ON TO DONCASTER

Following the resounding success at Deauville, Doncaster Bloodstock Sales takes up the baton today as it launches the first of Britain's yearling auctions.

While the three-day St Leger Sale no longer resides during the week leading up to the oldest Classic staged on nearby Town Moor, the decision to avoid a clash with Keeneland has led to an increased international presence. It has also led to a substantial hike in turnover and, from 2005 to 2007, the average of just under 25,000gns and median of 20,000gns climbed to over 35,000gns and 28,000gns, respectively. This year's edition follows hot on the heels of another high-profile victory for the sale as **Bushranger (Ire)** (Danetime {Ire}) captured the G1 Prix Morny on Sunday. In the process, Derrick Smith, Susan Magnier and Michael Tabor's colt became the third consecutive Leger graduate, after **Myboycharlie (Ire)** (Danetime {Ire}) and **Dutch Art (GB)** (Medicean {GB}), to take Deauville's premier juvenile contest. His purchase price of 100,000gns reflects the upturn in demand for choice yearlings here, as Myboycharlie and Dutch Art cost a mere 54,000gns and 16,000gns, respectively. However, the opportunity for a bargain is still alive and that was underlined by the exploits Saturday's G2 Lowther S. winner **Infamous Angel (GB)** (Exceed and Excel {Aus}), who demanded just 9,000gns a year ago.

Last year's one-two-three in the G1 2000 Guineas, **Cockney Rebel (Ire)** (Val Royal {Fr}), **Vital Equine (Ire)** (Danetime {Ire}) and the aforementioned Dutch Art, represented a peak for DBS before the sterling work was continued by the subsequent Group 1 winners **Excellent Art (GB)** (Pivotal {GB}), **Kingsgate Native (Ire)** (Mujadil) and **Dark Angel (Ire)** (Acclamation {GB}). The latter, who is already at stud, also registered success in this sale's £300,000 race staged during the York Ebor meeting.

That race, staged at Newmarket on Friday, was won by the 28,000gns purchase **Elnawin (GB)** (Elnadim) and his half-brother by the prominent first-season sire Kheleyf sells as hip 350 from Nelson Farm. Among the sires represented among the 500-strong catalogue are the sale's own graduates Acclamation (GB), Captain Rio (GB), Kyllachy (GB) and Monsieur Bond (Ire), as well as the heavyweights Danehill Dancer (Ire), Dansili (GB), and Invincible Spirit (Ire). Those with their first crop selling this year include Antonius Pius, Azamour (Ire), Dubawi (Ire), Footstepsinthesand (GB), Oratorio (Ire), Shamardal, Starcraft (NZ) and Whipper. "We were very encouraged by the results at Deauville, particularly as

people weren't very confident going into it due to the worldwide situation," DBS Managing Director Henry Beeby commented. "We have put together our best catalogue on paper and we feel that we have the individuals to match. It has been very busy today and we have received good feedback, so hopefully that will translate into a good trade. Bushranger has proven that this sale is all about quality and it is getting better and better every year." CURLIN READIES FOR WOODWARD In his final prep for Saturday's G1 Woodward S. at Saratoga, 2007 Horse of the Year **Curlin** (Smart Strike) breezed a



half-mile in :49.14 over the Oklahoma training track Monday morning. Under regular exercise rider Carmen Rosas, the four-year-old chestnut recorded splits of :13.01 and :24.98, galloping out in 1:04. The move was the fourth fastest of 25 at the distance. "He went really well--it was a nice, smooth half," said assistant

trainer Scott Blasi. "We're all excited about Saturday." According to Blasi, Curlin--who carries the colors of Jess Jackson's Stonestreet Stable--will jog today, have a light gallop tomorrow and be schooled in the gate on Thursday. "[Being at Saratoga] was a big contribution to how he performed last year going into the fall and the Breeders' Cup," explained Blasi. "Horses just do well up here. Oklahoma is a very good surface and we're fortunate to train over it."

OXX CONSIDERING STAR TARGETS Trainer John Oxx has outlined provisional plans for ☆ **"TDN Rising Stars"** ☆ **Arazan (Ire)** (Anabaa) and **Sea The Stars (Ire)** (Cape Cross {Ire}) and has not ruled out a clash between the two in the G1 National S. at The Curragh Sept. 14. His Highness The Aga Khan's Arazan was an impressive maiden winner at Leopardstown May 28 and followed up with an imperious performance on heavy going in the G2 Futurity S. at The Curragh Saturday. "Arazan is fine, no problems," Oxx told *RTE Sport*. "He didn't have a hard race, even though the conditions were tough enough. It didn't take anything out of him, he lost little or no weight. The National S. in three weeks' time is the obvious next start for him, that will be the plan at the moment, although we haven't got any fixed plan. He might stop at that or have one more [race], but that would be the maximum." Christopher Tsui's Sea The Stars, a maiden winner at Leopardstown in his latest start Aug. 17, may also target the seven-furlong contest. He holds an alternative engagement in the G2 Beresford S.--also at The Curragh--two weeks later. "They are owned by different people so [racing against each other] wouldn't be a factor. We'll just have to see where it's right to run each horse," the trainer added. "We've got an open mind, we'll see how he goes, but Sea The Stars wouldn't like the ground too soft. We'll have to watch the weather a bit for him."

COINNOISSEUR OUT FOR SEASON Richard Green's G2 Coventry S. hero **Art Connoisseur (Ire)** (Lucky Story) has suffered a leg injury which has ended his season with immediate effect, according to trainer Michael Bell's official website michaelbellracing.com. "Art Connoisseur has sustained an injury to his off fore cannon bone," the trainer revealed. "Although it is not too serious it would be serious enough to explain his poor run on Friday and is enough to keep him off the track for the rest of the season. He will be back next season a stronger horse and could be aimed at the [G3] Craven S. [at Newmarket]." The bay had impressed when tearing up the straight six furlongs in the Royal Ascot contest June 17 and followed up with a second in the July 27 G1 Phoenix S. at The Curragh, but was below par when eighth in the rearranged G2 Gimcrack S. at Newbury last week.

YOUMZAIN'S ARC PLAN Trainer Mick Channon yesterday announced stable star **Youmzain (Ire)** (Sinndar {Ire}) will point straight to this term's Prix de l'Arc de Tiomphe at Longchamp Oct. 5. Successful in the June 29 G1 Grand Prix de Saint-Cloud, Jaber Abdullah's five-year-old hit the board for the second straight year when third in the G1 King George VI & Queen Elizabeth S. at Ascot last time July 26 and will attempt to improve on last term's runner-up finish in the Bois de Boulogne showpiece.

A few years ago, when discussing the concept of inbreeding to the great Danzig, I wrote:

"The potential problem of inbreeding to Danzig, of course, was one of soundness, or the lack of it. Remember, Danzig's exciting debut victory in the June of his two-year-old season was immediately followed by the discovery of bone chips.

"Away from the races for over 10 months, Danzig returned the following May to record two impressive allowance victories. Unfortunately, X-rays taken after his third success revealed that a slab fracture was developing in a knee and Danzig was forced into retirement before he had tackled stakes company."

I was quick to point out that Danzig's progeny have a reputation for being sounder than their sire--as you can see from Danzig's up-to-date statistics, which show that 77 percent of his 1074 named foals made it to the races and around 62 percent made it into the winner's circle. More to the point, more than 18 percent of Danzig's foals became stakes winners, with this extraordinary percentage representing a huge incentive for trying to reinforce his influence by inbreeding.

Inbreeding to Danzig is likely to become quite widespread in Europe, where the Thoroughbred population is steeped in the blood of the Claiborne superstar. The main European standard-bearers of the Danzig male line have been Danehill and Green Desert, both of whom are developed thriving male lines.

Fortunately, the racing records of both these stallions were reassuringly free of the soundness problems which beset their sire.

Despite being almost back at the knee, Danehill was sound enough to win the G1 Sprint Cup on his ninth and final appearance. Aidan O'Brien was asked to summarise the main virtues of Danehill's stock after Duke of Marmalade had recorded his fifth consecutive Group 1 victory in the Juddmonte International three days ago.

"I suppose it's their constitution--their toughness and their speed and their strength," he said. "They're three massive things--strength physically as well as mentally."

When prompted by the interviewer to add soundness to the list, O'Brien agreed:

"Obviously soundness. This horse [Duke of Marmalade] is a testimony to that, but that comes with strength."

Green Desert was another individual whose career was comparatively problem free. Sufficiently forward to make his juvenile debut in May, he was racing for the 14th time when he failed to handle the dirt in the following year's Breeder's Cup Sprint. Oddly, there were some distinct parallels between his career and that of Danehill a few years later. Both won the Free Handicap over seven furlongs before reaching the first three in the 2000 Guineas. Subsequent efforts over a mile convinced both sets of connections to return their Danzig colts to sprint distances and both collected a pair of important victories, including one in the Sprint Cup at Haydock.

With unsoundness apparently not a serious concern, breeders have been quick to try combining Danehill and Green Desert, and last week's results suggest that we will see much more of this inbreeding to Danzig in the future. Two of Europe's important juvenile events fell to colts which have sons of Danehill as their sire and daughters of Green Desert as their second dam, creating 3x4 inbreeding to Danzig.

Firstly, we saw Dansili's son Shaveel run over a clear-cut winner of the G2 Gimcrack S., and then Bushranger provided Danetime with his second successive victory in the G1 Prix Morny.

This type of cross had also hit the jackpot earlier this year when the G1 Coral-Eclipse was won narrowly by Mount Nelson. This four-year-old is by Rock of Gibraltar, another son of Danehill, and his third dam is by Green Desert.

In view of the concerns about soundness involved in inbreeding to Danzig, it is worth pointing out that the sires of these three group winners were all sound enough to undergo a thorough testing on the track, with Dansili, Danetime and Rock of Gibraltar respectively being veterans of 14, 15 and 13 races.

The reverse cross--a Green Desert stallion on mares with Danehill blood--is also sure to become popular. Cape Cross has already sired three stakes winners from his first five foals out of Danehill's daughters, these stakes winners being inbred 3x3 to Danzig. Arguably the best of them is Able One, a New Zealand-bred who won the G1 Champions Mile in Hong Kong last year, but the English-trained Crosspeace was much better than his listed winner-status suggests, as he achieved annual Timeform ratings of 116 and 118.

Cape Cross's talented miler Sentinelese is another inbred 3x3 to Danzig, but his second line comes via Polish Patriot rather than Danehill, and his Group 1-placed son Charlie Farnsbarns is inbred 3x4 to Danzig, his second line coming through Chief's Crown.

While we are on the subject of Cape Cross, he added another group winner to his collection when Russian Cross took Saturday's G2 Prix Guillaume d'Ornano and he was a bit unlucky not to add another group success the following day, when Treat Gently was second after being hampered in the Prix de la Nonette. The Darley stallion's fee jumped from €20,000 to €50,000 in 2005, so his current crop of juveniles is the subject of high expectations. It is encouraging that two of his sons--Sea The Stars and War Native--recently achieved ☆ **"TDN Rising Star"** ☆ status.

Another of Green Desert stallions, Kheleyf, is also likely to have his fee raised substantially after the success he has enjoyed with his first runners. He currently heads the British and Irish freshman sires' table both by number of winners and prize money.

With Oasis Dream maintaining his position as one of the most successful second-crop sires, with five first-crop group winners, Green Desert has a powerful team of young stallion sons, which also includes Invincible Spirit. This Irish National Stud resident did so well with his early crops that his fee now stands at €75,000. Yet another son, the undervalued Desert Style, is again demonstrating his ability to come up with the occasional top performer, this time with the impressive seven-furlong specialist Paco Boy.

Perhaps these sons have taken some of the attention away from Green Desert, whose fee was as high as £85,000 in 2004 (when he was 21) and 2005. Whatever the reason, he appears to be another of those stallions whose results have declined in old age. His last Group 1 winners, Oasis Dream and Desert Lord, were born in 2000 and his last five crops of racing age have so far produced nothing more than a pair of Group 3 winners. But we can happily forgive him those recent failings in view of his growing impact as a sire of sires.

At the conclusion of the first day of selling, 145 yearlings sold for \$1,718,200, up from 121 head bringing \$1,331,600 last term. Provenance

The victory of **Pioneerof the Nile** in yesterday's seventh race at Saratoga represents a milestone for Ahmed Zayat's Zayat Stables, becoming the very first homebred winner for the operation.

The story of Zayat Stables as breeder began in 2005, when it went to \$680,000 to acquire the Gone West colt Forefathers as a Fasig-Tipton Saratoga yearling. At the time, Zayat Stables didn't own a single broodmare. A few months later, however, Sohby Sonbol, vice president of Zayat Stables, noticed that Forefathers's dam, the stakes-winning Lord at War (Arg) mare Star of Goshen, had failed to meet her reserve at the Keeneland November sale. She went unsold at \$160,000 with Pioneerof the Nile in utero. Soon after, Zayat purchased Star of Goshen and her winning daughter Regala Di Trieste (Old Trieste) privately as part of a package. Regala Di Trieste was in foal to Gulch at the time; the resulting foal, a two-year-old named Galloping Gulch, is in training with Steve Asmussen.

"Gary Bisantz had them," said Sonbol. "He didn't have much luck with the first two foals out of Star of Goshen, and thought maybe somebody else would be lucky with her. And that's what happened. Forefathers turned out to be a very nice horse--he's graded stakes placed--and this horse looks like he's the genuine article. Bill Mott loved him the whole time, and we liked him enough to breed the mare back to Empire Maker this spring."

Star of Goshen currently has a yearling Fusaichi Pegasus filly, but slipped to Distorted Humor and had no offspring this year. Regarding the choice of stallions, Sonbol commented, "We noticed that Mr. Prospector on top of Lord at War had worked very well--with horses like E Dubai and War Emblem--and so we've stuck to that cross."

The initial plan wasn't to keep and race Pioneerof the Nile. He was put through last year's Keeneland September sale, but bidding stalled out at \$290,000 and Zayat opted to buy him back. "He was maybe a little immature at the time--he's a May foal and was actually born on the same day that Barbaro won the Kentucky Derby--but he still was very classy," said Sonbol.

That class shone through yesterday, when he rallied to take his second start going lawn on the grass. Despite the sharp effort, Sonbol doesn't think the colt's future will necessarily be on that surface.

"He trains very well on the dirt," said Sonbol. "The only reason we ran him on the grass is because he just can't go six furlongs. We're thinking for his next spot either the GI Lane's End Breeders' Futurity [on the Polytrack] at Keeneland [Oct. 4], or the GIII Pilgrim BC S. [on the grass at Belmont Sept. 28]. After that, hopefully he takes us to the Breeders' Cup--we're very excited about him. It's a special feeling when it's a homebred." -LM

KHRC Approves Steroid Ban:

The Kentucky Horse Racing Commission yesterday unanimously approved the recommendations of the Kentucky Equine Drug Research Council that would ban the use of steroids in horses racing in the state. Kentucky's proposed regulation would classify steroids as Class B drugs, with violations carrying licence suspensions of up to 60 days. Therapeutic use of allowable steroids would have to be reported to Kentucky's Equine Medical Director, Dr. Mary Scollay, and horses under treatment would not be permitted to race within 60 days of treatment, and until the Kentucky Horse Racing Commission receives a clean drug test on that horse. The regulation now goes before Gov. Steve Beshears, who is expected to take quick action on the measure.
