#### EASY WORK FOR CURLIN

**Curlin** (Smart Strike) had a workout on the main track at Churchill yesterday morning, going an easy half in

:50.80 under exercise rider Carlos Rosas. The four-year-old clicked off fractions of :13.20, :26.20 and :38.80 and galloped out five furlongs in 1:05. If the licensing issues for minority owner Midnight Cry Stable can be resolved, he will make his grass debut in Saturday's GI Man o'War S. at Belmont. "It looks like we ought to know something on the licensing today, I understand," trainer Steve Asmussen said. "We're obviously very anxious about this."

Asmussen added that he would prefer to test the reigning Horse of the Year in the Man o'War, rather than the GIII Arlington Park H. the same day. Connections are trying to determine if Curlin is good enough on the grass to take on the best in Europe in the G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe in October. "[The Man o'War] is coming up fabulous," Asmussen said. "If you're going to venture overseas, you don't want to be kidding yourself about how good or bad you are on the turf." Also pointing for the Man o'War are GISWs Red Rocks (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}), Better Talk Now (Talkin Man) and Grand Couturier (GB) (Grand Lodge). If all goes well, Curlin will ship to New York Thursday. He will ship to Saratoga before heading to France to prepare for the Arc.

#### **DENIS OF CORK SIDELINED**

Denis of Cork (Harlan's Holiday), second in the GI Belmont S. and third in the GI Kentucky Derby, will be out for the rest of the year due to a hairline fracture in his left hind ankle. The William K. Warren colorbearer be miss 30 days of training, and then will be examined again to see how the injury is healing. "It's disappointing, but he'll come back 110 percent and have time to mature," trainer David Carroll told *Daily Racing Form*. "Hopefully we'll come back with a great horse next year." Denis of Cork, a \$250,000 BESMAR juvenile purchase, has compiled a record of 6-3-1-0 and earnings of \$613,252.

#### TATTERSALLS JULY BEGINS TODAY

Tattersalls' July Sale gets underway this morning in Newmarket at 9:30 a.m. A total of 915 horses have

been cataloged, with a varied collection of breeding prospects and horses in training on offer over the next four days. Potential and proven broodmares dominate today's pipe-opener. Among them is Lot 185, the five-year-old Looker (GB) (Barathea {Ire}), who is a half-sister to last month's G1 Oaks



winner Look Here (GB) (Hernando {Fr}) offered from Richard Kent's Mickley Stud for owner Robert Biggs. She is covered by Mutliplex (GB). Standout horses in training include the three-year-old Redolent (Ire) (Redback {GB}), Lot 602, winner of this year's Listed Heron S. and third in last season's G1 Criterium International. Lot 692, Military Cross (GB) (Cape Cross {Ire}), may now be five, but has shown his well being by winning his last two starts, while Lot 734, Great Hawk (El Prado {Ire}), is another five-year-old who can still perform to a high level. Lot 373, Nightjar (Smoke Glacken), won a Warwick maiden by five lengths last Friday for trainer Mark Johnston ahead of his date at Tattersalls, while the filly Shivering (GB) (Royal Applause {GB}), Lot 321, was Listed-placed last season and is a half-sister to Group 2-winning sprinter The Trader (Ire) (Selkirk). #### CHURCHILL DROPS SUIT AGAINST FHBPA

Churchill Downs Inc., after reaching an agreement with the Florida Horsemen's Benevolent and Protective Association regarding purses and the division of slots revenue, announced yesterday that it will drop the lawsuit against the FHBPA and its officers filed Apr. 24. Under the terms of the contract, Florida horsemen are guaranteed \$14.375 million in purses for the first three full years of slots operation, and 6.75 percent of slots revenue for the remainder of the 10-year deal. The Calder signal will be available to simulcasting outlets beginning Thursday. CDI and the Florida horsemen are still working toward an agreement with regard to the division of revenue from advance deposit wagering.



But for the last-gasp lunges by Mount Nelson in the Coral-Eclipse and Diamond Diva in the CashCall Mile, I would today be writing about a magnificent big-race double by Empire Maker's half-brother Chester House, the sire of Phoenix Tower and Ventura. With only three crops, the late son of Mr. Prospector is now as high as seventh on the sires' table, but he'll have to wait for another day.

I could have chosen to write about Kamsin, the Deutsches Derby winner who represents something of a landmark, as he is inbred 4x4 to the great Sadler's Wells through two of his first-crop sons.

Or I could have featured Mount Nelson's sire Rock of Gibraltar, who also struck at Grade III level with Genuine Devotion, but there's no escaping the fact that the stallion performance of the holiday weekend was by Darley's Street Cry. The 10-year-old's stakes treble featured Grade I successes by Zenyatta and Street Boss.

The unbeaten Zenyatta and Street Boss--winners jointly of 12 of their 16 starts--come from Street Cry's outstanding first crop, sired at a fee of \$30,000. This crop of 84 named foals has so far produced the magnificent total of nine group/graded winners, which would be achievement enough. But, to my way of thinking, his achievement has been made all the more impressive by the variety of talents displayed by Street Cry's standardbearers.

From coast to coast, seven Keeneland September grads won graded stakes races during the holiday weekend, including Genuine Devotion (IRE), J Be K, Mint Lane, Notional, Street Boss, Thorn Song, and Zenyatta.

Street Sense, with his victories in the Kentucky Derby and Travers, has shown that Street Cry can pass on the stamina which brought him success in the Dubai World Cup, and so has the Grade III winner Summer Doldrums. It isn't hard to envisage Zenyatta also staying 1 1/4 miles, following her last-to-first win in the Vanity H. over a mile and an eighth. She has also shone at around a mile, as has another Group 1-winning filly, the English-trained Majestic Roi. The U.S. filly Street Sounds could also be classified as a miler, even though her best win came in the seven-furlong GII Beaumont S.

However, Street Boss--Street Cry's other Grade I winner at Hollywood last Saturday--is one of a sizeable number of talented sprinters among Street Cry's first-crop graded winners, others being the ex-Italian Per Incanto, Street Magician and the English-trained Big Timer (recent winner of the 27-runner Wokingham H. over six furlongs at Royal Ascot).

The versatility of Street Cry's stock also extends to underfoot conditions. Street Sense was at his most effective on traditional dirt, which also suited Street Magician. Zenyatta also gained her GI Apple Blossom H. success on the dirt, even though she has done most of her winning on synthetic surfaces, and Street Boss and Street Sounds have gained their most important wins on all-weather tracks.

The turf team includes the Europeans Majestic Roi, Big Timer and Per Incanto, plus Summer Doldrums (winner of Friday night's Presque Isle Mile) and Street Sounds. The all-weather crew also features Cry and Catch Me and Globetrotter, the two juvenile graded winners from Street Cry's second crop.

This versatility regarding track surface is understandable in view of Street Cry's pedigree, which combines a speedy American-bred sire, Machiavellian, with a stam-

ina-packed British-bred dam, Helen Street. What I find more surprising is the number of sprinters by the Darley stallion. In winning the Irish Oaks, Helen Street displayed the type of stamina we came to expect in the progeny of her short-lived sire, Troy. This exceptional performer romped home well clear in the 1979 Derby and Irish Derby be-

fore defeating the older horses in the King George and the Benson & Hedges Gold Cup (now the Juddmonte International). Three of the seven stallions in the first three generations of Troy's pedigree contested the Ascot Gold Cup over 2 1/2 miles, which helps explain why Troy's mature stock built up an average winning distance of 12.7 furlongs.

Although Machiavellian was a champion juvenile who never won beyond seven furlongs, he was mated to numerous classically bred mares, the end result being an average winning distance of around nine furlongs. Street Cry was a perfect example of this, gaining all three of his stakes wins over nine or 10 furlongs.

However, it is beginning to look as though the Machiavellian/Mr. Prospector part of his pedigree often comes to the fore when he is mated to mares from speedy American lines.

Machiavellian enjoyed much of his success with granddaughters of Northern Dancer, part of this cross's appeal being that it produced 4x4 to Natalma and 5x5x5 to Almahmoud. The numerous group winners bred this way included the Group 1 winners Medicean, Storming Home, Rebecca Sharp and West Wind, so it is hardly surprising that this is also proving a popular cross with Street Cry. Street Sense and Majestic Roi are Grade I winners out of granddaughters of Northern Dancer.

There are also two Grade I winners out of mares from the Hail to Reason male line, one being Cry and Catch Me and the other being Zenyatta. As Machiavellian's dam was a granddaughter of Hail to Reason, these Grade I winners have two lines of the sizeable Hail to Reason in the first five generations. The Grade III winner Street Magician is inbred 4x4 to Halo (and to Raise A Native).

Another line which seems to suit Street Cry is the one descending from Damascus. Street Boss is out of an Ogygian mare and Summer Doldrums' dam is by Unaccounted For. Then there's the Peruvian star Tomcito, who is out of an Eastern Echo mare.

It is hard to believe that Zenyatta was snapped up for as little as \$60,000 at Keeneland's 2005 September Sale, as she is the third stakes winner from the first three foals produced by Kris S.'s winning daughter Vertigineux. However, neither of Zenyatta's elder siblings had earned black type by the time the Street Cry filly came on the market. The first, Where's Bailey, won the Remington Park Oaks on turf five weeks later and the second, Balance, gained the first of her five stakes victories at the end of November. Balance, of course, became a multiple Grade I winner, with the Santa Anita Oaks and Santa Margarita Invitational among her successes. Vertigineux has youngsters by Pulpit and Giant's Causeway, so she has every chance of adding to her impressive achievements.

Vertigineux is proving a worthy member of a celebrated female line. Her fourth dam Mrs. Peterkin made quite an impact on the list of the highest-priced yearlings sold in the USA. Mrs. Peterkin's daughter Kinema (now the dam of Mizzen Mast) was sold for \$2,200,000 as long ago as 1984, three years after one of Mrs. Peterkin's grandsons, the future Irish Derby winner Shareef Dancer, made \$3,300,000.

The fact that Balance was by the diminutive Thunder Gulch made me suspect that Vertigineux had inherited plenty of size from her sire Kris S. This has been confirmed by Don Robinson of Winter Quarter Farm, where Vertigineux is based. He recently described the mare as "a big ol' thing," so it is hardly surprising that the Amazonian Zenyatta apparently stands nearly 17 hands.

So Street Cry has sired the champion Street Sense from a mare by the 15.3 hands Dixieland Band, a lengthy, low-to-the-ground type, and he has another potential champion in Zenyatta, whose broodmare sire stood nearly 17 hands. It looks, then, as though Street Cry is as versatile as his progeny.



#### **GERMAN REVIEW** by Christa Riebel

It was Derby day at Hamburg on Sunday and Stall Blankenese registered their third success in the highlight with the Classically bred **Kamsin (Ger)** (Samum {Ger}) emulating his sire's success in 2000. Samum is one of three Deutsches Derby winners sired by the outstanding Monsun (Ger), who was himself second in the 1993 renewal to Lando (Ger), the sire of Sunday's runner-up Ostland (Ger) (see Monday's TDN). Monsun is by Germany's sole Triple Crown hero Konigsstuhl (Ger), and his damsire is the 1977 Derby hero Surumu (Ger), who was also responsible for a trio of winners in that Classic, including Acatenango (Ger).

Samum is out of **Sacarina (GB)** (Old Vic {GB}), also the dam of three Classic winners in this country, including the 2002 G1 Preis der Diana (German Oaks) heroine Salve Regina (Ger). Interestingly, Old Vic hails from the same family as Surumu's best son, Acatenango. Kamsin was bred by Gestut Karlshof--who also bred Samum, Schiaparelli (Ger) and Salve Regina--and is out of the group-winning stayer Kapitol (Ger). He is also connected to the aforementioned Konigsstuhl, giving his pedigree the finishing touch.

The two big events for fillies and mares were the highlight of the mid-week racing and the G3 Hamburger Stutenpreis saw the handsome three-year-old filly Peace Royale (Ger) (Sholokhov) best her elders (see Thursday's TDN). That was her second stakes victory after the May 12 G3 Kolner Stuten-Meile, in which she lost a shoe and sprained her shoulder. From her sire's first crop, she emulated the success of her half-sister Peaceful Love (Ger) (Dashing Blade {GB}) in the same race three years ago for the same connections. On Friday, the G3 Grosser Preis der Jungheinrich Gabelstapler was won by Lady Marian (Ger) (Nayef), who had been racing exclusively in France prior to the race (see Saturday's TDN). From the first crop of the promising young sire Nayef, she is a half-sister to the group winner Lucidor (Ger) and surprised her connections with the career-best.

Saturday's main event was the G3 Lotto Hamburg Trophy, which saw the unbeaten Hungarian-trained three-year-old **Overdose (GB)** (Starborough) strike for the ninth time. Notably, he was looked in the eye in the straight for the first time in his career, but he still managed to win comfortably and could now return for the G2 Goldene Peitsche at Baden-Baden Aug. 31.
