

# FASIG-TIPTON SARATOGA BEGINS TONIGHT

Last year was a good one for graduates of the Fasiq-Tipton Saratoga Selected Yearling sale, with the likes of Corinthian achieving Grade I glory, and 2008 has been just as good, with stars such as Da' Tara and Monba flying the flag for the boutique event. The 2008 renewal of the sale kicks off tonight at 7:00 p.m. with the first of two sessions, and sale officials are confident there are a few of tomorrow's stars currently on the sales grounds. "We've got a lot of really good horses here," said Fasig-Tipton Executive Vice President and COO Boyd Browing Jr. "The activity has been great, and people generally seem very positive about what they've got and what they've seen. I think it's going to be a good horse sale." There has been much talk regarding the recent downturn of the financial markets, but Browning said he doesn't expect the slumping economy to have much of an impact on trading over the next two nights. "I think it's overplayed, particularly at a market like this," said Browning. "The people who are buying the more expensive-type yearlings aren't as subject to the whims and worries of the economy." At least one consignor concurs. "I worry about the economy a lot, but there's a level that it affects, and a level it doesn't," said Denali's Craig Bandoroff, "People that buy horses here will continue to buy horses. We've seen [John] Ferguson here, [Demi] O'Byrne--I think we'll be all right." The sale concludes tomorrow with a session that begins at 7:00 p.m. For more information, visit www.fasigtipton.com. # Big Is Back...


Big Brown was forced to take back behind Coal Play-one of two horses trained by Nick Zito--who streaked to the front from the word 'go' and carved out solid early spilts of :23, :46, and :1:11. Never letting that foe out of his sights, the powerful bay took aim at the Bob LaPenta colt in the stretch and had to work hard to gain the advantage, but proved up to the task and drew clear to score by 2 1/2 lengths. The second half of the LaPenta/Zito entry, Cool Coal Man, held on well to be third, while Alaazo (A.P. Indy) came from way out of it to be fourth. "He found a new gear and just kept sticking his neck out," said winning jockey Kent Desormeaux. "I knew he was going to get there. At the top of the stretch [Coal Play] took off, but Big Brown took off after him. He just kept coming and I knew we'd get him." In the stretch, Big Brown drifted out, and seemed to be tiring. To everyone, that is, except for the colt's rider. "He's always been a drifter and today I decided I wasn't going to hold his line," added Desormeaux. "As long as he was going forward, I was going to let him go on with it. At the three-sixteenths pole, he switched leads and then at the eighth pole he took off again."


# Brown in the Making...

Big Brown left little doubt as to his inherent talent when he aired by 11 1/4 lengths in his career debut going a mile and a sixteenth at the Spa in September of 2007. IEAH purchased a majority share after that race and the colt joined Richard Dutrow Jr.'s string. The powerful bay added an equally impressive score in an off-the-turf one-mile allowance at Gulfstream Mar. 8 before galloping home a much-the-best winner in the GI Florida Derby Mar. 29. Sent off the 2-1 choice in the May 3 GI Kentucky Derby, the colt won easily and captured the GI Preakness S. in equally impressive style two weeks later. On the threshold of making history in the June 7 GI Belmont S., Big Brown failed to show his customary brilliance and was pulled up by jockey Kent Desormeaux in the stretch. # 'Coal' Connection Round Out Trifecta...

Robert LaPenta and trainer Nick Zito appeared to have the race stacked in their favor with the doubleteaming efforts of Cool Coal Man and Coal Play in yesterday's GI Haskell Invitational. In the early going, it appeared that Coal Play, winner of a Monmouth Park allowance May 25 and third in a \$32,000 optional claimer here July 4, was going to play the role of the rabbit, setting up his stablemate Cool Coal Man. The latter, who scored in the GII Fountain of Youth S. Feb. 24 before finishing out of the money in the GI Bluegrass S. and GI Kentucky Derby, won his most recent start in the 1-mile-and-70-yard Spend a Buck S. over this track June 14. "I thought we had a helluva shot turning for home," Zito said. "I thought to myself 'We could do this again.' I'm very happy right now. We made [Big Brown] run, that's for sure. But this is good for racing. Coal Play ran big."







# **GOLD STANDARD**

Kept in the shadows in two Classics this term, 29-10 chance Goldikova (Ire) (Anabaa) came out front and center to account for a stellar field in the G1 Prix Rothschild (formerly the Prix d'Astarte) at Deauville yesterday. Alain and Gerard Wertheimer's homebred sophomore oozed class throughout the one-mile contest and overcame a tendency to wander slightly under a drive in the closing stages to defeat last year's winner Darjina (Fr) (Zamindar) by a half length. "She really has everything it takes to become a champion, which is a high cruising speed and a turn of foot," commented trainer Freddy Head. "I was expecting a big performance from her and it is a pleasure to train horses of this calibre."

Successful in both juvenile starts at Chantilly last year, Goldikova was runner-up in a one-mile conditions event at Longchamp on seasonal return Apr. 3 and found only Zarkava (Ire) too good in the G1 Poule d'Essai des Pouliches back at the Bois de Boulogne track next time May 11. She was found wanting for stamina when chasing home that filly once more in the G1 Prix de Diane back at Chantilly June 8, but garnered a first pattern-race score in the July 6 G3 Prix Chloe at Maisons-Laffitte last time. That form received a timely boost with the success of Chloe second Top Toss (Ire) in Saturday's G3 Prix de Psyche. Positioned in the wake of pacesetter Natagora after the initial strides, Goldikova eased past that rival with 300 meters to go and maintained control thereafter, despite rolling about in front under a drive, to hold the vain thrust of Darjina along the rail. "She had the perfect run in behind Natagora and proved her class when Olivier [Peslier] asked her to quicken," said winning trainer Freddy Head, who captured this event three times as a jockey. "She is a much better filly now than in the spring, as she has matured both physically and mentally. It has been a vintage year, the last two months have been quite amazing and we can only hope it continues. It's not certain Goldikova will come back here in the [Aug. 17] G1 Prix Jacques Le Marois, and we will wait and see how she takes this race before deciding. There are plenty of opportunities later on." Jockey Olivier Peslier was keen to heap praise upon the winning trainer, saying, "I am really happy to have finally won a Group 1 race for Monsieur Freddy Head and, with it being for the Wertheimers, it is the icing on the cake. Freddy was an outstanding jockey and has now proved he is an outstanding trainer, too." Trainers Alain de Royer-Dupre and Pascal Bary indicated Darjina and Natagora will both point to the G1 Prix du Moulin at Longchamp Sept. 7. 

Rosenreihe delivered a late rattle to provide trainer Peter Schiergen with a third domestic Classic in 2008, following the wins of stable companions Briseida (GB) and Kamsin (Ger) in the G2 German 1000 Guineas and G1 Deutsches Derby, respectively. Third in the G3 Schwarzgold-Rennen at Cologne May 12, the homebred was runner-up in the aforementioned 1000 Guineas at this track June 1 and was taking on older horses when fourth in the G3 Grosser Preis der Wirtschaft at Dortmund June 22. Only fifth on her latest start in Frankfurt's G3 Grosse Hessen Meile July 20, the bay had been battle-hardened in those contests, and that proved decisive in this fiercely competitive renewal. Held up early by Andrasch Starke, she was against the fence as Lady Marian regained the lead at the quarter pole, but, when switched out, produced a decisive turn of acceleration to cut down that rival in the shade of the post.

Black Mamba kicked off her state-side campaign with a score going a mile over this course last summer before finising in the money in her next five consecutive starts in graded stakes company. Among them was a second behind Precious Kitten in the GII Palomar H. and a third to Nashoba's Key in the GI Yellow Ribbon S. in September, and a third to Citronnade in her seasonal finale in Hollywood's GII Dahlia H. in December. Runner-up to yet another Bobby Frankel trainee in the one-mile GII Buena Vista H. Feb. 18, the bay followed up with a third in Santa Anita's American Beauty H. Mar. 30. Nosed out by winner Foxysox in the 10-furlong GII Santa Barbara H. Apr. 19, the New Zealandbred recorded her first victory in almost a year when she took the GII Beverly Hills H. at Hollywood June 29. Well backed here, the five-year-old was content to settle off the early pace set by Passified. Looking for room and not finding it, while along the inside entering the stretch, Black Mamba was finally found a seam to slip through in the stretch and inched clear to a narrow score. Red Giant needed four starts to get going, but once he did, he did it in style, winning his turf bow by 5 1/2 lengths at the Big A last April. Runner-up in a one-mile allowance at Belmont May 7, the chestnut then reeled off three in a row, including the 10-furlong GII Virginia Derby at Colonial Downs in July. Passed in the final strides to be second behind Shamdinan in Arlington's GI Secretariat S. Aug. 11 and most recently crossed the wire fourth behind Nobiz Like Shobiz--beaten four lengths--in the GII Jamaica H. Oct. 6. "He had an ankle issue that flared up on him last year," said trainer Todd Pletcher, explaining the extended time off. "We gave him plenty of time for a summer campaign. I had entered him in an allowance race that didn't fill. We nominated him to this race as a back-up plan." Given a 4-1 chance in this seasonal bow, the four-year-old settled in along the inside early and tracked early splits of :23.95, :47.81, and 1:11.95. Making headway on the turn, the colt swung out for the drive and wore down Stalingrad to gain the narrow victory. "I thought he sat a perfect trip by saving ground on both turns," said trainer Todd Pletcher. "He was kind of anxious looking for a spot at the top of the stretch. When he finally found a seam to run through, he put in a big run." As for Red Giant's next start, Pletcher added, "We'll have to see if the [GII] Bernard Baruch H. [Aug. 23] gives him enough time. It may come up a little too quick for him."



Strike a Deal invades Ontario seeking his first gradedstakes win. The bay has placed in five graded stakes, but has not won since taking the Straight Deal S. in May 2007. He set the pace in the May 11 Volponi S. in his 2008 debut--his first start in over seven months-and finished second by a half-length to Parading. Stepped up in company for the GI Manhattan H. June 7, he finished fourth, beaten 1 1/2 lengths. A Grade I victory narrowly eluded him in the United Nations S. July 5, where he finished second by a neck to Presious Passion in his most recent effort. Independent George settled for fourth in the paceless UN after racing last of eight in the early stages. He is a two-time stakes winner, including the Sussex S. at Delaware May 28 two starts back. His first stakes win came in the inaugural Presque Isle Mile last September. Rahy's Attorney returns to his favored surface after finishing third in an open allowance race on Woodbine's Polytrack July 13. He has never finished outside the exacta in seven starts on the E.P. Taylor turf course, with five wins to his credit. Those victories include triumphs in three stakes, including the GIII Connaught Cup S. May 25.

Deal Making will put a perfect record at risk when he seeks his fourth win in as many starts. The Augustin Stables homebred broke his maiden going a route of ground on turf at first asking, holding on to win by a neck at Atlantic City Apr. 24. Allowance foes proved no match in start number two, where he closed to win by three-quarters of a length at Philadelphia Park May 26. Most recently, he took the Stanton S. at Delaware Park July 1. Despite breaking in the air, the dark bay opened up to a 1 1/4-length triumph. Wesley also overcame trouble in his last start, winning an allowance race at Belmont June 28 despite steadying hard on the far turn. Adriano, the only graded-stakes winner in the field by virtue of his GII Lane's End S. victory in March, will look to rebound off a fifth in the GIII Colonial Turf Cup S. in his last race June 21. He may not have cared for the soft turf that day at Colonial, where he finished 10 1/2 lengths behind the winner Sailor's Cap after pressing the pace. He is a two-time winner on firm turf. The chestnut broke his maiden over Saratoga's Mellon turf course last year and won an allowance race by 6 3/4 lengths on turf at Gulfstream in January.

# Rebuilding Process for Saparas...

Jim and Alice Sapara are back.

The Edmonton, Alberta, residents have been in the Thoroughbred business for the better part of 30 years, and made something of a name for themselves in the late 1990s, purchasing and racing the likes of dual

Grade III winner Brushed Halory; and MSW Serena's Tune, the first foal out of champion Serena's Song, acquired for \$1 million at the 1999 Keeneland July sale.

But tragedy and adversity struck in 2001, when a fire raged through their company, modular home manufacturer Winalta Inc., resulting in the total loss of the physical plant and the displacement of

their employees. Sapara did what he felt he had to do and dispersed his Thoroughbred holdings.

"We had a \$20-million fire," Sapara commented. "We were employing 300 people at that particular juncture, so we needed two things--my time and capital. So you go to your assets, disperse them and go back to work. We needed some capital real fast to start putting the plant back into shape, so that's why the quick dispersal.

"I never thought I'd go back at it, because that really hurt, spending all that time getting those kinds of mares and then having to disperse them," he continued. "I appreciate that money buys anything, but when you grow up with them and then race them, it's a different story."

After about two years of soul-searching and rebuilding, Sapara decided to get back on the horse, so to speak, and began reconstructing a racing stable. In 2004, the couple gave C\$100,000 for a colt by Southern Halo at the CTHS Selected Yearling sale. Named Edenwold, the chestnut won half of his eight juvenile starts, and the Sovereign Award as champion of his generation. Then, in 2006, the chestnut took the prestigious Queen's Plate by 3/4 of a length. Finally, a couple of reasons to smile.

"That was a nice way back in, that's right," admitted Sapara. "You need those ups, because there are enough downs."

A few months later, the Saparas found themselves at the Keeneland November sale, where they purchased two mares in foal, including Grade III winner Stupendous Miss (Dynaformer), pregnant for the first time to Distorted Humor, for \$1.3 million. *cont. p11*

"The pedigree and, secondly, the conformation of the mare is what attracted us," Sapara explained. "Carrying her first foal attracted us as well. She's a graded winner, and we were looking for very top mares at that particular sale; she was one of them.

"She's a very big, scopey mare, which, being by Dynaformer, you can imagine her size, and that's what I liked about her. On conformation, she passed with flying colors."

Stupendous Miss's first offspring, a colt by Distorted Humor, goes under the hammer tonight as <a href="https://hip.ele.nib.go/hip.68">hip 68</a>, and is consigned by Craig and Holly Bandoroff's Denali Stud, which coincidentally sold Serena's Tune to the Saparas on behalf of Bob and Beverly Lewis.

"He sort of looks just like his mother," Sapara stated. "Conformation-wise he's pretty hard to beat. It's hard to raise one in this day and age with that kind of appearance. We were very pleased with her first colt. He's really grown up very nicely."

Stars of tomorrow grabbing the spotlight today...

Bandoroff concurs.

"He's a big, two-turn, Saturday-afternoon-looking horse," he said. "If you want to dream about the Derby, you can look at him and envision it once he fills out and matures. He reminds me of a Distorted Humor like Any Given Saturday--he's got plenty of leg and scope. He's more of that mold than of the heavy-muscled, quarter-horse type."

Stupendous Miss produced a filly by Storm Cat this past Apr. 17. Sapara is unsure whether he will retain or sell the filly. The mare is back in foal to Distorted Humor for the current breeding season.

Sapara, who sold Winalta in 2006 and is now "semiretired," is cautiously optimistic about the boutique market, even with the prevailing turbulent economic conditions.

"My strong belief is that the top of the market will be very strong, as it usually is," he reasoned. "People that are working with disposable dollars, people that have already established themselves in life, another dollar here or there isn't going to bother them."

Afleet Alex was as gritty as they come as a racehorse, and weanlings from the dual Classic winner's first crop reflected that, averaging \$113,809 for 21 sold off a \$30,000 fee. That included this fellow, who, as a \$300,000 KEENOV graduate, was Afleet Alex's second-highest-priced weanling in 2007. The bay colt is a half to stakes winners Patriot Love (With Approval) and Deputy Country (Silver Deputy), as well as to Riley Tucker (Harlan's Holiday), a colt who has placed in four graded events for owner Zayat Stables. It might not be surprising, then, to find that Zayat purchased hip 12 as a weanling and re-offers him here.

# Hip 24, c, A.P. Indy--Platinum Tiara, by Cozzene Consigned by Taylor Made Sales, Agent XCIV

This colt, born Feb. 26 last year, is the third from the hard-knocking racemare Platinum Tiara, whose resume includes a trio of stakes wins in addition to a runner-up finish in the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies. "We feel he's a very unique commodity up here," said consignor Mark Taylor. "I think one of the things you're seeing at this sale is some very nice individuals, but maybe the sire power is a little on the light side. We thought we'd bring him here and let him be in the spotlight. He's a really beautiful horse; when you breed to A.P. Indy, you hope to get a horse that looks like this." He is the first of three A.P. Indys at Saratoga.

# Hip 68, c, Distorted Humor--Stupendous Miss, by Dynaformer


Consigned by Denali Stud (Craig & Holly Bandoroff), agent This is the first foal produced by Grade III winner Stupendous Miss, whom Winsong Farms purchased for \$1.3 million with this colt in utero. Distorted Humor continued his rapid ascension to the upper echelon of the commercial sire ranks in 2007, when 44 of his yearlings sold for an average of \$409,750 (off a \$60,000 fee). WinStar's star sire earned some free publicity at Saratoga a week ago when his son Commentator annexed a second GI Whitney H.

# Hip 82, f, Mr. Greeley--Twilight Encounter, by Regal Classic Consigned by Stoney Lane Farm, agent

Mr. Greeley boasted 18 weanlings sold last year for a very strong average of \$238,469. Included in that group was this miss, who was knocked down to Stoney Lane Farm for \$300,000 at the Keeneland November Sale. It was Mr. Greeley's most expensive weanling filly in the U.S. The Gainesway stallion was represented by the top-priced horse at this sale a year ago when the colt Kinsella sold to Team Valor's Barry Irwin for \$2.1 million.

# Hip 87, c, Officer--Wednesday's Child, by Storm Cat Consigned by Mill Ridge Sales, agent

Officer has gotten off to a fine start at stud with no fewer than 14 stakes winners to his credit, and consignor Bayne Welker believes the son of Bertrando has another potentially good one with this colt. In addition to carrying some of his father's best traits, the colt also sports some of this damsire's characteristics," said Welker. "The mare's a Storm Cat, and you can see a lot of that in him," he said. "He's really smooth. He's got a big shoulder, good size to him, and is real athletic, the way he drops his head and goes about his business. He's got a real big walk. It looks like he could be early, but it doesn't look like he'll be a one-dimensional kind of horse." This colt was purchased as a Fasig-Tipton November weanling for \$150,000, the top price paid for an Officer weanling in 2007.

Western Princess, who is owned by Earle I. Mack, is one of only a handful of mares who scanned in foal after being covered by Storm Cat this spring and is thus carrying a member of the pensioned stallion's final crop.

# Hip 90, c, Songandaprayer--What a Night, by Tough Night Consigned by Taylor Made Sales Agency, Agent X


Produced by stakes winner What a Night, this colt is a full-brother to the promising What a Song, the \$1.9 million juvenile who won the GIII Hollywood Juvenile Championship S. and GII Best Pal S. in 2005 before tragically dying during morning training while still undefeated. This Feb. 4 foal was bred in partnership by Gulf Coast Farms, which purchased What a Night for \$225,000 at the 2005 Keeneland November Sale. Sire Songandaprayer is well-represented at this sale with six catalogued, though this is his lone colt. "I believe this is his first Kentucky crop," consignor Mark Taylor said about Songandaprayer, who previously stood in Florida. "He already has a bunch of good two-year-olds from that last Florida crop, and I think once those Kentucky mares start producing, he's going to be a top sire. And this colt's full-brother was a monster. Unfortunately, he died prematurely, but he looked like he was going to be any kind."

"I think people will look more in time. It takes a while for people to adapt to something new. # Gettin' Lucky...

It's easily drawn up on paper. You purchase a mare. Shortly thereafter, the mare's immediate relatives start winning stakes like hotcakes, and you look like a genius with a genetic goldmine in your broodmare band. In practice, however, breeders are well aware it seldom works out that way.

That said, these days, Ben Walden is looking pretty darn smart. Some 5 1/2 years ago, at the 2002 Keeneland November Sale, Walden and partner Phil Steinberg went to \$300,000 for the Mr. Prospector mare Get Lucky. A graded-stakes winner on the track, Get Lucky hailed from one of the Phipps family's best lines, but as a broodmare she had, to that point, been only a modest success. A daughter of Grade I winner Dance Number, herself a half-sister to Private Account, Get Lucky got off to a quick start when her second foal, Accelerator (A.P. Indy), won the 1996 GIII Pilgrim S. and ran second in the following year's GI Wood Memorial S.

But her next five foals--all fillies incidently--failed to earn black type, and so the Phipps sent Get Lucky through the ring. Walden thought the 14-year-old mare still had plenty to offer, and took a chance. A good move, as it turned out.

Since being hammered down to Walden, Get Lucky has produced two stakes winners, the listed winner Harborage (Monarchos) and the very good Daydreaming (A.P. Indy), a Grade II victress for the Phipps who was twice placed in Grade I company. What's more, Get Lucky's unraced daughter She's a Winner (A.P. Indy) emerged as a top broodmare in her own right, with the likes of GI Haskell Invitational winner Bluegrass Cat (Storm Cat), MGSW Lord of the Game (Saint Ballado) and SW Sonoma Cat (Storm Cat) to her credit. A very good pedigree got that much better.

"Daydreaming was a yearling at the time when I bought Get Lucky," Walden remembered. "Bluegrass Cat was a foal; Lord of the Game was not yet on the page. The family just really heated up in a major way. I was very blessed to have bought the mare. I have to give my partner Phil Steinberg the credit; he had identified the mare in the catalogue and came to me and said, 'What do you think?' I thought she'd be a nice mare to own, and so he had me go out to Bill Harrigan's in Paris and look at the yearling out of the mare, Daydreaming, the morning the mare sold." cont. p15

Tomorrow, Walden's Gracefield makes the rare appearance at Saratoga with a Storm Cat half-brother to Daydreaming. Catalogued as hip <u>158</u>, the colt is the lone horse in Gracefield's consignment.

"We sell primarily at Keeneland September--have for 20 years--and when I come up here I want to make it count," Walden explained. "I brought up a two-horse consignment a few years ago, and that included [GI Met Mile winner] Corinthian. I just felt this horse was the right horse for Saratoga. He's doing well so far."

Walden said the recent success of the colt's relatives makes him an ideal stallion prospect.

"The great thing about him is that he could be a listed winner and be a stallion somewhere, with his pedigree," he said. "Pedigrees don't get too much more important than his. And Storm Cat's having a pretty good year, so we're excited to be here."

Overbrook's perennial star Storm Cat was pensioned this year after declining fertility, and interest in the champion stallion's last few crops figures to be high.

When asked if hip 158 reminded him of Storm Cat's better runners, Walden said that the only thing he could say for sure was that the colt was made in his father's image.

"I've never been able to breed to Storm Cat more than just a couple of times, so therefore I haven't raised many," said Walden. "As a spectator, I've seen quite a few, like all of us have. But the one thing that I can speak to about him physically is that he has an almost identical appearance to his dad. His head has the same identical marking on his forehead, and is just spot-on to Storm Cat's head. He has nearly identical markings with his white stockings, his color is the same--he's just a mirror image of his daddy, which I consider a good thing."

Notably, the colt will be the last that Gracefield consigns at Saratoga. But don't worry--Walden's not going anywhere. Several months ago, Walden sold the property that Gracefield currently sits on, and he'll soon have a new farm with a new name.

"The farm wasn't on the market, actually," said Walden. "It's 300 acres on the corner of Iron Works and Newtown. I had developed her from scratch--she is a beautiful farm, right next to Castleton Lyons. But about three months ago, a nice lady from the show horse business approached me about buying the farm. I told her it wasn't for sale. Before long, she had met my price, and suddenly I was without a farm. I have it until the end of the year, and then she takes possession."

Only a few days ago, Walden found a replacement, and Walden has promised his wife and daughter that it will be the last farm he buys.

"I've sold farms from time to time, but this is the farm I want to grow old on," he said. "It's currently named Valhalla; it's 235 acres in Woodford County. It's a really

beautiful place--it's got an old federal home that was built in 1812, an old mill house that was built in 1811. It's currently a horse farm, but I'm going to have to build a yearling barn. I'll put in an Equisizer. It's got a 10-stall foaling barn that I'm going to expand to 20 stalls."

As part of the move, Walden plans to trim his current broodmare band of 56 to a more select 20. He also will adopt a new moniker.

"The farm was originally built by the Paul

family, and it was called Pauls Mill, so I'm going to rename the farm Pauls Mill after the original founders," Walden explained. "We still own the name

founders," Walden explained. "We still own the name Gracefield, but I'm going to go ahead and rename it."

The move from Gracefield to Pauls Mill will not affect

Hurricane Hall, the stallion operation that Walden owns in partnership with Brad Kelley and Pat Madden. Hurricane Hall stands English Channel, Bellamy Road, Silver Wagon, Teuflesberg and Artie Schiller.

Though he came to New York with just one horse.

Though he came to New York with just one horse, Walden plans to make the most of his visit to the Empire State.

"As soon as I sell that rascal, I hope, for a lot of money Tuesday night, we're going to go down to New York City for a few days," said Walden. "We're going to stay at the Ritz on Central Park, and we're going to eat Italian food for three days and I'm going to take my 10-year-old daughter to *South Pacific*. It's going to be fun."

"We're hoping that he can kind of pick up where he left off," said trainer Tom Albertrani. "He went an easy half and got a little tired, so we're a good month away probably from seeing him run again." As for the colt's future, Albertrani added, "We'll be looking for a money allowance race, probably some time in September or a possible overnight stake maybe for his first time back."

# Indian Blessing to Stretch Out?:

Indian Blessing (Indian Charlie), who strode away to an authoritative seven-length victory in Saturday's GI Test S., came out of the race in good order, according to trainer Bob Baffert. "She looks great," said Baffert, adding, "She's a little tired today, but she ran great." Baffert was impressed with the dark bay's new found maturity. "Her race before this [the GI Prioress S., July 5] was impressive. Plus, the Test is a very important race, so she stamped herself yesterday."
