LA TRAVIATA RETIRED: ADIEU DEAD

Coolmore's Grade I winner **Adieu** (El Corredor--Irene's Talkin, At the Threshold) died June 17 at the operation's Ashford Stud in Kentucky, reports *The Thoroughbred Times*. The cause of death has yet to be an-

nounced. Retired for the 2007 breeding season, Adieu foaled a Giant's Causeway filly January 24. Coolmore associates Mrs. John Magnier, Michael Tabor and Derrick Smith purchased Adieu for \$300,000 at the Fasig-Tipton Calder sale in 2006. The bay was one of the better juvenile fillies that year, winning four of six, including the GI Frizette S. and GII Spinaway S. She was seventh to Folklore in

the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies at Belmont Park. At three, she captured the GII Delaware Oaks before being retired after going unplaced in the GI Alabama S. In all, she won five of 10 and banked \$907,934 for trainer Todd Pletcher.

Meanwhile, *Thoroughbred Times* reports that Coolmore lost another from its broodmare band recently when **Tacha** (Mr. Prospector--Savannah Dancer, by Northern Dancer), dam of Coolmore's European champion juvenile and leading freshman sire One Cool Cat, died after giving birth to a Johannesburg filly May 1. The mare was 16 years old and the filly is reportedly in good health. Coolmore purchased One Cool Cat from breeder WinStar Farm for \$3.1 million at 2002 Keeneland July and later bought the mare privately.

Speedy La Traviata In Foal to Mr. Greeley...

The four-year-old graded stakes winner La Traviata (Johannesburg--Piedras Negras, by Unbridled) was

retired this spring and bred to Mr. Greeley, said the publication. Purchased for \$1.1 million and campaigned Magnier, Tabor and Smith, La Traviata burst onto the scene last year with a 13 1/4-length romp at Monmouth in June, which earned her TDN Rising Star" status. She was just as impressive in her next two, taking the Post Deb S.

by five lengths and the GIII Victory Ride S. by 9 1/4 lengths. Favored in the inaugural Breeders' Cup Filly & Mare Sprint, she ran sixth after vying for the lead.

NO 'HONOUR' OFFSPRING IN 2008, 2009

Broodmare of the Year Better Than Honour (Deputy Minister--Blush With Pride, by Blushing Groom (Fr)), who became the first mare to be represented by backto-back GI Belmont S. winners, did not conceive after being covered by Distorted Humor in May and will not be bred again this season. "She was bred to Distorted Humor May 19, did not get in foal, and we decided to not breed her back," said Hill 'n' Dale Farms' John Sikura, who owns the mare in partnership with Southern Equine. Sikura said he is hoping to get the 12-yearold mare to the breeding shed early in the 2009 season. It will mark the second year in a row Better Than Honour won't have a foal. Earlier this season, she lost the A.P. Indy foal she was carrying. After son Jazil won the Belmont in 2006 and Rags to Riches won last term, Better Than Honour was poised to rewrite the record books with the emergence of another son, Casino Drive, as a serious threat in this year's Belmont. The colt, however, suffered a foot bruise on the eve of the race.

HAMSA ENTERS MOTHER GOOSE PICTURE

Last week's defection of GI Acorn S. heroine Zaftig (Gone West) left a big hole in Saturday's GI Mother Goose S., and few have been eager to fill the void and take on the prohibitive favorite Proud Spell (Proud Citizen). On Monday, however, Barclay Tagg tossed his hat in the ring and told Daily Racing Form that he planned on running Lael Stables' Hamsa (Fusaichi Pegasus). The filly broke her maiden sprinting seven panels at Gulfstream Mar. 30 and came back to take an allowance race at Belmont May 2. This will be her stakes debut and brings the Mother Goose field, as of Tuesday at least, to three. TDN Rising Star" Music Note (A.P. Indy) is the only other confirmed starter.



The Mother Goose is named after Harry Payne Whitney's filly, who defeated the colts in the 1924 Futurity and was named the champion juvenile of her division. She is one of only 13 fillies to have won the Futurity since it was first run in 1888. Even more influential in the breeding shed, she is the third dam of Natalma, who produced Northern Dancer; and of Cosmah, who produced Halo.

Indian Daffodil was successful in all three juvenile starts last year and came back this term to run second in both the Mar. 27 Listed Prix François Mathet at Saint-Cloud and the Apr. 24 Listed Prix de Suresnes at Chantilly last time. Positioned in second for much of this pattern race bow, he was sent to the front at the quarter-mile marker and kept on in determined fashion under a drive to just hold off the subsequently demoted Italian raider Farrel by a pixel for a career high. "M. Rouget has always liked him," said winning rider Christophe Lemaire. Approach Heads Derby Field...

Princess Haya of Jordan's New Approach (Ire) (Galileo (Ire)) will face a maximum 13 rivals in Sunday's G1 Dubai Duty Free Irish Derby as he bids to become the 13th to complete the Epsom-Curragh Classic double since 1970. The Jim Bolger-trained colt could face the next five home in the June 7 Classic, with Ballymacoll Stud's runner-up Tartan Bearer (Ire) (Spectrum {Ire}) and Moyglare Stud's third Casual Conquest (Ire) (Hernando {Fr}) already confirmed as certain starters by connections. The latter's trainer Dermot Weld, who also has Bertam Firestone's Winchester (Theatrical {Ire}) in the list, is expecting improvement from Casual Conquest. "I think this year's Derby was a vintage renewal and I believed he has learned from it," he said. "It will be very tough to reverse placings with the winner and second, but I'm very confident he'll run well on Sunday." Tartan Bearer's conditioner Sir Michael Stoute could also be represented by Khalid Abdullah's Derby fourth Doctor Fremantle (GB) (Sadler's Wells), while Aidan O'Brien has six remaining headed by Derrick Smith, Michael Tabor and Susan Magnier's Washington Irving (Ire) (Montjeu {Ire}) and Alessandro Volta (GB) (Montjeu {Ire}), who were fifth and sixth, respectively, at Epsom.

Another of the Derby's also-rans is Patrick Cooper and Partners' Curtain Call (Fr) (Sadler's Wells), and the Luca Cumani-trained colt will be renewing the link with jockey Fran Berry, who partnered him to success in last year's G2 Beresford S. "Curtain Call has been declared and the intention is to run with Fran Berry riding," Cooper told PA Sport. "He deserved his chance of a big pay day--he is leading the Irish jockeys championship, riding out of his skin and knows the Curragh very well." John Gosden yesterday supplemented Princess Haya of Jordan's handicapper Upton Grey (Ire) (Dalakhani {Ire}) for pacemaking duties and will also saddle Michael O'Flynn's G3 Sandown Classic Trial scorer Centennial (Ire) (Dalakhani {Ire}), who was fourth in the G2 Dante S. at York last time May 15. "I was at Sandown and it was a nice performance, but it looks a hot race on Sunday in different company," his owner told PA Sport yesterday. "The Dante was a bit fast for him and the trip was wrong and I think that he will be much more suited by the one mile four furlongs in the Derby and we'll find out at the weekend." The Curragh's Manager Paul Hensey yesterday described conditions as "good" ahead of the weekend fixture. "It is a bit overcast and windy at the moment and we are expecting five millimetres of rain," he commented. "The considerable rain we had on Saturday has soaked in and the ground has dried to good on the Derby course."

O'BRIEN OUTLINES SUMMER BATTLE PLAN

Aidan O'Brien has set out the forthcoming race schedule for Ballydoyle's main runners, with Susan Magnier and Michael Tabor's G1 Prince of Wales's S. winner Duke of Marmalade (Ire) (Danehill) due to contest the G1 King George VI and Queen Elizabeth S. The three-times Group 1 scorer is likely to be joined in the July 26 Ascot feature by Saturday's G2 Hardwicke S. hero Macarthur (GB) (Montjeu {Ire}), with Magnier, Tabor and Smith's G1 English and Irish 2000 Guineas and G1 St James's Palace S. winner Henrythenavigator (Kingmambo) likely to run in Goodwood's G1 Sussex S. July 30. "We've all discussed things and, while plans can always change, we've come up with a list of the races for our Ascot winners, and we're looking at Duke of Marmalade and Macarthur going for the King George," he told the Racing Post. "Soldier of Fortune (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}) may go to France on Sunday for the G1 Grand Prix de Saint-Cloud and, for now, we are looking no further than that race for him. We will see how he gets on there before looking any further ahead. The current plan is to send Yeats (Ire) (Sadler's Wells) and Honolulu (Ire) (Montjeu {Ire}), who won the Queen Alexandra S., for the [July 31] G2 Goodwood Cup." O'Brien also revealed that Tuesday's G1 Queen Anne S. fifth Mount Nelson (GB) (Rock of Gibraltar {Ire}) would be targeted at next Saturday's G1 Eclipse S. at Sandown.

DARJINA TARGETS FALMOUTH Princess Zahra Aga Khan's Darjina (Fr) (Zamindar) is being aimed at the G1 UAE Hydra Properties Falmouth S. at Newmarket July 9, connections announced yesterday. Trainer Alain de Royer Dupre revealed that the G1 Queen Anne S. runner-up would make a quick return to Britain for the £200,000 mile contest. "Darjina returned home after Ascot and has been playful and full of life," de Royer Dupre explained. "She seems to be very well. She certainly looks well, so if there's no problem with her, then the plan is to take her to Newmarket for the Falmouth S. The only problem for her would be if there was too much rain. She needs to have good to firm ground to run her best race." Also set to be in the line-up is Dick Karreman's Seachange (NZ) (Cape Cross {Ire}), who was 12th in Saturday's G1 Golden Jubilee S. "We'll go for the Falmouth S.--that's the plan at this stage," trainer Graeme Sanders announced yesterday. We just hope it stays dry now, because she's got to have that firm ground."

Horse racing is currently standing in the middle of a crossroads, in light of the recent tragedies and the public outcry regarding same. There is little doubt of that. That said, whichever path is collectively chosen to be pursued will dictate the future of the sport for decades to come.


To illustrate this point, I would like to parallel horse racing with two other sports that, 20 years ago, stared at their own crossroads.

One is boxing. Although not as popular as its heyday, 20 years ago it was still considered one of the top sports in America. It had myriad quality fighters and generated a lot of interest and enthusiasm from the general public, even if they didn't really care for the sport. However, when problems arose (the heavyweight champion going to jail, allegations of bribery, allegations of fixed fights, etc...) instead of bonding together and looking toward the future by marketing their product in a way that would change its image, the sport, already loosely governed by the World Boxing Association, or WBA and the World Boxing Council, or WBC, multiplied their problems by: one, generally ignoring them; and two, fighting among themselves to the point of splitting into more "governing" factions.

In 1983, Bob Lee (then President of the United States Boxing Association) lost in his bid to become WBA President. In response to same, he started a new "governing" body and called it the International Boxing Federation, or IBF. In 1988, a group of Puerto Rican and Dominican businessmen claiming to be disgusted by the WBA's questionable rules and ratings systems started the World Boxing Organization, or WBO. In 1993, a Florida businessman created the fifth governing body, and called it the International Boxing Organization, or IBO.

The result was a disaster, and the popularity of the sport plummeted into virtual oblivion. Whereas 20 years ago, boxing made countless millions of dollars through network and pay-per-view events, now they have been completely supplanted by Ultimate Fighting Championship, or UFC, a form of mixed martial arts. Whereas 20 years ago, you could stop people on the street and they would almost unanimously know the name of the heavyweight champion, now almost no one would, or even worse for the sport, care. (In case you're wondering, Wladimir Klitschko is the current IBF, WBO, IBO, and former WBC and WBA Champion).

The second sport that faced a crossroads 20 years ago is NASCAR. At the time, the sport had a reputation of being populated largely by and with "rednecks." As such, the general public seemingly wanted little, if anything, to do with the it. Although Indy racing enjoyed popularity to a degree, throughout America, NASCAR was considered its poor cousin.



The sport faced a dilemma: to ignore the general public's attitude towards them and keep things status quo (as they were already making quite a bit of money), or step out on a proverbial ledge and try to change the face of the sport.

Their solution was to attack the problem head on. They bonded together and created a unified cohesive organization with a strong governing body. They aggressively marketed to both potential sponsors and to the general public the speed, the thrills, the excitement, and the drivers (the idea being by taking their helmets off it would both personalize the sport and entice the potential female fan). The result is that they are now considered the number two sport in America

Two different sports with two different courses of action, and two very different end results. As I said earlier, horse racing is standing at a crossroads and the choices that are made will have far reaching and long lasting results. The question is: which path will be chosen?

Bill Yates is a fan of Thoroughbred racing who became hooked on the sport after at age 11 watching Secretariat win the Triple Crown.

ROYAL ASCOT

Top drawer, top shelf, top hat: Royal Ascot is the best week of racing in the world. Nothing else is even close. I say that having watched the racing from home this year; it didn't maybe have the same atmosphere, but I saw the races a lot better, and it certainly didn't detract from the quality of the competition.

The headline story of this year's meeting has to be the success of Irish trainers Aidan O'Brien and Jim Bolger. They won eight races between them, including

five of the week's seven Group 1 races. Aidan hit the target six times, four of them in Group 1 company: Haradasun (Fusaichi Pegasus) and Henrythenavigat or (Kingmambo) Tuesday; Duke of Marmalade,

one of two Royal Ascot winners last week from Danehill's last crop, in the G1 Prince of Wales's S. Wednesday; and Yeats (Sadler's Wells), only the second horse to win the 2 1/2-mile G1 Ascot Gold Cup three times, Thursday.

Bolger added the G1 Coronation S., for three-year-old fillies, courtesy of Lush Lashes (Galileo), on Friday.

British trainers did win 20 of the week's 30 races (click here to see a chronological table of the week's results), but the home team's only Group 1 win came in Saturday's Golden Jubilee S., a six-furlong sprint won by the three-year-old Kingsgate Native (Mujadil), a grandson of Storm Bird who had won the all-age G1 Nunthorpe S. last year as a two-year-old. He's trained by the up-and-coming John Best, who had two winners during the week, the other being last Tuesday's 100-1 shocker Flashmans Papers, from Exceed and Excel's first crop.

In what now looks an inspired purchase, Cheveley Park Stud had bought the breeding rights in Kingsgate Native last year. The trainer, quite correctly, pointed out in a post-race interview that the colt could now be said to have a similar profile, as a racehorse, to Cheveley Park's fantastically successful Pivotal, Britain's top sire.

Leading British trainer in number of winners at Ascot was Sir Michael Stoute, with three; Richard Hannon and William Haggas, who seems to have his horses in scorching form, had two each. One of Hannon's was Free Agent (Dr. Fong), who won the Chesham S. for The Queen to kick off Saturday's racing. The BBC's Rishi Persad didn't quite manage an interview with Her Majesty, but the cameras were on her in the winner's enclosure. She was clearly delighted, as any veteran horsewoman would be. It was great stuff. For The Queen's racing manager, John Warren, and his brotherin-law and sidekick, Harry Herbert, it capped off a memorable week as their Highclere syndicates scored a rapid-file double to close out Thursday's racing.

On the sire front, 18 of the 30 winners were by Northern Dancer-line sires, consisting of six from the Danzig branch; five from Sadler's Wells' branch (two by Montjeu, two by Galileo, and one by Sadler's Wells himself); three from the Nureyev branch; and two from Storm Bird/Storm Cat.

In an unusual appearance in Europe, one winner came from the Deputy Minister branch, and one was by last

year's leading freshman sire and this year's leading sophomore sire (by cumulative earnings), Acclamation (by Waajib; Northern Dancer-line, but not a specific branch). This was Equiano, upset winner of the G1 King's Stand. Spanish-trained but raced in France this year, he beat elders in that five-furlong test.

The Mr. Prospector line supplied five winners; the Roberto line, somewhat surprisingly, considering its relatively limited numbers, had four. Those included the most impressive two-year-old winner of the week-last Tuesday's G2 Coventry S. hero

Lucky Story's full brother, Dr Fong (they are by Roberto's son, Kris S.), had the one-two in Saturday's Chesham, a listed event for two-year-olds by sires who won over more than 9 1/2 furlongs. That was the race The Queen won with Free Agent, but Dr Fong also sired the second, Seaway, and he had sired the winner of the race last year, Maze. The other two Roberto-line winners were by older sons of Roberto himself, Dynaformer (still going strong) and Lear Fan (now retired). These three sire lines accounted for 27 of the 30 winners (90 percent). If you add the two Nasrullah-line winners, it means the four main Phalaris sire lines (Northern Dancer, Native Dancer, Royal Charger/Dante and Nasrullah) produced 29 of the 30 Royal Ascot winners (97 percent).

Only Indian Ridge, sire of the two-mile G3 Queen's Vase winner Patkai (from a major staying Ballymacoll family), represented the rapidly shrinking non-Phalaris sire lines.

Equiano's win in the King's Stand helped cement Acclamation's position among European second-crop sires. Another second-crop sire to have an Ascot winner last week was Oasis Dream (Green Desert). He is now very solidly in second place among this group, still a long way behind Acclamation, but a long way in front of third-placed Divine Light. Divine Light, the sire of Natagora, is now in Turkey.





This is becoming quite an interesting group of sires, including Dalakhani, whose three stakes winners this year are actually more than any other sire in this group. The 12-furlong G2 King Edward VII S. was won by Godolphin's Campanologist (by Kingmambo, who is also the sire, of course, of Henrythenavigator-both out of Sadler's Wells

mares), but sophomore sires filled the placings: Ballymacoll's Conduit, by Dalakhani (and out of a Sadler's Wells mare) was second, with Top Lock, by Nayef, third.

Another second-crop sire, Lemon Drop Kid's half-brother, Statue of Liberty (Storm Cat), supplied half of the Highclere double Thursday in the King George V H. winner Colony. So five second-crop sires either had winners (three), or sired the earners of over £40,000 at Ascot last week.

Among European third-crop sires, Invincible Spirit (Green Desert) had the best week, including Sandringham S. (a listed handicap for three-year-old fillies) winner Festivale; Thursday's Hampton Court S. (three-year-olds, 10 furlongs, listed) second, Staying On; and last Tuesday's G1 King's Stand third, Fleeting Spirit. Even so, he could not quite wrest the lead back from Rock of Gibraltar (Danehill) among European third-crop sires by cumulative earnings.

Talk about "locked together at the top." Each has 10 stakes horses this year, and exactly 100 winners. In cumulative earnings, Rock of Gibraltar's European-sired progeny have earned \$3.5 million, Invincible Spirit's have earned \$3.4 million. Plenty of others on this list are having good seasons, including Kyllachy (Pivotal); Noverre (Rahy), who's had five two-year-old winners this season, including Ascot's G2 Queen Mary S. winner Langs Lash and G3 Albany S. third Danidh Dubai, but has been sold to India. Also on that list are Sakhee (Bahri) and French sires Slickly (Linamix) and Chichicastenango, who is by the obscure Smadoun, a grandson of Caro, by Kaldoun. Chichicastenango is the sire of the unbeaten G1 Prix du Jockey-Club (the "new" French Derby) winner Vision d'Etat.




