Jim and Jackie Bolger's Friday afternoon at Royal Ascot started in style with Cuis Ghaire (Ire)'s success in the G3 Albany S., and hit the heights later when **Lush Lashes (GB)** (Galileo {Ire}) recorded a resounding

3 1/4-length success in the G1 Coronation S. Fifth as the crowd's choice in the G1 Epsom Oaks a fortnight ago, the well-supported 5-1 second favorite proved that speed is more her game, pulling away from Infallible (GB) (Pivotal {GB}) inside

the final furlong while just missing the track record set by Henrythenavigator on Tuesday. "We knew after Epsom she was going the right way and she's always shown plenty of pace," Jim Bolger said. Lush Lashes, who made quite an entrance at two when taking the Goffs Fillies Million on her debut at The Curragh in September, was bogged down in heavy ground when seventh on her return at that venue in the Mar. 30 G3 Park Express S. Delivering a powerful late surge to be sixth in the G1 1000 Guineas S. at Newmarket May 4, the blaze-faced bay built on that effort to spreadeagle the field in York's G3 Musidora S. just 10 days later. She was in the front line until being swallowed up in the final quarter-mile of the G1 Epsom Oaks June 6, but justified the bold decision to revert to this mile, rather than tackling Thursday's 12-furlong G2 Ribblesdale S.

Settled in fourth early by Kevin Manning while tracking the even pace set by Nahoodh (Clodovil {Ire}), she swept by that rival approaching the furlong marker as Infallible (GB) (Pivotal {GB}) and Jimmy Fortune hooked up for the final fight. That failed to materialise as Lush Lashes's superior stamina kicked in, and the contest was decided in a matter of strides.

"She was in a lovely position off a nice pace and traveled well all the way," Manning offered. "She stays well, and I just feel it was the track that she didn't handle at Epsom. In York, she put her head down all the way to the line, and it was the same here--it makes the job very easy when they have the speed she has."

Her trainer has a return to middle distances in mind now for the Galileo filly.

"She had the Goffs Million won with a furlong to go and that was over seven, so I was a little concerned about her staying the mile and a half at Epsom, but as it happened it was more the track than the trip that beat her," said Bolger. "Next time it will be the G1 Irish Oaks [at The Curragh July 13], and that is the only thing I am thinking about at the moment."

Cheveley Park's duo Infallible and the fourth-placed 9-4 favorite **Spacious** (Nayef) had no excuses afterwards. Infallible's trainer John Gosden told *PA Sport*, "She did nothing wrong and ran a blinder. The other filly just had more stamina in the last half-furlong. We came to beat her, and she outstayed us. Take nothing away from Jim's filly, but she likes this ground, and ours wants a bit of cut."

THINK ABOUT IT!

Connections may target the July 9 G1 Falmouth S. at Newmarket with the runner-up, while Dermot Weld is thinking further afield for Carribean Sunset.

"In my opinion, that was a vintage renewal of the Coronation S. and I was delighted with my filly, who is so tough and genuine," Weld said. "I think she was unlucky not to win the Irish 1000 Guineas, and possibly a shade unlucky not to finish second today. She is a filly who will get 10 furlongs as the year goes on, and her next race could be the GI American Oaks at Hollywood Park in a fortnight [July 5]."

Trained by Mark Johnston last year and this spring, Campanologist was fourth behind the subsequent G1 Dewhurst S. runner-up Fast Company (Ire) in York's G3 Acomb S. in August, and signed off with an unplaced effort in the G2 Royal Lodge S. here the following month. Transferred to his new stable after accounting for the smart Kandahar Run (GB) in the Listed Feilden S. at Newmarket Apr. 16, the bay was third behind Alessandro Volta (GB) and King of Rome (Ire) in the May 10 G3 Lingfield Derby Trial, and Classic plans were shelved. He was freshened up and showed willingness from the front under a perfectly judged ride from his Ascot specialist jockey. After turning down the spirited effort of Top Lock, he had done enough to ensure victory as Conduit ate up the deficit. "I wanted a good position, but not a mile-and-a-half testing pace, so I tried to slow it down without doing it too much," Dettori explained. "When I asked him, he quickened straight away, and he had enough left to get there." Winning trainer Saeed bin Suroor added, "He had improved a lot since Lingfield, and he showed he needed a mile and a half. We'll keep the options open." Sir Michael Stoute said of the runner-up, "He justified the supplementary fee and he's progressing along nicely. It's only been 13 days between his two runs, and we'll back off him now and freshen him up."

SERIOUS STUFF

It was harder work than her odds of 8-11 suggested, but Jim and Jackie Bolger's **Cuis Ghaire (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}) was firmly on top at the end of yesterday's G3 Albany S. While her name translates as "joke," the juvenile takes her work seriously. Twice a winner at Naas over this trip in a May 14 maiden and the June 2 G3 Swordlestown Stud Sprint S., the bay hit a flat spot before grinding her way to the front with a furlong remaining and asserting for a 1 3/4-length defeat of **Penny's Gift (GB)** (Tobougg {Ire}). "She's not really a six-furlong filly and, even at this stage, she wants seven furlongs or a mile, but because of her class we're getting away with it," said her trainer. **Albany S. cont. p5**

Jim Bolger's stable is almost a working advertisement for Galileo's prowess, and the talented progeny of Coolmore's heir apparent to Sadler's Wells keep rolling out of Coolcullen. Notables by that sire who carried the family silks include the two champion juveniles Teofilo (Ire) and New Approach (Ire)--the latter of which went on to Derby fame at Epsom earlier this month--as well

as yesterday's G1 Coronation S. heroine Lush Lashes (GB). Bolger, who also bred Ballydoyle's multiple Group 1 winner Soldier of Fortune (Ire), now has another dual group winner and ascendant star in Cuis Ghaire, who defied her pedigree with

the pace to beat the smart Silver Shoon (Ire) on debut before inflicting a 3 1/2-length defeat on Marquesa in the Swordlestown. The homebred was rank early when restrained behind the early leaders, and she did not find instant acceleration when the pressure was applied, but eventually got rolling to overwhelm Penny's Gift, and dominated the final furlong.

"I traveled well in behind them, but when they quickened up she just got a bit flat-footed, as the trip is possibly a shade short for her," winning rider Kevin Manning commented. "When she got into top gear she picked up and has gone all the way to the line." Bolger added, "She's impressed me in her races because she's a miler, but she's fairly precocious and majors in temperament. We thought we'd try to pick up a couple of these races before moving onto the serious stuff. You won't see her again over six [furlongs], but somebody said that Galileo hadn't had a winner over the trip so we had to put that right. She'll probably go for the [Aug. 10] G2 Debutante S. at The Curragh and all being well on to the [Aug. 31] G1 Moyglare Stud S."

This is a supreme stamina test for three-year-olds, but Patkai made it look a cakewalk with a highly impressive success on his first stakes try. Quietly progressive this season, the homebred followed a third in a Newbury conditions event Apr. 18 with a runner-up finish in a Chester handicap May 7. He had looked



better the further he traveled in a 1 1/2-mile handicap at Haydock last time May 31 and it was more of the same here as the chestnut outclassed his overmatched rivals. Settled in mid-division by Ryan Moore throughout the early stages,

Patkai made his move wide on the final turn and quickened to the front passing the quarter pole before surging clear. "He is a really progressive horse and is growing up mentally all the time," said winning trainer Sir Michael Stoute. "He doesn't need to go that distance, but we decided to run Conduit (Ire) in the King Edward, so it looked a suitable race for him. He's not bred to get this trip, being by Indian Ridge out of a sister to Islington (Ire) who was probably best at a mile and a quarter, but he just lobs and does nothing until Ryan asks him. Known as the Cork and Orrery S. from its inception in 1868 until its rebirth and upgrade six years ago, this race went to Freddy Head aboard King's Country in 1971, and he returns as the trainer of Marchand d'Or this time. While France has not been noted for the strength of its sprinters in recent times, Carla Giral's gelding has breathed life into the scene with wins in the last two renewals of Deauville's G1 Prix Maurice de Gheest. Fourth behind Sakhee's Secret and runner-up to Red Clubs (Ire) on his two British forays in the July Cup and G1 Haydock Sprint Cup respectively last term, he looked better than ever when beating the subsequent G1 King's Stand S. winner Equiano (Fr) over five furlongs in the G2 Prix du Gros-Chene at Chantilly last time June 1. "He ran a great race last time and was giving weight to Equiano after some time off," he commented.

"He is very well and has never been better. He was bothered by a quarter crack all last year, but that is behind him now and he will take a lot of beating." Following his half-length second in Tuesday's King's Stand, Joe Janiak's **Takeover Target** is back again for his sixth encounter with the Ascot straight as he chases the Global Sprint Challenge title. Third behind Les Arcs when attempting the "Choisir double" in 2006, he was a head second to Budget Stables' **Soldier's Tale** 12 months ago, and appears to have lost none of his verve. He is joined by Dick Karreman's New Zealand challenger **Seachange**, who was almost forced

into international competition after proving too good for her compatriots. Trainer Graeme Sanders is hoping the multiple Group 1 winner can hold her own while dropping in trip after a sixth in the Mar. 29 G1 Dubai Duty Free over 1777 meters at Nad Al Sheba, "She has thrived in her new surroundings, and I think she's done very well," Sanders said. "I think she'll take to the long straight well, and a testing six furlongs will be to her advantage." The strongly built mare will visit Zabeel (NZ) at the conclusion of her racing carer. Ballydoyle

will look to stretch their winning streak in the major races this week with Michael Tabor, Susan Magnier, Derrick Smith and Joseph Allen's **US Ranger** and Smith, Tabor and Magnier's **Astronomer Royal**. Both were campaigned over longer trips last year, with the latter winning Longchamp's G1 Poule d'Essai des Poulains before a third in this meeting's G1 St James's Palace S. He arrives off the back of a win in the May 24 G3 Greenlands S. when reverting to sprinting at The Curragh. US Ranger was racing against a marked draw bias when fourth behind Lady Whent's **Assertive** in the G2 Duke of York S. last time.

"He's in good nick, but is obviously relatively inexperienced for this big step up in class," Teddy Grimthorpe, racing manager for owner/breeder Khalid Abdullah, told PA Sport. "But he has been to Ascot before when he won very impressively in Listed company. This is obviously a different kettle of fish, but we have always had a high opinion of him."

THE MEASURE OF OPPORTUNITY

By Roger Lyons

Prior to Da' Tara (Tiznow--Torchera, by Pirate's Bounty)'s wire-to-wire romp in the Belmont Stakes, Torchera had been the dam of four unraced foals, a non-winner, and a winner in Japan--that, from opportunities with Deputy Minister, Unbridled (twice), Victory Gallop, Kris S., and Distorted Humor. We now know that her mating with Victory Gallop dipped more deeply into the stallion ranks than she was used to, but, clearly, she'd had plenty of opportunity and had worn

out her welcome when sold in foal to

Deputy Commander.

It turns out, though, that WinStar Farm had been well served by its pedigree adviser John Prather, who is credited with the idea of breeding her to Tiznow. That was the opportunity that counted the most, and what must be strongly suspected now--but which could only have been hoped for then-is that Tiznow was the best opportunity she'd ever had. He might well turn out to be as good a sire of the big

horse as Unbridled was, maybe better. He now has four Grade I winners (two colts, two fillies) and four Grade II winners, and this year we're seeing only his third crop of three-year-olds.

Wait a minute. Tiznow was a better "opportunity" for her than Distorted Humor? Clearly, that does not accord with the sense in which the term opportunity is ordinarily understood in this business. First, there is the most crassly statistical sense, which makes no distinction at all among the stallions a mare is bred to. If she had 10 foals, she had 10 opportunities. This is the most tenuously hypothetical of all senses of the term, and it doesn't help a bit here. Second, there is the more ordinary sense of the term, in accordance with which one can say that Torchera had excellent opportunity, precisely because she was bred to very good sires.

Still, neither of these statistical senses of the term opportunity would seem to give Tiznow an edge over Distorted Humor, but both of them fall very far short of the nuanced way in which opportunities are ordinarily recognized as such in the real world. Compare them with the variety of considerations that might apply to the selection of a stallion for a mare. It happens, for example, that, even prior to Da' Tara's Belmont S. win, the cross of Relaunch-line sires with Pirate's Bounty-line mares was an A++ nick by the Werk nick rating system featured in this publication. With the exception of the foal by Victory Gallop, which is an A + nick, all of Torchera's previous foals had been no better than B nicks.

Da' Tara's A + + nick was entirely accountable to three stakes winners by Bertrando (by Skywalker, by Relaunch), and out of mares by Pirate's Bounty. Smooth Player appears to have been the best so far, having won the GII Hollywood Oaks, the GII Lady's Secret Breeders' Cup H. and the GII Las Palmas H. Another of the three, though, is Sierra Sunset, winner of the 2008 GII Rebel S. The third is the less notable Seam Seeker, winner of the Burlingame H., a Listed stakes at Bay Meadows. The hook for breeding Da' Tara's dam to Tiznow is that both Sierra Sunset and Seam Seeker are out of mares from the same family as Torchera, both tracing in female descent to her second dam, Kay Ho, and bred to Pirate's Bounty. Even though Tiznow represents a quite different branch of Relaunch line, he was the right nick. That is what can fairly be

> called patterned breeding--a great opportunity indeed.

Having been a party to the development and maintenance of the Werk rating for the past 15 years, I am aware that, apart from the female family connections involved in this case, that rating has a very great advantage in reflecting the effectiveness of a potentially explosive sire-line cross, especially under the conditions represented by this case. Two key factors contribute to that.

First, the Werk rating disregards opportunity, hypothetical or otherwise. The frequency of stakes production is measured, rather, against a stakes population norm: overall representation of the sire and broodmare sire lines in the population of stakes winners. In other words, how does the actual stakes production from the cross compare with an expectation based on how frequently the Relaunch sire line and the Pirate's Bounty broodmare sire line are represented individually in the population of stakes winners?

The hazard of using hypothetical opportunity as a comparative measure--i.e., the number of foals or runners bred from the cross in the general population--is that quantitative opportunity is too often not what it appears to be. In too many cases, most of the occurrences of a cross will involve sire-line representatives that rarely or never contribute to the population of stakes winners, yet each of those cases will contribute to the statistical measure of opportunity equally, alongside much more viable breeding stock offering substantially greater opportunity in the ordinary sense of the term. Consequently, the more effective a sire-line cross is--and the more it is replicated down through the population--the more its "opportunity" will drive down its rating. How many Pirate's Bounty mares produced foals or runners by Bertrando? It doesn't matter since most of them, while vitally important to the industry and to their owners, did not represent a level of real opportunity that should give form to a top-down, sire-line nick rating system.

Second, the Werk rating disregards the winners of North American races restricted to regionally bred horses. If Da' Tara's cross were rated by a system that takes into account restricted stakes and that measures the frequency of stakes production against the statistical opportunity of the cross, then his cross could be rated as no better than average, even if Da' Tara himself were included in the calculation as a stakes winner. The problem is that the Relaunch sire line has had enormous opportunity (in the statistical sense) 1) to sire runners by Bertrando and out of Pirate's Bounty-line mares, not to mention Tiznow's sire, Cee's Tizzy; and 2) to yield California restricted stakes winners by those sires out of mares from other broodmare sire lines. In the first place, the abundant statistical opportunity would diminish the effect of the four unrestricted stakes winners, including two Grade II winners and a Belmont S. winner. In the second place, the restricted stakes winners sired by Relaunch-line stallions out of mares from other broodmare sire lines than Pirate's Bounty would compete with the genuinely superior runners from this cross on a basis of statistical equality. Those restricted stakes winners would further depress the rating for this cross. Remember, large samples gravitate toward the mean, which is why real researchers use qualified samples, rather than populations.

It's not that the breeding of restricted stakes winners does not frequently represent favorable nicks. The problem is that restricted stakes, as a group, are a lot easier to win than unrestricted stakes as a group. Consequently, they are frequently won by runners bred from inferior sire-line crosses. To take all of these runners alike as evidence of patterned breeding only tends to wash out the ratings for crosses that truly are effective.

The use of restricted stakes combined with a purely statistical measure of opportunity is a formula for broadly misguided results. While they seem like great features in principle, the structure of the population and of the racing industry are such that these measures apply only very unreliably.

So, the specialized ways in which thoroughbred breeders think and talk about opportunity must be cleared away in order to see that Tiznow very likely did present Torchera with the best opportunity she'd ever had. Greater is the advantage to those who can view opportunity in a richer, more nuanced way.

Gold Cup Notes:

Recent European import Spice Route (GB) (King's Best), Group 3-placed on the turf and stakes-placed on the all-weather in Europe, has cleared quarantine and could make his U.S. debut in next Saturday's GI Hollywood Gold Cup. "He got out of quarantine last Thursday and is stabled with Paddy Gallagher at Santa Anita," said bloodstock agent Richard Duggan, who bought the horse for Harlequin Ranches, owned by Canadian Dick Bonnycastle. "They're serious about running in the Gold Cup or they wouldn't have nominated." Though winless in just over a year, the fouryear-old ran the solid Kandidate (GB) to 3/4 of a length when third in the Listed Magnolia S. at Kempton Mar. 29 and was third two starts later behind Championship Point (Ire) and Maraahel (GB) in the G3 Huxley S. at Chester May 8.

Three probable starters in the Gold Cup turned in works yesterday morning. At Hollywood Park, Tiago (Pleasant Tap), the probable second wagering choice, went six furlongs in 1:12.60 beneath jockey Mike Smith. Despite solid form this season, including a victory over ante-post favorite Heatseeker (Ire) (Giant's Causeway) in the GII Oaklawn H. in April, trainer John Shirreffs is something other than confident. "Unless Heatseeker is carrying an anchor, I don't know how we're going to catch him," he deadpanned. Tiago was soundly defeated by Heatseeker in the GII The Californian S. May 31. Big Booster (Accelerator), third in last year's race, went 3/4 of a mile in 1:16 under Corey Nakatani, while McCann's Mojave (Memo {Chi}), recent winner of the GIII Berkeley H., went a mile to the satisfaction of trainer Steve Specht. "I got him in 1:39 and change, and he finished good and strong," said Specht of the eight-year-old millionaire. "That's not quite as fast as normal, but I didn't intend it to be. It was unusually hot here, and I took it a little easier than usual. He went easy the first three-eighths and picked it up the last half."


