crossroads of his career: if his turf bow in today's GI Man o' War S. at Belmont goes as planned, the powerful chestnut will head to France for a tilt at the G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe Oct. 7. "The perfect plan for us--for me, for Curlin and for everybody associated with him--is to first establish his level of quality on the turf, and not get ahead of ourselves," said trainer Steve Asmussen. "If he can compete at his level on the turf and we get the race that we expect, we will map out how to win the Arc

with him. I think that getting him over there immediately and getting him used to going right [on right-handed turns] would be the biggest obstacle that we face. If we establish that he's as good a horse on the turf as he is on the dirt, then we get him over there and get him relaxed, comfortable and confident, and doing right." Cont. p5

#### SPEED MERCHANT

Carla Giral's Marchand d'Or (Fr) (Marchand de Sable) left it until the last gasp of the G1 Darley July Cup at Newmarket yesterday, but Davy Bonilla's timing proved immaculate as the five-year-old collared US Ranger (Danzig) on the line to justify 5-2 favoritism. Coming off the back of a sixth in the June 21 G1 Golden Jubilee S. at Royal Ascot, the grey produced his customary rattle against the stands rail to deny the Ballydoyle raider by a head. "It is a great thrill to win this as a jockey and now as a trainer," commented Freddy Head, who partnered Anabaa to success in 1996. "I love this horse, but he's a difficult ride, and Davy did well." Head added, "I was very disappointed at Ascot, but he got too good a start and was very keen and got in the middle of horses, which he doesn't like. It's a great thing to have the best sprinter in Europe, and he's the best I've trained by far." July Cup cont. p2

Marchand d'Or is the undisputed king of Deauville, having garnered the last two renewals of the G1 Prix Maurice de Gheest at the feature August festival. His standing as France's best sprinter was hammered home in the June 1 G2 Prix du Gros-Chene at Chantilly, but his overseas forays had so far been unsuccessful, if creditable. Eighth in last year's G1 Dubai Golden Shaheen at Nad Al Sheba on his first try abroad, his subsequent travels yielded a fourth in this race 12 months ago, a second to Red Clubs (Ire) in the G1 Haydock Sprint Cup in September and a sixth in the G1 Hong Kong Sprint at Sha Tin in December before his latest run at the Royal meeting. Breaking well yesterday, he was instantly reined back and steadied in rear off the strong early fractions carved out by War Artist. Guided over to the rail to allow him to launch an unhindered challenge, the gray delivered his usual telling burst of acceleration to thrust past US Ranger, who had overhauled the long-time leader 50 yards before the line under Johnny Murtagh. Winning conditioner Freddy Head said, "He's a better horse this year than last, when I had a lot of problems with his feet. Now that's over and he's okay. Davy waited and waited, and that is how he runs well, from behind. He had good timing and came at the right moment--I know he can finish and quicken, and he has won over seven."

#### So Close, Yet So Far...

Aidan O'Brien was taking the positives from the narrow defeat of US Ranger, who was well supported at 9-2, and showed improvement off his fifth in the Golden Jubilee. "He ran a great race and we're delighted with him," he told *PA Sport*. "He just seems to be starting to learn what sprinting is all about. I'm not sure what we'll do now, but he's in all the top sprints."

Just 24 hours after Tom Dascombe and Richard Kingscote pulled off a notable first for the 42-horse yard when capturing the G2 July S., the same trainerjockey combination repeated the dose with another allthe-way win with Firth of Fifth. Twice placed on the Polytrack in the space of 12 days at Lingfield and Kempton in April, the juvenile was runner-up to the smart Baycat (Ire) at Ascot at the end of the month before finishing third behind the subsequent winner Wildcat Wizard at York June 14. Sent over this trip for the first time at Lingfield last time June 21, the bay relished the extra distance to record a seven-length success, and entered this contest with the small stable on the crest of a wave. Sent straight to the lead, he applied the pressure passing halfway and never looked in danger of being caught despite the travails of Weald Park and Shaweel. "Tom's horses love racing, and he had his ears pricked at the four pole," his rider commented. "We always knew he wanted further as he was staying on well in his races over five and six and he enjoys being in front. I kicked early enough, but he's hard and found plenty. He's still a baby--he had his head down and gave a kick on the way to the start and hopefully there is more to come." His conditioner, who revealed that he feeds his horses chaff instead of hay, was soaking up the fairytale afterwards. "He's small, but tough, and his early experience has made him streetwise," Dascombe explained. "He's got a really high cruising speed and you've got to let him rock and roll and not interfere too much. Mariol garnered prizemoney in four Nad Al Sheba sprints at the beginning of the year--including one disqualification from first--and returned to Europe to run eighth in the G2 Prix du Gros-Chene at Chantilly June 1. Hitting the board in the June 20 Listed Prix Hampton back at Chantilly, he did so again in the G3 Hamburg Trophy last week and gained the upper hand on some old foes to register a belated first stakes win here. Settled fourth until pushed along to close with 350 meters to go, he moved into second at the distance and ran on strongly under a drive to assert superiority nearing the line. "I telephoned my sister [and coowner Micheline Vidal] to inform her I was coming here today and that I hoped to return with a nice birthday gift for her," said co-owner Sydney Vidal. "Mariol is extremely tough and takes all his racing and travelling well. I imagine he will return in a similar event." Reflecting on how the race unfolded, jockey Sebastien Maillot added, "He had a very good trip on the inside and he quickened smartly when I asked him to. He is the stable favorite; he recovered well from his last race in Germany and deserved to win such a race."

This race should be a fairly good barometer of whether Curlin gets to spend the autumn in Paris; he'll face GI Breeders' Cup Turf heroes Better Talk Now (2004) and Red Rocks (2006) as well as Grade/Group 1 winners Grand Couturier and Sudan. Better Talk Now is

seeking to become the oldest horse to win the Man o' War at age nine. The venerable gelding was forced to take up in his latest, finishing fifth when attempting to defend his title in the GI Manhattan H. June 7. "He just was unlucky and couldn't get through," said trainer H. Graham Motion. "Since then, Better Talk Now has been doing great. We are very excited about being in this race. Every year, all you hear about

are the three-year-olds. This is like a throwback race, where you have good older horses competing. Better Talk Now has never ducked anyone, and he is too old to start now. I am looking forward to running and hope that each horse runs his race. To me, this is very exciting. Not only do we face Curlin, but we get a chance at Red Rocks again for what he did to us in the Breeders' Cup." Better Talk Now came up a half-length short to Red Rocks in 2006, and was 3/4 of a length behind his nemesis when fourth in the 2007 renewal. Red Rocks warmed up for the season with a conditions-race score at Lingfield May 10 for trainer Brian Meehan. He followed that with a sixth in the G1 Coronation Cup June 6 at Epsom, and adds blinkers for this third U.S. voyage.

nut mare has posted several noteworthy efforts in the interim. Fifth in last year's 13-horse Princess Rooney, she ran second by a halflength in the inaugural Breeders' Cup F/M Sprint Oct. 26--with **Dream Rush** (Wild Rush) fifth--and closed out 2007 with a rallying third to Benny the Bull in the GI DeFrancis Memorial Dash Nov. 24

at Laurel. She has faced the starter just once this year, finishing fourth in the GI Humana Distaff S. May 3 at Churchill, and should get a fast pace here to suit her closing style. "Obviously it's frustrating to us, her human connections, to have gone this long without winning a race with Miraculous Miss," trainer and co-owner Steve Klesaris told *Daily Racing Form*. "But to me it's more frustrating for the filly herself, since she's accomplished so much over that period and yet doesn't have a win to show for all that she's done." Klesaris added, "She's done extremely well since the Humana, and I like the fact the field for the Princess Rooney will be small this year. Last summer there were 13 in this race, and it's tough to get through all that traffic."



#### BALLYDOYLE SIX IN OAKS BONANZA

Aidan O'Brien will saddle six fillies in Sunday's G1 Darley Irish Oaks at The Curragh, which has attracted the largest field since Lagunette (Fr) beat 17 rivals in 1976. Heading the team will be Susan Magnier, Michael Tabor and Derrick Smith's Moonstone (GB) (Dalakhani {Ire}), who bids to emulate the stable's 2007 winner Peeping Fawn in going one better than her second in the G1 Epsom Oaks. Beaten 3 3/4 lengths by Look Here (GB) in that June 6 Classic, she is the choice of Johnny Murtagh as he seeks a fifth renewal, following the exploits of Ebadiyla (Ire) in 1997, Winona (Ire) a year later, Petrushka (Ire) in 2000 and the aforementioned Peeping Fawn 12 months ago. The first two of those successes came for the John Oxx stable, which is represented this time by His Highness the Aga Khan's Katiyra (Ire) (Peintre Celebre). Third at Epsom, the homebred will need to find improvement to bridge the gap with the likely favorite, but connections are hopeful there is more to come. "We're looking forward to seeing her run again, and she had a nice, easy time of things after her run at Epsom," her owner/breeder's Racing Manager Pat Downes told PA Sport. "One of our concerns going to Epsom was her lack of experience, as she'd only had two runs under her belt at that point, and I suppose horses either enjoy Epsom or they don't. On the day, we don't feel that she enjoyed it and I think she should be better suited to The Curragh." Among the British-trained contingent is the Listed Lord Weinstock Memorial S. scorer Rosa Grace (GB) (Lomitas {GB}), from the Rae Guest barn renowned for the past star My Emma (GB). "This filly gave me a really good feel when she won at Newbury last time," jockey Chris Catlin told PA Sport. "She won her race as soon as she got some daylight, but I thought better ground would suit her. Hopefully they won't get too much more rain in Ireland, and it is a big step up in class, but she's in good form and she's very tough."



FIGURES DOWN AT TATTS Tattersalls' July Sale finished in Newmarket yesterday with figures notably down from 2007. The 7,500,000gns turnover dropped by 31 percent, the 14,823gns average fell by 20 percent and the 7,900gns median dipped by 28 percent. There was a healthy crowd at Park Paddocks all week, and it was likely that a lack of class lots in the mixed catalogue, in addition to economic circumstances, was responsible for the downturn. "The figures are down on last year's July Sale, which is no surprise in the present economic climate, but there have been a number of positives to take out of this week's trade," said Tattersalls Chairman Edmond Mahony. "The catalogue probably lacked a few stars amongst the horses in training compared with recent years, but the turnover of well in excess of 7,000,000gns and the average of around 15,000gns are the third highest for this fixture, behind only the July Sales of 2006 and 2007. The demand from overseas buyers has been the outstanding feature of the past four days, and the clearance rate of more than 80 percent has yet again demonstrated the enduring appeal of the July Sale."

Four-year-old **Shela House (GB)** (Selkirk--Villa Carlotta {GB}, by Rainbow Quest), offered from James Fanshawe's stable, topped Friday's trade. Catalogued as lot 845, the gelding was bought for 87,000gns by John Butler, representing agent Gerry Hogan, and will now be aimed at Ireland's Galway Festival. "He's been bought for an existing owner with trainer Jim Culloty and we're hoping a change of scenery might make a difference to him," Butler said. "All roads lead to Galway, and he'll be aimed at the McDonogh H. over a mile, although I know we are racing against time to get there."

What ownership and medical history should be available for horses entered at public auction, and should corrective limb procedures be included in that history?

### Craig Bandoroff, Denali Stud

Denali Stud, since its inception, has always had complete medical records available on the horses we sell. I

think anything a buyer wants to know, you should be prepared to tell them. I don't know that it's our job to volunteer everything, but I think it is our job to be honest and give them an honest answer to any question. There is no reason to hide anything, because if they want to find out, they'll find out anyway. You have your rules for what needs to be in



the repository and you have that in the repository, and the rest they should be free to ask and expect to receive an honest answer. And, by the way, they ask very little. It's all so overblown, because people don't want to know. I can tell you on one hand how many times people have asked me, 'Did a horse have a screw and wire?' They don't care. They want to see a nice horse. Cont. p14

I remember when MRLS came along and one of the things that they said was that it would effect their heart. So we went and had all of our hearts cardiogrammed and not one person asked, 'Did you check his heart. Is his heart ok?' It's all overblown. If they want to know, you should have the information and tell them whatever they want to know, but not too many of them ask too many questions.

I don't think the ownership should be made public. I don't see what difference it makes who owns the horse. If they ask, I think you should tell them. But I don't think it should be made public. If Sheikh Mohammed owns the horse and he's selling it, he's probably sold a few that he wished he hadn't. And if John Magnier owns the horse and he's selling it, he's sold a few he wished he hadn't. What's important is that they have the opportunity to know what the horse's medical history is and ask honest questions and get honest answers, and to be able to evaluate the horse in the way they want to evaluate the horse.

#### Satish Sanan, Padua Stables



The answer is yes and yes! I have been advocating for full transparency and complete disclosure in our business. I started AIR (Alliance for Industry Reform) and have been fighting for "full ownership and veterinary disclosure," including corrective limb surgeries for a long time.

### Reilly McDonald, Eaton Sales

Sellers should not be required to disclose the ownership of horses sold at public auction. Of course, some Thoroughbred owners elect to disclose their ownership



on the catalogue page, but there are numerous reasons many wish to remain anonymous, ranging from financial to very personal. In nearly all other variety of auctions in this country, ownership disclosure is not a requirement. If a buyer feels it is important to know the identity of the selling owner who is represented by an agent (and it's not too difficult to find out with minimal research), they need only ask the agent

as a part of their due diligence. The agent responds with a truthful disclosure of ownership or states that the selling owner wishes to remain anonymous. The buyer is then free to pursue purchasing the horse or not. The system works. Of course, veterinary conditions and medical procedures cited in the conditions of a sale should be reported as required in the repository or from the auction stand. I also support requiring auction sellers, where they have knowledge, to disclose any conditions or procedures in a horse's history that could have a material effect on the job the horse is being sold to do (ie: racing, breeding, etc.). This would include corrective limb surgery, past debilitating sickness and even the medications a horse is administered on the sales grounds. Eaton Sales makes all this information available to buyers at the sales grounds. The surprising thing is how few people ask for it!

### Dan Metzger, President, TOBA

Ownership history was an issue that was discussed and debated at great length by the Sales Integrity Task

Force. In the end, we believe that while ownership disclosure may be important to some buyers, the sellers' right to privacy must be respected. Ownership in and of itself will not prevent undisclosed dual agency, which is not only improper, but illegal as well. An ownership registry is being established by each of



the sales companies and like the veterinary repository, it will be voluntary, but market-driven.

The current list of medical conditions and procedures that must be disclosed is sufficient, but as an industry, we must continue to monitor trends in the marketplace that may be added in the future. We do strongly recommend that sellers disclose known and material medical information regarding sales horses through the veterinary repositories at the public auctions. Corrective limb procedures should be included in the mandatory list of procedures, but the industry must first ensure that we have a proper mechanism to guarantee the accuracy of the information. Microchips are a potential solution. If a potential buyer determines that corrective surgeries are an important factor, they should ask the consignor, who is legally obligated to tell the truth.



### Purses up Handle down for NTRA Second Quarter:

The National Thoroughbred Racing Association and Equibase Company LLC released yesterday the "Thoroughbred Racing Economic Indicators" for United States and Canadian pari-mutuel wagering on U.S for the second quarter of 2008. During the time period, pari-mutuel handle decreased 4.15 percent from \$4,003,960,415 in 2007 to \$3,837,687,728 in 2008. Total purses increased by 3.60 percent to \$317,235,241 during the same period, while race days were down slightly. For the six months ending June 30, wagering is down 3.66 percent compared to 2007 levels, with purses up 1.44 percent and race days off by 0.66 percent. "Our industry is in the midst of a challenging period with discretionary entertainment dollars tighter than they have been for several years," said Alex Waldrop, president and CEO of the NTRA. "Still, we are pleased that purse levels are more than holding their own, and we look forward to a summer season that features some highly anticipated meetings such as Saratoga and Del Mar."





HENDRA VIRUS LIKELY CONTAINED Australian racing and breeding authorities are confident that the Hendra Virus outbreak at a Brisbane veterinary clinic has been contained and that there is no likelihood of a lockdown or quarantine restrictions that would disrupt racing and the upcoming breeding season. Queensland Thoroughbred Breeders Association President Bob Frappell said he did not anticipate disruption to the racing and breeding seasons. "Hopefully it's going to mean nothing," he said. "The authorities are quite experienced with Hendra Virus now--they know what causes it, they know it's a very stable virus, they know how to contain it. Hopefully that vet practice where it's been found will be quarantined and there'll be no greater ramifications--that's what I'm hoping anyway."

### Vastly Different Than EI...

Biosecurity Queensland Chief Veterinary Officer Ron Glanville said Hendra Virus was quite different from Equine Influenza. "There is no relationship between the two," he said. "I want to reassure Queensland horse owners and horse industries that we are not facing a lockdown situation or movement restrictions. There is a quarantine, but it is only at the veterinary clinic where the sick horses were located." Dr. Glanville said Biosecurity Queensland was alerted by a private veterinarian about the sick horses on Monday. The symptoms were not consistent with signs previously seen in Hendra Virus cases and the decision to quarantine the property was initially a precautionary measure because of the severity of the illness in the affected horses, rather than suspicion of Hendra Virus. However, as part of its routine procedures, Biosecurity Queensland tested for a range of diseases including Hendra Virus, which was confirmed as the cause yesterday. This is the ninth case of Hendra Virus in Queensland since 1994. Cont. p7



Dr. Glanville says neighbors have also been notified, but the risk to humans was minimal. Redlands Veterinary Clinic co-owner David Lovelle said he was optimistic the Virus had been contained on his property. "Our only concern is the possibility a horse might be incubating the disease and might develop the disease in a day or so," Dr. Lovelle said. He said a further 37 horses at the clinic had not shown any symptoms and 25 staff members had been tested by Queensland health officials as well.

Australian Racing Board Chief Executive Andrew Harding said authorities had learned much about the Virus during the 1994 outbreak that claimed the life of trainer Vic Rail and 21 horses. "We have identified that whereas it is a disease with very serious consequences, it is nothing like Equine Influenza, which is highly contagious," Harding said. "Hendra Virus does not spread quickly. All credit to the veterinary practice--they acted very responsibly, and this demonstrates the need for high vigilance and the fact it is the responsibility of everyone in the industry, not just chief veterinary officers."

**SUMMIT ON EI VACCINATIONS** The Australian Racing Board has arranged for an El Summit on a national basis to be held in Sydney on Sept. 25. Dr. Richard Newton, head of the Animal Health Trust at Newmarket in England, will speak at the Summit, along with Dr. David Powell of the Gluck Institute in Kentucky.

### The Debate Continues...

Australian Thoroughbred breeders are at loggerheads with veterinarians over whether horses should continue to be vaccinated against Equine Influenza. With national veterinary officials declaring that Australia is free of El, many in the equestrian community argue that vaccination should not be necessary and would be an extra financial burden on horse owners. But Thoroughbred industry leaders insist that vaccination is essential to prevent another outbreak such as that which disrupted the breeding and racing season last spring. Hunter Valley-based veterinarian Sandy Racklyeft of Satur Veterinary Clinic in Scone said in the wake of the massive push to eradicate El, authorities would be better prepared if another outbreak occurred. "If there is another outbreak, we will more readily diagnose and isolate it much better and quicker than previously, and providing vaccine is accessed rapidly we can start vaccinating instantly," he said. "Providing we are in a position to react quickly and effectively in the event of an outbreak, ongoing vaccination is superfluous and an unnecessary expense. The chance of another outbreak is greatly reduced--unless we become complacent."

The Australian Veterinary Association's Equine Veterinarians Australia President James Gilkerson said the mutations of the El Virus and the ease with which it passes from horse to horse would make the inoculation program ineffective. "Ongoing vaccination won't prevent another outbreak," Dr. Gilkerson said. "The horses who brought the disease with them last year were all vaccinated. Vaccinated horses can still get Equine Influenza and spread it to unvaccinated horses. Also, if there's another outbreak, there's no guarantee that the vaccination being used will work if there's a new strain of the virus." However, Hunter Thoroughbred Breeders' Association President and Darley Australia General Manager Oliver Tait said his organization believed vaccination was an essential "insurance policy" against a further outbreak. "It is very much our position that individual governing bodies [such as the Australian Racing Board] should be given a choice as to whether the horses under their jurisdiction undergo regular vaccination," he said. Australia would jeopardize its El-free status on an international stage if it opted for an ongoing vaccination regime. But Tait said the potential consequences of another disastrous outbreak of El outweighed its international El-free status. "If that is the case, so be it," he said.

### Foaling Season Will Peak Late Due to EI...

Last year's Equine Influenza pandemic will result in fewer foals born early this year, while an early peak is expected in 2010 as many barren mares are covered early this season. While October is usually the month in which the greatest number of foals are born, a peak is expected in November this year because many mares went into foal later than they would otherwise have. The annual foal crop will be reduced by about 10 percent. Hunter Thoroughbred Breeders' Association President and Darley Australia Managing Director Oliver Tait said he expected the overall impact of EI on the foaling season to be negligible. "Keep in mind that last year the breeding season was brought forward by a few days and a lot of mares were covered early," he said. "It was a tough breeding season in terms of the numbers covered in a short period and the fact that El affected fertility of both mares and some stallions, so mares were getting in foal later. But it will be manageable."
