RED 'ROCKS' THE MAN O' WAR

With most of the pre-race hype swirling around defending Horse of the Year and GI Breeders' Cup Classic hero **Curlin** (Smart Strike), it was another Breeders' Cup

champion, Red Rocks (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}), who led home a onetwo-three sweep of Breeders' Cup heroes in yesterday's GI Man o' War S. at Belmont Park. Comfortable to let the tightly bound pair of Mission Approved (With Approval) and Sudan (Ire) (Peintre Celebre) roll through a

crisp opening quarter in :22.69, Red Rocks held Curlin safe through a half in :47.62 and 1:11.92 for three quarters. Closing under his own steam on the turn, the handsome dark bay angled three wide at the quarter pole, surged to the front inside the furlong marker and drew clear to score by two lengths over Curlin, who was inching ever closer but failed to get the job done at the wire. Better Talk Now (Talkin Man), the 2004 BC Turf champ, rallied late to be third. "That was a dream trip for my horse," said winning rider Javier Castellano. "I sat behind the speed, made my move and then waited for the late kick of Curlin. I didn't see Curlin for a while, but because I had such a great trip, I thought I would be able to hold on." cont. p2

her connections with her first career Grade I victory in Saturday's GI Princess Rooney H. at Calder. With two-time Grade I winner **Dream Rush** (Wild Rush) in her sights through an opening quarter in :21.78, the bay poked her head in front of that rival after a half in :44.93 and hit another gear in the stretch, rolling home an eye-catching 5 3/4 lengths over clos-

ing Miraculous Miss (Mr. Greeley), who just edged Dream Rush for the place spot. cont. p3





Rocking and Rolling at Belmont...

Red Rocks (Ire) went off at 10-1 in the GI Breeders' Cup Turf two years ago, but left a solid 11-horse field in his dust, including 2004 Turf champion Better Talk Now. Ninth in his 2007 reappearance in the G1 Dubai Sheema Classic, the Irish-bred proved best in the 10furlong G3 Gordon Richards S. at Sandown in April. Fourth in consecutive starts the G1 Prince of Wales's S. and G1 Irish Champion S. last fall, the five-year-old was a respectable third in a soggy edition of the Breeders' Cup Turf held at Monmouth Park Oct. 27. Shipped across the ocean for his seasonal finale in the G1 Hong Kong Vase Dec. 9, Red Rocks failed to land a blow and had to settle for ninth. Given a break in class for his 2008 debut, he responded by scoring against allowance foes at Lingfield May 10, but failed to factor in his latest and came home sixth in Epsom's G1 Coronation Cup June 6. "I met Javier [Castellano] in the paddock this morning and the pace up front was as he said it was going to be," said winning trainer Brian Meehan. "Once he got into the straight and got straightened up and balanced, I knew he was going to be hard to pass." Video, sponsored by Taylor Made. Curlin Comes Close But No Cigar...

While Curlin ran respectably to be second, beaten only two lengths in his turf bow, the chestnut's connections appeared unsure of what to make of the result. "We just didn't see that late kick from him today," said the colt's 80-percent owner, Jess Jackson. "I don't know if that was because he is still getting used to the turf or what. These are some of the things I will have to talk to [trainer] Steve [Asmussen] about. My feeling right now is that he needs another turf test. We know what he can do on dirt, and that is always an option." While Curlin's immediate future is still unknown, Jackson was undeterred by the colt's first loss in six starts. "I'm disappointed, but this is not a setback," said Jackson. "And the horse that beat him is a very good horse, and I congratulate them on a great race." Jockey Robby Albarado was pragmatic about his mount's first turf attempt. "Obviously, he didn't grab me like he normally does," he said. "It wasn't an awful race. He was up against it with a couple of Breeders' Cup winners. His acceleration was a little different. He felt great, physically. He wasn't stressed or tired when I pulled him up. It's up to [his connections], but I would like to see him get another chance, another shot on turf. It's like a first race for him, a new chapter. He's got tons of talent and maybe that's what got him second today."

Runner up in the GIII Pocahontas S. at Churchill in October of 2006, Mistical Plan showed her best when beating Tiz Elemental in the six-furlong Sunshine Millions Oaks against Cal-breds at Santa Anita in January 2007. Victorious when stretched out to 1 1/16 miles for the GII Fair Grounds Oaks last March, the bay failed to hit the board in her final two starts of 2007; the GI Ashland S. at Keeneland and Churchill's GI Kentucky Oaks. A respectable fourth in her 2008 debut in Hollywood's Apr. 27 B Thoughtful S., the four-year-old failed to land a blow when sixth on the grass in the restricted Long Beach S. at the Inglewood oval May 14. Armed with plenty of speed in the early going of her latest in the 8 1/2-panel GI Ogden Phipps H. June 14, Mistical Plan couldn't handle the oncoming rush of last year's champion older mare Ginger Punch, and had to settle for third, beaten 8 3/4 lengths. 

Golden Spikes, second behind Recapturetheglory in the Apr. 5 GII Illinois Derby and fourth in the May 10 GII Peter Pan S., was a last-out winner of the Unbridled S. at this track and trip June 14. A winner of three of four Calder starts coming into this effort, the bay, from the family of GISWs Forestry and Cash Run, rated within striking distance early, as Gentleman James set fractions of :22.86, :46.28 and :58.48. Golden Spikes waited for racing room turning for home and was fanned wide for the drive, but closed determinedly to overtake the longtime leader late and earn his first graded-stakes win. "They didn't go as fast as I would have liked to see them go up front, but I could see that they were moving too soon on the backside, so I just sat behind them and waited," explained rider Elvis Trujillo. "With this horse the later you move the better he finishes." Co-owner Rob Murphy thinks that the turn back in distance has been key for Golden Spikes. "We kept him going two turns earlier this year and he ran good to finish second in the Illinois Derby, but after he finished fourth in the Peter Pan, we pretty much knew it was time to go back to sprinting," Murphy said. "We knew it would be difficult for him to turn back from nine furlongs to six, but he's come through. A logical spot to think about for him next would be the [Aug. 23 GI] King's Bishop [at Saratoga]. The six weeks timing seems just about right."

Tres Borrachos graduated third time out while going a sixteenth shorter over this track last November, but failed to fire and crossed the wire 12th in the GI Cash Call Futurity in December. Fourth in the California Derby at Golden Gate Jan. 27, the bay finished third in his next two starts on the main track in the Mar. 8 GIII El Camino Real Derby and the GII Arkansas Derby Apr. 12. Ninth when thrown in among the wolves--headed by Kentucky Derby winner Big Brown--in the GI Preakness S. May 17, the gelding was a much-improved second while returning to the Cushion Track for the GIII Affirmed H. here June 18. Sent off the longest shot in this short four-horse field, the bay kept Two Step Salsa in his sights through an opening quarter in :23.47, while Colonel John moved up to challenge for the lead after a half mile in :47.08. With just over a length separating the threesome as they entered the home stretch, Colonel John appeared to have the race won from the outside, but it was Tres Borrachos who packed the strongest punch in the stretch, besting a game Two Step Salsa by 1 1/4 lengths. Colonel John was a head further back in third. "This is just a special horse," said winning rider Tyler Baze. "He gave me my first Preakness ride. [This time] I had a perfect trip. [Trainer] Beau [Greely] and I thought that Two Step Salsa was the horse to beat. We didn't know if we could, but he proved he was the best horse today. Proud Spell kicked off her career with three straight victories, including the seven-furlong GII Matron S. last September. A good second behind eventual juvenile champion filly Indian Blessing in the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies in October, the bay filled the same spot behind that rival when returning to action in this season's GIII Silverbulletday S. at the Fair Grounds Feb. 9. Getting the best of her nemesis in the GII Fair Grounds Oaks Mar. 8, Proud Spell failed to handle the Polytrack at Keeneland and had to settle for third in the GI Ashland S. Apr. 5. Relishing the off going in the ninefurlong GI Kentucky Oaks May 2, the filly stole the show with an impressive five-length score over the talented Little Belle, with subsequent Grade I winner Pure Clan further back in third. The well-supported 1-2 choice in her most recent start in Belmont's GI Mother Goose S. June 28, Proud Spell endured a troubled trip before crossing the wire second behind Musical Note, but was later demoted to third for interference. Backed down to 1-5 favoritism in this quick turn around, the homebred broke well and tracked pedestrian early splits of:24.21,:48.53 and 1:11.95. Asked for more turning

Tizdejavu overwhelmed this field to remain perfect in three tries over the turf and stamped himself the one to

beat in the GI Secretariat S, three weeks down the line. Never worse than third in his career, the homebred rounded out the triple in a Polytrack allowance at Keeneland Apr. 12, then made a successful transition ignorant to what is to the green stuff, leading throughout to win the GIII Crown Royal American Turf H. over rain-soaked going at Churchill on the global industry that the Oaks undercard. He proved he could handle quicker ground in his latest, whipping the field by four lengths in the GII Jefferson advantage, no matter Cup June 14. Favored for just the second time, Tizdejavu set an easy pace of :51.93 for the half and 1:16.83 for three quarters, repulsed a bid from Sr. Henry on the turn and was not threatened for the balance. 

PLEASE DON'T HIT ME AGAIN!

Are you uncomfortable with turmoil and controversy? I say, bring it on! Embrace it. Work with it. Use it. Winds of conflict also carry with them the seeds of change, and the possibility that an eventual resolution of conflict might actually produce a better circumstance.

The swirling tempest around us has blown a huge gift our way: We have become self-conscious. A large mirror has been held up and we see that, in fact, the enemy is ourselves. And, in the midst of our embarrassment, we have new energy and new urgency to look at how we have soiled our terrain, and to realize that we can only clean things up if we work together. *cont. p11*



Certainly, we have more than a few projects to work on. Yet, no matter what we choose to tackle, we will do little more than tread water if we leave our fans out of the equation (as the Congressional Committee did recently). At a time when we are desperate to attract new fans and keep the ones we have, we should pay close attention to what our fans and the public see, and the three things that they clearly want: (1) Drug-free racing; (2) safer and more uniform track surfaces; and (3) no whipping.

With regard to the latter, I notice that The Jockey Club came out with a recommendation to modify the whip (in consultation with the Jockey's Guild), prohibit striking the horse with the arm raised above shoulder height, and to initiate inspection of damage after each race. I'm afraid that The Jockey Club members, from years of watching an established and in-grained practice, have become anesthetized to the violence of the stick and the image it projects. For sure, I think they failed to consult our fans and would-be fans.

The public does not want kinder, gentler whipping. They want to see an end to the whipping of these magnificent creatures who are made to run for our pleasure.

No question, jockey safety is paramount, and jockeys need to carry some form of whip to maintain control, and for assistance in dangerous situations. And the ability to "show the whip" or even brush the shoulder can be a significant, yet benign and acceptable, motivator. Nonetheless, the practical arguments for abolishing whipping are overwhelming.

First of all, we need to stop turning off fans and potential fans with the ugly spectacle of whipping beautiful animals. We especially need young people to build our fan base, and half of the young girls in America have an instinctive, sometimes powerful infatuation with horses. Go ask your 10-year-old daughter to watch a race and ask her what she thinks of the whipping of horses down the stretch.

Secondly, we need to recognize that whipping often has the counter-productive effect of actually interfering with performance. How many times have you watched a rider reach back to whip and get out of sync or lose momentum? How often have you seen a horse sulk, shy, veer, or duck in or out because of whipping? How many times have you seen a horse whipped when it is totally spent and backing up, or even when it is drawing away by five?

If we go hands and heels and use a modified whip for safety only, we'll find out which jockeys have the most talent and horsemanship (meaning the best hands, communication, timing, and athleticism), and which racehorses are the most genuine. We will always have a winner, and the best horses and jockeys will still find a way to win.



"Moonstone came out of the race very well and her work has been good," added Murtagh. "She will stay the distance well and won't mind the conditions." Dermot Weld collected the 1981 renewal with Blue Wind (Ire) and followed up with Dance Design (Ire) in 1996 and has a formidable duo in response to the Coolmore battalions. While Lady O'Reilly's Chinese White (Ire) (Dalakhani {Ire}) has yet to prove she can mix it in the big league despite the obvious promise of her success in Gowran Park's Listed Victor Mccalmont Memorial S. Mad About You (Ire) (Indian Ridge {Ire}) continues to prove her worth at the highest level. Third in both the G1 Moyglare Stud S. at this venue in September and Longchamp's G1 Prix Marcel Boussac the following month, Moyglare Stud's homebred returned to fill the same spot, before being promoted to second, in this track's May 25 G1 Irish 1000 Guineas. Only Promising Lead (GB) got in her way when she came back here for the G1 Pretty Polly S. last time June 28 and her trainer is hoping she can gain reward for her consistency. With Jim Bolger's recent exploits in mind, it is hard to believe that the master of Coolcullen has only a pair of Irish Oaks to his resume. Give Thanks (Ire) provided the first in 1983 and it was 19 years later that Margarula (Ire) caused a 33-1 upset at the expense of Quarter Moon (Ire).

Bar Henrythenavigator, virtually all of Europe's current three-year-old miling elite are here in a fascinating renewal. Heading the domestic Classic representation is Falco, who bids to become the first to complete the G1 Poule d'Essai des Poulains-Prix Jean Prat double since Melyno (Ire) in 1982. His three-length defeat of Rio de la Plata in that May 11 Longchamp Classic was a marked improvement on his previous form and he looked exposed when only sixth in Royal Ascot's G1 St. James's Palace S. last time. Trainer Carlos Laffon-Parias believes he is better than he showed in that June 17 contest and told PA Sport, "I think we made too much use of him at Ascot. We made the pace for the others and the winner broke the track record. He's been working okay and I am very hopeful." Raven's Pass and Cat Junior head a strong British-trained challenge and had Falco behind when second and fourth respectively in the St James's Palace. The former, whose trainer John Gosden took this with Torrential in 1995, was the only rival to give Henrythenavigator a race and he was delivering on the immense promise he showed at two when powering away with the G3 Solario S. at Sandown in September. Cat Junior is having only his fourth start and trainer Brian Meehan is hopeful he can progress again. "This is the perfect spot for him and he is in tiptop form," he said. Godolphin annexed the 1998 edition courtesy of Almutawakel (GB) and put forward Rio de la Plata, who was a creditable latest seventh in the June 7 G1 Epsom Derby. Racing Manager Simon Crisford is expecting a bold show dropped back to a more suitable trip. "I think he'll run a good race and be there or thereabouts, but it's a very hot race," he commented. "He ran very well over a trip that was too far last time and in the French Guineas he ran well from a bad draw, so although he's got to step up a level we are all pleased with him." Another cross-Channel raider carrying weight is the unbeaten Winker Watson, who is making his first appearance since beating River Proud under a penalty in Newmarket's G2 July S. 12 months ago. "He worked superb at Newmarket this week and I was delighted with it," trainer Peter Chapple-Hyam said. "He had a shadow over his knee last year, so I stopped with him and then he had two fractures when I was trying to get him ready for the Guineas. I think he'll run well, but it's a hot race and he's going to be a bit ring-rusty."

Santa Teresita broke her maiden in her fourth try, an off-the-turf test at Hollywood last December, then took a break. She returned to take a Santa Anita allowance in her turf debut Mar. 16, then switched back to the allweather and made it three straight in the Apr. 12 Santa Lucia S. The bay has faced tough company in her last two starts and has not been disgraced, finishing 3/4 of a length behind Tough Tiz's Sis as the runner-up in the May 4 GIII Hawthorne H. and 2 1/2 lengths adrift of undefeated Zenyatta when second in the May 31 GI Milady H. She stretches out to 10 panels off those 1 1/16-mile events. Hystericalady also tries the Delaware H. trip for the first time. The chestnut mare, winner of the GI Humana Distaff S. going seven furlongs and the GII Molly Pitcher BC H. at 1 1/16 miles last season, capped off the campaign with a game second to champion Ginger Punch in the GI Breeders' Cup Distaff. Fourth in the Feb. 2 GI Santa Monica H., she followed up with a decisive score in the two-turn GIII Azeri S. at Oaklawn Mar. 9, then missed by a head when third in this year's edition of the Humana Distaff May 3. The 1-2 chalk in the nine-furlong GII Fleur de Lis H. at Churchill June 14, she grabbed the lead early and drew clear late to win by 7 1/2 lengths. Unbridled Belle romped to a 7 3/4-length win in this race last year. Second in the GI Personal Ensign S. at Saratoga in August, the dark bay had a troubled trip in the Sept. 30 GI Beldame S., but shrugged it off to win by a head. The Team Valor colorbearer was fifth in the Breeders' Cup Distaff before taking an extended vacation. She has been out just once since, galloping home 5 3/4 lengths to the good in the June 14 GIII Obeah S. at this track.

The five-year-old gelding was dropped in for a \$50,000 tag in his 2008 debut, prevailing by a head but moving from the barn of trainer Lisa Lewis to that of Mike Mitchell. Runner-up in the Feb. 23 GII San Luis Obispo H. and Mar. 29 GIII Tokyo City H., where he was beaten just a nose, the bay comes into this race off a head-bobbing score in the May 26 GIII Dallas Turf Cup H. 

THE ONLY JULY SHOW IN TOWN

Gone are the days of the boutique Keeneland July sale, leaving Fasig-Tipton very much the one and only place to be when the company kicks off the yearling sales season with its annual Kentucky July sale at the Newtown Paddocks. For years a sale which emphasizes athleticism and "the physical" over splashy pedigrees, it boasts remarkable success, as evidenced by a single glance at the cover of this year's catalogue. Already in 2008, the July sale has been represented by the likes of GISW Ever a Friend as well as other graded winners Recapturetheglory, Commentator, Surf Cat and Z Fortune, to name just a few. Given that the auction is dominated by freshman and sophomore sires as part of the extremely popular "New Sire Showcase," sales officials are quick to admit they're doing at least something right. "There are two things that are in play," explained Boyd Browning Jr. "Clearly our industry has a fascination with young stallions. That's what led to the advent of the New Sire Showcase and that's been a very popular concept. I also think that we have done a very good job of selecting precocious, athletic-type horses. I think you can ask nine of 10 people in the industry what a Fasig July horse looks like and they'll tell you that it's athletic, precocious and well-balanced. It might have a conformational flaw here or there, but they have a certain look about them. They're going to look like theyr'e going to be a runner. I think we've done that well."

Strong Sale Expected Despite Economic Turbulence...

The Dow Jones Industrial Average was at a level of 13,950.08 at the close of business July 16, 2007, while the tech-heavy Nasdaq settled that afternoon at 2697.33. In the summer of 2007, light sweet crude was somewhere about \$70 a barrel. That was then. This is now. At the close of business on Wall Street Friday afternoon, the DJIA was at 11,100.54, a loss of 20.4 percent over the last 12 months. The Friday close on the Nasdag was 2239.08, representing a 17-percent loss on that index. Oil traded at a record level in excess of \$147 a barrel before retreating a bit, ending the day on \$145.66. But in spite of all of that apparent bad news, Browning does not see any substantial correlation between fluctuations on the stock market and the peformance of the yearling market. "Absolutely not," he said. "Nor was there a run-up as a result of the Dow being at 14,000. There might be some similarities or parallels in those markets, but there's also some dissimilarities. I have never been able to chart a direct causeand-effect relationship between one set of economic conditions and the overall heatlh of the industry. It's a dynamic market." He added, "So much of it is psychological. I can't control where the Dow is positively or negatively. We can just try to market our horses the best we can, attract as many buyers as we can and try to get people excited about our game." Overall, Browning would be pleased by 'steady as she goes.' "We're hoping for a good solid sale. I think we have a fairly good group of horses on the grounds. We received a good reaction to the catalogue. We hope for stability in the marketplace." He continued, "I think it will be fairly solid. I don't think there will be any dramatic shifts, positive or negative, from last year to this year. I think there's still a demand for quality horses and hopefully we've got a group of horses that the buyers find to be high quality. Overall, the sales were pretty solid this spring. They weren't spectacular, but they were solid and that's how I expect it will be this summer."

Fasig-Tipton Kentucky July Preview cont. Building the Catalogue a Fickle Process...

Putting together the catalogue and deciding just how voluminous that collection of horses is going to be from year to year is a daunting task for sales officials. The challenge is to offer enough horses to satisfy demand while not inundating the market with horses that are underqualified. On the heels of a tremendously successful 2004 July sale, which saw the average increase by 22.8 percent and the median by 19.4 percent, the size of the catalogue was increased by 36 percent. That proved toxic, as the average for the 2005 renewal dipped by 11.2 percent, though it did manage to finish in six-figure territory. The 2006 auction featured a catalogue similar in size to 2004 and the sale rebounded statistically, with the average shooting back up by 15 percent and the median by 12 percent. With another positive result in hand, 22 percent more horses were on offer in 2007, and the average suffered, dropping by 11.2 percent. It's a work in progress, Browning says, to strike a balance. "We've tried to eliminate the 'yo-yo' effect of the July number," he explained. "We'd like to get into a reasonable number and then build on it, quite frankly. I don't think you ever want to be content with where you are." He presents a possible theory. "I think it's probably a combination of the stronger sale you have, the more interest that you have, you might be a little bit more enthusiastic or aggressive in your recruiting and not intentionally, but subconsciously, you might lower your standards a little bit and take a few additional horses. Pretty soon two or three become 50 or 60 that don't belong and they detract from the overall sale. We are very comfortable at this number, though."

The Cat's Meow...

Owner Ken Ramsey stands just two sires at his Nicholasville, Kentucky, nursery, each with names appealing to the feline set. Ramsey claimed Catienus (Storm Cat) for \$60,000 back in 1999 and went on to earn back over \$320,000 before retiring him to stud. He



has since become a solid sire and has been represented by the likes of Precious Kitten, winner of last year's GI John C. Mabee H. and this year's GI Gamely S. She is also a member of one of the upand-coming families in the stud book. A five-year-old daughter of Kitten's First (Lear Fan), Precious

Kitten's Joy ramseyfarm.com Kitten is a half-sister to Kitten's Joy (El Prado {Ire}), who is represented by his first crop

of foals in 2008 and has four catalogued at Fasig-Tipton.

"He's definitely stamping them, you can see that out in the field," commented Mark Partridge, farm manager at Ramsey Farm. "They're scopey, long legs and most of them are chestnuts with a lot of white on him, just like he was."

One such offering is hip 144, a filly by the champion turf horse and the first foal produced by Wendy's Dream (Crafty Prospector). Ramsey reached in and claimed the mare for \$25,000 out of a 9 3/4-length victory at Aqueduct in March 15, 2006. Some 363 days later, she was a mom.

"We claim everything with a specific goal in mind, to breed to one of our two stallions," Partridge explained. "She was claimed and she was put on the next van back to Kentucky to be bred."

It's a practice used not infrequently by the Ramseys. "Every day we look in the Racing Form [for possible horses to claim]," he stated. Cont. p3

A Grade II winner at a mile, Kitten's Joy excelled at distances of 10 furlongs and beyond, winning the GI Secretariat S. and the GIII Virginia Derby at that distance while taking the 1 1/2-mile GI Joe Hirsch Turf Invitational S. and placing second in the GI Breeders' Cup Turf. Partridge explained the rationale of this particular mating.

"We were trying to breed a little bit of speed to him," he offered. "This mare was a bit of a sprinter herself. This horse is more of a six or seven-furlong type instead of a mile-and-a-quarter horse, so we were aiming for something right in between."

Partridge is quietly confident that this filly will appeal to buyers. "She's done everything right," he said. "She put on weight and she's very correct. She's a goodbodied filly with a nice big hip and she's done nicely." Partridge is also optimistic that Kitten's Joy, who is a half-brother to the dam of champion Dreaming of Anna and Lewis Michael, will be accepted by the breeding community at large.

"He's still a turf horse at the end of the day, but because he was such a great racehorse, I think they'll be looking at the Kitten's Joys," he commented. "I think they'll be interested in this filly, because she's not a three-year-old, scopey turf kind of filly. She looks like she can run on anything and it looks like she'll be pretty precocious."

Enjoying The View From Bella Vista Farm...

Chuck and Tracy Peery were both born and raised on the West Coast, but last year, they decided it was time

for a change. The Peerys packed their bags and headed to their new home in Kentucky, Bella Vista Farm near Versailles.

"My wife and I both turned 50; our daughter Brandy is 27 and out of school, and she has a good job," Chuck Peery explained. "We both grew up on farms, and we decided, if we were ever going to do anything crazy, we should do it at 50, not 60. We came to Kentucky last fall."

After 25 years of training horses in California, Chuck

Peery also took his career in a new direction. He purchased a dozen weanlings for his clients in November, with the intention of sending the majority back through the ring as yearlings. The first of his yearling pinhooks goes through the ring as hip 202 at Fasig-Tipton July Monday.

Hip 202, a filly by freshman sire The Cliff's Edge, was picked up for \$30,000 as a KEENOV weanling. It has proven an astute acquisition; her half-brother turned out to be Recapturetheglory (Cherokee Run), winner of this year's GII Illinois Derby.

"I picked her out for Jack Owens," Peery said. "She was a long tall leggy filly, and she covered a lot of ground. She has a nice stride and looks like she'll get a distance--she has the potential to be a good one.

"On her catalogue page, Recapturetheglory had only placed at two and earned \$3,500," he added. "We didn't know who he was. We just picked out the individual."

Peery did not restrict his buying to weanlings last fall. He was also shopping at Keeneland September, picking up a filly by Congaree for Owens for \$45,000. Now named Congo Kaye, she made her debut in last Sunday's Juan Gonzalez Memorial S. at Pleasanton and, despite blowing the break, got up to win it by 1 1/4 lengths.

"She was ready to run, but the maiden special weight race didn't go, so she ran in the stakes at Pleasanton instead," Peery remarked. "Things have gone pretty well for us so far."

A third-generation horseman, Peery started out at the old Longacres before heading to Northern California for an 11-year stint.

"We had a good run in Northern Californa--we were second behind [Jerry] Hollendorfer, which is about as good as you can do," Peery said with a laugh.

The Peerys spent another four years on the Southern California circuit, with Tracy serving as assistant trainer. One of the best horses to come through the barn was Shore Do, who ran third in last year's GI Norfolk S. and took Peery to the Breeders' Cup for the first time.

But the lifelong horseman little trouble leaving the track behind.

"We were based at Santa Anita, and it's pretty out there, but you are still living in L.A.," Peery said. "We have 22 acres now. It's a new home--it had never had a fence around it. We are developing the farm. It's truly a beautiful place to raise horses. It doesn't get better than this."

While the Peerys have made a lot of changes, something that has remained constant is their roster of clients. In addition to Owens, a long-time owner and member of the Thoroughbred Owners of California; Desert Sun Stable; Mike Connors and partners are Kevin and Terry Jacobsen and Jim Hawkins; and Michael Jawl, whose family campaigned GISW Bedside Promise.

"The investors are clients I've had for 15-20-25 years," Peery said. "I am so fortunate to have such great owners. They have supported us through the move here."

The Bella Vista focus is on pinhooking weanlings to yearlings, but the Peerys will not limit themselves to that side of the business.

"So far we have concentrated on the weanlings," Peery said. "I bought a group of a dozen horses last fall, and we have eight more to sell at Keeneland. We decide which will sell best at what sale, or which ones to maybe keep and race, because we do that, too. We provide service from one end to the other."

The pinhooking enterprise gets it's first test at Fasig-Tipton July, and the Peerys are hopeful that hip 202 will give them a strong start.

"I wasn't going to sell at Fasig-Tipton, but Recapturetheglory jumped up and ran big," Peery said. "We really like her--she's a really nice filly, a big filly. She is the most forward of the dozen we bought in November. I think she will show every well at Fasig-Tipton. We'll see how we do."

The Peerys also have a clear vision of what the future will hold.

"We are by no means trying to be a Taylor Made type outfit," Peery said. "We might grow a little bit, but not much. We go in with the idea of buying 12 to 15 every year. We want to keep the quantity down and the quality up. We are trying to pick out the good-looking individuals, and all the fillies have black type in their first dam. That we have some residual value--they'll have a second job after they are done racing, and that's important to us, because we want to take care of our horses as well as our clients."

Off To a "Fresh" Start...

As has become a tradition, the Fasig-Tipton July sale will open with the 322-hip "New Sires Showcase." A total of 37 first- and second-crop stallions will be featured. Among the sires whose first foals are juveniles this year, Smarty Jones (Elusive Quality) led the way at the yearling sales in 2007. The Three Chimeys stallion had 34 sell for an average of \$201,029 and a median of \$150,000. He has just two on offer at the July sale. Champion sprinter Speightstown (Gone West), a WinStar/Taylor Made stallion, was second on the list, with 53 lots averaging \$185,415 and realizing a median of \$150,000. Claiborne's Strong Hope (Grand Slam) also had a strong showing at the yearling sales last year, with 40 selling for an average of \$132,295 and a median of \$100,000. The only other stallion from the group to break the six-figure mark for average was Stonewall's Medaglia d'Oro (El Prado {Ire}), who averaged \$126,831. His median at the yearling sales was \$95,000. One stallion with first foals of 2007 was far in front of the field when it came to the weanling sales last year. Adena Springs's Ghostzapper (Awesome Again), who stood his first season for \$200,000, saw just three weanlings from his first crop go through the ring, but the resulting average was \$603,333 and the median was an eye-catching \$735,000.

Next on the list was Lane's End's Rock Hard Ten (Kris S.), who had nine weanlings sell for an average of \$166,777 and a median of \$170,000. The late Saint Liam (Saint Ballado), who will be represented by a single crop, had 10 sell for an average of \$148,050 and a median of \$110,000. Number four was Gainesway's Afleet Alex (Northern Afleet). With 21 weanlings finding new homes via the sales ring, he averaged \$113,809 and had a median of \$87,000. Rounding out the top five was champion turf horse Kitten's Joy (El Prado {Ire}). The Ramsey stallion had six sell for an average of \$94,666 and a median of \$112,500.

All in the Family...

Well known for their blockbusting consignments, Taylor Made seems to do everything in a big way. But it is not just in the sales ring that the operation boasts big numbers. The four Taylor boys--Ben Duncan, Frank and Mark--have 19 children between them. It comes as no surprise that the Taylor kids are following in the fathers' footsteps. Doing business as JLT Bloodstock, the younger set have been in the sales game since 2003, and this year bring their fourth consignment to FT July.

JLT is named for the family patriarch, the late Joseph Lannon Taylor. "Big Daddy Joe" came up with the idea, and he got the kids off on the right foot.

"He picked out our first horse for us, a horse called Praying for Cash, and he's now a graded-stakes winner," explained Katy Taylor, Frank's daughter and, at 22, the oldest of the brood. She has been in JLT from the beginning.

'It all started when I had just graduated from high school," she said. "'Big Daddy Joe' wanted us to get into the business of selling horses, and to do it all ourselves. He got us started, but we buy all the horses and prep them; we do all the work and consign them ourselves. It's hands-on, and we're investors ourselves, so we don't get paid unless our horses sell well. That's a big incentive for us to work really hard and make our horses look the best they can."

Horses and Taylors are a natural fit, but it wasn't until JLT was born that Katy knew what aspect of the horse business she wanted for her career.

"I've always loved horses, and I've always been really involved with them," she said. "I showed miniature horses when I was little and I've shown saddlebreds, but I didn't know in what facet I wanted to be involved. When this opportunity came along, I jumped right on it.

"Now, as soon as I graduate college, I'd like to pursue this full time."

Not all of the Taylor kids will end up making a living ringside, and that's just fine with the family.

"As far as my brothers and sisters and cousins go, some have always loved horses, some have grown to love horses," Katy remarked. "But all of them have gotten to spend some time learning about the sales, and everybody has the option to stay in JLT as much or as little as they'd like to."

Currently, 10 of the 19 first cousins are involved in JLT. Others are out of the fold, getting an education in something other than the Taylor Made way.

"As kids in the Taylor family, we have to work two years outside of the farm if we want to have the opportunity to work at Taylor Made," Katy said. "I've already done my two years, but last year my cousin Marshall was in Florida and he worked for Todd Pletcher, and my cousin Brook's in Australia this year; last year he was in France. We're kind of all over the map, but we seem to come back together for the sales."

JLT Bloodstock will bring five horses to Fasig-Tipton July this year, including two of the five most expensive to sell as weanlings. Hip 294, a filly by Taylor Made stallion Forest Danger, was a \$200,000 KEENOV weanling, and hip 555, a colt by Grand Slam, was acquired for \$120,000 at that sale. But Katy Taylor had a hard time picking out the highlight of the consignment.

"They're all really good," she insisted. "I think they're all superstars. They're all so different--different body types, different styles. I think we picked a variety of horses. We've got sprinters and horses that look like they'll go a longer distance. There will be a horse for everybody. But I really think that this is one of the best crops we've had."

Since their first Fasig-Tipton July consignment in 2004, JLT has sold 15 horses. In addition to Praying For Cash, who brought \$100,000 that first year, the Taylor kids have also scored with Samba Rooster, another son of Songandaprayer. Bought by JLT for \$45,000 as an OBSJAN yearling, he brought \$200,000 at Fasig-Tipton July. This year, the colt was second in the GII Coolmore Lexington S. and third in the GIII Lone Star Derby.

"We've been really fortunate," Katy Taylor said. "Of the dozen we have sold that are now three years old and older, all have started, and 11 of them have won. We have a pretty good record that way. We've sold a lot of good horses."

The Taylor children involved in JLT range in age from Josh, who is five, to Katy, who, as the eldest heads up the team. Every one of them contributes to the cause.

"Even the youngest kids can lead the horses," Katy offered. "I have a 10-year-old sister Gracie, and she



helps me bring in the fillies every day. Last year my brother Chris, who's nine, was out there showing one of the fillies at the sale. The horses are really used to kids; they're around them a lot. The kids are very eager; they want to be a part of it

and they want to learn.

"Everybody puts in their two cents on what we're going to be picking out at the sale," she continued. "Last year, I was walking around with a 10-year-old and an eight-year-old looking at horses. That's the only way it's going to work."

It is because of the demographic of the JLT crew that you won't see them selling at Keeneland September.

"All our horses sell at Fasig July," Katy said. "We do that because a lot of our little helpers are in school, and they want to be a part of everything. In September, it's hard for them--and for myself as well--to get out of school and be out there. It works out better at the summer sale. We have a lot more help and everybody gets to be involved."

The Taylor kids are independent, but they appreciate the fact that they have access to the knowledge gained by some of the most experi-

enced horsemen in the business.

"We have a great resource base for advice," Katy said. "We're definitely the first to ask if we have questions, but they invest and then they pretty much let us have the reins and do what we think--unless we're doing something really stupid. Our dads will give us some words of wisdom, but for the most part they stay pretty hands



off. They taught us well, and we follow their good example."

JLT also has investors outside the Taylor family.

"I would say the kids own maybe a quarter of the package combined, and then we have a lot of outside investors who help us," Katy explained.

"Clients of my dad's and friends of ours who have known us our whole lives, they saw this opportunity and wanted to be a part of it, especially after my grandfather passed. They wanted to help us out, since we lost our leader.

"We have the greatest investors," she added. "They let us make the decisions, and they stand behind us 100 percent--they're awesome. Most of them come back every year. They usually make money, so we keep trying to make them happy, and they stick with us."

Katy Taylor hopes to stick with it herself. She graduates from Midway College next spring.

"I would really like to continue with JLT," she said. "I hope to buy some land and start prepping horses for myself, maybe prep some horses for Taylor Made. I just don't want JLT ever to get so big that it's not ours, that we can't be hands on and the kids can't come and feel free to run and really be involved in it.

"When we were younger, Taylor Made was a lot smaller, and my cousins who are in the older set, maybe 16 and up, got to go to work with our dads. I feel that we got a wealth of knowledge doing that, but now that it's gotten larger, I think JLT is a better set for the kids that come in and want to be hands on. That's what it's all about to me. I never want it to get too big where the kids can't be come in and learn what they need to learn and be in the way."

Pair of Purges Feature at Hunter Valley...

The Hunter Valley agency of Adrian Regan and Fergus Galvin is still in its relative infancy, but they have managed to cut out a nice niche for themselves in their few years in the business. Their nine-horse consignment at Fasig-Tipton includes seven youngsters in the New Sire Showcase and features a pair of offerings by Purge (Pulpit), who capped his career with an impressive victory in the 2005 GI Hill 'n' Dale Cigar Mile H. at Aqueduct. The first of the sire's offspring to go under the hammer will be hip 12, a dark bay daughter of 1996 GII Black-Eyed Susan S. winner Mesabi Maiden (Cox's Ridge). Sent through the ring at last year's Keeneland November sale, she was hammered down for \$160,000, the top price for a Purge weanling in 2007. "She's a filly with a lot of quality and has a very smooth way of going," Galvin commented. "She has great balance to her, not to mention that she's out of a very good racemare." There is further pedigree appeal down the page, as the filly's third dam, Laughter, produced Private Terms and is a half-sister to the great Ruffian. Galvin has especially high hopes for the second of the two Purges, a colt out of Coffee Springs (Crafty Prospector). Hip 201 is a half to GSP Pine For Java and to Pride (Lion Heart), a \$475,000 OBSFEB juvenile purchase this year who won her maiden at first asking at Keeneland and was recently fourth in the Astoria S. "He's a very athletic colt and strong-bodied," Galvin explained, adding, "I've been very impressed by the two Purges. The one thing that stands out about them is their athleticism."


