#### **GENUINE RISK DEAD AT 31**

Bert and Diana Firestone's **Genuine Risk** (Exclusive Native--Virtuous, by \*Gallant Man), who was the oldest surviving GI Kentucky Derby winner, died peacefully

Monday just after being turned out at the Firestones' Newstead Farm in Virginia. She was 31. "She tried to get up once or twice and then just put her head down and went to sleep," Bert Firestone said. "It's a good way for a horse to go. She had a great life.

From the time we got her, I don't ever remember her being sick a day in her life." Foaled in 1977, the Kentucky-bred mare was purchased for just \$32,000 as a FTKJUL yearling. She captured the GII Demoiselle S. and the Tempted S. at two, but proved she belonged with the best colts of her generation the following year. The chestnut finished third in the GI Wood Memorial S., then stepped it up a level to become just the second of her sex to wear the blanket of roses on the first Saturday in May. Durable as well as talented, she went on to finish second in the GI Preakness and GI Belmont S., and capped off the season with a victory against her own sex in the GI Ruffian H. "She was a wonderful and outstanding filly; everyone fell in love with her," recalled trainer LeRoy Jolley. "She had a place in everyone's heart. Everyone involved with her took care of her up to the end. She was special to all of us." In a statement, the Firestones said, "Genuine Risk was an amazing horse with a tremendous heart that lived a life befitting a champion. We are truly blessed that she was a part of our life, and we are deeply saddened by her passing." Bred by Mrs. G. Watts Humphrey Jr., Genuine Risk retired with a record of 15-10-3-2 and earnings of \$646,587. She produced only two foals, both colts, neither of which raced.

Facing heavy conditions and a high-class Derby winner in **New Approach (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}), Ballydoyle's figurehead will have to draw on his reserves to add to his enviable tally. His most impressive performances have come on fast ground in The Curragh's May

25 G1 Tattersalls Gold Cup and Ascot's June 18 G1 Prince of Wales's S. and July 26 G1 King George VI and Queen Elizabeth S., but jockey Johnny Murtagh thinks the Duke will overcome the odds. "I always say a good horse can go on any ground, and I have a great belief in my horse," Murtagh said. "He's tough and genuine and every day he goes he gives you 110 percent. It's a very exciting race and I'm looking forward to it. It's a clash of the titans, and the best horse will win on the day. He's a horse that can overcome difficulties--this is one little thing that might not be in his favour, but I don't fear anything in the race." *Cont. p2* 


#### DEAUVILLE DELIGHT

Argana's August Yearling Sale ended on a high yesterday, with gains across the board resulting in a record for the fledgling sales company. At the end of another solid session, the cumulative average of €111,017 represented a 13-percent increase on 2007, while the median of €70,000 was up by 17 percent. General Manager Olivier Delloye was understandably upbeat at the close of a consistently strong four-day sale, which was the subject of virtually unanimous praise from buyers and vendors throughout. "This sale has been a great success," Delloye said. "It is a new record year for our company and, of course, we could not be more pleased. A seven-percent increase [in gross] over last year is a tremendous success. Before last year, Giant's Causeway was the sole sophomore to best his elders since 1993, but Authorized (Ire) managed to subdue Dylan Thomas (Ire) in the latest renewal. Like Authorized, New Approach comes here off a success in the G1 Epsom Derby, and he showed in that June 7 Classic that he stays a distance of ground. Deep conditions hold no fears for him on last year's evidence, when he beat Curtain Call (Fr) and Henrythenavigator in The Curragh's G2 Futurity S. in August. Since that effort, Princess Haya of Jordan's chestnut has won three of the five Group 1 races he has contested, and finished runner-up in the other two. "He's very well," trainer Jim Bolger told PA Sport. "The ground is not ideal, but hopefully, it will dry out somewhat. He's won over a mile and a half and he's won on heavy before, as well. Hopefully, he is strong enough now to take on the battle-hardened older horses." Henry Cecil saddled Wollow (Ire) to win this in 1976 when it was known as the Benson & Hedges Gold Cup, and followed up with Royal Anthem in 1999. He saddles Khalid Abdullah's G1 Prince of Wales's and G1 Eclipse runner-up **Phoenix Tower** and the Niarchos Family's Aug. 9 G3 Rose of Lancaster S. winner Multidimensional. "The ground sounds pretty desperate," Cecil commented. "Multidimensional won't mind it, but if it is heavy, Phoenix Tower could find it harder. His sire hated the soft, but he is in good order and seems to have improved." York has taking a drenching in recent days, and officials are hoping for a break in the weather. "We're currently heavy ground after a very wet night on Saturday," Clerk of the Course William Derby commented. "It is a continually unsettled period, so it is difficult, but the course looks in good nick, so the meeting is not in any doubt at the moment."



Sir Michael Stoute, who has collected five renewals of this prize, relies on Patkai. The colt stepped up from a Haydock handicap win May 31 to record an impressive seven-length success in Royal Ascot's G3 Queen's Vase last time. While that June 20 contest proved that he has the stamina for two miles, connections are convinced he has the speed for this shorter trip; the ground is more of a concern. "You're always bothered about the ground if it's bottomless," Ballymacoll Stud's Peter Reynolds told PA Sport. "There will always be a question mark, so I don't know at the moment." Aidan O'Brien puts forward Alessandro Volta and Bashkirov, who were out of the frame in the June 7 G1 Epsom Derby and July 14 G1 Grand Prix de Paris at Longchamp. In between, Alessandro Volta finished third, before being demoted to fourth, and Bashkirov was sixth in the G1 Irish Derby at The Curragh June 29. Godolphin are seeking a fourth renewal, but very testing ground is a concern for the supplemented \$11.7-million Meydan City, who handled ease in the ground when winning a maiden and conditions event at Newmarket July 9 and Aug. 8. "We have to check the ground, but Meydan City is in good form and is working well," trainer Saeed bin Suroor said. "He won his last two races and is ready to go. It will be a big step for him going into a Group 2, but the horse is improving all the time. I think the step up in trip will suit him."

His 10-length debut defeat of the subsequent winner Pegasus Lad at Ascot July 12 stamped him as a colt of considerable promise, but he has to underline his versatility in desperate conditions. "Heavy ground at York would be a real concern, but we'll take him up there and have a look before we decide to run or not," Johnson Houghton told PA Sport. "He would probably go on the ground, but I don't want to bottom him out this year. He's a lovely big horse and he's very laid-back, so he's a very exciting prospect." Prince Siegfried was an impressive five-length winner on his first outing at Salisbury July 12.

### August Yearling Sale

#### DEAUVILLE DELIGHT (cont. from p1)

"We feared beforehand that only the top pedigrees would sell really well, but that has not been the case," admitted General Manager Olivier Delloye. "The catalogue was very homogenous and we have sold well on all segments and, therefore, everybody is happy. It means that all breeders and consignors have harvested the fruits of their work and investments, and that is extremely satisfactory."

Elodie Garamond, managing director of the French Racing and Breeding Committee (FRBC), was also heralding an auction which has become an essential part of the mainstream now.

"We have worked a lot on bringing new clients to France," he said. "[We had] people from Australia, Scandinavia, Spain, Germany, Belgium and some from Bulgaria, Japan and many different other countries. Our job is to promote the French racing and breeding industry and we worked closely with Argana. Those who had never been here before loved Deauville and the atmosphere and all say they will come back. They appreciate that global package. Mark Player, from the Hong Kong Jockey Club, whom I have tried to persuade to come for years, finally came this year for the first time and just loved what he saw. He thought French yearlings were not suitable for the international sale in Hong Kong, but changed his mind after a close look and bought a few. He loved the quality of the horses and he is ready to come back. It has been such a success that 11 different people from six different countries have immediately applied for racing colours in France after buying yearlings here. The premiums system is a great incentive, and we have fully informed them of all procedures, the advantage of racing in France and about the ratio of training expenses to purses, which is excellent in our country. Some could not buy and said they will come back. Some didn't try to buy, but have collected information and said they will return."

#### This One's For the Ladies...

Fillies held sway during the final session and Will Edmeades snapped up the day's topper when paying €160,000 for hip 442, a daughter of Royal Academy from the consignment of Haras du Ma. Her dam is a sister to the 1996 G2 Ribblesdale S. and 1997 G2 Prix de Royallieu winner Tulipa (Alleged), herself a half to the 1997 G1 Premio Vittorio di Capua hero and sire Devil River Peek.

Michel Zerolo's Oceanic Bloodstock had earlier paid €150,000 for Haras d'Etreham's hip 406, a Marchfoaled daughter of Verglas (Ire) whose dam Sao (Ire) (Dolphin Street {Fr}) was listed-placed and contested the 1999 G1 Poule d'Essai des Pouliches, going unplaced.

"I bought two this year, including this one for Martin Schwartz from America," Zerolo explained. "He used to buy a lot of horses in training in France and had a lot of success, the last one being Gorella (Fr) (Grape Tree Road {GB}), but it has become more and more difficult to buy good horses in France in private deals, especially with the rate of the euro. So last year I bought four yearlings for him here, two have already won and look promising, and the third one is due to have his debut this coming Friday. The idea is to develop them here with trainer Jean-Claude Rouget and, if they are good enough, they will go to the United States later on. Mr. Schwartz has fully understood the benefit of the owner's premiums with French-bred horses, so we try that and see if it works. This filly looked good, with a very decent pedigree by a hot sire who produces a lot of winners, and we are happy to have her."

#### Here and Thir...

Muthathir (GB) has had a sale to reflect the exploits of his better progeny on the track over the past few months, and the Shadwell stallion supplied two more highlights yesterday.

Haras du Capucines consigned hip 360, a Marchfoaled filly out of Luna Hill (Fr) (Danehill) who was knocked down to Suprina's Patrcia Boutin for €125,000. The filly's extended family includes Linamix (Fr) and his half-sister Luna Wells (Ire), the 1996 G1 Prix Saint-Alary heroine. That mare's best runner, Cat Junior, was fourth in this year's G1 St James's Palace S. and G1 Prix Jean Prat. Dam Luna Hill was produced by French Group 3 victress Luna Mareza (Fr).

"I bought this filly for Mr. Oliver Pawle and Lady O'Reilly and each own 50 percent," Boutin explained. "She will be trained by Richard Gibson in Chantilly. I love the Diesis-Danehill cross, and 10 days before the sale I had seen her at Haras des Capucines when touring the farms. I remember that I liked her a lot, as she is a very pretty filly who looked great again at the sale. She comes from a very good family of the late Mr. Lagardere, and my father had trained many of the winners in the family."

Boutin added, "Overall, it was a very solid sale and the quality of the catalogue was a true success. It was moving on quickly, there was a good ambience and there were no holes in the sale. Even in today's session, there was plenty to be interested in. Over the years, it has been a great effort from all breeders in the quality of the preparation of the yearlings--not only the major consignors--and that pays off. It is day and night from what it used to be a few years ago."

That €125,000 price was matched by trainer Stephane Wattel for a daughter of another Shadwell sire in Nayef, whose Tamayuz (GB) did wonders for his early reputation in Sunday's G1 Prix Jacques le Marois. From the draft of Haras du Thenney, hip 378 boasts Green Tune and the 1996 G1 Cheveley Park S. heroine Pas de Reponse on her page, as well as Storm Bird.

"I bought this filly for Mr. Jean-Charles Coude, who is a breeder himself and who had consigned hip 78, a Dansili (GB) filly that he sold for €160,000," Wattel said. "He wanted this filly today, because she looks good and Mr. Coude wanted a filly bred on that same cross. Her sire is hot and has made a great debut at stud, and we liked her. I have had other orders to buy, but could not do so. When you come to the Deauville August sale and want to spend some money, you do not buy just to buy. You can't pass on defects and I am very strict on that."

#### Ransom o'War, American Post Enjoy Strong Day...

Haras de Grandcamp's hip 465 proved the sole colt to make six figures on the final day when selling to trainer Nicolas Clement for €115,000. The yearling is by the Gestut Fahrhof resident Ransom o'War (Red Ransom) and his dam is a half to the 2005 G1 Premio Vittorio di Capua heroine Anna Monda (Ger), whose family continues to regenerate itself courtesy of the recent stakes winners Iguazu Falls and Advice (GB).

American Post (GB) (Bering {GB}) has made a bright start at stud, and he was responsible for the next two highest-priced colts. Hip 343, the very first yearling to be sold yesterday, was snapped up by Charlie Gordon-Watson for €92,000. Consigned by Elevage de Tourgeville, he is a half-brother to the listed scorer Dansant (GB) (Dansili {GB}), who was fourth in the G3 Glorious S. earlier this month.

Haras d'Etreham provided the other notable in hip 414, a son of the listed winner Semire (Fr) (Mizoram) who was knocked down to Guy Armengol for €88,000.

One of the leading vendors was Haras de la Reboursière et de Montaigu, whose Aliette Forien summed up the general feel good factor when saying, "This has been a truly lovely sale up to the last minute. It was solid, with a good catalogue. There has been a tremendous work done to bring new clients that nobody knew before and that had never come to Deauville in the past. There were good prices at the top of the market and in the middle market, but for all consignors and not only a few as it used to be. That is an excellent sign of the vitality of a sale. Until the very last lot there has been continuous demand from buyers. Personally, overall, I am very happy with my sale, even though I felt that I didn't sell too well on the Saturday. It is much better than what I had anticipated. Three weeks ago I never thought I would sell that well, so I have no complaints."

I've always thought that fewer horses are capable of reproducing their best form on heavy turf than on very firm, but one stallion whose progeny rarely seem inconvenienced by very soft ground is Danehill Dancer. He enjoyed a group race treble at Leopardstown, thanks to Snaefell in the G3 Phoenix Sprint, Again in the G2 Debutante S. and Caribbean Sunset in the G3 Desmond S. Snaefell's victory in a close finish was at the main expense of another son of Danehill Dancer (Georgebernardshaw) and a granddaughter (Kyniska), and Danehill Dancer also sired the third in the Desmond.

This excellent treble was gained over six, seven and eight furlongs, which is pretty much what one might expect of a stallion who was a Group 1 winner over six and seven furlongs at two, and who never tackled more than a mile. There is another side to Danehill Dancer, though, as his daughters Anna Pavlova and Ice Queen have demonstrated this year. Anna Pavlova--a renowned mudlark--won the G2 Lancashire Oaks over 1 1/2 miles, whereas Ice Queen failed by only a short head to land the G1 Irish Oaks over the same distance. With the unbeaten Mastercraftsman (G1 Phoenix S.) also to his credit, Danehill Dancer currently ranks third behind Galileo and Montjeu on Britain and Ireland's general sires' list (one place above his sire Danehill), and he also heads the two-year-old table.

While I should point out that Danehill Dancer has had more runners than any of his competitors, I should also mention that there's a distinct possibility that the best is yet to come from this stallion, whose fee was once as low as IR3,500gns. He stood the 2006 season at  $\in\!75,000$  and both the 2007 and 2008 seasons at  $\in\!115,000$ , whereas his three group winners on Sunday were sired during a period when his fee ranged from  $\in\!30,000$  to  $\in\!45,000$ .

Again, who carries the colors of Michael Tabor, ranks alongside Mastercraftsman, Westphalia and Abbeyside as one of four stakes winners from Danehill Dancer's current crop of juveniles. As she gained her first success over a mile, she will have appreciated the testing conditions when dropped back to seven furlongs at Leopardstown. Indeed, there's every reason to think she will eventually stay as well as Ice Queen and Anna Pavlova, as her dam Cumbres has a stamina-packed pedigree.

Cumbres's career has undergone quite a transformation. Born in 1993, she never made it to the races and her sire, the dual Derby winner Kahyasi, was being shamefully neglected by breeders in the second half of the 'nineties (when his progeny were becoming popular in the jumping world). When Cumbres made her debut as a broodmare as a three-year-old, the stallion selected for her was Sin Kiang, a Group 3 winner also belonging to her owner Sir James Goldsmith (who was to die in 1997).

The picture started to change in 1998, when Cumbres' half-brother Montjeu showed Classic potential in winning his first two starts in the colors of Tsega Ltd, a company owned by Goldsmith's friend Laure Boulay de la Meurthe. Michael Tabor then bought a major share in Montjeu, and the partnership was rewarded with six Group 1 victories, including the Derby, Irish Derby, Arc and King George.

At around the same time, Kahyasi's most famous broodmare daughter, Hasili, was beginning her extraordinarily successful partnership with Danehill, with their first two foals, Dansili and Banks Hill, highlighting this cross's potential. Consequently Cumbres was transferred to Ireland, where she had produced two foals by Danehill and two others by his sons Desert King and Danehill Dancer. Her winning Danehill filly Arkadina has been placed twice in mile-and-a-half stakes races this year, including at Group 3 level, but this is one occasion where Danehill Dancer has done better than his exceptional sire.

The Danehill-Kahyasi cross has been further advertised by the group successes of Intercontinental, Cacique, Champs Elysees, Promising Lead and Danelissima, but Kahyasi mares also have 2008 G1 winners by Zamindar (the exciting Zarkava) and Indian Ridge, plus a Group 3 winner by Oasis Dream (like Danehill Dancer, a grandson of Danzig).

Again's second dam Floripedes established herself as a fine stayer by winning the G3 Prix de Lutece over 1 7/8 miles and by finishing an admirable second against the males in the Prix Royal-Oak (French St Leger). The next dam Toute Cy was by Tennyson, winner of the Grand Prix de Paris over nearly two miles, and Toute Cy passed on plenty of stamina to her son Dadarissime. Even though he was inbred to the very fast Zeddaan, Dadarissime developed into an accomplished stayer, with three group victories over distances just short of two miles. Toute Cy's distinguished brother Le Mamamouchi also showed very smart form at around two miles in France.

American racegoers will know this family through Montjeu's half-brother Le Paillard, runner-up in the San Juan Capistrano H., and through Toute Cy's half-brother Dear Doctor, a group winner from 1 1/4 to 1 1/2 miles in four different countries, including the USA, where he won the GI Arlington Million and was second in the Turf Classic.

As several of Danehill Dancer's daughters, such as Alexander Tango, Callwood Dancer, Caribbean Sunset and Good Mood, have performed well in North America, it's possible that Again may one day also be seen in action in a major American prize.

BOWMAN'S BAND DIES Bowman's Band (Dixieland Band--Hometown Queen, by Pleasant Colony) was euthanized Saturday at Rood and Riddle Equine Hospital in Lexington following complications from colic surgery. The 10-year-old stallion had been standing at Lane's End Farm near Versailles. Bred by John Rooker and racing for Martin S. Schwartz, Bowman's Band won the 2003 GII Meadowlands Breeders' Cup S., was second in the 2004 GI Metropolitan H. and was third in that year's GI Whitney H., GI Pimlico Special H. and GI Woodward S. With career earnings of \$1,315,774, Bowman's Band retired as Dixieland Band's leading earner. He stood his first two years at Maryland Stallion Station, a joint venture with Lane's End, and was relocated to Lane's End for the 2007 season. His first foals are two-year-olds this year and, from five starters to date, he has two winners.






