Owner Jess Jackson and his wife, Barbara Banke, were on hand yesterday to watch **Curlin** (Smart Strike) work an easy five furlongs over Saratoga's Oklahoma training track. The big chestnut stopped the clock in

1:03.99, ninth fastest of 11 at the distance. Exercise rider Carmen Rosas was in the irons. Trainer Steve Asmussen watched as well, and admitted afterwards of still being in awe of his stable star. "He's such a tremendous horse," said Asmussen. "The remarkable thing about him is, when you watch him come back, you can't tell whether he's jogged, galloped or breezed. He's got an air

about him, he sure does." Curlin is coming off a second-place effort to Red Rocks (Ire) in his first test on the turf in the GI Man o'War at Belmont Park July 12. Asmussen said he has had several discussions with Jackson as to whether Curlin's future will be on the turf or on the dirt, but that nothing had been decided. Among several possibilities are Saratoga's GI Sword Dancer Invitational on the turf Aug. 16. or the GI Woodward S. Aug. 30. "Everything is up in the air," said Asmussen.

# GLORIOUS GOODWOOD KICKS OFF TODAY

The Glorious Goodwood meeting begins its five-day stand this afternoon, with a trio of group races kicking things off. The highlight of the day is the seven-furlong G2 Lennox S., which finds the sophomore filly Infallible (GB) (Pivotal {GB}) taking on the boys after runner-up finishes in the G1 Coronation S. at Royal Ascot June 20 and in the G1 Falmouth S. on Newmarket's July Course July 9. "She has run very well this year, and a mile has really tested her, so the drop back to seven furlongs seems logical," trainer John Gosden told *PA Sport*. "I have been very pleased with her since the Falmouth." Cont. p4

### A Return to Form...

Kodiak Kowboy was one of the best juveniles in North America last term, reeling off four straight wins over the summer in a skein that included the Victoria S. at Woodbine, the GIII Bashford Manor S, at Churchill and the GII Saratoga Special S. here at Saratoga. He fell a length short in the GII Futurity S. at Belmont in September, then concluded his two-year-old campaign with a third to War Pass in the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile. Named champion two-year-old colt in Canada, Kodiak Kowboy kicked off 2008 the right way, winning an Oaklawn allowance by six lengths in March, but he could do no better than fourth as the chalk in the Lafayette S. over Keeneland's Polytrack Apr. 6. He failed to see out the final yards of the 7 1/2-furlong Derby Trial S. at Churchill Apr. 26, when Macho Again surged late to win by half a length, an effort that gained credibility when that rival ran second in the GI Preakness S. and then captured Sunday's GII Jim Dandy S. Yesterday's victory should set up Kodiak Kowboy for the sevenfurlong, Aug. 23 Gl King's Bishop S. at Saratoga, according to Larry Jones. "Kodiak Kowboy needed this race, since it had been a while since he had run," he said. "The King's Bishop is our target. It would be nice to win it again this year." # PROMISING LEAD TO MISS NASSAU


Khalid Abdullah's G1 Pretty Polly S. scorer **Promising Lead (GB)** (Danehill) was yesterday ruled out of Saturday's G1 Nassau S. at Goodwood after suffering a setback. The owner-breeder's Racing Manager Teddy Grimthorpe announced yesterday that the Sir Michael Stoute-trained four-year-old had injured a knee in work and that **Passage of Time (GB)** (Dansili {GB}) would be the stable's sole representative.

"She just tweaked a knee after she worked so well on Saturday," he told *PA Sport*. "It doesn't look like it will keep her out for long, or that it is anything serious, but there is a little bit of heat there. We have decided not to risk her and she will go straight to York for the [Aug. 21] G1 Yorkshire Oaks now. We hope Passage of Time is a useful substitute and she showed last time that she is still capable."

Trainer Jim Bolger has left in his G1 Coronation S. heroine Lush Lashes (GB) (Galileo {Ire}) in the 10-furlong contest, while Aidan O'Brien has five fillies remaining, headed by Michael Tabor, Derrick Smith and Susan Magnier's G1 Irish 1000 Guineas winner Halfway to Heaven (Ire) (Pivotal {GB}). Cheveley Park Stud look set to be represented by the G1 Falmouth S. third Heaven Sent (GB) (Pivotal {GB}), while Patricia and David Thompson's operation withdrew the James Fanshawetrained G1 1000 Guineas runner-up Spacious (GB) (Nayef) at yesterday's five-day stage.

The Stud's Managing Director Chris Richardson told *PA Sport* yesterday, "I believe Spacious is fine in herself, but she just isn't sparkling. We have taken the long-term view and are not going to rush her back. James will freshen her up and get her ready for an autumn campaign."

MONTMARTRE DOUBTFUL FOR ARC His Highness the Aga Khan's Montmartre (Fr) (Montjeu {Ire}) is rated "doubtful" for the Oct. 5 G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe at Longchamp after reportedly returning "sore" from his win in the July 14 G1 Grand Prix de Paris. Trainer Alain de Royer-Dupre told sportinglife.com yesterday, "He won brilliantly, but he wasn't okay after the race. The ground was very firm and he came back a little bit sore. Maybe he still runs in the Arc, but at this stage I am not sure. He is doubtful." Montmartre propelled himself to early favoritism for the Fall highlight with his four-length victory over the same course and distance. "The Grand Prix was run in a very fast time and on very fast ground and the race has left its mark," his conditioner told the Racing Post.



TUSCAN APPEAL LOST Trainer John Murphy yesterday failed in his appeal to reinstate Tuscan Evening (Ire) (Oasis Dream {GB}) to the runner-up spot in the G1 Irish 1000 Guineas. Hubie deBurgh's maiden was disqualified and placed fourth by the Curragh stewards after the May 25 Classic and the Irish Turf Club upheld that decision. "They felt that interference did take place and that in causing the interference Tuscan Evening had improved her placing with regard to Carribean Sunset (Ire)," the organisation's Press Officer Cliff Noone explained.

Infallible reverts to the seven-furlong trip over which she was so impressive when winning Newmarket's G3 Nell Gwyn S. Apr. 16. Subsequently fourth in the G1 1000 Guineas at that venue May 4, she found only Lush Lashes (GB) too strong in the G1 Coronation S. and Nahoodh (Ire) in the G1 Falmouth S. last time. She represents the John Gosden stable, which was successful with Observatory in the inaugural edition in the millennium year. "She will have a little holiday after this run until mid-September," Gosden revealed, "when she could come back for the [Sept. 13] G2 Park S. at Doncaster or the [Oct. 4] G1 Prix de la Foret at Longchamp." Tariq (GB) scored for trainer Peter Chapple-Hyam 12 months ago and he is represented by Al Qasi this time. He was behind Arabian Gleam when the duo were fifth and eighth, respectively, in the G1 Lockinge S. at Newbury May 17 before finding only Jumbajukiba (GB) too strong in the July 12 G3 Minstrel S. at The Curragh. Chapple-Hyam is hoping for some easing in ground conditions for the five-year-old. "I was very happy with his last run in Ireland and we are stepping him back up in class here, but he probably needs some rain to guarantee his participation," Chapple-Hyam said. Godolphin registered wins with Byron (GB) in 2004 and Iffraaj (GB) two years later and rely on II Warrd.



Flashmans Papers renews rivalry with Spin Cycle here after finishing two places behind that rival when fourth in the G2 Norfolk S. at Royal Ascot last time June 19. That effort came just two days after his defeat of the subsequent G3 Anglesey S. scorer Bushranger (Ire) in the Listed Windsor Castle S. on the opening card at the Royal meeting and trainer John Best is hoping he can make his presence felt again here. "Flashmans Papers ran two great races at Ascot and he's been in great form since," he told PA Sport. "The draw hasn't been kind to us. We're stuck out wide and that won't help. but he's a good horse in great form and, hopefully, he'll run a big race." Godolphin include a fascinating contender in the impressive Yarmouth maiden winner Global City and trainer Saeed bin Suroor thinks he can make the grade. "He won last time out at Yarmouth and I think he has learned from the race," he commented. "He deserves the chance to go for a group race and five furlongs is his ideal trip. He is in good form and there will be no excuses for him, apart from the rise in class."

Thanks to the omnipresence of his descendants on big race days, it seems hardly credible that it is now more than five years since the mighty Danehill died at the age of 17. By the time of his death, Danehill was the highest-priced stallion in Europe, with his status

boosted to new heights by the 2002 Group 1 victories of Rock of Gibraltar, Landseer, Banks Hill, Aquarelliste, Fine Motion, Spartacus and Dress to Thrill. Needless to say, the book of mares he was covering at the time of his death was in very different league from those he'd attracted

when his fee was as low as IR9,000gns in his fourth and fifth seasons. Even when his fee was low, Danehill was still capable of siring performers of the calibre of Desert King and Tiger Hill, so what might he achieve with many of the best mares in Europe?

The answer is that--from a crop of around 100--he has so far sired nine group winners, five listed winners and another eight which have been group-placed. Altogether 25 have earned black type. Five of the group winners have collectively won 13 Group 1 events, with Duke of Marmalade's epic King George victory making him the second to complete a sequence of four Group 1 triumphs, following Peeping Fawn.

The group winners from Danehill's final crop encapsulate the full range of his extraordinary talents. At one end of the spectrum there is Holy Roman Emperor, a fast and precocious colt who was officially rated the second-best European juvenile of 2006 (when another of Danehill's Group 1 winners, Simply Perfect, ranked third among the juvenile fillies). Peeping Fawn was far from precocious (it took her four starts to break her maiden at three), but she developed into Europe's best middle-distance three-year-old filly, with two Group 1 victories over 11/4 miles, including the Pretty Polly S., and another two over 11/2 miles. Unfortunately, she hasn't raced this year, but the Pretty Polly S. fell to Promising Lead, another of Danehill's daughters, and Duke of Marmalade has also excelled, with Group 1 victories in France, Ireland and England (2).

Duke of Marmalade's magnificent sequence inevitably makes one wonder what he might have achieved but for fracturing a pastern when narrowly defeated at Goodwood two years ago. Although he was officially rated just 9lb below the best of his age group after a winless campaign at three, the subsequent removal of the screws from his old injury has helped transform him. He is now a worthy replacement for the year-older Dylan Thomas, the rock-hard colt who provided Danehill with his first King George success a year ago.

A day after the King George we saw another aspect of Danehill's talents in the Phoenix S., a Group 1 juvenile event which has fallen to four of Danehill's sons. One of the four, Danehill Dancer, was responsible for Mastercraftsman, who won impressively to end the unbeaten record of Art Connoisseur, a colt out of a Danehill mare. Third place went to Bushranger, another grandson of Danehill.

Duke of Marmalade will eventually be a very welcome addition to the Coolmore roster, as he comes from a female line with a big reputation for producing stallions.

You can gauge the family's reputation from the fact that Duke of Marmalade's dam, Love Me True, cost \$1.35 million as a yearling--and from the fact that she was bought on behalf of Susan Magnier. Aidan O'Brien, with his quaint belief that racehorses are for racing if they are fit and well, certainly didn't let the filly's price affect his handling of this daughter of Kingmambo.

It was only on her 11th start that Love Me True finally recorded her first victory, in a mile maiden at Naas, by which time she had been third in the G3 Killavullan S. at two and had acted as a pacemaker for her stablemate Imagine in the Irish 1000 Guineas. Incidentally, of the 16 contestants in that 2001 classic, as many as four have already produced a top-class son, namely Imagine (Horatio

Nelson), Sequoyah (Henrythenavigator), Speirhbean (Teofilo) and Love Me True (Duke of Marmalade). Two of the others have 2008 stakes winners by Danehill Dancer, one being the Irish 1000 Guineas third Carribean Sunset. This suggests strongly that breeders with sufficient resources could do far worse than get themselves a speedy classic filly to breed from.

Love Me True was later third in a listed race over a mile and ran well enough in one of her starts over 11/4 miles to suggest she stayed that far. It is worth pointing out that Love Me True's three-parts brother Lemon

Drop Kid stayed well enough to win the GI Belmont S., so there is the degree of stamina here which Danehill normally needed to get a mile-and-a-half horse.

Love Me True also proved her toughness, racing 15 times in less than 14 months, even though she is inbred 3x3 to the famously fragile Raise A Native, and toughness is also one of the main assets of Duke of Marmalade (whose five-generation pedigree includes two lines apiece to Northern Dancer, Buckpasser and Natalma and four lines to Native Dancer.).

Two of Love Me True's half-brothers, Bite the Bullet and Shuailaan, were stakes winners, but the most important aspect of her pedigree is that she is a granddaughter of the blue hen Lassie Dear. Perhaps all I need

to say about this family is that it has produced five stallions good enough to sire a winner on Breeders' Cup Day, with A.P. Indy being responsible for Tempera, Summer Squall for Storm Song, Honor Grades for Adoration, Deerhound for Countess Diana and Kipling for Kip Deville.

This family has achieved so much in the USA that the Coolmore team should perhaps consider basing Duke of Marmalade at Ashford, where there are no sons of Danehill, rather than Coolmore, where he would become one of seven Group 1-winning sons of Danehill. After all, Love Me True was relocated to Kentucky, where she produced foals to Storm Cat in 2006 and 2007. How-

ever, the continued uncertainty about how many tracks will be converted to synthetic surfaces must make it more likely that Ireland will become Duke of Marmalade's base.

The fact that he is by Danehill and has a Kingmambo mare as his dam will make him an automatic choice for many breeders with daughters of the champion broodmare sire Sadler's Wells. It was Sadler's Wells mares which produced Peeping Fawn and Horatio Nelson to Danehill, and Danehill's daughters are currently doing very well with Sadler's Wells's son Galileo. Combining Sadler's Wells with Kingmambo is also very much in vogue, Henrythenavigator and the Group 2 winner Campanologist being the latest advertisements for this.

That was a little disappointing. What Alan should have done, and I love Alan, but he should have let [Eibar] Coa go and sit off him, instead of having Coa sitting off him. It was a terrible situation. My horse can run a distance of ground, he proved it, but you can't run :46 and run a distance of ground." Zito added that he expected a better finish from Anak Nakal, considering the way the race unfolded. "He should have been right there," said Zito. "Maybe he was slipping and sliding. You know, when you seal the track and then unseal it--and I'm happy they opened it up--maybe that particular horse, he didn't like it."

"That's three seconds in very nice races this week, which is kind of the theme of it," said Asmussen, who added, "I'm disappointed Pyro didn't win. He ran hard. It could have unfolded for him a lot differently. He was shuffled back farther than he wanted to be early, and it's so hard to make up ground here. The track was playing pretty funny right then. Had it rained more, or not rained at all, it might have been a little more favorable. With that being said, he ran second to a nice horse and he needs to run back better."
