#### JACKSON CHALLENGING IEAH

A day of challenges and counter-challenges yesterday between Jess Jackson, majority owner of reigning Horse of the Year **Curlin** (Smart Strike), and connections of GI Kentucky Derby winner **Big Brown** (Bound-

ary), involved potential match-ups between the two stars in the Aug. 30 Gl Woodward S., Sept. 27 Gl Jockey Club Gold Cup and Oct. 25 Gl Breeders' Cup Classic. Trainer Rick Dutrow Jr. added fuel to calls for a meeting between the sport's leading runners after Big Brown won the Aug. 3 Gl Haskell Invitational. Dutrow told *Daily Racing Form* that

he thinks Big Brown is "way better than Curlin," adding that Curlin "couldn't win the Derby" and "got beat [by] a filly." In a statement released yesteday morning, Jackson said, "Big Brown's camp's recent remarks about Curlin inspired me to offer an incentive to get these two great horses to race at the legendary track at the Spa. This type of competition between horses is exactly what Thoroughbred racing needs." Jackson offered to donate \$50,000 to the Belmont Child Care Association's Anna House, which provides childcare for working families at New York racetracks, should both horses go postward in the Woodward. But the Big Brown camp nixed any idea of a Woodward start for their colt. "There's no shot we'll run in the Woodward; our horse isn't ready for it," said Michael lavarone, president of co-owner IEAH Stables. "The race in the Haskell took a lot out of him. He might need until the end of September to be fully recovered. We've got to take care of our horse." lavarone added, "The race you're supposed to run in is the Breeders' Cup Classic [Oct. 25 at Santa Anita]. That's where the best horses in the world come together to decide Horse of the Year, not in the Woodward in a four-horse field. Curlin is supposed to run in the Breeders' Cup Classic, and I don't understand why they wouldn't do it. If they want to face us, that's where they should go." Cont. p7

Let go at 7-1 in her career opener at Delaware July 12, Mani Bhavan went straight to the lead and never looked back as Rosie Napravnik rode her out to a 9 1/4-length triumph. That effort earned her TDN Rising Star" status and an 82 Beyer Speed Figure, and she was flattered when runner-up Bon Jovi Girl

came back to score in her next start. Scratched out of opening day's GIII Schuylerville S., Mani Bhavan came back with a pair of bullet works at her Delaware base, but didn't earn much respect here at 8-1. The dark bay broke alertly from her outside post and quickly crossed over to the rail under Alan Garcia. Bold Union, expected to be on the lead early, never saw the front, and raced inside throughout. Mani Bhavan maintained a length margin through splits of :22.36 and :46.10. Garcia gave her the signal

when she turned for home and the longshot responded, opening up for an emphatic success. "My filly was a little nervous in the gate," Garcia explained. "When [the starter] opened the door to the gate, she was going right to the lead. After that, she was gone." Mani Bhavan hails from the family of champion sprinter Speightstown and GISW Turk Passer.

## Back at the Ranch...

Bloodstock agent and co-owner Mike Ryan was thrilled after watching Mani Bhavan sail to an easy Adirondack score. "That was very special," Ryan said. "To win up here at this level, it's beyond words."

Ryan purchased Mani Bhavan as a yearling, with the

anticipation of pinhooking her as a juvenile, but a series of minor setbacks disrupted those plans. The filly RNA'd at OBS February and was withdrawn at Fasig-Tipton Midlantic in May. "She worked in :21 3/5 under a stranglehold three weeks before the first sale," Ryan said. "That was on the Polytrack at OBS. But she cut her right knee on the screen in her stall, and we missed six or seven days of training before the breeze show. Then she didn't breeze up to expectations, and I took her home at \$95,000. We had her in the sale at Maryand, but she just wasn't doing

well. Sometimes horses get flat on you. She wasn't thriving, she was horsing at the time, and I scratched her "

Ryan sent Mani Bhavan to trainer Steve Klesaris, and it wasn't long before he knew he'd made the right call keeping her. "Steve is a very good caretaker, and he really liked her," the Irish horseman said, adding, "She has done unbelievably well physically since Maryland. I hadn't seen her since May, and I couldn't believe it was the same horse. Steve was quite optimistic [yesterday]. You have to be realistic jumping from a maiden race to a Grade II at Saratoga, but we thought she belonged. I said I'd be delighted if she finished 1-2-3."

Ryan has a bit of history with the filly's family. He bought the dam, Rehear, for \$200,000 for Carl Pollard as a KEESEP yearling. Pollard raced the mare, who won once in six starts, and bred and sold Mani Bhavan. He sold Rehear, in foal to Medallist, to Miklin Stable LLC for \$50,000 at the KEEJAN sale. Rehear produced a Stormy Atlantic filly in 2007 and a Medallist colt this past spring.



# MUSIC STILL ON THE ALABAMA FENCE

Godolphin Stables' Music Note (A.P. Indy), who is still under consideration for the Aug. 23 GI Travers presented by Shadwell Farm, is expected to be entered in Saturday's GI Alabama S., but may be scratched in favor of the following week's Mid-Summer Derby, according to Godolphin's Rick Mettee. "No final decision has been made," said Mettee. "I spoke with [Godolphin trainer] Saeed [bin Suroor] [Tuesday] and faxed them the form on both races, and they are still looking. I think they want to make sure they run something." Godolphin also has GI Ashland S. winner Little Belle (A.P. Indy) poised to contest the Alabama. "Both ways, it would be interesting," said Mettee. "They would have two chances to win the Alabama, which is obviously a classic race, while the Travers is, well, the Travers. I think the concern is the big field. If the Travers were under six or seven, they might be a little more gung-ho about it." Should Music Note go against the boys in the Travers, she would be the first filly to run in the race since Davona Dale, who finished fourth as the favorite behind track-record-setting winner General Assembly in 1979. In 1974, Chris Evert was third to Holding Pattern and, in 1962, Cicada trailed the field home in last behind one-two finishers Jaipur and Ridan. In 138 runnings of the 1 1/4-mile race, seven fillies have gone on to win the Travers, the most recent of which was Lady Rotha in 1915.

MAMBO IN SEATTLE TO TRAVERS Trainer Neil Howard confirmed that Will Farish's Mambo in Seattle (Kingmambo) will make his next start in the GI Travers S. Aug. 23. "It's worth going into the Travers and giving him a chance," Howard said. "We had been talking about it since his last race and wanted to make sure everything was in good order. Mr. Farish and I both agree the horse is moving forward." Mambo in Seattle, a winner in his last three starts, defeated You and I Forever by a neck in 1:50 4/5 most recently in the ninefurlong Henry Walton S. at Saratoga July 27. On that same card, Macho Again won the GII Jim Dandy S. in 1:51. "His race record speaks for itself," Howard added. "He's got a great demeanor and he has been training really good. Everything is falling into place. He's got a race over the track. The timing is good between that day and the Travers." Grasshopper (Dixie Union), runnerup in last year's Travers, will head to Monmouth for Saturday's GIII Philip H. Iselin S., but could find himself on the infield this fall. "We'll probably take a shot on the turf at Belmont sometime in the fall," Howard said. "It gives us another option. He's a smooth-moving horse. We'll probably breeze him here on the turf near the end of the meet and see what kind of a feeling that we can get. We want to see if it opens any other doors for him."

NEW APPROACH IN JUDDMONTE PICTURE Princess Haya of Jordan's New Approach (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}) could be set for a clash with Duke of Marmalade (Ire) (Danehill) in Tuesday's G1 Juddmonte International at York, for which 16 stood their ground at yesterday's five-day stage. Not seen since winning the G1 Epsom Derby, the Jim Bolger-trained colt--who sustained an injury on the eve of the Irish equivalent--was left in the extended 10-furlong contest by his trainer. "We haven't firmed anything up yet, and I haven't looked at the entries for the race," said Bolger. "It will be the weekend before we make a decision." Aidan O'Brien has left in a trio alongside G1 Prix Ganay, G1 Tattersalls Gold Cup, G1 Prince of Wales's S. and G1 King George VI and Queen Elizabeth S. hero Duke of Marmalade. The Henry Cecil-trained Prince of Wales's and G1 Eclipse runner-up Phoenix Tower (Chester House) could represent the sponsors. Khalid Abdullah's Racing Manager Teddy Grimthorpe told PA Sport yesterday, "He's in very good form and worked very well on Tuesday." Sir Michael Stoute has a duo headed by Rupert Plersch and Peter Walichnowski's G1 Grosser Dallmayr-Preis winner Linngari (Ire) (Indian Ridge {Ire}), while John Gosden is set to saddle Cheveley Park Stud's G2 Yorks S. winner Pipedreamer (GB) (Selkirk).

CITY ADDED TO VOLTIGEUR Godolphin have supplemented Meydan City (Kingmambo) for Tuesday's G2 Great Voltigeur S. at York. Following the \$11.7million yearling's success in a Newmarket conditions event Aug. 8, connections have paid the £13,500 fee to add him to the 12-furlong contest, for which 16 remained at yesterday's stage. "He's progressing nicely, and his last run was a good one," Racing Manager Simon Crisford told PA Sport. "This will be another step for him, but we are of the opinion he is ready for a bigger challenge." Heading the opposition will be Ballymacoll Stud's G3 Queen's Vase winner Patkai (Ire) (Indian Ridge {Ire}) from the Sir Michael Stoute stable, which was forced to withdraw Khalid Abdullah's G1 Epsom Derby fourth Doctor Fremantle (GB) (Sadler's Wells) due to a foot problem. "He worked this morning and got a bit of a bruise on his foot, so we'll fix that up and look at the various alternatives," the ownerbreeder's Racing Manager Teddy Grimthorpe told PA Sport. Aidan O'Brien has 10 remaining of the acceptors, led by Michael Tabor, Derrick Smith and Susan Magnier's Alessandro Volta (GB) (Montjeu {Ire}), who was demoted from third to fourth in the June 29 G1 Irish Derby.

# NTRA REPORT FROM CAPITOL HILL

#### IMPORTANCE OF NEW WITHHOLDING BILL

Last month, the Pari-Mutuel Conformity and Equality Act of 2008 (H.R. 6631) was introduced in the U.S. House of Representatives by Rep. Charles W. Boustany, Jr. (R-LA). This bill is crafted to eliminate the automatic 25% federal withholding on pari-mutuel winnings of \$5,000 or more.

#### Why is this bill important to the industry?

- Horseplayers will retain more of their winnings from exotic wagers like trifectas and the Pick 6, which have rapidly grown since the last time the federal withholding threshold was changed in 1992 and now account for two-thirds of all wagers placed
- On average, each dollar paid to winning horseplayers is re-wagered seven times during the course of a day - this reinvestment of winnings is referred to as "churn"
- Higher wagering levels lead to more revenues for racetracks and other wagering providers to cover escalating operating costs and more purse money for horsemen
- More purse money strengthens the bloodstock market for breeders, consignors and auction houses

MOONSTONE SUFFERS SETBACK Aidan O'Brien has announced that Moonstone (GB) (Dalakhani {Ire}) will sidestep Thursday's G1 Darley Yorkshire Oaks after suffering a setback. Susan Magnier, Michael Tabor and Derrick Smith's G1 Irish Oaks heroine and G1 Epsom Oaks runner-up will be replaced by the Irish Oaks second Ice Queen (Ire) (Danehill Dancer {Ire}) and the G3 Blue Wind S. scorer Adored (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}) in the 12-furlong contest. "Moonstone has had a little hold-up and will be confined to walking for seven days, so she won't be going to York," O'Brien told the Racing Post.

Upon hearing that Big Brown was not under consideration for the Woodward, Jackson issued another statement. "I made a sportsman's proposal to Big Brown's connections this morning to race at Saratoga...and they declined the invitation," said Jackson. "I am disappointed by the news. I read this morning that Big Brown might be looking for a turf race at Belmont Park, so apparently, his connections are looking at other options this fall. I would ask Big Brown's camp to consider the prestigious \$750,000 GI Jockey Gold Cup at Belmont Park on Sept. 27 as an option. It's a prestigious, prized race on a natural dirt surface at one of the great tracks in the world. Big Brown is a champion and, most certainly, would be prepared to race at the end of September. Perhaps we could work together to get the Breeder's Cup to add an incentive to the purse so that a specific charity would get a bigger slice of the pie." Jackson continued, "This has long been a part of my platform for this industry--bigger purses. Another part of my personal platform is to make charitable contributions. When Barbara and I bought Curlin, we immediately established the Jackson Curlin for Kids Fund, whose purpose is to make a difference in the lives of children where Curlin runs or trains. In February of this year, we donated \$1 million to The Woods Laboratory for equine and human cancer and infertility research. Plus, we give millions to more than 600 charities ever year because we believe it is the right thing to do. We also are aware of IEAH's involvement with charitable causes, including the current construction of the Ruffian Equine Medical Center across from Belmont Park. We seem to have two great horses and a common purpose. Why not get them together?" Jackson added, "As to the Breeder's Cup, it is not part of my current plan for Curlin. I felt it was the sporting thing to do to announce Curlin's schedule to give fair notice to anyone looking to compete against the reigning Horse of the Year this fall. Our plan is to focus on the Woodward, look to the Jockey Gold Cup, hopefully with Big Brown in the field, and review our plans after that. Ultimately, all of us have to do what is in the best interest of our horse." However, the match-up doesn't seem as though it will happen this year. lavarone responded, "My answer is the same as it was before. I guess I have to run in August or September, but not in the Breeders' Cup, to meet him. That's unfortunate. The Gold Cup is not even in our thoughts. We are looking for a race on the grass to set us up to run on a synthetic surface in the Breeders' Cup. Our plan is our plan, and we're sticking to it."


