JOHN HETTINGER PASSES AWAY

John Hettinger, a member of the Board of Trustees of the New York Racing Association and Chairman Emeritus of the Grayson Jockey Club Research Foundation, died Saturday morning after a lengthy illness. The former majority shareholder in Fasig-Tipton was 74. "John was a renaissance man who retained all the old-fashioned virtues of straight talk and honesty," said Terence Collier, director of marketing for Fasig-Tipton. "During his tenure at Fasig-Tipton, he insisted that it be run with the same principals that he ran his life." Cont. p2

RAIN KOS BIG MEETS

Yesterday's Group 1 action at Leopardstown and Haydock was lost to waterlogging, with the former track moving its G1 Irish Champion S. card to today. While Haydock was not able to be saved due to a total of 35 millimetres of rain in the preceding 24 hours, officials at Leopardstown remain optimistic that the transferred meeting will take place following a 7 a.m. precautionary inspection. "We're very disappointed about today, but we're quite confident we'll be okay for tomorrow," explained Leopardstown's General Manager Tom Burke. "We're due dry weather today and tomorrow, so we're very hopeful. We decided we will inspect tomorrow morning, but it is soft ground at the moment. I'm sure in the final analysis, it will all work out." It was later announced that Haydock's G1 Sprint Cup will be moved to Saturday's St Leger card at Doncaster.

After earning a degree in American History from Yale in 1955, John Hettinger moved to Mexico to work for

Celanese Corporation, which produced chemicals and chemical fibers. He later relocated to Spain, where he started a career in real estate. Hettinger returned to the United States in 1973 after selling a 450-acre development to an investment bank. He then took over Akindale Farm, which his father had purchased 55 years earlier, and expanded the property to 800 acres.

Hettinger said his biggest thrill as a Thoroughbred owner was winning

the 1989 GII Long Island H. with Warfie. Akindale also campaigned stakes winners Chase the Dream, Genuine Regret, Jazzing Around, Lady D'Accord, Move It Now, Prospector's Flag, Up Like Thunder and Virgo Libra. Stallions that stood at Akindale include D'Accord, Personal Flag, Stacked Pack and Sir Wimborne.

In December of 1991, Hettinger personally supplied 40 percent (\$2.4 million) of Fasig-Tipton's \$6 million recapitalization plan, and also added \$1.2 million from trusts benefitting his sons, James and William. He maintained a 51 percent interest in Fasig-Tipton before it was sold to Synergy Investments Ltd. this April.

Hettinger was an outspoken opponent of horse slaughter, forming Blue Horse Charities in 2001 to raise money for adoption and retirement programs and was an active member of the Thoroughbred Retirement Foundation.

"John personified our mission and made us a stronger, better organization, and we are honored to continue his efforts on behalf of our equine athletes," said TRF Executive Director Diana Pikulski. "He was the Thoroughbred's strongest advocate and he took action to back his convictions. The TRF was honored to have his huge support and presence as a director."

Hettinger also "spent a great deal of time and money" in an effort to create legislation that would outlaw horse slaughter in the U.S., Collier said. "Certainly he was pleased with the closing of plants in Texas and Illinois. However, he was by no means satisfied and always felt that more could be done."

In addition to his wife Betty and his sons, Hettinger is survived by his three grandchildren, Caroline, Charles and Lilly. Funeral arrangements will be private.

HEFFERNAN GETS DUKE CALL-UP With the unpredictable weather shaking up the race program, Ballydoyle had to juggle its jockeys, and stable stalwart Seamus Heffernan has the enviable task of deputising for the Longchamp-bound Johnny Murtagh on Duke of Marmalade (Ire) (Danehill) in the G1 Tattersalls Millions Irish Champion S. Susan Magnier and Michael Tabor's five-time Group 1 hero still might not line up despite the forecast dry spell leading up to the race. Trainer Aidan O'Brien told Racing Post, "There is still a doubt about Duke of Marmalade because of the ground situation at Leopardstown. The instinct is not to run, but a final decision will probably be left until morning."

NAVIGATING THE STORM Not since suffering two juvenile losses has Henrythenavigator (Kingmambo) encountered ground as soft as he is likely to get in today's G1 Prix du Moulin de Longchamp, and he could be another missing star on a weekend tarnished by heavy rain. His status as top cat over a mile in Britain and Ireland is unquestionable following wins in the 2000 Guineas at Newmarket and The Curragh in May, G1 St James's Palace S. at Royal Ascot and Goodwood's G1 Sussex S. last time July 30. Trainer Aidan O'Brien revealed to *PA Sport* yesterday, "The plan is to run him, but the ground is currently working against us, so we'll have to see. He's been fine since his last run and we are very happy with him."





A SOLID CASE FOR RAHY'S ATTORNEY

Four-year-old Rahy's Attorney (Rahy) is a perfect three-for-three going a mile on the grass, and he puts that record on the line in his Grade I debut. The gelding took a restricted allowance, the Vice Regent S. and the Bunty Lawless S. for Canadian-breds, all going eight panels on the Woodbine lawn last year. He added a victory in the May 25 GIII Connaught Cup going a mile and a sixteenth in his second start this term, then stretched to 1 1/2 miles and was runner-up in the June 22 GIII Singspiel S.

The gelding was third in an off-the-turf allowance

July 13, and shortens up off a fourth in the Aug. 4 GII Nijinsky S. Wollemi Pine (Aljabr), on the other hand, gets an added furlong after finishing a rallying second to Just Rushing (Wild Rush) in the Aug. 23 GII Play The King S. at Woodbine. The Kinghaven, Clarke and Thompson colorbearer is three-for-six this season, including a nose victory over Just Rushing in a sprint allowance on the grass two back Aug. 1. "I would like to think that a mile suits him," trainer lan Black told Daily Racing Form. The four-year-old gelding was a modest \$24,000 FTMMAY juvenile purchase. Emma Jayne Wilson has the mount.

Winner of the restricted Ontario Jockey Club S. two starts back July 19, the five-year-old gelding comes off a fourth in the Play The King. He has Sam-Son's Canadian champion Wilderness Song (Wild Again) as his second dam.

Seventh in the GI Breeders' Cup Distaff over a saturated Monmouth strip last fall, Tough Tiz's Sis was runner-up in her next three outings, capping the streak in the Feb. 9 GI Santa Maria H. She followed up with wins in the Mar. 16 Harry Henson S. at Sunland Park and, after a break, in the May 4 GIII Hawthorne H. at Hollywood. In against unbeaten Zenyatta (Street Cry {Ire}) in her next two tries, the bay filly was second by a half-length in the July 5 GI Vanity H. and third by 6 1/4 lengths in the Aug. 2 GII Clement L. Hirsch H. at Del Mar. She'd failed to fire in three prior wet-track starts, but, kept in the clear by Edgar Prado yesterday, she proved she could handle the footing, winning as much the best.

The Long and the Short of It...

Bob Baffert, with an eye on the Breeders' Cup Filly and Mare Sprint at Santa Anita Oct. 24, said yesterday that Indian Blessing could make her next start in the six-furlong \$400,000 Presque Isle Masters in northeast Pennsylvania. "I scratched Indian Blessing because she doesn't need to run that long," Baffert said after the Ruffian. "We talked it over and we decided to keep her in the short game. That's what she does best. Of course, I would have felt bad if [Tough Tiz's Sis] didn't win because I scratched Indian Blessing."

She was good enough on the dirt to run second in the GI Frizette S. and third over a sloppy strip in the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies, but Backseat Rhythm has taken her game to a new level on the grass. A maiden winner on the lawn, the bay filly was third in a Gulfstream turf allowance Feb. 22 to open 2008, then switched back to the main track and was a distant fourth in the Mar. 2 GII Bonnie Miss S. The sophomore was back on the weeds after running third in a Belmont allowance test May 2, and showed her appreciation for the change with a six-length allowance score three weeks later. She failed to fire when seventh behind Pure Clan in the July 5 GI American Oaks, but made it three-for-five on the lawn in the Aug. 15 GII Lake Placid S. at Saratoga, recovering from a rough start to win going away. Still, the bettors needed some convincing, and sent her off the co-fourth choice in this field. Backseat Rhythm settled in fourth as raw Silk (Malibu Moon) led them along through six furlongs in 1:14.72. She circled the field at the top of the lane and brushed Pure Clan at the eighth pole, but, kept to a drive, fought her way to a narrow score. "She's by no means an Amazon, but she's got a great stride on her," trainer Pat Reynolds said. "It was great coming from that far back with no pace. She's a no-excuse filly. She either gets there or she doesn't, but she always gives you her best." Looking ahead, Reynolds added, "We're invited to the Queen Elizabeth II [GI QEII Challenge Cup at Keeneland Oct. 11]. I hear that when you are invited, they give you a free meal. I'm a sucker for that, so we'll see what happens." Unhurried in the early going, Close Out rated in 10th as favored Lucky Copy cruised through the opening six furlongs in 1:12.24. Lucky Copy still had six lengths on the field at the eighth pole, but had hit the wall, and Close Out, despite racing erratically, caught her in the final strides and edged clear. "The distance was a big plus," jockey Jamie Theriot said. "The further she goes, the better she's going to be. [Lucky Copy] had a lot of speed and she was stopping the last eighth of a mile, and my filly was just getting moving." Jockey Garrett Gomez, on the runner-up, remarked, "She was pretty empty at the top of the lane, but she was still able to keep going. 

Following wins in Lingfield's Listed Spring Cup and Newbury's G3 Greenham S. this spring, the bay was seventh in the course-and-distance G1 Poule d'Essai des Poulains May 11 before rebounding with wins in the G2 Lennox S. at Goodwood July 29 and the Hungerford at Newbury Aug. 16. Princess Zahra Aga Khan's homebred has failed to add to her three Group 1 wins so far this term, but was the runner-up in the May 18 G1 Prix d'Ispahan, won by stable companion Sageburg, as well as the G1 Queen Anne S. at Royal Ascot and the G1 Prix Rothschild at Deauville Aug. 3. In the latter contest, she split the Wertheimer brothers' Goldikova and Stefan Friborg's G1 1000 Guineas winner Natagora. Goldikova's conditioner Freddy Head is hoping his recent golden period can last out. "The ground at Longchamp is going to be soft and I believe it is pouring with rain today, but that won't be a problem to her," Head told PA Sport.










LET THE GAMES BEGIN

They will come from the four corners of the world to poke, prod and then parry, battling fiercely against each other in the hopes of future glory...and all in the name of athletics. The Olympics in Beijing? Nah. It's the Keeneland September Yearling Sale, in Lexington, Kentucky. Tomorrow, Keeneland begins its 65th renewal of September, a massive 15-session event that runs through Tuesday, Sept. 23.

KEESEP Books 1-2 Average/Median 2001-2007




A record 5,555 yearlings have been catalogued for September, two more than in 2007. Last year, the sale saw 3,799 youngsters exchange hands--including 32 for \$1 million or more--for gross sales of just over \$385 million. It was the second-highest grossing September in Keeneland history, behind a blockbuster 2006 that grossed \$399 million. The cumulative average was \$101,347, down 9.9 percent from the 2006 record of \$112,427, while the median was off 6.7 percent to \$42,000. Those numbers don't tell the whole story. The sale started slowly, suffering a big 20-percent drop in Book 1, largely attributed to the scaled back spending of Darley's Sheikh Mohammed, before storming back strongly with 13 consecutive sessions that realized gains from the previous year.

Topping the 2007 sale was a striking son of Unbridled's Song out of GI Kentucky Oaks heroine Secret Status (A.P. Indy), who realized a bid of \$3.7 million from Coolmore's Demi O'Byrne. Lane's End, agent, consigned the colt, the unraced Dunkirk.

Coming into this year's September, there are more questions than answers over how a sluggish U.S. economy will affect the domestic buying bench. Some have predicted Book 1 will be only marginally affected-recession-proof is a phrase that has been used to describe those shoppers--with the next few books in the catalogue more liable to be influenced. Last year, foreign buyers--from Europe, Asia and beyond--took advantage of a weak U.S. dollar and helped buoy all segments of the market, with an emphasis on the midrange horses, and could once again play a significant role.

September sessions begin daily at 10:00 a.m. Friday, Sept. 12, is the sale's lone dark day. For the complete catalogue, visit www.keeneland.com. -LM

How Big an Impact?

In 2006, John Ferguson, acting on behalf of Sheikh Mohammed, spent a staggering \$59,945,000 for 34 yearlings at September, an average of \$1,763,088 per horse and 15 percent of the total gross of that year's sale. Ferguson purchased 12 yearlings at \$1 million or more, including five at \$3 million or more. Among Ferguson's purchases were the \$11.7-million Meydan City (Kingmambo--Crown of Crimson), the \$9.2-million Plavius (Danzig--Sharp Minister), and the \$8.2-million Snickered (Storm Cat--Awesome Humor).

Things were different last year. In 2007, September was left to play catch-up after Book 1 average plunged by nearly 25 percent, largely attributable to Sheikh Mohammed's drastically reduced spending during the select sessions. In all, Ferguson purchased 21 horses for \$17,780,000, an average of \$846,666 and 4.6 of the total gross.

Compared to the 12 million-dollar yearlings he walked away with in 2006, Ferguson landed six last year. The top two were the \$2.9-million **My Vision** (Dynaformer-Preach) and the \$2.4-million **Keep Thinking** (A.P. Indy-Denebola). Notably, Ferguson and Coolmore's Demi

O'Byrne failed to lock horns in any serious manner, a trend that continued through the two-year-old in training sales this year.

Sheikh Mohammed's reduced spending on yearlings in 2007 was coupled by an aggressive strategy on the breeding side of things, in particular the stallion market. The breeding rights to three highly regarded stud prospects--Derby winner Street Sense (Street Cry {Ire}), Hard Spun (Danzig) and Any Given

Saturday (Distorted Humor)--were acquired by Darley and stood their first seasons there this spring. Ferguson was also busier than usual at Keeneland November, where his acquisitions included the record \$10.7-million Playful Act (Ire) (Sadler's Wells).

In recent news, it was announced that Darley is purchasing Robert and Janice McNair's Stonerside operation, including a group of 50 well-bred yearlings. What that all adds up to, in regard to the extent of Sheikh Mohammed's buying at September, likely won't be determined until the close of trading Tuesday. -LM



Runnymede's Offering Has a European Flair...

Runnymede Farm will offer shoppers a chance to bid on yearlings by a pair of European-based sires during Monday's first session of the Keeneland sale. The farm consigns the only offspring of leading European sire Danehill Dancer (Ire) in the catalogue, as well as a filly from the first crop of Dubawi (Ire). The offerings reflect a strategy that has worked well for Runnymede's Vice President and General Manager Martin O'Dowd.

"Off and on I've been breeding to these European stallions for five or six years," O'Dowd explained. "Perhaps not the scale that I'm doing it now, but I've always had one or two or three over there. I basically breed them out there; sometimes I'd foal them over there if I wanted the mare go back to another European stallion, and then take the foal back and sell it here."

For all the intercontinental travel, O'Dowd admits many of the foals end up back where they started.

"I usually sell them back to the Europeans, for the most part," he said. "I suppose it's one of those highrisk gambles that you take, but it has worked out very well for us over the years."


During last year's September sale, Runnymede sold a colt by Galileo (Ire) for \$600,000. A filly by Rock of Gibraltar (Ire)--a 3/4-sister to this year's Danehill Dancer colt--brought \$300,000 a year ago.

O'Dowd credits his success to myriad factors.

"We usually send mares from very good families," O'Dowd said. "They are usually very good matings for those who study the pedigrees deeply. And we've been blessed that these horses have been very well-conformed. And we try to turn them out at the sales looking fit and in good shape. So our success is a combination of all the above."

Despite the past success and a relatively weak dollar, O'Dowd does have concerns about this year's sale. He forsees fewer European buyers than in recent years.

"This is going to be a tough year," he admitted. "There is a kind of a change in the trend and it may alter the direction I've been going in a bit. I don't think we're going to see quite as many European bloodstock owners or breeders at this year's September sale. I get the impression that the Europeans haven't had a lot of success with American sires over there. Generally speaking, there is a massive influx of owners and bloodstock agents from Europe, and they are wonderful shoppers at the early part of the sale every year. But from talking to people over there, they're saying, 'Listen, our own stallions are doing far better over there in Europe and we really don't see the need to come over there this year.' I'm concerned that [the yearlings] are not going to have the large audience that they've had in the past." Cont. p4





O'Dowd does remain confident about the two European-bred yearlings he will send through the sales ring Monday.

Hip 49 is a colt by Danehill Dancer (Ire) out of Seek Easy (Seeking the Gold). Danehill Dancer capped an impressive August when he was represented by his 10th Group 1 winner with Again (Ire)'s victory in the G1 Moyglare Stud S. at the Curragh Aug. 31. The unraced Seek Easy is a half-sister to multiple graded stakes winner Conserve (Boundary).

"Danehill Dancer is just a wonderful sire and he's been very, very successful," O'Dowd said. "And it was a particularly good mating for this mare. The catalogue page doesn't come close to reflecting all that is in that pedigree. This family, down through the generations, I'll tell you who's not showing up there: Encosta de Lago (Aus), Holy Roman Emperor (Ire), Big Viking. It is back under the second dam [Fanfreluche]. There is so much going on in that family; it's so alive. The family has always shown an affinity to Danehill and his sons, and physically it was a good mating for this mare. He's an extremely nice colt, and I think he resembles his sire. He's an exceptional individual."

Asked if there was any advantage to having the only offspring of Danehill Dancer at September, O'Dowd said, "If you don't come and look at the only Danehill Dancer in the sale, you must be a very busy person. This horse has to be one of the horses that has to be marked by everybody who is attending the first two days of the sale. And I think they'll like him because he is quite gorgeous."

Runnymede is also offering <u>Hip 29</u>, a filly from the first crop of Irish 2000 Guineas winner Dubawi (Ire) (Dubai Millennium {GB}), who was represented by a

€400,000 yearling at Arqana's Deauville Yearling Sale in August. The filly is out of Regina Maria (Unbridled), a half sister to Kentucky Derby runner-up Tejano Run (Tejano) and to graded stakes winner More Royal (Mt. Livermore).

Explaining the mating,

O'Dowd said, "When I attended the December sales over there, I went to Darley and I saw Dubawi and I really liked him. He's Dubai Millennium's most successful son and he matched up very well with this mare. We thought genetically it was a very good cross. Physically, I thought they would complement each other and I thought from the commercial viewpoint that Dubawi would have some appeal and be a unique presentation at the September sale."

O'Dowd is happy with the resulting foal.

"She is a most attractive filly," he confirmed. "I think she should be well-received. One of the top sellers at Deauville was a Dubawi and I think people will be keeping their eyes open for them." - Jessica Martini

Big Brown's Little Sis...

Gary Knapp joined an elite club when Big Brown (Boundary), a horse he bred and sold under his Monticule banner, romped by 4 3/4 lengths in the GI

Kentucky Derby in May. Knapp sold Big Brown as a yearling across town at the Fasig-Tipton October Sale two years ago for \$60,000, and, on Tuesday, brings Big Brown's little sister to the Keeneland pavilion. By Touch Gold, the filly sells toward the end of the day as hip 484. The Apr. 20-foaled chestnut is the fourth foal from the nine-vear-old Nurevey mare

Mien. Both physically and mentally, she is her mother's daughter, says Knapp.

"She's very typical of her dam," he said. "She reminds me more of the dam than Big Brown. The dam's not a large horse, and she's very alert. It's rare, if they're in the field, that she doesn't know where her foal is. It's very interesting to watch the family--they're all extremely curious. This filly, her dam, her granddam, and her sisters all are some of the most alert horses in the pasture. They're always very observant--they're always the first horses in the pasture to raise their heads and look at something. They're not skittish--just very curious."

Though some breeders might be reluctant to part with a half-sister to a Derby winner, Knapp sees it a different way.

"We operate with the policy that we take everything to the sales," he said of Monticule, which is home to about 20 mares. "If a horse is able to go to the sales, we take them there. If you don't, what you're basically saying is that there is no amount of money I'll take for this horse. As a commercial breeder, principally, that is sort of inconsistent with what we're trying to do. If we really like a horse, then the reserve will be set accordingly."

Knapp says he had a few different angles in mind when he planned the Touch Gold--Mien mating.

"First, physically, they fit really well," he said. "And then we looked at the results of the inbreeding patterns that have been successful with Touch Gold. It's one of the things we do when planning matings, to look at inbreeding patterns that have been successful with sires in the past. In other words, if you look through the principal runners of a sire, it's very common to see patterns of inbreeding that consistently show up among those runners--it might be 4x4 to Northern Dancer, or 4x4 to Mr. Prospector, or 4x4 to both. I'm a very applied person; I'm not much of a theoretician. If I see a sire has produced a number of good runners bred 4x4 to Northern Dancer, it seems to me that that's a good idea."

As far as his famous graduate, Knapp says it's been a joy watching Big Brown compete this year.

"It's been absolutely fantastic," he said. "When, as [trainer] Richard Dutrow [Jr.] said, he 'got down on his belly' and won the GI Haskell Invitational, I said, 'Now there's a characteristic of the guy we haven't seen.' And I'm glad he's got it."

So does Knapp have any opinions regarding a match-up between Big Brown and Curlin?

"Oh, I'd love to see them race each other," he said. -Lucas Marguardt

Williams Finds it All in the Family...

Count Doyle Williams among the many who found his way to Thoroughbred racing through Quarter Horse racing. Williams just found the economics made more sense in the Thoroughbred industry.

"You have to have just an exceptional Quarter Horse all the time just to make it pay, where a Thoroughbred at least you have the option of, at least, the claiming ranks that you can economically make it work for you."

In the early 1990s, Williams was racing both Quarter Horses and Thoroughbreds, but decided he needed to make a change.

"I had a couple of Thoroughbreds, but not very good ones. I got rid of all the Quarter Horses and all the Thoroughbreds and I just started over," he recalled. "I started looking for some quality mares--that was about 1993."

One of the first mares that came his way during the transition period was Safe Salute (Hail Emperor), a half-sister to champion sprinter Safely Kept (Horatius).

"If you have an opportunity to get a half-sister to an Eclipse Champion that won a Breeders' Cup and ran second in another one, you'd take a shot at that deal," he explained. "It just happened that that's the way it came up."

That opportunity was the start of a long attachment with the family. In a broodmare band of 10, Williams has six mares from the family.

The line started when Williams bred Safe Salute to Safely Kept's sire Horatius. The resulting filly became Keep Me Safe, who was multiple stakes placed for Williams on the track. He also campaigned Safe Salute's multiple stakes winner Sea Dub (Sea Hero).

"I guess it's probably the speed," Williams said when asked what attracts him to the family. "Although, some of them are not necessarily sprinters, it's just a question of whether they would use the speed in the first part of the race or the last part of the race. Sea Dub would work fast and he would do the quarter miles fast, but when it came to the track, you needed to wait and let him do his running in the last quarter."

Williams admits his focus is more on selling than racing.


"I've got eight in training right now and that's plenty," he said.

Both Safe Salute and Keep Me Safe have yearlings by Darley stallion Street Cry (Ire) selling at Keeneland Monday. Safe Salute's filly will sell as https://doi.org/10.15 as the Safe sells as hip 43, while a colt out of Keep Me Safe sells as hip 210.

Of the decision to breed both mares to Street Cry, Williams said, "He was a good racehorse, obviously. But also the first three dams are all Grade I winners or have produced Grade I winners. It's just a really, really strong family."

Williams's yearlings are consigned by Ron Blake, who sees plenty to like in the two youngsters.

"Number one, they are by Street Cry," Blake responded when asked what he liked about the yearlings. "The filly is a good-sized filly. She's a tad bit offset through her knees, but walks through it very well. She has good size and balance. Street Cry is a little bit offset in his knees, as well, and it doesn't seem to be an issue with his foals. The colt is a May foal, but he's got good size for a May foal. He's well-balanced, very strong and has a great walk. He walks right at you and is a pretty correct horse overall. They are both good individuals." -Jessica Martini

A'Courtly' Queen and Her Royal Lineage...

It's hard to imagine a mare having a greater influence on a breeding operation than Courtly Dee has had on Helen Alexander's Middlebrook Farm. Alexander, granddaughter of King Ranch founder Robert Kleberg, purchased Courtly Dee, then 12, in partnership back in 1980. The daughter of Never Bend had an immediate impact for Alexander and her partners, her mother Helen Groves and David Aykroyd, and even now, nearly 30 years later, Courtly Dee still features prominently in the pedigrees of the majority of their horses.

That's readily apparent in Middlebrook's Book 1 consignment, a modestly sized, four-horse draft that includes three homebreds--all of whom boast Courtly Dee as their third dam.

Many are familiar with the story of Courtly Dee, and nearly all know of the successful race horses, broodmares and sires that trace to her--her champion daughter Althea, Grade I winners Green Desert and Arch, and successful sires Bertolini and Twining are head the list.

As a racehorse, Courtly Dee was a well-bred miss who never lived up to expectations. She managed four wins in 33 starts, and by the time she was retired to the breeding shed, she had no black-type and banked only \$19,426.

Courtly Dee quickly turned things around in her new occupation. Courtly Dee's first foal was Ali Oop (Al Hattab), who in 1976 captured the GI Sapling S. as a juvenile. Her next foal, Native Courier (Exclusive Native), was a graded stakes-winning grass horse, and after her next two foals became minor winners, she again hit it big with Princess Oola (Al Hattab), a SW & MGSP in the U.S. and later dam of a Group 1 winner in Australia. So Courtly Dee was no secret when she stepped into the ring at the 1980 Keeneland November Sale.

"[Bloodstock agent] Tom Cooper was helping me out at the time," explained Alexander. "We went and looked at her and just loved her. To us, she was the best mare in the sale--we were really excited about owning her and really determined to buy her. But everybody was talking about Street Dancer (Native Dancer) being the first \$2-million mare that year, and we thought, 'Gosh, if she brings \$2 million, Courtly Dee has got to bring at least \$1.5 million. We're going to have to hustle around and get some money.' So that's how we ended up with the partnership of Tom's brother-in-law, David Aykroyd, my mother and myself."

Though prepared to go to \$1.5 million, Alexander and company landed Courtly Dee, in foal to Alydar, for \$900,000--a good chunk of change both then and now --but less that what they expected to have to pay.

"And for a little while there, the bidding had stalled out on her at \$400,000, and we were looking at each other thinking, 'What the hell did we miss here? Something's not right!'" Alexander remembered with a laugh.

As it turned out, everything was right. The Alydar foal Courtly Dee was carrying was very talented Althea. While racing for Alexander, Grove and Aykroyd, Althea won the GII Hollywood Juvenile Championship S. and GII Del Mar Futurity against the boys and was named champion two-year-old filly in 1983, the same year Courtly Dee was named Broodmare of the Year.

Trainer D. Wayne Lukas again sent Althea up against males in the following year's GI Arkansas Derby, and she responded with a resounding seven-length win. The coupled entry of Althea and Life's Magic was sent off favored in Swale's 1984 Kentucky Derby, but Althea beat just one home and was retired soon after. Still, she had won eight of 15 starts, finished second another four times and earned a total of \$1,275,255.

And to think, but for a brief foot infection, Althea might have done all that wearing some else's colors.

"Even when she was young, she was just such a nice horse, and as a yearling we were so excited--we were going to take her to the [Keeneland July] Sale and make all our money back," explained Alexander. "But she graveled right before the sale and we had to take her out."

While there was everything to love about Althea's racing ability, her attitude around the barn occasionally left something to be desired. A family trait, it turns out.

"When she was in training, she was as mean as a snake," Alexander said. "And I don't think Courtly Dee was very nice to train, either. Bobby Umphrey told me one time, when we were racing Twining at Gulfstream and he was the racing secretary, that he was her groom for a while. Bobby still had some rather unsavory names to call her. All the girls in the family could be a bit aggressive; the colts were all fine." Cont. p9

Both Althea and Courtly Dee died in 1995. Courtly Dee was pensioned at the time, but Althea, aged 14 and already a top producer, died from injuries suffered in a paddock accident and represented a serious blow. "It was a real bummer," Alexander said flatly.

Despite the loss, Middlebrook's paddocks were still populated by sons, daughters and grandchildren of both mares. Courtly Dee produced a pair of nice colts for Alexander, Groves and Aykroyd, the Grade I-winning colt Ketoh and MGSW Twining--but it was her daughters that were the real treasures. The Grade II-winning Alydar fillies Aishah and Aquilegia both starred in the Middlebrook band--Aishah produced Grade I winner Aldiza, Grade II winner Atelier and SW Arabis, while Aquilegia was reponsible for the speedy Bertolini and the stakes winners Amelia and Alchemilla.

Althea, meanwhile, produced GSW Destiny Dance, dam of GISW Balletto (UAE); SW & MGSP Alyssum; Japanese champion juvenile filly Yamanin Paradise; and Aurora, dam of Arch and UAE Horse of the Year Festival of Light.

"It's been an amazing family for us," confirmed Alexander, who added that, of the 17 broodmares currently at Middlebrook, "probably 14 or 15 go back to Courtly Dee."

Given the tradition of naming each member of the family with the letter A, the trio of homebreds offered in Book 1 sell in close order, catalogued by their dams' names. Hip 119, a Dynaformer colt out of Amelia, kicks things off for the Middlebrook consignment, followed by hip 125, a Distorted Humor colt out of Atelier. Both colts were bred by Alexander and Groves along with another of Groves's daughters, Dorothy Alexander Matz. Capping off the flourish is an Alexander/Grovesbred Empire Maker half-sister to Arch and Festival of Light, hip 126, who represents a somewhat rare opportunity to purchase a female member of the family.

"We generally just sell the colts, but sometimes you have to raise some money," said Alexander.

Speaking of the family in his book *Matriarchs*, published in 1999, Edward L. Bowen called Courtly Dee, her daughters and granddaughters a "link to the 21st Century." It's an accurate statement, and a fitting tribute to fine mare. *-Lucas Marquardt*

Cats and Lyons...

When Castleton Lyons purchased an interest in Bernstein several years ago and moved the Storm Cat stallion to its Lexington, Kentucky-based farm, its late owner Dr. Tony Ryan made a commitment to support Bernstein with some of his best mares. Ryan's commitment is evidenced in Book 1 at Keeneland, where you'll find a pair of youngsters by the 11-year-old Bernstein out of mares that most any stallion manager would welcome. Both horses are offered by Paramount Sales.

First through the ring is hip 206, a son of the 12-year-old mare Jiving (GB). Purchased as a broodmare by Castleton Lyons for \$700,000 at the 2000 Keeneland November Sale, Jiving is a sister to the superlative producer Hasili (Ire)--dam of Breeders' Cup winners Banks Hill (GB), Intercontinental (GB), et al.--and to the dams of champions Three Valleys (Diesis {GB}) and Leroidesanimaux (Brz) (Candy Stripes). Jiving's second foal, the now-six-year-old Excusez Moi (Fusaichi Pegasus), was a stakes winner and graded placed.

Selling on Tuesday is hip 396, a filly out of the 1998 G1 Yorkshire Oaks heroine Catchascatchan (GB) (Pursuit of Love {GB}). Purchased by Lyons Demesne (Ryan's estate in Ireland) for \$4.7 million at the 2000

November Sale, Catchascatchcan made an immediate impact in the breeding shed. Her first foal, Antonius Pius (Danehill), was hammered down to Coolmore's Demi O'Bryne for \$1.5 million at this sale six years ago. He went on to take the G2 Railway S. and finish a fast-closing second in

Singletary's GI Breeders' Cup Mile in 2004. Catchascatchcan has also produced the fillies Princess Zara (A.P. Indy), a \$900,000 yearling; and Catch the Blue Hat (Storm Cat), a \$1.2 million buyback.

"Like all Bernsteins, these two walk particularly well," said Castleton Lyons farm manager Tobias Incollingo. "The Catchascatchcan is a strongly built and powerful-looking filly. The Jiving colt is a fluid mover and a very athletic sort with great bone."

Castleton Lyons purchased an interest in Bernstein, who began his career at Buck Pond Stud, prior to the 2005 breeding season. Bernstein's first crop of runners conceived at Castleton Lyons are now two-year-olds.

"We bought into Bernstein at the right time and brought him over here, and his first crop for us has gotten off to a great start," said Stuart Fitzgibbon, commercial manager at the farm. "He had a very nice filly finish second in the GII Adirondack S. at Saratoga, Doremifasollatido, and he has 15 individual two-year-old winners so far-tops in the country."

Of Castleton Lyons' backing of Bernstein, Fitzigibbon said, "We just feel, if we don't believe in the horse, no one will. That was Dr. Ryan's strategy, and it's the strategy of his son Shane, who's taken over the farm. And you're seeing that here--where we're being represented higher up in the catalogue. We've bred some very nice mares to him in the past, and will continue to do so. We bought Pocus Hocus (Quiet American), a graded stakes winner, last year and she went to him this spring, and we also got Super Freaky (Smart Strike). She's still racing, but when she retires he'll be her first date." -Lucas Marquardt







BELMONT BARN UNDER QUARANTINE Barn 38 on the Belmont backstretch has been placed under precautionary quarantine, after Smell My Carrots--a three-year-old maiden gelding--was euthanized after being found in his stall with a fever and unable to stand. With equine herpes one possible cause for the horse's illness, the decision was made to place the barn under quarantine. Horses in Barn 38 are being carefully monitored and are restricted from racing and shipping for the time being. They will be allowed to train after normal training hours on the nearby training track once the general horse population has cleared. Blood samples from the deceased horse have been drawn and sent to Kentucky. Test results are expected by Tuesday. Owned by Eugene Louglin and trained by John Candlin, Smell My Carrots was most recently eighth at Saratoga Aug. 22, his eighth career appearance. He was entered, but was scratched from Friday's seventh race.

PEDROZA GETS WIN #3,000, BREAKS FAIRPLEX RECORD Jockey Martin Pedroza won his 3,000th race by guiding Airplane Attendant (Unusual Heat) to victory in the second race at Fairplex Friday before breaking the track's record for wins in a single day. After reaching that milestone, Pedroza went on to win six more races, including the featured \$63,700 Jim Kostoff S. by a nose aboard Trevor's Clever (Stephen Got Even). Pedroza, the all-time win leader at the bullring with 526 victories after Friday, rode in all 12 Thoroughbred races on the card.






