

### DEEP IMPACT STRIKES AGAIN AT JRHA SALE

Japanese businessman Takaya Shimakawa went to \$952,380 (¥100,000,000) to bring home the top lot at Wednesday's third and final session of the Japan Racing Horse Association's Select Foal Sale on Hokkaido.



Deep Impact-Mill Grain colt www.jrha.or.jp/eng Shimakawa, who runs a natural foods company based in Sendai, was intent on taking home hip 423, a son of champion Deep Impact (Jpn) (Sunday Silence), "When I visited Shadai Farm to inspect their consignment, I fell in love with this colt," Shimakawa admitted. "And Teruya Yoshida of Shadai Farm strongly recommended this colt, saying this is one of the best Deep Impacts. I was determined to buy him." Out of Mill Grain (GB) (Polish

Precedent), the foal is a three-quarter brother to Group 1 winner Fine Grain (Jpn) (Fuji Kiseki {Jpn}).

Shimakawa said he hasn't yet decided on a trainer for the colt. Shimakawa also bought Tuesday's session topper, and eventual sale topper, the Deep Impact--Biwa Heidi (Jpn) colt for \$2,056,074. Shimakawa wasn't the only one taken with the foals from the first crop of the two-time Japanese Horse of the Year. Wednesday's top three prices were provided by Deep Impact, while eight of the top 11 foals sold at the two-day foal sale were by the Shadai Stallion Station resident.

### Cont. from p1 Numbers Maintain Well at JRHA...

Given the state of the slumping economic markets both in Japan and around the world, sale officials at the Japan Racing Horse Association say they weren't surprised, or overly disappointed, that the July Select Sale suffered modest declines. With action slowing on the second day of the foal sale, the cumulative average of ¥33,058,559 (\$311,257) represented a 4.3 percent decline from last year's ¥34,552,083 (\$279,774). However, because of the weakening dollar, the figure was actually up significantly, 18.4 percent, in U.S. dollars (last year, \$1 = \$123.50, compared with today's conversion rate of \$1 = \$107). The median remained static at ¥26,000,000 (\$242,990). "It is a solid market," said Teruya Yoshida, vice chairman of the JRHA. "In other words, it is the acceptable result, under the current circumstances of business in Japan and all over the world. I am very happy to see the quality of Japanese-breds is very high now, and I am also happy to see more than ¥500,000,000 was put into this market by the buyers from foreign countries. I am guite confident the horses who will be exported to the countries of the buyers will run well there, and I hope they will encourage more buyers to come from foreign countries at this market in near future."



The presence of Godolphin's pair of Grade I-winning fillies by A.P. Indy, Little Belle and Music Note, has understandably kept the number of contenders to a minimum in Saturday's 10-furlong GI Coaching Club American Oaks. Just two others, Acoma (Empire Maker) and Never Retreat (Smart Strike), are listed as definite by the New York Racing Association. Two additional fillies may make the starting gate: James Brady's Ms. Margaret H. (Point Given), who paired up victories going seven panels at Churchill Apr. 29 and May 22, and is coming off a runner-up effort going a mile under the Twin Spires June 14; and Mercedes Stable's Seattle Smooth (Quiet American), based at Hollywood with trainer Julio Canani.

The highest-priced yearling of 2006 for her sire when selling for \$340,000 at FTKJUL, Seattle Smooth graduated narrowly when stretched out for the first time on



the Hollywood Cushion Track in December. She was second by a neck in the California Oaks over Golden Gate's Tapeta Feb. 2, then finished fifth on the all-weather in the GI Santa Anita Oaks Mar. 8. Switched to conventional dirt for the Apr. 12 Bay Meadows Oaks, the bay filly powered clear to score by six lengths. The Mercedes Stable colorbearer came east for her latest, rallying to claim third

to Sweet Vendetta and She's All Eltish over a sloppy track in the GII Black-Eyed Susan S. May 16 at Pimlico. She has been working regularly at Hollywood since her return, posting a seven-eighths drill in 1:25.40 July 6 and a half-mile in a bullet :47.40 July 12.

Only fifth on debut at Fairyhouse June 19, Luminous Eyes took a major step forward when inflicting a 5 1/2length defeat on Ballydoyle's Drumbeat (Ire) at Roscommon last time July 7. Responding to an aggressive ride from Pat Smullen here, the chestnut led after the first few steps and was pressured by Chintz, but surged inside the final quarter to pull clear in the run to the line. "She is sound, relaxed and very genuine and quickened well," trainer Dermot Weld commented. The G2 Debutante S. [at The Curragh Aug. 10] will be next and, if she progresses, then she will go for the G1 Moyglare Stud S. [at The Curragh Aug. 31]." The victory provided both her and her freshman sire Bachelor Duke (by Miswaki) their first stakes win. A foal of 2001, Bachelor Duke won just once in six starts, but made it count, taking the G1 Irish 2000 Guineas in 2004 over Azamour (Ire) and Grey Swallow (Ire). He also ran third in the previous year's G3 Somerville S. Bachelor Duke stands at Ballylinch Stud in Ireland; he stood the 2008 season for  $\in 8,000$ .

**ARCHIE HAS MILLION IN SIGHTS Sheikh Mo**hammed bin Khalifa Al Maktoum's Archipenko (Kingmambo) is being aimed at the GI Arlington Million, trainer Mike de Kock confirmed yesterday. Having scored on his 2008 European debut in Ascot's G2 Summer Mile S. on Saturday, the four-year-old will take his show on the road again to tackle the Aug. 9 Chicago feature. "It looks like we're going to go to Chicago with him, as it looks like the right option for us to take," de Kock told PA Sport. "It's really always been the plan to go to America, even though he proved himself right up there at Ascot last time. It's also probably a very good race for us to try to expose him as a future stallion. No race like the Million is an easy one, but it might just be a bit more winnable, as there are a couple of very good 10-furlong horses around in Britain at the moment." De Kock also revealed that the G1 Dubai Sheema Classic heroine Sun Classique (Aus) (Fuji Kiseki {Jpn}) was likely to be at a rehabilitation centre for eight to 16 weeks following her tendon injury. "They're doing a very good job there and people like this don't always get the good publicity they need," he added. "Hopefully, they can help her and she can do the same for them."





### **NO SURPRISES**


There really wasn't much Fasig-Tipton officials could say that virtually everybody in the business doesn't already know; as Denali's Craig Bandoroff put it in Tuesday's TDN, "I don't think there are as many end users as there have been in the past. There's more supply than there is demand." With a heavily American-based buyers list, the number of horses sold was down 14 percent, the gross was down 23 percent, and the average was off by 10 percent. In all three categories, the numbers were almost identical to those in the MRLS year of 2003, when 303 sold (305 this year) for \$28,202,000 (\$28,151,000 this year), an average of \$93,076 (\$92,298 this year). The difference, of course, was that only 463 were catalogued in 2003, whereas there were 568 catalogued this year. The clearance rate of sold/catalogued was just 54 percent this year, versus 65 percent in 2003 (61 percent last year). In particular, Fasig-Tipton's Walt Robertson pinpointed the weakness in the lower ranges of their market. "The lower end of the market is a tough place to be," Walt commented, "a hard place to find a buyer out there for someone to spend \$30,000 or \$40,000 on a horse."

As we have all had occasion to experience, there's never enough supply of 'good' horses; however they're identified, the top of the pyramid. But in a period of market contraction (this is not a recession: look at the

figures for 1986-1992 if you want to see what happens in a real recession), demand is lower anyway. When that lower demand is combined with an oversupply which has been building since 1999 (interrupted by the MRLS years), it's not hard to predict the result. But it's also important to remember that this round of oversupply has mainly been produced by stallions standing at higher stud fees, due to the doubling of book sizes for more expensive stallions since around 1996. That will be more important at Saratoga and for Keeneland's first four days. Fasig July's average is roughly the same as Keeneland's fifth session (Book 3, first session, on the first Saturday), so the stud fee investment isn't as high.

Of course, Fasig July is famous for

its New Sire Showcase and, at that around-\$100,000 average level, and given the market's insatiable thirst for new sires, you'd expect these sires to outperform the market as a whole by at least a little bit.



By my unofficial count, 38 percent of the horses sent through the ring this week were by first-crop sires, and their results saw 67 percent sold, versus the overall

sale average of 61 percent (that's sold/ring, not sold/catalogued, which was 54 percent).

A total of 30 first-year sires had yearlings go through the ring at Fasig, of which 14 stallions had three or more sell. The top five on 'average' (see table p7), actually had just one each sold, though for two of them --Ghostzapper (\$275,000) and Eddington (\$270,000)--it was their only yearling offered. Unforgettable Max, heretofore known principally as Afleet Alex's older brother, had one colt sell, for \$330,000, but that was of four sent through the ring. Saint Liam (\$300,000) was one-for-three, and Offlee Wild (\$190,000) was just one-for-five. Rock Hard Ten, who along with Saint Liam should vie for

second spot among this North American sire crop by yearling average (behind Ghostzapper, who will be the runaway leader), went two-for-two, averaging \$130,000.


Of the first-year sires which had three or more sell, top spot went to **Forest Danger**. The 2005 GI Carter H. winner had eight go through the ring, of which six sold (75 percent), for an average of \$154,500. He has been heavily supported by owners Aaron and Marie Jones, and his stock is sure to continue to prove popular. Second was dual Classic winner **Afleet Alex**, with four sold (of nine through the ring), for an average of \$142,500. As expected, Unbridled's Song's Grade IIwinning son (no stigma there; Distorted Humor and Dansili were both 'just' Grade II winners) **Eurosilver** was popular; 11 of his 15 offered (73 percent) averaged \$135,909. Also over the \$100,000 average mark were **Roman Ruler** (\$125,666, six of 11 sold) and **Medallist**, whose three sold (of four offered) averaged \$113,333.


Purge, the son of Pulpit who won the GI Cigar Mile and two Grade II's, had an impressive 80 percent sold, his 12 (of 15 offered) averaging \$94,083. Another son of Unbridled's Song, Value Plus, had eight sell (also of 15 offered), for an average of \$77,250. Of the 14 first-year sires with three or more sold, only 2005 GI Kentucky Derby second Closing Argument (seven-for seven) had a 100-percent clearance rate of those sent through the ring. They averaged \$73,714, from a Florida-sired crop. Grade I-winning two-year-old Consolidator had four (of seven offered) average \$69,250; and this particular top 10 was rounded out by the five-time graded winner Limehouse, whose 13 sold (of 21 offered) averaged \$66,769. Also over the \$50,000 average mark was my 'sleeper,' Grand Reward. His 10 sold (71 percent of 14 offered) averaged \$55,500.

Last year's first-crop stars, which now have their first two-year-olds, were less heavily represented, but 79 percent (15 of 19 offered) by the four top sires in this category on average were, not surprisingly, sold. **Friends Lake** led that list, with three sold (of five offered) averaging \$183,333. **Medaglia** d'**Oro** had five of six sell, averaging \$151,000. **Lion Heart** went four-for-five, with a \$128,750 average; and all three offered by **Speightstown** sold, averaging \$117,333.

Next up is the two-day Saratoga sale on August 4-5. Last year this sale averaged \$289,310, on receipts of \$41-million. The average was down 11 percent from 2006, when about \$42-million in sales (12 fewer sold) averaged \$323,731. This will tell us much more about the top tier of the market (Keeneland's first four days averaged \$284,883 last year). I don't think anybody is projecting Saratoga's average to be up, but they do have three each by Storm Cat, A.P. Indy, and Distorted Humor, as well as seven from Ghostzapper's first crop. He's the best racehorse we've seen in America in the last 10 years, so I am expecting some fireworks.
