A FORCE TO BE RECKONED WITH?

Five-year-old **Dynaforce** (Dynaformer) has only made eight career starts, she is still looking for her first group/graded success, and she faces a stellar field in the GI Diana S., but she is one to watch today at Saratoga. A Listed winner at Chantilly at three, the bay made just two appearances last year, capturing a conditions event at Vichy in July and running third behind the talented Satwa Queen (Fr) in the G2 Prix Jean

Romanet at Deauville in August. She made her U.S. bow in the June 21 Gll New York H. going 10 panels at Belmont and, despite the 10-month layoff, was a game neck runner-up to Mauralakana (Fr). Dropping back to nine furlongs, Dynaforce takes on no less than four Grade I winners in

the Diana. Champion Wait a While (Maria's Mon) makes her first start since taking the Jan. 14 GII San Gorgonio H., but her return could be delayed if the Saratoga turf comes up soft. Trainer Christophe Clement is also concerned about the footing. He saddles the Grade I duo of Vacare (Lear Fan) and Rutheriene (Pulpit) this afternoon. Vacare, six-for-nine lifetime, was a troubled eighth when making her seasonal bow in the June 7 GI Just a Game S. "I think she has improved from that race," Clement remarked. "She had a horrible trip in that. Since then she has been doing well and I think she will be competitive." Rutherienne followed a win in the Apr. 12 GII Jenny Wiley S. with thirds in the May 26 GI Gamely S. at Hollywood and June 21 GIII All Along BC S. at Colonial Downs. "I hope the ground isn't too soft for either filly," Clement said. Last year's GI QE II Challenge Cup heroine Bit of Whimsy (Distorted Humor) looks to get back on track after finishing sixth in the Jenny Wiley and the Just a Game.

BRING ON THE DUKE

When it has really mattered, Ballydoyle's tactical strength has been demonstrated successfully on many

occasions this season, and it is a certain bet that Aidan O'Brien has a battle plan readied for today's G1 King George VI and Queen Elizabeth S. at Ascot. At the head of the triumvirate is the general, or rather **Duke of Marmalade (Ire)** (Danehill), and Susan Magnier and Michael Tabor's invigorated colossus will have

some serious groundwork laid down by Macarthur (GB) (Montjeu {Ire}) and Red Rock Canyon (Ire) (Rock of Gibraltar {Ire}) on his first try at this mile-and-a-half trip. Hampered by injury when relegated to second fiddle behind Dylan Thomas (Ire) last term, the four-year-old has already outdone last year's hero by winning the G1 Prince of Wales's S. at Royal Ascot. His four-length defeat of subsequent G1 Eclipse S. second and third Phoenix Tower and Pipedreamer (GB) in that June 18 contest marked a turning point in the public perception of him as a top-class runner. His trainer makes no secret of the regard in which he is held. "He's very good, this horse--his physique, pedigree, mental attitude, everything about him," he explained. "He is very professional and very tough--a very serious colt." Cont. p2

Macarthur, who is a full brother to the brilliant 2005 G1 Epsom Derby hero Motivator (GB), was forced out of last year's Classics but like the "Duke" has begun to fulfil his latent potential at four. After winning Chester's G3 Ormonde S. by four lengths May 9, he was third behind Soldier of Fortune (Ire) and Jaber Abdullah's Youmzain (Ire) (Sinndar (Ire)) in the G1 Coronation Cup, where Papal Bull (GB) (Montjeu {Ire}) was back in fourth. While his finishing position in that June 6 Epsom highlight may have been the result of a positive ride from Seamus Heffernan, he showed he was still going forward with a battling success in the June 21 G2 Hardwicke S. at the Royal Meeting. Heffernan gave a vital clue to the stable's pace plans yesterday. "His runs this year have been very good indeed," the rider told PA Sport. "He was very highly-rated at home as a three-year-old, but he had a little setback. Red Rock Canyon is in there to make sure nobody has any excuses, you either stay the trip or you don't. Nobody wants a muddling race." In 1958 and 1959 Alcide (GB) and Ballymoss (Ire) added this prize to the previous year's G1 St Leger respectively, and George Strawbridge's Lucarno (Dynaformer) bids to end the long subsequent drought for victors of the Doncaster Classic. He was only sixth behind Youmzain in the June 29 G1 Grand Prix de Saint-Cloud, but gave Papal Bull and Slavica Ecclestone's Petara Bay (Ire) (Peintre Celebre) five pounds and a comfortable beating in the G2 Princess of Wales'S. at Newmarket last time July 10. That performance was marked by enterprising front-running tactics, but jockey Jimmy Fortune is keen to stress the versatility of Lucarno. "He doesn't have to dominate--we held him up in the Leger and we held him up at York in the Great Voltigeur, so as long as there is a decent gallop on and he relaxes he doesn't have to, but he can quite easily make the running," he said.

Steadied early, My Princess Jess was rated just off the pace through six panels in a moderate 1:14.59 and was crying for running room as they raced down the lane. Jockey Eibar Coa found it for her, bulling his way between horses at the eighth pole and spurting through to prove much the best despite the narrow margin. The gelding ended a four-race campaign in 2007 with a seventh-place finish in the Oct. 27 GI Breeders' Cup Sprint, but he came out running in 2008. A 14-length winner in an optional claimer at Gulfstream Jan. 17, he took the Mar. 8 GII Richter Scale H. by 13 3/4 lengths, and was the even-money chalk to make it three in a row in the May 26 GI Met Mile H. The chestnut set a swift pace in that test, but

carry 124 pounds, spotting seven to 11 pounds to her opponents as she defends her title here. "She deserves carrying that weight," said trainer Bobby Frankel. "She won with 123 pounds. There isn't another Grade I winner in this race." The 2007 Champion Older Female also has wins in the GII Louisville H. and Sunshine Millions Distaff in 2008. Her only loss this year was a

third in the GI Apple Blossom S., where she finished behind undefeated Zenyatta and repeat winner Brownie Points. She will be joined by fellow Stronach rep **Spring Waltz**, who finished fourth, 8 1/4 lengths behind winner Hystericalady, in the GII Delaware H. 13 days ago. That race snapped a four-race winning streak, which was capped by a 3 1/2-length romp in the Mar. 9 GII Rampart H. **Moon Catcher**, six-for-11 in 2007, was a six-length winner of the Emergency Nurse S. at Calder Apr. 27. The bay was fifth, 15 lengths behind Ginger Punch, after stumbling at the start of the Phipps in her latest. **Runaway Rosie** lived up to her name in her last effort, taking the Proud Delta S. by 4 3/4 lengths at Belmont July 2.

Undefeated Bustin Stones bids for his seventh straight score. The Roddy Valente homebred took the Feb. 18 GII General George H. at Laurel in his graded bow and most recently joined the elite ranks with a half-length tally in the Apr. 5 GI Carter H. The fouryear-old was forced to miss the May 26 GI Met Mile H. with a fever, but trainer Bruce Levine feels confident the colt will be sharp after the break. "Naturally, we're looking for him to win to start off the rest of the year," Levine said. "He is strong and fresh and will probably show more speed." He added, "This horse has never been behind another horse--they're going to have to worry about him." Thor's Echo, the champion sprinter of 2006, looks to get back to winning ways. The sixyear-old gelding capped off his Eclipse season with wins in the GI Breeders' Cup Sprint and GI DeFrancis Dash. He failed to hit the board in two starts in Dubai in 2007, including a sixth in the G1 Dubai Golden Shaheen, and has been out just once since. The chestnut came back after more than 14 months on the shelf to run fourth behind Benny the Bull in the June 7 GII True North H. Black Seventeen was sidelined for 11 months after taking the GII Carry Back S. at Calder last July. The four-year-old resurfaced in the June 14 Oakland S. at Golden Gate and, after setting fast fractions weakened to be second. He should prove tighter today.

Storm Mesa will try to make her turf debut a winning one and gain her fourth straight victory. It took her six tries to break maiden, but she is undefeated in three starts since graduating. Those triumphs include a 13 1/2-length domination of the Cinemine S. at Lone Star May 26 and a one-length score in the GIII lowa Oaks at Prairie Meadows June 27, where she prevailed despite stumbling at the break. She'll have to contend with **Misty Ocean**, who also enters on a winning streak and figures to be prominently placed early. Misty Ocean has won three in a row, including the Golden Poppy S. at Golden Gate May 18 and the GII Honeymoon H. at Hollywood June 7. Missit, winner of the GII Providencia S. at Santa Anita in March and Group 2-placed in England, will look to rebound off a fifth in the GI American Oaks July 5.

Sir Michael Stoute saddles the G3 Dee S. winner Tajaaweed. Only eighth when appearing not to stay the mile and a half in the June 7 G1 Epsom Derby, he should be suited by this drop in trip. "Michael Stoute gave him a little bit of a break and freshened him up after Epsom," owner Sheikh Hamdan bin Rashid Al Maktoum's Racing Manager Angus Gold commented. "I'm sure he's a horse who will continue to improve as he gets older with the scope that he's got."



A NEW DAYAT DEL MAR?

NEW AND IMPROVED SURFACE AT DEL MAR

An inconsistent surface during the inaugural season of the Polytrack era at Del Mar brought about some

changes this past winter. "The Polytrack people added wax to it in April [over a three-day process] and ever since we started training on it, we've been watering it every day," Del Mar Track Superintendent Steve Wood said. "[Polytrack manufacturer] Martin Collins

didn't think we had enough wax in it. He added a little, but didn't want to add too much. Once you get too much wax in it, you can't get it out, so he wanted to go one step at a time. It's oil-based and should perform very well." The track wasn't watered during last year's meeting, per the recommendation of Collins. However, the addition of water this term was expected to keep the surface more consistent from morning to afternoon. In 2007, the track got slower as the day went on. With nearly two weeks in the books, the "new" Polytrack surface is off to a good start. "It's dynamite," Wood continued. "Really, really good. Everybody likes it. It's fair and stays pretty much consistent day in and day out. It's night and day from last year."

HOW DOES THE POLYTRACK SURFACE COMPARE TO LAST YEAR? TRAINERS WEIGH IN...

Neil Drysdale: It's much better. It's an improved surface and I'm very pleased with it and I hope they can maintain it the same way. It has more spring to it and is more consistent [from morning to the afternoon].

Dan Hendricks: It's very similar in the morning, just a little faster. But we haven't had any hot sunny days yet. It has definitely helped with the added water, but it's hard to improve on last year because last year it was the best track I had ever trained on. Their main object was safety and they got that. They never tinkered with it or tried anything different. This year, they're watering it and have definitely sped up the afternoons, and it still seems like a good, safe track, with no biases. We're real happy with it. It's a more consistent or better track than we had at Santa Anita or Hollywood. Both tracks at their best were very good, but, for different reasons, those tracks fell apart. This one seems to be holding up.

Bob Hess Jr: Well, last year they didn't have Polytrack. They may have named it that, but it wasn't Polytrack. It was nowhere even close to what they had at Keeneland. For one, it didn't have the jelly cables. Two, it was incredibly waxy. I don't know what kind of wax it used, but it was like walking or running in gooey peanut butter. It was atrocious. Horses weren't breaking bones--which is a great thing--but we had tons of soft tissue injuries last year. And there's no way I'm the lone ranger on this one. It was acceptable in the morning, until about 8 a.m.; when the fog left and the sun came out, it rapidly deteriorated. As bad as it was last year, it is remarkably fantastic this year. I don't know if a perfect track exists, but whatever they did to it--I think they put in a different wax and they're adding water--it's really, really good this year. Will horses get injured? Sure. But I think overall their goal of protecting horses and our goal of protecting horses and owners is going to be accomplished. I'm sure we'll have the odd injury here and there, but nothing like last year and nothing like what the dirt was. I'm not advocating that we go back to dirt or anything like that. Cont. p9

The problem last year was we'd have horses work great in the morning. So you'd go into a race with a

false sense of confidence. And they'd run last. Horses who worked average or poorly would win. So you couldn't know until you ran. The people who got hurt last year, unfortunately, are the two most important segments of our business: the gambler and the owner. Because you couldn't bet with any confidence and the owners were sustaining career-ending, not lifethreatening, but career-ending injuries, last year with soft-tissue. This year,

our two most important assets are in good shape. Aside from the horse. Obviously, the horse comes first before anyone.

Jerry Hollendorfer: Well, it's a lot better. It just seems more fair and for horses that come from off the pace.

Brian Koriner: I think the safety of the surface has been great the whole time. I think adding water has helped it. The times of races are faster. Horses look like they are running down the lane, not swimming down the lane. As far as speed to coming from behind, it seems like at the top of the lane, any of six can win, which is kind of strange.

Michael Machowsky: I was a fan of it last year. We didn't have soundness issues. The only injury any of my horses had last year was a knee problem, and that was on a workout on the turf course in the morning. I didn't have any issues with it training or in the afternoon. So far this year, I see the same thing. It was a little tiring and you'd be a little concerned about routing horses in the afternoon, but training horses in the morning it was great. In the afternoons, it was a little bit different, but horses would come back out of the races in good shape and to me, that was the bottom line. This year, it's very fair. I think they have it perfected. Horses are true to form and it's more of a consistent surface. You're able to handicap the race and look at the outcome. To me, Del Mar is the best surface we've had.

William J Morey Jr: It's a whole different surface. Last year, the mornings were pretty good, but the afternoons, it would get real loose. I'd say the consistency of the track is the same in the morning as the afternoon. I've run on all [the synthetic surfaces in California] and I think this one is the closest to Golden Gate Fields, but it's a little tighter and it's a little better. It has improved big time. If this thing stays like this for the rest of the meet, this is the best synthetic track we've seen in California, I believe. It's playing fair-speed and coming from behind.

Wagering without it is a real gamble.

William E Morey Sr: I ran one horse here last year; she was a speed filly and she was a victim of the slow tiring track and ran way back. It's completely different [this year]. I still think it's got a good cushion to it, but it's much faster. They gave me 12 stalls [at Del Mar this year]. If I thought it was going to be like last year, I might have not brought as many--or any. But it sounded like they had worked on it, put some more water on it, maybe some more wax or something? I don't know the details, but I think they've done some things that have really improved it.

This [track] reminds me a lot of the Tapeta at Golden Gate Fields. I like those two tracks a lot. They're very similar--I train the same at Golden Gate. You train them a little more for stamina than for speed.

John Sadler: It's similar. What I liked about it last year was that it was consistent throughout the meet. With only [two weeks] of racing [so far this year], you really don't have a large enough sample size to make any judgments. The weather made a large difference last year, and we haven't had a really hot day yet.

I'd like to have one surface for the entire circuit. We're going to have Polytrack at Del Mar, Cushion Track at Hollywood, and Pro Ride at Santa Anita. Then you can include Tapeta at Golden Gate. I'd rather see one type of surface in California.

1a Ginger Punch Awesome Again 1-2

The champion ran a lot of very good figures last year, and one great one. This year it looked like she might not be as good until last time, when she ran a negative 3 1/2, the best race of her life and an enormous figure for a mare. In this era of so-called handicaps, she picks up only one pound off an eight-length win in a Grade II, but she still may be vulnerable now. She's almost sure to regress significantly from that strenuous effort, and with five pounds worth one point on the Thoro-Graph scale, Ginger Punch is spotting about two points of weight to the field. All of which will at the very least make it close this time.

2 Inside Passage Tiznow 15-1

Finally broke through to a new top two back, and bounced significantly. She's not fast enough to compete in graded races, and her pattern doesn't indicate she's going anywhere soon.

3 Indescribable Pleasant Tap 15-1

Got good last fall, and even better this spring, running a big one at Keeneland before bouncing last time in her first try for Mott. On her best she would be a borderline contender, but she's only run that well once, and all her good ones were over poly. She has to show she can do it on dirt.

4 Moon Catcher Malibu Moon 5-1

Threw one big figure as a three-year-old for Tim Ritchey, and an even better one this year in her second start for Clement. She bounced last time when she got slaughtered by Ginger Punch after stumbling out of the gate, and the question now is, is it too soon for her to run her best again? If she does, she has a big shot.

5 Copper State Jump Start 10-1

Did a lot of developing to get down to a big one late last year, and when we found out she was for sale this spring, we saw an opportunity to get a filly with graded-stakes ability for a bargain price, and advised Millennium Farm to purchase her. They did, and in her first try for Steve Asmussen she got right back to her best figure while running second to Unbridled Belle. It's tough to know if she'll bounce from that effort, but at the weights, a repeat would put her right in the thick of this. Since it's been pouring rain up at Saratoga, it's also worth noting that Copper State has four siblings that ran the best races of their lives on off tracks.

Runway Rosie Include

8-1

Has developed dramatically since Contessa got his hands on her over the winter. Her last was a return to her top, but the last two times she ran that well she bounced, and even a repeat won't help here. Note that Contessa hasn't done nearly as well at Saratoga as he has overall (see trainer profile).

7 Over Under Seeking the Gold 20-1 Has moved steadily forward, but is still well short of

competitive with these.

8a Spring Waltz Silver Charm 1-2

Jumped up dramatically in December, either because she was getting off polytrack, or because Lynch was getting a lot of horses to jump up last winter. She ran an enormous figure to win an allowance, then actually won a graded stake while bouncing. She came back with a decent effort at Delaware, and it's tough to know what she will do coming back on only two weeks rest, which Frankel rarely tries. On her best, she's a big threat.

Bottom Line--Ginger Punch certainly could win the Go for Wand, but her real odds are more like even money than the much shorter price she will be. Moon Catcher and Copper State both have good shots, and will be decent prices.

I couldn't agree more with Fred Pope on his letter in the Thoroughbred Daily News (Racing's Upside-Down Distribution Model, TDN, 7-17-08) regarding reversing the present wagering platform - which is broken!

Many years ago, Fred Pope, John Gaines, Bill Marquardt, Robert Clay and I discussed the problem confronting racing and the wizard, John Gaines, formed the N.T.A. One hundred prominent owners and breeders put up \$50,000 individually to finance the N.T.A. Unfortunately, the powers to be at the time resisted owners possible power or control and N.T.R.A. was formed, which essentially diffused the efforts of the dissident owners who were eager for a change.

Ten years have passed and the industry has slid into even more difficult problems than were encountered years ago.

The main problem was always that purses were never satisfactory to cover expenses that just kept rising. Integrity, medication control or elimination of drugs, track safety were also issues, but weakness in purses was always the main problem.

The present simulcast distribution system has only made the problem worse! THG efforts are meaningful and in the right direction and all owners should support their efforts, but Fred Pope has the right solution. The tracks should retain the major portion or host fee and the receivers of these signals should receive a commission. The present system rewards the receiver and the people putting on the show get short changed.

My friend, Ed Friendly, who formed T.O.C. in California and who had a distinguished career in T.V. and movies once said, "There should only be two parties at all negotiations regarding racing. One party owns the theaters and the other party owns the films, the horses." Ed was correct and Fred Pope is today!

Owners and breeders need to seize control over the industry that they provide the product for. Owners deserve payment when their product and property is sold via satellite to purchasers all over the world.

The present distribution system does not compensate owners fairly. Listen to Fred Pope. Think about integrity, clean racing, safe surfaces, the health of the horse and proper compensation to those who put on the show. --Gary E. Biszantz, Cobra Farm, Lexington




