





### **CURLIN CLEARED FOR MAN O'WAR**

The ownership licensing issues in New York regarding **Curlin** (Smart Strike) have been resolved and the 2007 Horse of the Year will make his first start on turf in the GI Man o'War S. at Belmont Saturday, trainer Steve Asmussen announced Tuesday. "Very recently we've

been told we've been OK'd in New York and plan on flying him there on Thursday," Asmussen said, choosing the Man o'War over the GIII Arlington H. The trainer said he wanted a true test of Curlin's turf form, which he'll get in the Man o'War facing two previous GI Breeders' Cup Turf winners--**Better Talk Now** (Talkin Man) and **Red Rocks (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}). If all goes according to plan, it could be Curlin's last

start in the U.S. this year, as the colt's long-term goal remains the G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe at Longchamp Oct. 5. "He won't have to win [Saturday to proceed with the Arc plans], but he'll have to look the best," Asmussen said. With a satisfactory performance in the Man o'War, Curlin's next start would be the G2 Prix Foy Sept. 14, also at Longchamp. Asmussen said he plans to retain Curlin's regular rider, Robby Albarado, instead of replacing him with a European jockey. "It's between knowing the course and knowing the horse," Asmussen said, describing the Prix Foy as a "tune-up for Curlin and for Robby equally."

### FALMOUTH FEAST

International competition is now commonplace in Britain's top events and today's G1 Falmouth S. is no exception, with runners from France, Ireland, Germany and even New Zealand in evidence on Newmarket's July Course. Princess Zahra Aga Khan's Darjina (Fr) (Zamindar), who suffered the ordeal of a lengthy journey across the Channel, will be in favor if the rain stops and that also applies to Michael Ryan's Finsceal Beo (Ire) (Mr. Greeley). How testing conditions will affect the chances of Dick Karreman's Seachange (NZ) (Cape Cross {Ire}) is uncertain, but Stall Litex's Briseida (GB) (Pivotal {GB}) becomes more of a force with wetter weather. The latter's trainer Peter Schiergen is welcoming the rain. "It will very hard for her, but soft ground will be no problem," he commented. "She is a small filly, but a good one and we will happy if she is in the first four." Cont. p4-5

AGA KHAN, ARROWFIELD IN NEW VENTURE

His Highness the Aga Khan's Studs and Australia's Arrowfield Stud have announced a new breeding venture, in which several of the Aga Khan's mares will be bred to Arrowfield's stallions. The produce will be offered at Australian select yearling sales. Six mares have been selected for this season, and they are currently in guarantine in Australia. Among the sextet are Zarakiysha (Ire) (Kendor {Fr}--Zarkasha {Ire}, by Kahyasi {Ire}), a four-year-old unraced half-sister to unbeaten champion Zarkava (Ire); and Vadsalina (Ire) (Sagacity {Fr}--Vadaza, by Zafonic), a listed winner as a juvenile last season. The latter is a half-sister to G1SW Vadawina (Ire) (Unfuwain) and GSW Vadapolina (Fr) (Trempolino) from the immediate family of MG1SW Valixir (Ire) (Trempolino) and Val Royal (Fr) (Royal Academy). Arrowfield stands the leading Danehill stallions Flying Spur (Aus) and Redoute's Choice (Aus) as well as Hussonet, a son of Mr. Prospector who, after establishing himself in Chile, has made an excellent start in Australia. "The market in Australia is developing and this will add quite a bit of interest," Arrowfield's John Messara told Sport 927. "It's a pretty exciting development--not only for Arrowfield, but the whole industry." He added, "I think this is underlining the future of the Australian breeding industry. The likes of Redoute's [Choice] are world renowned now, and you're no longer embarrassed to approach these people [to breed to Australian stallions]."

WELSH CAKE TOPS TATTS OPENER Welsh Cake

(GB) (Fantastic Light), a half-sister to G2 Prix du Rond-Point winner Trans Island (GB), brought 200,000gns to top yesterday's breeding-stock orientated first session of the Tattersalls July Sale in Newmarket. Selling as lot 96 from the draft of Kevin and Sue Mercer's Usk Valley Stud in Wales, the winning five-year-old is in foal to Sakhee. She is also a half to Italian Group 3 winner Welsh Diva (GB). Mike Caddy, who trades as Horizon Bloodstock, outbid agent Richard Frisby for Welsh Cake. "You only have to look at the first and second dams to see her potential--it's a very good family to get into," said Caddy. "We bought Heatherwold in 2003 and, like most up-and-coming studs, you start off with a certain band of broodmares, but are always looking to upgrade. We've got 33 mares of which 10 are my own." Later in the session, Lancashire-based Mike Smith paid 180,000gns to get his first broodmare **Boast (GB)** (Most Welcome {GB}), the dam of black-type performers Strut (GB) and Vaunt (GB). The 11-year-old mare, listed as lot 245, is carrying a foal from the first crop of Dylan Thomas (Ire). Offered through Bill Dwan's Castlebridge Consignment, she is set to be owned with Smith's business partner, Nick Cable. "We have dressage and riding horses, and were looking to start breeding," said Cable. The winning mare Lunathea (Ire) (Barathea {Ire}) out of a half-sister to leading French sire Linamix (Fr), sold for 150,000gns to Irish agent Brian Grassick, acting for a County Wexford-based client. The five-year-old, offered as lot 80 through Charlie and Alice Mason's Silfield Bloodstock, is in foal to Oasis Dream (GB). "For me she was the pick of what was here," said Grassick. "She was in foal to a hot horse, and there is a lot happening in the pedigree." The sale continues today at 9:30 a.m. Complete results are available on www.tattersalls.com.

+44 (0) 1485 520827 (www.thedabblingduck.co.uk) Set in the heart of a picturesque Norfolk village, The Dabbling Duck is situated less than an hour from Newmarket and within a stone's throw of The Royal Studs. The pub and restaurant, refurbished and reopened in 2006, takes its name from a line in The Wind in the Willows--"ducks go a dabbling-up tails all!"--and is located in the shadows of the 12th century St Mary's church where Britain's first Prime Minister, Sir Robert Walpole, was educated in his early years. The handcrafted bar, which features a mural of Norfolk detailing the sources of local ingredients, is stocked with an exciting array of real ales and ciders, and also offers a good selection of wines. It is manned by a team of friendly and helpful staff. The menu reflects the seasons and, wherever possible, is sourced locally. If you don't try the locally reared steak from the Holkham Estate, the locally harvested Brancaster Mussels in garlic and thyme are a must, either as a starter or main course. The delicious Norfolk asparagus wrapped in Parma ham is an alternative starter. The Cley Smokehouse, situated on the nearby North Norfolk coast, supplies a range of produce to the restaurant and is renowned for its freshly smoked kippers and smoked prawns, which are also highlights on an extensive menu.

The Dabbling Duck, which hosts its own beer festival in July, is a traditional rural hostelry with large open log fires and three restaurant areas, including one dubbed 'the library.' It also offers accommodation for those wishing to get away from the crowd. As well as occasional live music and poetry readings, local attractions include Houghton Hall, which hosts the internationally renowned Horse Trials every May. Alternatively, just sit and watch the world--and the ducks!--go by as you enjoy your meal. The website is a useful source for menus, wine lists and much more. Darjina, who is yet to win on her travels, was beaten only a head by Haradasun (Aus) in the June 17 G1 Queen Anne S. at Royal Ascot on her latest start and had Finsceal Beo and Saturday's G1 Eclipse winner Mount Nelson (GB) behind. Despite an 18-hour ordeal due to shipping delays, it is the mercurial British summer weather which has trainer Alain de Royer-Dupre concerned. "She had to stay for six hours at Calais because of the storms," he told *PA Sport*. "She left us at 6 a.m. and got to Newmarket at 12 last night, so it was a very long trip. She is okay, but we have the problem of the rain. They had 10 millimetres of rain last night and there is more rain tomorrow. If the ground is not as she likes it, I would prefer not to run." **cont. p5**

Finsceal Beo needs to prove she is back to her best after a dismal effort when trailing in the June 28 G1 Pretty Polly S. at The Curragh, but was brilliant when smashing the all-Guineas time record on the Rowley Mile here last May. Seachange is running for the final time and trainer Graeme Sanders is hoping she can improve on an unplaced effort in the G1 Golden Jubilee S. at Royal Ascot June 21 and cap a career boasting seven domestic Group 1s. "She is one of the greatest horses to race in New Zealand alongside Sunline," he said. "She probably needed the race at Ascot and has improved a bit since then. She wasn't on the best part of the track there and the step up in trip will help her as well. She needs firm ground and won't really like it soft unfortunately, even though she has won easier-class races at home on it." Heading the home defence are Cheveley Park Stud's Heaven Sent, who found only Sabana Perdida (Ire) too strong in the G2 Windsor Forest S. at Royal Ascot last time June 18 and Infallible. The latter will appreciate any ease in the ground, having found the lively conditions against her when runner-up in the Royal meeting's G1 Coronation S. on her latest outing June 20.

Aidan O'Brien saddled You'resothrilling to win this 12 months ago and relies on the Listed Marble Hill S. winner Heart Shaped. Following her hard-fought success in that five-furlong Curragh contest May 24, she only beat three rivals when failing to make an impact in Royal Ascot's G2 Queen Mary S. June 18. Lucky Leigh was fourth on that occasion and looked the likely winner at one stage before succumbing in the final yards and forms a three-pronged attack by Mick Channon. Channon was watching the weather yesterday for Lucky Leigh. He told Racing Post, "She's by Piccolo and has terrific speed. If she'd not been drawn high in the Queen Mary, she must almost have won. If it happened to come up soft or heavy, I would probably leave her and, in that case, it would be a good job I left Please Sing in." She is joined by the G3 Albany S. flop Please Sing and Windsor conditions scorer Kerrys Requiem. John Gosden saddled Chicarica to collect the 1990 edition and relies on Sea of Leaves, who looked in need of an extra panel when graduating over five furlongs of Salisbury's circuit last time June 25.

### FIRST IMPRESSIONS

They don't call it the New Sire Showcase for nothing: 38 different stallions are represented by 211 yearlings--37 percent of the catalogue--in next week's season opener, the Fasig-Tipton July Yearling Sale in Lexington. The last couple of years it's seemed almost like a Florida New Sire Showcase, but this year only two of the 12 new stallions with seven or more catalogued even began their careers in Florida, and one of them, Closing Argument (Successful Appeal), has already moved to Kentucky. Of course, the big guns aren't really rolled out at Fasig. This sire crop's undisputed commercial leader, Ghostzapper (Awesome Again), has just one yearling catalogued at Fasig, and the two/three on the F2007 list (first foals 2007) by weanling/ or 'short yearling' sire average (per Insta-tistics, calculating sales of foals of 2007 through the February 2008 mixed sales), Rock Hard Ten (Kris S.) and Saint Liam (Saint Ballado), are represented by two and three yearlings, respectively. Ghostzapper will explode onto the commercial scene at Saratoga, where he has seven catalogued; Rock Hard Ten and Saint Liam have four each.

Here, in alphabetical order, are thumbnail sketches of the 12 stallions represented by seven or more yearlings from their first crops at Fasig:

The number four new sire on the F2007 average through February was Afleet Alex (Northern Afleet), who has nine yearlings catalogued at Fasig. He comes to the table with very strong credentials. At two, he won his first four starts: two 5 1/2-furlong races at Delaware Park by 11 and 12 lengths, followed by a Saratoga stakes double, in the GII Sanford (six furlongs) and the GI Hopeful (seven furlongs)--so he had plenty of zip. He was beaten 3/4 of a length in each of his two tries at 1 1/16 miles to close out his two-year-old campaign--second-place finishes to Proud Accolade in the GI Champagne, and to Wilko in the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile. He wintered at Oaklawn as a three-year-old, winning the six-furlong Mountain Valley S. before turning in an unaccountably bad run in his only career off-the-board performance, the GIII Rebel S., but rebounded to win the GII Arkansas Derby by eight lengths (Beyer 108). He was third to Giacomo and Closing Argument in the GI Kentucky Derby, leaving the impression he might have been the best horse on the day, then romped by nearly five lengths in the GI Preakness S., despite stumbling badly and nearly losing jockey Jeremy Rose (career-best Beyer 112), before finishing off his career with a seven-length rout in the GI Belmont S.

He never ran again, but with a record that reads 12-8-2-1; a winner from 5 1/2 furlongs to 1 1/2 miles; and a Grade I winner at two and three--well, there's not much missing from his CV, is there? He must have a big shot to make a sire.

Closing Argument, from his sire Successful Appeal's first crop, has seven catalogued at Fasig from his own first crop, sired in Florida. But he has already received the call-up from Kentucky, where he now stands at Hill 'n' Dale. He went pot-hunting as a two-year-old, winning over \$420,000 while competing in ungraded stakes, such as the NATC Futurity (won), two legs of the Florida Stallion Series (placed in both), and the \$1-million Delta Jackpot S. (second) at Delta Downs. He stepped up to the big time as a three-year-old, winning the GIII Holy Bull S. at Gulfstream in early February. He came back two months later to run a distant third to Bandini in the GI Blue Grass S., then completed a massive exacta when, at odds of 71-1, he finished second behind 50-1 Giacomo in the GI Kentucky Derby. He was down the field two weeks later in the GI Preakness S. in what was to be his final start. With plenty of two-year-old form, solid Florida credentials, and from the never-fail two-year-old line of In Reality's son Valid Appeal, he is sure to have a lot of 'valid appeal.'

Consolidator (Storm Cat) was a \$1.25-million KEESEP yearling trained by D. Wayne Lukas for Bob and Beverly Lewis. He won the GI Lane's End Breeders' Futurity at Keeneland before running fourth behind Wilko, Afleet Alex and Sun King in the GI Breeder's Cup Juvenile. After a prep race in the seven-furlong GII San Vicente S., he trounced Giacomo by more than six lengths in the GII San Felipe S. at a mile and a sixteenth (Beyer 105), but the wheels came off when he trailed in fifth in Bandini's Blue Grass. It was a little bit of a surprise, at the time, when Darley stepped in to buy him to stand at Jonabell, though it later became clear his was just an early purchase in what evolved as a new Darley strategy, buying top three-year-olds to stand at stud. He's going to have plenty of followers, and has nine catalogued at Fasig.

A lot of people are hoping that Unbridled's Song will make a sire of sires--so far he is one-for-two, counting Songandaprayer as a success and Buddha, unfortunately, not. Two of his new sire sons will be strongly represented at Fasig, Eurosilver (16 catalogued) and Value Plus (q.v., 15). A homebred for the late Mahmoud Fustok's Buckram Oak Farm, Eurosilver ran just three times at two, winning a Saratoga maiden (Beyer 96) in his second start, already indicating he was a very promising colt, then following with a near-fivelength win in Keeneland's then GII Lane's End Breeders' Futurity. Like many before him, his three-year-old campaign did not go to plan, yielding just an allowance win and two stakes-placings (all at seven furlongs) from four starts. But, unlike many before him, he did bounce back at four to show us what he could do. With trainer Carl Nafzger now calling the shots, he showed good form at nine furlongs, winning the GIII Skip Away H. on Florida Derby day, then closing out with a second to Saint Liam in the GI Stephen Foster H. (Beyer 106) before running poorly in the GI Whitney H. in his final career start. The first stallion for the popular Gerry Dilger's Dromoland Farm, he's got 'Pinhookers Look Here' written all over him.

Forestry, sire of the brilliant Discreet Cat, has the best APEX A Runner Index (3.16) of any North American or European sire whose first foals were born in 2001 (F2001). The lightly raced Forest Danger, unraced at two, made only four starts each year at three and four, yet proved himself a crack seven-furlong specialist. He won the GIII Bay Shore (Beyer 110) and ran second in the GIII Withers (at a mile) before going on the shelf at three, but came back to win the GI Carter H. (Beyer 115), again at seven furlongs, at four. From a \$20,000 stud fee, 19 weanlings/short yearlings from his first crop averaged over \$88,000 through February, more than four times his stud fee--and that was for weanlings! He has eight catalogued at Fasig. A \$900,000 two-year-old himself, with the tip of his first-crop foals having sold so well--expect fireworks.

Grand Reward, by Storm Cat out of the great Serena's Song, no less, placed in six stakes from 12 starts for Aidan O'Brien, but came to Wavne Lukas toward the end of his three-year-old year with a lowly 107 Timeform rating. His best day in North America came when he led virtually all the way and held on to win the nine-furlong GII Oaklawn H. He ran a Beyer 108 that day, about equivalent, on my scale, to a Timeform 120. In spite of his blockbuster pedigree, he wasn't a horse I thought had that much to recommend him. Until he had five weanlings sell in Kentucky last November for at least \$75,000, as well as probably another five to 10 which blatantly way outsold their pedigrees. That's almost always a sign that a horse is throwing good individuals, and these days that's almost always a sign that this is a horse to watch. It will be interesting to see if the European pinhookers will go for him. They'll have plenty of chances: he has 14 catalogued at Fasig (another sign that he's getting good individuals).

Gone West probably rates second only to Fappiano among Mr. Prospector's sons as a sire of sires, and his son Grand Slam already has an active sire son in dual Grade II winner Strong Hope. His second major son is Limehouse, who has the highest number catalogued (21) of any first-crop sire at Fasig. Limehouse has a real speedball pedigree: his second dam is the rocket sprinter Blue Jean Baby, by Mr. Prospector (so Limehouse is inbred 3x3 to the great man, I mean horse) out of another rocket sprinter, Jones Time Machine. Sure enough, Limehouse won his first three starts as a two-year-old--kicking off over 4 1/2 furlongs at Keeneland in April, the Three Chimneys Juvenile S. on Derby Day, and the GIII Bashford Manor S. at six furlongs in early July. He placed over as far as 8 1/2 furlongs at two when third to Eurosilver in the Lane's End Futurity. He came back to win his first two starts at three--the GII Hutcheson S. at seven furlongs, and the GIII Tampa Bay Derby, his first win at 8 1/2 furlongs. Limehouse ran third to The Cliff's Edge in the GI Blue Grass S. and fourth to Smarty Jones in the GI Kentucky Derby, but then went on the shelf after running only sixth as the even-money favorite in the GII Ohio Derby. But he proved his toughness by coming back to run 10 times at four, all in stakes races, including eight Grade I or Grade II races. He won twice, including the GII Brooklyn at nine furlongs, running a career-best Beyer 112 that day. He's got plenty to recommend him.

Carson City didn't sire that many quality two-turn horses, but if you want to talk about toughness, look at Pollard's Vision. He ran in 15 consecutive two-turn graded races at three and four. The dark bay won four of them: the GII Illinois Derby (Beyer 107), GIII Leonard Richards S., and GIII Lone Star Derby at three, and the GIII National Jockey Club H. (Beyer 109) at four; he also placed in seven more graded races, two of them Grade I's. His dam is by the top broodmare sire Dixieland Band, but the next two dams are by Pleasant Colony and Nijinsky II, and some of those two must have come through to contribute to his toughness. He has 11 yearlings at Fasig, and if he's throwing the kind of precociousness the close-up elements of his pedigree suggest (you wouldn't expect two-turn Grade II winners to have 11 yearlings at Fasig July), he could be a very interesting prospect.

Blimey, how many of these did Todd Pletcher train? Forest Danger, Limehouse, Pollard's Vision, and now **Purge**, a brilliant (on his day) but not terribly consistent son of Pulpit. We should just ask Todd to handicap these sires--he trained most of them. Purge won three graded races: the nine-furlong GII Peter Pan (Beyer 108) and GII Jim Dandy (Beyer 109) at three, and the GI Cigar Mile (Beyer 111) at four. On those days, it didn't look like any horse in America could touch him: he won the Peter Pan by 6 3/4 lengths, the Jim Dandy by 4 1/2, and the Cigar Mile by 3 3/4. Vinery always gives their sires a fair shot, and Purge is no exception: he had 30 weanlings/short yearlings sell through February (average \$56,763), and he has 17 yearlings catalogued at Fasig.

Roman Ruler, a half-brother to El Corredor, is from the first crop of Fusaichi Pegasus, and did his best to get his old man off to a good start. Trained by Bob Baffert, Roman Ruler won his first two starts, a five-furlong maiden at Hollywood Park (by four lengths, in :57 1/5), and the 6 1/2-furlong GII Best Pal S., at Del Mar, by seven lengths (Beyer 103). Off such a sensational Beyer at that stage of the season (that figure would have won something like nine of the last 10 GI Breeders' Cup Juveniles), he was sent off at 1-10 for the GII Del Mar Futurity, but the bubble was burst when eventual two-year-old champion Declan's Moon beat him by a head. He came back to win the GII Norfolk (at 1-20), but could only finish fifth as the 2-1 favorite behind Wilko, Afleet Alex, Sun King, and Consolidator in the 2004 Breeders' Cup Juvenile. In five starts at three, he won the GII Dwyer S. and GI Haskell S. (Beyer 108), and placed in the GI Travers S. and GII Goodwood H., where he was second to the then four-year-old Rock Hard Ten (Roman Ruler's Beyer was 111). Roman Ruler has a very similar commercial profile to that of Purge: he also had 30 weanling/short yearlings sell, his average of \$59,973 was just ahead of Purge's; and he has 14 yearlings catalogued at Fasig-Tipton.


So that's just the five trained by Pletcher, then, of the 12 first-crop sires to have seven or more yearlings catalogued to Fasig July. The last of them is **Value Plus**, like Eurosilver, a son of Unbridled's Song. Value Plus never won a graded stakes; his best win came in the 7 1/2-furlong Artax H. at Gulfstream Park (Beyer 108), in his second start at four. But he had run (a distant) second to Cuvee in the GI Futurity at Belmont Park as a two-year-old, and he had also run second to Friends Lake in the GI Florida Derby at three. He's getting plenty of exposure, too: he's had 37 weanlings/short yearlings sell, for near enough three times his stud fee (\$12,500), and he has 15 catalogued at Fasig.

Storm Cat's son Forest Wildcat has already had a useful freshman sire, last year, in D'Wildcat (11th on the 2007 Freshman Sire list), and he has another good prospect in Florida-based **Wildcat Heir**, who has eight yearlings catalogued at Fasig. Second to Whywhywhy in the GII Sanford S. at Saratoga as a two-year-old, he missed most of his three-year-old year, but returned at four to win four and run second twice in seven starts. In his only off-the-board performance that year, he dead-heated for fourth, beaten 1 1/2 lengths, in the GIII Phoenix S. at Keeneland (Beyer 110), then came back to win the GI Frank DeFrancis Memorial at Pimlico, running a Beyer 109. A Florida-based, Grade I-winning six-furlong specialist: sounds like a recipe for early two-year-old speed to me.

### In Other News...

First, many thanks to those of you who elected me to the 48-member Breeders' Cup Board of Members and Trustees. I was also pleased to see that *TDN* publisher Barry Weisbord was elected. Just in case there was any question about it, there was no plan involved; Barry and I didn't even know each other was running until the nominations were published. But I feel that it is the 'winds of change' that saw us elected, and you can bet I will do everything we can to make a great game even better, and I'm sure Barry will do the same.

Back on the sire front, what a huge weekend for Street Cry (Machiavellian), with two Grade I winners from his first crop (four-year-olds) at Hollywood Park on Saturday. Ditto for Chester House (Mr. Prospector), whose last of just three crops are four-year-olds of 2008. I counted four stakes horses for him reported in Sunday's *TDN*: stakes winners at Belmont Park and Evangeline Downs; Ventura, second in the GII Cashcall Mile; and Phoenix Tower, second in the G1 Eclipse S.-all four-year-olds from his last crop.

He's now ranked seventh on the 2008 North American General Sire List, with 13 stakes winners of 17 stakes races, just halfway through the year. So much for temperament meaning a sire's progeny won't take racing. A Grade I winning half-brother to three other Grade I winners--including Empire Maker (Unbridled) and Honest Lady (Seattle Slew)--Chester House was notoriously temperamental himself, and is out of the notoriously temperamental mare Toussaud, but from reading these statistics, you'd think he must have been calmer than Old Shep. I've never really been convinced of that 'temperament' knock, and I'm even less convinced of it now. Saturday was a big day also for Lion Heart (Tale of the Cat), who went further clear at the top of the Freshman Sire List by virtue of Azul Leon's win in the GII Hollywood Juvenile Championship S. and Lyin' Heart's second in the GII Bashford Manor S. at Churchill Downs; and a big day, too, for Airdrie Stud's Friends Lake (A.P. Indy), who sired the winner of the Bashford Manor, Screen Your Friend. Airdrie's Bret Jones has been telling me for the last year I haven't been giving Friends Lake enough ink, and it looks like that young buck could be right this time. Friends Lake only has three starters and one winner, but having the Bashford Manor winner in his first crop is big news for a sire with a two-turn race record and a two-turn pedigree.

Ghostzapper ran a 128 when he won the Iselin by 10L on a sloppy track, but I have used his Breeders' Cup Classic win, 124. Saint Liam once ran a 123, but I have gone with his far more typical figure, 114.

## SO. CALIFORNIA ★

**CHRB Seeks Comment on Shoeing Regulation:** 

Should horses be allowed to run without shoes if a trainer feels the horse might perform better unshod? The California Horse Racing Board will be considering this option July 17 at Del Mar and is soliciting comments from the public by July 14. The issue was first raised by the California Thoroughbred Trainers at a meeting of the CHRB Medication Committee last November. CTT Executive Director Ed Halpern indicated there had been sentiment among some trainers "for a long time to allow horses to race unshod, but with the introduction of synthetic tracks, the idea has gained support for moving forward. Some horses are more comfortable without shoes." The official program will note when any horse adds or removes shoes. To date, the CHRB has heard no testimony in opposition to allowing horses to race unshod. Written comments should be addressed to: Harold Coburn, Regulation Analyst, California Horse Racing Board, 1010 Hurley Way, Suite 300, Sacramento, CA 95825. 


