DUBAWI COLT LIGHTS UP LEGER OPENER

Darley's Dubawi (Ire) provided the highlight of Day 1 of Doncaster's St Leger Sale when a colt from his first crop sold for £220,000. Charlie Vigors' Hillwood Stud consigned the January-foaled bay as hip 38; the ath-

letic colt is out of Hasten (Lear Fan), a half to 2003 G3 Autumn S. winner and G1 Racing Post Trophy runner-up Fantastic View and this year's G2 Superlative S. second-place finisher Weald Park. It was Malih al Basti who saw off Angus Gold to prevail and provide Vigors with a handsome return on the 55,000 guineas paid at Tattersalls December.

Rathbarry Stud's Acclamation (GB), who also sold at this sale, provided the main focus away from the day's topper with a pair of colts in demand. From the draft of Brian Grassick's Newtown Stud, hip 58 sold to Richard O'Gorman Bloodstock



Sprint winner Gulch and GI Preakness S. hero Summer Squall (video) launched their careers in the Hopeful in the '80s. Foolish Pleasure preceded his 1975 Kentucky Derby win with a tally in the Hopeful at two, while the '60s saw horses of the ilk of Hail to Reason, Jaipur and Buckpasser take the prize. Nashua and Native Dancer won in the '50s, while Man o'War and the brilliant filly and eventual Kentucky Derby heroine Regret helped establish the race's importance with victories earlier in the century.

Regret's victory had a precedent. The inaugural edition of the Hopeful, contested in 1904, was won by **Tanya**, who captured the Belmont S. the following year and had the distinction of being the last filly do to so until Rags to Riches beat Curlin in 2007.

Notably, a total of 14 Hopeful winners have gone on to take the Test of the Champion at three. Afleet Alex was the most recent (<u>video</u>). He zigzagged his way to victory in the 2004 Hopeful, then put on a show for the ages when he dominated the Belmont by seven lengths in 2005. Cont. p4

DBS St Leger Yearling Sale cont.

Under hip 58's second dam is Firth of Fifth (Ire) (Traditionally), who captured last month's G2 Superlative S. at Newmarket. Late in the session, Angus Gold paid £150,000 for another of Acclamation's sons, consigned from Liam Cashman's stud as hip 159. Out of a half to the GSP Dunloskin (GB), his extended family includes the graded stakes scorer Mayoumbe (Fr).

Paul Thorman's Trickledown Stud consigned another highlight, hip 11, a son of Royal Applause (GB) out of the stakes-placed Frascati (GB) (Emarati). The yearling was knocked down to Tom Goff of Blandford Bloodstock for £115,000. Lodge Park Stud's hip 65, a son of Kheleyf, was the only other to achieve six figures when selling to Shadwell for £100,000. The Darley resident's first crop have made an instant impact, thanks mainly to the exploits of the top-class filly Percolator (GB), and Angus Gold was not to be denied for the half-brother to this year's Listed Jebel Ali Mile winner Jonquil (Ire) (Machiavellian).

Of the fillies, it was a daughter of Exceed and Excel (Aus) who shone from Denis Brosnan's Croom House Stud. Darley's first-season sire was put firmly on the map this weekend by G2 Lowther S. winner Infamous Angel (GB). Representing that sire was <u>hip 87</u>, out of a sister to the top-class sprinter Striking Ambition (GB), who sold to Amanda Skiffington with a bid of £90,000. Earlier, Frank Barry paid £80,000 for Pier House Stud's <u>hip 43</u>, a member of the first crop of the Tweenhills resident Trade Fair (GB), who is a half-sister to this year's G2 Prix Robert Papin and Weatherbys Super Sprint third Senor Mirasol (GB) (Deportivo {GB}) and the listed-placed Becher (GB) (Vettori {Ire}).



Recently, River Proud has provided a boost to the pedigree with a third in the latest running of the G1 Poule d'Essai des Poulains; he was also runner-up in last Saturday's G2 Prix Guillaume d'Ornano.

In recent years, however, the Hopeful has tended to be won by more early-developing, speedy types, and Afleet Alex's Belmont win snapped a long dry spell that dated back to 1978, the year **Affirmed** edged out Alydar in the Triple Crown. Ten months before that, the Affirmed/Alydar rivalry was just heating up (<u>video</u>). The Hopeful marked the third time the two future Hall of Famers faced each other. Earlier, Affirmed beat Alydar, who was making his career debut, in the Youthful S., while Alydar came back to take the Great American S. in July. By year's end, Affirmed had secured divisional honors by taking four of their six meetings.

Somewhat surprisingly for a race that continues to produce horses of the highest caliber, only three twoyear-old champions have won the Hopeful since Affirmed: the aforementioned Favorite Trick, who won in 1997 on his way to becoming the first juvenile since Secretariat to be honored as Horse of the Year; **Dehere** (<u>video</u>), whose Hopeful win in 1993 helped convince Eclipse voters that despite a well-beaten effort in the Breeders' Cup Juvenile, he indeed was the best two-year-old in the land; and **Chief's Crown**, who would go on to win the Juvenile after taking the Hopeful during a six-for-nine two-year-old year.

Who will win the 104th running of the Hopeful, and what will he go on to achieve afterwards? Only time will tell, but you can be sure the connections will be, um, optimistic, they have a good one on their hands.


First held in 1904, the Hopeful, according to the NYRA website, was so named because it was the first time two-year-olds were asked to tackle a distance longer than six furlongs in a stakes, and thus owners were 'hopeful' they had a Classic horse on their hands. Despite that claim, the race was held over six furlongs from its inaugural running through 1925, when it was first contested at 6 1/2 furlongs. In 1994, the race was changed to its present distance of seven furlongs.

HEROINE A LEGER PROBABLE The Tommy Stack-trained Unsung Heroine (Ire) (High Chaparral {Ire}) is on target to tackle the Sept. 13 G1 St Leger at Doncaster, according to trainer's son Fozzy Stack. The bay sophomore, who suffered an injury earlier in the year, made a belated winning debut at Fairyhouse July 17 before retaining her unbeaten record with an impressive score in the Aug. 8 G3 Give Thanks S. at Cork last time. "She's always shown plenty [at home], but she had a bit of bad luck in the spring when she stood on a hind joint and it was quite messy," explained Stack Jr. "She punctured a joint and had to spend a couple of weeks at the veterinary clinic to get it sorted out. She's done nothing wrong; we had her entered for the Irish Oaks and she missed that, but, luckily, we entered her for the Leger before she ran. With everything going according to plan, we're leaning towards running in the Leger as she only gets one crack at running in it. There is no reason why she shouldn't improve with age as she's guite tall and a light, narrow filly. Saying that, she's a good-looking filly, but to have a chance she'd have to improve again."



this outstanding son of Rahy, who continues to be one of our most prolific stallions," said Three Chimneys owner Robert Clay. "Lewis Michael ensures that the Rahy influence will continue for years to come." The bay is a son of MSW Justenuffheart, herself a halfsister to champion Kitten's Joy (El Prado {Ire}) and MGISW Precious Kitten (Catienus). "Lewis Michael is the full package that the middle market needs," said Three Chimneys President Case Clay. "Standing at over 16 hands, he is a big, solid horse that is exceptionally good-looking. His balance and scope, combined with a tremendous pedigree and quick turn of foot, will marry well with a wide variety of mares." A stakes winner at two, Lewis Michael was the runner-up in both the GII Peter Pan S. and GIII Perryville S. in 2006 and captured the 2007 GII Washington Park H.

THE CHEKA SOLARIO BOUND Anthony Pye-Jeary and Mel Smith's **The Cheka (Ire)** (Xaar {GB}), who earned **O "TDN Rising Star" O** status with a spectacular 10-length debut win at Ascot July 12, will make his next start in Saturday's G3 Solario S. at Sandown, according to trainer Eve Johnson Houghton. The bay juvenile missed his intended target, the G3 Acomb S., when that race became a casualty of York's washout last week. "We were absolutely delighted with his win at Ascot," Johnson Houghton told *PA Sport*. "It was very good. We thought he was pretty nice, and we've been delighted with him. I think Sandown should suit him as he's very easy and not much bothers him."

AGAIN HEADS MOYGLARE 17 Michael Tabor and Susan Magnier's G2 Debutante S. victress Again (Ire) (Danehill Dancer {Ire}) heads a cast of 17 entries for the G1 Moyglare S. at The Curragh Aug. 31. Her participation hinges on satisfying connections in a workout this week. "Again seems to be fine following her win at Leopardstown and the chances are that she will run on Sunday," trainer David Wachman told Racing Post. "She will do a bit over the next few days when I get home [from the Doncaster sales], and we'll see how she goes. I'm not sure yet who will ride her, as Johnny Murtagh and Wayne Lordan are both suspended." Lady Chryss O'Reilly's Debutante third Rare Ransom (GB) (Oasis Dream {GB}) may seek revenge on Again if the ground dries out enough. "Rare Ransom is a likely runner in the Moyglare at the weekend, and I am just hoping for a dry week," trainer Dermot Weld told PA Sport. "She ran well enough in the Debutante, but the ground was heavy that day, and I think she will be more effective on quicker ground." The going at the Co. Kildare track is currently described as 'soft' on the round course and 'heavy' on the straight course. Other notable entries for the seven-furlong contest include Sheikh Hamdan bin Rashid Al Maktoum's unbeaten Listed Saoire S. heroine Shimah (Storm Cat) and Jackie Bolger's dual Group 3 winner Cuis Ghaire (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}).

SUPERMARKET TIME

There have been mixed messages from the yearling sales so far this year: the three Fasig-Tipton sales (including the New York-bred sale) were down 16 percent in gross, though just 3 percent in average; Deauville, up 7 percent in gross and 13 percent in average; followed by OBS, off a massive 35 percent in gross and 18 percent in average (though, fortunately for OBS, they way outperformed the rest of the North American Two-Year-Old market earlier this year). Going into this week's sales at Fasig-Tipton Texas (finished yesterday) and Doncaster (started yesterday), the yearling market so far is down 11 percent in gross, but up 8 percent in average, with a hefty 17 percent fewer yearlings sold, and a drop in the clearance rate (from those catalogued) from 64 percent to 58 percent. Seven of every 12 catalogued have been sold through the ring, five haven't.

Assuming that Deauville bucked the trend on the plus side (sale on the up), and OBS the same on the minus (concentration of the domestic yearling market in Kentucky), the message from the sales so far seems to be: those which do get sold are holding their value, but fewer are getting sold. But what does this mean for the 5,555-horse Keeneland September sale, the world's biggest yearling supermarket?

We must first keep in mind that Sheikh Mohammed scaled back his spending at last September's sale, pretty much singlehandedly accounting for a 20-percent drop in Book 1 gross, \$182 million in 2006 to \$145 million in 2007. Though the sale recovered strongly in its remaining sessions, the overall gross was off \$15 million, or 4 percent, from \$399.7 million in 2006 to \$385 million last year. If Sheikh Mohammed re-enters the September market (and he has been plenty active in the yearling market so far this year) at least to some extent, and the overall market is down 15 percent (that's what I'd say if I was an economic forecaster), I would forecast that Book 1 revenues should be about the same as last year: \$145 million. I'd expect the whole sale to produce revenues around \$350 million, which would be off just under 10 percent from last year, and off by 12 or 13 percent from the 2006 record of just short of \$400 million.

Of course, one feature of the markets the last 10 years has been the sheer volume of yearlings by the better (or more fancied) sires. The accompanying tables (p9-10) provide some detail on all sires with one or more yearlings in Books 1 and 2. For those with three-year-olds (first foals 2005) and up of 2008, their key Midyear 2008 APEX ratings are included. This information was tabulated on July 31, and includes racing data from Jan. 1, 2002--July 31, 2008.

To very briefly refresh your memories, APEX index ratings (1.00 is always average for the sires covered, in this case 1,096 of them with 10 or more three-yearolds of 2008) are a sort of enhanced average-earnings index, but also capable of measuring sires' progeny performance in different Regions (North America, Europe, and Japan), and at different ages (two through five-plus). The current world leader by the signature A Runner Index (top 2-percent earners) is A.P. Indy (5.27).

The runaway leader by number catalogued in Books 1 and 2 is **Giant's Causeway** (78). With 2005 European Classic winners Shamardal and Footstepsinthesand in his first crop, and a top American two-year-old in First Samurai in his second, Giant's Causeway's stud fee had shot up to \$300,000 by the beginning of the 2006 breeding season. So not only are there a lot of them, they will also be very well bred. Though he ranked number three on the North American General Sire List last year and is number four this year, he has possibly been somewhat a victim of commercial overexposure. He will never have a better-bred crop, but there could still be plenty of nice ones selling at or around his 2006 stud fee.

Unbridled's Song (61) is the only other sire with more than 50 catalogued in Books 1 and 2, followed by two sons of Gone West, **Elusive Quality** and **Mr. Greeley**, with 47 each, and another grandson of Mr. Prospector, **Distorted Humor**, with 46. **Cont. p8**

Seven other sires have more than 30 each catalogued in Books 1 and 2, headed by top first-year sire **Ghostzapper** and **A.P. Indy** (37 each). **Storm Cat** has 34 in Book 1, while **Forestry** (35), **Dynaformer** (33), **Gone West** himself (33) and **Empire Maker** (32) are also in the thirties.


Among first-year sires, **Ghostzapper** (Awesome Again) is the leader, as mentioned, with 37 catalogued in Books 1 and 2. Afleet Alex (Northern Afleet) (26), Rock Hard Ten (Kris S.) and Saint Liam (Saint Ballado) (21 each, the latter from his only crop) are the other major first-year sires in the first two books, although Grade I winner Eddington (Unbridled) has 11 catalogued and Roman Ruler (Fusaichi Pegasus), a half-brother to El Corredor, has eight. Among the second-year sires, in other words 'freshman' sires, with their first two-year-olds, Smarty Jones (Elusive Quality) (23) is the leader in number catalogued, followed by Medaglia d'Oro (El Prado {Ire}) (18), Speightstown (Gone West) (17), Strong Hope (Grand Slam) (15), and North America's current leading freshman sire, Lion Heart (Tale of the Cat) (11).


Of the sires with their first three-year-olds, the crop's three commercial leaders have the most catalogued in Books 1 and 2: Empire Maker (32), Vindication (28), and Mineshaft (27). The two Airdrie sires which have claimed the crop's progeny earnings leadership thus far, Harlan's Holiday and Proud Citizen, have 10 and six, respectively, in Books 1 and 2. Each stood for \$17,500 in 2006. Among the sires with their first four-year-olds this year, not surprisingly Johannesburg (22) and Street Cry (19) are the leaders in number catalogued; while, of those with their first five-year-olds, America's current number two sire, Tiznow (25), and the resurgent Songandaprayer (15) have the most catalogued in Books 1 and 2. So, like I say every year at this time: good hunting, and keep your hands in the air!



Sept. 3 at 6:30 p.m., and the second and final session will be held Thursday, Sept. 4 at 10:00 a.m. All the leading consignors will be present, including major domestic vendors Gestut Auenquelle, Gestut Fahrhof, Gestut Karlshof and Gestut Wittekindshof. Prominent sellers from abroad are led by Mount Coote Stud. Newsells Park Stud and Haras du Petit Tellier. The percentage of group-race performers on the catalogue pages is the highest ever. Highlights of this year's edition will include a septet of yearlings--six colts and a filly--on offer by German sire sensation Monsun (Ger), who was responsible for the two sales-topping colts last year. German bloodstock has gone from strength to strength in the past decade, and proved it could compete on the internationalstage when Manduro (Ger) was rated the highest racehorse in the world last year. Regulations in German breeding are very strict, requiring a healthy genetic background and sound conformation. In addition, there is no racing on medication in Germany.

How It All Began...

The Baden-Baden Sales Company has gradually worked its way up the ranks in the Thoroughbred bloodstock industry and took a giant step forward in the past decade on its way to international recognition. The very first yearling sales were held at Gestut Romerhof in the 1920s. In the early 1960s, the passionate breeder Baron Alfred von Kapherr and the breeding expert Ferdinand Leisten had the idea of setting up a public auction, and soon enjoyed the support of some of the major stud operations such as Schlenderhan, Rottgen, Zoppenbroich and Waldfried. The new company was named Deutimex, and a date was fixed for the summer race meeting at Baden-Baden, which always attracted a large attendance from all over Europe. The company leased some land near the racetrack's home turn and a stabling complex of 50 boxes along with a parade ring was built. The inaugural sale was held in 1963.

In the following years, the yearling sale, held on the Thursday during the week of the summer race meeting at Baden-Baden, gained a solid reputation and a growing attendance. The late Ferdinand Leisten was the company's chairman and also served as an auctioneer, and his unique performances on the rostrum are still a vivid memory for those who witnessed him in action. In 1972, a second company under the name of "Verein zur Forderung der Vollblutzucht"--VFV--was founded, with the internationally minded and leading racing journalist Philip Alles as its initiator. The partners included leading studs Bona, Erlengrund, Fahrhof and Romerhof. The acreage of leased land was increased and a new stabling complex complete with parade rings was set up. The VFV sale was tradionally held on a Saturday, which was the eve of the summer race meeting's highlight, the Grosser Preis von Baden.

Leisten, a major influence in the development of the domestic breeding industry, resigned his position in 1994 and Karl-Dieter Ellerbracke took over as his successor. Two years earlier, the BBAG had conducted its first Autumn Mixed Sale with broodmares, weanlings, yearlings and horses in and out of training, and the sale grew in quality and quantity. The inaugural Breeze-Up Sale was held in 1995 during the spring race meeting at Baden-Baden. Another major factor in increasing the BBAG profile was the creation of highly valuable auction races for two- and three-year-olds.

The Yearling Sale gradually improved its standing, with many of the younger stud operations breeding solely for this market, and this led to a logical requirement for updated facilities. With Ellerbracke at the helm, the modern sale complex, with its expanded stabling capacities, was unveiled during the Yearling Sale in 1999. This feat, along with the gradual acceptance of foreign consignors, has led to an increasing recognition of the Baden-Baden Sales on the international Thoroughbred sales calendar. The first fruit of this policy shift was the record-priced yearling of 2004, an Acatenango (Ger) colt which realised €400,000. He was knocked down to leading English agent John Ferguson, acting on behalf of Sheikh Mohammed's Godolphin operation, with the Wertheimer Brothers as the underbidder. This trend has continued and, just last year, Gestut Brummerhof sold a pair of colts by Monsun (Ger) for \in 710,000 and \in 430,000. The former went to Baron Georg von Ullmann, while the latter was secured by Shadwell Estate.

"In the past decade, the BBAG has strived to meet the international requirements of a modern sale complex as well as other supporting facilities, and the German Thoroughbred Breeding Industry can look back on an excellent year in 2007," said Karl-Dieter Ellerbracke, president of BBAG. "Manduro, the world's best racehorse, is a German-bred and this achievement is even more remarkable considering that Germany has far fewer broodmares than countries like England, France or Ireland. We are extremely proud to say that this top international performer is a BBAG Yearling Sales Graduate. This kind of success has a solid background. German breeders having increasingly bred for quality, while the handling and equipment on the respective stud farms have been upgraded to reach an international standard. Most importantly, Germany has the strictest and most strongly enforced regulations on drugs and doping in the whole world. Absolutely no drugs or medication are allowed in races. Even if a stallion prospect has raced under medication only once in his career it will mean that he can never stand at stud in this country. Many foreign breeders envy us for these strict regulations which have led to the German Thoroughbred being especially tough, healthy and capable performers."



Leading Baden-Baden Yearling Sales graduates include 10 German Derby winners, as well as multiple Classic and Group 1 scorers at home and abroad, headed by Manduro (Ger), his sire Monsun (Ger) and Tiger Hill (Ire). A Short Trip Through History...

The history of the Grosser Preis von Baden and the Baden-Baden races traces back to 1858. Since then, the Grosser Preis von Baden and Baden-Baden itself have been the most popular race and racecourse in Germany. It is nestled between the Rhine, the source of all German romance, and the Black Forest. The meeting was originally run under the aegis of the French Societe Sportive d'Encouragement, because the German Jockey Club, then based in Berlin, did not take it seriously. As with many other courses, the reason for the building of the racecourse was to provide an adjunct to the town's major attraction, the Casino. The franchise for the latter was held by a Frenchman, Edouard Benazet, who decided that his guests needed some innocent entertainment during the daylight hours before the Casino's evening diversions began.

Although the racing was successful, it fell victim to international politics. The Franco-Prussian war of 1870-71 took place precisely that part of the world--the Alsace-Lorraine-Bavarian border--and racing was discontinued until that particular dispute had been settled. The outcome naturally meant that the French authorities could not easily continue running the track, so the Internationaler Club Baden-Baden was born--a gathering of some of the highest nobility based in Baden-Baden at the time--and that body still organizes racing.

Iffezheim racetrack, with its special charm, is situated some eight miles west of the town centre near the village of Iffezheim. The daunting splendour of the Black Forest lies in front of the visitors. The course has often been compared to Deauville because it offers the same relaxed holiday atmosphere--one is not just there to race, but also to enjoy the antiquity of the course and the buildings--and to Ascot because of the elegance of the spot. The course opens early in the morning and, as you have the famous breakfast in the stands, you can view the horses being exercised on the course, surely the best way for a racing fan to come to grips with the early hours.

The international flavour of the racing reflects the character of Baden-Baden. The style of the architecture in the town proper is Franco-Italian, whilst English is to be heard everywhere. The stock of the spa town has risen considerably since the intrepid Monsieur Benazet began his adventure. The latest achievement is the festival hall, which can host up to 2,500 spectators, only exceeded by the Paris Opera in Europe. Edward VII, when Prince of Wales, was a frequent visitor to the town, and to this day European notables are often in evidence.

The track facilities provide spectators with every luxury they could expect on a racecourse, and combine an excellent view of the racing. All in all, there is little that one could fault about both the course and the welcome provided by the people from Baden, who flock to the course in greater numbers than any other German racecourse. Former U.S. President Bill Clinton tore a page out of the New York book of quotes when claiming Baden-Baden was so nice it had to be named twice, and the Spa on the fringes of the Black Forest justifies that accolade by serving up a double helping of the bloodstock experience next week. Racing makes way for an entire day of auction action on Thursday Sept. 4 before the twoyear-olds get their chance to contest Germany's first juvenile group race of the year, the 135th G3 Maurice Lacroix-Trophy over seven furlongs and valued at \in 90,000. The social gathering concludes with the track's annual highlight on Sunday Sept. 7, the 136th edition of the G1 Grosser Mercedes-Benz-Preis von Baden. This 10-furlong contest for three-year-olds and upwards carries a total purse of \in 250,000. --Christa Riebel.



TOBA Honors Sales Integrity Task Force:

The Thoroughbred Owners and Breeders Association announced that the 2008 Industry Service Award will go to the Sales Integrity Task Force. It will be presented at the TOBA National Awards Dinner Sept. 6 in Lexington, Kentucky. Reconvened in 2007, the SITF was intended to provide industry consensus on licensing of bloodstock agents and consignors, transparency in ownership and medication in the sales arena. The task force recommended a bloodstock agent code of conduct be added to the conditions of sale, voluntary ownership disclosure in an ownership registry, updated prohibited practices and exogenous anabolic steroid testing at the buyer's discretion; these recommendations have been adopted by Keeneland and Fasig-Tipton. Biancone Suspension Extended:

The Kentucky Horse Racing Commission has extended Patrick Biancone's suspension through Nov. 1, 2008, according to published reports. Biancone, suspended for six months--beginning Nov. 1, 2007-reached an agreement with the KHRC to wait a full year, from the initial suspension date, before resuming training horses. The current ruling was handed down after KHRC investigators determined that Biancone has been training horses at Hurricane Hall in Lexington, violating the terms of his suspension. Biancone, who agreed to the new terms, denies the charges leveled by the KHRC. Under the original terms handed down by the commission, Biancone was prohibited from training for six months and was banned from applying for a trainer's licence for an additional six months. However, he has bee given clearance to begin training on an offtrack property for private clients after Apr. 30, 2008. Biancone, who was suspended last year after investigators found vials of cobra venom in June at his Keeneland barn, will have to wait until Nov. 1, 2008 before restarting his training career.


