MAJOR EURO MEETS THREATENED BY RAIN

Today's racing at Leopardstown and Haydock is in jeopardy following heavy rainfall. Both tracks will hold 7 a.m. inspections to determine the chance of the cards, which feature three Group 1 contests, surviving the persistent rain sweeping Britain and Ireland. Leopardstown's General Manager Tom Burke is hoping

the downpour stops in time to save the eight-race card centered around the G1 Tattersalls Millions Irish Champion S. and G1 Coolmore Fusaichi Pegasus Matron S. "We will have an inspection at 7 a.m. and we have had 45 millimetres of rain between 4 a.m. and 2 p.m.," he told *PA Sport* yesterday. "There are bits of casual water on the track,

but that wouldn't be unusual when you get so much rain in a short period of time. We had a similar experience before our last meeting and we raced fine. Most of the track is surprisingly in good condition, so we will have to see what the night brings." Later in the day, it was announced that the meeting would take place Sunday if it fails to get the green light today. Haydock's meeting is also in doubt, with contingency plans to transfer the G1 Sprint Cup to next week's Doncaster St Leger festival already in place.

BRING IN THE NEW

Today is a day of "ifs" due to monsoon-like conditions and although Leopardstown and Duke of Marmalade (Ire) (Danehill) need the go-ahead respectively, if there is one certainty it is that New Approach (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}) will be at the start for today's G1 Tattersalls Millions Irish Champion S. Princess Haya of Jordan's G1 Epsom Derby winner's momentum has been disturbed by a mixture of injury and York's abandonment, but today's stage is perfect for a return to the headlines. Proven on heavy ground on more than one occasion at two, the chestnut could be ready for a careerbest following his comeback third in the G1 Juddmonte International S. staged on a fast surface at Newmarket a fortnight ago, "The ground looks like it will be testing and while it is not too much of a worry, we wouldn't want it to be too bad," trainer Jim Bolger told PA Sport. "Obviously, he was very fresh at Newmarket but I think we have that sorted that out. He is in great form and it looks like there is going to be something in there to make it a decent pace." Farm near Versailles, Kentucky. Bred by Seth Hancock's Cherry Valley Farm, War Pass was purchased by LaPenta for \$180,000 out of the 2006 Keeneland November sale and was ticketed for the next year's juvenile sales, only to have a minor problem preclude that opportunity, and the colt en-

tered the Nick Zito racing stable. Never headed in four starts as a two-year-old, the attractive dark bay took his debut by 2 3/4 lengths at Saratoga and followed with a 5 1/2-length allowance score over a field including Pyro prior to a mild upset of Ready's Image and Majestic Warrior in the GI Champagne S. at Belmont Park. Sent off the 2-1 favorite against 10 other rivals in the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Oct. 27, he turned in another front-running tour-de-force, splashing home 4 3/4 lengths to the good of Pyro. So much hinges on the decision of Coolmore and Aidan O'Brien to let Duke of Marmalade take his chance on deep ground and while they were willing to let that happen prior to the York Ebor meeting, they are thinking long and hard this time. Due to the postponement

of the Juddmonte contest and its rescheduling, the four-year-old has had to endure a tough fortnight involving two return trips to England and a grueling battle to maintain his winning sequence at Newmarket. While a battling win in the July 26 G1 King George VI and Queen Elizabeth S. demonstrated the

resilience of the "Duke", these conditions could test him to the limit. O'Brien reiterated his wait-and-see policy regarding a final decision on his participation to the Racing Post. "The plan is to run Duke of Marmalade, but if they get all the rain that's forecast we would be talking about ground that would not be ideal for the horse," he told the trade daily. "Everyone knows he's a horse who likes good, fast ground, so we'll have to wait and see what happens with the weather and review the situation if necessary." One who will relish testing ground is the Niarchos Family's Multidimensional (Ire) (Danehill) and he could hardly have had it softer than when winning the G3 Rose of Lancaster S. at Haydock last time Aug. 9. "He has travelled over and appears to be in good shape," the owner-breeders' Racing Manager Alan Cooper told PA Sport. "We would be expecting a good run."

After the colt's brilliant victory in the Breeders' Cup, trainer Nick Zito said, "War Pass is without a doubt the fastest two-year-old I've ever had. He has tremendous speed and is extremely talented." Zito went on to say, "I've been on the track since I was a teenager and in my opinion, War Pass has everything: speed, class, and quality." The colt picked right up where he left off in his sophomore debut on the Fountain of Youth undercard Feb. 24, taking a one-mile allowance by 7 3/4 lengths in nothing more than a canter. That win set him up for the GIII Tampa Bay Derby Mar. 15, but things went wrong right from the start, as War Pass was slow away from the stalls, was bumped around on the first turn, raced very wide and finished seventh. He atoned for that effort in the GI Wood Memorial Apr. 5, setting a strong pace over a very quirky surface before yiedling grudgingly to finish a half-length second. His Derby dreams were dashed by a fractured sesamoid in his left front ankle, which never sufficiently healed to warrant a return to the races. "I think he fits in extremely well with our roster," said Farish. "He is a horse that showed a tremendous amount of speed and could carry it up to a mile and an eighth. If his career hadn't been curtailed by the ankle injury, I think he would have gone on, and I know Nick felt so, too. It's very disappointing that he came up with the ankle problem after the Wood, but I have always felt he would make a terrific sire." War Pass retires to Lane's End with a career record of 7-5-1-0 and earnings of \$1,583,400.

Twice stakes-placed in a brief six-race career, Vue got off to a fast start as a broodmare, producing GI Spinaway S. winner Oath to the cover of Known Fact in 1994. The latter has carried on the family tradition, as the dam of Honest Man (Unbridled's Song), who recently earned his first graded-stakes success in the GIII Philip H. Iselin H. at Monmouth Park. Vue is also the dam of Vision of Beauty (Danzig), runner-up in the 2004 GII Raven Run S. and Ruler's Vision (Monarchos), RNAd by LaPenta for \$1.5-million out of this year's Fasig-Tipton Calder sale and a promising third in his racetrack debut at Saratoga Aug. 30.

If this race takes place today, it will be a case of survival of the fittest and what gets through this deep ground. Since 2000, this contest has been staged on soft or heavy on four occasions and Reverence was successful on one of them. While he appears to have lost some of his old verve since his success two years ago, he showed glimpses of a return to form when a fast-finishing third in the Listed Queensferry S. at Chester last time Aug. 3. "He's in great order--the best we've had him all year--but he'll need to be," trainer Eric Alston told PA Sport. "He's drawn high which normally, would be a good draw. You just wouldn't know, but we're very hopeful." Aidan O'Brien's major-race haul does not include this prize, but the Ballydoyle conditioner has a trio to attempt to put that right this time. US Ranger and Astronomer Royal have been closely matched all year and proved inseparable when deadheating for fifth in the G1 Prix Maurice de Gheest at Deauville last time Aug. 10, but the former has a slight edge on his second in the G1 July Cup at Newmarket July 11.

This race sees the seasonal debut of Ballydoyle's G1 Fillies' Mile heroine **Listen** and G2 Cherry Hinton S. scorer **You'resothrilling**, but the stable has a leading candidate in thisyear's G1 Irish 1000 Guineas and G1 Nassau S. winner **Halfway to Heaven**. The latter may have been fortunate to best **Lush Lashes** in the Aug. 2 Goodwood contest last time and that rival has subsequently won the G1 Yorkshire Oaks at Newmarket Aug. 22. Dropping back a half mile should not inconvenience that G1 Coronation S. scorer and trainer Jim Bolger is more concerned about testing conditions.

"The ground probably isn't perfect, but we are going to let her take her chance," the Coolcullen conditioner commented. "When we ran her in heavy ground early this year, she ran a bit freely and maybe she wasn't as ready as we should have had her. We're going to give her another chance as she is in great form at home and the trip makes no difference to her." Dermot Weld collected this prize with Dress to Thrill (Ire) when it was a Group 3 six years ago and relies on the Irish Guineas third Carribean Sunset, who handled this ground when running away with the G3 Desmond S. over course and distance on her latest outing Aug. 17.



The dark bay also got to the wire first in the 1 1/16-mile Feb. 9 GIII Silverbulletday S. at Fair Grounds, but connections opted to turn the sometimes headstrong filly back to sprints after she tired to second in the Mar. 8 GII Fair Grounds Oaks and June 7 GI Acorn S. Showing a new dimension, the Earnhardt homebred rated off fast fractions in the July 5 GI Prioress S. and rallied to win handily, and she used identical tactics to take the Aug. 2 GI Test S. by seven lengths. Encouraged by her new-found patience, connections have decided to give the champ another chance going long. "I think she's relaxing a

little bit more," trainer Bib Baffert said. "Now is the time to try it." Indian Blessing could find herself on the lead end here, unless **Rite Moment** goes to the front.

The four-year-old also stretches out. The winner of the Mar. 22 GII Distaff H. and Apr. 19 GII Bed o'Roses H. at Aqueduct, she then ran second in the May 17 GII Shuvee H. at Belmont. Third as the chalk in the July 4 GII First Flight H., the bay was outrun after getting off to a slow start in the Aug. 1 GII Honorable Miss H. at the Spa, but should improve with a clean break. Spring Waltz capped off a four-race winning streak with a handy tally in the Mar. 9 GII Rampart H. at Gulfstream, but has been out just once since. The gray mare came back on the July 13 GII Delaware H. at 10 furlongs and weakened late to be fourth. She has been first or second in all six tries at this trip.

Third in the Apr. 6 GII Fantasy S. and May 2 GI Kentucky Oaks, the chestnut switched back to the lawn for the June 14 GIII Regret S. and won by 2 3/4 lengths. She followed up with a game 3/4-length tally over Satan's Circus in the July 5 GI American Oaks, and is the one to beat here. Satan's Circus has been out once since, rallying for fourth in the Aug. 16 GI Del Mar Oaks. Ariege, coupled with Pure Clan due to common ownership interests, goes after her fourth straight. The dark bay took the Mar. 8 GI Santa Anita Oaks and Apr. 10 GII Stonerside Beaumont S. at Keeneland on the all-weather, then moved to grass and added a score in the Aug. 9 Madame Jumel S. going a mile over a yielding Saratoga lawn. My Princess Jess bids to add to consecutive victories in the May 8 Gaviola S., June 28 GIII Boiling Springs S, and July 25 GII Lake George S. "She's a very tenacious, gritty, quick filly," trainer Barclay Tagg remarked. "She isn't afraid of anything. She's a pleasure to be around."



Don't Rush It...

Good things come to those who wait. Just ask Carlo and Lou Tucci, who will send out **Just Rushing** (Wild Rush) in Sunday's GI Woodbine Mile. The gelding is the 5-1 third choice on the morning line and is the top local hopeful, entering off a 1 1/4-length score in the GII Play the King S. Aug. 23.

The uncle and nephew, who race under the name Tucci Stables, claimed Just Rushing, then a four-year-old, for \$40,000 out of the gelding's fifth race, a conditioned claimer at Woodbine in November 2005. Nearly a year later, at the age of five, Just Rushing captured his first stakes. The following spring, at six, he became a graded-stakes winner.

Carlo, who moved to Ontario from Calabria, Italy, at the age of two, owns and operates all four of the Levi Strauss outlet stores in Ontario. In addition, he holds an interest in several hotels in the province's Waterloo area. Lou owns and operates Royal Envelope, the largest privately owned envelope manufacturer in Canada.

The Tuccis claim many of their horses, but they also buy privately and from auctions and manage a breeding operation. Tucci Stables also owns shares in the stallions Seeking the Best (Ire) (Seeking the Gold) and Endeavor (Capote).

"The family has been involved [in racing] for a long time," Lou said. "Going to the racetrack has been a family affair since I was a little kid."

Carlo's brother Al started claiming horses in 1971. Lou began to race horses in partnership with his uncle in 1985, before Al passed away in 1988 from pancreatic cancer at the age of 43.

Following the lead of his late brother, Carlo decided to become a Thoroughbred owner in 1995. In the early part of this decade, Carlo suggested to his nephew-who remained in the game after Al died--that they should combine their interests and race in partnership.

"I think it was about six years ago when I said, 'Why don't we pool our resources?'" Carlo said. "Lou thought it was a great idea."

It didn't take long for the uncle-nephew duo to find success. In October 2002, the Tuccis claimed a three-year-old filly named **One For Rose** (Tejano Run) for \$40,000 from her winning debut.

"We were impressed with the workouts and simply told [our trainer] Sid [Attard], 'If you like the horse, let's take her,' Carlo added. "He called me from the paddock said 'She looks like a million bucks and she's 6-5.' So I said, 'Put the slip in!'"

One For Rose would blossom into an eight-time stakes winner for the Tuccis, with graded triumphs coming in the 2003 and 2004 GIII Maple Leaf S. and the 2005 GIII Seagram Cup over males. She also had won the Seagram Cup the previous year when the race was ungraded. For her efforts, she won three Sovereign Awards, taking Canada's Champion Older Female honors in 2003-2005.

"It was like claiming a dream," Lou said. "We were winning races that we very seldom could enter a horse into. She put our stable on the map."

The mare retired with a record of 25-15-5-2 and nearly \$1.3 million in earnings. The Tuccis sold their \$40,000 claim for \$875,000 as a broodmare prospect at the 2006 KEEJAN sale. They decided to put the profits from One For Rose back into racing.

"She holds a special place in our hearts because she allowed us to take bigger risks and improve our stock," Carlo said.

Like One For Rose, Just Rushing has done his best running since he was claimed by the Tuccis. Starting in July 2006, the gelding won seven straight races, capping the streak with his first two stakes victories, the restricted Mt. Sassafras S. and the open Labeeb S. He was fifth in his next start, the GIII Woodbine Slots Cup, before he was given a break during winter time. His 2007 debut was a winning one, as he captured the GIII Vigil S. in April.

Just Rushing then lost his next nine starts, but never finished worse than fifth and placed in six stakes. Second in the 2007 Play the King, he snapped his losing streak by taking this year's renewal.

Versatility has been a strength for Just Rushing, who has triumphed in sprints and in routes. Only once has he raced away from Woodbine--his debut win at Fort Erie, also in Ontario--but he has shown he can handle different surfaces. Just Rushing holds the distinction of having won over every surface in Woodbine's history. Before his Polytrack and E.P. Taylor turf course victories, the dark bay scored over the old dirt track and the inner harness track, when it hosted Thoroughbred racing as Woodbine installed its synthetic surface.

"You just put him in the gate and you know he'll run a good race," trainer Sid Attard said. "It doesn't matter what surface."

As for their chances Sunday, Lou believes Just Rushing should "be right there, if he runs his race" against his seven opponents, which include the 2007 GI Breeders' Cup Mile winner **Kip Deville** (Kipling) and GISW filly **Ventura** (Chester House). Still, Lou realizes the gelding will need to take another step forward if he is to deny the invaders from the United States.

"He's a horse who prefers to have some more time between races," Lou admitted. "Even at his best, he'll have to run a great race to beat those horses."

Owned by a syndicate, Silver Deputy stood at Fred Seitz's Brookdale Farm near Ver-

sailles, Kentucky. From 17 crops to race, Silver Deputy has progeny earnings in excess of \$72 million. Of his 75 stakes winners, 20 of them have come in graded stakes. Also a top broodmare sire, Silver Deputy's daughters have produced the winners of 37 stakes races, including GISWs El Corredor and Roman Ruler, GSW Silver Tornado--all out of Silvery Swan--and MGSW & MGISP Miraculous Miss (Mr. Greeley).

A winner in two of her three European starts, the chestnut was acquired privately by Schwartz and won her first two U.S. outings, including the GIII Regret S. She concluded her three-year-old campaign with a runner-up effort to champion Wait a While in the GII Lake Placid S., then reeled off three straight wins to start 2007, including the \$1-million GII CashCall Mile with an electrifying turn of foot. Third in the GI Beverly D. S. and the GI Matriarch S., she placed in all three of her appearances this season, including a runner-up effort to Ventura in the GI Just a Game S. June 7 before rounding out her career with a third in defense of her CashCall title July 5. Schwartz has had success in recent years, acquiring runners such as Angara (GB) and Gorella (Fr) before racing them to prominent victories in this country. A full sister to SW Loup Masque, Lady of Venice retires with a record of 16-7-3-4 and earnings of \$1,308,842.

On her good ones she'll get a piece of this.

Got good late last year, and was bought on our recommendation in the spring. Part of our thinking was that her siblings had gotten better with age, and we looked good when she came close to beating Ginger Punch in a Grade I last time out. With plenty of rest since, she should run well again, and the storm that's rolling in should help--three of her siblings (far right column) ran the best race of their lives on off tracks.

4 Indian Blessing Indian Charlie 7-5

Has always been very good, but took it to a new level in her last two. The negative Thoro-Graph figures she earned in those two sprints were unbelievable, and you could make the case that on pure ability she's the best three-year-old filly of all time. Those two big ones could cause a bounce this time, but her bounce might be good enough to win. Her best races this year and last were on off tracks.

5 Spring Waltz Silver Charm 5-2

Unraced until her four-year-old season, she didn't show much on Poly, then improved dramatically over the winter at Gulfstream for Bryan Lynch, who was getting some amazing figures out of horses at the time. Now in the Bobby Frankel barn, her return in the Delaware H. was much better than it looked. A repeat of that effort would put her in mix here, and a return to her February top would make her very strong.

6 Stage Luck Unbridled's Song 8-1
Has obviously been fighting soundness issues, and big efforts take a lot out of her. But even her best won't do it here.

7 Tough Tiz's Sis Tiznow 6-1

Has been hard hitting, and has shown that she can handle both dirt and artificial surfaces. But she's been racing against a very weak group in California--with the exception of Zenyatta--and her two efforts against that filly weren't nearly as good as they looked. In both starts Tough Tiz's Sis got weight from Zenyatta and had a rail trip. Her figures are not that strong, and she's not a strong contender here.

8 Boca Grande A.P. Indy 15-1

Got good last fall, then went wrong and was laid up for nine months. Her return was decent, and she's set up for a good one now for Shug, who is good with horses making their second start off a layoff (see profile). If that good one is a new top she could get a piece of this at a price.

9 Miraculous Miss Mr. Greeley 12-1

Is a very good late running sprinter that is stretching out here. With good route efforts when she was younger and with this being a one-turn race, that doesn't figure to be a problem. But in three starts this year she hasn't been able to get back to her top, which isn't a healthy sign. With only 13 days rest we don't love her, especially in the slop.

<u>Bottom Line</u>: Indian Blessing is clearly the most likely winner, with Copper State and Spring Waltz the other main contenders. At anywhere near the morning line, Copper State is clearly the value.



Taylor Made to Sponsor White Horse Award:

Taylor Made Sales Agency and Taylor Made Stallions Inc. are the name sponsors for the Race Track Chaplaincy of America's sixth White Horse Award. The 2008 winner of the award will be recognized at a ceremony to be held Thursday, Oct. 23 at Santa Anita's Sironas Room on the eve of this year's Breeders' Cup World Championships. The award is given annually to racingrelated people judged by the members of the White Horse Fellowship to have performed the most heroic act in behalf of a human or a horse. "The philosophy behind the track chaplaincy has to do with people helping other people, and one of the inhibitors to helping others is fear," said Taylor Made President Duncan Taylor. "The White Horse Award is about honoring people who have overcome their fears to help people and horses, and we want to commend people with that virtue. And the nominees are the farm workers and backstretch folks who are vitally important to this industry." Among this year's nominees are a group of four Louisiana racing farm workers and three backstretch workers at Charles Town Races and Slots, all of whom risked their lives to save racehorses during two separate barn fires. Last year's winner, Johnny Arrendondo Ponce, is a Navy aircraft mechanic who stopped after a van overturned near Del Mar last summer, severely injuring Noe Garcia, groom for the recently retired Lava Man. Standing in traffic, Ponce used his hands as a tourniquet to stop Garcia's severely bleeding and nearly severed arm. The action likely kept Garcia, who later lost his arm, from bleeding to death.

Farish Jr. Re-Elected as BC Board Chairman:

Breeders' Cup Chairman William S. Farish Jr. was unanimously re-elected at yesterday's Breeders' Cup Board of Directors third quarter meeting. R.D. Hubbard was unanimously elected vice chairman. The Board also agreed to a three-year renewal to help fund the Equine Drug Research Institute of the Grayson-Jockey Club Research Foundation.






