LAVA MAN MAY HAVE RUN LAST RACE



Looking Back...

When you scan the list of Sanford winners, some of the biggest names in Thoroughbred racing jump out at you. Triple Crown winner Secretariat and New York's Handicap Triple hero Tom Fool both earned their firstever stakes wins in the event; 1978 Triple Crown champ Affirmed was actually picking up his third stakes score in the race. Regret beat the boys in the second running of the Sanford in 1914. Afleet Alex set the stakes record of 1:09 1/5 in 2004, and went on to win the GI Preakness and GI Belmont S.

One of the most impressive performances in Sanford history was not, however, a win, but the second-place



finish of Man o'War in 1919. The race was contested on Aug. 13, and Man o'War already had six victories to his credit. He was heavily favored at 1-2 to make it seven in a row, but luck was not with him. The first stroke of misfortune came when the starter, Mars

Cassidy, fell ill, and was replaced by placing judge C.H. Pettingill. Pettingill was plagued by

bad starts all day, and the Sanford was no exception.

Caught flat-footed and facing the wrong way when the tape went up, "Big Red" found himself trailing the field down the backstretch. Jockey Johnny Loftus went to work, driving the powerful chestnut after his rivals; Man o'War's monster stride ate up ground. He had just three horses in front of him on the turn for home, and it looked like he might overcome the disastrous start, but Loftus opted to send Man o'War up the rail in the stretch and the two were boxed in. *Cont. p2* While no official decision has been made, multi-million dollar earner **Lava Man** (Slew City Slew) may have run his last race, according to co-owner Steve Kenley of STD Stable. "Nothing's official, but I'm sure we'll huddle up and make a decision before too long on what to do," Kenley said yesterday, a day after Lava Man ran last in the GI Eddie Read H. "It's nothing we feel we have to do in a day or two, but we'll huddle up and decide to do what's best for the horse." Lava Man was



claimed by STD Stable and Jason Wood and trainer Doug O'Neill for \$50,000 at Del Mar in 2004. The sevenyear-old gelding went on to win seven Grade I races and earnings of \$5,268,706. He won three straight renewals of the GI Hollywood Gold Benoit Cup, from 2005-2007, as well as the 2006 and 2007

editions of the GI Santa Anita H. and the 2006 GI Pacific Classic and GI Charles Whittingham Memorial H. Winless since last year's Gold Cup, Lava Man seemed to regain his form with a game third-place effort in the June 7 Whittingham, leaving connections disappointed with his finish in the Eddie Read. "We were really confident [Sunday] because he looked so good in the paddock and he had been training really well since the Whittingham," Kenley said. "And he ran great in the Whittingham. With that, we thought we could do better yesterday. We thought he'd be cruising along on the lead and things would go our way." Kenley praised Lava Man, adding, "We have nothing but appreciation for this horse. It's been quite a ride for four years. He's been in the spotlight and he's put us on the map."

Describing that final drive, Willie Knapp, aboard Upset, reportedly said, "We'd passed the quarter pole and were going to the eighth pole when I heard something right behind me, and I knew it was Big Red coming at me now. I looked back and there he was. Johnny Loftus was riding like a crazy man and he yelled at me, 'Move over, Willie! I'm coming through!' So I yelled at him, 'Take off! Take off, you bum, or I'll put you through the rail!'"

Loftus was forced to take up, but finally got Man o'War into the clear in the final furlong. It was too late, though. Carrying 130 pounds to Upset's 115, Man o'War came up a neck short in what would be the only defeat of his career.

The prospective field for this year's running of the Sanford may not include another Man o'War, but it does feature a pair of **C** "TDN Rising Stars" **C**. Desert Party (Street Cry {Ire}), who graduated in his debut at Arlington in June, will have Edgar Prado in the irons; Notonthesamepage (Catienus) earned "Star" status when setting a track record of :50 flat for 4 1/2 furlongs in his career opener on Apr. 30, but has not been out since. Also pointing for the six-furlong test are Bullion Cache (Seeking the Gold), a maiden winner at Churchill June 25; Heir to the Stone (Birdstone), who bested New York-breds by 5 3/4 lengths in his July 10 debut at Belmont; and Run Away and Hide (City Zip), who made it two-for-two in the May 1 GIII Kentucky S. at Churchill.

Over the years A.P. Indy's daughters have treated us to plenty of impressive Grade I victories, with Secret Status' seven-length romp in the Kentucky Oaks, Sweet Symphony's wide-margin win in the Alabama S. and Rags to Riches' various triumphs among the most memorable. But, for sheer imperiousness, nothing compares to the way Music Note sprinted away from her rivals for an 11-length success in the Coaching Club American Oaks three days ago. This was the second CCA Oaks victory for Lane's End's star stallion, following Jilbab in 2002, and A.P. Indy was also responsible for the runner-up for the third time, with Little Belle following the example of Tomisue's Delight and Fircroft. When I wrote about Jilbab I commented that:

"No horse capable of siring sons of the quality of Aptitude, A P Valentine, Golden Missile, Jump Start, Stephen Got Even, Old Trieste, Pulpit and Symboli Indy could ever be described as a "filly" sire. Yet A.P. Indy, the stallion responsible for this impressive collection, has undoubtedly earned a reputation for being an even better sire of fillies than he is of colts." Cont. p4


Even though the names of Bernardini, Mineshaft, Friends Lake and Majestic Warrior have since been added to the list of A.P. Indy's most talented sons, the above paragraph still holds true six years later. Admittedly, A.P. Indy's impressive total of over 60 graded winners divides equally between the sexes, but the fillies dominate at Grade I level, accounting for 13 of his 21 winners at the highest level in the U.S. In other words, only eight of the 21 are colts (with that statistic changing to nine out of 22 if the Japanese colt Symboli Indy is included).

There is also a powerful back-up team of a dozen Grade II-winning sons, and such has been A.P. Indy's charisma that breeders have been eager to support his sons, even if they fell a little short of the highest class. That charisma stems from the fact that A.P. Indy was Horse of the Year, as was his sire, the Triple Crownwinning Seattle Slew, and the 1992 Belmont S. winner also comes from an exceptional female line--something which helped this very handsome individual top the 1990 Keeneland July Sale at \$2,900,000.

So far, six of A.P. Indy's American stallion sons have hit the Grade I target, with Pulpit leading the way from Malibu Moon, Old Trieste, Aptitude, Golden Missile and Stephen Got Even. Another son, the unexceptional turf winner Camden Park, has shown considerable potential in South Africa, siring the recent Grade 1-winning two-year-old Consensual and the high-class Jaypeg, who this year has triumphed in Group 1 international contests in Dubai and Singapore.

It can surely be only a matter of time before Mineshaft joins the Grade I club, as he has the Grade II winners Casino Drive and Cool Coal Man among his first three-year-olds. The vibes are encouraging concerning the 2004 Florida Derby winner Friends Lake, whose early runners include Screen Your Friend, winner of the GIII Bashford Manor S. It could also pay to keep an eye on Stephen Got Even, as his 2008 yearlings were conceived soon after his son Stevie Wonderboy had landed the title of champion two-year-old colt. Jump Start, with nine stakes winners among his 112 current runners, is another who can be expected to make further progress.

To get back to Music Note, she was guaranteed to be suited by the step up to a mile and a quarter in the CCA Oaks. In addition to being by a winner of the Belmont, she is out of a daughter of Sadler's Wells, a stallion renowned as a source of excellence over 1¼ miles or more. That Sadler's Wells mare, the unraced Note Musicale, is out of a daughter of Mr. Prospector, which means she is bred along the same lines as Look Honey, a Group 2 winner over 1¼ miles, New Frontier, a Group 3 winner at up to 1 7/8 miles, and Carnival Dancer, a triple Group 3 winner over 1¼ miles. **Cont. p5**

The idea that Note Musicale would also have been suited by 1¹/₄ miles is supported by the record of her high-class In Excess filly Musical Chimes. This Group 1 winner over eight and nine furlongs stayed 11/4 miles well enough to be third in the French Oaks and second in the Yellow Ribbon S.

Music Note follows Indy Five Hundred as only A.P. Indy's second Grade I winner out of a mare by a son of Northern Dancer (or third if you count Symboli Indy). There are graded winners out of daughters of Danzig, El Gran Senor, Lyphard, Night Shift and Nureyev, plus a handful of Grade II and Grade III winners with Northern Dancer mares as their second dams.

However, A.P. Indy is far more famous for his association with mares from the Mr. Prospector line. The emergence this year of Little Belle and Adriano has improved A.P. Indy's total of graded winners out of Mr. Prospector mares to 13, from the first 100 foals bred this way--a tremendous achievement.

Music Note's second dam is by Mr. Prospector, but she wasn't just any old Mr. Prospector mare. This mare--It's in the Air--did so well that Gainsborough had to pay \$4,600,000 to acquire her as an eight-year-old in 1984. Her racing career, which extended to 43 starts, saw her share the title of champion two-year-old filly, but It's in the Air trained on extremely well, numbering the Alabama S. over 1¹/₄ miles among her numerous subsequent victories.

She was in foal to A.P. Indy's sire Seattle Slew at the time of her sale and that foal, Bitooh, won a Group 2 in France to rank as her dam's best effort. For a while it looked as though It's in the Air wasn't a particularly shrewd investment, but that has

changed in recent years, with three of her daughters producing group winners. Storming Home, a Group I winner in England and the U.S., is out of the winning Shareef Dancer mare Try to Catch Me, a three-parts sister to Note Musicale.


It's in the Air was bred along similar lines to Morning Devotion, another influential broodmare best known as the dam of Balanchine, winner of the Oaks and Irish Derby. Both were by stallions from the Raise a Native line, and It's in the Air's dam A Wind Is Rising was the second dam of Morning Devotion.

This family has also enjoyed recent Group 1 success with West Wind, winner of the 2007 Prix de Diane, and Saoirse Abu, a filly who took two of Ireland's top juvenile events last year, so it isn't just A.P. Indy who is a source of top-notch distaffers. This family also has a notable young representative in Art Connoisseur, an English colt who showed excellent acceleration in winning the G2 Coventry S.

of 28,000 at Arlington Park in his last public appearance at a track before being retired to stud.


July 28, 1987...Jockey Angel Cordero Jr. won his 6,000th career race aboard Lost Kitty in the Colleen S. at Monmouth Park.



SALES INTEGRITY PROGRAM LAUNCHES **MONITORING COMMITTEE**

Last week, the Thoroughbred Owners and Breeders Association (TOBA) announced the appointment of D.G. Van Clief Jr. as the chairman of the Sales Integrity Program Monitoring Committee. Van Clief, currently the



chairman of Fasig-Tipton and formerly the president of Breeders' Cup Limited and commissioner of the NTRA, will head the 11-member committee, which has been charged with "overseeing the implementation and determining the effectiveness of the Sales Integrity Task Force's recommendations that were issued in November 2007," according to a TOBA release. The Monitoring Committee is made up of: Jimmy Bell, Darley USA; Reynolds Bell Jr., Reynolds Bell Thoroughbred Services; Bill Casner,


Bayne Welker, Mill Ridge Farm.

The Sales Integrity Task Force was established in 2004 after calls for reform at Thoroughbred public auctions. The Task Force released a list of recommendations that year, then last November released a second list, which was fully adopted by Fasig-Tipton and Keeneland and partially adopted by the Ocala Breeders' Sales Company.

Included among the implemented recommendations were: a ban on exogenous anabolic steroids for 45 days prior to a sale for weanlings and yearlings; a voluntary ownership registry; an updated list of prohibited practices; and a Code of Conduct for all participants in public auctions. Last week's Fasig-Tipton Kentucky July Sale was the first auction to fully implement the Task Force's recommendations.

Yesterday, Van Clief, along with TOBA President Dan Metzger, talked to the TDN's Lucas Marguardt about the new committee and the goals it hopes to achieve.

What was the impetus behind the formation of the monitoring committee?

Van Clief: One of the points we want to make is that, when the Sales Integrity Task Force issued its recommendations last fall, the process didn't just stop there. It's not one of those deals where a list of recommendations was handed out from whatever agency, and then everybody goes home. In this process there has been follow-up, and it's serious follow-up.

What sort of role do you see the committee playing?

Van Clief: I think you can probably divide the committee's function into maybe a four-part mission.

Number one, as the name implies, is to monitor the implementation of the Task Force recommendations with an eye toward gauging how effective they are. That's number two, to gauge the effectiveness.

Number three, once we've collected enough input and data to assess its effectiveness, we think it's this committee's job to go back to the Task Force and sales companies and recommend any changes, or additions, to the policies that might be necessary to enhance or protect the marketplace.

Lastly, we're also looking at this committee not only as a monitoring body, but also as a communications conduit. We're going to undertake it as our job on the committee to keep the media, the public, the marketplace and state government informed as to how these recommendations are being adopted, and how they're working once adopted.

After the November sales, it's very likely that we will commission--in fact the committee plans on doing it--a piece of research to gauge how the marketplace feels about these policies. At that point, there will be a considerable body of information that we can tap, and we will ask a professional firm to tap it for us and get opinions from all parts of the marketplace.

We do already have a small preliminary window to look through in the form of the Fasig-Tipton July Sale. Fasig-Tipton has reported to the committee that, as regards the steroid testing, out of the 305 or so horses that were sold, there were 22 blood samples requested. Those tests, which went to UC Davis, all came back negative.

The Task Force also recommended, and the sales companies agreed, to implement a voluntary ownership disclosure registry. There were 82 horses whose ownership was registered, of which 61 revealed ownership that was not already carried on the catalogue page.

Was there any tally of how many of those were accessed by potential buyers?

Van Clief: Yes, we asked that question specifically, and we thought it was interesting--and remember this is preliminary--that there were zero requests of ownership in the repository. The sales company did announce there was a repository that was accessible to qualified individuals; it was announced at the beginning of each sales session that there was a new condition, Condition 20, in the catalogue relating to sales transparency, and there was a full-time staff member allocated to providing information on requests. There were just no requests. We thought that was particularly interesting. But again, there will be many more yearlings to sell through the rest of the summer and early fall, so let's hold our opinion. *Cont. p8*

How long do you expect the committee to be around for?

Van Clief: The committee's in place until further notice.

How were the members of the committee picked? Is there a term length the members are expected to serve?

Metzger: It's somewhat indefinite. They will probably serve as long as they'd like to serve. The committee was chosen, essentially, by the groups that have managed this process. That includes TOBA, Keeneland, Fasig-Tipton and the CBA, the Consignors and Breeders Association. We tried to have a well-balanced committee made up of sales company representatives, sellers, buyers. We believe the committee takes all points of interests, from people who breed and sell at a larger level to folks who are maybe more mid-sized. It was also, mostly, people who were included in the original task force, and had an idea of the inner workings and process.

Van Clief: It's also important to point out that, while we endeavored to balance the committee from a perspective standpoint, we also tried to balance it from a geographic standpoint.

Metzger: We did add two member who weren't on the original task force, that being Samantha Siegel and Michael O'Farrell. That gave us good representation from California and Florida.

It seems that there is only one member of the committee who is strictly a buyer--Samantha Siegel of Jay Em Ess. Are you worried that owners' interests are adequately represented?

Van Clief: If you look at the list, it's a little bit difficult to classify people as either buyers or sellers. Most of our industry players are at some point both. For instance, Jimmy Bell from Darley represents perhaps the most significant buyer in the world (Sheikh Mohammed). Reynolds Bell represents some of the most important American buyers. WinStar's a buyer, Hill 'n' Dale's a buyer, Mill Ridge is a buyer, so in addition to Samantha, we feel we have the buying public well-represented. We also assume that sale companies have the welfare of the marketplace at heart. Having been involved with a sales company for years, I can tell you from experience that a sales company that does not faithfully represent both sides of the transaction, it isn't going to have much business for long.

Do you have meeting schedule for the committee? How do you see the committee moving forward from here?

Van Clief: We haven't set forth a calendar schedule of regular meetings at this point, but the assumption is that we will meet a couple of times between now and November. Frankly, we're looking at this as on an as-necessary basis. If we see developments in the marketplace, or reaction from the marketplace, then this is a pretty mobile and nimble group. We can pull them together pretty quickly for a meeting at any time, and will do so. We look at this as a dynamic process; we want to be responsive, but we know full well we'll be learning as we go.

There has been talk of what sort of teeth these policies have. Can you comment on that?

Van Clief: Well, if you look at the Fasig-Tipton Kentucky July catalogue, there are several conditions which address the policies. Condition 6, which addresses anabolic steroids; Condition 19, which sets forth the new code of conduct for agents; and Condition 20, which involves transparency of ownership.

In brief, the sales companies actually led, and the Task Force agreed with them, to enforce a ban on exogenous anabolic steroids. No weanling or yearling may receive anabolic steroids within 45 days of the sale. Buyers can have their purchases tested, and if any come back positive, it's clear under the conditions of sale it is grounds for the recision of the sale. Enforcement is provided right in the conditions of sale.

Under the code of conduct, Condition 19, as recommended by the Task Force, there are several points which agents and consultants need to abide by. If it is found that an individual agent is not conducting his or her business in accordance with the conditions of sale, then a sales company has the authority to essentially ban that individual from participating at the company's sales. If there is a disagreement about that verdict, then the condition makes a provision for an arbitration process under the rules of the American Arbitration Association. That arbitration would be binding.

Lastly, in the area of ownership transparency, the consignor or principal owner who is selling the horse may lodge ownership information in a repository for use by qualified buying individuals. Whether the ownership is shown on the catalogue page or in the repository, it is a warranty of sale. If that ownership information is materially inaccurate or misleading, then the buyer, if he or she can demonstrate that it is inaccurate, can seek and receive up to 50 percent of the hammer price of that individual animal as liquidated damages. *Cont. p9*

So there is some real teeth in this. Just like other warranties which have been embodied in the condition of sales for years, these become legally binding conditions with real methods for enforcement.

Looking at back to 2004, the original Task Force recommended that any conformation-altering procedures be disclosed to buyers. The policies adopted by the sales companies did not include that provision. Why not?

Metzger: It was recommended in 2004, and though the spirit was there, it wasn't put into the final recommendations in 2007 because it became guite a logistical issue, to be able to confirm that all the information was accurate. First, you have to be able to have a means that is 100 percent accurate to confirm a horse has indeed had conformation-altering surgery.

One of the things we were trying to get was microchipping as a mandatory procedure, which would ensure the 100-percent accuracy that this procedure was done. But until we have the infrastructure, there would be a tremendous amount of liability for inaccurate information, and whose fault, or whose liability, would that fall to? Would it be the consignor's? Would it be the person who bought the horse, if that horse was later pinhooked? If a horse is purchased as a weanling after having a procedure done, then as a yearling and then as a two-year-old, where is that chain of custody in terms of the accuracy of the information? It's a pretty complex problem to solve. The best answer we have is that if microchipping were mandatory, that would almost, if not entirely, solve the situation.

A # will distinguish first-time stakes-winners, a @ will indicate first-time graded stakes-winners, a **A** will denote a first-time Grade/Group 1 winner, a + will indicate first-time starters, an (S) will be used for statebred races, a (C) will be used for maiden-claiming races and an (R) will be used for other restricted races.

Is that something the committee recommends, mandatory microchipping (implanting microchips in horses that would included their medical history) in the future?

Metzger: We haven't officially taken a position on it yet, although I know The Jockey Club is working hard on it. I believe there was a pilot program. But I think that microchipping, which is something that's done around the world, would help not only in this issue, but in a lot of other issues with equine health as well.

Van Clief: There's an ongoing process, too, which is separate from this committee's work, but obviously totally related. The Task Force called for an ongoing process of evaluating medical procedures and continuing to add, as appropriate, prohibited practices under the conditions of sale. So there's a separate committee that is charged to meet at least annually to evaluate whether additional practices should be added to the list. Last year, actually, there was one additional practice that was prohibited, and that is injection behind the knees.

How has the reaction to the committee been thus far?

Van Clief: Since it was just announced last week, it's a little too early to tell. Being an optimist, I would assume it's going to be positive. But the proof's always in the pudding.
