#### TAMAYUZ TAKES JACOUES LE MAROIS

Sheikh Hamdan bin Rashid Al Maktoum's Tamayuz (GB) (Nayef) enjoyed a faultless trip en route to stamp-

ing his superiority in yesterday's G1 Prix du Haras de Fresnayle-Buffard Jacques le Marois at Deauville. Coming off the back of a lifetime best when capturing the one-mile G1 Prix Jean Prat at Chantilly July 13, the homebred tracked his pacemaker Racinger (Fr) (Spectrum {Ire}) until the quarter pole and, after being committed by Davy Bonilla soon after, kept up a relentless gallop to the line. He had a comfortable 2 1/2-length margin over Natagora (Fr) (Divine Light {Jpn}) there to provide trainer

Freddy Head with another top-level success during a golden period of his career. "I am so lucky to train such good horses, and I think this one is also a champion," Head said.

Most of the main action happened late during yesterday's third session of Argana's August Yearling Sale and it was a family on the upswing which caused a stir

eight lots from the finish. Hip 336, a colt by Verglas (Ire) from the consignment of Haras des Sablonnets, was placed into the spotlight after his full-brother Silver Frost (Ire) captured the G3 Prix de Cabourg at the local track earlier this month. Bound for the G1 Prix Morny Sunday, the son of Hidden Silver (GB) (Anabaa) had

been purchased by Charlie Gordon-Watson at last year's sale for €95,000. Since then, High Rock (Ire) elevated the colt's second dam Hint of Silver when winning the G3 Prix La Force by six lengths, and was the starting favorite when fourth in the G1 Prix du Jockey-Club. It was ultimately John Ferguson who consolidated his position as leading buyer during this edition after Mick Buckley of Kildangan Stud made the purchase on his behalf at €360,000. "John had to leave last night, but had inspected the horse, and we found that he was a lovely animal with a great pedigree and the type to make a precocious, speedy two-year-old," Buckley said. "He will return to England and join the contingent of our yearlings before Sheikh Mohammed decides where to allocate him. We are delighted to have him." cont. p8

Tamayuz was two-for-two as a juvenile in mile contests at Longchamp in September, when he had the future G2 Prix Greffulhe winner Prospect Wells (Fr) and G1 Criterium de Saint-Cloud hero Full of Gold (Fr) back in second and fourth, respectively, and at Chantilly the following month. He returned to win the G3 Prix de Fontainebleau back at Longchamp Apr. 13 before running down the field from an outside draw in that track's May 11 G1 Poule d'Essai des Poulains. In a hot renewal of the Prix Jean Prat, he benefitted from a positive ride to conquer Raven's Pass, and those tactics were employed again here to further his burgeoning reputation. Showing early speed to sit in behind his stable companion Racinger--who cut out perfect fractions under the guidance of Olivier Peslier--the chestnut had total command throughout a lonely final quarter mile as Natagora gave her usual valiant effort in his wake. "He has class, speed and stays and a mile is perfect for him," trainer Freddy Head said. "As a former jockey, I know that you have to ride these races as you feel, and Davy [Bonilla] felt he had a lot of horse and made the right decision to go on as early as he did. I never had a single worry and Olivier [Peslier] and the pacemaker did a great job--it was exactly as we had planned. I have to thank Sheikh Hamdan for giving me such a horse to train and all the public for their support over the past three weeks. I will discuss Tamayuz's future with Sheikh Hamdan and the G1 Prix du Moulin [at Longchamp Sept. 7] is a possibility, but one day we will have to take on Henrythenavigator, and Ascot for the [Sept. 27] G1 Queen Elizabeth II S. could be the day." Natagora's trainer Pascal Bary paid tribute to the effort of the grey filly afterwards. "She stumbled slightly out of the gates and took time to get balanced, but had the perfect trip afterwards and tried hard, so I am delighted," Bary said. "The winner was superior, but she is so brave and always gives her best. The Prix du Moulin might come too soon, as she has had two hard races at this meeting, so we could very well consider the G1 Prix de la Foret [at Longchamp Oct. 4]."

Sunday morning in preparation for Saturday's GI Travers S. The winner of the GIII Withers S. completed the task in :59.72. "I thought he went really well this morning and he's coming into the Travers in good order," trainer Todd Pletcher said. "We were shooting between 1:00 and 1:01. It was a

tick quicker than we wanted to go, but he did it the right way. He did it well and galloped out strongly. He seemed to cool out quickly." The grey was accompanied by stablemate Understatement (Distorted Humor), who also completed the task in the same time as the Prince of Wales S. winner. "I always work him in company," added Pletcher. "He has become a very good work horse, which hasn't always been the case. He's gotten better as he has been going along." Asked to assess his chances in the Mid-Summer Derby, the Eclipse Award trainer added, "It will be an interesting Travers; it is a pretty wide open race. Who knows what would have happened if we went to the Preakness? But I feel we have arrived here in pretty good shape."

Trainer Barclay Tagg confirmed Sunday that GI Wood Memorial S. winner **Tale of Ekati** (Tale of the Cat) is well and ready to roll in Saturday's 1 1/4-mile feature.

The colt, who finished fourth in his latest start in the GII Jim Dandy S., worked six panels in 1:13.60 over the Saratoga main track Saturday in what will be his final major move before the Travers. "I knew he was short going into the Jim Dandy," explained Tagg. "I was going to run him in the [GI] Haskell [Aug. 2], [and] get another work into him. I was planning on running [stablemate] Big

Truck in the Jim Dandy, but after I decided not to, they asked me if I would run Tale of Ekati, and I thought, he could use a race and it will help move him forward a little bit and it will give me four weeks until the Travers. It was all a last-minute thing. Since then, he's been doing really, really well." GIII Tampa Bay Derby winner Big Truck (Hook and Ladder), who worked five furlongs in a bullet :59.67 Saturday, is entered in Wednesday's Albany S. against New-York breds.





King of Rome ran 11th in last term's G1 Racing Post Trophy at Doncaster and came back to finish fifth in the Apr. 20 Ballysax S. at this track before running second in the May 10 G3 Lingfield Derby Trial. The well-travelled sophomore then turned up to run 12th in the June 7 G1 Epsom Derby, hit the board in the June 19 Listed Hampton Court S. at Royal Ascot and finished sixth in the G1 Deutsches Derby at Hamburg July 6 in his penultimate start. He claimed a first pattern-race win in the July 24 G3 Meld S. over course and distance last time, and returned to the scene of that triumph to double his stakes score with this easy victory. Shadowing the leading pair throughout, King of Rome took control inside the final quarter mile and was never seriously threatened thereafter to record an easy 3 1/2-length win from Alarazi. "He's a very classy type who should be a nice horse for next year," commented trainer Aidan O'Brien, however, he added, "I'm not ruling out the G1 Irish Champion S. Eighth in a Roscommon maiden on debut July 7, Again broke through in a Curragh maiden last time July 27 and climbed further up the ladder to register a personal best in this stakes bow. Restrained in midfield for the most part, she loomed large on the wide outside as the field fanned into the straight and dominated her overmatched rivals by drawing clear once taking over at the furlong marker. "David [Wachman] liked her a lot and said she had come on a lot since The Curragh," jockey Johnny Murtagh commented. "She's a big, scopey filly with a great temperament and coped with conditions great. I was really impressed with the way she stretched out in the last furlong. There were a lot of unexposed types there coming off impressive maiden wins and they are the best around, but mine showed she was the best. The G1 Moyglare Stud S. [at The Curragh Aug. 31] seems ideal for her and should suit her down to the ground. She might develop into an Oaks filly next year and there is no end to where she can go." Crowd choice Cuis Ghaire (Galileo {Ire}) came under pressure rounding the home turn and was handled with care in the straight once her chance had gone. 

The dam is in foal to Hurricane Run (Ire) and has a lovely foal by Anabaa Blue (GB). We are happy to see the horse go to Richard Hannon, and we wish him the same success as Gorella." #### NO BC CUP FOR PROUD SPELL? Proud Spell

(Proud Citizen), winner of the GI Alabama S., exited Saturday's race in good order, according to trainer Larry Jones yesterday. "All things are good with her," said Jones. "I don't know what our next objective is. The Alabama had been our main objective, so right now, I don't know. We'll sit down in a day or two and start thinking about it." With a three-year-old championship in mind, Jones told Blood-Horse yesterday, "Hopefully, [the Alabama] will settle the Eclipse Award. I just can't see them settling it on an artificial surface, and using that as the one-race measure. That's why they have dirt horses and they have turf horses, and now you need a third kind of horse. I know we're not looking to go to the Breeders' Cup with Proud Spell." Explaining the decision to bypass the championship series at Santa Anita, Jones told Blood-Horse, "She wasn't comfortable on the Polytrack at Keeneland [third in the GI Ashland S.]. We work over the Tapeta synthetic surface at Fair Hill, and while it's good for her to train on, she still works slow, and had a slow work over it for the Alabama, considering the effort she put in."

#### SAFETY FIRST AT JC ROUND TABLE

By Maryjean Wall

Calling for quick action from the ground up as well as at the top, The Jockey Club's Thoroughbred Safety Committee is urging all racetracks to enact immediate change in horse welfare through the use of interim "house rules" to speed reform while awaiting any future state actions.

This recommendation was among proposals yester-day at the 56th annual Round Table Conference sponsored by The Jockey Club, where the use of anabolic steroids, alkalinizing substances ("milkshakes") and toe grabs on horse shoes were singled out as problems that the industry is attempting to solve quickly.

The committee also urged publication of TCO2 (alkalinizing, "milkshake") levels of all horses tested in each state because the public has a right to know.

"Medication issues continue to haunt this industry and they are and will continue to be a priority for this committee," said Stuart S. Janney III, chairman of the Thoroughbred Safety Committee. "We have too much medication compared to the rest of the world," he also said.

The Thoroughbred Safety Committee also recommended changes in drug testing and laboratory standards, uniform penalties for prohibited drug and practices violations, more strenuous milkshake testing, and a national system to report injuries during racing and training. Some 55 racetracks have signed on with the committee's Equine Injury Database and the committee yesterday urged all tracks to participate.

Clearly, the great amount of negative publicity the industry has received since the death of Eight Belles in the Kentucky Derby was one major theme driving this year's Round Table. The Safety Committee is to examine the size of the Kentucky Derby field, which generally attracts 20 horses, to determine if it is, in fact, a safety issue.

The industry can cite some successful strategies that were in place even before the hailstorm of news articles resulting from this year's Triple Crown, according to James Hickey Jr., president of The American Horse Council.

Nonetheless, Hickey stressed in his presentation that the climate of public tolerance for racing injuries has changed markedly since the last time, some 27 years ago, when the fear of federal intervention swept through the industry.

"The public is very interested now and not sympathetic," James Hickey Jr. said. "Overwhelmingly the articles are critical. The focus on steroid problems in other sports has spilled over into racing."

Alan Foreman, chairman and CEO of the Thoroughbred Horsemen's Associations, Inc., promised aid with funding post-graduate doctoral students whose career interests will focus on drug-testing of racehorses. Foreman predicted that the industry is going to find it difficult to replace the core scientists who have devoted lifelong careers to this niche.

He also warned that sophisticated testing will be needed to combat the next generation of illegal drugs: gene doping. Foreman said that one solution to prevailing budget problems at state-controlled testing laboratories would be for the racing industry to establish its own laboratory.

Bill Casner, president and co-owner of WinStar Farm, showed visuals that highlighted how the wearing of toe grabs alters the leg and ankle position of a running horse. He cited research by Dr. Sue Stover at UCLA-Davis that has connected the wearing of toe grabs to on-track injuries.

"We have a lot of work ahead of us," Janney concluded, adding, "If the death of Eight Belles makes us all more cooperative and less inward-looking, Eight Belles may be viewed as one of the most important racehorses ever to step on a track."


