first time beyond nine furlongs on Saturday. Frank Calabrese's **Dreaming of Anna** (Rahy), an Eclipse Award winner in 2006, is in search of her first Grade I on the lawn. Produced by Justenuffheart, a Broad Brush halfsister to Precious Kitten, the chestnut is ideally drawn at the fence for her on-pace running style. Garrett Gomez takes the call. 

Glitter City (City Street) won the break, but ultimately conceded the lead, as Evita Argentina raced in centerfield for the opening half-mile. Four wide on the bend and one path deeper into the stretch, she set sail after the lead leaving the eighth pole and proved best. Stardom Bound (Tapit), favored at 9-5 despite racing here as a maiden, was slow into stride, but was doing her best work late, closing to be second. Glitter City crossed the line third, but was disqualified to fourth for coming across the heels of Emmy Darling inside the final furlong, "We felt she had a nice kick and would like the distance," said winning trainer John Sadler. "We thought we had a good chance to be 1-2, but Emmy Darling had a lot of trouble all the way down the backside and then got cut off in the stretch. We expected Emmy Darling to be sitting close and the other horse to be a little farther back. But Evita had the benefit of a much better trip." The winner and third-place finisher are likely to square off in the Debutante Sept. 1. Halo Farms is the nom du course of Ted Aroney. Three Sisters Thoroughbreds is Ron Judy. Both are from Rancho Santa Fe, California. Aroney acquired Jealous Wildcat for \$40,000 at the 2004 Keeneland November sale. The 10-year-old mare has a yearling and a weanling full sister to Evita Argentina and was bred for a fourth time to the Hill 'n' Dale stallion in 2008. Click for the PPs or the brisnet.com chart. FROM THE DESK OF...





AN ORDERLY RETREAT

It's unfortunate that the mainstream media, in real life, finds that the best way to sell their product is by sensationalism. The gloom and doom shouted from the rooftops every morning really shouldn't be confused with a completely predictable, and in fact probably healthy, contraction in an economic cycle that was overheated, particularly in housing prices, and especially in Ireland. The coincidental spike in inflation in fuel and food prices is more worrying, because that hadn't been predicted, but they're a separate issue as far as the contraction of an overheated economy is concerned.

There aren't a lot of people jumping for joy that gross revenues at Fasig-Tipton's two leadoff North American yearling sales--Fasig July and Saratoga--are down more than \$13 million, or 17 percent, from their 2006-07 peak of \$77 million. The good news is that Saratoga was a tough market, but by no means a disaster. There was active pinhooking, there was significant new domestic money from Legends Racing and Team Valor, there was a significant Maktoum presence in John Ferguson and Shadwell, and there was a \$2-million sale-topping Storm Cat colt to Coolmore. There may have been reduced demand, but there was not 'no demand', which I think sends us heading towards Keeneland's catalogue of 5,555 yearlings next month in a better frame of mind. In the meantime the resurgent Deauville sale, starting on Friday, Aug. 15, will take the temperature of the European yearling market.


If you agree with the point of view (very well expressed by British jump-jockey-turned-flat-trainer Jamie Osborne in an article in yesterday's *Racing Post*) that we are experiencing an economic contraction and not the sky falling in, it's always useful to remember what is expressed in the greatest work of Philosophy I have ever encountered, the Chinese book, the *I Ching*, which dates from Confucian times. In the Commentary on Hexagram 33, 'Retreat', we read:

"Conditions are such that hostile forces favored by the time are advancing. In this case retreat is the right course, and it is through retreat that success is achieved. But success consists of being able to carry out the retreat correctly. Retreat is not to be confused with flight. Flight means saving oneself under any circumstances, whereas retreat is a sign of strength ... In this way we prepare, while retreating, for the counter-movement." (from the *I Ching*, or Book of Changes, Richard Wilhelm Translation, rendered into English by Cary F. Baynes, published by The Bollingen Foundation, 1967)

So, yes, the North American yearling market is down, no doubt about it; but so far it looks like an orderly retreat, which means the foundations for recovery are already implicit in the falling prices.

Nor does a 17 percent fall in gross mean there are no longer hot sires. Yes, there are. Commercial golden boy Mr. Greeley (Gone West) had nine catalogued at Saratoga. All nine went through the ring, and, in a sale where 63 percent of the yearlings catalogued sold, he had eight sell, for an average of \$395,625. Another sire who had a good Saratoga was Songandaprayer (Unbridled's Song), currently ranked number five on the Juvenile Sire List (bloodhorse.com), with 11 two-year-old winners, including a pair of stakes winners, this year; he had six yearlings catalogued, five through the ring, five sold, for an average of \$321,000. Malibu Moon (A.P. Indy), sire of the earners of over \$2.6 million this year, including seven stakes winners, also had six catalogued; all six went through the ring, five sold, for an average of \$220,000. Among first-crop sires, five-time G1/G2 winner Rock Hard Ten (Kris S.) is giving the highly-touted (including by me) Ghostzapper (Awesome Again) a run for his money for commercial supremacy so far. Through Saratoga, Ghostzapper has had five sell, for an average of \$370,000; Rock Hard Ten has also had five sell, and they've averaged \$362,000. That will be an interesting rivalry to follow at Keeneland. Among first-crop sires with five or more sold, Afleet Alex (Northern Afleet) is a clear third; his six so far have averaged a healthy \$195,000. Saint Liam (Saint Ballado) averaged \$193,333, but that was for three sold (of seven offered).



BRADLEY THOROUGHBRED BROKERAGE

At each of Fasig's two flagship yearling sales so far, 14 percent fewer horses were sold than last year. Saratoga had catalogued nine percent fewer, so their average was up by two percent, as their gross was off by 12 percent. At the two sales combined, the gross is down over \$13-million, or 17 percent from last year. It would be surprising if following North American sales, at least, don't continue that trend. But we've all known it's been coming, and so far, it could be worse.




Katy Voss, Chanceland Farm: I have been training horses for 40 years and couldn't agree more with Rob Whiteley, who supports his argument with a lot of valid reasons (The Game Has Changed, Not the Horse, TDN Op-Ed, 8-3). I sent the following letter to Congress after the recent hearings, and felt Rob further amplified some of these points.

Chairman and Members of the Committee,

I have been a horse owner, trainer and breeder for almost 40 years. My partner and I own a breeding and training farm in Maryland. I have been on the boards of the Maryland Thoroughbred Horsemen's Association and Maryland Million Limited for many years, and am a former president of the Maryland Horse Breeders' Association. Having listened to your hearing on Thursday, I would like to emphasize some issues and give another opinion on some.

- 1. Jack Van Berg was absolutely right when he said that testing facilities must be the first order of business. Most states do not have the resources to properly equip state-of-the-art testing facilities, an absolute necessity if illegal drugs are to be eliminated. They should pool their resources to develop three or four regional, state-of-the-art labs with uniform testing protocols that the tracks in each region use. The horse business is like any other industry where a lot of money is involved (investment banking, mortgage lending, etc.) that attracts an element of greed. The majority of participants are honest people who care about their horses and the most sophisticated testing is necessary to protect them from those who are always seeking an advantage.
- 2. The RMTC should continue to be the vehicle for establishing uniform drug rules and penalties. They represent a broad cross section of the industry and are gradually developing support and consensus within the industry. They have already made significant progress in their mission. Their expertise is vital and it would be a mistake for Congress to try to substitute something else. Congress can hold the big stick to encourage the different states to adopt the regulations.

A # will distinguish first-time stakes-winners, a @ will indicate first-time graded stakes-winners, a ▲ will denote a first-time Grade/Group 1 winner, a + will indicate first-time starters, an (S) will be used for state-bred races, a (C) will be used for maiden-claiming races and an (R) will be used for other restricted races.

- 3. The industry has long recognized the distinction between therapeutic medication and illegal drugs. In the process of your deliberations, the Committee must differentiate between the two. There is unanimity in the industry that users of illegal drugs should be banned, but a slight trace of a therapeutic medication should not cost a trainer his livelihood. Butazolidin is a non-steroidal anti-inflammatory medication and not a painkiller. Procaine is a painkiller and is banned.
- 4. In the Mid-Atlantic region where we race, the only race-day medications that are allowed are bleeder remedies, including Lasix. I strongly disagree with the people who testified about banning Lasix. Before the endoscope for horses was invented, a horse was known to have bled if blood came out of his nose after a race. It was a fairly common occurrence and would usually be clearly seen by all, including the fans. With the endoscope, we discovered that the vast majority of horses do bleed. The majority swallow the blood so you don't know it unless you scope them. With the use of Lasix, you rarely ever see a horse bleeding from the nose on the track after a race. This is both a humane issue and an economic issue. Each bleeding event causes cumulative damage to the lungs. The more you can eliminate or minimize bleeding, the safer for the horse, and the longer their career will be. I have used Lasix for over 25 years and I scope all of my horses after every race. I strongly disagree with Dr. Soma.
- a. Lasix does not always prevent bleeding but the boots on the ground will tell you that Lasix absolutely delays the onset and lessens the severity.
- b. I do not believe that horses run faster because of Lasix. They run faster if they don't bleed.
- c. The regulations governing the administration of Lasix are designed to minimize any masking effect it might have. The dilution effect is only in urine and blood tests are taken on all tested horses.
- d. Since disease and environmental issues probably have more to do with bleeding than genetics, banning it for the good of the breed would be a disservice to the horses.
- 5. As far as breeding and genetics are concerned, graded "black type" is the engine that drives sales prices and stud fees. Winning or placing in a graded stakes race (black type) greatly enhances the value of a horse and his or her relatives. A two-tiered system could be implemented for drug regulations that distinguish between graded stake races and all others. Setting a higher standard for all graded stakes would accomplish what the purists want and ensure that we are not breeding "chemically engineered" horses, while allowing tolerance levels for therapeutic medications, according to the AAEP recommendations, for the rest of the population.

TOBA (Thoroughbred Owners and Breeders Association) is the national organization representing owners and breeders. Their "graded stakes committee" controls the grading of stakes races. Tougher drug rules could be a prerequisite for a stakes race to be graded.

6. The statistics relative to "average number of starts per horse" are being taken as proof positive that the breed is more fragile. That may or may not be true, but it has to be taken into account that training patterns, styles, techniques, etc. have changed significantly. The business is so competitive that trainer percentages are a very significant factor in determining to whom owners send their horses. In our statistic-driven modern world, percentage-conscious trainers train their horses much harder to peak when they run and are very selective about what races they run in. In the end, they spend more time training and waiting for the right race than racing. I think that is a more significant factor in fewer starts per horse.

7. There is no question that the ankles are the weakest link in the anatomy of the horse. The front legs have to absorb the full weight of a thousand pound animal landing at 30-40 miles per hour and the ankle or fetlock joint, which connects the pastern and the cannon bone or shin, takes the brunt of that. The vast majority of racehorse injuries involve some aspect of the ankle, either pastern, cannon bone, sesamoids or the various ligaments that hold everything together. This is not a recent anomaly. However, to blame ankle problems on Native Dancer is ridiculous. He won 21 of 22 races over three years (he won 9 times as a two year old) and retired after a "recurring foot injury," and his son, Raise a Native, suffered a bowed tendon.

Our business is challenged by several economic issues, not the least of which is that purse revenue for owners is approximately half of their expenses, not including capital costs. I hope the committee in its wisdom can help the racing industry in constructive ways without imposing sanctions and restrictions that could cripple such a large industry.

PIMLICO TO CLOSE FOR TRAINING; LAUREL

STAKES SLASHED Officials at the Maryland Jockey Club have announced that, effective Aug. 31, Pimlico Race Course will be closed for stabling and training. Racing secretary Georgeanne Hale will relocate Pimlicobased trainers to barns at Laurel Park and the Bowie Training Center at the expense of the Maryland Jockey Club. "We understand this is an incovenience to the horsemen and we will work with them to ensure a smooth and fluid transition," commented Tom Chuckas, president and chief operating officer of the Maryland Jockey Club. "This was a business decision based on the revenue stream." Cost-cutting measures will also result in drastic changes to the stakes schedule during the upcoming Laurel fall meeting, including the cancellation of the GI Frank J. DeFrancis Dash, one of just three Grade I events in Maryland, Added Chuckas, "This is terribly disappointing, but these are serious times. We remain hopeful that the playing field between Maryland and our neighbors to the west, north and easy will be leveled and that we will be able to resume running this prominent race in the future." Other races put on hiatus include the two marguee juvenile events, the Laurel Futurity and the Selima S., and the GIII Safely Kept S.



"We've entered five horses in the Darley Dewhurst S. and I hope that we might be represented in it, because we would like to keep the sequence going," Bolger said. "Gan Amhras was entered in a Listed race at Tipperary on Thursday, but he will not be running because he doesn't fancy soft ground. He's a miler, but I'm sure he would have no problem in dropping down to the seven furlongs of the Darley Dewhurst. I don't think he will take in the G1 National S. at the Curragh in September and I think he will be stepping up to a mile now, but we could easily be tempted to drop him back to seven for Newmarket. He's got the class to do that." Aidan O'Brien features heavily among the 138 entries for this year's edition; he is responsible for a total of 33, including Derrick Smith, Susan Magnier and Michael Tabor's G1 Phoenix S. winner Mastercraftsman (Ire) (Danehill Dancer (Ire) and the G3 Tyros S. hero Rip Van Winkle (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}). The Irish possibilities are bolstered by His Highness the Aga Khan's TDN Rising Star" Arazan (Ire) (Anabaa), who took a Leopardstown maiden May 28 for the John Oxx stable. Other **TDN Rising Stars** on the list are Khalid Abdullah's impressive Sandown maiden scorer Zacinto (GB) (Dansili {GB}), one of seven from the Sir Michael Stoute stable; and Anthony Pye-Jeary and Mel Smith's The Cheka (Ire) (Xaar {GB}), who took an Ascot maiden by 10 lengths July 12 and hails from the Eve Johnson-Houghton barn. Mark Johnston has 15 entered, including Alan Spence's Jukebox Jury (Ire) (Montjeu {Ire}), who also earned **O** "TDN Rising Star" **O** status at Goodwood last week, while Godolphin have 15 in the list, topped by the unraced Mahyoub (GB) (Elusive Quality), a half-brother to the operation's past stars Dubai Destination and Librettist.

SOUTH CENTRAL HEADED TO HONG KONG

The G2 Norfolk S. winner **South Central** (Forest Camp) has been sold to race in Hong Kong in a deal brokered by McKeever St Lawrence. The purchase price was not disclosed. Trained by Howard Johnson under the banner of his and Graham Wylie's Transcend Bloodstock to win the June 19 Royal Ascot contest, the two-year-old colt has already entered quarantine in Newmarket. Johnson signed the ticket for the dark bay colt earlier this year at the Doncaster April Breeze-Up Sale at £60,000.

RAKTI IN COMMERCIAL DISPUTE Rakti (GB)

(Polish Precedent--Ragera (Ire), by Rainbow Quest) is at the centre of a dispute between the Hong Kong Breeders' Club and Hubie de Burgh and Huma Park Stud. Following a Racing Post article which outlined that the Hong Kong-based syndicate--which is responsible for a 10-percent share in the nine-year-old--was suing for what it claims are "stallion service rights," the HKBC's Racing manager John McGrath issued a statement which read, "Contrary to some reports, this action does not just concern a sum of money being owed by one party. We are now hopeful this matter can be resolved in the near future, thereby avoiding the need for any further court action." Later yesterday, de Burgh issued his own statement which responded, "I've already made a statement that this is a commercial dispute in which we are claiming money that is owed to us, and I want to make it clear that de Burgh Equine is not involved in this case. Like the Hong Kong Breeders' Club, we very much hope that this will be resolved amicably." Rakti retired in 2005 and stood at Huma Park Stud in County Kildare, which was co-owned by De Burgh at the time of his arrival the following year. He currently stands at the Irish National Stud at a fee of €8,000.
