




**Undefeated SOUTHERN EXCHANGE Runs** Today in the Del Mar Futurity (G1) (see p. 4)

#### F-T RESTRUCTURES MANAGEMENT TEAM

Today's closing day of the current Del Mar meeting features the GI Del Mar Futurity, and the seven-furlong test has drawn 11 runners in a competitive renewal.

Tabbed as the morning-line favorite is Kelly Leak (Runaway Groom), who crossed the wire first in two lifetime starts, including the GII Best Pal S. over this track Aug. 10. Despite getting the best of Azul Leon (Lion Heart) and Coronet of the Baron Southern Exchange M. Burns (Pure Prize) at the end of that 6



#### UNDER-TACK SHOWS CHANGES ANNOUNCED

The four major U.S. Thoroughbred auction companies--Barretts, Fasig-Tipton, Keeneland and Ocala Breeders' Sales Company--have announced that they are making significant changes relating to preview shows leading up to their two-year-olds-in-training sales. Beginning next year, the use of whips by riders will be strictly regulated during under-tack shows, with the option of stiff penalties and/or suspensions possible for riders who do not follow the guidelines. Additionally, the use of front toe grabs will also be eliminated, in accordance with recommendations from The Jockey Club's Thoroughbred Safety Committee now being widely adopted by the racing industry. "The focus on safety and soundness issues within our industry brought us together and we forged a united front to introduce important changes in the way under-tack shows are conducted," commented Mike O'Farrell, chairman of OBS. "The changes we have enacted can only enhance for buyers the reputation and image of the two-year-olds in training sales program." O'Farrell noted that all four sales companies have been in recent discussions, along with two-year-old consignors, and have worked expeditiously to reach a consensus. The first sale to operate with these new regulations will be the OBS Selected Two-Year-Olds in Training Sale Feb. 10, 2009.



#### Pride to Fasig-Tipton...

The newest addition to the Fasig-Tipton team, Dan Pride, served as chief operating officer of Darley USA, before making the move to the Fasig-Tipton company, which was purchased by the Dubai-based company Synergy earlier this spring. "I think it's a positive move for the future of the company," said Browning. "The addition of somebody with the talent, the desire and the drive of somebody like Dan Pride will be a very valuable addition to an already very committed and dedicated management team and staff. We're thrilled to have Dan join us, and we are hoping to continue the service element and try and enhance the overall customer experience. We would like to develop new customers and take Fasig-Tipton to greater heights than it has every achieved before." As for the day-to-day operation of the company, Browning added, "You probably won't be able to see any dramatic changes in the near future, but what we are hoping to do is to utilize his talents, and the talents of our other employees, and be more active and concise with our efforts and to deliver a better product for buyers and sellers alike. I view this as an opportunity to improve our sales and we are going to make every effort to do that." Pride, who served at Darley USA for the past six years, is expected to start as soon as possible. "Obviously, there are some transitional issues that will take a few days, but we are looking forward to Dan being on Newtown Pike on a full-time basis," said Browning.

#### TAIT TAKES OVER AS COO OF DARLEY USA

Olly Tait, currently managing director of Darley Australia, will take over the post of chief operating officer at Darley USA following the move of Dan Pride to Fasig-Tipton. "Olly brings with him international experience having served at the highest level in Europe and Australia," said Darley's John Ferguson. "He has looked after Sheikh Mohammed's bloodstock operations in Australia very successfully and has been instrumental in the development of Darley in that region." Tait, who has been serving at the Australian arm of the operation following a stint at the KPMG in Sydney, is expected to arrive in the United States this week. "I am hugely fortunate to be given this opportunity by Sheikh Mohammed and I am looking forward to the fresh challenges that the role will bring." As for the post vacated by Pride, Darley America President Jimmy Bell offered, "Dan Pride, who has spent six years with Darley, will be a hard act to follow. He has made a huge impact during his tenure and we are all very sad to lose him, but have no doubt that he will be a great success in his new career. Olly has proved himself to be ideally suited to the role and we look forward to seeing him in Lexington this weekend."

Successful in the G3 Supreme S. on this day last year, Lovelace was unable to get his head in front until bagging a valuable handicap at Sandown in his penultimate start July 5, and was just touched off in the July 11 Bunbury Cup at Newmarket last time. Reserved off the early pace here, the bay challenged widest of all approaching the final eighth and was ridden out in the closing stages to win a shade cozily. "He's shown good form over shorter distances, so our main concern was to conserve his energy," explained winning rider Jamie Spencer. "I decided to track Andreas Suborics [on Peace Royale], and it all went according to plan. I've now ridden him five times and have won four races, including a Group 3 and a Group 2, so let's see if we can win a Group 1 together. Hopefully, he'll now have a good autumn campaign." 

O'BRIEN & O'DONOGHUE TO FACE JUDDMONTE ENQUIRY Following a week of intense scrutiny by the British media, the British Horseracing Authority has announced it will ask trainer Aidan O'Brien and jockey Colm O'Donoghue to face a disciplinary panel with regard to possible breaches of the 'team tactics' rule during the running of the G1 Juddmonte International at Newmarket Aug. 23. "We have completed the review process and written to Aidan O'Brien and Colm O'Donoghue confirming that they will need to appear before the Disciplinary Panel in connection with a possible breach of Rule 153(iv) in the Juddmonte International, said the BHA's Paul Struthers. "We are obviously conscious of the interest this will generate, but, having reviewed the video and read comments attributed to Johnny Murtagh in the press, it was felt that a formal enquiry into the incident had to be held. This will ensure that the matter is considered thoroughly, fairly and openly. This is the first time we have reviewed a race for a possible breach of 'team tactics' since the rules changed in 2007, and we are satisfied that there has been no other race where an enquiry should have been held. I would also like to make clear that there is no possibility of the result of the Juddmonte International being affected." The race, which was won by Ballydoyle star Duke of Marmalade (Ire) (Danehill), sparked debate which questioned the riding performance of O'Donoghue aboard Red Rock Canyon (Ire) (Rock of Gibraltar {Ire}) as well as subsequent press comments attributed to winning jockey Johnny Murtagh.

ORIENTAL TIGER DRUG POSITIVE Oriental Tiger (Ger) (Tiger Hill {Ire}), an impressive seven-length winner of the Aug. 17 G1 Rheinland-Pokal at Cologne, looks set to be stripped of his career-high win after testing positive for a banned substance. Gestut Auenquelle's homebred is believed to have been treated with a drug containing a metabolyte of cortisone for an allergy to nettles, and the biological schedule for the treatment was compromised, leading to traces remaining in the five-year-old's system. The drug is not a painkiller, nor performance enhancing, but does contains cortisone, which is on the list of forbidden substances. Germany operates a zero-tolerance policy on all positive drugs tests. The 'A' sample has been confirmed positive; results of tests on the 'B' sample are expected today. Compounding Gestut Auenquelle's likely misery, Oriental Tiger has also suffered a hairline fracture and will be sidelined at least for the rest of this season. The runner-up in the Rheinland-Pokal was this season's G1 Deutsches Derby hero Kamsin (Ger)

(Samum {Ger}) will be promoted to first place in the

event of any disqualification.

(Fr) (Divine Light {Jpn}) remains on course to meet G1 2000 Guineas hero Henrythenavigator (Kingmambo) in this Sunday's G1 Prix du Moulin at Longchamp, according to Friborg's racing manager Patrick Barbe. "We have left her in the Moulin and she is a possibility to run, as long as the ground is not too soft. She is in very good condition and Christophe Lemaire should ride." The grey was second to Tamayuz (GB) (Nayef) in the Aug. 17 G1 Prix Jacques le Marois at Deauville where she was ridden by Yutaka Take. Henrythenavigator, a four-time Group 1 winner this term, charts a similar course into the one-mile contest as that of trainer Aidan O'Brien's only previous winner Rock of Gibraltar (Ire) (Danehill). The Ballydoyle conditioner is also hoping for sufficiently drying conditions to allow his star charge to run. There is a forfeit stage for the €400,000 contest today, which will erode the current list of 26 entries. followed by a €24,000 supplementary stage tomorrow.








#### ROSE HAYDOCK SUPPLEMENT CONFIRMED

# 'HUSSLER NAMED HORSE OF THE YEAR Sixtime Group 1 winner Weekend Hussler (Aus) (Hussonet) scooped the 2007-08 Australian Racehorse of the Year award at a function at the Palladium at Crown in Melbourne Monday night. The bay secured 82 percent of

award at a function at the Palladium at Crown in Melbourne Monday night. The bay secured 82 percent of the votes. With an overall record of 13-10-1-0 and earnings of A\$2,541,900, he is the first sophomore since Octagonal (NZ) (Zabeel {NZ}) in 1995-96 to achieve the top honor. Weekend Hussler mirrored the deeds of Kingston Town (Aus), the 1979-80 Horse of the Year at three, by winning six Group 1 races in a season. Last spring, the Ross McDonald trainee won the G1 Caulfield Guineas and the 1200-meter G1 Coolmore S. before returning in autumn to snare four straight Group 1 races: the Oakleigh Plate, Newmarket H., Randwick Guineas and George Ryder S. These performances resulted in Weekend Hussler being rated the world's equal best miler and second-best sprinter behind Hong Kong superstar Sacred Kingdom (Aus) (Encosta de Lago {Aus}). He was also crowned champion three-year-old colt/gelding.

#### If the Slipper Fits...

G1 Golden Slipper hero **Sebring (Aus)** (More Than Ready) captured champion two-year-old honours with a record of 6-5-1-0 and earnings of A\$2,537,060, but the Gai Waterhouse-trained colt will not be seen this spring. She revealed last month that the chestnut had stress-related bone bruising on his right fore cannon bone, and would need to be spelled for two months. In addition to his Slipper success, Sebring captured the G1 AJC Sires' Produce S., but incurred his sole defeat when narrowly beaten by Samantha Miss (Aus) (Redoute's Choice {Aus}) in the G1 Champagne S. Waterhouse indicated that Sebring would have one last campaign in the autumn before retiring to Widden Stud.

The other highlight of the evening was the elevation of 80-year-old 'Cups King' Bart Cummings to Legend status in the Australian Racing Hall of Fame. Cummings joins last year's inaugural Hall of Fame Legend, Phar Lap. He has re-written the record books in Australian racing since winning the first of his 11 Melbourne Cups with Light Fingers (Aus) in 1965. Cummings has also trained the Cup quinella five times, and his Group 1 tally of winners currently stands at 249.
