





PRECIOUS STONE

Aidan O'Brien's monopoly on the Irish Classics continued apace yesterday as Moonstone (GB) (Dalakhani {Ire}) justified 2-1 favoritism with a last-gasp success under Johnny Murtagh in the G1 Darley Irish Oaks at The Curragh. In denying the 66-1 shot Ice Queen (Ire) (Danehill Dancer {Ire}) and Colm O'Donoghue in the final stride by a short head, Susan Magnier, Michael Tabor and Derrick Smith's G1 Epsom Oaks runner-up provided yet another stable one-two and added to the successes of Henrythenavigator in the Irish 2000 Guineas, Halfway to Heaven (Ire) in the Irish 1000 and Frozen Fire (Ger) in the Irish Derby at this venue. Gagnoa (Ire) (Sadler's Wells), who finished a further two lengths behind, completed a trifecta for her owners, whose list of achievements now include a third consecutive renewal of this Classic, a seventh consecutive Irish Classic and a fifth one-two in an Irish Classic since 1997. "It was a great race, with two fillies and two jockeys giving their all," O'Brien said. "It is a privilege for me to be involved with the people and the horses I work with." Cont. p2

WILL IT BE M.O.T.S. AT FASIG-TIPTON?


To be certain, there is a distinct air of uncertainty as the 2008 yearling sales season kicks off this morning with the Fasig-Tipton Kentucky Sale at the company's Newtown Paddocks. A total of 568 young colts and

fillies, just 14 fewer horses than last year, are catalogued for the two-day event, which gets underway today and tomorrow at 10 a.m. The sale has grown by leaps and bounds and, between 1999 and 2006, saw the sale-topping price exceed a half-million dollars, highlighted by a Forestry--Alizea's Song colt which realized a bid

of \$1.2 million two years ago. Significantly higher supply, along with a tepid two-year-old market in 2007, combined to suppress the results of last year's sale, and officials at Fasig-Tipton tightened the screws this time around. "We went to our consignors with the aim of containing the size of the catalogue in 2008," said Fasig-Tipton President Walt Robertson. "We were tougher in our inspections on yearlings which might not be ready physically for July and are happy with the numbers we will offer." As the sale gets underway, the indicators, economic and otherwise, don't necessarily point up, yet the predominant feeling is that the market will remain steady, i.e. more of the same. *Cont. p11*





Moonstone Captures Irish Oaks (cont. from p1)

Moonstone, who was one of the leading lights of the Britton House dispersal two years ago, entered this Classic one of Europe's top-rated maidens. Runner-up to the smart Winchester on debut at Leopardstown Apr. 20, her reputation preceded her appearance in the May 14 G3 Musidora S. at York and she looked in need of the experience there when staying on late to finish fourth. Sent off at 25-1 in the June 6 Epsom Classic, she outran those odds as the closest pursuer of the runaway winner Look Here (GB) and had swayed Murtagh to renew his partnership here from a strong cast of fillies at his disposal. Settled fourth among the five-strong Ballydoyle peloton which dictated matters early, the blaze-faced bay was asked to close as O'Donoghue committed Ice Queen at the quarter pole, and only had that rival's measure with a final bob of the head. "She ran a lovely race at Leopardstown first time and then ran smashing races in the Musidora and Epsom, and her work was very good up to today," O'Brien added. "She is progressing very well and Ice Queen is big strong filly with a lot of class. The second filly wouldn't mind going back to a mile and a quarter and [Moonstone] could stay at a mile and a half for the [Aug. 22] G1 Yorkshire Oaks--they are progressing well and, hopefully, they will keep going that way."

From Sales Ring to Winner's Enclosure...

Moonstone became the highest-priced yearling ever to sell at Tattersalls December when Coolmore representative Dr. Demi O'Bryne purchased the handsome filly for 700,000 guineas at the 2006 renewal of the sale. O'Bryne outbattled Irish bloodstock agent Brian Grassick to land Moonstone, who hails from a family which Coolmore has had success with in this very race. L'Ancresse, Moonstone's three-parts sister by Darshaan (GB), ran second at The Curragh in 2003, a few months before she completed the exacta under Islington (Ire) at 46-1 odds in the GI Breeders' Cup Filly & Mare Turf at Santa Anita. CURLIN EXITS MAN O' WAR IN FINE SHAPE

Curlin (Smart Strike) came out of his runner-up effort in Saturday's GI Man o' War S. in good order and shipped to Saratoga Sunday morning. "Physically, he came out of the race great," said trainer Steve Asmussen. As for plans to continue to aim the 2007 Horse of the Year at a tilt at the Oct. 5 G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe, Asmussen said, "There is no time frame--the evaluation will be continual. Our options are open."

FAWN NO NEARER TO RETURN Michael Tabor and Susan Magnier's Peeping Fawn (Danehill) will be absent for longer than expected, trainer Aidan O'Brien revealed yesterday. Not seen since capturing the fourth of her Group 1 successes in York's G1 Yorkshire Oaks in August, the four-year-old has met with a setback. "We took her away for a bit of work before the Pretty Polly and she came back a little bit stiff and is still not 100 percent, so we just have to bide our time," he said. "Obviously, because she is a very special filly we can't take any chances with her."

'YUZ DA MAN!

Sheikh Hamdan bin Rashid Al Maktoum's Tamavuz (GB) (Nayef) capped a memorable week for Freddy Head and Davy Bonilla by capturing the G1 Prix Jean Prat at Chantilly yesterday. The trainer-jockey partnership combined last Friday to garner the G1 July Cup at Newmarket. Bouncing back from a first defeat in the May 11 G1 Poule d'Essai des Poulains at Longchamp, 54-5 chance Tamayuz regained the winning thread by defeating Raven's Pass (Elusive Quality) by 1 1/2 lengths for a first top-level success. The official result was subject to a 25-minute stewards' enquiry, which attempted to dissect late interference among the placegetters. "He went into the Poule d'Essai des Poulains unbeaten, but everything went wrong there," admitted Head. "I was always confident in his ability and he has proved his class today." Breaking through in a newcomers' event at Longchamp last September, Tamayuz closed his juvenile season with victory in a conditions event over this course and distance the following month. He opened his sophomore campaign with a stirring victory in the Apr. 13 G3 Prix de Fontainebleau back at Longchamp, but was unable to overcome a parking-lot draw when losing his unbeaten record and finishing ninth in the May 11 G1 Poule d'Essai des Poulains back at the Bois de Boulogne track last time. Let go at double-figure odds for this attempt at redemption, the chesnut homebred was out swiftly to chase rabbit Poligold (Ire) (Poliglote {GB}) in second before slotting into third at halfway. He made a cute move off the home turn to seize the initiave along the rail in early stretch and kept plenty in reserve under a sympathetic drive in the closing stages to easily hold Raven's Pass' customary late charge. "Poligold ensured it was a truly run race and Tamayuz went to the front soon enough," said winning trainer Freddy Head. "His turn of foot was dazzling, he quickened brilliantly and had plenty left at the end. I shall discuss plans with the owner, but the logical target is the G1 Prix Jacques le Marois [at Deauville Aug. 17]."

Tales of the Vanquished...

John Gosden, trainer of runner-up Raven's Pass, was gracious in defeat and commented, "Raven's Pass ran an exceptional race, but he had to come from a long way back which is a difficult thing to do at Chantilly. It would have taken a jet engine to catch Tamayuz and I must congratulate the winner." Saeed bin Suroor praised third placegetter Rio de la Plata's effort saying, "He ran very well and finished strongly. He'll probably go for longer events now."

Delaware H.-GII results cont.

Hystericalady, who came up just a neck short of champion Ginger Punch in last year's GI Breeders' Cup Distaff, won the Mar. 9 GIII Azeri S. and was beaten a head when third in the May 3 GI Humana Distaff H. and was coming off a 7 1/2-length romp in the June 14 GII Fleur de Lis H. at Churchill. The speedy chestnut ran with pacesetting Lemon Drop Mom through tepid fractions of :24.12, :48.82 and 1:13.07. She moved to the lead after a mile and sprinted clear for an easy win. "Everything worked out perfect for the trip I was hoping to get," said winning rider Garrett Gomez. "This is a classy mare. She will do whatever you want her to do and it is a pleasure to be on her. My main concern was she kicked when I wanted her to kick, because the mile and a quarter was a question in some people's minds. Her last race, she went a mile and an eighth, and she was getting stronger as the race was going on. You never know until you go a mile and a quarter. So I started kicking her just like I was going a mile and an eighth just like last time and went ahead and went after the horse on the lead. I let her make the lead and when we turned for home, she hit another gear and lengthened her stride some more." 

Warning Zone, winner of the 2006 GIII Generous S. and the 2007 War Chant S. over this course, was third at this distance in the GII San Luis Rey H. at Santa Anita and ran second in the 1 3/4-mile GII San Juan Capistrano H. Apr. 20 before a fifth-place effort in the June 7 GI Charles Whittingham Memorial H. last time out. The bay colt settled into stride as Boule d'Or (Ire) (Croco Rouge {Ire}) bowled along on a loose lead through pedestrian splits. Warning Zone moved closer along the rail entering the straight, took a narrow lead with a furlong to run and inched clear to the wire. "The course had a little more give in it today and it really suited him well," said winning rider Mike Smith. "Of course the distance always helps. And I had a dream trip. I saw the [Boule d'Or] getting out a little bit so I knew when he had to ask him he was probably going to drift off. So I went for it and it worked out. He was sitting on a big race and he really looked the part, too. You can't go far enough for him. A mile and one-half, a mile and three-quarters, he loves it." The stakes win capped a memorable Hollywood meeting for leading trainer John Sadler. "At Santa Anita he was peaking at the longer distances, it was a very good second in the San Juan Capistrano," Sadler said of the winner. "The first race here [at Hollywood] was a mile-and-one-quarter, you hate to say it but it was actually a little short for this horse right now, his best form is at a mile-andone-half or farther. We wanted to get a race in him so we ran him at a mile-and-one-guarter, he was fifth beaten three and he was just a little even the last part because they closed a little faster. We'll find something for him, there's some long-distance races like the [Aug. 23 GII] Del Mar H." Bushranger beat the subsequent G2 Queen Mary S. sixth Nubar Lady (Ire) by a neck on debut in a fivefurlong Tipperary conditions event June 5 before finishing runner-up in the Listed Windsor Castle S. at Royal Ascot 12 days later. Drawn away from the seemingly favored stands' side on that occasion, he emerged with credit after going down by only a half length to Flashmans Papers (GB) despite ploughing a lone furrow in the centre of the track. Without cover again here, the bay raced wide of the tightly packed field, but was professional when committed approaching the furlong marker and rolled by Westphalia soon after. Stretching away from that rival in the run to the line, he was firmly in command as the maiden Kamado emerged to chase the runner-up. "He did it very well and is in everything, including the [July 27] G1 Phoenix S. here and G1 Prix Morny [at Deauville Aug. 24]," trainer David Wachman said. Plan improved off a debut fifth at Cork last October and earned a 🗘 "TDN Rising Star" 🗘 badge when breaking through in a Leopardstown maiden, his freshman season closer, at the end of that same month. He ran a creditable eighth behind stable companion Henrythenavigator in the May 1 G1 2000 Guineas at Newmarket on seasonal return and was a last-out fourth in the Listed Celebration S. at this track June 29. Settled off the pace in fourth after the initial strides here, he was stoked up with three furlongs to go and stayed on relentlessly under a final-quarter drive to assert superiority nearing the line. "He's very lazy at home and Seamus Heffernan, who rode him last time, said he only clicked into gear late in that race where he finished strongly," explained winning jockey Johnny Murtagh. "I thought this mile and one [eighth] would suit him as he finds a bit when you ask him and responds well. I think he's a nice horse going the right way and should now be spot on for a big one after this." Trainer Aidan O'Brien elaborated on possible targets and added, "He is going forward all the time and looks an obvious horse for the GI Secretariat S. next month." Click for the Racing Post chart.

"[Alessandro Volta] came out of the Derby well and is in good form, as are Bashkirov and William Hogarth, so hopefully they'll run well," O'Brien said yesterday. "It is very competitive, but you'd expect it to be as it's worth a lot of money, is on a great track and is very prestigious." Connections of Curtain Call are currently seeking to gain promotion from fifth above Alessandro Volta, who brought his run to a virtual halt as he began his errant move. Last year's G2 Beresford S. winner had run down the field at Epsom and his trainer, Luca Cumani, is hoping his widest post will not bring further bad fortune. "The draw could have been better," he told PA Sport. "Hopefully, over a mile and a half it will be less important, but it would have been nicer to have a more midfield draw He's come round now since the Curragh. He did a good piece of work on Wednesday and we are happy with him." Andre Fabre won this eight times in its previous guise as a 10-furlong contest and two years ago with Rail Link (GB) after the latest change in distance. His two representatives this time are the Wertheimer pair Prospect Wells, who followed a win in Saint-Cloud's G2 Prix Greffulhe May 12 with an eighth placing in the G1 Prix du Jockey-Club at Chantilly June 1 and the promoted May 31 Listed Prix de l'Avre winner Americain. Like Prospect Wells, Montmartre rebounded from an unplaced effort in the Jockey-Club to return to winning ways in the G3 Prix du Lys over this track and trip June 19, and bids to provide Alain de Royer-Dupre with a fourth renewal, while Sir Michael Stoute relies on the G1 Epsom Derby fourth Doctor Fremantle. The G3 Chester Vase hero has enjoyed a break since the blue riband and represents the sponsors successful with Beat Hollow (GB) in 2000 and the last two winners in the aforementioned Rail Link and Zambezi Sun (GB). "He's in good form, he's come out of the Derby well," Khalid Abdullah's Racing Manager Teddy Grimthorpe told PA Sport. "This has always been his target since then and he's trained well into it."

Hi Calypso carries a penalty here due to her successful exploits in the G2 Park Hill S. at Doncaster in September, but has to show more than her uneventful return when trailing in the G2 Hardwicke S. last time June 21. Speed Gifted was fourth in that Royal Ascot contest after a third in Goodwood's Listed Tapster S. 15 days previously and has been brought along steadily in typically patient fashion by trainer Luca Cumani. "The distance will suit him, but this race is a bit better class than the handicap he won at York last summer," Cumani told PA Sport. "He's had two nice runs at Goodwood and Ascot this season and he goes there in good form." Andre Fabre enjoys yet another enviable tally here, with eight wins, and relies on Noble Prince, whose pattern-race efforts include a second and third, respectively, here in the G2 Prix Chaudenay in October and May 5 G3 Prix d'Hedouville and latest fourth in the June 1 G2 Grand Prix de Chantilly. Sixth in that latter event was last year's G3 Prix Gladiateur winner and G1 Prix du Cadran runner-up Varevees, who will find this extended trip more suitable.

"I think that the two-year-old consignors have had a reasonably good year and they tend to fuel the market here," said Fergus Galvin, who operates the Hunter Valley consignment. "I don't really see too much change happening. I think it's the same story--the good horses bring the good money and horses that aren't making the grade are generally the ones that suffer in the market. There might be a mild correction, but I don't really see anything drastic." Consignor Meg Levy, who runs the Bluewater Sales agency, is treading somewhat cautiously. "It's so hard to see what's going to happen," she says. "People are just starting to vet now. I think it's actually less numbers traffic-wise than it's been the last couple of years, but hopefully it's quality versus quantity. But you just don't know what's going to happen." In light of the weakening American economy, it stands to reason that those from other parts of the world could take advantage and put their relatively stronger currency to good use. "We've made a little extra push, in Europe, in particular," explains Fasig-Tipton Vice President and Chief Operating Officer Boyd Browning Jr. "You don't really know yet how that's going to turn out. We think there will be some additional support from some of that European buying power and we'll be surprised if there isn't." However, that may or may not be taking place. "It's all about the pedigrees," said bloodstock agent Tom Ryan, "and there's just not a whole lot in the catalogue that appeals to Europeans." Nevertheless, the sales grounds at Fasig-Tipton were alive with activity yesterday on a

morning that started grey and rainy which eventually turned bright and sunny, a term which could be applied to the hopes of sales officials in an otherwise stormy economic climate.

Heaven Trees No Stranger to Success...

On a parcel of land a few furlongs down the road from Keeneland sits Heaven Trees, a farm owned since 1995 by veterinarian and horse breeder Dede McGehee, on which she boards 23 mares she owns singly and in partnership. The 51-year-old, who graduated from the University of Florida's College of Veterinary Medicine in 1984, has had her fair share of success selling horses she bred, mostly through the recently

closed Grovendale agency of James Keogh. As the saying goes, "necessity is the mother of invention," so instead of turning the 10 to 15 horses she sends to auction each year over to someone else, McGehee has decided to take a crack at her own consignment. Her three-strong draft this week is a groundbreaking event, but just how long it will endure remains uncertain.

Hip 268 is a filly from the first crop of fourracing's best time graded winner Limehouse (Grand Slam) and the first foal out of the stakeswinning Gracility (Known Fact), a mare McGehee owns in partnership with Ron Blackberry and DiCicilia's Crown's Way Farm of Illinois.

"That filly is awesome, the Limehouse details when I get filly," McGehee says proudly. "She's just beautiful. It was a very good physical mating, a very nice match for the mare [to go to Limehousel."

McGehee has made something of a name for herself working with mares with Click Here to Sign Up a history of reproductive problems.

"I like to fool with those mares, because if they didn't have issues, I wouldn't be able to afford them," she says laughing.

Gracility, one of several mares owned with Crown's Way, was one such mare. A daughter of the very talented Illinois-bred racemare Kuma (Naevus), she was retired from the track in 2005, but was unable to breed that season. She has a Roman Ruler filly by her side and she is back in foal to Langfuhr. Cont. p12

It is not surprising that McGehee has a soft spot for the Lane's End sire, as he provided her with one of her most prominent successes as a breeder. In partnership with John Gaines Thoroughbreds, McGehee was responsible for Imperial Gesture, runner-up to her stablemate Tempera in the 2001 GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies and third in the 2002 GI Breeders' Cup Distaff.


"He's such a good and underrated sire," McGehee says of Langfuhr. "He's not all that glamorous, but he sure can get you a runner."

In 2003, Heaven Trees was the successful bidder on the-then 13-year-old mare Adventurous Di (Private Account), who was in foal to Include. The hammer price was a mere \$17,000, an investment which was recouped when the filly, consigned through Grovendale, realized a final bid of \$110,000 at the 2005 Fasig-Tipton Kentucky July sale. In her biography on NTRA.com, McGehee said the Include filly was "beautiful, but you can't keep them all. You have to sell some of them to pay for the others." A Sovereign Award finalist in 2007, the grey daughter of Avide (Wall Street Dancer) was retired earlier this year following a successful swansong in Santa Anita's Paseana H. in January, the 14th stakes win of her career.

Heaven Trees' other two horses sell Tuesday. <u>Hip</u> <u>446</u> is a son of Langfuhr--Alcea (Honour and Glory) which hails from the strong Sam-Son family of champion Wilderness Song; while <u>hip 562</u>, a daughter of the late Vindication from Long Stemmed Rose (Rhythm), will keep McGehee busy right to the end of the sale.
