#### BENNY THE BULL RETIRED

IEAH Stable's **Benny the Bull** (Lucky Lionel--Comet Cat, by Birdonthewire), victorious in this year's G1 Dubai Golden Shaheen S., was discovered to have a chip in his right front ankle and has been retired from racing. Stud plans are pending for the five-year-old,

perfect in four starts this season. Bred in Florida by Tomoka Hills Inc., Benny the Bull was purchased by owner Greg James for \$38,000 out of the 2004 Keeneland September sale. The colt was turned over to Jeff Talley, for whom he won four of nine starts, including the 2007 lowa Sprint H. Acquired privately by IEAH off that effort, the dark bay was runner-up to Midnight Lute in the

GI Forego S. last September, fourth to the subsequent champion in the GI Breeders' Cup Sprint, and closed the year with a 1 1/4-length success in the GI DeFrancis Dash. An easy 4 1/2-length winner of the Sunshine Millions Sprint in his seasonal debut in January, Benny the Bull bested Breeders' Cup Sprint runner-up Idiot Proof in the Shaheen, then took his two post-desert appearances, the GII True North H. June 7 and the July 12 GII Smile Sprint H. "There are ups and downs in this game, but I don't even view this as a down," Mike lavarone, co-president of the IEAH, told *Daily Racing Form*. "The horse has retired without something terrible happening, and hopefully he'll live a happy and healthy life." Benny the Bull heads to the breeding shed with a record of 17-9-1-2 and earnings of \$2,221,630.

#### ALL ABOUT QUALITY

It was a son of Elusive Quality who shone brightest yesterday during the middle session of Doncaster's St Leger Sale, selling for £145,000 to Richard O'Gorman Bloodstock. Consigned as hip 245 by Brendan Holland's

Grove Stud, the sole representative of Darley's established star cost Holland \$55,000 as a Keeneland November weanling. Out of the 1991 G3 Molecomb S. winner Sahara Star (GB) (Green Desert), the colt is a half-brother to the 1997 G2 Flying Childers S. winner Land of Dreams (GB) (Cadeaux Genereux {GB}), who is herself the dam of Godolphin's smart

Into the Dark (GB). The family also includes the son of Danehill Dancer (Ire) who sold for £90,000 during Tuesday's first session as hip  $\underline{15}$ . Dick O'Gorman, who had been prominent on the opening day, denied trainer Bryan Smart to secure the February-foaled bay.

On a day when demand for colts dominated proceedings, an offering by Night Shift from the draft of Westerlands Stud, was the sole filly to make six figures. Richard Brown of Blandford Bloodstock went to £115,000 for hip 196, the half-sister to this year's G2 Richmond S. winner Profilic (Ire) (Compton Place {GB}) from the family of the 2000 G2 Royal Lodge S. winner Atlantis Prince (GB). Trainer William Knight was the underbidder.

No fewer than seven colts made £100,000, with a duo by Dansili (GB) providing an early focus. Highclere Stud's hip 178, from the family of group winners Polar Ben (GB) and Franklins Gardens (GB), was knocked down to trainer Charlie Egerton, while 11 lots later John O'Byrne outlasted Anthony Stroud to secure Catridge Farm Stud's colt, who was produced by a full-sister to the listed-placed Perfect Peach (GB) (Lycius).

## STILL A MAJOR PLAYER ON THE WORLD STAGE

THEATRICAL, America's Leading Active Sire of G1 Winners, was represented by his 77th Stakes winner on August 24th when DANCING ABBIE took the Erik O Steens Memorial. The 3YO filly had placed in the Italian Oaks (G2) earlier this year. Look for the following yearlings by Living Legend Theatrical at Keeneland September: 211, 415, 562, 595, 1304, 1358, 2098, 3660, 3886, 4471, 4854.

This sale's stalwart buyer Bobby O'Ryan paid £100,000 for Cloverdale Bloodstock's hip 261, an Acclamation (GB) colt out of a half to Bachir (Ire) (Desert Style {Ire}). That was followed seven lots later by Mario Hofer's purchase of Newsells Park Stud's son of Medicean (GB) and the 1999 GI Hollywood Starlet S. runner-up and GI Del Mar Debutante third She's Classy (Boundary).

During this spell of activity, trainer Howard Johnson became the fifth buyer to reach £100,000 on the day, going to that figure for hip 276, a colt from Eddie O'Leary's Lynn Lodge Stud. By Exceed and Excel (Aus), the colt's pedigree includes the listed scorer Barshiba (Ire), who was runner-up to Archipenko in Ascot's G2 Summer Mile last month.

Shadwell secured the final pair of hundred-granders. The operation staved off the opposition for hip 291, a Dixieland Band colt out of a stakes-winning three-parts sister to the graded stakes scorer Patience Game from the draft of Brendan Morrin's Pier House Stud. Shadwell also landed a Piccolo (GB) offering from Paul Thorman's Trickledown Stud. Hip 320 is from the extended family of Reprimand (GB) and proved the day's biggest pinhooking success, having been purchased for just 19,000 guineas at Tattersalls December.

Session average and median dipped slightly from 2007 figures, and DBS Managing Director Henry Beeby summarised briefly, "It was another cracking day full of competitive duels for the better horses." Selling continues at 11 a.m. today. Full results are available on www.dbsauctions.com.


Darley Stable's **Desert Party** (Street Cry {Ire}) tuned up for the Hopeful yesterday morning at Saratoga,



Let go at 7-1 this time, the Fox Ridge homebred was allowed to settle into stride after getting bumped at the start. The bay was full of run whilst stuck behind a wall of horses in midstretch, and bulled his way through determinedly to post a 1 1/4-length success. Our Golden Dream's owners, John Confort and Albert Weis, were on hand to watch the filly race, as was her breeder, Gallagher's Stud owner Marlene Brody. According to Gallagher's Stud manager Mallory Mort, the filly was a standout from her early days. "She was a big, nice foal and she turned into a very nice yearling," said Mort. "We thought about putting her in the Selected sale [Fasig-Tipton Selected Sale at Saratoga], but decided on the Preferred [New York-bred sale] because we thought she'd be one of the top horses in there, and she was." He added, "She's really turned out to be exactly the sort of filly I thought she would be--she's got a lot of scope, a big barrel, and a lot of class and style. And boy, did she look great today--if there was a beauty contest in the paddock, she'd have won."

The filly hails from a family that has been very good to Gallagher's, the Upstate New York breeding and racing outfit begun by Mrs. Brody and her late husband, Jerome. The story traces back to a mare named Turn to Me (Cyane), whom the Brodys purchased, on the advice of Michael Motion, as a 17-year-old broodmare for \$105,000 at the 1982 Keeneland November Sale. Turn to Me produced exactly one foal for Gallagher's: a daughter of Riverman named Adorable Micol. But Adorable Micol turned out to be good one, Turn to Me's best offspring, in fact. She won a Grade III race in the U.S. and a stakes in France and banked nearly \$250,000.

As a broodmare for Gallagher's, Adorable Micol produced SW & GISP Adorydar (Alydar), GSW Adcat (Storm Cat), and Adorahy, dam of Icabad Crane and Our Golden Dream. In one of those funny twists, it was Michael Motion's son, Graham, who wound up training Icabad Crane

Adorable Micol's other offspring included the GSP Adoryphar, granddam of Rutherienne; and Le Chat (Storm Cat), a \$1.25 million two-year-old in training in 2000. Gallagher's sold the 16-year-old Adorable Micole, in foal to Gone West, to Brushwood Stable for \$600,000 at the 1999 November sale. -LM

#### NY State DOL Issues Report Critical of Wages:

The New York State Department of Labor issued a statement yesterday, claiming that backstretch workers at Saratoga Race Course are being underpaid and are often subjected to subpar living conditions. "When the lights go out at Saratoga Race Course and the crowds are long gone, backstretch workers are still there--day in, day out--to make sure that every horse is properly cared for," said State Labor Commissioner M. Patricia Smith. "We believe that this investigation into the treatment of backstretch workers highlights conditions not only at Saratoga Race Course, but throughout the industry. As such, our message to trainers who employ backstretch workers across New York state is simple: comply and comply now." Officials at the New York Racing Association expressed their commitment to work with the New York State Racing and Wagering Board and the Department of Labor to protect the financial well-being of its backstretch workers. "Providing a safe, healthy and humane environment in which to work and live for the backstretch employees and their families is a core principle of the New York Racing Association," said NYRA President and CEO Charles Hayward, "NYRA shares Commissioner Smith's concern that workers who are employed by independent trainers on the backstretch are treated fairly and with dignity, both in respect to their living conditions and their ability to earn a living wage. NYRA has worked cooperatively with the Department of Labor during the course of this investigation, and NYRA will continue to cooperate with the Department as it works with [the New York Thoroughbred Horsemen's Association] and the Racing and Wagering Board to ensure that the trainers conduct their business operations in accordance with State laws and regulations." A recent investigation by the Department of Labor revealed that of 110 backstretch workers, including hot walkers, grooms and watchmen, fully 80 percent were underpaid, some earning as little as \$5.06 per hour, and most did not receive overtime. Many of those interviewed commented that their wages had remained the same for 10 to 20 years. Investigators also spoke with 88 trainers (out of 115) and found that of those, 77 were not keeping required time and payroll records. Preliminary plans call for the Department of Labor to host seminars on labor laws, perhaps at a NYRA facility, for all trainers doing business in New York State.



GEOFF WRAGG TO CALL IT A DAY Geoff Wragg, elder statesman of the Newmarket training establishment, is to relinquish his licence at the end of the current season and will thus bring down the curtain on a 55-year career. Taking over the reins from father Harry at the end of 1982, Wragg was an immediate success. He provided Lester Piggott with a record eighth G1 Epsom Derby victory when saddling Teenoso to win a rain-affected 1983 renewal. The partnership struck again in the following season's King George VI & Queen Elizabeth [Diamond] S., when Piggott executed perfect tactics to stave off the attention of an array of stars in the midsummer showpiece, and held on to best subsequent super sire Sadler's Wells. The trainer was unable to add to his sole Derby victory, but did add another King George win when Pentire (GB) gained compensation for his narrow 1995 defeat with success in the following year's edition. Pentire also secured the 1995 G1 Irish Champion S. at Leopardstown. Other notable highlights of the trainer's career include wins for Arcadian Heights (GB) in Royal Ascot's 1994 G1 Gold Cup, Marling (Ire)'s successes in the 1991 G1 Cheveley Park S. and 1992 G1 Coronation S. as well as victories in that latter event for Rebecca Sharp (GB) in 1997 and Balisada (GB) in 1999. Stable darling Marling also garnered the G1 Irish 1000 Guineas and G1 Sussex S. in 1992. Another multiple Group 1 winner to pass through the Abington Place gates was First Island (Ire), who garnered the G1 Sussex S. in 1996 and the 1997 G1 Lockinge S. Wragg, also a dab hand with sprinters, sent out First Trump (GB) to win the 1993 G1 Middle Park S. by a head from stablemate **Owington (GB)**. The latter gained his own top-level success in the following season's G1 July Cup. North America also proved to be within bounds as evidenced by the 1989 win of Braiswick (GB) in the GI E.P. Taylor S. at Woodbine. In common with Wragg's trademark softly-softly approach, news of his retirement was typically understated. "Geoff is retiring at the end of the season," wife Patricia told Racing Post.

#### FREMANTLE STILL A LEGER POSSIBLE

Juddmonte Farms' **Doctor Fremantle (GB)** (Sadler's Wells) may yet make it to post for the G1 St Leger at Doncaster Sept. 13 despite bruising his foot earlier this month, according to racing manager Teddy Grimthorpe. The bay homebred's injury forced a missed engagement in the ultimately rerouted G2 Great Voltigeur S. last week and he will not have an interim run if lining up for the world's oldest Classic. "He's coming on all right, and we are hopeful of getting him there," Grimthorpe told *PA Sport*. "Obviously, he won't get a run before the Leger. It is a very delicate balance in that I don't want to say, Don't worry, he'll make it, easy peasy,' but equally I don't want to put everyone completely away. At the moment we are hopeful of getting him there."



ARTIST ON THE WARPATH Newmarket trainer James Eustace has revealed ambitious plans for stable star War Artist (Aus) (Orpen), and is hopeful the former South African sprinter can kick start his campaign with victory in the Sept. 6 G1 Haydock Sprint Cup. Last year's G1 Mercury Sprint hero has just failed at the highest level this term, finishing second in the June 21 G1 Golden Jubilee S. at Royal Ascot and a last-out third in the G1 July Cup at home track Newmarket July 11. "He really deserves to win a big one and, hopefully, he can do that at Haydock," Eustace told Attheraces. "He has been very consistent at the top level and he ran a great race at Ascot. We had a good draw and Takeover Target gave us a good lead, but Kingsgate Native came and spoiled the party. I would at least like to have a go at turning the form around with him." War Artist's regular partner Kerrin McEvoy has now departed for Australia, so the Newmarket handler is keen to confirm a new jockey as soon as possible. "Ryan Moore rode the horse when he was second at Wolverhampton earlier this year, and he liked him," said Eustace. "He would be the obvious choice, although it all depends on if he is available." Once Haydock has been negotiated, Eustace will look further afield for five-year-old's subsequent targets. "It is a possibility he could go to the Far East, but just a possibility at this stage. We may decide to go west rather than east, as there is a race at Woodbine called the Nearctic S. and he could then go for the Breeders' Cup Turf Sprint. There is even the Breeders' Cup Sprint to consider, so there are plenty of options."
