MONMOUTH BIDS FOR 'BROWN'

Monmouth Park is the newest addition to the list of suitors for IEAH Stables and Paul Pompa Jr.'s **Big**

Brown (Boundary), and Philadelphia Park has made another strong push to host the colt's next start. The New Jersey option is the Sept. 13 Monmouth S., a nine-furlong grass race. Monmouth Vice President and General Manager Bob Kulina has had discussions with IEAH principal Michael lavarone, offering to increase the purse of the race should Big Brown run. The two

did not go into specifics, but Kulina said he could not match Philadelphia's bid. According to lavarone, Philadelphia Park officials have agreed to increase the purse of the Sept. 13 Governor's Cup to \$1 million, should Big Brown take part. Earlier in the week, it was reported that Philadelphia would double the original purse of the nine-panel race, from \$250,000 to \$500,000, if the GI Kentucky Derby and GI Preakness S. hero competed. lavarone said Wednesday from Saratoga that Big Brown will make his next start at one of four tracks: Philadelphia, Monmouth, Belmont or Santa Anita. All four races under consideration are turf events. lavarone said he is concerned about the condition of the Philly turf, and he and trainer Rick Dutrow Jr. will head to Philadelphia Monday to walk the course. Philadelphia officials haven't scheduled a grass event since July 29 in order to allow the course to recover from hard use earlier in the summer, although Saturday's card has two races slated for the sod. The New York Racing Association has scheduled a mile-and-an-eighth turf race of its own for Sept. 13. The race, which does not yet have a name, will be worth \$200,000 if Big Brown is part of the field. The fourth option is the Sept. 27 GI Clement L. Hirsch S. at Santa Anita. "If you have three options and all the turf courses are safe, the one that offers the most money would be the leading contender," lavarone said. "There is a substantial difference between \$200,000 in New York and \$1 million at Philly. But that's not our driving factor. If we walk that turf course at Philadelphia and it is not safe, we will not run there."

COLLEAGUES REMEMBER DAVID MULLINS

David Mullins, who owned Doninga Bloodstock and had formerly operated Doninga Farm in Lexington, died

Monday at the age of 51. He had been diagnosed with pancreatic cancer the week before this year's Kentucky Derby. To those in the racing industry, Mullins was best known for selling Baby Zip (Relaunch), dam of GISW City Zip (Carson City) and 2004 Horse of the Year Ghostzapper (Awesome Again); and Drina (Regal and Royal), dam of Spain (Thunder Gulch), a MGISW who retired as the highest-earning female of all-time. To

his friends and close colleagues, he was a master of playful banter who knew a bargain when he saw one.

James Keogh, owner of Siena Farm, recalled how far he and Mullins went to make sure they could get their hands on an undervalued filly. Entered at River Downs in June of 1992 was a four-year-old maiden named Scotch Champagne (Highland Blade). Her \$6,500 claiming price disguised her true value: she was a half to GSW Bubbling and GISW Effervescing. Mullins and Keogh decided they had to keep Scotch Champagne a secret. "We didn't want our competitors finding out about her," recalled Keogh. "At seven in the morning, we drove to every *Daily Racing Form* supply shop and bought up all of the *Racing Forms* for that afternoon. We claimed her and sold her that fall for \$75,000."

Jim Fitzgerald, owner of Knockgriffin Farm, described Mullins as a "pioneer" for being one of the first to use the claiming game to purchase broodmare prospects.


"He had it down to a fine science," Fitzgerald said of Mullins's method. "When nobody else was doing it, he was intensively doing it--going to tracks, looking at fillies, claiming, and selling. If everyone was zigging, he was finding a way to zag."

Mullins sold 51 stakes producers and five Grade I-winners. A native of Ireland who relocated to the U.S. in 1979, he was the son of Luke Mullins, general manager of Galway Racecourse. His uncle, Paddy Mullins, was a renowned steeplechase trainer. In addition to his father, he is survived by son Chase and daughter Dara.

George O'Meara, owner of Chapel Hill Bloodstock, described Mullins as "one of the finest fathers I have ever encountered." O'Meara recalled his yearly trips to Colorado with Mullins.

"We had gone out to Colorado, west of Denver, for two or three years and herded cattle for Kirk Shiner, who has several ranches around there," O'Meara said. "We'd go in September and would have to get them off before the snow set in."

Mullins served on the boards of Central Kentucky Riding for Hope and the Kentucky Thoroughbred Farm Managers' Club, was a member of the Thoroughbred Club of America, and was a president of High Hope Steeplechase.



"High Hope Steeplechase died a few years ago and he helped bring it back," said Bill Wofford, owner of Rimrock Farm. "He was a huge innovator. He helped come up with the Sportman's Challenge, an amateur race for farm workers, and was great at raising money for charity." High Hope runs the David Mullins Lexington Derby in his honor.

Mullins was also known for his ability to trade barbs with his friends. "There was always good banter with David," said Fitzgerald. "In Irish terms, you'd call it 'taking the piss.' There was always a story to be told, but it was never malicious."

Visitation will be held Friday from 4 to 6 p.m. and 7 to 9 p.m. at Kerr Brothers Funeral home in Lexington. The funeral will be at 11 a.m. Saturday at Christ the King Church, also in Lexington. Dr. Tom Tobin and Bill Wofford will deliver the eulogy. It should be a bittersweet occasion. Mullins will be missed by his friends, but there should be plenty of laughter when they reminisce about their colleague. Keogh said, "There were some unbelievable stories," but admitted that "most of them were unprintable."

Fitzgerald added, "At the end of the day of selling at Keeneland, we'd go up to the bar for a beer before we went home. David Mullins and a few others like that would be standing around. You'd always go over and say 'hello' because you always knew you'd leave with a smile on your face." -Jon Forbes

West Point Thoroughbreds' Macho Again (Macho Uno) followed a half-length score in the Apr. 26 Derby Trial with a runner-up finish in the GI Preakness S. Coming off a fifth in the GI Belmont S., he was let go at 8-1 in the Jim Dandy, but steered through traffic on the far turn and outgamed Pyro (Pulpit) to the wire to take it by a half-length.

Trainer Neil Howard opted to skip the Jim Dandy with **Mambo in Seattle** (Kingmambo), instead entering the royally bred colt in the Henry Walton S. on the undercard July 27.

Sent off the 2-1 chalk, the bay got up for a game neck score, and his final time in the nine-furlong affair was 1:50 4/5, a tick quicker than the Jim Dandy time. The Mrs. William S. Kilroy & W. S. Farish runner will break from post nine. "There's a good long run into the first turn, and he's a horse that breaks well and usually gets good position," Howard said after post positions were assigned. "I think he'll be fine from that post." As for the step up in class and trip, the trainer said, "He ran well last time and we've been very confident since that race, especially in light of the way he has trained. The distance shouldn't be a problem, relative to his pedigree. He still has to do it, but I think he has it in him."

EBOR WIPED OUT; RACES RESCHEDULED

Newmarket, Newbury and Goodwood have been named as the hosts of a clutch of major races which fell pray to the weather at York's Ebor meeting. Following the announcement at yesterday's noon inspection by Clerk of the Course William Derby that York would be unable to salvage anything of its planned four-day festival, the British Horseracing Authority found temporary homes for the flagship races Friday and Saturday. Late yesterday afternoon, the news came through that Newmarket would stage the G1 Juddmonte International S. on Saturday and the festival's other top-level contests--the Darley Yorkshire Oaks and Coolmore Nunthorpe S .-- on its Friday card. That day will also feature the DBS £300,000 St Leger Yearling S. as part of an 11-race card. Goodwood's Saturday card will feature the G2 Great Voltigeur S., while the the G2 Gimcrack S. and prestigious Ebor H. are re-routed to Newbury's Friday card, with the latter contest being re-named the Newburgh H. Earlier, Derby had spoken of the unprecedented abandonment. "It is obviously disappointing, both for the connections of the horses and the whole team, so I am so sorry about that," he said. "It's hugely frustrating and to be beaten by the elements is a very humbling experience." Newmarket Racecourse will stage an extra three Group 1 races and a £300,000 sales contest over August 22-23 after the abandonment of York's four-day Ebor meeting. Newmarket's Director of Racing Michael Prosser said, "Firstly, it is important to stress that all of us would have wished for these races to have been staged at York--their rightful home. Once it became apparent that the weather had affected their race programme, our position was we would help the BHA in any way they required. As such, three Group 1s and the DBS sales' race are additions to our two-day fixture. With Newbury and Goodwood also re-scheduling additional races, the BHA has worked tirelessly with industry representatives to pull everything together."



Gran Premio General San Martin cont.

Estrellas Classic winner Flag Copado proved that his victory in Argentina's equivalent of the Breeders' Cup Classic was no fluke, as he delivered another sizzling performance in winning the G1 Gran Premio General San Martin in track-record time. Sent off as the slight choice over top miler Bahiaro, the Flag Down horse sat just off the pace in third along the inside under 21-year-old Gustavo Calvente before rallying in midstretch and reeling in Estrellas Mile winner Bahiaro in the final furlong for the victory. The Roberto Pellagata trainee completed the nine-furlong race on the dirt in 1:45.34, which shattered the previous record of 1:45.89 set by Le Pont Neuf eight years ago. Flag Copado recorded his second consecutive Group 1 win after exiting a nine-length victory in the G1 Gran Premio Estrellas Classic at Palermo June 28.

Wait a While, the champion three-year-old filly of 2006, tired to seventh as the favorite in the July 26 GI Diana H. That race was the gray mare's first start in five months, and trainer Todd Pletcher is looking for a stronger effort in her second start off the layoff. "She has trained well since the Diana," reported Pletcher. "I still thought she ran well in that race. She was pretty wide on both turns. The biggest thing was that she had not run in a while. I am expecting her to move ahead from that." Since winning the GII Jenny Wiley S. at Keeneland in April, Rutherienne has put together a string of third-place efforts; in the May 26 GI Gamely, June 21 GIII All Along Breeders' Cup and, most recently, in the Diana. She captured the GIII Lake George over this course and trip last year.

Sadler Barn Raided:

Trainer John Sadler, who won the Hollywood Park spring/summer meet training title and is currently leading that division at Del Mar, had his barn raided on Monday, according to published reports. The raid was launched by the CHRB after the Southern California trainer turned up with an undisclosed number of positive results for anabolic steroids since official testing for the banned substances began Aug. 1. According to Sadler's lawyer Donald Calabria, the trainer is considering a lawsuit against the CHRB. Horsemen were granted a grace period of 30 days to comply with new regulations regarding steriod use, and beginning Sept. 4, trainers who violate the rules are subject to more stringent penalties, including suspension of the trainer and loss of purse for the owner. Dr. Rick Arthur, the racing board's equine medical director, informed the racing board's medication committee at a meeting Tuesday that in the month of July, 38 of 418 steroid tests were found to be in violation. Of those 38, "17 were with one trainer, and 11 with a second trainer," Arthur told the committee. "Two trainers have been responsible for 70 percent of the violations for anabolic steroids at Hollywood Park and Del Mar," Arthur told DRF. "The rest are a trainer here and there." According to Arthur, 97 percent of trainers are running clean presently, but noted that in anonymous tests conducted in March and April, about 60 percent of horses came back positive for anabolic steroids under the new standards. "We're certainly moving in the right direction," Arthur told Blood-Horse. "In the long run, this is beneficial to all concerned."


