#### IEAH ANNOUNCES DRUG-FREE POLICY

IEAH Stables announced Monday morning that, beginning Oct. 1, the only medication their horses will race on will be Lasix. A press release on their website

stated, "No other medication, drugs or steroids will be administered. To the best of our knowledge, we are the first racing stable in North America to make this commitment. We encourage others to follow our lead." The date was chosen to give any medication time to clear the horses systems. IEAH co-President and co-CEO Mi-

chael lavarone explained the decision to announce the drug-free policy now. "There were several motivating factors," lavarone said. "Racing has been going down the tubes for too long, but we were never in a position before to make a statement or take a stand. Nobody knew us. When we won the Kentucky Derby with Big Brown, that put us in a position to take a stand. Also, when Big Brown won the Kentucky Derby, it was tainted because he won it on steroids, and that wasn't fair to Big Brown." lavarone initially wanted the IEAH horses to run without the benefit of any medication at all, but modified the plan to exclude Lasix. "When I told Rick Dutrow what we wanted to do, he was all for it, but he said that certain horses do bleed and, for their protection, they should race on Lasix," lavarone said. IEAH is willing to fund pre- and post-race testing on all of its runners, and if the horse tests positive for any substance other than Lasix, even if that medication is permissible on raceday, they will take any purse money received and donate it to charity. What charity has not yet been determined, but the money could even go to providing better testing in the future. "We're making it very clear," lavarone said. "Our horses will run on Lasix only. If they test positive for anything else--steroids, for example--we will not accept the purse money, I assure you--no ifs, ands or buts." IEAH cont. p2

#### SANTA ANITA TO INSTALL PRO-RIDE

Santa Anita Park will undergo a complete overhaul of its main track, which will be reconstituted with Pro-Ride synthetic, according to track statement yesterday. The installation process--expected to begin July 14--is anticipated to take six weeks to complete. While the track is being restructured, Santa Anita will be closed for training, and any horses on the ground will be moved to Hollywood Park. The project will include completely removing the existing asphalt base, adding a new grid base material, and treating the entire track with binder and fiber. "We are very anxious to undertake and complete this project," said Santa Anita President Ron Charles. "After consulting extensively with [Magna Entertainment Chairman] Frank Stronach and MEC track consultants, we have all decided this would be the best course of action for Santa Anita to take, with the Breeders' Cup committed to coming here over the next two years. We are firmly convinced the people at Pro-Ride can provide the product our racing demands, and just as importantly, we know they will provide the oversight we need to guarantee this surface drains properly, is kind to horse and rider, and that it will produce formful, consistent racing." With regard to training and stabling during the course of the project, Charles acknowledged Hollywood Park's cooperation. "We appreciate very much that Hollywood has agreed to stay open for training during Del Mar," said Charles. "We will initiate this project at the conclusion of the Hollywood Park meet, and we'll be closed for training for most all of the Del Mar meet. We also appreciate the cooperation of Ed Halpern and the California Thoroughbred Trainers [CTT] and the TOC [Thoroughbred Owners of California] for their willingness to work together with us to make these changes." Explaining the decision to go with Pro-Ride, Charles added, "lan [Pearse, managing director of Pro-Ride] was able to turn a dysfunctional track into a functional one for us in just four days," said Charles. "Now, he'll have three full weeks to work with. We've put a great deal of thought into this decision. We seriously considered other options, and we believe that staying with Pro-Ride and taking the time we did not have in February to fully upgrade the surface is the way to go."

splits of :13.20, :26.20, :38.80 and :51.20, galloping out six furlongs in 1:17. The colt's connections have indicated that a start in the G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe Oct. 5 may be in the cards for the powerful chestnut, who recently posted an impressive victory in the June 14 GI Stephen Foster H. Asmussen confirmed that, should the colt show an affinity for the turf, he will look for a race over that surface in mid-July.

IEAH is encouraging other owners to follow its drugfree direction. "There is no better governing body, in my eyes, than the owners," lavarone said. "We need the owners to come together before the sport doesn't have any integrity left. This is the way to do it. The owners make the decision, they don't give the option [for medication to the trainers or the vets." lavarone would also like to see that the betting public is informed as to which owners are adopting a drug-free policy, and which are not. "There needs to be transparency in racing," he said. To that end, the IEAH press release suggested, "We will request and strongly urge that race programs include data indicating which horses will run with medication, which will run free of medication. The programs should also indicate which owners/trainers decline to divulge this information." IEAH is in the process of developing a campaign against drugs in racing. "We're going to be all over it," lavarone said. "We can't release our plan yet, but we have a lot of ideas and we are putting them together as we speak."



#### Curragh Expect Good Ground...

With the Derby weekend fast approaching, The Curragh's management are forecasting good ground, with the promise of an unsettled forecast set to stop any major drying of the surface. General Manager Paul Hensey gave the current state of the going as 'good to yielding' on the round course and 'yielding' on the straight course ahead of the two-day Dubai Duty Free Irish Derby meeting. "The Met Office say it will be an unsettled week and it is difficult to predict how much rainfall we will get," Hensey said. "The ground on the Derby course is just on the easy side of good and I would be hopeful, based on the forecast, that the ground will be as close to that for the weekend." In addition to Sunday's clash between the G1 Epsom Derby one-two-three **New Approach (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}), Tartan Bearer (Ire) (Spectrum {Ire}) and Casual Conquest (Ire) (Hernando (Fr)) in the main feature, Saturday's G1 Pretty Polly S. promises to be a high-class affair despite the absence of Peeping Fawn (Danehill). While that Ballydoyle star was scratched at yesterday's five-day stage, Jim and Jackie Bolger's impressive G1 Coronation S. winner Lush Lashes (GB) (Galileo {Ire}) was a key name amongst the 13 remaining in the 10-furlong contest. Michael Ryan's Finsceal Beo (Ire) (Mr. Greeley) was another from the Bolger stable, while Sir Michael Stoute has entered Khalid Abdullah's G1 Prix de l'Opera runner-up Promising Lead (GB) (Danehill).

PYRO WORKS: HASKELL NEXT Winchell Thoroughbred's Pyro (Pulpit), winner of the Mar. 8 GII Louisiana Derby, is expected to make his next start in the GI Haskell Invitational at Monmouth Aug. 3, according to trainer Steve Asmussen. Winner of the GIII Northern Dancer S. at Churchill Downs June 14, the dark bayunder Carlos Rosas--breezed four furlongs in :53.60 at Churchill Monday morning. A winner of four of nine starts with earnings of \$1,174,063, Pyro also accounted for the GIII Risen Star S. at the Fair Grounds Feb. 9.

#### STUDENT COUNCIL TO HOLLYWOOD GOLD

CUP Millennium Farms' Student Council (Kingmambo), victorious in the GI Pimlico Special May 16, will make his next start in the \$750,000 GI Hollywood Gold Cup June 28. The six-year-old was originally considered for the \$500,000 GI Suburban H. at Belmont the same day as the Gold Cup, however, the bay's connections reconsidered their options. "It came down to the weights and the higher purse," explained Ro Parra, owner of Millennium Farms. "Perhaps it will be 'third time's the charm' for us, as we've been third in the Gold Cup twice, and we think we can win it this year with Student Council." Trained by Steve Asmussen, the winner of last year's GI Pacific Classic has been assigned 117 pounds and will be ridden by Shaun Bridgmohan. According to Para, Student Council flew from Kentucky, where is currently based at Churchill Downs, to California vesterday. In the 1 1/4-mile contest, the Kentucky-bred will once again face Heatseeker (Ire) (Giant's Causeway), who was assigned top weight of 123 pounds.

June 22 holds a very different place in the life stories of Galileo the stallion and Galileo Galilei, the radical mathematician, physicist and astronomer after whom the 2001 Derby winner was named. Apparently it was on that day in 1633 that the scientist was forced by the Inquisition to recant his view that the sun, not the earth, was the center of the universe. On the other hand, June 22, 2008 pretty much confirmed that the equine Galileo is the center of the universe as far as today's European breeding industry is concerned.

The previous few days had seen the 10-year-old son of Sadler's Wells represented by two group winners at Royal Ascot, with his daughters Lush Lashes and Cuis Ghaire taking the G1 Coronation S. and G3 Albany S., respectively. There were also stakes winners in the U.S. and Ireland. By the 22nd, Galileo's British and Irish prize-money total stood at over £1,700,000, more than double that of his nearest pursuer, Henrythenavigator's sire Kingmambo. So, after the sires' championship has been dominated by just two stallions, Sadler's Wells and Danehill, over the last 16 years, there is a very strong chance that the next name on the list will be that of Galileo. He is the reigning champion sire of two-year-olds and he has been making relentless progress up the general sires' table, having ranked fourth to Danehill in 2006 and second to that stallion in 2007.

Although a minimum of £3,400,000 is normally needed to secure the sires' championship, Galileo must have every chance of reaching that sort of figure, with the Derby hero New Approach, the Coronation Cup winner Soldier of Fortune and Lush Lashes among his current representatives. Altogether, he has 13 Northern Hemisphere stakes winners this year, including nine group winners. As I pointed out a few weeks ago, seven of those group winners come from Galileo's third crop, conceived at a time when his fee had fallen to €40,000.

He had started out at €50,000 in 2002 and proved so popular that Coolmore felt obliged to raise his fee to €60,000 in his second year. The rise backfired and Galileo's book fell from 156 to 103 mares, but reducing his fee revived demand, with 156 third-crop mares producing 124 foals. His seven group-winning three-year-olds represent an impressive 5.6 percent of his crop. His 17 group winners from his first three crops also work out at more than 5 percent, so what might he achieve with his 2008 and 2009 crops, sired at considerably higher fees?

Galileo's fee was reduced to €37,500 in his fourth and fifth seasons--the fifth season coming after his first two-year-olds had performed creditably, but not spectacularly, in 2005. It was a different story when that first crop turned three in 2006, with Red Rocks (Breeders' Cup Turf), Sixties Icon (St Leger), Nightime (Irish 1,000 Guineas), Allegretto, Vendageur, Galatee and the nicely named Heliostatic all developing into group winners.

As four of those group winners scored at 1 1/2 miles or more, and Galileo supplied the trifecta in the St Leger, he appeared to be shaping up as an excellent sire of horses which generally needed time and a test of stamina. Fortunately, trainer Jim Bolger has helped prove that there is another dimension to Galileo's talents.

Bolger has come in for a fair amount of criticism in the British press in recent weeks, but no one could deny that racing would be much more entertaining and informative if more trainers adopted his bold approach. Being told that something has never been done before is unlikely to deter Bolger from trying to achieve the so-called impossible. He believes that if a racehorse is fit and well, its place is on the racecourse.

For example, that excellent racemare Alexander Goldrun raced 31 times during her jet-setting career (before visiting Galileo) and the equally talented Finsceal Beo attempted to complete the 1000 Guineas treble in England, France and Ireland in the space of 22 days and very nearly succeeded. This boldness is shared by Aidan O'Brien, who spent some of his formative years as a trainer in Bolger's employ. The fact that Bolger has trained as many as seven of Galileo's 18 group winners (and O'Brien another three) suggests that Galileo's stock thrive on hard work.

A striking statistic about Galileo's progeny is that only three have so far succeeded in winning a group race at two, and all three were handled by Bolger, who also trained Lush Lashes to win the highly valuable Goffs Fillies Millions as a juvenile. Bolger's first group-winning juvenile by Galileo was none other than Teofilo, who remained undefeated in five starts to land the title of champion two-year-old in 2006. History repeated itself when New Approach duplicated Teofilo's achievements last year and now Bolger has become the first person to win a six-furlong group race with a Galileo, thanks to Cuis Ghaire's Group 3 victories in the Swordlestown Stud Sprint and the Albany S. The filly is now unbeaten in three starts.



#### Pedigree Insights cont.

One emerging fact about Galileo is that he is very well suited by daughters of Danehill, with this pairing producing 3x4 inbreeding to Northern Dancer, plus

4x5x5 to Natalma and 5x5 to Buckpasser. Teofilo is out of a Danehill mare, and so are Cuis Ghaire, Cima de Triomphe (winner of this year's G1 Derby Italiano) and Banc de Fortune (runner-up in last year's G1 Arrowfield Stud S. in Australia). The Group 3 winner Prima Luce is out of a grand-daughter of Danehill, while Lush Lashes

is out of a mare by Anabaa, who shares the same sire--Danzig--as Danehill. In view of this very promising link between Galileo and Danehill, it is all the more surprising that he hasn't done a lot better with his Australian crops. He is currently lying in 19th place on Australia's leading sires' list, having finished 109th--with two crops of racing age--on the 2006-2007 table.

Cuis Ghaire comes from the same family as Soldier of Fortune and his brother Heliostatic, who stood his first season at Oak Lodge Stud this year. Her third dam, the classic-placed Fanghorn, is also the fifth dam of Soldier of Fortune, who ran away with last year's Irish Derby. It would probably be wrong, though, to assume that she will stay as well as her relative. Whereas Soldier of Fortune's broodmare sire is Erin's Isle, a Grade I winner at up to 1 3/4 miles, Cuis Ghaire's first three dams are by Danehill, Tap On Wood and Crocket, three stallions which made their names over sprint distances or a mile. However, when Cuis Ghaire's second dam Smaoineamh visited Galileo, the outcome was Luminous One, who was allowed to take her chance in last year's Pretty Polly S. and has since been tried over 1 3/4 miles.

Fanghorn made her mark principally by producing the top sprinter Double Form and her family continues to thrive. Fanghorn's grand-daughter Guess Again had two foals by Double Schwartz which were inbred 3x3 to Fanghorn. Jim Bolger trainer the first, Cois Na Tine, to become a Group 3 two-year-old winner and the second, Eva Luna, to take the G1 Phoenix S. and four other races on her way to the title of champion juvenile filly in Ireland in 1994.

Now that Bolger has shown that Galileo's stock can flourish at two, perhaps other trainers should be reminded that all four of the stallion's grandparents--Northern Dancer, Fairy Bridge, Miswaki and Allegretta-were very effective at two, winning 13 of their 18 starts.




