STORM MESA going for 6 straight in Del Mar Oaks-G1

GALILEO ON TOP AGAIN AT AROANA

Twelve months ago, a son of Coolmore's Galileo (Ire) topped the opening session of Argana's August Yearling Sale, and it was a case of deja vu as the latest renewal of the Deauville showcase got underway yesterday. Consigned by Edouard de Rothschild's Haras de Meautry as hip 30, the February-foaled colt is the first produce of the listed winner Olimpic Girl (Ire) (Darshaan {GB}). The dam is herself a daughter of the smart stakes scorer Lille Hammer (GB), who was placed in the 1993 G2 Prix de Royallieu. Her page also includes the high-class German mare Slenderella (Ger), winner of the 1984 G2 Preis der Diana. In the end, it was Bertrand le Metrayer Bloodstock--acting on behalf of Nathan Tinkler's Patinack Farm--who saw off Coolmore with a bid of €770,000. Tinkler, the Australian millionaire, had made his first venture to Deauville last December when he bought the top-priced filly Jambu (Fr) from the Haras de Fresnay le Buffard draft. Earlier Friday, he paid €280,000 for Haras de la Reboursiere et de Montaigu's hip 8, a filly by Sadler's Wells out of the useful stakes performer Maid of Dawkins (Ire) (Kendor {Fr}) from the family of Grey Swallow (Ire). "My job is to buy horses for Patinack Farm and this is a classy colt, who is strong, well-balanced and also a beautiful walker," explained Patinack's Managing Director Roger Langley. "Mr. Tinkler was keen to have some horses in training in France, and we made our choice among the many good-looking animals. He is the first horse we will have in training in France and will probably be trained by Richard Gibson."

For consignor Edouard de Rothschild, the price paid for his homebred session topper came as no surprise. "This was a really nice colt by a hot sire, and the first foal of a gifted mare from a really good family, so I was not prepared to let him go at any price," Eduoard de Rothschild said. "In fact, I had decided that he would not sell for less than €700,000, and I did bid to that price. When he passed that mark, I let the others battle and I am happy with what he made. Striking Gold...

There was a general hope that Sheikh Mohammed would become more closely involved in this sale, and that came to fruition early in the day when John Ferguson made an instant impact with the first of his nine purchases. Haras du Mezeray's hip 7, the sole Seeking the Gold offering catalogued in this year's sale, is the first foal out of the 2004 G1 Premio Lydia Tesio winner Lune d'Or (Fr) (Green Tune), who was later third in the G1 Yorkshire Oaks. Ending a five-year drought at the auction, Ferguson won the day with a bid of €700,000 for the filly, and later added another from the same draft of Charles-Henri de Moussac's operation to the roster. Hip 55, by Oasis Dream (GB), is a half-sister to the 2006 G3 Prix la Force winner Barastraight (GB) (Barathea {Ire}) from the family of Godolphin's G3 Bentinck S. scorer Greek Renaissance (Ire). Her fullsibling Naagoos (GB) helped her cause significantly when registering an impressive success in a debutantes event at the local track earlier in the month; is a possible for next Sunday's G1 Prix Morny. After prevailing with a bid of €670,000 for the latter, Ferguson said, "There are some very good yearlings in the sale and, obviously, these two fillies are some of them. They both come from very good families, one being the first foal of a Group 1 winner and the second from a top Weinstock family. These fillies would fit in any major sale in the world, and it is a tribute to the Argana management who has succeeded in having them and others here." The agent was in action up until the close and paid €470,000 for hip 115, a colt by Cape Cross (Ire) from the Haras de la Louviere consignment. He is a half-brother to this year's impressive G3 Prix la Force scorer High Rock (Ire) (Rock of Gibraltar {Ire}), who was later fourth in the G1 Prix du Jockey-Club and the group winner Homeland (Fr), as well as being a fullsibling of the listed scorer Hideaway (Fr).

Bow Down ...

Tom Goff of Blandford Racing secured hip 37, a blueblood filly by Sadler's Wells out of GI Santa Maria H. heroine Race the Wild Wind (Sunny's Halo), for €520,000. Consigned by Haras d'Etreham, selling on behalf of Coolmore Stud, she is a three-parts sister to the high-class Nureyev pair King Charlemagne and Meshaheer, both currently at stud. "This filly is a queen and is by the best stallion in the world, even though he is now pensioned," Goff said. "She is out of a Grade I winner and is a sister to a Group 1 winner--what more can you ask?" Italian trainer Bruno Grizzetti went to the same price to acquire Reboursiere et de Montaigu's hip 89, which provided Galileo (Ire) with the first- and second-highest-priced colts of the day. Grizzetti trained the dam Baranja (St. Jovite) to a third in the 2001 G2 Premio Regina Elena, and will handle the colt as well. He is from the family of Croco Rouge (Ire) and Alidiva (Ire), herself the producer of Taipan (Ire), Sleepytime (Ire), Ali-Royal (Ire) and Oonagh Maccool (Ire).



Princely Air...

There was another first in Deauville vesterday as Prince Mitab bin Abdullah bin Abdul Aziz paid a notable first visit to a sales ring. By the close of play, the son of the King of Saudi Arabia, who is in charge of the King's stables, had spent €1.54 million on a quintet of yearlings under the banner SKAS. The prince was seated next to Andre Fabre, and the largest of his purchases was hip 35, who brought €650,000. From Ballylinch Stud, the Rock of Gibraltar (Ire) filly is halfsister to Red Rocks (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}). Among her halfsiblings are the Linamix (Fr) duo of Medicinal (Ire), a listed winner who was also group placed and Pill (Ire), who was third on debut in a decent contest last week. He also purchased Haras d'Etreham's hip 100, a son of Montjeu (Ire) out of a half to Rock of Gibraltar (Ire) for €400,000; a duo from the Haras du Capucines draft in hip 73, a €350,000 Empire Maker filly out of the brilliant You (You and I), and hip 17, a Distorted Humor half-sister to the G1 Grand Prix de Paris third Magadan (Ire) (High Chaparral {Ire}) from the immediate family of Shiva (Jpn), Light Shift and Limnos (Jpn), who fetched €260,000; and Mezeray's hip 109, a Monsun (Ger) colt who descends from the Stud's blueblood Luth de Saron (Fr). All will be trained in France by Fabre.

Come Together...

A group of breeders took an original approach by forming a syndicate to buy hip 12, a colt by Montjeu (Ire) with a stallion's pedigree. Consigned by Klaus and Renata Jacobs's Newsells Park Stud, he is out of twice Classic-placed Midnight Angel (Ger) (Acatenango {Ger}) from the family of Moonlady (Ger), and was knocked down to Guislain Bozo's Meridian International for €450,000. "Everyone in France knows that the stallion situation is quite difficult and we are missing some topclass sires," Bozo said. "The idea is to buy a yearling and try to develop him into a nice group winner, and then stand him in France at the end of his career. Lucien Urano of Haras des Monceaux, Lady Chryss O'Reilly, Florent Couturier and a client of mine from Trinidad and Tobago are members of this syndicate, and we are open to any new partner who would like to join. The horse will be trained in Pau by Jean-Claude Rouget, and we hope that the plan will work."

Arqana cont. Fishing for Freshmen...

First-season sires held their own yesterday and, while both Shamardal and Whipper averaged well in excess of €100,000 each, it was a colt by Oratorio (Ire) and a filly by Dubawi (Ire) who stole the show. The former was responsible for the most expensive of Demi O'Byrne's trio of purchases after Watership Down Stud's hip 19, a half-brother to the 2004 G1 Prix de Diane runner-up Millionaia (Ire) (Peintre Celebre) sold for €400,000. That was the same price paid by Shadwell France for Dubawi's hip 43, a half-sister to the triple group winners Whortleberry (Fr) (Starborough {GB}) and Valentino (Fr) (Valanour {Ire}), as well as the very smart Scandinavian performer Appel au Maitre (Fr) (Starborough {GB}) and this year's G1 Prix Saint-Alary heroine Belle et Celebre (Fr) (Peintre Celebre). With such a stack of immediate relatives, it was no surprise that Haras de la Reboursiere et de Montaigu's Aliette Forien was a shade frustrated with the eventual outcome. "I have to say that I am slightly disappointed at the price she brought," her breeder said. "With such a good-looking and well-bred filly, you could dream of getting slightly more. I don't know if it is the market that was not strong enough or a lack of interest. I know she is quite tall and a rather massive filly, and maybe that scared some potential buyers away." Buyer Angus Gold added, "We have bought some nice individuals that will return to Ireland now, and then Sheikh Hamdan will allocate them, but there is a reasonable chance to believe that they will come back to be trained in France. That is usually what happens with horses bought in France."

Economic Downturn? What Economic Downturn?

While an air of optimism preceded this sale, just how much the worldwide economic situation would cast its

shadow over affairs was unknown. In any event, the opening salvo of the first major component of the European sale season showed no knock-on effect from the general doom and gloom. With an average of €214,277 and median of €170,000, up by 17 percent and 42 percent, respectively, on 2007 and a clearance rate of 78 percent, it was as near to a complete success as Arqana could have hoped for. Executive Presi-

dent Eric Hoyeau reflected afterwards, "We had 15 percent less horses to sell compared to last year, mainly because of genuine late withdrawals and that has somewhere affected the gross, but obviously we are delighted with the figures of this first day. We have easily maintained a high clearance rate, and the average and the median have gone up significantly. The median is getting closer to the average, which is always an excellent sign. We have sold 34 yearlings for €200,000 or more, compared to 24 a year ago. These figures totally reflect the improvement of the quality in the catalogue, the confidence the breeders had in this sale and the positive answer of the buyers. There was a very good and serene ambience at the sales today and it also shows that this new format, which was initiated for the first time in 2006, is just ideal for Deauville. With such figures at the end of the first day, you can feel some relief and be reasonably optimistic for the outcome of the sale on Monday, as we still have some very nice animals to sell." Some of the leading buyers issued a chorus of praise, with Shadwell's Angus Gold glowing in his tribute. "I haven't looked at all the prices, but I feel and I hope that the market is strong," Gold commented. "The standard is improving all the time here in Deauville, and all the teams concerned from Argana to the French Racing and Breeding Committee have done a great job to attract good horses and new people here. There is genuine action on all the horses and underbidders at decent money levels."





This Is Positive...

Blandford Bloodstock's Tom Goff echoed the positive sentiments. "It is a strong sale and you need to have the right commodities to be fine," Goff said. "The horses look good and are well prepared and it puts the focus on France in the right way." John Ferguson added, "Arqana have done a great job to have so many good horses and to have promoted their sale so well. It is like Saratoga last week and Japan a few weeks agothe top sells real well, but buyers must understand that this year there will be opportunities in the middle market for everyone." Marc de Chambure, of this sale's customary leading consignor Haras d'Etreham, summed up the situation. "The market is good and strong here in Deauville today and it is a good sign," he commented.

Trainer Gary Contessa has come a long way since his boyhood days of jogging and grooming Standardbreds at Roosevelt Raceway on his native Long Island. Introduced to the flats by a relative, Contessa made the move to Thoroughbred racing when he was still a teenager. "My Uncle Louie used to take me to Belmont Park, and I just fell in love with it," Contessa explained in his NYRA Media Guide bio. "After high school, I was working at a bank, and one of my clients was a trainer. I decided that I didn't want a normal job, and what I wanted to do was train horses. So I started in 1974 as a hotwalker."

Contessa spent a decade learning the ropes before

opening his public stable in 1985. He earned his first New York training title in 1999, and set a record of 159 NYRA victories when he led the standings in 2007. The 50-year-old horseman is currently the ninth-leading conditioner in the country, with more than \$5.3 million in purses this year. He will try to add to that total when he saddles **Sweet Vendetta** (Stephen Got Even) in the GI Alabama S. today.

Sweet Vendetta was off the board in the first three starts of her career, but turned it around with the addition of blinkers. "Blinkers have made all the difference in the world," Contessa told *Daily Racing Form*. "When I take her out there and gallop her without blinkers, you'd think she was like a two-year-old. I don't like to gallop her in blinkers--I like her to see things and I'm used to her--but I galloped her out there without blinkers, and she must have switched leads about 20 times."

In her first appearance with the hood, Sweet Vendetta broke her maiden by seven lengths facing state-breds at Aqueduct on Valentine's Day, then finished second to **Little Belle** (A.P. Indy) in the Busher S. 10 days later.

This fall in Lexington, the NTRA will host a two-day gathering of industry leaders to discuss implementation and funding of yet-to-be determined industry reforms. The list of potential reforms includes: mandatory medication and testing standards, safety benchmarks for all surfaces, mandatory pre-race inspections and injury reporting, the use of the whip, toe grabs, horses-intraining sales, and racehorse retirement. What's on your short list of racing reforms, and why?

MAGGI MOSS, Owner

I certainly recognize that racing is at a crucial time for all involved. Like any sport, reform is welcome and



needed. Ironically, I have found horse racing and the law have similarities. In the law, I watched as highly publicized events were captured by the media; there were many editorials, and discussions and ultimately new laws, sometimes extreme in answer to public outcry. They were not always in the best

interest of racing or the betting public, but political in nature without looking towards the future. I am hopeful that racing leadership finds a uniform voice, with the very real understanding that the betting public is our mainstay and must believe that they have a level playing field.

With that in mind, I am hopeful that reform takes a reasoned and careful approach with all involved from many different backgrounds and experience.

(Moss's short list includes:)

- 1) A true leader for the industry, such as the National Football League, that represents all interests on all levels and takes swift and reasoned actions.
- 2) That all elements of the industry create a platform that convinces the betting public they can wager on a fair and equitable basis. That we all look at how the betting public sees us, not at what we do to serve only our own interests.
- 3) That monies be spent that take all labs throughout the country to the 21st century of drug testing, with uniformity and consistency from state to state across the country.
- 4) That drug testing procedures and the labs involved use the sophistication and science necessary--such as the Olympians use--to have the best science available, assuring the betting public that fairness and sophistication exist.

- 5) That states and their racing commissions have uniformity, and are sensible and recognize the need to have common sense with regard to their violation policies and rules, along with due process for all.
- 6) That calling for bans of all race-day medications might be extreme, and a moderate approach of what is best for the horse should also be considered. That abuses of drugs, much as in humans, is the problem.
- 7) That more data is needed to determine the safest surface and that research be continued on injuries occurring on different surfaces, whether it is dirt or synthetic. That expertise and care of the track assures safety for the horse and the jockey.
- 8) That any abuse--whether it be horses running too often, horses that are overmedicated and sore, over-whipping of horses, toe grabs--that all measures that hurt horses be banned and rules strictly enforced.
- 9) That all tracks, owners and breeders be more diligent in every possible way to end ANY horse being sold to slaughter, and that there is more discussion and awareness of this horror. All measures from tracks, including legislation and enforcement, should be unified to prevent this archaic and barbaric practice, and every possible measure be taken to stop it entirely.
- 10) That dignity of the horse, over medication, high vet bills and abuse of the animal, be a priority for all tracks and all racing. That all owners and trainers be unified against these abuses and act accordingly and quickly. That racetracks provide educated personnel to oversee all practices and that rules be strictly enforced. This would include a strong and unified group of vets at tracks who not only look at the horse, but also at where the horse is racing and at what level, and readily scratch horses that have red flags.

Most importantly, all reforms, in a moderate and thoughtful way, should be implemented to assure the betting public will be enthused again and support racing. We should use the science available in this country to create unified and sophisticated drug testing. The people who lead us to reforms should consist of members of all aspects of racing, involved day in and day out. Tracks, vets, owners, trainers, jockeys and everyone in racing must try to do what is fair for the animal, in combination with the ability to stay successful in their endeavors and to be around for years to come. Whether it be whips, toe grabs, medications or track surfaces, reform should come in moderation and with an eye to the best interest of the horses, along with an emphasis on reassuring the betting public.

Juestion LANE'S END of the month Continued...

BILL CASNER, co-owner of WinStar Farm

1) Implementation of the RCI rule on limiting toe grabs to a maximum of a two millimeters in all racing jurisdic-

tions is paramount. The first studies into the detrimental effects of toe grabs were done in 1992 by Dr. Sue Stove of UC at Davis. There have been a number of other quality university-based studies over the last 16 years that demonstrate how lethal these devices are to the horse and rider. The data is compelling and the time has come for all states to enact this rule.



2) Requiring a certification of minimum standards for all drug testing laboratories that are engaged in post race testing must be addressed. As it stands, there are 18 labs that are testing and only five have been certified. The bar needs to be raised on the quality of our testing to Olympic standards, and there needs to be a mechanism in place to also provide enough funding for research in developing tests for the plethora of drugs that have the potential for abuse. This is a tremendous problem because of the requirement by many states that the testing be done at their state university. This compromises the quality and creates a huge amount of inefficiencies that could be remedied by reducing the number of testing labs to three or four, and requiring them to be of the highest standard. 3) Synthetic tracks have demonstrated their ability to significantly reduce catastrophic injuries. I would hope that racetracks would understand that conversion to these surfaces is not only in the best interest of the horse, but also is in the best interest of their business. I would also hope that the major racing jurisdictions would find ways to incentivize the racetracks to move in this direction. No doubt the learning curve is still progressing on these surfaces, but there has not been a track that has converted that has not achieved a dramatic reduction in breakdowns. It is the right thing for our horses and our industry.

- 4) The TOBA Action Committee has been examining the whip rule, in concert with leaders from the jockey colony, and will be coming forth with recommendations in the near term.
- 5) Time frames and distances for two-year-olds are topics that certainly needs evaluation.
- 6) Expanding the fund for disabled jockeys needs to continue to be a major focus. The benefits of the industry working in concert with the riders was demonstrated during the Triple Crown, and there was a significant amount of funding raised for this program.

The needs of disabled exercise riders, grooms and trainers also needs strong consideration, and the inclusion of this group into the fund for disabled jockeys would incentivize a broader group of contributors.

- 7) Addressing the problem of retired horses is a monumental problem that will require continual focus. There not only has to be an accountability of the industry, but also of everyone who profits and benefits from raising, selling and racing horses. This is everyone's problem and the biggest obstacle is funding. The burden can not lay solely in the charitable sector. It is a cost that everyone must be willing to share.
- 8) Field size should be limited to 14 horses. Larger fields place horses and riders at greater peril. While they may increase the excitement of a race that is run without incident and stimulate betting, it is not worth the expanded risk to riders and horses, and the immense amount of damage that could be done to our industry if a spill is incurred in a nationally broadcasted race.

TOM MCGREEVY, Bloodstock Agent

There are many reforms in the horse industry that can help racing, the horse and the public's view of racing. Changes in the use of the whip can have an immediate impact in these areas, especially in the public's view. The jockey definitely needs the whip. He needs the whip for his safety and that of his fellow riders and the horse. The whip should be used to guide and to signal the horse when it is time to give their all. I think this can be done very effectively with the whip turned down. My suggestion for change--DO NOT LET THE JOCKEY TURN THE WHIP OVER. This is a black and white rule--either the jockey turned the whip over or he did not. I have never ridden in a race, but I have watched thousands and believe that a turned-down whip would change a very small number of races. The horse is the biggest winner of this change.

Got good at the end of last year and looked like he had a future, but hasn't gotten an inch better this year, not a healthy sign. His third in the United Nations was not nearly as good as it looked--he got a rail trip (1w1w, upper left) in a three-turn race, gaining several lengths in ground loss relative to the field. This colt will move forward some day, but he would need to do it a lot and right now to get involved here.

2 Grand Couturier (GB) Grand Lodge Ribaudo 8-1

Is another that wasn't much at three, but he got much better last year, exploding in his third start of the campaign to win this race with the best figure anyone in this field has ever run. That he ran his best that day was no surprise--Ribaudo trainees are poor first and second off layoffs, but much better third time out, both in terms of winning and finishing in the money. Well, guess what--this horse is third off a layoff again, racing at Saratoga, where he has run his best race each of the last two years. He also has an inside post going three turns and Alan Garcia, who has turned into the reincarnation of Pat Day--he always saves ground.

4 Interpatation <u>Langfuhr</u> Barbara 30-1

Is a typical grass horse, running lots of races at or close to whatever his top is at a given point in his career. But he's not as good at age six as he was in the past, and even on his lifetime best is only borderline, even getting weight (five pounds is worth a point on the Thoro-Graph scale).

5 Presious Passion Royal Anthem Hartmann 15-1

Won a weak U.N. two back at a big price by returning to his lifetime top. He then got buried (!) in a lesser race while running exactly the same figure, due to racing three wide on the turns (upper left) and spotting weight, which no one who handicaps without performance figures will believe in a million years. He comes back here on short rest off a pair of lifetime tops, so there is a good chance he will back up a little. If he can hang on for another one he could get a piece of this despite carrying high weight—he might save ground around three turns as lone speed.


Better Talk Now Talkin Man Motion 4-1

Is not what he used to be, and what he used to be was not as good as it looked--he has benefitted from some great ground saving rides by Dominguez. Now, at the age of nine, he's consistent enough to get a piece of this, but can't win unless others don't run their best.

7 Dancing Forever Rahy McGaughey II 5-2

Horses on average improve six Thoro-Graph points between the ages of two and four, but the sons and daughters of Rahy are extreme late developers that improve an average of 10 points over the same period. Dancing Forever has become a good example--he was just okay at three and four, but has developed dramatically this year at five. With plenty of time since his last there is a good chance he can pair up that top effort, as grass horses so often do--but he spots a little weight and drew outside, and it's unlikely he's ready this soon to run the new top he will need to win this.

Bottom Line: Grand Couterier is the best horse on his best, and he figures to run his best today.

BONUS ADDED TO NETJETS KING'S BISHOP

In addition to the lion's share of the \$250,000 purse, the winning owner in the Aug. 23 GI NetJets King's Bishop S. at Saratoga will also receive \$50,000 in air travel with the race's sponsor, it was announced yesterday. "The GI NetJets King's Bishop S. is the top three-year-old sprint race on the New York Racing Association calendar," said NetJets Chairman and CEO Richard T. Santulli. "It will attract some of the finest horses in the world, and we are proud to sponsor the event and honor the winning owner. We are excited to continue our longtime support of Thoroughbred racing and to be part of this historic day at Saratoga." Added NYRA President and CEO Charles Hayward, "The sponsorship of NetJets strengthens what annually is one of the strongest stakes run at Saratoga."

KY EQUINE DRUG RESEARCH COUNCIL

APPROVES STEROID BAN The Kentucky Equine Drug Research Council voted Thursday to ban anabolic steroids for horses racing in the state. Under the new rule, which is stricter than the one proposed by the national Racing Medication and Testing Consortium, only three naturally occuring steroids--boldenone, nandrolone and testosterone--will be allowed for therapeutic use, and horses will not be permitted to race within 60 days of the administration of those steroids. The national recommendation calls for a 30-day withdrawal time, and also allows for the use of stanozolol, marketed as Winstrol. Kentucky's proposed regulation prohibits the use of Winstrol, and would also classify synthetic steroids as Class A drugs; Class A violations carry the toughest penalties, including licence suspensions of up to three years. Naturally occuring steroids would be treated as Class B drugs, with violations carrying licence suspensions of up to 60 days. In addition, therapeutic use of the three allowable steroids must be reported to Kentucky's Equine Medical Director, Dr. Mary Scollay, and horses under treatment will not be permitted to race until the Kentucky Horse Racing Commission receives a clean drug test on that horse. The Drug Research Council's proposal will go before the KHRC during its next meeting, scheduled for Aug. 25. Testing for anabolic steroids is expected to begin in 2009; there will be a 90-day grace period before penalties are issued.
