BIG BROWN COMES TO TOWN

GI Kentucky Derby and GI Preakness hero Big Brown

(Boundary) arrived at Monmouth Park yesterday morning and schooled in the paddock in the afternoon. His connections will have their fingers crossed as he takes to the track for today's GI Haskell Invitational S. "It is a make-or-break race for sure--how can it not be?" co-owner Michael lavarone told *Daily Racing Form*. "He just got pulled up at 1-5 [in the June 8 GI Belmont S.]; if that

A Blip on the Radar...

Halfway to Heaven stayed under the radar at two and while the stable's Listen (Ire) was carrying all before her in the top fillies' heats, the grey was starting late when breaking her maiden at Leopardstown at the end of October. Runner-up to Carribean Sunset (Ire) back there on her sophomore bow in the Apr. 6 G3 1000 Guineas Trial S., she excelled when staying on strongly to be third in a vintage renewal of the G1 Poule d'Essai des Pouliches at Longchamp May 11. Passed over by Murtagh for the Curragh version a fortnight later, she battled to a head defeat of the subsequently disqualified Tuscan Evening (Ire) under Seamus Heffernan and was given time off to recover from her exertions. With stamina to prove here, she was helped by the pedestrian early gallop dictated by Muthabara (Ire) (Red Ransom) and her rider's initiative after she was allowed a lead from that rival after showing best for a furlong. Given a kick at the top of the straight, she joined battle with the long-time leader while Lush Lashes and Kevin Manning were holed up in behind. Wresting the advantage passing the furlong marker, her travails had already ensured victory as the eventual runner-up found daylight. "I was in the right spot because no one wanted to go and we did our own thing in front and doddled around the bends," Murtagh added. "I wanted to save as much as I could, as I knew when I let her go in the straight she was going to extend and Aidan had said she was very straightforward. She is very genuine and always toughs it out--she ran very well on firm ground in the French Guineas and came back to win the Irish Guineas doing just enough. She's won two Group 1s now, so she has to be exceptional. She can run a fast mile or a mile and a quarter, so she has plenty of options." Luckless Lush...

While the even-money favorite Lush Lashes did not receive a clear run and looked short of luck, her trainer Jim Bolger was taking it on the chin afterwards. "These things happen," he told PA Sport. "Kevin gave an accurate assessment of what happened and I'm not in the blame game. I'm not sure where we will go now. She is in the G1 Yorkshire Oaks [at York Aug. 21] and we'll have a look at that and there is also Leopardstown [for the Sept. 9 G1 Irish Champion S.]." Passage of Time (GB) (Dansili {GB}) fared best of the older brigade and was a head back in third, which delighted connections. "She has run really well, she probably would have preferred a better pace and the weight-for-age has probably made the difference," owner-breeder Khalid Abdullah's Racing Manager Teddy Grimthorpe told PA Sport. "She will either go for the Yorkshire Oaks or a Group 2 at Deauville."

The Pretenders...

Can anyone spoil Big Brown's return? It seems unlikely, but trainer Todd Pletcher has opted to change



Pletcher has opted to change equipment on his Haskell runner, **Atoned** (Repent), in the hopes that the addition of blinkers will make a difference. The dark bay has come out on the losing end of the photo in no less than five of his last eight appearances, including the June 14 Spend A Buck S. and July 12 Long Branch S., both at Monmouth. "I don't

know whether he has been unlucky or underachieving or overachieving," Pletcher admitted. "We're putting blinkers on him for this race to see if we can get him more focused." The Dogwood colorbearer has not visited the winner's circle since taking the off-the-turf Continental Mile S. at the Oceanport oval last August.

Do You Believe in Magic?

Magical Forest (Forest Camp) goes for his third straight victory, and his fourth from five two-turn starts. The dark bay could do no better than fifth over a muddy Monmouth strip in the six-furlong Rumson S. May 31, but rebounded to take the June 9 Floor Show S. at Delaware Park by a neck. Let go at 15-1 in the July 13 GIII Barbaro S. at that track, he battled on the front end from the start and hung in there gamely for a half-length tally. "This colt has been getting better and better," trainer Joe DeMola said. "He and [jockey Jorge Chavez] put it together in the Barbaro, and I'm hoping they can do it again."

Unbeaten in three starts at two, the dark bay capped off her championship season with a front-running romp in the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies. The Earnhardt homebred opened 2008 with back-toback wins in the GII Santa Ynez S. Jan. 13 and GIII Silverbulletday S.

She had to weave her way through the field, but undefeated Zenyatta found a seam when she needed it and rolled to a a handy score over Model. Recognized as a **O** "TDN Rising Star" **O** after breaking her maiden by three lengths at Hollywood Park on Thanksgiving 2007, the strapping filly was never really threatened in her next four starts. She proved she could handle something other than a synthetic surface when taking the Apr. 5 GI Apple Blosson H. at Oaklawn and made it five in a row in the May 31 GII Milady H. Tough Tiz's Sis got to within a half-length of her at the finish of the July 5 GI Vanity H., but the Del Mar faithful still made her the 3-5 chalk to keep her perfect record intact. At the back of the pack early, Zenyatta cruised to the front in the stretch and was geared down in the final sixteenth, winning much easier than the final margin might suggest. 

Trainer Alain de Royer-Dupre has issued a warning over the participation of last year's winner Darjina and Sabana Perdida, who are dependent on fast ground to deliver their best. The former, who captured last term's G1 Poule d'Essai des Pouliches and G1 Prix du Moulin at Longchamp in May and September, has come unstuck on a soft surface more than once and was scratched from Newmarket's G1 Falmouth S. last month after the rains came. Both were last seen at Royal Ascot. Darjina was runner-up to Haradasun (Aus) in the June 17 G1 Queen Anne S. and Sabana Perdida won the G2 Windsor Forest S. 24 hours later. "We decided not to run Darjina at Newmarket and I'm afraid, because the forecast is not good in Deauville," their conditioner, who is seeking a third consecutive renewal, told PA Sport. "Unfortunately Sabana Perdida needs the ground fast too, just as it was at Ascot when she ran so well." Natagora heads the sophomore challenge in receipt of seven pounds due to the weight-forage system, and that will make the task harder for her elders if she can reproduce the form of her win in the G1 1000 Guineas May 5. Freshened after finishing third in the June 1 G1 Prix du Jockey-Club, the grey will handle any cut in the ground. Nahoodh, who appeared unlucky not to be in the shake-up when hampered late in the Newmarket Guineas, rebounded from below-par efforts in the Irish equivalent and G1 Coronation S. at Royal Ascot to win the Falmouth July 9.

The three-year-old will be sidelined until next year. Trainer Jimmy Jerkens told *DRF* that the colt would ship to Hogan Equine Clinic in Cream Ridge, New Jersey, for surgery, and will miss at least four months of training. A \$270,000 KEESEP yearling purchase for Pinebloom Stable, Mint Lane has compiled a record of 10-4-2-1, and earnings of \$298,412. He captured the Postponed S. at Belmont and was runner-up in the GII Peter Pan S. and the Federico Tesio S.



THE GAME HAS CHANGED, NOT THE HORSE

There's been a lot of high-profile, loose talk floating around lately about how we are allegedly producing weaker, softer, more fragile Thoroughbreds. A Congresswoman from Illinois said so in a Congressional Hearing. Randy Moss announced it to the nation on ESPN. And veteran story teller Bill Nack even made up a story about it. I'm not sure what qualifies any of them to weigh in on the issue, but I know for sure that they speak from hear-say or anecdotes, and personal opinion, rather than from supportable or researched facts.

Quite a few folks lately seem to be looking at the steady decline in average starts per foal as an indication that our breeding and in-breeding practices are causing racehorses to be less "durable. " This notion is merely a simplistic, knee-jerk response without any substantive base. It is nothing more than a red herring. Based on my 25 years of experience breeding racehorses, I see no change in the horses themselves. It's *the game* that has changed. *It's what we do to and with our Thoroughbreds that accounts for the decline in average starts.*

I'm thinking that our contemporary horses may even be *tougher* than earlier models to be able to hold up as well as they do despite everything we put in their way.

Speculation that in-breeding to Native Dancer, Mr. Prospector, etc., has weakened our breed is simply unsubstantiated opinion, and it is nonsense to think that we could alter the breed in a few generations. So, if the horses themselves haven't changed significantly, what else might explain the decline in average starts?

A structural analysis of how *the game has changed* points to a complex interaction of many factors which, taken together, explain the decline. One factor alone would only explain part of the decrease; but all of the factors listed below, in combination, likely account for most of the downward trend. The reader may even be able to think of additional circumstances that contribute to the drop in average starts.

First, it is important to note that average starts began to decline steadily with the advent of year- round racing. In the '40s, '50s, '60s, and '70s, horses would typically race on a circuit and then be given a season off for rest and recuperation. They might race seven or eight months a year and spend the rest of their time rejuvenating their bodies and spirits and transitioning back into racing fitness. In our "modern" era, it seems we forget that horses are herd animals and living creatures. They are not meant to be cooped up in cell-like stalls year round. Twelve months in confinement with a brief time each day for exercise in repetitive routines is not merely tough on them physically, it is unnatural for a horse and stifling to the spirit. As thinking, feeling creatures, horses need time off to, well, just be horses, out picking grass with their heads down and some sunshine on their backs.

Second, and equally important, we too often substitute *veterinary intervention* for good, old-fashioned horsemanship. Racetrack vets have a stranglehold on many racing barns. Just look at your vet bills each month. Relying on medications may get a horse to the next race, but it generally lowers the probability of getting that horse through the next six or eight.

It is not surprising to most of us, therefore, that career starts have declined in an era of increasing drug use.

Third, our emphasis on speed in relation to two-yearold sales likely has a negative effect on the career longevity of many young horses who go through the rigors of preparing to breeze as fast as they can on a given day. Instead of bringing the babies along patiently, and within themselves, based on each horse's own developmental needs, predispositions, and time-table, we push them along on our own imposed schedule, to get a return on investment. The minority of sales horses that hold up to this regimen are testimony to the concept of survival of the fittest, and some of them go on to be major horses. But how many potential stars are compromised along the way? This Darwinian process could be easily altered to benefit buyers, sellers, and horses alike by simply returning to the previous practice of showing the babies in a strong gallop without causing them to fly through the stretch faster than most of them will ever run again. Because this current fascination with speed still reigns supreme, however, about 60% of the two-year-olds catalogued are not sold at auction, and an untold number likely have their longterm durability affected in negative ways, contributing to the decline in average career starts.

Fourth, trainer stats have been published for about 15 years, causing trainers' reputations to be judged in part by their win percentage. Thus, some trainers, wishing to maintain an edge in public perception and recruitment of horses, pick their spots very carefully and sometimes scratch a horse when they don't like their chances, in order to protect their win percentage.

When a horse is scratched, it typically has to sit out for several days before it can be entered again for another race, thereby causing more wear and tear from training without having made another start when it was ready. This modern phenomenon probably contributes incrementally to the overall annual reduction in starts.

Fifth, economics figure heavily into the puzzle. Just chart the 40-year average cost of Thoroughbreds against the decline in average starts and you will see that as investment cost goes up, average starts go down in an inverse or similarly linear way. The inference here is that one way *the game has changed* is that managers and trainers *protect the investment*. Clearly, expensive foals race less today, and cheaper foals race more. This is fully supported by recent *Blood-Horse* research data which show that, during the last decade, foals by stallions with a stud fee of \$50,000 or more started 20% fewer times than foals by stallions with fees from \$10,000 to \$50,000. Furthermore, average starts per foal in the latter group were 17.8, not that far from the 20.4 of the 1970s.


Our sport is not unique in the way the game has changed to protect investment. Take Major League Baseball, for example. In the '70s, Major League pitchers typically pitched 300 or more innings per year and it was commonplace for a starter to throw 200 pitches in a game. Today, in an era of expensive ball players and huge investment, pitchers average closer to 130 – 140 innings per year and managers often yank their starters when they approach 100 pitches. Are pitchers softer or more fragile today? Not likely. The economics and logistics of the game have changed, and some of the change occurs to protect a large investment. I don't hear anyone blaming the pitchers' Moms and Dads (or great-great grandfathers) because their boys' pitch counts have declined from those in the '70s.

Sixth, given the *steadily rising costs of training* and the gouging nature of veterinary charges, the annual expense of keeping a horse in training (\$30,000 -50,000 +) enters heavily into the average starts equation. The influence of economics on the decline in average starts is especially influential because purses are declining when adjusted for inflation. Thus, many "modern" owners are quicker than their historic counterparts to pull the plug on their horses in training, thereby shortening their careers if they are not sufficiently productive. Owners of well-bred fillies, for example, will typically try them a few times to see if they have potential to earn black type, but will retire them early to be broodmares if they are not measuring up and paying their way. This aspect of the changing game is even more noticeable and dramatic with regard to stallion prospects who are quickly pulled from the track to the breeding shed.

Seventh, inefficiencies in modern condition books and the writing of races often restrict opportunity and, therefore, play some role in a horse's number of annual starts. As Yogi Berra might say, "They can't run if they can't start." Horses are trained on and trained on. When it is time to run, they need to run. Trainers point to a particular race in the condition book, and when the race is "not used" or their horse does not "draw in," the horse does not get to run when it is ready. Missing a race when the horse is ready to race merely produces more training, with all the wear and tear that continuous training entails. A comparative study describing the frequency of missed opportunities in the '40s, '50s, '60s, and '70s needs to be conducted to assess the extent that our game may have changed to delay or postpone racing opportunity. My guess is that in the previous era, because of fewer horses and fewer races, when a horse was ready to run, it had a greater chance to race.

Obviously, a lot of complex variables are mixing and interacting together to reduce the number of starts our horses make. The economic realities of keeping a horse in training are currently so daunting, we need to identify and quickly address the causes in order to fix this serious problem. At a time when we are desperate to attract new owners and keep the ones we have, we need our horses running much more often. They can't earn money or bring sufficient excitement and joy to their owners when standing in a stall or merely working themselves into the ground while training on the track morning after morning. Meanwhile, let's focus on the real causes of fewer starts per foal, and stop trying to say it's the breeders or the breed. *Comments? Please email TDN at* <u>suefinley@thoroughbreddailynews.com.</u>

Irwin Finding Value in Yearling Market...

Team Valor International's Barry Irwin caused a splash at last year's Fasig-Tipton Saratoga sale, taking home the sales-topping son of Mr. Greeley for \$2.2 million. That colt, now named **Kinsella** had been training with Todd Pletcher, but has been given some time off. "He had a chip removed from one ankle; not a big deal, but a little deal," Irwin explained. "He's basically a horse



who is very immature. He's big, he's muscular, but his bone structure is such that he needed more time. We could have left this little thing in there. It wasn't that big a deal, but since we had to give him time anyway, we went in there and flushed both of his ankles out." Irwin expects Kinsella to return to the Pletcher barn in November and he didn't rule out a juvenile appearance for the colt, although he is more likely to make his first start next year.

Irwin is fresh off a buying spree at Fasig-Tipton July, where he found the market much to his liking.

"[The July sale] suited me perfectly, I can tell you that," Irwin said. "I bought seven horses, six of them between \$60,000 and \$95,000. I bought one for \$170,000. I think the market is very restrictive right now. The middle has kind of sunken down a little bit. I was able to get every horse I wanted, but one. The only one I got outbid on went for \$295,000, and I couldn't see any difference between him and the ones I was buying for \$75,000 and \$80,000. So I just stopped bidding." *Cont. p2*

Irwin is finding more value in the yearling market this year.

"This year we decided we weren't going to buy any more American racehorses for the rest of the year-because the yearling market is going to suit us, because the prices are good for the first time in a long time, and you get the bonus depreciation and the expense allowance which makes it easier to sell," he said.

And he is expecting more of the same at Saratoga.

"I think [Saratoga] is going to be like most of the sales," he said. "I think the average and median will go down a little bit. The marginal horses are probably going to be hard-pressed to sell, but if there is a really good one, it will be an effort [to buy it]. People will spend whatever it takes. But I think, generally speaking, everything is going to be a little bit down. There isn't as much competition as there has been because money is not as free."

Irwin has definite ideas about the market, but don't ask him about this year's Saratoga catalogue.

"I don't look at catalogues; I look at horses," Irwin said. "And then when I'm finished looking, then I'll look at the catalogue. When I go to the consignor, I say, 'Don't give me the name of the sire and don't give me any updates, or I'm walking away.' I buy strictly on conformation. I don't care what the pedigree is. I have them walk the horse back and forth so I can determine what its front legs look like. If its front legs look good, then I'll look at it from the side. If I don't like the front legs, then I'll say, 'Next.'"

That game plan worked well with last year's Saratoga topper.

"He just blew me away," Irwin said of the \$2.2-million yearling. "You don't see a horse that is that big and is that well-proportioned. His front legs were perfect. He just had everything I wanted."

Irwin will employ those same tactics at Saratoga this year, with no definite idea of how many yearlings he'll buy or what price range he'll be buying in.

"What I do is, I just look at everything, and if I see something truly outstanding and I have to have it, then I'm buying it," he explained. "It just depends on if that special horse is there. Generally I try to buy one or two good fillies or one or two good colts. I just went a little ape at the Fasig-Tipton sale because the prices were so good, I just couldn't resist."

Consignors will be hoping Irwin sees plenty of yearling he can't resist at Saratoga. -Jessica Martini

As Blue as the Grass...

Bluegrass Thoroughbreds Services' John Stuart and Peter Bance know what a good yearling looks like. Having previously offered Grade I winner Eddington, graded-stakes winners Bwana Bull, What a Song, Coy



Coyote and Group 2 winner Rio de la Plata as yearlings through their operation, the Bluegrass team brings eight yearlings to this season's Saratoga sale and expect the newest alum to build on the companies burgeoning reputation. Included among this year's offering is <u>Hip 194</u>, a bay filly by Silver Deputy. The Apr. 3 filly, owned by Mueller Farms, is the second foal out of GSP Liter-

ary Light (Ide), a full sister to MGSW & GSP Junior College. The nine-year-old mare was purchased by Mueller Farms for \$380,000 at Keeneland November in 2005.

"I love her sire, Silver Deputy," said Stuart. "Her mother was an out-and-out, tough, New York sprinting stakes mare. She's just a lovely filly."

Another filly sure to draw interest is <u>Hip 155</u>, a bay by Elusive Quality. Offered on behalf of North Wales LLC, the Feb. 2 foal is out of Galeta (Arg), a muliple Group 1 winner in her native Argentina. The Kentuckybred is a half-sister to Lokoya (Woodman), who was second by a desperate nose behind Marylebone in the 2003 GI Matron S. and Argentine stakes winner High Flight (Arg) (Mutakddim).

"I really like the way that she is made," explained Stuart. "I also sold her half sister [Lokoya] at this sale."

Also one of the primary players in the Stallion Company--a stallion brokerage firm launched early last year--Stuart was quick to express his enthusiasm about another member of this year's consigment: a member of

Afleet Alex's first crop of foals. <u>Hip 42</u>, the bay, who is the property of BAN Partners, is out of MGSW & GISP Restored Hope, the dam of Sabellina (Langfuhr), winner of the GIII Cardinal H. and earner of \$531,237.

"I work with a guy who has seen most of the Afleet Alex yearlings and he tells me that I

have the best colt he's seen," offered Stuart. "As a first-year stallion prospect, [Afleet Alex] was a very sought-after horse, so I bred my best mare to him."



And while impressed by the tough-knocking nature of the colt's New York-bred dam, Stuart was overflowing in praise for the yearling's GI Preakness S. winning sire.


"You know, I am in the stallion business and I can tell you that the hardest one to buy was Afleet Alex, because I tried to buy him [with Castleton Lyons Farm's Tony Ryan]," explained Stuart. "We came within a hair of buying him. We negotiated for a month, and then Jess Jackson came in and scooped him up. Nobody will ever forget his athleticism and gameness when he ran in the Preakness."


With Fasig-Tipton's July yearling sale already in the bag, Stuart surmised that the Saratoga equivalent would keep things rolling in a positive direction.

"I think the Saratoga sale will have the best chance to hold up to its averages and its gross, because everybody says that the buyers who will be least affected by economic woes are the ones who want the most select yearlings. Well, *these* are the most select that Fasig-Tipton offers and there are not that many of them on the market. It wouldn't be a surprise if things were off a little bit, but in theory, I think, they will be off less here than other sale we see all year."--C Bossinakis

A King and His Court...

Television magnate and horse owner Roger King was certainly one of a kind. Nowhere was that more evident than at the 2001 renewal of this very sale. King, alongside bloodstock agent Buzz Chace, was locked in a bidding duel with Padua Stable's Satish Sanan. Both men were set on landing the third horse through the ring, a striking colt from the third crop of Unbridled's Song. Sanan seemed to have launched the winning salvo at \$1.8 million, prompting King, seated just a few rows up, to abruptly stand up and storm out of the pavilion. King theatrically lit a cigarette just outside as folks waited to see what he would do next. After a few moments, he came back in and bid \$1.85 million. This time it was Sanan's turn to stand up. He walked over and calmly asked King if he would like to go in together on the colt. King, in a somewhat impolite and salty manner, declined. Not quite the normal way of going about bidding, but the colt was his.

In the end, Sanan probably had the last laugh. Two nights later, Sanan purchased Vindication for \$2.15 million, while King's Mister C's Song--a half to GISW Harmony Lodge and MGSW Graeme Hall--won in his only start before dying prematurely.

But the story (which is superbly captured in Glenye Cain (Oakford)'s *The Home-Run Horse*) is vintage King-brash, competitive, unafraid to go it alone. Those traits shone through in his TV dealings, too. Back in 1983, when King, through his King World Productions, was setting out to syndicate the game show "Wheel of Fortune," he took the unusual step of bypassing the major markets of New York, Los Angeles and Chicago in order to let the show grow. A year later, "Wheel" was showing in 181 markets, including the big three, and was the top-ranked syndicated game show in American, according to *tvweek.com*. King would later go on to strike gold with "Jeopardy!," "The Oprah Winfrey Show" and "Dr. Phil." In 1999, King sold King World Productions to CBS for \$2.5 billion.

Sadly, King died last December after suffering a stroke. He was 63.

On Tuesday, a horse bred by King goes through the ring at Fasig-Tipton, a fitting tribute to a man who enjoyed spending time at the Spa. Hip <u>184</u>, an A.P. Indy filly out of Jewel for a King, is consigned by Eaton Sales, which regularly did business with King.

"I talked to him about twice a month," said Eaton's Tom VanMeter. "He was quite the character. He was a great guy and a good friend, and we miss him dearly."

As for the filly, VanMeter said the Apr. 3 foal is a sterling example of what A.P. Indy can throw.

"I really like her," he said. "I don't want to jinx her, but it wouldn't surprise me if she was one of the top fillies up there. She's really nice."

VanMeter said that King's estate owns two mares, both of which are boarded at Eaton. Jewel for a King (Storm Cat), an unraced daughter of GI Breeders' Cup Distaff heroine Jewel Princess which King paid \$1.4 million for at this sale in 2004, is one. The A.P. Indy filly is her first foal. She produced a Distorted Humor filly this spring and was bred back to Ghostzapper.

King's other mare is King Shooting Star, another daughter of Storm Cat, which King purchased for \$1.1 million at the 2004 Keeneland September Sale. From the family of Gold Beauty, Maplejinsky, et al, the fiveyear-old King Shooting Star was unplaced in one start and is now a broodmare. She produced a Dynaformer filly last year, optimistically named Miss Barbaro, who is slated to go through the ring in September, and has an Unbridled's Song colt at her side at the moment. She was bred back to Unbridled's Song.

VanMeter said that King's estate and his wife, Raemali, are undecided if they will disperse King's Thoroughbred holdings, or continue to race and breed.

"They have talked about selling the mares, but we'll work through that this fall," said VanMeter. "I think she's enamored enough with it because of Roger. He was pretty passionate about it; he loved it. He liked to go to the track and bet, and I think he liked racing horses, too." *-Lucas Marquardt*

Bluewater Sales kicked off the yearling sale's season the right way last month when a bay by Saint Liam realized the top price for a filly at the opening session



of the Fasig-Tipton Kentucky July Yearling Sale. Purchased by John Fort for \$300,000, the filly was a member of the sole crop produced by the Breeders' Cup Classic winner. Looking to replicate that feat at Saratoga, Bluewater sales will present seven yearlings, including Hip 192, a colt by the Sire of Hip 192, Saint Liam ill-fated 2005 Horse of the Year.

Offered on the second day of

selling, the Feb. 1 foal is out of Ling (Fusaichi Pegasus), daughter of GSW Voodoo Lily.

"He is a very athletic colt who is representative of his sire," said Bluewater Sales' Meg Levy. The champion older horse, who died at the age of six in 2006, boasted a weanling average of \$148,050 in 2007.

"This is a very nice one," added Levy. "We like him and his pedigree."

Also among Bluewater's consignment at the aforementioned July sale was a colt by freshman sire Medaglia d'Oro, who was the sixth highest priced colt of the first session with a \$260,000 final price from Starlight Partners. Bluewater is hoping to work that same magic here, this time with a filly by the three-time Grade I winner. Selling early during Tuesday's session, Hip 104 is out of Atlantic Ocean (Stormy Atlantic), winner of the GIII Miesque S. and GIII Santa Ysabel S. and earner of \$678,210.

"She is one of the best fillies I have seen this year," affirmed Levy. "Definitely one of the best Medaglia's I've ever seen. Her dam speaks for herself, she's everything you would expect out of that mare. I hope she will do well, especially with everything that Medaglia has done recently. Hopefully, he'll have another winner at Saratoga."

Also expected to be a bit of a novelty at Saratoga is Hip 169, a filly by Value Plus, whose first foals are yearlings of 2008.

"She is an absolutely gorgeous individual," commented Levy. "She is out of Hermione's Magic, a filly who was graded stakes placed at Saratoga in the [GII] Schuylerville S. She is a fantastic individual and we thought that her pedigree and physical warranted her being at Saratoga."

Levy pointed out that while Bluewater somewhat coincidentally came up with a stronger group of yearlings out of young stallions for this sale, she was quick to aknowledge the value of a younger, and often, unproven stallion with youngsters on offer at the Spa.

"Saratoga is a great place to have first- or secondseason sires, because sometimes you can get lucky with races right around the Saratoga meet, and have have an nice update for the progeny of the sire," she explained. "We do like to bring those types of horses up there."

And according to Levy, case in point is Medaglia d'Oro, who is currently ranked second in earnings--only behind Lion Heart--on the freshman sire list of 2008.

"Medaglia is doing very well right now," Levy said. "No body expected [Medaglia d'Oro] to have good twoyear olds, and suddenly, he has as many winners as the others sires of his year and already has a graded stakes placed horse. So they seem to be more precocious than expected."

Levy added that while pedigree is a very important factor in the equation, the market at Saratoga dictates that only animals that can back up the catalog page have a chance of doing well. "We only pick the best physical representatives to bring to Saratoga," she confirmed. "We don't bring too many, we only bring the right kind."--C Bossinakis

Stoney Lane Makes Spa Debut...

Stuart Turlington has come a long way since mucking out stalls as a youngster in North Carolina. Then, Turlington was learning all he could from the horsemen who cared for his father's burgeoning weanling-to-yearling pinhooking operation, which sold under the moniker Stoney Lane Farm. These days, however, Turlington is at the helm of Stoney Lane, which makes its debut at the Saratoga sale with small but select two-horse consianment.

"We felt it is the right time to come up and give Saratoga a chance," said Turlington, 35, who is now based in Lexington, Kentucky. "We've sold here before, but just through other consignors. We're trying to grow and build up our numbers, and we feel like we've got two nice horses. Fasig-Tipton liked both of them, and really wanted us to come here."

Though Stoney Lane is new to the Humphrey S. Finney sales pavilion at the Spa, the operation has been around for the better part of 2 1/2 decades. Stoney Lane was launched by Ed Turlington, a real estate developer based in North Carolina who was fond of race horses, especially Quarter Horses. Ed Turlington eventually bought a few Thoroughbreds, and both father and son were hooked. Ed Turlington eventually got into the pinhooking game, buying weanlings and re-selling them as yearlings. Early on, Stuart was put to work on the farm. He absorbed everything he could. He especially liked the hustle and bustle of the weanling and yearling sales.

At that point, Stoney Lane was selling primarily in Maryland at Timonium, but in 2000, Stuart moved tack to Lexington. The Stoney Lane moniker came too, and the farm now sits on 150 acres off Parkers Mill Rd. Stoney Lane's biggest pinhooking coup came not long after the move. At Fasig-Tipton July in 2002, Stoney Lane sold Consistent, an Unbridled's Song colt, for a sales-topping \$700,000. They had purchased the colt privately as a weanling for \$95,000 nine months earlier. Marshall Silverman consigned the horse for them. Cont. p6

Stoney Lane typically buys about 20 to 25 weanlings to pinhook, usually paying in the range of "nothing to \$100,000," said Turlington.

Last year, though, the Turlingtons decided to extend their budget on a few prospects. Their most expensive buy came at the Keeneland November Sale, when they paid \$300,000 for a striking daughter of Mr. Greeley out of the GSP Twilight Encounter (Regal Classic). It was the most Stoney Lane had ever paid for a horse, and it was the most anyone spent for a Mr. Greeley weanling filly in the States in 2007.

"We were really stretching it with her," laughed Turlington. "But that's what the market is demanding these days--just those top, top individuals--and last year we decided to take a chance and buy a few of those kinds of horses for our program. And Mr. Greeley is a really hot sire."

Monday, they'll find out if their gamble paid off when the chestnut filly sells as hip $\underline{82}$.

On Tuesday, Stoney Lane's second-most-expensive weanling buy, a colt by Successful Appeal, goes under the hammer. Catalogued as hip <u>193</u>, the colt is a half-brother to stakes winners Link to Jimmy (The Name's Jimmy) and Fager's Island (Storm Boot) and was acquired for \$145,000 as a Keeneland November weanling.

"They're both gorgeous horses," said Turlington. "I'm really pleased with the way both have progressed since last year; we look for both to be well received; they're racey horses, with good size and scope." --Lucas Marquardt

Antonellis Hope They Have a Tale to Tell...

Piedras Negras is the modern name for a ruined city of the pre-Columbian Maya civilization. To John Antonelli and his wife Marsha, the name is synonymous with a mare who landed them on the map as a breeder and one which carries the hopes of the couple at Saratoga Monday evening in the form of hip 23.

Antonelli, who felt the recent Southern California earthquake at his home in Whittier--right between Los Angeles and Anaheim--got his start in the Thoroughbred business when he and a friend claimed and successfully raced a horse.

"This looked like an easy business," Antonelli said last week.

But the thrill of racing just wasn't as fulfilling as he'd hoped and he opted to broaden his horizons.

"I decided I wanted to get into breeding horses instead of racing horses," he explained. "It just fit me better as an individual."

The Antonellis purchased a farm in Santa Ynez, California, and began to assemble a broodmare band, which today numbers 10. With the intent of building a high-quality group of horses, Antonelli found himself at the 2003 Keeneland November sale. He knew exactly what he was after. "First and foremost, I was looking for a family with Unbridled, looking for Fappiano," he stated. "He had such success and we knew we were looking for an Unbridled mare. We came across this mare that was correct and good looking. We found out she had some problems as a yearling and a two-year-old and didn't make it to the races, but she had everything we were looking for in a mare--quality and conformation."

That mare was Piedras Niegras, then four years old and in foal to 2001 champion juvenile Johannesburg.

"The fact that she was in foal to a young, precocious sire, we thought this would give us a good opportunity to produce a good runner," Antonelli reasoned.

Some \$95,000 later, the mare was his, and Antonelli shipped her back to the Golden State, where, on Feb. 1, 2004, she produced a dark bay filly. The owner could not have been happier, all things considered.

"For that price, she was a no-brainer," he explained. "As soon as she dropped her foal, we were like 'wow.' She was such a good-looking filly. Every baby she has dropped has been just beautiful."

The couple returned the mare's first foal to Keeneland the following November, and the \$75,000 they received for their filly represented a solid start. They sold a Holy Bull colt for \$85,000 as a weanling the following November.

In the meantime, the value of Piedras Niegras continued to rise. The first foal from the mare was a \$112,000 FTKJUL yearling, but made headlines the following winter when she was hammered down for \$1.1 million as a FTFFEB juvenile to Team Coolmore. The filly was turned over to trainer Patrick Biancone and, named La Traviata, went on to be one of the top sprinting fillies and mares in the nation, winning her first three starts by a combined 27 1/2 lengths, including the GIII Victory Ride S. at Saratoga.

The Antonellis decided to retain the mare's 2006 offspring, a full brother to their Johannesburg filly. Named Ducane and in training in New York with Todd Pletcher, the couple have very high hopes for him.

"He's just a gorgeous animal, he's got everything that La Traviata had," Antonelli said. "We are extremely impressed with him."

Three Chimneys Sales consigns Piedras Negras's colt by Tale of the Cat to Monday night's session. The decision to sell the colt as a yearling as opposed to how they'd done things heretofore was simple.

"It had to do with the fact of watching what was going on with La Traviata and if she did very, very well, the value of him would probably be higher," Antonelli offered. "It was a risk-versus-reward decision."

The fruits will be borne tomorrow night in the sales ring, and Antonelli is hoping for the best.

"There are so many variables right now," he says. "The economy has changed. A breeder needs to adapt and look at the marketplace and make decisions based upon the market. Like any breeder, you look at it and you fantasize about hitting the home run, but the reality is that this is a very good colt. He's got a great hip and chest. His conformation is great and he's got a wonderful attitude about him. All horses should have this guy's attitude. He's got some real dynamics to him."

Piedras Negras is the dam of a weanling colt by Bluegrass Cat and is currently in foal for one final time to Johannesburg.--*Alan Carasso*

Lo Duca Taking a Swing as a Breeder...

He didn't exactly plan it this way, but professional Major League baseball player Paul Lo Duca may just be a spectator at the sale Monday evening. Having played the last few seasons with the New



York Mets, Lo Duca hooked on with the Washington Nationals this season. But it has been a trying year for the 36-year-old backstop, as he struggled both at the plate and with a couple of injuries which limited his playing time and, ultimately, led to his unconditional release from the Nats. Temporarily unemployed, Lo Duca may benefit from the time off and may join the cheering section for hip <u>24</u>, an colt by A.P. Indy he bred in partnership with former Major

Leaguer Rob Murphy and Pablo Suarez's Suarez Racing.

"The breeding aspect is one of the more intriguing aspects of the sport," Lo Duca said by phone late last week. "A lot of people don't know the intricacies of breeding, how much the horses pick up from their mother and father. A lot of people just see them as racehorses and not as individuals. I enjoy that part of it."

A self-proclaimed lifelong fan of racing, Lo Duca was a downstairs neighbor of jockey Mike Smith while he was catching for the Los Angeles Dodgers, and the two became fast friends. Lo Duca dabbled mostly in lowerlevel horses in the early 2000s, employing Simon Bray before he left the business for television. In recent times, Lo Duca has been part of the ownership group which races GISP Grace Anatomy and is partners with Murphy on GII Carry Back S. hero Golden Spikes (Seeking the Gold).

Hip 24 is a son of Platinum Tiara (Cozzene), raced by Murphy's M375 Thoroughbreds to a runner-up finish in the 2000 GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies at Churchill Downs. It is the first time Lo Duca will offer a horse cobred in his name, and he is relishing the opportunity.

"I've never had one go through the sale and I am sure my heart is going to be pounding," he commented. "When we bought Golden Spikes, I was online and Murph and I were talking back and forth. We wanted to go to a certain amount and we hit that number. We were the bid and we weren't going to go any higher and luckily no one went higher than us." He added, "It's going to be exciting. I don't really know what my reaction is going to be when the horse goes into the ring."

Things could get more interesting still a few Saturdays from now across Union Avenue. Once a Triple Crown aspirant, Golden Spikes has successfully shortened back up in distance for his last few starts, and is slated to make an appearance in the GI King's Bishop S. on the Travers undercard Apr. 23.

"That day is going to be just awesome," Lo Duca said. "When he won the Carry Back I went nuts. He's really gotten better since we backed him up to one turn. I really think he's going to run a huge race in the King's Bishop."

As for his colt Monday night, Lo Duca took time away on a recent road trip to check in on him at the farm.

"He's an awesome-looking individual," he commented. "I went to go see him on the farm in Kentucky when we were playing the Reds. He looks a lot like A.P. Indy and obviously his mom could run too."

Platinum Tiara is the dam of a weanling filly by Storm Cat, which Murphy and team will retain, Lo Duca reports.

Well, he won't be wearing a number 16 on the back of his shirt if he shows up Monday night, but he's certainly a motivated seller and observer, and may not be too tough to pick out if things go the right way.

"I might drive down if I haven't been picked up by anyone," he said. "I really want to see him go through the ring, I hear it's really amazing."--*Alan Carasso*

Shift in Strategy for Adena...

Over the last few years, Frank Stronach's Adena Springs, a five-time Eclipse Award winner as Outstanding Breeder, has offered the vast majority of its horses at Adena's annual two-year-old sale near Ocala in the spring. But with an abundance of yearlings this year, plus a slew of weanlings waiting in the wings, Adena announced on Friday that it has cancelled the 2009 two-year-old sale and will instead focus on the yearling markets at OBS August, Keeneland September, and here at Saratoga. It's been a few years since Adena sold at the Spa, and it returns with a strong eight-horse draft that is being handled by Hidden Brook.

"We've tested the waters here before," said Jack Brothers, who works for both Adena and Hidden Brook. "We last came here in 2005, and we actually had a few nice grads that year, including a horse named Ron Bob and Dave. He's a Touch Gold four-year-old who's won three of his last four in California--he looks like he's an up-and-comer. And we also sold Cobalt Blue here, who won the GII San Felipe S. last year and also the Select S. at Monmouth."

Commenting on the decision to return to the yearling market in force, Brothers said, "The numbers are pretty big this year; the broodmare band is pretty large at the moment, so the direction is to shift and offer them as yearlings. Plus we've also had a lot of success selling yearlings over the years. I think it's a great opportunity for the buyers to get on board with an operation like Adena early."

Brothers points out that the buying bench for yearlings is comprised not only of end users, but of a substantial number of yearling-to-two-year-old pinhookers.

"When you offer horses as two-year-olds, there's a very limited market," he said. "When you sell as yearlings, the pool of buyers is substantially larger."

Among the Adena horses set to go under the hammer are two from the first crop of Horse of the Year Ghostzapper, two by Awesome Again, and one each by Distorted Humor and late Horse of the Year Saint Liam.

"Across the board, it's a real salty group," said Brothers. "It would be hard to separate them on a whole."

As for Hidden Brook, the operation--owned by Brothers, Sergio de Sousa, Dan Hall, Mark Roberts and Danny Vella--is in the midst of a sensational year. The operation bought Big Brown for Paul Pompa Jr. as a juvenile in training and watched as that colt took two legs of the Triple Crown. In February, Pompa and Hidden Brook sold a Street Cry (Ire) to Darley for \$2.1 million, the top price for a two-year-old at auction this spring. The colt, Desert Party, had been acquired for \$425,000 as a yearling and is now undefeated in two starts, having won the GII Sanford S. at Saratoga a week and a half ago. Back restocking last month at Fasig-Tipton July, Hidden Brook and Pompa acquired an Unforgettable Max colt for \$330,000, top price for a colt at the sale.

"It's been a great year and it'll be a tough act to follow, but we'll try," Brothers laughed. -Lucas Marquardt

Finley Hoping for a Big Return...

West Point Thoroughbreds capped a successful 2007 racing season with an impressive return in the sales ring. The company auctioned off MGISW Dream Rush for \$3.3 million and GISW Irish Smoke for \$750,000 at the Fasig-Tipton November Kentucky select mixed sale.



West Point President Terry Finley and pinhooking partner Lewis Lakin found a quick outlet to reinvest the profits, buying a weanling from the first crop of Horse of the Year Ghostzapper (Awesome Again) for \$735,000 at the Keeneland November sale.

That filly returns to the ring Monday at Saratoga, selling as hip 32 as part of the Hill 'n' Dale Sales Agency consignment.

Horsephotos "We just fell in love with her," *Horsephotos* Finley said of the weanling. "We would have loved to have gotten

her for less money, but obviously there was someone else in the pavilion that thought just as highly of her as we did. We thought she was a top-class filly, by the right sire with the right pedigree. I don't like to say 'the best horse in the sale'--when I hear agents and owners talk about that, I'm not a big fan of using that. But I thought she was a really, really exceptional filly." **Cont. p9**

Finley, who said West Point bought six weanlings last year, admitted the filly's price tag was a little high for a pinhooking prospect.

"We usually don't like to spend that kind of money, but it is what it is and we ended up with her. We'll see how it turns out. We had just sold \$4 million worth of horses the night before, so that might have worked into play, too."

The dark bay yearling is out of Questress (Seeking the Gold) and is a half sister to multiple Grade I winner Pomeroy (Boundary), as well as the stakes-placed Acquileia (Arch). Questress, with this foal in utero, sold to Blandford Bloodstock for \$925,000 at the 2006 Keeneland November sale.

According to Finley, his investment from last November continues to improve and impress.

"She's a big stout, beautiful-moving filly," he said. "And she's developed the right way. John Sikura and his team have done a super job."


While the filly was bought last fall with the specific intention of re-selling, Finley would have no problem racing the filly.

"We are hoping for the best [at the sale]," he said. "Without a doubt, we'd be happy racing her."

Finley admits the economy may be working against pinhookers.

"The economy has changed substantially," he commented. "Anybody that is bullish--optimistic is one thing--but to represent that you are bullish in a market like this, I don't think you are being accurate and true to what the indicators are telling us. This is a tough environment and a tough economy for a lot of people."

But, Finley adds, the economy alone will not dictate his actions.

"You can make it a lot more complex than it needs to be," he explained. "You are going to sales and you're looking for value. And over the years, you kind of refine your outlook on a certain type of individual and a certain type of pedigree and what that combination represents in terms of value. If you can buy horses, you can buy them. If you can't, you can't. That doesn't mean I'm not cognizant of [economic conditions]."

West Point purchased seven yearlings at the Fasig-Tipton Kentucky July sale and Finley is expecting to purchase a similar number at Saratoga.

"I was fairly pleased with the Fasig sale," said Finley who signed for seven yearlings at the July auction. "I thought, obviously the market overall has weakened some and it's drawn back some, but that's not a negative in every case. It does give the end-user a chance to get a little bit of a better shot to make a return on investment when he can get into a horse at a reduced price. It's just economics."

Finley would like to see more people buy with the intent to race.

"I pinhook," he admitted. "It's not a huge part, but it is a part of our business. But now it just seems like, aside from a few people, most people at the sale are there with the intent to resell. I hope that the number of people who want to end up on the racing side doesn't continue to get smaller and smaller. That's a trend that I would like to see reduced."

Finley noted another affect of the economy has been an increase in the number of established owners interested in joining West Point partnerships.

"More and more people that have been involved as sole owners are starting to say, 'Wow--I have a better shot to have some fun by getting involved with a partnership," Finley said. "Partnerships aren't for everybody. But for owners doing it by themselves, partnerships are certainly a way to augment their portfolio. And we just have to continue to attract [new] people by showing people how exciting the business is. How it can be a whole new world to them. What we call it is a lifestyle investment. It doesn't matter what age they are, if they step into this business and they take a liking to it, it can be such a positive part of their family and their personal life." *-Jessica Martini*

Here, he offers small plates, pastas, salads, pizzas, and daily specials with extensive cocktail, beer and wine lists in a contemporary hip setting. DEL MAR TO CUT PURSES 3.5 PERCENT Del Mar will reduce purses 3.5 percent--or about \$10,000 a day--starting with the third condition book Aug. 13. The track cited a decline in on-track handle and a "slowdown" in account wagering as the reasons for the cut. Five stakes will see their purses decreased. The GI Del Mar Oaks Aug. 16 and the GII Del Mar Derby Aug. 31 will have their purses cut \$50,000, down to \$350,000. In addition, the Solana Beach H., El Cajon S. and Torrey Pines S. will see their purses trimmed by \$25,000. Track officials placed part of the blame on the end of an account wagering experiment, which allowed California residents to wager on all of the state's tracks using any wagering platform licensed by the California Horse Racing Board. Del Mar and TVG did not reach an agreement to continue the experiment. "Had we got that accomplished, we would not be having this conversation [about purse cuts]," said Del Mar Senior Vice President and CFO Mike Ernst.
