





MACHO AGAIN FIGHTS OFF PYRO IN 'DANDY' West Point Thoroughbred's Macho Again (Macho

Uno) was given little chance in yesterday's GII Jim Dandy S. at Saratoga, going postward as the secondlongest shot in the



seven-horse field. But the gray mustered a career-best effort and was able to hold off favored **Pyro** (Pulpit) to earn the halflength tally. "This is my first stakes win as a trainer at Saratoga, so I am very excited," Dallas Stewart said after the race. Reunited with Julien Leparoux,

who guided him to victory in the Derby Trial S. in April, Macho Again was able to angle in and save ground as GI Belmont S. hero **Da' Tara** (Tiznow) and **Mint Lane** (Marian's Mon) sped out and dueled through :23 2/5 and :46 4/5 splits. The former had had enough by the far turn, and Mint Lane was soon tackled by **Tale of Ekai** (Tale of the Cat) and **Tiz Now Tiz Then** (Tizow). Gearing up his challenge in upper stetch, Macho Again found clear running down the center of the track, surged to lead at the furlong grounds and was never in serious danger as Pyro ran on for place honors.

After Mastercraftsman (Ire) (Danehill Dancer {Ire}) and Johnny Murtagh had passed the post 4 1/2 lengths clear in yesterday's G1 Phoenix S. at The Curragh, the only surprise was the starting price of 4-1, as Aidan O'Brien notched up a 15th success at this level in 2008. Allowed to drift in the market by the Kildare faithful, Derrick Smith, Susan Magnier and Michael Tabor's G2 Railway S. scorer made a mockery of the doubts when sweeping to the front before the furlong marker and into daylight, as the even-money favorite Art Connoisseur (Ire) (Lucky Story) was left treading water behind. Street Boss knocked off successive allowance races at Santa Anita this spring, then rallied to take the GIII Los Angeles H. at Hollywood May 10. He was odds-on when victorious in the GI Triple Bend H. July 5 and was offered at relatively generous 2-1 odds here. The plucky chestnut was last of nine as second favorite Barbecue Eddie (Stormy Atlantic) set contested :22 1/5 and :44 3/5 splits. Jockey David Flores opted to go the overland route with Street Boss--the way overland route--and despite coming widest of all the pair finished strongly to register a second Grade I triumph. "I waited and I waited with him," said Flores. "I wasn't going to get him in any trouble. I waited until the corner, then I went straight out with him. And, oh, he finished; did he finish. I've never ridden one that finishes like that. Not on the main track. He's something. He's not a Cadillac; he's a Ferrari." Macho Mans Up...

"He's a good horse, but he needed to step up," trainer Dallas Stewart said just after his colt Macho Again did just that in yesterday's Jim Dandy. Kept relatively busy this year, Macho Again won a Fair Grounds allowance in February, then, after a lackluster effort in the GII Lane's End S. at Turfway, captured the Derby Trial at Churchill Apr. 27. He was a 39-1 bomb when he finished runner-up to Big Brown in the GI Preakness S. May 17, but he was unable to replicate that effort in the GI Belmont S., coming home a well-beaten fifth to Da' Tara. Regarding future plans, Stewart added "The [GI] Travers [S. at Saratoga Aug. 23] would be great if he comes out of this good and everything is good." Steve Asmussen, trainer of runner-up Pryo, said after the race, "We finished second. There is nothing more I can say. Go talk to the winner." Nick Zito, trainer of Da' Tara, blamed the quick early fractions for his colt's lastplace effort "That was a suicide mission," he said. "It didn't work. I don't know what that was all about." Mastercraftsman's victory provided Ballydoyle with a ninth Phoenix win since 1998 and his jockey, Johnny Murtagh, was quick to pay tribute to trainer Aidan O'Brien, who was taking a day off for his son's eventing competition. "He's a genius," Murtagh said. "The way they come out every day for every race --they are 100 percent and never lose a battle." Reached by phone, O'Brien said of the winner, "He has come forward very well over the last few weeks and we're looking forward to stepping him up to seven furlongs now. He could go for the G1 National S. [at The Curragh Sept. 14] and [G3 Tyros S. winner] Rip van Winkle (Ire) could go for the G2 Futurity S. [at The Curragh Aug. 23]."

How the Race Was Won...

Mastercraftsman started out with a hard-fought win over six furlongs at The Curragh May 5 and was pitched into the G2 Railway S. over the same track and trip last time June 29. While his workmanlike shorthead victory over of Alhaban (Ire) (Verglas {Ire}) there did not convince all that he had star potential, his presence as the stable's chosen representative in that important staging post indicated that he was held in high regard. Confirming that here, the chestnut recovered from a tardy break to follow the strong fractions carved out by the aggressively ridden Sea of Marmara (Johannesburg), who was over five lengths clear by halfway. Rolling by his *domestique* before the furlong marker, it was plain sailing after he had turned back the brief threat of Art Connoisseur and Jamie Spencer on the outside. "We wanted to make sure it was a solid race as we always felt a step up to seven would be ideal," jockey Johnny Murtagh said. "His work during the week suggested he was ready and he's a good, progressive horse that is going the right way. The good pace today brought out the best in him--over six furlongs I thought there wouldn't be much between him and Bushranger. but Aidan said this colt had really needed his last race and would go forward from it, so I opted for him. He has a huge stride, covers a lot of ground and gets horses in trouble, but although he might look like he would get a mile, I wouldn't be so sure as he has loads of speed." Jamie Spencer admitted he was disappointed with the effort of Art Connoisseur and said, "I was happy enough until I moved out and, after quickening nicely, he emptied out very quickly in the final furlong. That was the disappointing part of the race and time will tell whether he has run his race or not. The winner was the better horse and looks the best two-year-old out, but in all of his races up to now he has finished well and he was walking in the last 100 yards."

Linngari left Sir Michael Stoute's care after victory in the 2005 Listed Superior Mile at Haydock and was conditioned by Herman Brown and Diego Lowther until joining Alain de Royer-Dupre last year. Running fourth on debut for de Royer-Dupre in the Sept. 9 G1 Prix du

Moulin at Longchamp, he dropped to ninth in the Oct. 6 G1 Prix de la Foret back at the Bois de Boulogne track before claiming a career high in the Oct. 21 Premio Vittorio di Capua at Milan. Returned to Herman Brown for a Spring campaign at Nad Al Sheba in Dubai, he won a Jan. 24 conditions event, ran

fourth in the Feb. 21 G2 Al Fahidi Fort and was 14th in the Mar. 29 G1 Dubai Duty Free. He was reacquainted with Stoute for another European campaign and was beaten under four lengths by Haradasun (Aus) in the June 17 G1 Queen Anne S. at Royal Ascot last time, but rebounded in style to register a second top-level score here. Reserved off the pace in eighth from the outset, Linngari made smooth progress off the home turn to challenge approaching the final furlong and found extra gears under a drive in the closing stages to best a quality field. "I was quite sure he would manage the trip," said winning part-owner Rupert Plersch. "He had an excellent race and the jockey did everything just perfectly right," he added. 

With a brace of juvenile scores at his home track Newmarket, Twice Over entered winter guarters with a Classic campaign very much on the itinerary. Hopes were raised by a brave victory at the expense of Raven's Pass in the G3 Craven S. back at the Rowley Mile course on seasonal return Apr. 17, but G1 Epsom Derby aspirations were dashed by defeat, albeit a valiant one, in the May 15 G2 Dante S. at York in his penultimate start. He came back to finish a commendable third behind Henrythenavigator and old foe Raven's Pass in the G1 St James's Palace S. at Royal Ascot last time June 17 and regained the winning thread with a career high here. Twice Over was restrained in midfield and remained on the inside through the early fractions. Making rapid headway once into the straight, he quickened to the front with 350 meters remaining and refused to surrender thereafter, running on strongly under a drive to hold the late thrust of City Leader. Trainer Henry Cecil, responsible for previous winners Dr Fong and Burning Sun, said, "He ran well in the [one-mile] St James's Palace S. last time when they broke the track record and he needed a little bit further than that. He's [still] very immature and will be a better horse next year. We will take our time to decide on his program from here, but he's in everything and I'll feel my way with him. It was my turn to win, as it was only my third victory, whereas Andre Fabre has already won it 11 times. This was an important victory today." City Leader filled the exacta for the British raiding party and conditioner Brian Meehan was gracious in defeat, "Twice Over is a very good horse and it's no bad thing to finish second to him," he said. "City Leader is back on track and kept on well in the straight. He ran well over 10 furlongs here and I don't think going further will be a problem. 

Italy has enjoyed a creditable record in this contest since Rolly Polly (Ire)'s victory at the turn of the millennium and can boast runner-up finishes for Slap Shot (Ire) in 2001, Shifting Place (GB) in 2004, Golden Titus (Ire) for Armando Renzoni in 2006 and Magritte (Ity) last year. Renzoni continued the trend here and improved upon his own personal record by saddling Lui Rei to claim the prize at the expense of Britain's speedball Percolator in a thrilling renewal. Opening his account in a Rome conditions event Apr. 27, Lui Rei ran second in the Listed Premio Alberto Giubilo back at the Capannelle June 2 and benefitted from Sweet Hearth's spectacular exit through the rails when going one better in the G3 Premio Primi Passi at Milan's San Siro last time June 22. Occupying an open lane in third after the break here, he inched ever closer from halfway and would not be denied under a final-furlong drive to deny the trailblazing Percolator in the dying strides. "We have always thought he was a good horse and his easy win in Italy last time encouraged us to come for this race," explained Renzoni. "He is just about the best I have trained, even better than Golden Titus, I think. The G1 Prix Morny [at Deauville Aug. 24] is a possibility and he will be entered for that. However, he is not a certain runner as we want to avoid too much traveling, so he might remain in Italy for his next run." Paul Cole's dual record-breaker Percolator lost no caste in defeat, but the trainer conceded a fourth journey across the English Channel may have taken its toll, saying, "The ground was also a little too fast I think, but she still ran a very good race. She is undoubtedly feeling the effects of so much traveling between England and France, so she will have a break now for sure." DESORMEAUX HITS THE 5,000 PLATEAU Jockey Kent Desormeaux won the 5,000th race of his career after guiding **Bella Attrice** (Tomorrows Cat) to victory in the driving rain in yesterday's seventh race at Saratoga. "Last week, I was thinking it was just another number,

that." Of all his victories, Desormeaux was able to Adam Coglianese select two that meant the most to him. "My first win [aboard Miss Tavern at Evangeline Downs on July 13, 1986 and my first Kentucky Derby [on Real Quiet in 1998] are the two I hold close to my heart," said Desormeaux, 38, who is the 23rd jockey to reach the mark. The native of Maurice, La., has twice come within one race of sweeping the Triple Crown, winning the GI Kentucky Derby and GI Preakness S. with Real Quiet in 1998 and with Big Brown this year. Between those wins was his 2000 Derby triumph aboard Fusaichi Pegasus. Desormeaux has three Breeders' Cup victories to his credit, most recently the Dirt Mile aboard Corinthian. He has received three Eclipse Awards, earning outstanding apprentice jockey honors in 1987 and was the outstanding jockey award of 1989 and 1992. He continues to hold the record for the most number of wins in a year, having captured 599 races in 1989, shattering Chris McCarron's previous mark of 546. In 1995, at the age of 25, he became the youngest rider to win 3,000 races. Wherever he has gone, Desormeaux has found success, having won riding titles at Oak Tree, Santa Anita, Hollywood Park, Del Mar, Laurel, Pimlico, and Tokyo. He finished one win behind Cornelio Velasguez at last year's Saratoga meet. During his 2001 stint in Japan, Desormeaux became the first foreign rider to win a Japanese classic, guiding Lady Pastel (Jpn) to victory in the Japanese Oaks. He was elected into the Racing Hall of Fame in 2004. Desormeaux and his wife, Sonia, have two sons, Joshua and Jacob.


