It was closer than most expected, but Henrythenavigator (Kingmambo) had the call over Raven's Pass (Elusive Quality) at the end of a pulsating renewal of Goodwood's G1 Sussex S. yesterday. Sent

off the shortest-priced favorite since 1959, Susan Magnier's G1 English and Irish 2000 Guineas and G1 St James's Palace S. winner made the takers of 4-11 sweat as he failed to shake off his arch-rival after sweeping to the front passing the quarter

pole, but he kept finding more for a head verdict. "The good ones have everything and he was up for a battle," Johnny Murtagh said after guiding home Ballydoyle's 16th Group 1 winner of 2008. "They probably didn't go quick enough for him and he was in front soon enough, but when he hit the line, he was still full of running and won snug." Cont. p2

LAVA MAN RETIRED

Multi-millionaire **Lava Man** (Slew City Slew--Li'l Ms. Leonard, by Nostalgia's Star), whose racing future

seemed uncertain after his last-place effort in the GI Eddie Read H. at Del Mar July 20, has been retired. The seven-year-old underwent a complete examination at Alamo Pintado Equine Medical Center in Los Olivos, California; X-rays revealed the condition of his front ankles differed significantly from those taken earlier in 2008. "When we heard about the results of the X-rays, the decision was easy," said co-owner Steve Kenly. "It was time to call it a day. We

sent him up there to make sure he was OK and if not, we knew we'd retire him." Trainer Doug O'Neill added, "It's been wonderful to be around such a great champion. He'll be missed, but I'm going to put in my vote for him to be our stable pony." Lava Man was claimed by STD Stable and Jason Wood and O'Neill for \$50,000 at Del Mar in 2004, surely the most profitable claim in racing history. The Cal-bred gelding went on to win seven Grade I races, and compiled a career bankroll of \$5,268,706; over \$5.1 million of that came for his current owners. He won three straight renewals of the GI Hollywood Gold Cup, from 2005-2007, as well as the 2006 and 2007 editions of the GI Santa Anita H. and the 2006 GI Pacific Classic and GI Charles Whittingham Memorial H. Winless since last year's Gold Cup, Lava Man seemed to regain his form with a game third-place effort in the June 7 Whittingham, but he gave way in the Eddie Read, prompting a complete physical examination. The popular runner's record stands at 46-17-8-5.

Henrythenavigator arrived on the picturesque Sussex Downs in the shadow of Rock of Gibraltar (Ire), the colossus who achieved the quartet of both the English and Irish Guineas, St James's Palace and Sussex in 2002. Despite being one short of matching that considerable achievement, the latest legend off the Ballydoyle conveyor belt had already been placed above the "Rock" by Aidan O'Brien in a recent interview. His battling nose defeat of New Approach (Ire) in Newmarket's G1 2000 Guineas and much easier disposal of that subsequent G1 Epsom Derby hero in The Curragh's equivalent three weeks later had preceded a 3/4-length verdict over Raven's Pass at the Royal meeting last time June 17. Many were expecting fireworks here and that confidence was reflected in his odds, but soon after his pacemaker Windsor Palace (Danehill Dancer {Ire}) made hard work of establishing the early fractions, the race took a different shape. But the advantage that the favorite had over Raven's Pass as they tracked the

moderate pace proved decisive. Allowing Major Cadeaux a short lead, Murtagh pressed the button with a quarter mile remaining and, after his mount swamped that rival in a matter of strides. he was made to stretch all the way to the line. "The lack of pace was against him

and I didn't want to take any chances in a slowly run race, but when he got to the front he was waiting on Raven's Pass and was not going to stop," said Murtagh. "He is more impressive than that, and although he is very similar to Rock of Gibraltar, he probably has a bit more of a turn of foot." Aidan O'Brien has plenty of options for his charge, including the G1 Prix Jacques le Marois at Deauville Aug. 17, G1 Queen Elizabeth II S. at Ascot Sept. 27 and GI Breeders' Cup Classic at Santa Anita Oct. 25. "He's a very special horse--a great traveler who is very tough and quickens very well," O'Brien explained. "He got beaten on very heavy ground last year, so that's the thing we've got to keep an eye on, but he's a hardy horse who enjoys racing, so the Jacques le Marois is a definite possible before the Queen Elizabeth II. The lad who rides him every day said, before the Guineas, that he felt like a dirt horse, so the Breeders' Cup Classic is a definite possible." Not for Passing...

For connections of Raven's Pass, it was a similar story after chasing home Henrythenavigator once again, but the Stonerside homebred may have had excuses. "The winner is exceptional, but we drew the rail today and that is compromising," trainer John Gosden commented. "I didn't think Aidan's pacemaker was up to the usual standard and we decided in the end we had no choice but to get off the rail and come round, but Henrythenavigator is a tough horse to give a lengthand-a-half start to. We're thrilled with and proud of the horse and he has put in a great run." According to www.stonerside.com, the homebred chestnut could have one more start in Europe before heading to Santa Anita for the Breeders' Cup. The connections of thirdplace finisher Major Cadeaux are looking at the G2 Hungerford S. at Newbury Aug. 16 and G1 Prix Jacques le Marois.


Orizaba was sent off the 11-4 favorite for Royal Ascot's G2 Coventry S. on the basis of a nine-length debut success at Newbury May 16, but failed to live up to expectations when fifth in that June 17 contest. Rested subsequently, the bay rebounded with a hard-fought score here to justify the purchase of Sheikh Hamdan bin Mohammed AI Maktoum prior to the Royal meeting. Settled wide in the middle of the pack by Frankie Dettori throughout the early stages, he swooped by Sayif passing the eighth pole before asserting from Lord Shanakill. "He just went a bit weak at Ascot and today won like a nice stayer," said Dettori, who was steering home his fourth winner of this prize. "He'll be a nice horse for next year, and I was pleased to see his best work coming at the end."

Trainer Mick Channon added, "It was a terrible spring and it's always difficult for two-year-olds, but the British ones have been moderate right across the board to me so far this year and this colt might be above them. He just went through a growing stage before Ascot and he didn't have the perfect preparation for the Coventry, so we gave him time and he had been working well. We'll keep him until the autumn now and the decent races like the G1 Dewhurst S. [at Newmarket Oct. 18] or G1 Racing Post Trophy [at Doncaster Oct. 25]." Connections of the runner-up are looking at the G2 Futurity S. at The Curragh Aug. 23 or G2 Champagne S. at Doncaster Sept. 13.

Yeats returns to the venue at which he was successful two years ago on the crest of a wave, having landed a third consecutive renewal of the G1 Gold Cup. His five-length defeat of Geordieland (Fr) in that June 19 Royal Ascot marathon hammered home his dominance of this sphere and, on paper, he should have little to fear from that day's fifth- and sixth-place finishers Sagara and Regal Flush. "He's had a little break since Ascot and we've not done a lot with him, but he seems in great form," Aidan O'Brien told PA Sport. The Gold Cup also-rans represent the Godolphin team responsible for the 1999 winner Kayf Tara (GB) and trainer Saeed bin Suroor is hoping for improvement on their recent efforts. "Both horses have been disappointing this year, although they produced good performances over 2 1/2 miles at Royal Ascot," bin Suroor said. "Regal Flush is in good form and I am happy with him. I think that two miles will suit him." Luca Cumani is hoping to saddle the recent Old Newton Cup winner Mad Rush, but needs to see rain. "He won't run on good to firm," he told PA Sport. "He would go there with every chance, but I can't see him beating Yeats--he's the undisputed king of the Cups--but hopefully he'll run a good race." Sir Michael Stoute saddles the 2005 winner Distinction, who took the July 5 Listed Esher S. at Sandown following his 1 1/2-length defeat by Ballydoyle's second string Honolulu in Royal Ascot's Queen Alexandra S. June 21. "Sir Michael Stoute has been very pleased with him since he won at Sandown and although it's a very tough race, he traveled well for a long way last year on a comeback from injury, when we thought he'd blow up much sooner than he did," Highclere Throughbred Racing's Harry Herbert told PA Sport.

CRY AND CATCH ME RETURNS TODAY

TDN Rising Star" Cry and Catch Me (Street Cry {Ire}), unraced since taking the GI Oak Leaf S. last September, makes her return in the seventh race at Del Mar today. She broke her maiden by 6 1/4 lengths over the seaside oval last August, and bested Izarra by a nose in the Oak Leaf. She shipped to Monmouth for the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies, but came down with a fever and had to miss the race. "We had to leave her [at Monmouth] for a month," trainer Bob Baffert told Daily Racing Form. "She got sick from the shipping. Then she got a shin on her and needed four months off. Coming back from a long layoff, she looks good." The threeyear-old faces eight rivals in the 6 1/2-furlong optional claimer, including GI Del Mar Debutante heroine Set Play (Van Nistelrooy). The chestnut, 11th in the Juvenile Fillies, ended the year with a third in the Nov. 24 GIII Miesque S. on grass and a fourth in the GI Hollywood Starlet S. on the Cushion Dec. 15. She has been out once since, running fourth in the Feb. 2 GIII La Habra S. on the Santa Anita lawn. Click for brisnet.com PPs.

"We are thrilled to be participating in such a great cause," said Michael lavarone,

co-president of IEAH. "This is a great way to give back to our industry." IEAH was the sponsor and guest at the nonprofit's second Annual Day at the Races charity luncheon at Monmouth Park June 21, where they were joined by Dr. Patty Hogan, VMD. Hogan will be the head surgeon of the new Ruffian Equine Medical Center at Belmont Park, which is being built by IEAH. Busto hopes that participation in the Running for ReRun program by Big Brown's connections will encourage other racehorse owners to join the program. "This is a great way for owners to give back to the horses in the industry and help ReRun so that we can make available to them the more humane alternative to auctions. Plenty of owners care about the future of their retired horses and will make the right choice of placing them in ReRun's adoption program, but we have to have the funds and resources to keep that option open to them." NTRA REPORT FROM CAPITOL HILL

NEW FEDERAL LEGISLATION INTRODUCED

On Tuesday, July 29, a bill was introduced in the U.S. House of Representatives that would eliminate the automatic 25% federal withholding on pari-mutuel winnings of \$5,000 or more. The Pari-Mutuel Conformity and Equality Act of 2008 (H.R. 6631) is sponsored by Rep. Charles W. Boustany, Jr. (R-LA).

The federal withholding threshold last changed in 1992 when it was raised from \$1,000 to the current \$5,000 level. Exotic wagering has grown rapidly since then and now accounts for two-thirds of all wagers placed. These bets often have high odds and high potential returns, which makes this legislation critical to horseplayers who have long suffered from an unfair loss of available capital. That loss of reinvestment or "churn" leads to lower wagering levels and, subsequently, less revenue generated for state governments, racetracks and purse money for horsemen.

The NTRA now is actively seeking a Democratic cosponsor for the new bill and will work closely with the new Horseplayers' Coalition to help organize grass-roots communications in support of its passage.

DE ROYER-DUPRE DUO SET FOR DEAUVILLE

TEST Sabana Perdida (Ire) (Cape Cross (Ire)) and Darjina (Fr) (Zamindar) are set to contest Sunday's G1 Prix Rothschild at Deauville, according to trainer Alain de Royer-Dupre. Scuderia Zaro's G2 Windsor Forest S. winner Sabana Perdida and Princess Zahra Aga Khan's G1 Queen Anne S. runner-up will form a strong hand in the mile contest, previously known as the Prix d'Astarte. "Sabana Perdida is very fresh, because she has only had two starts all season. Darjina is the same as Sabana Perdida, because she also needs better ground. It was disappointing that it rained prior to the Falmouth S., but it is better to wait rather than risk her once again." Heading the opposition is Stefan Friborg's G1 1000 Guineas heroine Natagora (Fr) (Divine Light {Jpn}). Trainer Pascal Bary issued an upbeat bulletin on the gray, who is returning from a break having finished third in the G1 Prix du Jockey-Club at Chantilly June 1. "She is looking beautiful, goes well on a straight track and also on any type of ground," Bary told Racing Post. "Christophe Lemaire will be back in the saddle."

Mr. Oppenheim's columns have always been of great interest to me, particularly his pedigree work, which are always well reasoned and insightful. In [Wednesday]'s column he ventures into treacherous waters. He ventures out of his bailiwick and, perhaps forgivably (after all he is human) gets it wrong. Perhaps his emotions, due to his personal involvement with one of the subject horses and his personal relationship with the manager of both horses, have clouded his ability to view these very different situations clearly and dispassionately. One is ruled upon with a subjective standard, the other with an objective standard.

If he wants, as he says in his column, uniformity in rules, how does he reconcile that with allowing one horse (as he suggested Green Girl should have been) to not carry her weight in the post parade while the others must? Clearly the rule mandates uniformity for good reason; to avoid an unfair advantage to any horse. Green Girl did not comply with the rule and was rightly disqualified. I agree with Mr. Oppenheim on the other subjective decision after having watched the race many times and being familiar with the diverse approaches taken by various racing jurisdictions, including the standard applied in that case. Again, the Stewards exhibited their fallibility. A uniform approach to the adjudication of fouls occurring during the running of the race needs to be addressed internationally.

There is no need to change the paddock to post rule, however, as it is virtually universally in place and easy to apply by competent stewards. Either the objective evidence proves that the horse (in this case the filly) carried the weight paddock to post and over the route of the post parade(unless excused in advance) or it (she) didn't. Mr. Greely saw it clearly and made the right decision. The Stewards were not about to reverse themselves for myriad reasons, including their mistaken decision to let Green Girl run in the Suwannee River Handicap in first place.

I have represented many, many owners and trainers before the Stewards in over two dozen jurisdictions and in foreign countries in a wide variety of disqualification cases. In fact, I represented Gary Zwerling, owner of La Dolce Vita, the filly declared the official winner, in the Suwannee River Handicap case. I respectfully disagree with Mr. Oppenheim's comment that the rule applied by Mr. Greeley was "absurd" and that his friend Patrick Cooper was "victimized." Mr. Oppenheim ought to be able to put himself in Gary Zwerling's position for a moment and understand how important a Graded Stakes win is to the value of a horse as it appears forever in the pedigree reports and catalog pages he routinely pores over, that it was the final race of La Dolce Vita's career and she would have been denied her rightful (and only) Graded Stakes win had the order of finish not been reversed. The evidence was overwhelming that Mr. Douglas was off his mount's back for at least ten minutes and did not present her to the starter having carried the assigned weight paddock to post, including the post parade (from which she was not excused) as is required by Florida's (and most, if not all other jurisdiction's) rules.

Bill Oppenheim's response:

The same was true of Green Girl--it would have been her only graded stakes win. It may be true that most jurisdictions in the U.S. have that rule, but I don't believe it is the case in Europe; at least, I have seen countless horses who have tossed their riders in European races and been neither scratched nor disqualified; as I wrote at the time, I thinks it's just as likely that Green Girl was disadvantaged by losing her rider and running around fretting--something that can't be quantified in pounds. Absolutely, my comments were subjective, not objective, and absolutely true, I'm no lawyer. I concede Bill Greely read the rule and said, yep, that's what the rule says. But I don't believe the rule is just. Cont. p8

I'm not arguing for one minute that natural justice does prevail, but that it should. I am not persuaded by Joel's comments; the rules may have been followed, but I still maintain it is a bad--no, an absurd--rule.

By the way, the fact that Patrick is a friend of mine really has nothing to do with my position. I would have been just as adamant in my position had Gary Zwerling owned Green Girl and Ronchalon owned La Dolce Vita. The really ironic thing, as Gary wrote me in an email after my original comments, is that I had actually suggested the mating of La Dolce Vita. I'm pleased that it worked out for Gary, but I wish it had been under different circumstances. But I do think it's time to smoke the peace pipe on this. The decisions have been made, and I've said my piece. If we all agree international uniformity would be better for everybody, let's use this opportunity to all push in that direction--and whether the new international rules are pillar-to-post, automatic disqualifications for collisions, or whatever, the really important thing is that the industry recognizes that inconsistencies are bad for our business.

VANMETER'S GOT A SECRET

As most of the Thoroughbred world focuses on Saratoga this weekend, consignor Tom VanMeter will have at lease one eye on New Jersey. And not on

Monmouth Park, site of Sunday's GI Haskell Invitational. No, VanMeter, who runs Eaton Sales with Reiley McDonald, will be keeping close tabs on the Meadowlands, where a colt he owns in partnership goes for harness racing's most coveted prize, the \$1.5 million Hambletonian, on Saturday night. The colt, named Celebrity Secret, is up against his nemesis and heavy favorite Deweycheatumnhowe, whom he ran second to in last year's Breeders' Crown.

It is only VanMeter's second foray into Standardbred racing,

and his involvement directly stems for an unsuccessful first try with the jugheads.

"A couple of years ago, me and some buddies bought a [Standardbred] filly from Bob Brady, who runs Kentuckiana Farms," VanMeter explained. "She was a really well-bred filly. We trained her for two or three years, but it didn't really pan out. I think she won one race. So Bob said that he would buy us out on the filly. He did, but instead of cash, he gave us farm credit."

Last fall, after the Breeders' Crown--harness racing's version of the Breeders' Cup--Kentuckiana bought back into the promising Celebrity Secret, whom they had bred and sold as a yearling for \$75,000 to Sam Stathis's Celebrity Farms.

"When they bought an interest in Celebrity Secret [reported to be 25 percent], they applied our credit to a share in the horse," said VanMeter, who added. "It's been really fun, because he's come really good this vear."

VanMeter isn't the only Thoroughbred type who owns a share in Celebrity Secret. Breeders Tony Holmes and Kim and Rodney Nardelli also share a piece.

Trained by the 43-year-old Staffan Lind, a native of Sweden, Celebrity Secret will have his work cut out for him as he attempts to solve the puzzle that is Deweycheatumnhowe. The two lined up against each other at least three times last year; Celebrity Secret completed the exacta twice--including in the Breeders' Crown--and was third once.

In fact, no one has been able to figure out how to beat Deweycheatumnhowe, who sports a perfect 14-for-14 record. Last month, after stringing together four straight wins, including the \$175,000 New Jersey Sire Stakes Final, Celebrity Secret once again met with Deweycheatumnhowe, this time in the \$350,000 Stan-

lev Dancer Memorial, and once again found only that foe too strong. VanMeter and company managed to avoid Deweycheatumnh owe after they drew into the first Celebrity Secret of the three

Hambletonian eliminations last weekend. But Celebrity Secret failed to capitalize, getting nailed at the wire by Atomic Hall. The effort was good enough to stamp his ticket to the Hambletonian, but proved costly, as the winners of the eliminations get to pick their post position.




HORSEMEN'S GROUP FILES FOR DISMISSAL

Attorneys on behalf the Thoroughbred Horsemen's Group have filed a motion to dismiss Churchill Downs Inc.'s lawsuit over the advance deposit wagering negotiations. THG attorneys referenced the Interstate Horseracing Act of 1978, which they believe gives horsemen the right to negotiate the percentage of off-track wagering revenues that go into purses. "Horsemen must protect themselves," the motion states. "And they do so through their collective negotiations with entities like CDI. When those negotiations do not reach a mutually agreeable conclusion, the [Interstate Horseracing Act] is very clear: the horsemen have an absolute 'veto' right to withhold their consent, and that means there can be no interstate wagering on the affected races." THG represents local horsemen's groups throughout the country, as well as the Kentucky Horsemen's Benevolent and Protective Association and the Kentucky Thoroughbred Association. CDI's lawsuit alleges that the horsemen are in violation of the Sherman Antitrust Act.

Multiple Grade I winner Tiago (Pleasant Tap), sixth last out as the second choice in the GI Hollywood Gold Cup June 28, has been pulled up in his last two scheduled breezes at Del Mar, according to Daily Racing Form. Bill Would Eliminate Automatic 25% Withholding:

A bill was introduced in the U.S. House of Representatives Tuesday that would eliminate the automatic 25percent federal withholding on pari-mutuel winnings of \$5,000 or more for bets that carry odds of 300-1 or higher. The "Pari-Mutuel Conformity and Equality Act of 200" (H.R. 6631) is sponsored by Rep. Charles W. Boustany Jr. (R-LA), and enjoys the support of the National Thoroughbred Racing Association (NTRA), which claims the pari-mutuel industry is burdened by "an inequitable tax law." The current law requires waging facilities to withhold federal taxes on winnings over \$5,000 if the odds are at least 300 times the amount wagered. The withholding threshold has remained unchanged for 16 years, and was last increased in 1992, from \$1,000 to \$5,000. Since then, the NTRA points out, exotic wagering has "grown tremendously in the U.S., now accounting for two-thirds of all pari-mutuel wagers placed." Said Peggy Hendershot, vice president of legislative affairs for the NTRA, "For the betting public, the negative impact of withholding is multi-faceted. It has meant a confiscatory and frequently unfair loss of available capital. That loss of reinvestment, or 'churn,' leads to a reduction in overall wagering that in turn means less revenue generated for state governments, racetracks and purse money for horsemen. Our industry and our fans applaud Congressman Boustany for introducing this important legislation, and we look forward to working with our new Horseplayers' Coalition to add support to this initiative."

Round Table to Spotlight JC Safety Committee:

The Jockey Club's Thoroughbred Safety Committee, which in June issued its initial recommendations calling for the elimination of steroids in training and racing, a ban on toe grabs and a series of whip-related reforms, will provide an update on its activities and announce additional recommendations at The Jockey Club's 56th annual Round Table Conference on Matters Pertaining to Racing on Sunday, Aug. 17, at the Gideon Putnam Resort in Saratoga. According to The Jockey Club, the program will be devoted almost exclusively to equine health and safety, medication and Thoroughbred breeding. The Safety Committee was formed in May in the wake of the breakdown of Eight Belles in the Kentucky Derby. In addition to Stuart Janney III, chairman of the Safety Committee, speakers at the conference will include: Dr. Rick Arthur, equine medical director for the California Horse Racing Board; Dr. Larry Bramlage, co-owner of Rood and Riddle Equine Hospital and a member of the Safety Committee; Bill Casner, president and co-owner of WinStar Farm; Alan Foreman, chairman and CEO of the Thoroughbred Horsemen's Associations Inc.; Jim Gagliano, executive vice president and chief administrative officer for The Jockey Club; David Haydon, president of InCompass Solutions Inc.; James J. Hickey Jr., president of the American Horse Council; Matt Iuliano, vice president of registration services for The Jockey Club; and Dr. Mary Scollay, equine medical director for the Kentucky Horse Racing Commission. 
