GI Breeders' Cup Classic hero **Curlin** (Smart Strike) will face six challengers in his grass debut in a top-shelf

renewal of the GI Man o'War S. Saturday at Belmont. Connections are hoping for a true gauge of Curlin's ability to handle the green stuff and will surely get it in a race boasting plenty of talent. The Man o'War features a pair of GI Breeders' Cup Turf winners, 2004 hero Better Talk Now (Talkin Man) and '06 hero Red Rocks (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}), marking just the second time in history--and first outside Breeders' Cup day--that three Breeders' Cup winners will line up

DASHING BLADE

Classic Blade (Ire) (Daggers Drawn) made every yard of the running and clung on in the closing stages to record a short-head defeat of Sayif (Ire) (Kheleyf) in yesterday's G2 July S. at Newmarket. Successful in a conditions event at Salisbury last time June 29, the 6-1 shot provided the Classic Strollers Partnership and rookie trainer Tom Dascombe with a fairytale result in this prestigious prize. "This is just fantastic," his conditioner said. "He didn't look much early on, but has just kept improving and was bound to like this softer ground. He tries his heart out and that is what has got him through today." Cont. p2

NATIVE ASSAULT

While most were berating the opportunities for threeyear-old sprinters, John Mayne's Kingsgate Native (Ire) (Mujadil) put a spanner in the works when besting his elders in the G1 Golden Jubilee S. and he bids for a notable double in today's G1 Darley July Cup at Newmarket. He is used to defying normal practice, having won York's G1 Nunthorpe S. and finishing runner-up in the G1 Prix de l'Abbaye de Longchamp as a juvenile and his 1 1/4-length defeat of War Artist (Aus) (Orpen) in the June 21 Golden Jubilee proved that sophomores can master the older brigade in early summer. "He came out of the race well," trainer John Best explained. "I always give him a little bit of time off immediately after a race. He had his little break, is back now and is in good form. I was delighted with him at Ascot. He had Takeover Target (Aus) to give him a lead, he was drawn on the right side and everything was perfect. I just hope everything falls into place at Newmarket." VINDICATION EUTHANIZED

Champion Vindication (Seattle Slew--Strawberry Reason, by Strawberry Road (Aus)), who went to stud at Hill 'n' Dale Farms in 2004, was euthanized Wednes-

day night due to complications from colic. "He was observed to be uncomfortable around 9:30 p.m.," Hill 'n' Dale owner John Sikura said Thursday morning. "Farm manager Joe Ramsey and resident veterinarian Dr. Jeremy Whitman were called to observe the horse. and he was sent to Rood and Riddle, Dr. [Rolf] Embertson did his diagnostics and decided to do exploratory surgery to confirm the ailment. They didn't think it was at all life-threatening, but when they opened him up, they found a

gastric rupture. It was inoperable--there was nothing they could do." Purchased by Padua Stables for \$2.15 million as a FTSAUG yearling, Vindication earned the Eclipse Award after an undefeated two-year-old season that culminated with a win in the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile (video). A suspensory injury ended his career, and he headed to Hill 'n' Dale, which owned a share of his breeding rights. From two crops to race, he has produced 41 winners, including GSW More Happy. He is also the sire of GISP Maimonides, a half-brother to El Corredor and Roman Ruler who realized \$4.6 million at the 2006 Keeneland September Sale. Zayat Stables purchased the colt, who placed in last year's GI Hopeful S. before being sidelined by injury. In all, Vindication is the sire of seven stakes horses and the earners of more than \$2 million.

Only fourth when sent off at 14-1 on debut at Leicester Apr. 26, Classic Blade improved to win a maiden at Doncaster June 6 and followed up with a defeat of the previous winner Measurement (Ire) at Salisbury. Quickly away here under the enterprising Richard Kingscote, he had most in trouble as he steadily turned the screw and only Sayif emerged as a live threat meeting the rising ground. Digging in to repel that rival, he had his nose thrust out where it mattered. "He's game, genuine and jumps, runs and keeps going," his rider said. "He's very stocky and has a lot of muscle, but has been a surprise as he wasn't showing a great deal as a baby. He's very professional and last time he was keen going to post but was settled today. He goes on any ground, as it was soft at Doncaster and firm at Salisbury and he's very straightforward and versatile." Dascombe was not getting carried away afterwards and added, "I think he's a good horse, but not top-class, so we'll keep our feet on the ground and go for the money in the Tattersalls Ireland Sale S. [at The Curragh Aug. 23]. We didn't expect to have a group horse on our hands and that was always on the agenda--he will have a penalty now, but I don't mind too much." 

Lucarno built steadily towards his victory in the G1 St Leger in September, after which he had been stored away for the winter in preparation for a potentially fruitful four-year-old campaign. While he reached a peak in that Doncaster Classic, he had shown a high level of form earlier when fourth in the G1 Epsom Derby, runner-up in Royal Ascot's G2 King Edward VII S. and successful in York's G2 Great Voltigeur S. Down the field in the G3 Brigadier Gerard S. on his return at Sandown May 29, he followed that with a sixth in the June 29 G1 Grand Prix de Saint-Cloud last time and used his giant stride to maximum advantage to improve on his fourth behind Papal Bull in this contest last year. It was that rival who launched the greatest threat in this renewal, but by the time the mercurial character reached top gear, Jimmy Fortune had already inflicted the damage with an enterprising ride from the front. "There was never going to be much pace and he got his own way out in front," his jockey explained. "It's taken a long time to come together this year, but he had a lot of races last year and it was only on his fourth or fifth run that he showed real class." Connections of the first and second are eyeing a rematch in the July 26 G1 King George VI and Queen Elizabeth S. at Ascot. DARLEY JULY CUP-G1

Of the vanquished at Ascot, Vintage Thoroughbreds's War Artist and Gerry Galligan's Sir Gerry (Carson City) were closest to Kingsgate Native in second and third, respectively, and re-oppose here. The former's trainer James Eustace wants the ground to dry out for last year's G1 Mercury Sprint hero. "We've had a drying day today and if we are lucky and that carries on, the ground may get back to good, which will obviously suit us with him used to racing in South Africa," he told PA Sport. "I'm loathe to say it really, but he appears to have come out of Ascot in better shape than he went in. He is really well and we are expecting another good performance from him." Sir Gerry, who took last year's G2 Gimcrack S. at York, was third behind Carla Giral's Marchand d'Or and the subsequent G1 King's Stand S. winner Equiano (Fr) in the G2 Prix du Gros-Chene at Chantilly June 1 before his Royal run. Owner Gerry Galligan makes no secret of his regard for the James Fanshawe-trained colt, who bids to become the ninth three-year-old to win this since 1990. "He's a superstar in the making and this time next year he will take some beating," he commented. "He has a good chance in this race and James has been very positive in his reports since Ascot. He's at the top of his game now and while he doesn't like extremes of going, he will like this better than the fast ground at Ascot last time." Marchand d'Or is back in a bid to improve on his fourth behind Sakhee's Secret (GB) 12 months ago and had excuses for his sixth in the Golden Jubilee. "The Golden Jubilee was a very funny race," trainer Freddy Head told PA Sport. "He was very keen early on and then he got bumped. He's a bit funny now in his old age and he doesn't like that. He ran very well in this race last year and I think he is a better horse this year." Aidan O'Brien, who scored with Stravinsky in 1999 and with Mozart (Ire) two years later, relies on US Ranger and Astronomer Royal, who were fifth and seventh, respectively, in that all-important Ascot sprint, while Richard Fahey puts forward the Rumpole Partnership's G3 Chipchase S. winner Utmost Respect.

Aidan O'Brien unleashed Horatio Nelson (Ire) on Newmarket three years ago, having registered a first win with Thady Quill in 1999 and saddles Grand Ducal this time. Off the mark at the first time of asking at Tipperary May 23, he failed by 1 1/2 lengths to give 11 pounds to the smart Glisten (GB) in a conditions event at Fairyhouse last time June 19. Mick Channon, who collected the last two renewals with Halicarnassus (Ire) and Hatta Fort (GB), relies on the York maiden third Sanvean, as well as Managua, who graduated at Sandown last time June 13. Bryan Smart has Prime Spirit, who was nosed out in a conditions event at Doncaster last June 27, to represent the revitalised Hambleton House Stable. "Hehas come out of Doncaster fantastically well and ran very well there," Smart said. "He's a nice horse; I like him a lot. I thought he was very unlucky to get beaten the last time--in fact he hasn't really been beaten because it was nearly a dead-heat. He's run fantastically well so I'm really pleased with him."

Curlin departed from trainer Steve Asmussen's base at Churchill Downs late Thursday morning as he began his trip to New York. Asmussen led the chestnut colt from his barn to a van that was scheduled to carry Curlin and other members of Asmussen's stable to the Empire State. Curlin is heading to Belmont Park for Saturday's race, while the bulk of Asmussen's stable at Churchill Downs was bound for Saratoga Race Course. Asmussen talked to track officials about Curlin's first attempt on the grass. "It's another great test for a great horse," Asmussen said. "It's a big test that we have in front of us, in the accomplishments of the field and who they are. It's our first step on the turf and there are so many questions. But I can't say enough about how proud we are to be involved with Curlin."

TOP PRODUCER WINTER'S GONE DIES The 12-year-old mare Winter's Gone (Dynaformer--Stark Winter, by Graustark), dam of Grade I winners Sharp Lisa and Spring at Last and Grade II winner Sharp Susan, died at WinStar Farm after birthing a dead Storm Cat foal. The mare was owned by WinStar's Kenny Troutt and Bill Casner, who had purchased her for \$410,000 at the 2000 Keeneland January sale. "She was one of our foundation mares, no doubt," said WinStar President Doug Cauthen. "With two Grade I winners and a poten-

tial Grade I-type in Sharp Susan, Winter's Gone had Broodmare of the Year potential. It was a tremendous loss." A half-sister to Grade I winner Bien Bien, Winter's Gone failed to find the winner's circle in six starts on the track, but more than made amends as a broodmare. **Sharp Lisa** (Dixieland Band), her third foal, won the GI Las Virgenes S. and banked \$658,100. In 2006, Sharp Lisa topped the Fasig-Tipton November Sale when

BBA Ireland purchased the then-four-year-old for \$3.4 million. Sharp Susan (Touch Gold), who beat Valbenny (Ire) and All is Vanity (Fr) in a contentious renewal of the \$200,000 Dr. James Penny Memorial S. at Delaware on Monday, is a multiple graded stakes winner who won last year's GII Lake Placid S. She is co-owned by WinStar, along with IEAH Stables and Pegasus Holdings Group. WinStar sold **Spring at Last** (Silver Deputy) to J. Paul Reddam as a racing prospect for \$675,000 in 2006, but later bought back into the colt. Spring at Last won last year's G2 Godolphin Mile in Dubai and, earlier this year, won the GI Donn H. at Gulfstream. He was injured after contesting the GI Carter H. and was subsequently retired. Spring at Last will begin his stallion career at WinStar for the 2009 season. "We are excited about the stallion prospects of Spring at Last, who we are currently syndicating," added Cauthen. "He had a unique mix of speed and stamina which will serve both the commercial and racing breeders well. He reminds me a bit of Distorted Humor when he retired--a well-bred horse who had great speed and could carry it. We will support Spring at Last like we have supported all the WinStar stallions--strongly. And our partner Paul Reddam is also retaining a percentage with the intent to breed to the horse, so we have a strong foundation behind the horse already. We're excited."

COLLAPSE OF THE PRIVATE MARKET by Barry Irwin

As the first of the major yearling sales for 2008 is upon us, I would like to sound the death knell for the private market and suggest that a combination of a lack of private trade and institution of accelerated depreciation for yearlings as part of the federal government's economic stimulus package will help prop up the yearling sales in spite of a contracting economy.

Yes, you read that correctly--the private marketplace has collapsed. As one of the individuals responsible for the rapid rise of the private market beginning in the 1980s, I am here to tell you that this form of acquiring racehorses has all but ceased to exist in the United States.

The private marketplace, beginning towards the end of the 1980s, developed into a viable arena for the purchase of racehorses of all levels, but especially for the phenomena of ready-made Classic prospects.

When owners of racing stables began to realize that by paying a bit of a premium they could get their hands on a ready-made runner, the private market began to expand.

Coming out of the economic slowdown that began in 1987, owners and breeders of racehorses were all too willing to sell their promising young horses to willing buyers, take the money and either run or reinvest.

Owners that had used traditional methods to stock their racing stables, such as buying unraced horses, went to school when animals such as Lil E Tee, Thunder Gulch, War Emblem, Victory Gallop and Sarava won Triple Crown races after being purchased privately after their racing careers had commenced. When somebody is able to buy a horse a fortnight before the Kentucky Derby and win the most sought-after prize on the American Turf, it has a tendency to make the owner wonder aloud why anybody would ever breed another horse or buy another yearling. And it made the rivals of that owner wonder the exact same thing.

War Emblem, probably more than any other horse, did more to fuel the viability of the private marketplace than any other horse.

So why, enquiring minds will want to know, has the private marketplace ceased to be a viable avenue for owners to continue to obtain high-quality stock?

The method of acquiring stock privately over the past 20 years has always been somewhat complicated by the "elephant in the room" syndrome. At one time or another, the role of this dominant force has been played by the likes of Jenny Craig, Sheikh Mohammed, Gary Tanaka and, more recently, IEAH Stables.

What complicated the market was the willingness of these buyers to overspend to a lavish degree.

The Farm Bill Depreciation of Race Horses Shortened

The incentives referred to in Barry Irwin's column stem from the Farm Bill passed by Congress in May. Effective January 1, 2009 all race horses will be depreciated over three years, regardless of their age when placed in service. Prior to then, race horses will continue to be depreciated over seven years if they are placed in service before they turn two. This change to the tax code for race horses will "sunset" after five years, ending at the end of 2013.

Last year Senators Mitch McConnell (R-KY), Jim Bunning (R-KY) and Blanche Lincoln (D-AR) introduced the Equine Equity Act (EEA), which proposed to put all racehorses in the three-year category for depreciation purposes and make horses eligible for capital gains tax treatment after being held for 12 months.

With the passage of this provision, horse owners will no longer have to decide whether to place their horse in service at the end of its yearling year, and depreciate it over seven years, or wait until the horse reaches 24 months and a day in order to use the three-year depreciation schedule. This period is often only a few months. "Beginning in 2009, all race horses will be depreciated over three years regardless of when placed in service. This amendment will end the inequitable situation of depreciating race horses over seven years, a period that is about twice as long as their actual racing time," said Jay Hickey, president of the American Horse Council

The willingness or ability of "elephants" to spend large amounts of capital to obtain the best racing prospects is certainly a legitimate exercise of their rights in a free marketplace and nobody begrudges them for it. The "elephants" have not killed off the market.

What has made the private market for high-quality Thoroughbreds collapse is a combination of unethical bloodstock agents and buyers that have distorted the culture of potential sellers, who in turn have inadvertently shut down the enterprise of trading horses privately between individuals because of greed and unrealistic expectations.

In order for trade to take place privately there has to be a willing seller and a willing buyer. One does not have to be Bob Barker to know from experience that anything can be sold if the price is right.

But today, in an uncertain economy, coming up with the right price for tangible goods is not such an easy task. Complicating the matter is the potential sale to an "elephant."

Unscrupulous agents have systematically, over the last couple of years, exploited the uncertainty of potential sellers by distorting the landscape of the private market to a point where it has all but ceased to exist.

Here's an example of how it plays out:

- A two-year-olds wins a race impressively.
- No sooner has the youngster crossed under the wire then the trainer, the owner or the representative of the owner of the horse in question receives some phone calls.
- First there is the normal song and dance. Agent: "Wanna sell?" Seller: "Horse is not for sale, but for the right price it might be." Agent: "I represent a guy that can pay a lot of money." Seller: "What's a lot of money?" Agent: "A million and a half." Seller: "I might consider that."
- The agent actually could really be legit and represent The Maktoums or IEAH, in which case the actions of the agent and the principal are being conducted on an ethical basis and trade very well could be possible. Barry Irwin cont. p10

- But more likely than not--way, way more likely, I can assure you--the agent calling either has not spoken with his principal, may not have a principal and may, in some instances, be trying to tie up the two-year-old so that he can "middle" a client.
- When an agent suggests to a potential seller that he might be able to get \$1.5 million for a two-year-old, he invariably has little or no intention of actually finding a client at such a price. But, by mentioning this figure, the agent eliminates any further competition from rival agents or buyers, and has managed to get the seller's complete attention.
- When, and if, the agent returns for a second conversation with the seller, a new and lower price
 may be offered. Invariably, the seller walks away,
 having first heard the greater price and his natural
 greed not allowing him to adjust to the lower figure.
- There are a few really unethical agents that try to get a seller to sign a contract in which the agent acts like he is buying the two-year-old for his own account. The agent then scurries around trying to "resell" the two-year-old while the process of vetting the youngster takes place. If the agent can find a buyer at a figure higher than that which he agreed to buy the two-year-old, a deal actually takes place. But if the agent fails to find a buyer, the two-year-old suddenly fails the vet.

The main complication that results from these machinations is that precious little trade is taking place, especially in North America. There are fewer willing sellers, because sellers are waiting for a legitimate call from the Maktoums or IEAH Stable. These two entities do not buy enough horses on an annual basis to satisfy the requirements of private sellers, so their horses are not sold to the "elephants."

Once a sale to an "elephant" is no longer a possibility, a seller is, as an illiterate college professor friend of mine once stated, "in the hands of the Philippines."

And just exactly who are these so-called "Philippines" and who, if anybody, do they represent?

In some instances, the agents are just that--agents; independent bloodstock agents that do not represent any principals per se, but try to find horses that might be for sale and match them up with people that buy horses to race.

In some instances, the agents are paid employees of trainers that hire the agents to make phone calls and try to "tie up" two-year-olds so that the trainers can then present them to a client.

In some instances, the agents actually work for owners that are trying to buy horses privately to race.

But, such are the methods employed by these agents, that potential sellers are given such absurdly high expectations that very little trade takes place, because the owners' unrealistic expectations can rarely, if ever, be met.

As unethical and unscrupulous as the agents and trainers with principals or without principles are in these instances, the sellers are not exactly blameless, because they turn a suggested price into gospel and internalize the price to such an extent that it does not allow them to adjust when crunch time arises. Furthermore, in any conversations that follow a failed sale, the owners love to invoke either the names of the "elephants" or the phony prices as a means of trying to give legs to future transactions.

What, one may want to know, is the difference between how horses are being bought now and, say, 10 or 20 years ago in the private market?

Back in the day, when somebody interested in buying a horse privately contacted a seller or a trainer or an owner's rep, that buyer started low and eventually was able to reach a reasonable agreement on price through negotiation. Sellers invariably wanted to hear from buyers and engage in trade.

Today, mostly what occurs in the song-and-dance phase of what now passes for negotiation is that a potential seller comes away from a failed transaction with what he considers to be a valuation for his horse, which is really all that some wealthy owners want from such brushes with the private marketplace, because they are not really willing sellers unless the price represents a killing for them.

The days of the willing seller, except to an "elephant," are virtually extinct.

In the burial grounds of this market, you can find one guy that probably sold more Classic winners and Classic-placed horses than anybody in the United States during the heyday of the private market. This year his sales have dwindled to a point where he has managed to complete just one sale higher than \$1 million. His occasional sales now take place in the lower depths of the marketplace. Another big player from a few years ago has moved into a different phase of the horse business.

Unlike regulated markets, such as real estate and stock exchanges where sales activity is reported, the private marketplace is like six guns in the wild west. The primary conduit between buyer and seller is the agent, whose evidence of price is mostly anecdotal and of questionable quality in aiding either buyer or seller in forming an opinion of value.

In time, like all markets, this one will correct itself, when the sharks and barracudas move on to another feasting ground because the market has dried up and the game is all but played out.

As for me, I have alternatives. I have decided to take a position of not engaging in any private domestic acquisitions for the balance of 2008. I have done so A) to send a message to sellers that this chump is no longer available for gouging, and B) to take advantage of the special bonus depreciation available in buying yearlings.

If Uncle Sam wants to be my 50-percent partner this year in buying yearlings, who am I to turn him down? Make no mistake--I am not doing this out of some form of misguided patriotism. If The Man makes me a deal even the Mafia cannot refuse, I plan to embrace that high-hatted feller at the yearling sales. And I suspect others just like me will be there for the same reasons, because with accelerated depreciation from the Feds and hundreds of willing sellers, I betcha I might could find some horses to buy!



CHRB Resolves 'Quick Pick' Issue:

The California Horse Racing Board yesterday announced an agreement with Scientific Games regarding faulty Quick Pick tickets. The issue first came to light after a handicapper who had purchased a number of Quick Pick tickets for the Kentucky Derby noticed that none of the tickets included the race winner, Big Brown, who was the 20th wagering choice in the program. CHRB discovered and confirmed that, due to a programming error, some of Scientific Games' betting terminals were producing Quick Pick tickets that did not include the entire array of runner numbers in their selection. As part of the agreement, Scientific Games will immediately reimburse the CHRB in the amount of \$50,000 for the costs of the investigation into this matter. The company will also make a voluntary payment of \$150,000 to charities benefitting horse racing-related causes, and will pay refunds to people who placed Quick Pick bets at the BetJet terminals in California between July 1, 2007 and June 2, 2008, as long as the person can establish placement of the bet through legitimate proof, including but not limited to a ticket stub. 


