Club's 56th annual Round Table Conference on Matters Pertaining to Racing at the Gideon-Putnam Resort and Spa in Saratoga Springs, New York, Sunday, Aug. 17. ## Toe Grabs Named a Culprit...

Noted equine veterinarian Dr. Larry Bramlage spoke to the issue of toe grabs and the negative impact they have on horses. "You have to look at the incidence of catastrophic injuries as a group, and the majority of the significant injuries are in the front fetlocks, so that has to raise that higher on our level of our concern," he stated. "The data is all in the favor of the toe grabs increasing the stress on the limb, principally because of the "plow" effect of the toe grab going into the ground, not so much the toe grab "grabbing" the ground to propel the horse forward. If you look at all the data, the front fetlocks are most important. We think there is a level of practicality and safety in the hind shoes as well, but we don't have the data."

# Perception Nine-Tenths of the Law?...

Janney sees the role of the committee to formulate rules and regulations which benefit the horse and enhance the safety of the equine, but also to fortify the perception of Thoroughbred racing among the broader public. "That's a very legitimate concern of this committee," he commented when asked whether public opinion has an impact on the business of the group. "I think that what this committee's responsibility comes down to is not only taking the steps that we believe necessary to safeguard the horse and the rider that's on the horse, but also to create the conditions and practices within this industry that will allow this industry to grow and prosper and be attractive to the casual fan. As far as we're concerned, what we're looking for are solutions and recommendations that meet those two standards. We think the ones that we are suggesting today do that. We're not responsible for coming up with any definitive views of exactly why Eight Belles broke down, but we are given the responsibility to take peoples' concerns and provide the best possible solutions across the industry in a very broad sense. This is a time when I think the industry is reflecting on where we should be going and is amenable to working together to get to a better place."

# Across the Board Acceptance...

The initial recommendations from the committee have spawned widespread praise from industry leaders. Said Bill Farish, chairman of the board of Breeders' Cup Limited, "The Breeders' Cup Board unanimously endorses the three recommendations released today by the Thoroughbred Safety Committee. We urge all segments of the industry to work together with state regulators to adopt necessary rules and regulations to immediately implement these recommendations including strong penalties for any violations. We look forward to the Committee continuing its work to address other major issues related to the safety and welfare of Thoroughbreds including the potential for further restrictions on race day medication and ongoing research into the safest available race track surfaces." Speaking on behalf of the Thoroughbred Owners and Breeders Association, Bill Casner stated, "TOBA supports the recommendations made by the Thoroughbred Safety Committee and encourages immediate adoption. Anabolic steroids have no valid purpose in the training and racing of the equine athlete. The data is undeniable in demonstrating the detrimental effects of toe grabs and traction devices on front shoes. The adoption of humane riding crops and their judicious use is intuitively right. Implementing these rules will serve to increase safety and are in the best interest of our horses and riders. As we endorse these Jockey Club recommendations, we would also like to mention that the TOBA Executive Committee has created a Thoroughbred Action Committee to study these issues, as well as track surfaces, medication, drug testing and others." In addition to Janney, the Thoroughbred Safety Committee includes John Barr, James G. (Jimmy) Bell, Dr. Larry Bramlage, Donald R. Dizney, Dell Hancock and Dr. Hiram C. Polk Jr.

With the defection of Harlem Rocker over the weekend, it looked like Team Stronach would have to take their chances with their talented but lightly raced maiden **Jungle Brew** (Milwaukee Brew) in Sunday's

Queen's Plate at Woodbine in Toronto. That was until the operation decided to throw **Ginger Brew** (Milwaukee Brew) into the mix, having to supplement the filly at a cost of \$25,000. An impressive sixlength winner of

the June 8 Woodbine Oaks against Canadian-bred fillies, the chestnut will try and become the first of her gender to take the Queen's Plate since Dancethruthedawn accomplished the feat in 2001. "We wouldn't be doing this if we didn't think she had a chance," said trainer Brian Lynch. "She's potentially a Grade I winner down the road. She wouldn't be running for the sake of trying to prove a point in the Queen's Plate." The Adena Springs homebred is aiming to become only the fifth filly to record the Woodbine Oaks/Queen's Plate double. The feat was accomplished previously by Flaming Page (1962), La Lorgnette (1985), Dance Smartly (1991) and Dancethruthedawn (2001). "I could see her running the race she did," said Lynch of Ginger Brew's Oaks triumph in the Woodbine Oaks. "It was another solid performance. She was able to settle in and start picking it up at the half-mile pole. Even when she was between horses, in tight, she never had any fear. She never has when it comes to racing tight like that." # A Queen's Procession...

A narrow winner in her career opener at Woodbine last October, the Ontario-bred was shelved for the season before returning to action with a runner-up effort over the Gulfstream turf Jan. 9. Second again going a mile over the main track at the Hallandale oval Feb. 16, she reeled off two straight victories on the turf, including the nine-furlong Calder Oaks Apr. 26.

"In that race, it was as tight as it can be," said Lynch of her sole Calder appearance. "But that didn't bother her a bit. In the Oaks, she started niggling away at the leaders, but got boxed in a bit. But even if she winds up flat-footed, she can still show a strong kick. And if she's cruising, she's able to do the same thing."

Looking ahead to Sunday's Queen's Plate, Lynch doesn't expect to change what has been working for the operation thus far.

"She's a very rateable filly, very easy to ride," said Lynch, who will once again have Javier Castellano in the irons. "She won't be too far off the pace, and if all goes well, she'll come running down the lane."

Is he concerned about throwing his prized filly in against tougher competition and taking on the boys for the first time?

"Not at all," he said. "She certainly appears to be the real deal. We knew that right from the start. She trained well, she was mature from the outset and she was as level-headed as can be. She's calm and cool. She gets on her toes in post parade, but she's all business when the running starts."--Christina Bossinakis

## PROSPECTOR DAY

The best week of racing in the world kicked off yesterday with three Group 1 races in a row, the first three on Royal Ascot's opening-day Tuesday card. Two of those races are at a mile, the G1 Queen Anne S. for



'olders' (four-year-olds and up), and the G1 St. James's Palace S., for three year-old colts. The latter, the third race on the card, is essentially the 'European 2000 Guineas,' as it has the potential to attract the English, French, and Irish 2000 Guineas winners. It did so again this year, as odds-on Henrythenavigator (Kingmambo) added to his English and Irish Guineas triumphs over subsequent G1 Epsom Derby winner New Approach with a decisive, though narrow, victory over English 2000 Guin-

eas fourth Raven's Pass (Elusive Quality). Twice Over (Observatory), who had narrowly defeated Raven's Pass in Newmarket's Guineas prep, the G3 Craven S., in April, finished third. The G1 Poule d'Essai des Pouliches (French 2000 Guineas) winner Falco (Pivotal) got to the lead straightening up for home, but could only finish fifth, suggesting again this year's English Guineas form is particularly strong. Raven's Pass definitely stamped himself as Henrythenavigator's closest European three-year-old rival at a mile.

The day's first two races demonstrated the fiercely competitive and international flavor of the week's racing: the G1 Queen Anne was won by Haradasun, an Australian-bred son of Fusaichi Pegasus who came 'up north' after Coolmore bought into him for a spring-summer campaign before going back to Australia to enter stud in September. It looked a tight contest beforehand, and Haradasun, who had been only fifth in the G1 Lockinge S. in his first start for Aidan O'Brien, prevailed narrowly from two 2007 Classic-winning four-year-old fillies, Darjina (Zamindar) and Finsceal Beo (Mr. Greeley). Then the five-furlong King's Stand, promoted back to Group 1 status this year, produced a Spanish-trained winner (who has been racing in France this year) in Equiano, who is by last year's leading European freshman sire, Acclamation, and was one of only three sophomores in the field. The evergreen Australian-bred Takeover Target (Celtic Swing) was second --he won the race in 2006, and was fourth to compatriot Miss Andretti last year--with pre-race favorite Fleeting Spirit (by the leading 2006 European Freshman Sire, Invincible Spirit) third. What was very striking about the results of the mile races is that all six placings were filled by horses from the Mr. Prospector sire line: the Australian version of Fusaichi Pegasus, Zamindar, and Mr. Greeley in the Queen Anne; and Kingmambo, Elusive Quality, and Observatory in the St. James's Palace. Three of the six are by sons of Gone West: Zamindar, Mr. Greeley, and Elusive Quality. Only two of the six stand in Europe: Zamindar and Observatory, both bred and raced by Juddmonte, and both standing at Banstead Manor. However dominant the Northern Dancer line has become in Europe, it seems there's always room for that high-quality, essentially American, Mr. Prospector blood. Oh, and Takeover Target is also Mr. Prospector-line; he's from an Australian crop by Celtic Swing, who stands in Ireland.

Yesterday's two races for two-year-olds were both won by colts by first-season sires--surprise, surprise. The G2 Coventry was won decisively by Art Connoisseur, the most expensive yearling sold last year (55,000gns.) by Lucky Story (Kris S.), a full brother to Dr Fong who won the G2 Champagne S. at Doncaster and stands at David Redvers' Tweenhills Stud for just £4,000 in 2008. Second was Intense Focus, by Giant's Causeway and, like the winner, out of a Danehill mare. Third was another representative of the Gone West/Mr. Prospector line, and a colt by a first-season sire; this was Lord Shanakill, from Speightstown's first crop. Boy, did Mr. Prospector have a good day: eight of the 15 black-type placegetters yesterday were by Mr. Prospector-line sires--and half of those eight were by four different sons of Gone West.

The day's final event, the five-furlong Listed Windsor Castle S. for two-year-olds, also went to a first-season sire, in this case Darley's Exceed and Excel, an Australian-bred and -raced son of Danehill. With five stakes winners in his first Australian crop, Exceed and Excel is comfortably leading Freshman Sire in Australasia in their season, which is winding down. (Interestingly, Falbrav is second, this according to the website stallions.com.au.) This will surely put him among the top three in Europe, along with Lucky Story and Coolmore's One Cool Cat, who has four stakes winners already. In one of those all-Danzig finishes, favorite Bushranger (Danetime) was second in the Windsor Castle, with Mullionmileandhour (Mull of Kintyre) third.


There was just one handicap on yesterday's card, a little 19-runner affair for £60,000 run over 2 ½ miles; this was the Ascot Stakes H. (misnomer – not a black-type race). Jumping trainers ran 1-2-3 with flat-bred horses which had all been sold to go jumping, and had been hurdling with various degrees of success. With that footnote (from the flat point of view), we can turn the page and concentrate on today's card, head-lined by Coolmore's **Duke of Marmalade** (Danehill) in the G1 Prince of Wales's S. and the rapidly improving **Bankable** (Medicean) in today's big handicap, the one-mile Royal Hunt Cup, for Team Cumani.



Kahyasi was trained by Luca Cumani to capture the G3 Derby Trial S. at Lingfield in his third career start before adding the G1 Ever Ready Derby S. to his resume. Among his rivals that day were Doyoun (GB), the Aga Khan's G1 2000 Guineas hero; and Unfuwain. "It was amazing to win my first Derby with him and very much the fulfilment of

a dream, especially as I was still relatively young," Cumani told Racing Post. "I owe the horse a lot. He was a great horse and a great friend, and the easiest horse in the world to train. He was so relaxed and so professional as a racehorse, and as a sir,e he has been very underrated. As a broodmare sire he was excellent." Kahyasi added a victory in the G1 Irish Derby, but never fully recovered from cuts sustained that day. He lost his unbeaten record when second in the G2 Prix Niel, and closed out his career with a sixth in Tony Bin (Ire)'s G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe. The bay began his breeding career in Ireland and proved an effective dual-purpose stallion, siring the Aga Khan's Group 1 winners Enzeli (Ire), Khalkevi (Ire), Vereva (Ire) and Zainta (Ire), as well as top jumpers Karasi (Ire) and Hirapour (Ire). However, Kahyasi will likely be best remembered as a broodmare sire. His daughter Hasili (Ire), a listed winner in France, has produced Grade/Group 1 winners Banks Hill (GB), Cacique (Ire), Heat Haze (GB) and Intercontinental (GB) as well as leading young sire Dansili (GB). Another daughter, Zarkasha (Ire), is the dam of the Aga Khan's unbeaten champion Zarkava (Ire), heroine of this year's G1 Prix de Diane and G1 Poule d'Essai des Pouliches.
