





### **BC ANNOUNCES ELECTION RESULTS**

Officials at Breeders' Cup Limited have announced the election of 12 individuals to its Board of Members and Trustees. The election results were confirmed by TrueBallot, Inc. on July 1, and are expected to be rati-



fied by the current Breeders' Cup Board of Members and Trustees at its July 11 meeting. Consisting of 48 individuals, the Breeders' Cup Board is elected by Breeders' Cup foal and stallion nominators through a proportional share holder voting system. It meets at least once a year for an election for the 13-member

Breeders' Cup Board of Directors, which is charged with overseeing the activities of the corporation. The Board of Members and Trustees will vote for six new members to the Breeders' Cup Board of Directors July 11. The 12 elected members will each serve a three-year term, beginning July 11. ### **BIG BROWN RETURNS TO WORKTAB**

GI Kentucky Derby and GI Preakness S. hero **Big Brown** (Boundary) returned to the worktab yesterday for the first time since being eased out of the GI Belmont S. June 7, going five-eighths of a mile in a pedestrian 1:06.71 over a fast main track at Aqueduct



Wednesday morning. According to Daily Racing Form, Big Brown loped along through his opening two furlongs in :27.47, threeeighths in :41.02 and the half in :53.68. He was out six furlongs in 1:21.50, according to DRF clockers. "I told [exercise rider] Michelle [Nevin] I don't want to him to go too fast, I'd rather him go slower than faster," trainer Rick Dutrow Jr. told the publication. "The horse looks like he's fine. I can't tell you that we've got any problems. He's good right now; he's cooling out good, drinking his water, looks like he's happy, so we're good." Unde-

feated and untested in his first five starts, Big Brown endured a rough opening quarter mile in the Belmont S., then had nothing left for the stretch drive and was eased down the lane. He is expected to resume his season in the GI Haskell Invitational S. at Monmouth Park Aug. 3 before a possible start in the GI Travers S. Aug. 23. He could close his career in the GI Breeders' Cup Classic at Santa Anita Oct. 25.

Consistency was the watchword with Cheyenne Star in 2007 after the homebred had made her mark when winning the G3 Ridgewood Pearl S. at The Curragh in May. Runner-up in the Listed Glencairn S. over a mile here the following month, she reappeared after a break to win the Listed Garnet S. at Naas in October and Listed Cooley Fillies' S. on Dundalk's Polytrack in November. Unplaced on her seasonal return in the May 5 G3 Athasi S. at The Curragh, she rebounded with a third in the latest renewal of the Ridgewood Pearl back at that track May 24. Settled behind the early pace here, the bay was unleashed wide at the top of the stretch and grabbed the lead at the furlong marker before holding Age of Chivalry in the closing stages. "[Jockey] Pat [Smullen] was suspended and couldn't ride Cheyenne Star, but Seamie [Heffernan] gave her a lovely ride," commented winning trainer Frances Crowley, also the wife of Pat Smullen, told Irish-Racing.com. "Pat rides Cheyenne Star in her work and, after her last piece of work, he told me she'd win this. She is a lovely mare to train and may go to Goodwood now before having a tilt at the Group 1 Matron S. [at Leopardstown Sept. 6]."

Stepping up from a maiden win at Bremen last August, Peace Royale ran second in the G3 Maurice Lacroix-Trophy at Baden-Baden at the end of that month before bagging a sales-related event at Dusseldorf in September. She ran sixth in the Oct. 7 G1 Prix Marcel Boussac in her season closer at Longchamp next time and came back to bag the May 12 G3 Schwarzgold-Rennen at Cologne in her latest outing. Breaking swiftly to occupy second along the rail here, she went by Irish raider Impetious (GB) (Inchinor {GB}) with 350 meters remaining and came under a power drive in the closing stages to just withstand the late thrust of Flashing Colour. "She lost a shoe and strained her shoulder last time out," revealed trainer Andreas Wohler. "We are very happy with her and will now try her in the G1 Preis der Diana [at Dusseldorf Aug. 3], as we are quite sure she will stay the [11-furlong] trip." Click for the Racing Post chart.

Conditioned by Cosme Morgado Neto at Estrela Dalva's Training Center, Estrela do Oriente added his second consecutive group stakes victory after previously annexing the May 25 G2 Grande Premio Conde de Herzberg at La Gavea. Estrela do Oriente represents the first Group 1 winner for multiple GI/G1SW Redattore, whose first crop is racing successfully in Brazil this year. Redattore stands the Northern Hemisphere season at Harris Farm in California.



As many as eight older turf horses are expected to pass the entry box today for Saturday's 1 3/8-mile GI United Nations S., one of just two Grade I events at the Jersey Shore. With English Channel, winner of the last two runnings of the \$750,000 test, now retired to stud, this year's renewal shapes a wide-open affair. Trainer Bobby Frankel is a two-time winner of the U.N., having won in 1991 with Exbourne (at Atlantic City Racecourse) and in 2001 with Senure, who was awarded the victory via the stewards. The Californiabased conditioner has three horses nominated to the race, and is expected to start either Juddmonte Farms' Champs Elysees (GB) (Danehill), Stud TNT's Out of Control (Brz) (Royal Academy) or Gary A. Tanaka's Sudan (Ire) (Peintre Celebre). In 1999, the U.N. was shifted permanently to Monmouth Park and was won by the Bill Mott-trained Yagli. The Hall of Famer, who took the 2000 running as well with Down the Aisle, is likely to be represented this weekend by Pin Oak Stable's Equitable (A.P. Indy) or Peter Vegso's veteran Silver Tree (Hennessy). Bushwood Stable's Better Talk Now was victorious in the 2005 U.N., and, while the nine-year-old is penciled in for next weekend's GI Man O'War S. at Belmont Park, his stablemate Independent George (Cozzene) is considered a likely starter at Monmouth Park. A pair of locally based horses are also expected to take part in Saturday's race, Presious Passion (Royal Anthem) and Strike a Deal (Smart Strike).

Revenue for the Series will be gained via television contracts, which would require that all races are staged on Saturday and could mean a move for Royal Ascot's G1 Prince of Wales's S., Glorious Goodwood's G1 Sussex S. and York's G1 Juddmonte International S. Racing UK's Chief Operations Officer Andrew Brown announced the enterprise in London yesterday. "The Sovereign Series is a competition to crown the British champion Flat horse," Brown said. "Racing needs to reach to a broader audience. The Sovereign Series is an easy-to-understand concept to take racing into the mainstream and to optimise the value and exposure of racing on television."

### HOOK, LINE, SINKER... THE PINHOOKER'S VIEW OF THE 2008 SEASON

It was a mixed bag at this year's two-year-old sales, from impressive gains at OBSMAR (median up 21.9 percent, average up 36.6 percent) to significant declines at BESMAR (median off 25.4 percent, average down 18.9 percent). Results at OBSFEB, FTFFEB and KEEAPR showed only minor fluctuations. The RNA rates ranged from 28.2 percent at OBSFEB (compared to 29.9 percent in 2007) to 44.4 percent at BESMAR (up from 41.3 percent last year). KEEAPR improved sharply when it came to buybacks, with RNAs at 38.4 percent this year (down from 47.1 percent in 2007).

We asked some of the leading pinhookers in the Thoroughbred business how 2008 treated them, and what, if any, changes they plan to make going forward. The results of our survey will be published this week.

### What two-year-old was the biggest disappointment? Why do you think he failed to meet expectations? JS: The Indian Charlie out of Predictress (purchased for \$75K as a FTKJUL yearling; bought back for \$250K at



BESMAR). This colt worked fantastic at the Barretts sale, and looked good in his performance. He seemed to be very well received by the buyers, but did not generate the bidding we had hoped for. There was some discrepancy with the various interpretations of his vet reports. None of the issues at hand was relevant to his racing potential, but definitely seemed to effect the bidding. Big issues were made of small things. We were pleased to purchase him for our own racing group,

### Will your results from this year affect the way you approach the yearling sales this year? Will you change the number or the type of yearlings you are buying to adjust to the market?

**JS**: Yes, in a positive way. We followed specific guidelines last year, and set pretty strict spending limits on each horse. This approach has worked for us for the last two years, generating good returns for investors and allowing us to continue our efforts.

In general, we look for horses that look athletic, and have something in the family that suggests an opportunity for success in racing for the individual horse. That won't change. In terms of numbers, we don't like to have horses competing against each other for the same buyers at their respective sales--for that to hold true, we can only consign so many at each sale. Our numbers, 16-22, will probably remain about the same.

Of your three biggest pinhooking successes this year, which was the biggest surprise?

Joe Applebaum: Of the group, the surprise was the Holy Bull. He really responded to the new surface at OBS and it allowed him to flourish. We've been following him on Watch Mail and it seems he has held that form with a series of strong workouts. I'm eager to see his debut.

#### What two-year-old was the biggest disappointment? Why do you think he failed to meet expectations?

JA: A colt by Tiger Ridge out of Dual Monarchy (purchased for \$30K as an OBSAUG yearling; sold for \$30K at OBSMAR to Rafael Celis). He breezed in :10 1/5 at OBS in March. He was good-looking and vetted well. We were only able to sell him for \$30,000. I think the buyer got a great deal. I am happy for him, but seriously can't believe that :10 1/5 isn't good enough anymore.

### How would rate your overall success this year?

**JA**: We had a pretty solid year in the sales ring. We got hit with a bit of an injury bug late in the season that held us back from having a spectacular year, but if every year was like this, we wouldn't complain.

### Will your results from this year affect the way you approach the yearling sales this year? Will you change the number or the type of yearlings you are buying to adjust to the market?

JA: We are constantly fine-tuning our strategy, but the basics will remain the same. Like everyone else, we look for well-conformed, athletic horses that fall into our price range. We probably obsess a bit on the vetting, but in the long run we feel that gives us a measure of security. Most importantly, we work hard to target the sales where our horses can be standouts.

#### Which of your three biggest pinhooking successes this year was the biggest surprise?

**MR**: The Pleasantly Perfect filly was a surprise only because she missed about two months of training at the beginning of the breaking season due to an ankle chip. She came back great and managed to catch up with the rest.

What two-year-old was the biggest disappointment? MR: The biggest disappointments were a couple of nice fillies that did not make it to the sale. One was a Mr. Greeley filly that ended up needing a chip removed from her ankle and the other was a Proud Citizen filly that developed bucked shins. These were two quality fillies that we had high expectaions for that we did not get to present.

How would you rate your overall success this year? **MR**: This year was very good overall; the numbers were down, but that was intentional. There are too few horses finding new homes. With scratches and RNAs, only 50 percent of horses, at best, are actually changing ownership. Given those statistics, we are happy. There is saturation of the product that we have to compete with and there are so many hurdles to jump through. For example, the horse has to breeze well, have a fast time, a fast gallop-out, an excellent video, pristene X-rays and be sound at the barn. With six to eight months of training, they are going to have some wear and tear. People do not want to see pathology on X-rays. Performance and perfection is a difficult combination to achieve and it becomes expensive. The advent of synthetic surfaces at the two-year-old sales has been huge and helped guite a bit.

### Will your results from this year affect the way you approach the yearling sales this year? Will you change the number or the type of yearlings you are buying to adjust to the market?

**MR**: We will probably operate at the same level as last year. We are cautious on the amount that we spend per horse, and everything will stay the same as far as numbers go. I enjoy the challenge of buying yearlings to go to the two-year-old sales and I believe that anybody serious about racing at a high and competitive level needs to consider the two-year-old sales as a source of runners. They are proven--look at Big Brown and Denis of Cork in this year's Derby.

### DEADLOCKED JURY IN CURLIN OWNERS'

**TRIAL** A federal jury in Covington, Kentucky, reported Wednesday morning that it had reached a deadlock in their deliberations on fraud charges against two lawyers who are the minority owners in Horse of the Year Curlin. Judge William Bertelsman of the U.S. District Court for the Eastern District of Kentucky ordered the jury to continue their discussions after hearing arguments from both sides. Attorneys for the defendants William Gallion and Shirley Cunningham, who have been jailed since late last year on charges of conspiracy, asked Judge Bertelsman to issue the order to the jury as opposed to declaring a mistrial. Gallion, Cunningham and a third lawyer, Melbourne Mills Jr., have been charged with defrauding clients in a 2002 settlement of a suit against the makers of the diet drug fen-phen. The proceedings are likely to have a result on the immediate future of Curlin. He is currently being pointed to his turf debut in the GI Man O'War S. in New York or the GIII Arlington H. the same afternoon, but licensing issues could preclude a start in either jurisdiction. However, a ruling issued by Kentucky state judge Roger Crittenden has transferred management of the minority interest to a court-appointed receiver, the Blood-Horse reports, apparently clearing the way for Curlin to race in any jurisdiction. "They [Cunningham and Gallion] basically have no say in any of the horses at this point," attorney Richard Getty, who represents the Stonestreet Stables operation of Jess Jackson and his wife, Barbara Banke, told the publication. "I think this is a very positive development in terms of the ability to race Curlin in any jurisdiction. We hope it is viewed as such by such racing authorities."

### NTRA TO ADDRESS NEW TAX ISSUE

As part of its ongoing effort to address tax matters that impact that the pari-mutuel industry, the NTRA will introduce legislation this year to eliminate or substantially increase the threshold for Federal tax withholding on pari-mutuel winnings from the current \$5,000 level. This "withholding conformity" legislation would put parimutuel wagering on par with other forms of gaming where there is no withholding.

Eliminating the automatic withholding – a flat 25 percent of winnings over \$5,000 – will reduce paperwork at racetracks and increase daily pari-mutuel "churn" as each wagering dollar is re-bet multiple times. Ultimately, the bill would benefit not only horseplayers but racetracks, horsemen and owners through increased handle and purses.

The NTRA legislative team has secured a Republican cosponsor for the bill and hopes to secure bi-partisan support in the few weeks that remain before the start of the summer recess on August 2.



LOOK TOPS LEGER LIST Julian Richmond-Watson's G1 Epsom Oaks heroine Look Here (GB) (Hernando {Fr}) yesterday featured among the 46 remaining in the Sept. 13 G1 Ladbrokes St Leger. Trainer Ralph Beckett yesterday confirmed that his charge is on target to attempt to become the first filly to win the £500,000 Doncaster Classic since User Friendly (GB) in 1992. "Look Here is very well," he said. "She's doing her own thing quietly at the moment and we're aiming for the G1 Yorkshire Oaks [at York Aug. 21], and we'll see how it pans out after that. The York race comes first, obviously, and three and a bit weeks later, if she's all right, she'll run. If the ground comes up quick at York, we'll probably wait. I'd like to send her to Doncaster if we could, but it's ground dependent, really, and we've got to do what's best for her. We set out an autumn campaign after Epsom and we look like sticking to it. The timing of the Oaks seems to indicate that we should be taking on the colts." Sir Michael Stoute is still looking for his first renewal of the extended mile-and-three-quarter contest, but has an enviable team this time. Among the seven remaining are the Ballymacoll Stud homebred trio of G1 Epsom Derby runner-up and G1 Irish Derby third Tartan Bearer (Ire) (Spectrum {Ire}), G3 Queen's Vase hero Patkai (Ire) (Indian Ridge {Ire})) and G2 King Edward VII S. runner-up Conduit (Ire) (Dalakhani {Ire}). "The G2 Great Voltigeur S. [at York Aug. 19] is traditionally a good trial for the St Leger and both Patkai and Conduit have been entered for that race as well, so we'll probably make a decision about them after it," commented the stud's manager Peter Reynolds. "Tartan Bearer has arrived home, but I haven't spoken to his trainer about how he is. I would imagine that it will take him a while to get over the race--his brother Golan was a bit the same, in that he needed plenty of time between races. It will probably be a while before you see Tartan Bearer out." Godolphin has one nominee in King Edward VII winner Campanologist (Kingmambo), while Aidan O'Brien has a total of 18 remaining, including Michael Tabor, Derrick Smith and Susan Magnier's Irish Derby first and fourth Frozen Fire (Ger) (Montjeu {Ire}) and Alessandro Volta (GB) (Montjeu {Ire}).



#### **4.00 Yarmouth, Mdn, £4,400, 3yo/up, 10f 21ydsT COLISEUM (GB) (Medicean {GB})** debuts in the colors of Cheveley Park Stud for the Sir Michael Stoute yard. **HEFFERNAN PAYS TRIBUTE TO FIRE** Jockey Seamus Heffernan believes Michael Tabor, Derrick Smith and Susan Magnier's G1 Irish Derby winner Frozen Fire (Ger) (Montjeu {Ire}) could take high rank among the best Ballydoyle middle-distance horses of recent times. Despite his odds of 16-1 and the dramatic nature of the finish due to the errant run of his stable companion Alessandro Volta (GB) (Montjeu {Ire}), his rider believes the colt, who had previously flopped in the G1 Epsom Derby, stamped his authority in the mileand-a-half Classic. "I really like him and you have to disregard his Epsom run," Heffernan commented yesterday. "I was impressed with him on Sunday -- he won well and on merit. He won his two-year-old maiden over seven furlongs, so has plenty of speed and could be as good as any of the good middle-distance horses we have had here."

### **CONNECTIONS KEEP FAITH IN GETAWAY**

Baron Georg von Ullmann's Getaway (Ger) (Monsun {Ger}) remains on course for the Oct. 5 G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe following two off-the-board runs, connections announced vesterday. Having been briefly on top of the World Rankings after his emphatic success in Newmarket's G2 Jockey Club S. May 4, the Andre Fabre-trained five-year-old was only fifth in both Epsom's G1 Coronation Cup June 6 and Sunday's G1 Grand Prix de Saint-Cloud. "Sunday was a bit of a disaster and while it is not necessarily an excuse, he did lose a front shoe on his near fore," explained the owner-breeder's Racing Manager Paul Harley. "There was a good covering of grass, but the ground was firm and he probably does lack a bit of speed against the top mile-and-a-half horses in Europe at the moment. I feel that he's a different horse with ease in the ground and Mr Fabre is a genius at getting horses right for the Arc, so if there is a chance of being there to win it, he is the man. I think maybe we all got carried away after he won at Newmarket, but his Arc form from last year was solid against those horses he has been competing against at Epsom and at the weekend, so we've not totally lost faith. Our plan now is to get him to the Arc, and although one of the Arc trials is a possibility, we may send him there fresh. I haven't talked about it in great detail to Mr. Fabre, but he is considering sending him back over one mile and seven furlongs for the race he won at Deauville last year, the [Aug. 24] G2 Prix Kergorlay, just to get his confidence back. The King George is definitely out."
