





THIRD TIME'S A CHARM FOR TEAM VALOR

For years, commercials ran in the Capital District in New York that claimed Saratoga was the 'August place to be.' It's a catch phrase that Barry Irwin has taken to



heart. Twice in the past four years, Irwin had landed the top-priced horse at Fasig-Tipton's Saratoga Selected Yearlings Sale, and the head of Team Valor Int'l was at it again last night. Irwin, standing toward the back on the second floor of the Humphrey S. Finney sales

pavilion, saw off all challengers to land a Storm Cat filly for \$1.5 million. It was the top price paid for a yearling during the opener of the two-day sale. "I have seen only one better filly at public auction," Irwin said. "That was the one out of the dam of El Corredor and Roman Ruler; John Sikura had her. This one's the second best. She's got the most awesome body. She's just so athleticlooking. Her front legs are good; she's got everything you want. And she's got a great brain."

John Sikura had this filly, too. Sikura's Hill 'n' Dale Sales Agency consigned the miss, who was catalogued late in the session as hip 80. "She was one of Storm



Cat's last crops and had a great female family to boot, and on top of that, she was an outstanding physical specimen," said Hill 'n' Dale's Director of Sales Andrew Cary. "When you get all of that together, this is what can happen. She had size, balance, just great athleticism, really everything you could look for conformationally. She was very correct, she looks like she'll be able to carry her speed for a distance of ground, like her

[half] brother Lil's Lad [Pine Bluff] could. Barry Irwin bought her and he definitely understands what a good horse looks like. But the horse really did all the talking. She was very popular and all the right people were on her. I thought she'd bring close to \$1 million, but after that it's just a guess." **Cont. p2**

SIX ELECTED TO HALL OF FAME


The National Museum of Racing inducted its newest members at a ceremony Monday morning in Saratoga. A packed house crammed into Fasig-Tipton's Humphrey

S. Finney Pavilion to see jockeys Edgar Prado and Ismael "Milo" Valenzuela, trainer Carl Nafzger and the horses Inside Information, Manila and Ancient Title honored for their contributions to the sport. Dr. Dean Richardson, the noted equine surgeon who

cared for Barbaro, spoke at the event, mixing both humor and compassion in an opening address that stressed the importance of the horse and its care to the racing industry. Eclipse Award-winning jockey Edgar Prado, who was introduced by trainer Robert Klesaris, was another whose comments to the crowd were at times both funny and poignant. He drew laughs when he thanked his late mother for making him "five foot three and 114 pounds," and recalled his Kentucky Derby run with Barbaro as the highlight of his career. "I miss you my friend," the 41-year-old Peruvian jockey said. He added, "I have proved that dedication, persistence and dreams can be accomplished. I find myself filled with joy. For the past 22 years, my career has taken many roads in which I've found courage and strength and the will to succeed." Trainer Carl Nafzger, who has saddled a pair of Kentucky Derby winners in Unbridled (1990) and Street Sense (2007), was introduced by the latter's owner, Nafzger's longtime client and friend Jim Tafel. Nafzger, who thanked his wife Wanda, credited fellow Hall of Famer John Nerud for helping him along as a horseman. "He said keep them fat, keep them happy, work them a half-mile, and they'll win races for you," Nafzger remarked. But, most important, he continued, is "the horse. That's who brought us here. None of us would be here. The horse has taken me from Texas to the Hall of Fame."

Totemic is a half-sister to GII Fountain of Youth S. winner Lil's Lad (Pine Bluff), and a full-sister to graded stakes winner Cherokee and stakes winner Art Museum. The 19-year-old Totemic, a Grade III winner, was purchased by Horse France at the 2000 Keeneland November sale for \$1.075 million.

Asked his immediate plans for the new purchase, Irwin laughed and said, "To be truthful with you, I thought I had no shot to get her, so there is no plan."

Irwin confirmed the filly would be

offered through Team Valor Int'l in partnership, though he couldn't say how many members would comprise the partnership. "When I buy a 'normal-priced' horse, I mark up the horse 25 percent. On this one, I'll mark it up 10 percent," added Irwin.

A Fair Market...

In 2004, Irwin landed his first Fasig-Tipton Saratoga

sale topper when he went to \$1.85 million for Fairbanks, a son of Giant's Causeway who went on to take last year's GIII Tokyo City Cup H. and finish second in the GI Suburban H. and Massachusetts H. Last year, Irwin outlasted Terry Finley and Buzz Chance to acquire a \$2.2 million son of Mr. Greeley. That colt, Kinsella, recently had surgery to remove an ankle chip and is set to go to Gold Mark Farm in Ocala on Sept. 1. "We hope to run him by the end of the year," said Irwin, who added the colt is headed to Todd Pletcher's barn.

Whether or not his latest Saratoga purchase will be a sales-topper remains to be seen, but Irwin said that, despite the big price tag, he believes the final figure on the board was fair.

"I really only wanted to go to \$1.2 or \$1.3 million, but the way I look at it is, where are you going to find another horse like this?" he said. "I bought a couple earlier, and I wish the timing was different, because if I had bought this one first I may not have bought the others--it's stretching my bankroll--but I just couldn't resist her. I saw her the first day when I was here, and I told my wife she was beyond belief. I remember Lil's Lad when he was running, and I don't know if there was a better-looking horse ever than Lil's Lad. And this filly's got a lot of that look in her."

As for his fondness of the Spa, Irwin offered, "There's less competition up here for a top horse; that's my opinion. And a filly like this, at the next sale, might look like a pretty good deal. It looks expensive now, but at the next one it may look pretty darn good. It's worked out that way for me so far, and that's why I like coming here." *-Lucas Marquardt*

Night of the Hunter...

Fergus Galvin and Adrian Regan were friends even before they worked together at Irish National Stud as youngsters, hoping to learn the ropes of the horse business. Some 20 years later, Galvin and Regan are still pals, as well as business partners. Three years ago, with the financial backing of Irish partners John Wade and Tony Hegarty, they struck out on their own under the banner Hunter Valley Farm. Hunter Valley achieved quick success, selling the likes of Scat Daddy for \$250,000 and recent GII Sanford S. winner Desert Party as a yearling for \$425,000. But, last night, Hunter Valley soared to new levels when an A.P. Indy colt they consigned on behalf of a unnamed client sold to Lane's End's Will Farish for \$1.2 million. It was the top price for a colt for the first session, and secondhighest overall.

"He was a lovely horse from a very early stage, and was one of the best horses we've ever brought to a sale," said an emotional Regan immediately after the hammer fell. "We're happy he's going to a great outfit such as Mr. Farish's. He was a big, strong, strapping horse--really a man. And he's got a stallion's pedigree if everything works out." **Cont. p4**

Catalogued as hip 31, Hunter Valley's bay colt is out of the 11-year-old Broad Brush mare Pyramid Lake, who has already produced a pair of graded-stakes fillies in Pyramid Love (Fusaichi Pegasus) and Pyrana (Anabaa). From a top European family, Pyramid Lake is a halfsister to European highweight and G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe winner Peintre Celebre (Nureyev).

It was actually the second time Hunter Valley offered the colt, who was bred by Dream With Me Stables, at auction. Last November, bidding stalled out on the colt at \$500,000, short of his reserve.

"We were close enough, but we had no problem RNA'ing him as a weanling," said Regan. "We knew he was a horse that was only going to improve. He was a bit backward as a weanling. And, even in the last 90 days, as we were prepping him, he just kept getting better and better and better. We knew he was getting back, but it wasn't until the last week I started getting chills that this could be the one. I woke up on Thursday morning very early and just thought, 'Man, this could be the horse.'"

Indeed he was. For Galvin and Regan, it's a long way from their early days at Irish National Stud.

"That was my first job; I was 18," said Regan. "We really got to know each other very well. We kept in touch after that and have been good friends. Partnerships either work or don't, but this one's been fantastic. We've got the same idea about things."

Regan said that night's score represents the realization of a lot of hard work and more than a little risk.

"Both of us had very good jobs before, and we took the gamble," said Regan. "We both had good jobs before we did this; I was a manager at Crescent Hill for five years, and Fergus worked at Ashford. This horse was for a client who's been with myself and Fergus since we opened the farm and, without our clients, things like this wouldn't be possible."

The consignor added, "We're delighted it was here in Saratoga. These guys at Fasig-Tipton--Boyd [Browning] and the rest--are great to deal with. They've always been very supportive of us and they'll do anything for you." *-Lucas Marquardt*

Saparas Rise From the Ashes...

Jim and Alice Sapara know the ups and downs of the Thoroughbred business, and last night was one of the peaks, when their Distorted Humor colt, consigned by Craig and Holly Bandoroff's Denali Stud, realized a final bid of \$900,000. John Ferguson outlasted representatives of Charlotte Weber's Live Oak Stud for the first foal out of Grade III winner Stupendous Miss (Dynaformer) from the extended female family of Storm Bird. The Saparas were extended to \$1.3 million to acquire Stupendous Miss carrying this foal in utero at Keeneland November in 2006, and last night's transaction put a serious dent in that investment. "He was a nice colt and we thought he should be in [that price range] somewhere and he was, so we're very pleased," Jim Sapara commented. "That's a lot of money in this economy, and you have to think about that for a while. We were pleased with the way he sold and I have no complaints. You take what you get, and you're happy to get the kind of mare that's turning out that kind of a baby. We walk away grateful. That's a very good start for the mare and we're thankful for that." Stupendous Miss is the dam of a weanling filly by Storm Cat and is back in foal to Distorted Humor. She is one of a halfdozen mares owned by the Canadian-based couple, who have slowly eased back into the business following a fire at Sapara's company in 2001.

Darley acquired a number of shares in Distorted Humor from WinStar Farm a little less than a year ago. His son, Any Given Saturday, entered stud this year at Darley's Kentucky nursery. Of last night's purchase, Ferguson commented, "He was a lovely athletic horse and we're delighted to have him. The sire is obviously very successful and he was a horse of serious quality. I thought he was very expensive, but at the end of the day, I thought he was a horse that has a chance to be a very good one, so there's bound to be competition for him. He was out of a Dynaformer mare and he had more of a Dynaformer look to him."

Call It a Ground Rule Double...

Former Major League baseball player Rob Murphy, current player Paul Lo Duca and Pablo Suarez teamed up with hip 24 at Fasig-Tipton, and the combination were pleased when their colt by A.P. Indy--Platinum Tiara (Cozzene) went to John Ferguson, bidding for Sheikh Mohammed, for \$700,00 last night. "When your horse goes to a buyer like that, we're very pleased, absolutely," Murphy commented, adding, "You're dealing in an open marketplace...ilt's you against the world and, sure, we were hoping for more, but you can't force people to bid. We know he's going to a good home. That's good for the mare. She's got a beautiful Storm Cat filly on the ground, she's in foal to Unbridled's Song, so everything is good." Platinum Tiara helped to put Murphy, a former pitcher for the Cincinnati Reds, on the map as a racehorse owner, finishing second to Caressing in the 2000 GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies, in addition to winning three stakes and placing in no fewer than four graded events.

ing shed, producing Audacious Chloe (A.P. Indy), who made \$500,000 as a KEESEP yearling. Last night's offering added to her luster. "He was a nice horse and he moved well, and [A.P. Indy] is a sire that has been lucky for Godolphin and for Darley," Ferguson said. "It was a fair price, he was a good-looking colt, and the mare could run a little bit. But

\$700,000 is a lot of money." Taylor Made's Mark Taylor was satisfiedby the result. "I thought it was fair," he said. "The horse was such a good individual that you dream about seven figures plus, but the bottom line is once you get above \$500,000, it gets pretty thin. Darley got a great horse." Was the current economic downturn a factor? "It's probably too early to say, because this is the first horse of this magnitude that we've sold all year," he reasoned. "I think it's one of those things--sometimes a lot of people who wanted to give \$700,000 or \$800,000 say, 'There's no way I can afford this horse.' They figured Darley or Coolmore was going to buy him, so they got scared off; it leaves this vacuum at the top, and they're the beneficiary."

Stonestreet Off to Quick Start...

Folks have gotten plenty familiar with Jess Jackson as a buyer, and have gotten accustomed to seeing the fruits of his burgeoning broodmare band entered at both yearling and weanling sales. But Jess Jackson, consignor? You bet. Jess Jackson's Stonestreet Thoroughbred Holdings LLC sold its first horse last night, conveniently cataloged as hip 1, and did just fine, selling the homebred colt by Mr. Greeley for \$450,000. Darley representative John Ferguson purchased the chestnut, a son of the stakes-placed Royal Applause (GB) mare Madame Boulangere (GB). Stonestreet sold Madame Boulangere to Kern Livingston Association, agent, for \$52,000 at last year's Keeneland September Sale.

Jackson watched from the pavilion as the horse sold, and was happy with the immediate results of something he calls "an experiment."

"It's working well, so far," said Jackson, who was seated alongside his bloodstock agent John Moynihan, who is also managing the Stonestreet consignment.

Jackson said it made sense for Stonestreet as consignor to make its maiden voyage at a modest-sized venue like Fasig-Tipton Saratoga. Stonestreet will not consign at the mammoth Keeneland September this year, but Jackson said that Stonestreet may well in the future.

"This is a select market, and we had the right horses," he said. "Some of our best yearlings are here, and they're selling well. I think we'll continue to consign our horses. That doesn't mean we're abandoning the consignors we've used in the past, but we'll do this to keep our people sharp."

Two other offerings from Stonestreet's consignment went under the hammer yesterday: <u>hip 35</u>, a colt by ulpit that brought 300,000; and <u>hip 71</u>, a filly by Forestry that sold for 200,000.

Jackson said Stonestreet is selling its entire yearling crop, 80 or 90 head. The operation currently has about 120 broodmares. *-Lucas Marquardt*

Statistical Gains No Real Surprise...

Despite some predictions to the contrary, the first boutique sale of the season held up extremely well

year-over-year. Fewer horses sold resulted in slightly lower turnover, but the average of \$302,667 was ahead by 15.8 percent versus the corresponding figure from 2007. That number could have been even better, but for the RNA of hip 7, a colt by Unbridled's Song which was led out of the ring unsold on a bid of \$900,000. The impact on the average would have been at least \$10,000. The median of \$235,000 also showed a healthy advance from last year, gaining 13.25

percent. Buybacks were slightly higher in 2008--29.4 versus 21.6 percent. "From where I sat this evening, it looked like a very solid horse sale," said Fasig-Tipton Chairman D.G. Van Clief Jr. "The company expected that this market niche would perform in a solid manner, and I think it did." While the overall market at this company's July Yearling Sale struggled three weeks ago, there was plenty of interest and money for a top horse, and that was borne out again last night. A total of nine horses brought in excess of a half-million dollars last night, compared to six during last year's opening session. Two horses were sold for better than \$1 million last evening, while there was a single seven-figure horse in 2007. Walt Robertson, president of Fasig-Tipton, was not entirely surprised by the performance of the market. "It was a good sale," he stated. "I thought going in, this segment would perform pretty well, because the upper end in Kentucky performed pretty well. There weren't a lot of surprises; it wasn't always easy, buybacks were up, but still manageable at under 30 percent." There is still plenty of demand for a top horse, Robertson indicated. "I think that segment of the market has been pretty healthy so far this year, and it hasn't changed," he remarked. "People want a nice horse and will pay \$300,000 for that kind of horse. We're happy to have averaged over \$300,000 tonight. I would have been surprised if we had struggled tonight, because there was strength in this segment in Kentucky." The sale wraps up this evening with a session beginning at 7 p.m.

Long and Winding Road...

It's about a 15-hour van ride for Saratoga-bound yearlings from Central Kentucky. Just ask consignor Eric Gulley, he'll tell you. The horseman, who operates under the banner of Long Branch Farm, spent every one of those minutes on the van with his Successful Appeal filly, which sells tonight at Fasig-Tipton as <u>hip 119</u>. And the youngster apparently took the ride a bit better than her owner.

"She tolerated the trip really, really well," said Gulley. "Me? I am a nervous wreck. There's too much that can go wrong, but luckily, nothing did."

Gulley brings his first horse to Saratoga tonight and is especially proud to have raised her with the help of his wife Cindy and his sons, 16-year-old Taylor and sixyear-old Tripp, on his 30-acre farm just outside of Lexington.

"It's everything to me to have my family contribute the way they do," he commented. "We've done everything with her from day one. We take pride in what we do. I know every hair on her. A lot of people don't think a whole lot about that, but, trust me, it matters."

Gulley's filly was produced by Call Her Magic (Caller I. D.), one of three mares he owns. After racing for as little as a \$25,000 claiming price early in her career, she won the Ocean Hotel S. in 1999 and closed her account with three consecutive wins, including the Walkin in Da Sun S., en route to bankrolling \$\$195,013. The dam of the stakes-placed Kid Majic (Lemon Drop Kid), Call Her Magic is a half-sister to Pacific Spell, who is responsible for this year's GI Kentucky Oaks heroine Proud Spell (Prpud Citizen). Gulley is impressed with her current produce, while realistic about what he's got.

"She's a nice, big strong filly," he said. "We're up against the big dogs, but she certainly fits here. She's truly been special from the day she was foaled. We're very proud of her."

Tonight's offering will be the final one from the mare bred by Gulley and his family. Call Her Magic was sold at Keeneland November to WinStar Farm for a solid \$95,000 while back in foal to Successful Appeal. "You can't keep them all," he stated. "She's a nice mare, but sometimes you need to raise some money. I would have loved to keep her and foal the colt out, but sometimes you just have to part with them. We did good with her."

The other foal from Call Her Magic bred by Gulley was a \$52,000 Keeneland November weanling. The consignor is full of respect for his filly's sire.

"I think people haven't seen anything yet," he said of Successful Appeal. "He's getting all kinds of runners and this is from his second Kentucky crop, so I have been really impressed with what he's done. I thought it would be a really good cross. The mare is a scopey mare and she was really big. Successful Appeal seemed to fit just right with her. We were very happy with what we got."

Gulley is in the process of relocating his operation to a 70-acre farm located near Adena Springs in Paris, and will therefore lay low, while offering a few foals at Keeneland November. But he is not likely to significantly grow his consignment anytime soon.

"We are aiming for quality over quantity, especially when you're doing the work yourself," he commented. "You just try to do everything the right way and hope that it comes out right. I can't see getting much bigger. I change the water myself on her twice a day in her stall. I don't baby them at all, but I'm just into making sure that everything's right, keeping them happy."

Gulley lives by a fairly simple motto.

"If you don't take care of them, they don't take care of you. If you take care of them, they take care of you, that's what I live by," he offered.

Though perhaps a bit premature to pass judgement, Gulley has been overwhelmed by his first trip to the Spa.

"It's been absolutely great," he said. "It's been unreal and I haven't touched or seen almost anything. My nerves have been pretty shot, but it's got to be one of the most beautiful places on earth. I would love to come up here and not be so stressed out. But everybody's been great."

John and Marsha Antonelli picked up the mare, in foal to Johannesburg for \$95,000 at KEENOV in 2003. They sold the resulting foal, for \$75,000 as a KEENOV weanling the following year; that filly blossomed into a \$1.1 million FTFFEB juvenile and turned out to be GSW La Traviata. The Antonellis sold the mare's next offspring, a colt by Holy Bull, for \$85,000 as a KEENOV weanling in 2005, but turned the real profit with this colt, the first progeny to sell since the now-retired La Traviata went three-for-four in 2007 and captured the GIII Victory Ride S.

Blue Grass Thoroughbred Services bought the mare, then empty, for \$55,000 at KEENOV in 2004, and bred her to Strong Hope in 2005. Her daughter Sabellina (Langfuhr), at the time of the purchase a New Yorkbred stakes winner, went on to take the GIII Cardinal H. in 2006. 
Forget Groundhog Day. What could be described as Danzig Day recurs nearly as frequently, with descendants of the great Claiborne stallion popping up regularly in the day's feature races, in much the same way that Punxsutawney Phil emerges every Feb. 2.

Aug. 3 was another Danzig Day, with Danzig's stallion sons being responsible for major winners in three different countries. Anabaa set the ball rolling when his highly progressive daughter Goldikova defeated a vintage field of distaffers in the G1 Prix Rothschild. Next to pick up the ball was Langfuhr, whose son Marlang led throughout to land the final leg of the Canadian Triple Crown, and then Boundary completed a tremendous treble when Big Brown had to work much harder than his odds suggested to land the GI Haskell Invitational. For good measure, the G1 German Oaks fell to Rosenreihe, a filly from the first crop by Danzig's grandson Catcher In The Rye. Of course this sequence came only eight days after the previous Danzig Day, when two other sons of Danzig--Danehill and Belong To Me-were respectively responsible for the Group 1 winners Duke of Marmalade and Forever Together.

Goldikova's recent Group victories at Chantilly and Deauville were gained with such assurance that it is possible that the daughter of Anabaa is now a better filly than when she was placed behind the unbeaten Zarkava in the French classics. Her victories also suggest that she is much more at home at a mile than over the 1 5/16 miles of the Prix de Diane, and this would be in line with her excellent pedigree.

A member of a family which has done sterling work for the Wertheimers for several generations, Goldikova is by a champion sprinter and her dam, Born Gold, is a sister to Gold Splash, winner of two of Europe's most prestigious mile prizes for fillies, the Prix Marcel Boussac and Coronation S. You can get some idea of the quality of this female line from the fact that Goldikova's Group-placed half-sister Born Something was sold for 820,000gns as a three-year-old in 2001.

Anabaa--who also cropped up Sunday as the broodmare sire of Silver Frost, winner of the G3 Prix de Cabourg--spent the 2007 season at a fee of \$40,000 at Castleton Lyons in Kentucky. The transfer of this champion sprinter looked a good idea at a time when America's steady switch to synthetic surfaces promised to favor fast horses with turf backgrounds. However, a book of 54 mares seems to tell another story, and Anabaa was transferred permanently back to Haras du Quesnay in France. French breeders must be glad to have him back, as his 2008 group winners include Goldikova, Group 2 winner Loup Breton and Group 3 winner Hapsburg (plus Group 1 and Group 2 winners in Australia). He currently ranks third on France's leading sires' list, having finished second to Danehill last year, when he was champion sire of juveniles.

For a horse capable of siring plenty of two-year-old winners, Anabaa is very versatile, getting winners over a wide range of distances. His latest Australian Group 1 winner, Imananabaa, captured the Railway Stakes over six furlongs but he had earlier been represented by such as Teranaba, winner of the AJC Spring Champion Stakes over 1 1/4 miles and Headturner, hero of the AJC Australian Derby over 1 1/2 miles.

It has been a similar story in Europe. At the higher end of the distance scale he's been represented by a Prix du Jockey-Club winner in Anabaa Blue and a Prix Vermeille runner-up in Ana Marie. Such success would have been hard to predict on the basis of the racing records of Anabaa and of his fast dam, Balbonella.

However his grandsires Northern Dancer and Gay Mecene were, respectively, Group 1 winners over 1 1/4 miles and 1 9/16 miles. When Balbonella was mated to Danzig's son Chief's Crown, she produced the versatile Key of Luck, sire of the Irish Derby winner Alamshar.

Anabaa follows Danehill and Green Desert as the third son of Danzig to sire a top winner from a daughter of Blushing Groom, the predecessors being the American GI winners Light Jig and White Heart. Another Group winner bred to a similar pattern is Danzigaway, dam of the Wertheimer-bred Grade II winner Silent Name, now a resident at Adena Springs.

An interesting link between Sunday's three big winners by sons of Danzig is that all three are inbred to Northern Dancer. Goldikova and Marlang are inbred 3x4; Big Brown is inbred 3x3. The second line of Northern Dancer in Goldikova's pedigree comes via Lyphard, who sired her distinguished second dam, Riviere d'Or, from the even more distinguished Gold River.

This outstanding daughter of Riverman was the luckless victim when lightning struck a Kentucky paddock in 1986. Gold River was only nine and had only four foals, but she left a legacy worthy of a mare whose racecourse exploits included victories in the Prix Royal-Oak, Prix du Cadran (over 2 1/2 miles) and the Arc.


Needless to say, Gold River was given every chance as a broodmare, her foals being by Northern Dancer, Nijinsky, Lyphard and Nureyev. Gold River's death came at about the time her Northern Dancer colt Chercheur d'Or won the G3 Prix du Lys to become the first of her three stakes winners.

Both of her other stakes winners, the Lyphard filly Riviere d'Or and the Nureyev colt Goldneyev, were good enough to take the runner-up spot in a French Classic. Goldneyev (later to sire the Wertheimers' very good miler Gold Away) was second in the Poule d'Essai des Poulains, whereas Riviere d'Or took second in the Prix de Diane after winning the G1 Prix Saint-Alary.

Both of Gold River's daughters have made their mark as broodmares, with Riviere d'Or leading the way as the dam of Gold Splash. Gold Splash's combination of first-rate pedigree and performance earned her repeat visits to such as Danzig, Storm Cat and Deputy Minister but it was only this year, 18 years after her birth, that she was finally represented by a stakes winner (the French-based Royal Academy colt Royal God).

This is in sharp contrast to the success enjoyed by her year-younger sister Born Gold. Born Gold was distinctly ordinary on the track--she had to travel to Jallais in the French Provinces to get her head in front--but she has proved easily the better broodmare, Goldikova being her third group winner from nine runners.

Goldikova's victory in the Prix Rothschild means that she has emulated her third, fourth and fifth dams--Riviere d'Or, Gold River and Glaneuse--by becoming a Group 1 winner. Remarkably, all these fillies raced for the Wertheimer family and were all trained by members of the Head family--an achievement of which all concerned should be very proud.



ARQANA READY TO WELCOME THE WORLD

Buyers attending this year's Arqana Deauville Yearling Sale will find an auction company with renewed devotion to both quality of product and quality of presentation, with particular attention to attracting an international buying bench.

Arqana was formed two years ago with the merger of



L'Agence Francaise and Goffs France. The merger, which was designed to strengthen the international standing of France's breeding industry, was made largely through the initiative of the Aga Khan, who individually owns an 18-percent share in Arqana. "I think the goal [of the merger]

Olivier Delloye arqana.com was to make the French sales company much stronger than it was and, in that way, to support all the French breeders that invest quite a lot of money to breed some nice yearlings

every year," said Arqana Managing Director Olivier Delloye. "And I think one of the key goals was to make Deauville a much more international market and, I would say, a more qualitative market in August."



According to Delloye, the restructuring of the company provided the impetus for renewed energy and confidence within the French commercial breeding industry.

"The change in shareholders was quite important for all the stakeholders in the company," Delloye said. "All the vendors felt much more confident in the company's future because of the new shareholders, with His Highness the Aga Khan in the first position. And the Aga Khan, together with a group of French commercial breeders, having capital in the company gave much more confidence to the people who sold at Deauville. It really helped us create good momentum. It had a very positive psychological effect."

At the 2005 August Sale, 326 yearlings sold for a total of \in 22,842,000. The average was \in 70,067 and the median was \in 47,000. In 2006, Arqana sold 366 yearlings for \in 29,772,000. The average rose to \in 81,344 and the median increased to \in 57,000. Those figures increased again last year, when 382 yearlings sold for \in 37,448,000. The average was \in 98,031 and the median was \in 60,000.

"Together with the change in management, which I think has brought a lot of energy and new methods and more marketing, I think it also helps buyers to feel more confident in the sales company," Delloye said of the sale's progress. "And all of that came in a positive economic environment, since the yearling market has grown quite a lot in the past four or five years in Europe. So all of these factors translated into a very sharp increase in the August sale over the past two years."

The sales company continues to work hard to widen its appeal in the international marketplace.

"We have worked quite a lot on the offered side over the last few years," Delloye said. "We have slightly increased the numbers of very good individuals bred abroad, from Great Britain, Ireland and even the U.S. This year in the catalogue, we have 40 yearlings who were bred and born in the U.S."

Among the American stallions represented by yearlings in the August catalogue are: Afleet Alex, Cozzene, Della Francesca, Distorted Humor, Dubai Destination, El Corredor, Elusive Quality, Empire Maker, Fusaichi Pegasus, Giant's Causeway, Gone West, Hennessy, Horse Chestnut (SAf), Indian Charlie, Johannesburg, Langfuhr, Leroidesanimaux (Brz), Lion Heart, Mizzen Mast, Mr. Greeley, Proud Citizen, Quiet American, Seeking the Gold, Strong Hope, Tale of the Cat, Theatrical (Ire), Tiznow, Toccet and Vindication.

Among the American-bred offerings is a son of Gone West out of a half sister to Grade I winner Spinning Round (Dixieland Band), who is the dam of Dream Supreme and granddam of Majestic Warrior.

That colt is consigned by Haras des Capucines, as agent for Taylor Made Farm. The Haras des Capucines consignment, which includes offerings from Airdrie Stud and Hill 'n' Dale, also includes a daughter of GI Belmont S. winner Empire Maker out of multiple Grade I winner You (You and I).

Arqana is committed to putting together a powerpacked catalogue.

Delloye cont.

"We are very pleased with the catalogue," Delloye commented. "Every year we follow some very simple indicators to monitor the quality of the catalogue, like the percent of group-performing dams and group-producing dams, just to make sure the quality is improving. This year, we were very pleased with the trend of this indicator. If you take, for instance, the first day, which is the most select part of the sale, we have 30 percent of the first dams who are group performers, and 50 percent of these mares are group producers--talking just about the mares who already have foals of racing age. So this is one very positive aspect,"

"The other positive aspect is that the French commercial breeders have made huge efforts in the past years to send their best mares to more popular, more fashionable stallions, and probably stallions more appealing to international buyers. So the best foals bred in France are more appealing to international buyers than they were in the past couple of years."

Delloye thinks American buyers may be more receptive than ever to expanding their search for outstanding bloodlines.

"I think Americans will have a very positive feeling about the horses they will see, which is basically the most important thing," Delloye continued. "They should be quite excited by the reading of the catalogue and

they won't be disappointed at at the sales. And I think, at present time, when all the American breeders are thinking of how they can regenerate their breeding stock because of all these drug issues, it might be a good opportunity



to move back a little toward Europe and get some nice fillies, because we are breeding some drug-free yearlings. It might be a good time to look for sound and well-bred yearlings, and either race them in Europe before sending them back to the U.S., or maybe import them directly to the U.S."

With a catalogue of pedigrees designed to attract an international market, Arqana is starting an ambitious renovation of its sales ground and pavilion to provide a welcoming environment to its discriminating clientele.

"Being in the center of the town of Deauville, the sales ground is not as big as those like Keeneland," Delloye admitted. "We needed to build some more boxes to give more comfort to vendors and buyers at the sales. And we will continue this renovation program with the modernization of the sales stadium, which will start next year. This is aimed at giving buyers who are used to visiting sales complexes all over the world the same standard of comfort and hospitality that one can find in Australia or in the U.S. We really want to match the best sales companies in terms of hospitality. We know we have the chance to welcome them to Deauville, which is a fantastic place to operate sales, but we need to make our sales grounds the same standard as the best in the world, even though it will remain quite small because it is in the town."

Even the name of the new company will help put it in a better marketing position, according to Delloye.

"Another change, which is in my mind quite important, is the fact that we operate through a new brand, which is Arqana," he explained. "Before that, the company was called L'Agence Francaise de Vente du Pursang, which was kind of a typical French name, not a name that was easy to pronounce or even to remember for potential buyers abroad. Working with this new brand makes our lives much easier to promote the French sales."

For the first time, Arqana is printing an English version of its August catalogue.

"We definitely want to open ourselves to potential buyers everywhere in the world," Delloye explained. "So I think this English version of the catalogue will allow more people everywhere to be aware of what we have on offer. And it comes with a very superior catalogue this year, so I think it is a good opportunity. Our business is about service, so we really have to adapt to our customers expectations. With this version, non-French speakers may read the catalogue for the first time and they will feel more comfortable to come and maybe to buy here."

The August sale is supported for the first time this year by its own website, <u>www.thesalesparadise.com</u>. The site features not only the sales catalogue and video of recent graduates, but also information on the town of Deauville. It contains maps, hotel information and a schedule of events in and around town.

"We totally revamped our Arqana website two years ago, and for the first time I wanted to have a website

that just supports the August sale and to provide people with all the information they could expect from us regarding the sale," Delloye said. "The traffic was good and the word of mouth was very





positive. And the website allows some people who have never come to Deauville to have a good idea of what the sale is, in terms of the yearlings offered and what Deauville stands for. It is interesting for people to have an idea of what it looks like before they arrive."

This year's Deauville sale will take place in a more uncertain economic climate and Delloye is realistic about what impact that will have on results.

"Of course, you cannot totally deny the economic environment, which is not very favorable," he admitted. "My belief is that we could do pretty well on the top end of the market because we have some very outstanding individuals. I hope that we will do well on the first two days despite this bad economic environment. I'm not that pessimistic about the top end of the market, but obviously, like everywhere else, it will be much tougher in the middle market. We have maintained the same number of catalogued horses--we have never inflated this number--so probably this will help. We have been very careful in selecting the yearlings because we knew we would not be in a very positive economic environment, and we are lucky enough to have attracted some top-class individuals. Still, there are more than 500 yearlings to sell, so the middle market will not be that easy."

One thing that will be an easy sell to prospective buyers is the town of Deauville itself.

Arqana is committed to making buyers feel welcome in Deauville, with everything from private flights to bicycles.

"Two years ago, we set up an initiative to provide private flights departing from Dublin and London," said Delloye. "So now, every year we invite some buyers from Ireland and England to join this flight and get directly to Deauville. Unfortunately, there are no commercial flights arriving in Deauville, so we decided to implement this to make buyers' lives easier.

"And then, once they are on site, Deauville is a nice

place and there is a lot of entertainment around the sales. We pay a lot of attention to the hotels, that everything is OK and that buyers have a nice welcome back when they arrive at their hotels," he added. "And

for the first time we will offer our buyers and visitors bicycles to ride in Deauville, instead of driving. It is that kind of small detail which makes our sale very popular. This is why people love coming to Deauville. They find something very special they will never find anywhere else."

Delloye is looking forward to an influx of American buyers to this year's sale.

"American people will be very welcome in Deauville," he said. "There were very few American buyers in the past years, but there were a few last year, notably buying through Michel Zerolo's Oceanic Bloodstock. It will be fantastic to see more American people visiting the French sales, either in August or in December." - Jessica Martini

A Slice of Americana in Deauville...

The catalogue for the Deauville sale is flavored not only with yearlings by American sires, but also with horses being offered on behalf of stateside consignors. A handful of youngsters owned by Brereton C. Jones's Airdrie Stud, John Sikura's Hill 'n' Dale Farm and Taylor Made Farm are set to go under the hammer during the first two days of the sale Aug. 15 and 16, and hopes are high that their American-infused pedigrees will appeal to the European marketplace.

"I sure think so," said Airdrie's Bret Jones when asked whether the timing is right for such an undertaking. "I think we're sending the right horses over there. With the value of the Euro right now compared with the dollar, it could very well prove a profitable enterprise."


It is with good reason that Jones is bullish on his chances. <u>Hip 97</u>, the first of two Airdrie-breds to take their spot in the ring, is a Canadian Frontier daughter of Da River Hoss (River Special). Out of a half-sister to dual GI Breeders' Cup Mile hero Da Hoss, who was purchased by former Governor Jones for \$16,000 out of the 1997 Keeneland September sale, the bay filly is a 3/4-sister to River Proud (Proud Citizen), winner of the 2007 G3 Somerville Tattersall S. and most recently third in the G1 Poule d'Essai des Poulains May 11.

"The family has been very successful on the grass," Jones said. "We wanted to show off a nice Canadian Frontier internationally. It's nice to get the sire off with a nice individual over there.

<u>Hip 164</u> is a filly by Proud Citizen, himself from the extended female family of champion Bernardini, the young sire Hook and Ladder and G1SW Muhtathir (GB).

"Proud Citizen has been very well received internationally," Jones added. "Several European buyers did well with their pinhooks last year into the breeze-up sales. It's just another way to show off a nice Proud Citizen and it's a pretty strong family down the page."

The Airdrie horses are being handled by Haras des Capucines, as are the pair which is offered for Taylor Made. <u>Hip 17</u> is an April-foaled filly by Distorted Humor out of Molasses (Fr) (Machiavellian), a half-sister to the dam of G1SWs Light Shift and Shiva (Jpn) and MGSW Limnos. Molasses was consigned by Taylor Made to the 2005 Keeneland November sale in foal to High Chaparral (Ire), but was bought back on a bid of \$425,000. The chestnut's half-sister Magadan (Ire), also by High Chaparral, was a maiden winner at first asking in April and was most recently third in the G1 Grand Prix de Paris July 14.

<u>Hip 65</u> is a Gone West colt and the first foal from Two Chimneys (Deputy Commander), a half-sister to GISW Spinning Round, the dam of MGISW Dream Supreme and granddam of GISW Majestic Warrior. Taylor Made purchased Two Chimneys for \$160,000 with this foal in utero at the 2006 November sale. Taylor Made's Duncan Taylor reasons that you have to be flexible in this business and explore all options.

"It's such an international business that if you can put the horse in the right market and let it stand out as something special, you might get more money," he said. "We're just trying a few different things and we think these horses fit well."

The Hill 'n' Dale entry, <u>hip 184</u>, is being consigned by Haras d'Etreham. A daughter of the farm's stallion El Corredor, the brown filly is out of Amelia Saratoga (Jpn) (Dehere), whose pedigree is likely to appeal to the European market. A half-sister to SW & GSP Play Waki for Me, she is also kin to Factice (Known Fact), the dam of G1 English and Irish 2000 Guineas hero Cocknet Rebel (Ire). Offered with the El Corredor in utero at the 2007 Keeneland January sale, Amelia Saratoga was led out unsold at \$95,000. Another offering from the red, white and blue is <u>hip 73</u>. Consigned by Capucines and owned by Edmund Gann, the daughter of Empire Maker is the latest foal from Gann's five-time Grade I winner You (You and I), dam of the recently stakes-placed You and I Forever (A.P. Indy).

"She is a big, stretchy kind of Empire Maker," commented Bayne Welker of Mill Ridge Farm, where the filly was raised. "She has kind of a more European look to her. She stands over a bit of ground, she's got quite a bit of frame and she is very correct." - *Alan Carasso*

TRF RAISES \$540K AT SUNDAY GALA Buoved by the last-minute addition of a season to Street Cry (Ire), which brought a winning bid of \$230,000 by Airdrie Stud's Bret Jones, the Thoroughbred Retirement Foundation raised \$540,000 at its annual charity event in Saratoga Springs Sunday night. The gala, held at the Saratoga National Golf Club, drew a crowd of 375, and featured an auction of "unique experiences" and stallion season options. Darley Stud, in keeping with the event's format, had originally agreed to donate an option to breed to Street Cry at the 2008 fee of \$100,000, with the farm collecting the live-foal fee and the charity retaining the option price. As the evening wore on, however, Darley America's Chief Operating Officer Dan Pride informed the event's organizers that Darley would like to do more. "We are fortunate to be in a position to support many charitable causes in the industry, and Thoroughbred retirement is one of our key causes," Pride said. "Last night was a great format to try to bring awareness to this important issue, and Darley wants to contribute as much as possible to that cause." When the season came up for bid, a spirited bidding war between Chester Broman and Jones ensued, with Jones finally landing the prize. "I can't adequately express the TRF's gratitude to Sheik Mohammed and the whole Darley team," said Diana Pikulski, the TRF's executive director. "In a tough economy, they stepped up to the plate and guaranteed the success of the event for us." Topping the list of unique experiences was a trip to Morocco, which brought \$15,500 from Arianne deKwiatkowski. Seats to the last-ever regular season game at Yankee Stadium, combined with the privilege of throwing out the first pitch at Oriole Park at Camden Yards in August, brought \$15,000 from Tony Mitola. John Angelos donated that experience.

Attendance Improves in Second Week at the Spa:

Attendance and handle at the 2008 Saratoga meeting, which was off sharply during opening week, showed improvement during the second week of the season. The first week, plagued by bad weather that shortened fields, saw attendance decline 24.8 percent, with on-track attendance off 11.8 percent and total allsources handle off 12.6 percent. Attendance was down 17.8 percent during the first five days of week two, with on-track handle down 9.7 percent and total handle off 9.6 percent. Through the first 11 days of the stand, attendance averaged 22,854, as compared to 27,811 last year. Total handle averaged \$14,797,355, down from \$16,374,475, while on-track handle over the period averaged \$3,041,147, down from \$3,367,768. One figure has improved from 2007 to 2008, as daily average purses were up, from \$789,317 last year to \$805,342 this season. "Despite the decline in handle, we will keep the current purse structure in place throughout the meet, including the distance purse incentives that have contributed to a year-over-year purse increase of two percent," said New York Racing Association President and CEO Charles Hayward.

Certification of Secondary Pari-Mutuel Orgs in Works:


Regulators from 13 states, including California, Kentucky and New York, announced yesterday that they will move to require off-shore wagering companies and secondary pari-mutuel organizations (SPMOs) to be certified by the Association of Racing Commissioners before they be allowed to wager into pools under the states' jurisdictions. Implementation is expected to be Jan. 1, 2010, giving ARCI the time to do thorough background checks on those entities applying for certification. The SPMOs will bear the expense of the certification process. "Today, nearly 90 percent of the money wagered in horse racing occurs away from the track and, in several cases, outside of the country, with little or no regulatory review," said California Horse Racing Board Chair Richard Shapiro. "For this reason, it is critical that the states regulating this sport know exactly who we are doing business with, and that the integrity of the game is not jeopardized. The establishment of an independent process of certification and due diligence will ensure integrity at all levels." Shapiro added, "This initiative is long overdue, and I am pleased that it has been so widely supported." The RCI Board of Directors has given its unanimous approval to the certification program. The other states lending their support to the initiative are New Jersey, Illinois, Pennsylvania, Ohio, Indiana, Virginia, Delaware, Colorado, Oklahoma and New Hampshire.

Gov. Schwarzenegger to Chair BC Host Committee:

Gov. Arnold Schwarzenegger will serve as the chairman for the Breeders' Cup Host Committee in 2008, it was announced yesterday. The 2008 Breeders' Cup will be held Oct. 24-25 at Santa Anita. "The very first Breeders' Cup was run in California, and so it is a special honor to host the 25th running of horse racing's most prestigious championship races at Santa Anita during the Oak Tree season," Gov. Schwarzenegger said. "The event will not only showcase one of the world's most beautiful racetracks, but also will generate more than \$100 million for the California economy. I am looking forward to working with the other members of the Host Committee to ensure its success."
