#### WOODWARD NEXT FOR CURLIN

Horse of the Year **Curlin** (Smart Strike) will return to dirt for his next start in Saratoga's GI Woodward S.

Aug. 30, owner Jess Jackson announced on yesterday's NTRA Teleconference. Since his second-place finish on the grass in the GI Man o'War S. July 12, the handsome chest-nut has posted three workouts at the Spa, including a five-furlong move over the Oklahoma training track in 1:02 3/5 Aug. 4. Other races under consideration for Curlin's next start

were the GI Arlington Million Aug. 9 and the GI Pacific Classic at Del Mar Aug. 24. "He's here now [at Saratogal, and we thought it would be best to stay at this venue, both for him and for racing," Jackson said. "It's the legacy of the horse and the fitness of the horse right now that made the final decision for the Woodward. His legacy is one of the reasons I wanted to run at Saratoga. [Racing at such a] historic venue will add luster to his legacy." The turf experiment isn't over for Curlin yet, Jackson confirmed. "Turf's not out of his future," he said. "We have to take one race at a time... we think he could be a turf champion. We're not sure he has enough time this year to make the adjustments to be satisfied with his top condition on the turf. The Arc is probably out for this year. If we race Curlin next year, we could point for the Arc for the culmination of his career, but the chances of racing him next year are pretty slim. It's a hard decision whether to retire him and improve the gene pool or to race him and help the sport. We're having a great deal of fun watching him run. He's such a special animal." Looking further down the line Jackson said, "We'd like to go [in the GI Breeders' Cup Classic], but that's an untested surface and we're very uncertain about it. The Breeders' Cup has two races we considered--the Turf and the Classic. We won the Classic already--been there, done that. We looked at the Turf, but we also see the potential of that conflicting with other races. We've been invited to Japan, Hong Kong and other venues on the North America continent as well. We're going to keep all of those options open, but right now, let's focus on the Woodward and do our best to compete well."

#### **COOL \$2 MILLION FOR COOLMORE**

Coolmore wasn't making a lot of noise early during

yesterday's session of the Fasig-Tipton Saratoga Selected Yearlings Sale, but when they finally moved, they made it count. With Michael V. Magnier signing the ticket, Coolmore came through with a \$2-million bid for Hip 158, a handsome colt by Storm Cat out of GSW Get Lucky (Mr. Prospector). Darley's John Ferguson was involved in the battle, as was D. Wayne Lukas, acting on behalf of Legends Racing, but, bidding in near darkness at the back walking ring, Magnier,

flanked by Coolmore's Paul Shanahan, leveled the final volley in the clash of titans. "All the lads thought he was lovely," said Magnier. "We loved the horse and just had to have him." With a sire that needs no introduction, the colt also boasts a female family that brings impressive credentials to the table. Get Lucky, winner of the GIII Affectionately H., is a full sister to juvenile champion Rhythm. The 20-year-old mare is the dam of three stakes winners, including the Phipps' GSW and GISP Daydreaming (A.P. Indy). She is owned in partnership by Ben Walden Jr. and Philip Steinberg.


November sale. That price tag looked like a bargain yesterday at Saratoga. "I'm happy, very happy," an understated Walden said, while also admitting to some relief. "I'm glad to have it over with." The fireworks were not unexpected for the duo, who sold the foal in partnership

with WinStar Farm. "You don't bring too many up here, or to any horse sale, that represents the potential that this horse does. And I'm very honored to have sold him for Phil and I and I'm pleased with his price." Asked if the seven-figure price was near the colt's reserve, Walden said, "It was way past it. We brought him here to sell. We didn't think our reserve would come into play and it didn't." While the colt was a handful in the ring, it was apparently the only time his behaviour gave Walden and Steinberg cause for concern. "He's always been okay," Steinberg said. "He's been great since he was born. He has a great mind and he's been a beautiful colt ever since he was born." Walden added, "He bloomed up here. He grew up into a young man. He is a Storm Cat, and you don't fight with those guys and you don't push them. You kind of have to ease them along when you throw new things at them. He handled it beautifully." Michael Magnier affirmed, "He's an outstanding horse. He's good-looking, the best looking of the sale." Get Lucky also produced She's a Winner (A.P. Indy), dam of GI Haskell Invitational S. winner and GI Kentucky Derby and GI Belmont S. runner-up Bluegrass Cat (Storm Cat). She has a weanling full brother to the FTSAUG topper and is in foal to GI Preakness S. winner Bernardini (A.P. Indy). - Jessica Martini

#### Quick Start To Day 2...

Things got rolling quickly yesterday when the fourth horse through the ring brought a healthy \$750,000 final bid from trainer Nick Zito, bidding on behalf of Robert LaPenta's Whitehorse Stable. Consigned by Eaton Sales, Hip 102, a son of Mr. Greeley, was a \$350,000 KEENOV weanling purchase by Olin Gentry. He is out of the Deputy Minister mare Arcadiana, a half sister to Horse of the Year Cigar. "Cigar is one of my favorite horses of all time," explained LaPenta. "The pedigree is the reason I had to buy him." LaPenta added, "I've never had a Mr. Greeley, but sometimes we've had a lot of luck doing something we never did before." Asked whether the price was what he expected, LaPenta remarked, "It was a little more, but we think he was well worth it." Eaton's Reiley McDonald thought the horse brought a lot more to the table than just pedigree. "He is a beautiful colt and he was one of the best moving horses on the farm," he said, adding, "We thought he would bring between \$600,000 and \$700,000. His sire also was a big draw. We were happy with the price. And I am very happy that Mr. LaPenta bought the horse. In fact, I am even more pleased that Nick [Zito] will get him. He's in good hands." As for what lies ahead, LaPenta commented, "We'll send him to the farm with the rest of the babies, break him, see how he looks and think about the twovear-old sales." -- Christina Bossinakis

#### Foxhill In the Hunt...

With the action winding down, there was still some firepower left in the pavilion. Tom McGreevy, bidding on behalf of Rick Porter's Foxhill Farm, fired a \$675,000 bid to land Hip 184, a filly by A.P. Indy and out of Jewel for a King (Storm Cat). Consigned by Eaton Sales on behalf of the Estate of Roger King, the yearling was the sole purchase for Porter at this year's sale. King, who purchased the filly's dam for \$1.4 million at this sale in 2004, bred the dark bay. A daughter of GI Breeders' Cup Distaff winner and champion older mare Jewel Princess (Key to the Mint), the five-year-old unraced mare is a full sister to stakes winner One Nice Cat. "She looked like a two-turn filly with some pedigree, which is what we look for, and she really fit the bill," said McGreevy. "She is very athletic and looks like she'll be able to get a distance." Explaining Porter's Foxhill philosophy, McGreevy added, "We always start by looking at conformation, and if they are a two-turn type, then we focus on the pedigree. Rick really likes the pedigree of this filly. She just filled both categories." With the crowd in the pavilion obviously thinning, there still remained some shooters in the mix. "She brought just about what we thought she would bring," said McGreevy. "I thought it was a very good buy." According to McGreevy, the filly will go to Porter's go-to-man Larry Jones, who also campaigned last year's GI King's Bishop S. hero Hard Spun and ill-fated 2008 Kentucky Derby runner-up Eight Belles. -Christina Bossinakis

#### Centennial Looking for Classic Success...

Centennial Farms got into the action Tuesday at Saratoga, going to \$600,000 to bring home a son of Kentucky Derby winner Smarty Jones from the consignment of Taylor Made Sales Agency, Agent LVI. The racing management company came into the two-day auction with a select wish list, according to President Don Little Jr. "We came here with two horses on our list," Little confirmed. "We didn't get one of them, but we got the second one and we're very happy with what we did get." The yearling that they did get is a son of Cozzena (Cozzene), the dam of multiple graded stakes winner Megans Bluff (Pine Bluff). "He had the best walk of any horse in the sale," Little said of his newest acquisition. "His physical appearance and his athletic ability are spectacular, and his conformation is great. We think he's a spectacular individual." The yearling's freshman sire was also an attraction for Little. "Smarty Jones himself was a spectacular racehorse. We loved [Smarty Jones's sire] Elusive Quality." While pure speed seems to be in demand in the sales ring, Little admitted Centennial's focus is elsewhere. "[The yearling] was a good strong, Classic-type individual, and that's what we're looking for," he said. "We're not looking for a two-yearold, we're looking for a horse who has some substance and can win the Classic races." That focus has led Centennial to be particular in its selection process. "There were 200 horses here and you have to be careful what you pick," Little said. "We took our time--we still have September to come. We wanted to be partial and selective and we got one of the two we liked. And if we didn't get that one, we would have gone to September."

Centennial has enjoyed success at Fasig-Tipton and Little is hoping for more with this yearling. "We hope this is going to be the sixth Grade I winner we've bought out of the Fasig-Tipton sale," he remarked. The price tag was no surprise to Taylor Made's Frank Taylor. "I think he had the best walk of any yearling I ever saw," Taylor said. "He had an unbelievable walk and is an absolutely beautiful horse. I think Smarty Jones has some really nice horses, and this one is one of the best I've seen." -- Jessica Martini

#### Broman Hopes to Add Storm Cat Filly to Band...

Chester Broman went to \$510,000 to bring home a daughter of the legendary Storm Cat last night, and hopes the filly will one day join his broodmare band. "I bought her as a broodmare prospect, but hopefully she can run," Broman said. The filly is out of GSW Golden Reef (Mr. Prospector), and is a half to stakes winners Cherokee Reef (Cherokee Colony) and Chanting (Danehill). Broman gave credit for picking out the filly to bloodstock agent Becky Thomas. Thomas said the yearling would be a perfect addition to Broman's broodmare band. "What I liked about her is that she's out of a Mr. Prospector mare, so it has the great Storm Cat/Mr. Prospector cross," Thomas said. "The second dam is Mill Reef, which is turf and distance. Mr. Broman has an absolutely awesome broodmare band, which is getting older, so we wanted to add something new, but we also wanted something that looked like it could go a little further." In addition, Thomas admitted, "She was pretty." The yearling was consigned by Eaton Sales, agent.

#### Ryan Is a People's Person...

Bloodstock agent Mike Ryan is no stranger to the mare People's Princess (Meadowlake). Ryan purchased a Point Given yearling out of the 12-year-old mare for \$150,000 from the 2005 Keeneland September sale. A year later at Saratoga, Ryan purchased a daughter by Forestry for \$650,000. That filly became Carolyn's Cat, winner of the GIII Cicada S. for owner William Warren. Ryan was back for a third offspring of the gradedstakes winning mare during Monday's opening session of the Saratoga sale. He paid \$230,000 for a full sister to Carolyn's Cat from the consignment of Lane's End, agent. "This filly is very different from Carolyn's Cat," Ryan said yesterday. "Carolyn's Cat is a chestnut filly-this filly looked more like Forestry. But they are two beautiful fillies, independently different." Ryan was pleasantly surprised by Monday's bargain price after the exploits of her full sister. "I was shocked to get her for almost a third of the price of Carolyn's Cat," Ryan admitted. "There was no black type [before Carolyn's Cat], and Carolyn's Cat is now black type. Forestry is just a little quiet at the minute, but he's shown he can throw a serious racehorse. And this is a full sister of a very good filly that is getting a little time off, but is going to come back in the fall. With that kind of family, she can win a small stakes and she's worth a considerable amount to breed from." Of his continued interest in the pedigree, Ryan added, "I like the family. It's a very good-looking family. Meadowlake mares are a great source of speed. This is a big filly who looks like she'll stretch a route of a ground. I was really impressed with her." The Irish bloodstock agent also admitted he was encouraged by the filly's connections. The yearling was bred by Summer Wind Farm. "Summer Wind raise a lot of runners, and I like buying from people that raise runners," Ryan said. While Ryan purchased Carolyn's Cat for Warren, this yearling filly is destined for a return engagement in the sales ring. "We're going to put that filly in our pinhook partnership," Ryan said. "She'll likely end up at Calder or Keeneland." -- Jessica Martini

#### Saratoga Sale Similar to '07...

After two nights in Saratoga, Fasig-Tipton sold 122 yearlings for \$36,080,000. The average rose 2.2 percent to \$295,738, while the median remained steady at \$227,500. "We thought the upper level at July would be an indication of what we might see this year," commented Fasig-Tipton Chairman D.G. Van Clief Jr. "That proved so last night, and I think the numbers bore that out even more tonight. It was a very stable market at this level, on par with last year. I thought, once again, the Fasig-Tipton team did a great job of putting the right horses in front of the right buyers. There were some lovely horses on the grounds this week and some lovely horses came through that ring. They were wellbred and beautifully turned out. And when the conformation and pedigree matched, there was a lot of urgency in the marketplace." Fasig-Tipton President Walt Robertson professed himself satisfied with results of the sale, particularly in the face of a troubled economy. "The average was up a smidge, buy-backs were probably up a smidge, but everything else was pretty close," Robertson said. "The numbers read a whole lot like last year, but we did have fewer horses. We came in here hopeful that we would equal last year. With the economy and different things going on in the world, I didn't know if it was attainable, but I'm tickled to death that it was.'

The mare's foal of that year, a Macho Uno colt, turned out to be Wicked Style, who went on to win the GI Lane's End Breeders' Futurity and GIII Arlington-Washington BC Futurity in 2007. Bowling and Dodd capitalized on that success and sent Deviletta back through the ring at FTKNOV in 2007, where she brought \$325,000 while in foal to Omega Code. Her Red Bullet filly brought \$90,000 as an OBSFEB juvenile this year, and the duo put the finishing touch on the deal with this lucrative sale.

A Saratoga maiden winner from the family of MGSW Hero's Tribute (Sea Hero), she had produced three foals, including the moderately successful Above the Odds (Wild Again), a Churchill allowance winner, but her yearling of 1999, a colt by Capote, brought just \$1,000 at KEESEP. Barren in 2000, Doppio Espresso produced a Tale of the Cat filly in 2001 that attracted a final bid of \$500,000 as this venue in 2002. Named Resplendency, she went on to become a multiplestakes winner and was third in the GI Santa Monica H. The next offspring through the ring was a filly by Dynaformer that brought \$450,000 as a KEESEP yearling in 2004, and the latest, the unraced two-year-old filly Lady Mocha (Tale of the Cat), was a \$295,000 FTKNOV weanling in 2006 for Highclere. Yesterday's sales success brought the mare's broodmare bankroll to a cool \$1.95 million.

Now 23, If Liloy proved she still has what it takes to get the bidders going at FTSAUG last night.

His first winner abroad romped home 5 lengths ahead of her closest rival and then, just days later stateside, his second winner, **KEEFER** cruised home to an easy maiden special win in his first start. Clarke Ohrstrom, Whitewood Stable Inc.: I have thought about this issue often after reading articles about the 'rapid decline' in Thoroughbred soundness, and am in agreement with Rob Whiteley's comments (The Game Has Changed, Not the Horse, TDN Op-Ed, 8-3) as I often seem to be. I don't think the trend is a bad thing, it just reflects the ever-changing goals of the players in Thoroughbred racing. Training and breeding goals have changed over the last 40 years and that is not a negative thing, so a reduction in average number of starts is not necessarily negative either. The training game has become so competitive that trainers feel they need to run to win (stats, etc.), whereas they may have run for a check before. Most of the horses raced today come from auction sales, and the pressure from buyers for trainers to perform is certainly higher than the breed-to-race owners of yesteryear; trainers wait for the best opportunity and thus run their horses less often. With the huge shift over the last 40 years from breeding to race versus breeding to sell, there is no doubt that many decent fillies are raced for black type versus earnings. If they have some pedigree, you hold them back, maybe skip conditions, and wait for the right opportunity, which may take awhile. If that can't be achieved, they are bred and sold because their sales value will not increase without blacktype. Collectively, in the racing game we have many challenges to face, but I feel that soundness maybe a 'bogey issue.' We have a lot bigger problems on which to focus; soundness of Thoroughbred racing seems more questionable than the Thoroughbred horse.

Team Valor's Barry Irwin: Rob Whiteley neglected to mention what is likely the greatest reason for the lower number of starts, which is that breeders allow vets to talk them into fiddling with the limbs of very young horses and compromising the foals' careers as racehorses. Breeders and only breeders are responsible for these extremely questionable actions. It is commercialism as practiced by breeders that has lessened the quality of the animals.







#### DIANA WRAP-UP by Christa Riebel

It has been a season to remember so far for trainer Peter Schiergen and the 34-year-old jockey Andrasch Starke, who is currently riding in the form of his life, and that duo were responsible for Sunday's G1 Preis der Diana (German Oaks) heroine Rosenreihe (Ire) (Catcher in the Rye {Ire}). They were adding to their G1 Deutsches Derby success with Kamsin (Ger) (Samum {Ger}) and G2 German 1000 Guineas victory with Briseida (GB) (Pivotal {GB}) in the 1 3/8-mile Classic, in which Rosenreihe was dispelling any stamina doubts.

In hindsight, Gestut Wittekindshof's homebred had sufficient factors further down in her pedigree to suggest that the trip would not be a problem. Despite her sire Catcher in the Rye being a miler, his dam was a 12-furlong group winner by Darshaan (GB) and his second dam's sire was Caerleon. Rosenreihe's dam Rosengeste (Ire) is by Be My Guest, another very versatile sire whose leading progeny as a damsire include the G1 Prix du Jockey-Club winner Holding Court (GB) and the top German performer Manduro (Fr). Rosengeste is also a half-sister to the Slovenske Derby scorer Rosenblatt (Ger), and her third dam Rose Amore (Ger), by the 1970 German Derby winner Alpenkonig (Ger), won in group company over 12 furlongs.

Schiergen thinks his jockey helped the cause when it came to staying power. "If you are not sure whether a horse stays the trip, this is how you must ride--Starke did just absolutely everything right," he said before announcing that Rosenreihe will have a break now. Werner Baltromei, the trainer of the second and third Lady Marian (Ger) (Nayef) and Baila Me (Ger) (Samum {Ger}), said, "Things would probably have been different on a different track. Lady Marian suffered a stop on the way and Baila Me is a great stayer." Lady Marian is due to run during Deauville's August festival, possibly in the Aug. 24 G3 Prix de la Nonette, while Baila Me will be aimed at the G1 Prix Vermeille at Longchamp Sept. 14. Trainer Andreas Wohler believed that there was a hard-luck story for the hampered 3-1 favorite Peace Royale (Ger) (Sholokhov {Ire}), and said, "She did not have an ideal trip, but there will be other races for sure."
