'MARMALADE' TOASTS THEM!

Duke of Marmalade (Ire) (Danehill) attracted heavy support into even-money favoritism for yesterday's G1 Prince of Wales's S. and the cash flow was fully justified as Susan Magnier and Michael Tabor's bay crushed the opposition to provide Ballydoyle with its third Group 1 success of the Royal meeting. Adding to

wins in Longchamp's G1 Prix Ganay and the G1 Tattersalls Gold Cup at The Curragh, the four-year-old turned on the power passing the quarter pole and soon had his rivals toiling en route to a four-length defeat of **Phoenix Tower** (Chester House). Jockey Johnny Murtagh was glowing in his

praise afterwards. "He is up there with the best I've ridden," Murtagh said. "Aidan [O'Brien] has been getting him ready for this all year and today was the big target. I ride him a lot in his work and he's been showing speed and has really come good." Cont. p2

THE GOLD STANDARD

With three Group 1 races already in the bag for Ballydoyle this week, hopes will be high that **Yeats (Ire)**

(Sadler's Wells) can make it a Royal meeting to remember in today's G1 Gold Cup. This contest has been the jewel in the crown since its inception in 1807 and, throughout its long history, only Sagaro (GB) has recorded three successes to eclipse multiple dual winners. Susan Magnier and Diane Nagle's seven-year-old, who was imperious in 2006 under Kieren Fallon and professional for Mick Kinane 12 months ago, is agonizingly close to equalling that milestone set in 1977. He

warmed up with a win in the Listed Vintage Crop S. at Navan Apr. 27 and has been deliberately kept fresh for his historic bid. "He had a perfect start to the season and all has been well since then," O'Brien told Racing Post. "He has often had a run between his first run and Ascot, but we decided to come straight here this time. We will see tomorrow if that was the right decision, but he is in good form, and is older and wiser than last year." Jockey Johnny Murtagh had an additional message for his opponents. "I've sat on him at home and he's flying," he added. Gold Cup cont. p6

DIXIE DREAMER IS BUILT MUTAKDDIM FAST & MUTAKDDIM TOUGH

Multiple Stakes winner DIXIE DREAMER was precocious enough to win the Bassinet S. at 2 and fast enough and sound enough to win the U Can Do It H. at Calder on June 14, halfway through her 5YO season. She is the kind of tough and durable runner for which Mutakddim is well known.

Although it was only whispered in corners at the time and not backed up by connections, Duke of Marmalade was touted as Ballydoyle's best juvenile when he arrived at Glorious Goodwood for the G2 Vintage S. in August 2006. Injured after his second to Strategic Prince (GB) there, his long road back to full effectiveness was only beginning when fourth in both the G1 English and Irish 2000 Guineas last May. Runner-up in this meeting's G1 St James's Palace S. and fourth in York's G1 International S. in August, it took stable companion Dylan Thomas (Ire) to stop him in Leopardstown's G1 Irish Champion S. before he finished off with a third in the G1 Queen Elizabeth II S. at Ascot the following month.

The bay posted a workmanlike first stakes score in the Apr. 27 Prix Ganay before turning back Finsceal Beo (Ire) in the G1 Tattersalls Gold Cup at The Curragh May 25, and he took another leap forward with a career-best this time. Settled in a pocket against the rail tracking the strong pace set by his stable companion Red Rock Canyon (Rock of Gibraltar {Ire}), he was angled wide for his run at the top of the stretch where **Pressing** (Soviet Star) was traveling with ominous ease. Sweeping by that rival with an irresistible surge before the eighth pole, the result was settled in a matter of strides as Phoenix Tower and Pipedreamer stayed on in his slipstream.

"He's getting better and better," Aidan O'Brien said after greeting his first Prince of Wales's hero. "He had

pins in his leg due to a bad fracture after Goodwood as a two-year-old, and we were never really able to train him last year because he was semi-lame all the time. He was probably carrying more weight than he should have been, and wasn't able to use himself the way he is this year.

He's gone very athletic and is showing more pace, but looking at him today you'd say he wouldn't have a problem going further than a mile and a quarter as well, so he has a lot of options open to him. He's traveling and guickening better this year."

Duke of Marmalade's dam Love Me True, hailing from the Weekend Surprise family of A.P. Indy, et al, was acquired for \$1.35 million at the 1999 Fasig-Tipton Saratoga Sale. Racing in the colors of Susan Magnier, her career highlight for O'Brien was a third to stablemate Perigee Moon in the 2000 G3 Killavullan S. France was on the scoresheet for the Royal meeting yesterday after Scuderia Zaro's **Sabana Perdida (Ire)** (Cape Cross {Ire}) wore down favored **Heaven Sent (GB)** (Pivotal {GB}) to take the G2 Windsor Forest S. Following a near-miss with Darjina (Fr) in Tuesday's G1 Queen Anne S., trainer Alain de Royer-Dupre celebrated when his five-year-old charge claimed a 3/4-length success as the 4-1 second choice. "She's a very serious filly," de Royer-Dupre. "At the beginning of last year, she would always pull, but she is very calm now and able to wait before producing big acceleration."

Campaigned in Italy by Roberto Feligioni at two and three, Sabana Perdida placed third in the G2 Premio Regina Elena (Italian 1000 Guineas) at the Capannelle and fourth in the San Siro's G1 Oaks d'Italia in 2006. Transferred to de Royer-Dupre soon after, she took time to find her feet for her new base, and only truly broke through with a third behind Nannina (GB) and Satwa Queen (Fr) in this race 12 months ago. She showed she had turned a corner when taking Longchamp's G3 Prix du Pin in September, and returned with a smooth success in the May 10 G3 Chartwell Fillies' S. at Lingfield to warm up for a repeat bid here.

Breaking well and racing close to the early pace in the center of the track, she was swamped by Heaven Sent's acceleration inside the final quarter, but responded to the whip to reel in that drifting foe in the final strides.

"She was very generous, as Heaven Sent was a length in front and I knew that a mile is as far as she wants to go," jockey Christophe-Patrice Lemaire commented. Connections of the winner are looking at the G1 Prix Rothschild at Deauville Aug. 3, while the runner-up's team were not too downcast.

"She's run a fantastic race," Cheveley Park Stud's Managing Director Chris Richardson told *PA Sport*. "To be fair, the winner loves this ground and we could have possibly done with a drop of rain. She'll be entered in the G1 Falmouth S. [at Newmarket July 9] now and, if she comes out of this race well, we will give that thought and consideration." Dr. Vincent O'Brien's Grecian Dancer, who stayed on strongly late to finish third, will now be retired as she is in foal to Galileo (Ire). Previously, the five-year-old captured the G3 Ridgewood Pearl S. May 24 at The Curragh.

"I thought she was my best chance of the week and that she would place, but she really finds," her rider said. "She's tough with a good mental attitude and it's like riding a colt--she's up for a fiaht."

Langs Lash won by four lengths on her debut at Folkestone May 1 before finding only Bahamian Babe (Bahamian Bounty {GB}) too strong at York. Breaking fast here, she was in front of her group which contained the smooth-traveling Shyrl, but was only level with Connie Mac, who was racing alone against the stands rail. Marginally in front approaching the final quarter, she was headed by Lucky Leigh (Piccolo {GB}) soon after, but rallied gamely to regain the advantage in the final strides as Shyrl made late progress.

"She showed so much speed that before I knew it I was at the two pole," Munro continued. "I asked her to quicken there, and she pulled out when it got down to a fight."

Trainer Mick Quinlan added, "It's great to win here and this was always the plan before she had run. She had no race at Folkestone and was drawn on the wrong side at York, where she got shell-shocked at halfway when asked to race before getting her head down. The Guineas mile would be stretching her stamina, but I always thought after this that we might look at the G2 Lowther S. [at York Aug. 21]."

He got me to the front quickly and Ascot is a big place, so he had a look around, but he's only had three runs and is still learning about the game." Trainer William Haggas added, "We've always liked him, but he broke his knee here last year and has been steadily prepared. He's come on a lot from his maiden; we'll see if we can go up from here." Saeed bin Suroor said of the runner-up, "Il Warrd ran very well--we are happy with how he did in the race. Did You Know?...

YEATS is one of 3 two-time winners of the Gold Cup in the last decade. The others are ROYAL REBEL (2001-02) and KAYF TARA (1998 & 2000).

This is one of the rare prizes to have eluded Khalid Abdullah, but Reefscape (GB) went closest two years ago when four lengths runner-up to the Ballydoyle giant Yeats. Reefscape's half-brother Coastal Path has much to recommend him here, having remained unbeaten at three and four through a quartet of pattern tests. He has looked stronger this term, and his commanding performances in Longchamp's Apr. 27 G3 Prix de Barbeville and May 18 G2 Prix Vicomtesse Vigier mark him as a serious threat to the favorite. "Andre [Fabre] has always had a high opinion of him, and being unbeaten in six is a tribute to his talent and to Andre's," the owner/breeder's Racing Manager Teddy Grimthorpe said. "With two miles and four furlongs, we are going into unknown territory, but he has won most of his races comfortably, and we hope he has the class and stamina to last out. He has been in very good form, but this is really competitive--the blue riband of the meeting." Runner-up by 1 1/2 lengths last year, Mountgrange Stud's Geordieland is back for another crack at the title. Always a smooth traveller who does not always find as much as expected, the enigmatic grey has been called some names, but quashed some doubts with a deserved big-race triumph in the G2 Yorkshire Cup at York last time May 16. While he has had three unsuccessful tries against Yeats, trainer Jamie Osborne believes the turnaround could be imminent. "I think we know where we are with Yeats, who I think struggled a little bit on his first run, whereas Geordieland has come back better this year," Osborne offered. "We only have 1 1/2 lengths to find with him, and the way he is working and the evidence at York gives a strong argument that we are capable of bridging the gap. There is, however, the chance that Coastal Path is a very good horse and better than all of us." Godolphin, past masters at training Gold Cup winners, have a classy duo in Regal Flush and Sagara hoping to emulate Classic Cliche (Ire), dual hero Kayf Tara (GB) and Papineau (GB). Sagara was third in the G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe at Longchamp in October, but was dismal on his debut in the royal blue, finishing last in the Listed Tapster S. at Goodwood June 6, while Regal Flush needs to progress off his third in York's Listed Grand Cup 19 days ago.

Inaugurated in 1919 in honor of Thomas Lister, the fourth Baron Ribblesdale, this race is often used by those seeking consolation for the vanquished in the G1 Epsom Oaks. In the last 10 years, three winners of this contest--Punctilious (GB), Miletrian (Ire) and Bahr (GB)--were rebounding from that Classic. This time, the June 6 form is brought to the table by the sixth- and seventh-place finishers Cape Amber and Michita. Cape Amber was runner-up in the May 14 G3 Musidora S. at York prior to the Oaks, and trainer Peter Chapple-Hyam is hoping she will find this task easier. "I think she will run [today], as there is rain forecast," he said. "She performed well enough at Epsom for a relatively inexpe-

rienced filly. She came out of the Oaks fine, and we feels that she is worth another try over a mile and a half." Michita, who was going into the Oaks off an impressive win in the Listed Height of Fashion S. at Goodwood May 21, carries the hopes of the McNairs' Stonerside Stable. Their representative John Adger told *PA Sport*, "She is a big, leggy filly with quite a bit of ability. However, coming down the hill around Tattenham Corner she didn't handle the track,

but made a nice run through the stretch and finished well." Trainer John Gosden is also represented by the TTDN Rising Star" Dar Re Mi. She missed Epsom after suffering minor cuts in the roughly run Musidora. Geoff Wragg, no stranger to success at this meeting, saddles an intriguing candidate in Arthur's Girl. She took a 10-furlong maiden at Salisbury last time May 15, and owner/breeder Anthony Oppenheimer's advisor Hugo Lascelles told PA Sport, "I wouldn't think the step up in trip would be a problem looking at the pedigree, but it's obviously a tough task for her to go for this after winning a maiden."

Originally known as the New S. and renamed for the 16th Duke of Norfolk in 1973, this speed test has been won by the likes of Magic Ring (Ire), Turtle Island (Ire), Mind Games (GB), Johannesburg and Dutch Art (GB). John Best saddles Listed Windsor Castle S. winner Flashmans Papers alongside the maiden Elegant Cad, and the former needs to prove that his impressive 100-1 success in Tuesday's race was no fluke. "He seems fine and although we'll wait to see how he is in the morning, he'll probably run in the Norfolk," Best told PA Sport. "I told a few people beforehand that he was certainly too big a price in the Windsor Castle and we were expecting him to run very well. I thought my other runner Mullionmileanhour might be the likelier one, but the draw bias worked against him and he was five lengths down on the stands-side horses at halfway. But I never thought Flashmans Papers was a no-hoper, and we had deliberately given him a break after his last race to make sure he strengthened up a little bit. He was showing us loads of pace in his first two races, but wasn't quite getting home. The break and fast ground helped him. He doesn't have the best of draws in the Norfolk, but there aren't so many runners in that so it shouldn't matter too much." Baycat, who collected the same Newbury maiden on debut as last year's winner Winker Watson (GB) on debut Apr. 18, went on to defy a subsequent penalty over this track and trip 12 days later. He faces a host of highly promising sorts headed by South Central, who looked flashy when taking his first start by 13 lengths at Carlisle June 2 and represents the Howard Johnson stable successful with Masta Plasta (Ire) three years ago.



TOC BOARD ENDORSES THG MODEL The Board of Directors for the Thoroughbred Owners of California expressed their confidence in the Thoroughbred Horsemen's Group, voting unanimously to endorse THG's negotiating model and to authorize the horsemen's group to represent TOC in upcoming simulcast negotiations, including those involving advanced deposit wagering. In a TOC press release, the organization's Vice President Mace Siegel said, "Owners, and all other horsemen for that matter, have been at a disadvantage for years in terms of the negotiation of simulcast and ADW contracts. We have been intentionally excluded from the process by the vast majority of racetracks and ADW providers, and it shows. Simulcast revenue allocations are still founded on an outdated financial model, which disproportionately benefits those who do not contribute as much to the industry as do horsemen." TOC Chair Marsha Naify added, "Let's face it, racing is an interstate business, and becomes more so every day. To succeed and prosper, the industry must accept that reality, and manage the business as such. THG is the ideal vehicle to efficiently negotiate and manage the horsemen's side of the simulcast business, and could certainly do so for track partners were they inclined to objectively and honestly look at what it is THG proposes and stands for." Since last October, TOC and the California Horse Racing Board permitted all licensed ADW providers and tracks access to California Thoroughbred race signals, an experiment that ends at the beginning of the Del Mar meeting July 16. "The experiment was widely seen as a positive development for players, the ADW companies, and for the industry in general," said TOC President Drew J. Couto, who is also vice president of THG. "As a result, TOC has indicated to track partners its support for continuation of the experiment through the 2008 Oak Tree meet, which would allow us to properly evaluate the experiment's impact on all California Thoroughbred meets, through one full year. In the absence of an agreement to extend the experiment, the TOC Board has authorized THG to immediately begin negotiating alternative arrangements with ADW companies, beginning with the Del Mar meet." KETTLEONEUP RETIRED; IN FOAL TO

BERNARDINI Multiple graded stakes winner **Kettleoneup** (Victory Gallop--Bugs Rabbit, by Storm Cat), retired from racing after sustaining an injury in the May 2 GII Louisville H., is now in foal to Bernardini. "She chipped an ankle in the Louisville H. and she was retired," confirmed trainer Mike Tomlinson. The five-year-old mare captured last year's GII Falls City H. and GIII Sixty Sails H. On the board in 15 of 21 starts, Kettleoneup won seven races for owner Tom Crouch and earned \$659,297.

NYC OTB BILL INCLUDES TAKEOUT INCREASE

The legislation that gives New York State control of the NYC Off-Track Betting Corporation includes a shortterm 1-percent increase in the takeout on races run at New York Racing Association tracks, and could also bump up the takeout by 1 percent when a bettor in New York wagers on an out-of-state simulcast, the Daily Racing Form reports. The revenue generated by the increase is expected to help stabilize the New York racing industry. Under the terms of the bill, it will expire in two years. The 1-percent takeout raise on NYRA races will go into effect after the Saratoga meet. To offset the effects of that increase for its Rewards Program customers, NYRA will offer higher rebates. "Our plan is to at least make those customers whole, and we may even try to make it a little better for them," NYRA CEO Charlie Hayward told DRF. The increase in the outof-state takeout for New York bettors may be harder to implement, as that rate is set by contract, and it would require new contracts with the various out-of-state tracks to change it. In addition, the company taking the bet does not traditionally keep all of the revenue from an increase, but instead shares it with the track hosting the races on which the bets are being placed. That would decrease the financial benefit that the provision was hoped to provide to both NYRA and NYC OTB.






