Two Undefeated SKY MESA **2YOs Run in Stakes Races Today**

NEW RUNNING STYLE A TRUE BLESSING

If her last effort, an off-the-pace powerhouse success in the GI Prioress S., is any indication, the rest of the field is running for second money only in today's GI Test S. behind reigning two-year-old champion TDN Rising Star" Indian Blessing (Indian Charlie). For the opening seven races of her stellar

career, speed was her forte, and she was just that much better and faster than her peers in 2007, with a pair of Grade I scores en route to the Eclipse. Victorious in her first two starts this term, her free-running style did not serve her Adam Coglianese quite as well in her next pair, finishing second to

subsequent GI Kentucky Oaks winner Proud Spell in the Mar. 8 GII Fair Grounds Oaks and to Zaftig in the GI Acorn S. June 7. The Earnhardt homebred showed a new and potentially devastating dimension in the July 5 Prioress, settling in fourth before unleashing a strong finishing kick to score by 5 1/4 lengths. "The older they get, they start relaxing a little bit more and getting with the program," commented trainer Bob Baffert, in Saratoga for a "working vacation" and in search of his first Test winner. "I like the way at least she just didn't run off from behind them. She relaxed. She actually was working that way before the Acorn." A maiden winner in seven European starts, Sweet Hope (Lemon Drop Kid) has won two of three since her repatriation, including a three-length score in the Beautiful Day S. at Delaware June 23. She could face pace pressure from GIII Adena Stallions' Miss Preakness S. winner Palanka City (Carson City) and J Z Warrior (Harlan's Holiday), and that could set things up for Ms. Margaret H. (Point Given) to be the exotics kicker. Though light on figures, she has the right running style and is perfect in two tries at today's distance. "She's taken a little while to mature mentally and physically," said trainer lan Wilkes. "She's been very consistent this year."

BC TAKES HARD LINE ON STEROIDS

Officials at Breeders' Cup Limited have announced that the trainer of any horse which might test positive for anabolic steroids at this year's Breeders' Cup World Championships at Santa Anita face a one-year suspension from the event and that a three-time violator could face a lifetime ban. In addition, beginning next year, Breeders' Cup will neither fund purses nor award Breeders' Cup Challenge races to racetracks in the U.S. and Canada which do not adopt the Racing Commissioners International (RCI) model rules on anabolic steroids, via state regulations or house rules. "The Breeders' Cup Board believes it's crucial that we take a leadership role in eliminating anabolic steroids from our sport," stated William S. Farish Jr., chairman of Breeders' Cup Ltd. "We encourage each race track and racing jurisdiction to move swiftly in enacting these much needed regulations. It is important that the industry takes a coordinated approach to address medication and safety issues. We pledge to continue to work with the NTRA, The Jockey Club Safety Committee, Thoroughbred Owners and Breeders' Association, and other industry leaders in this regard." In addition to testing for steroids, there will also be out-of-competition testing for EPO (i.e. blood doping) 10 days prior to this year's Breeders' Cup and testing for TCO2 (milk shaking) prior to all 14 championship races at the detention barn at Santa Anita.



Unplaced in two prior starts at the "Graveyard of Favorites," Joe Shields Jr.'s Any Limit took advantage of her third Spa appearance, leading from flagfall to finish as the longest shot in a field of five. It had been two years since her two upstate tries, when she finished sixth to then stablemate Swap Fliparoo in the GI Test S. and eighth in the GIII Victory Ride S. in 2006. Winner of the GIII First Lady H. and the GIII Hurricane Bertie H. in five outings last season, the homebred returned from an 11-month absence to be third in the May 17 Upper Noosh S. on the Belmont turf, then was back on eight days' rest, but was no better than fourth in the GII Vagrancy H. The bay led past every pole en route to a game neck success in the GII First Flight H. July 4, but was the outsider here. Quickest into stride, Any Limit showed the way from favored Miss Macy Sue (Trippi), who was in tight nearing the half-mile marker and was eased out to the two path on the turn. The chalk mounted her challenge approaching the quarter pole, but Any Limit had plenty in reserve and won going away. "Wire to wire, that was nice," said trainer Allen Jerkens. "We're going to be trying for the [GI] Ballerina [\$250,000, seven furlongs, Aug. 24] if she's well." Lightly raced Zada Belle, steadied sharply entering the far turn, chased inside and outfinished Graeme Six for second, while Miss Macy Sue struggled home. "She was just off today," said her rider Eddie Razo Jr. "When I got to the top of the lane, she was just dead. I didn't have any horse at all."

Prolific (Ire) (Compton Place {GB}) struck a blow for the longstanding Highclere Thoroughbred Racing/Richard Hannon combination when edging out Gallagher (GB) (Bahamian Bounty {GB}) in a tight finish in yesterday's G2 Richmond S. at Goodwood. Third in both the G2 Norfolk S. at Royal Ascot June 19 and G2 July S. at Newmarket last time July 10, the 5-1 second choice was ready to battle as the 7-2 pick came at him late, and dug in to record a neck success. Reve de Soleil (Fr) (Dyhim Diamond {Ire}) made it three across the track and was a head back in third. "He's a very fast horse and loves fast ground," winning jockey Richard Hughes commented. "He just got a bit lonely in front and I thought I would get beaten, but he found a bit and stuck his neck out."



Prolific looked to have a bright future when winning on debut at Newmarket May 15 and lost no shine when going down by a half-length to Danehill Destiny (GB) in a conditions event at Windsor June 2. Unable to match the raw speed of South Central when third in the Norfolk, the chestnut was undone by the heavy rain that preceded Newmarket's July meeting on his latest start. Back on a sound surface here, he broke fast and raced in the front rank throughout the early stages and gained a slight edge before the furlong marker as Jimmy Fortune looked for room on the strong-traveling Gallagher in behind. When that rival got free, it looked as if Prolific would surrender but he found extra to repel the threat and cling on. "At Ascot, he didn't get away with the five furlongs and we were unlucky with the rain at Newmarket," Richard Hughes said. "We couldn't get any cover in the race, but I was happy for him to loaf rather than do too much at the front and he's just done enough to win. He's a really good fun two-year-old and although it's hard to see him getting much further at the moment, we can't ask for more than he's doing and there is the G2 Gimcrack S. [at York Aug. 20]." Gallagher's Brian Meehan is looking at either a rematch with the winner in the Gimcrack or a trip to Deauville for the Aug. 24 G1 Prix Morny. Sixties Icon's problems since his 2006 G1 St Leger and 2007 G2 Jockey Club S. wins have been well documented, but the signs so far this term are that they are firmly behind him. Runner-up to Getaway (Ger) in this year's renewal of the Jockey Club S. at Newmarket May 4, the bay took the Listed Festival S. at this venue May 22 before failing to land a blow when down the field in the June 18 G1 Prince of Wales's S. at Royal Ascot. Settled in midpack early, he was travelling strongly early in the stretch and when asked to take command responded with a surge to lead passing the guarter pole. Warding off Lion Sands on his inner, he was beyond recall as Galactic Star made late inroads. "Jeremy [Noseda] was a little bit worried about the ground, but it's lovely and as a Leger winner he deserved to win a race like this," jockey Johnny Murtagh commented. "He is a great horse who has had a lot of problems and credit to Jeremy and the lads. A mile and a half is a good trip for him and he outstayed them today." Owner Paul Roy added, "He had a wind operation and it's great to have him back in top form. We had a little bit of a bug in Jeremy's yard last time and the runners we had we felt ran a bit below-par, so we felt they had been affected. He's very tough with a lot of class and I think there are a few more group races in him, so the aim is to get to the GI Breeders' Cup Turf [at Santa Anita Oct. 25]."

Since her impressive success in Ascot's G3 Princess Margaret S. last July, Visit has endured a rocky road back to the winner's spot but gave notice that she is firmly back on track here. Found to have the tranquiliser ACP in her system after her second in the G2 Lowther S. at York in August, for which the homebred was disqualified and placed last, she was eighth in the G1 Cheveley Park S. on her final juvenile start at Newmarket in October and did not reappear until runner-up in the Listed Distaff S. at Sandown last time July 5. Showing all her old verve here, the bay delivered a flourish from behind the leading pack to hit the front approaching the eighth pole before fighting off the fast-finishing Chevenne Star in the closing stages. 



With an astonishing 16 Group 1 successes under their belt already this year, there is almost a sense of inevitability about Ballydoyle winning with their chosen representatives in the major heats and Halfway to Heaven is charged with maintaining the golden run in today's G1 Nassau S. at Goodwood. One of Aidan O'Brien's typical improvers, Michael Tabor, Derrick Smith and Susan Magnier's sophomore stepped up off a second in the Apr. 6 G3 Leopardstown 1000 Guineas Trial S. and third in the G1 Poule d'Essai des Pouliches at Longchamp May 11 to take the G1 Irish 1000 Guineas at The Curragh last time May 25. Rested since, she bids to emulate the stable's 2007 heroine Peeping Fawn. Jockey Johnny Murtagh has the most envied seat in world racing at present and he is in an understandably confident mood. "She has had a little break since the Irish Guineas and is going really well at home," he said of Halfway to Heaven. "I think a mile and a quarter won't be much of a problem for her." Backing up the three-year-old challenge is Jim and Jackie Bolger's G1 Coronation S. heroine Lush Lashes, who bids to provide her trainer with a third renewal following the exploits of Park Express (Ire) in 1986 and Alexander Goldrun (Ire) three years ago. Her 3 1/4length success in that June 20 Royal Ascot contest came over a mile, but she had already shown an aptitude over an extended 10 furlongs when taking York's G3 Musidora S. May 14. On that occasion, stamina was not an issue when accounting for Five Horses Ltd's Cape Amber (Ire), Dar Re Mi (GB) and Moonstone (GB) and that form looks stronger all the time. Henry Cecil's five successes came courtesy of Roussalka (GB)in 1975 and 1976, Connaught Bridge (Ire) three years later, Nom de Plume in 1987 and Lyphard's Delta in 1993 and he relies on Khalid Abdullah's Passage of Time (GB) (Dansili {GB}) to provide another highlight. The 2006 G1 Criterium de Saint-Cloud winner was back on track when taking the Listed Steventon S. at Newbury last time July 19 after two disappointing efforts earlier in the season.

Big Brown Takes to Turf for Final Tune-Up...
IEAH Stable, Paul Pompa Jr., Gary Tolchin a

IEAH Stable, Paul Pompa Jr., Gary Tolchin and Andrew Cohen's Big Brown (Boundary) blew out three furlongs in :38 3/5 over the turf course at Aqueduct yesterday morning in advance of his return to action in tomorrow's \$1-million GI Haskell Invitational. According to Daily Racing Form, the GI Kentucky Derby and GI Preakness S. hero broke off in :13.01, got his second furlong in :12.99 and came home in :12.66. Trainer Rick Dutrow Jr. reports that he will send Big Brown by van to the Jersey Shore this morning and that the colt is scheduled to school in the paddock with the field for today's first race. The Haskell marks the first start for Big Brown since being eased down the stretch while trying to secure the Triple Crown in the GI Belmont S. in New York June 7. This will be the third Haskell mount for jockey Kent Desormeaux, who was fourth aboard Private Terms in 1988 and third with Free House in 1997.

Family of Injured Police Officer to Attend Haskell...


Family members of a critically injured Nassau County (New York) police officer along with Nassau County Police Commissioner Lawrence W. Mulvey will join IEAH Stables' Mike lavarone and Richard Schiavo at Sunday's race. Officer Kenneth Baribault was on duty and pulled over a suspected drunk driver on the Long Island Expressway May 18 when his car was rearended by another alleged intoxicated driver.

Baribault remained hospitalized at the Nassau University Medical Center until July 14, at which time he was transported to the Kessler Rehabilitation Clinic in West Orange, New Jersey. In response to the incident, lavarone and Schiavo, both Long Islanders, pledged a portion of any earnings from the Belmont S. to a fund set up in the officer's name. Despite failing to earn any money in the race, the owners nonetheless donated \$50,000 to the Kenneth and Christopher Baribault Benevolent Fund. "We are so touched and honored by the support from Michael, Richard, IEAH Stables and the Big Brown team," said Danielle Rella, Baribault's sister. "We are going to the Haskell to root for Big Brown with Ken in our thoughts."

Hutton No Stranger to Monmouth...

Peter Hutton, assistant to trainer Ken McPeek, is no stranger to the Monmouth Park backside and is back this time with New Jersey-bred Nistle's Crunch (Van Nistelrooy). The bay colt, owned and bred by the Alien Farm of Garden State residents Michael Harrison and Allen Furst, was only able to gallop three furlongs yesterday morning before the track was closed for an hour to care for an injured horse. Hutton is a familiar face at Monmouth, having served previously as assistant to trainers Bob Baffert and D. Wayne Lukas. The Englishborn former jockey accompanied champion Silverbulletday when she invaded to win the 1999 GII Monmouth Oaks and was also with the silver-haired trainer when he sent out Captain Steve to a runner-up effort behind Dixie Union in the 2000 Haskell. Hutton is not sticking around for this year's main event. He leaves Saturday night for Russia with the McPeektrained Racecar Rhapsody, who is set to race in the Russian Derby at the Moscow Hippodrome later this month. Nistle's Crunch has won on Polytrack, dirt and turf, and comes into the Haskell off a runner-up effort in the grassy GIII Colonial Turf Cup June 21.

RCI MODEL RULES COMMITTEE MEETS AT

SPA The Racing Commissioners International Model Rules Committee met in all-day session yesterday in Saratoga Springs, and issued the following recommendations to the RCI Board for their adoption. The committee suggests that further restrictions be imposed on the use of toe grabs in Thoroughbred racing, limiting their size to two millimeters. The committee also recommends a new requirement on licensed trainers to undergo at least four hours of continuing education each year as a pre-condition to maintaining their license. The Model Rules Committee also voted in favor of making significant changes to the rules concerning the use of the riding crop (whips), specifying limits on the size and weights of the crop, allowing only flaps and further defining "proper use" of the crop. The committee failed to adopt a proposal to modify the Claiming Rule, which would allow a claim to be voided under certain circumstances where a horse fails to return to the unsaddling area.

NEW TAX BENEFITS SHOULD STIMULATE PURCHASES by Jay Hickey

Anyone thinking of getting into the horse business or purchasing more horses should do so this year. Last February, Congress passed the Economic Stimulus Act to boost the lagging U.S. economy. That law includes two tax benefits that are available only for 2008 that should spur purchases of horses and other assets used in the horse business.

Expense Deduction Doubled...

The first incentive raises the so-called "Section 179 expense allowance" for horses purchased and placed in service in 2008 from \$128,000 to \$250,000. The allowance also applies to farm equipment and most depreciable property. Once total purchases of horses and other eligible depreciable property reach \$800,000, the benefit phases out dollar-for-dollar, but that leaves a lot of room to purchase some nice horses.

The horse industry almost lost the Section 179 expense deduction in 1996 when the House of Representatives passed legislation taking it away from the horse industry. But the American Horse Council convinced the Senate to remove that limitation before passing the final bill and the deduction was preserved. It was worth \$17,500 then. It has increased gradually since then and will nearly double to \$250,000 for 2008.

Since most horses cost less than the \$250,000 limit, this means that most horse owners can write-off the entire cost of a horse purchased and used in 2008. This is a real attraction for horse owners and breeders to purchase horses in training or increase their breeding stock.

A misconception that surrounds the expense deduction is that it can only be taken against income from your horse business. Not so. It can be used against any business income, including wages, salary and similar compensation or income from any business a horse owner has.

In 2009, the allowance will revert to \$128,000.

Fifty Percent Bonus Depreciation Re-Instated...

The second incentive brings back the 50 percent first-year bonus depreciation. This means that a person can deduct 50 percent of the cost of a horse or other depreciable asset purchased and placed in service during 2008. The industry enjoyed bonus depreciation from 2002 through 2004. It was a benefit then and it should be again. This write-off applies to all depreciable property, unless the property has a depreciation life of over 20 years.

There is one limitation. As was the case when bonus depreciation was available in 2003 and 2004, the property must be "new," meaning that the original or first use of the horse or other property must begin with the purchaser. If a horse has been used by one person, it is no longer eligible for bonus depreciation. For example, a person could not purchase a horse that had raced and use it for breeding and enjoy bonus depreciation. But unlike the expense deduction there is no limit on the amount of bonus depreciation that can be taken; it is simply 50 percent of the purchase price.

On top of both deductions, a horse owner can also take regular depreciation on any remaining basis.

To illustrate, assume that in 2008 an owner pays \$500,000 for a colt to be used for racing and \$50,000 for other depreciable property, bringing total purchases to \$550,000. The young colt had never been raced or used for any other purpose before the purchase. The owner would be able to expense \$250,000, deduct another \$150,000 of bonus depreciation (50 percent of the \$300,000 remaining balance), and take regular depreciation on the \$150,000 balance.

The tax bill is intended to provide a shot in the arm for the economy. Clearly, these provisions offer some very attractive economic reasons to buy horses in 2008.

Younger Race Horses to Be Depreciated More Quickly after 2008...

A third provision allowing a faster write-off for younger race horses will kick-in in 2009 when the above provisions expire. Congress included a provision in the new Farm Bill to amend the current depreciation schedule for race horses to make it uniform at three years. Effective January 1, 2009 all race horses will be depreciated over three years, regardless of their age when placed in service. This change to the tax code for race horses will "sunset" after five years, ending at the end of 2013, unless Congress extends it.

For 2008, race horses will continue to be depreciated over seven years if they are placed in service before they turn two; three years if after two.

But beginning in 2009, horse owners will no longer have to decide whether to place their race horse in service at the end of its yearling year, and depreciate it over seven years because it is under two, or wait until the horse reaches 24 months and a day in order to use the three-year depreciation schedule. The difference in time placed in service may be only a few months, but the result is a four-year difference in the write-off. This amendment ends the inequitable situation of depreciating race horses over seven years, a period that is about twice as long as their actual racing time.

Always Check with Your Advisors...

As with all tax changes, horse owners should check with their CPA or attorney to ensure the benefit is available to them and their situation. But for most horse owners, each of the changes is very favorable and the American Horse Council is pleased to have been able to ensure horse owners are eligible for them.



"Treasure" a Bit Different Than "Cat":

Discreet Treasure (El Prado {Ire}) is a half-brother to GI Hill 'n' Dale Cigar Mile H. hero Discreet Cat (Forestry), but the similarities end with the nomenclature, says trainer Stan Hough. "His brother had a lot of speed; he doesn't," the conditioner commented. "He's the complete opposite. He acts more like a distance horse. I'm going to run him back at a distance." In fact, the gray colt was entered main-track only for a recent 11-furlong grass allowance, but was scratched when it remained on the turf. Discreet Treasure made a serious impression in his July 5 debut, even if it looked as if he wouldn't beat a single horse. Off slowly and lagging well behind the field in an off-the-turf maiden, he entered the picture on the turn and blew his rivals away late, scoring by 12 1/4 lengths to become a 3 "TDN **Rising Star"** • (video). "His race was impressive, but again, it was off the turf," Hough said, "and you really don't know what was in there and that speed was coming back while he was moving forward at the same time. So, we'll have to see him run again." Discreet Treasure was out for work yesterday morning, breezing five furlongs in 1:03.94 over the Saratoga main track.

Godolphin Fillies Progressing Towards Alabama:

Rick Mettee, the North American manager for Godolphin Racing LLC, reported that **TDN Rising** Star" Music Note (A.P. Indy) and Little Belle (A.P. Indy), first and second in the GI CCA Oaks July 19, are making steady progress toward a rematch in the GI Alabama S. Aug. 16, a race also expected to attract GI Kentucky Oaks victress Proud Spell (Proud Citizen). "We're planning to run both of them in the Alabama," Mettee commented. "Even though the race is in a couple of weeks, it's still a go. After the Alabama, decisions need to be made, and we'll separate them." In other news from Godolphin's New York string, Jalil (Storm Cat), the \$9.7-million KEESEP topper in 2005 who won a pair of group events at the Dubai International Racing Carnival over the winter, is stabled at Saratoga. "He had a strong campaign earlier in the year," Mettee said. "We got him a couple of weeks ago at Belmont. It will be a couple of weeks before he returns, and I don't know if he will run here." Cocoa Beach (Chi) (Doneraile Court), the UAE 1000 Guineas and UAE Oaks winner, will join the stable before the end of the meet, but will not run at the Spa. Tam Lin (GB) (Selkirk), runner-up to Kip Deville in the GIIII Poker H. July 13, is scheduled to make his next start in the seven-furlong GII Play the King S. at Woodbine Aug. 23.


NYRA Director of Racing Surfaces Resigns:
