JUDGMENT DAY IN WOODBINE MILE

With the presence of last year's GI Breeders' Cup Mile hero **Kip Deville** (Kipling) and the Grade I-winning filly



Ventura (Chester House) in yesterday's GI Woodbine Mile in Toronto, there appeared to be very little pre-race talk trickling down to many of the other competitors. However, it was 12-1 outsider **Rahy's Attorney** (Crown Attorney) who proved best on the day, landing the \$1,000,000 event by 1 1/4 lengths over the

hard-running filly Ventura. Content to track a pedestrian early pace set by **Just Rushing** (Wild Rush), Rahy's Attorney launched his bid approaching the turn. Ahead by a comfortable margin with a sixteenth left to go, the bay refused to yield as Ventura--with her ears pinned back--inched ever closer. However, it was the bay gelding who proved toughest of all in the stretch and had enough in reserve to hold off the game challenger. It was another 1 3/4 lengths back to another Candianbred, Just Rushing, who held on for third. **Cont. p2**

GETTING THE JOB DONE

Without Duke of Marmalade (Ire) to contend with, Princess Haya of Jordan's **New Approach (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}) appeared to face a straightforward task in the G1 Tattersalls Millions Irish Champion S. at Leopardstown. While the punters backed up that impression by taking odds of 8-13 at the off, it was a display that was more workmanlike than thrilling that the G1 Epsom Derby hero offered the crowds when grinding out at half-length success at the expense of the 50-1 shot **Traffic Guard** (More Than Ready). "He was only doing enough and had loads left in the tank," Bolger said. "Once again, we probably overdid the settling, and he did what he had to do." **Cont. p3**

trade. "It's a big question mark," said Three Chimneys Farms' Case Clay. "Perhaps more now than at any time in the last five years. Right now, it's all speculation-hopefully we'll be all right." Keeneland Director of Sales Geoffrey Russell is confident that September has all the right ingredients to make for a successful sale. "All I can say is that everyone's here that should be here," said Russell. "Everybody seems to like the horses; the consignors have done a wonderful job bringing the cream of the crop. We'll just have to wait and see. The table is set. If the physicals match the pedigrees, it's a very strong group of horses." Russell said he expected foreign buyers, who were busy a year ago, to remain active. "The dollar's a little stronger this year than it was last year, but it still offers great value to the European and English market," he said. "And there are a lot of Europeans here. Later on in the sale, we hope to see people from other countries show up." Kee cont. p12

Rahy's Attorney proved his affinity for the turf at Woodbine, scoring in four of five starts on the green stuff last term. Among those victories was a 2 1/2length score in the one-mile Vice Regent S. against Canadian-bred rivals early last September. The bay found the 10-furlong trip of a \$62,000 optional claimer Sept. 30 a little to far outside his scope and had to settle for third. Back to his beloved one-mile trip, he closed out the season with a score in the restricted Bunty Lawless S. Oct. 28. A well-beaten seventh when placed on the Polytrack in a seven-furlong allowance Apr. 27, the gelding rebounded to collect his first graded-stakes score in the 1 1/16-mile GIII Connaught Cup May 25. Runner-up in the 12-panel GIII Singspiel S. June 22 over a rain-softened turf course, the Ontariobred tired late to be third in an off-the-turf allowance July 13 before coming home fourth most recently in the 10-furlong GII Nijinsky S. Aug. 4. Sent off the prohibitive favorite while trying to improve on his second-place finish in last year's Mile, Breeders' Cup Mile champ Kip Deville (Kipling) pressed the pace in second for most of the way, but tired late and had to settle for fifth. "It was disappointing," said trainer Richard Dutrow Jr., about Kip Deville, the top ranked miler in North America. "Maybe he didn't like it [the soft turf]. I'm not going to cry and complain about it. He's usually run good on soft courses. We can't explain anything why he didn't fire. He had everything go his way. He just broke so good and let the other horses come up on the inside of him. I'll try to figure out what his excuse is. I'm sure he's got one." Added Velasquez, "He broke good. He did not try today. He wasn't running today. Whether he did not like the track, I don't know."

Same Old Result for New Approach...

New Approach was rising to prominence at this venue last year when winning the G3 Tyros S. in July, and hit the heights with subsequent successes in The Curragh's G2 Futurity S. and G1 National S. and Newmarket's G1 Dewhurst S, over the next three months. Nosed out on his sophomore bow in the May 3 G1 2000 Guineas, he was second again to Henrythenavigator when subdued in the Irish equivalent three weeks later. While aggression was the main tactic at up to a mile, his subsequent runs when successful in the June 7 Epsom Classic and a third behind "The Duke" in the G1 Juddmonte International at Newmarket two weeks ago were marked by an early keenness as connections sought to unravel his latent stamina. That was in evidence again here as Kevin Manning urged him into the bridle following a tardy start, and he was soon over-racing in the slipstream of Ballydoyle's perennial front-runner Red Rock Canyon (Ire) (Rock of Gibraltar {Ire}). Passing that rival inside the final quarter, he had to be kept up to his work all the way to the line to ward off a crowd of contenders, from which Traffic Guard emerged best. "At Newmarket, he was too keen on the day because we had to rush a lot of quick work into him, and there really wasn't enough pace on today, but he had a nice easy race and should come out of it very well," Jim Bolger added, before outlining the upcoming options for New Approach. "He is in the G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe [at Longchamp Oct. 5], the [Oct. 18] G1 Champion S. at Newmarket and the GI Breeders Cup Classic [at Santa Anita Oct. 25]. He will probably run in two of them. If we could only win them all as easy as that, it would be nice."

Aidan O'Brien yesterday decided against running **Duke of Marmalade (Ire)** (Danehill) in the G1 Tattersalls Millions Irish Champion S. at Leopardstown, later won by arch-rival New Approach (Ire). While the meeting survived a morning inspection, the Ballydoyle conditioner was not happy to risk Susan Magnier and Michael Tabor's five-time Group 1 winner on rain-softened ground. O'Brien told the *Racing Post*, "He has achieved so much this year on good or quicker ground, and we felt it would be unfair on the horse to run him on ground that would not suit him with a view to the rest of the season. Plans for the horse will be decided at a later date."

Not Just One-Way Traffic...


For Jane Chapple-Hyam, the effort of Traffic Guard was not unexpected but was a highlight in her short training career. "I couldn't believe it when I saw him quoted at 100-1 during the week," Chapple-Hyam told the *Racing Post*. "After he ran in Singapore, we put him out on grass for eight weeks. That nearly paid a big dividend today and, hopefully, it will do so before the end of the season. We're hoping to take him to Australia to run in the [Oct. 25] G1 Cox Plate at Moonee Valley next month." Mores Wells's trainer Kevin Prendergast also revealed that he could run the thirdplace finisher in Saturday's G1 Irish Field St Leger at The Curragh.

Anatomy of a Win...

Alain and Gerard Wertheimer's **Goldikova (Ire)** recorded a career high when lifting the Aug. 3 G1 Prix Rothschild at Deauville last time, and continued trainer Freddy Head's banner year by accounting for a stellar field at Longchamp. Getting the fractions right throughout, Alain and Gerard Wertheimer's 7-2 chance picked her moment in the straight and refused to relinquish her advantage under a drive to hold on bravely for a halflength defeat of **Darjina (Fr)** (Zamindar). "I knew she was doing as well as, or even better than, when she won the Prix Rothschild, and it is a real privilege to train such a good filly," enthused Head.

All That Glitters...

Goldikova fell just short of the mark in two Classics this term, the May 11 G1 Poule d'Essai des Pouliches and the June 8 G1 Prix de Diane, and registered a first pattern-race score in the G3 Prix Chloe at Maisons-Laffitte July 6. She accounted for a solid cast in the Aug. 3 G1 G1 Prix Rothschild at Deauville last time, and improved further coming out of that distaffers' event to climb another rung of the ladder with a game victory in this all-aged contest. Racing a shade keenly in third during the initial strides, Goldikova settled in fourth once the pacemakers Sarissa (Brz) (Music Prospector), Pas Seule (Fr) (Iron Mask) and Honoured Guest (Ire) (Danehill) vied for control on the front end. Taking control as the rabbits wilted with 500 meters remaining, she gained first run on her held-up rivals and kept on in resolute fashion under a drive to claim deserved glory. "It was a strong race today, but I knew she'd run well and Olivier [Peslier] gave her a great ride," said Head. "I will discuss her future with the Wertheimer brothers, but it is highly likely that she will now go to the Breeders' Cup meeting. We have to decide whether to go for the GI Mile or the GI Filly & Mare Turf. She showed in the Prix de Diane that she can stay the longer trip, and it should be even less of a problem going around two turns in America."

Tales of the Vanquished...

Princess Zahra Aga Khan's Darjina (Fr) (Zamindar) chased home Goldikova in the Aug. 3 G1 Prix Rothschild last time, and occupied the runner-up's berth once more. "She has run her race and was brave again," insisted trainer Alain de Royer-Dupre. "It was the same result as the Prix Rothschild, so we have no excuses. Darjina is not eligible for the Breeders' Cup and she doesn't appreciate the round course at Ascot, so we'll have to wait and see where she runs next." Dual 2000 Guineas winner Henrythenavigator (Kingmambo), who was seeking a fifth straight Group 1 success, was unable to land a telling blow from off the pace and kept on late to finish a never-nearer fifth. "He took a while to settle and would definitely prefer a sounder surface," a Coolmore spokesperson remarked. Stefan Friborg's G1 1000 Guineas heroine Natagora (Fr) (Divine Light {Jpn}) was not disgraced by her sixth-place finish and is set to drop in trip for her next start. "They were too good for her and it was just a bit too far at this level," said trainer Pascal Bary. "She will probably come back here in the [Oct. 4] G1 Prix de La Foret."



LASHES IS A LADY

Lush Lashes (Galileo {Ire}) has slalomed in and out of the winner's circle this campaign, and followed up success in the May 14 G3 Musidora S. at York with defeat in the June 5 G1 Epsom Oaks. Regaining the winning thread in the June 20 G1 Coronation S. at Royal Ascot, she could not overcome a series of traffic problems behind Halfway to Heaven in the Aug. 2 G1 Nassau S. at Goodwood, but gained compensation in the rearranged G1 Yorkshire Oaks at Newmarket last time Aug. 22. Positioned in a stalking second until seizing the initiative off the home turn, she answered every call under a final-quarter drive to turn down all challenges in game fashion. "She is a credit to herself and to my staff," commented trainer Jim Bolger. Indicating possible targets, Bolger added, "We'll discuss the options we've got for her for the rest of the season. There's the [Oct. 4 G1] Sun Chariot S. at Newmarket and the [Oct. 5 G1] Prix de l'Opera at Longchamp. She has received invites for the Breeders' Cup [meeting] and the [G1] Hong Kong Cup [at Sha Tin Dec. 14], which [former stable star] Alexander Goldrun (Ire) won in 2004. The ground was not good enough for her [today], and whatever she does, she will remain in training next year and will start off season in Dubai." In doing so, he emulated his sire, who also wore the Blankenese silks when completing the Derby-Grosser Preis double in the millennium year. He wore that rival down approaching the final furlong before drawing clear. Trainer Peter Schiergen said, "When winning the Derby he made all, but today he showed the speed we all knew he had. He could run once more this year, but where or when has to be decided on." Adlerflug's conditioner Jens Hirschberger was taking defeat on the chin. 

of drama about this filly selling," said John Sikura, whose Hill 'n' Dale Sales Agency consigned Playful Act and also consigns the yearling. "She's a lovely filly. She has all the attributes of a good horse. She's in Book 1 and she has all the attributes of a Book 1 horse." The yearling's record-setting dam has obviously made her extra-popular on the sales grounds. "She's been very well-received," Sikura admitted. "She's a good individual and has been holding up well to all the activity." Asked if the filly reminded him of Playful Act, Sikura said, "She's very well-made, like her mother, but she's an individual in her own right." Playful Act, who was covered by Street Cry (Ire) this year, won the 2004 G1 Meon Valley Stud Mile and was second in the following year's G1 Irish Oaks. The legendary Sangster family also sold the mare Sand Springs (Dynaformer) for \$2.3 million in November and her yearling colt by Sadler's Wells will sell as Hip 281. Robert Sangster, who died in 2004, bought the original Swettenham Stud in Chesire, England in the 1960s. He established a racing empire, earning leading owner honors five times between 1977 and 1984 and campaigning such greats as Sadler's Wells, Alleged, The Minstrel, Storm Bird, El Gran Senor and Rodrigo de Triano. Sangster, along with John Magnier, founded Coolmore. "It's obviously been a privilege to have a group of horses in the barn who have such proven performance through the decades." said Sikura. "But there are also mixed emotions. You want to see these family operations continue. But when they do go to auction, the family is rewarded for its commitment to the industry. A lot of times in these situations, people are strictly after value, but in this case I think people are happy to honor the memory of a man like Robert Sangster, who was a true pioneer in the industry. He was a true sportsman. We have him to thank for creating an international market. He and John Magnier gave the industry a global perspective, coming from Ireland to America to buy yearlings, racing them, and then giving us the legacy of so many great stallions. Robert is not here anymore, but Coolmore is one of the two main players in the industry and he and John Magnier began that. They made us an industry. It was like the beginnings of the NFL."

"He's definitely one we're excited about," Will Farish's son, Bill Farish, said. "He's a really super-looking colt. He's good-sized and very well put together."

Kingmambo, whose 2007 yearlings averaged \$595,034, is enjoying a banner 2008, led by the exploits of his dual Classic-winning son Henrythenavigator. Kingmambo can also boast of the '08 Grade I winners Student Council and Archipenko, and Farish is hopeful that Mambo in Seattle can join the club soon.

"It's been very exciting watching him progress," Farish said. "The way he's come around has been very much the way [trainer] Neil [Howard] likes to do things. And Jeanie Kilroy and my father, as well--bring them along slowly and let them mature. [Mambo in Seattle] ran a great race on Derby day [second in an entry-level allowance], and he's just progressed since then."

Hip 345 represents a potent Kingmambo/Seattle Slew cross that has produced 18 percent stakes winners, including Grade I winners Boboman and Lemon Drop Kid, the latter of whom hails from the same family as this colt.--Lucas Marguardt

Kronfeld breeds under the banner Maverick Productions Ltd., the name of a his movie, record, and television company. A year before, Kronfeld sold Zenyatta's half-sister, Grade I winner **Balance** (Thunder Gulch), to Amerman Racing for \$260,000. The fillies were produced by the Kris S. mare Vertigineux.

On Tuesday, Winter Quarter and Kronfeld team up again to offer another Vertigineux youngster, a Giant's Causeway colt catalogued as <u>hip 340</u>. The horse was co-bred with Ashford Stud as part of a foal-share agreement.

"He's the nicest horse I've ever brought to a sale--the absolute nicest yearling I've ever brought to auction," asserted Robinson last week. "He's everything, in my opinion. He's by a horse that has had 18 stakes winners this year, out of a mare who's unquestionably as good a mare as you'd ever want to see."

So does he remind Robinson of his sisters? "He reminds me of Giant's Causeway--he looks just like him," he said. "It's scary."

The story of the colt, and of Zenyatta and Balance, too, dates back 30 years and one month. It was at the 1978 Fasig-Tipton Saratoga Yearling Sale that Kronfeld, then a fledgling owner, went to \$170,000 for the *Forli mare For the Flag. The first foal of the modest runner In the Offing (Hoist the Flag), For the Flag was nonetheless from a deep family that included her dam's halfsister Sweet Alliance, winner of the Kentucky Oaks and later dam of Irish and English champion Shareef Dancer. (Incidently, Kronfeld bought Mrs. Penny in partnership at the same sale for \$40,000. That filly went on to become a champion in England at two and three before being sold as a broodmare in the mid-1980s.) cont. p15

As a racehorse, For the Flag followed after her mother. She made just over \$7,000 in two seasons in England and America before being retired to the breeding shed. Fortunately for Kronfeld, however, For the Flag did live up to her page as a producer.

For the Flag became the dam of three stakes winners

and another who was group placed. But for Kronfeld, it would be For the Flag's daughter Vertigineux who would become her most important offspring. Foaled in 1995, Vertigineux was offered the following year at Keeneland September by Winter Quarter, but went unsold at \$120,000, a serendipitous result Hip 340 - Giant's that nonetheless perplexed her connections at the time.

"We got an enormous filly, and I'll never understand why she didn't sell," said Robinson. "She was big, and she wasn't at all ungainly. If I was buying yearlings, I'd have bought her in a heartbeat. We had a healthy reserve on her, which was around what the RNA was--around \$120,000. Which, honestly, I thought was a modest price for a filly like that."

Kronfeld put Vertigineux into training, first with Tom Skiffington and then with Michael Dickinson. She failed to hit the board in three starts at three, but showed signs of life at four, breaking her maiden in a 10-furlong grass event at Belmont in May of 1999 before doubling up at the same distance in a NW1X in her next start. She just failed to hit the board when fourth, beaten a length, in a minor stakes at Delaware that July, and was subsequently retired after a well-beaten try in the GIII Glens Falls H.

"Despite her record, everybody raved about her," said Robinson. "She was unsound, but she had serious ability. She should have been black-type. That's easy to say, but she really should have. But we retired her, and she seems to be a pretty good broodmare."

Vertigineux's first foal was Where's Bailey (Aljabr), who made only \$4,000 as a 2003 September yearling but went on to become a stakes winner of \$116,313. Balance was her next, and her yearling price tag of \$260,000 reflected her looks, said Robinson.

"Balance had balance," he said. "Vertigineux's a big mare, and she has a Kris S. shoulder. She's a bit light in rear end, but very typical of Kris S. And the mating with Thunder Gulch just worked perfect. Thunder Gulch can get you kind of a weedy horse--I love him, I think he's one of the best sires there is--but she was the perfect fit for him. Balance was big for a Thunder Gulch and had plenty of bone. And she had an incredible walk, and that really sold her."

Knocked down to bloodstock agent Bob Feld for Jerry and John Amerman, Balance became one of the better three-year-old fillies of 2006, winning the GI Las Virgenes S. and GI Santa Anita Oaks. Cont. p16

Last year, Balance added the GI Santa Margarita Invitational H. and was retired after last year's GI Breeders' Cup Distaff with earnings of \$1,048,491.

About a month before Balance made her winning debut in October of 2005, Zenyatta stepped into the ring at Keeneland September.

"Compared to Balance, Zenyatta was much more a throw of the dice," said Robinson. "It was a first-year sire--Street Cry's everything now, but that first year he was viewed in America as, 'Well, sure he was a good runner, but he's by a grass sire in Machiavellian,' and folks maybe weren't that enthused. So she wasn't a horse that everyone had to have. I loved her, but she also had much more the look of her mother. She had a great, big enormous shoulder. She had a little bit more of a hindquarter, but still slightly fell off--she didn't have a big, sprinting-type ass. There just wasn't that great interest in her. Except for David Ingordo, who was going to buy the horse, no question about it. He just locked on. David's a quiet guy, but he did his homework and didn't make any bones about it--he was buying her."

A bloodstock agent who often buys for Jerry and Ann Moss, Ingordo wasn't bothered by a skin disease Zenyatta was battling at the time, something that turned off a few other potential buyers, said Robinson.

"I had it in some of the other horses, too," he said. "It was God awful, and it was embarrassing. I'd never had in my horses before or since. And we just couldn't get it out of her by the time of the sale; I had actually wanted to scratch her. But it put a lot of people off, other than David. You know, it's skin disease. It's just a matter of time before you get rid of it, but it was unsightly and a lot of it is how you look on sale day."

Two years down the road and Zenyatta has yet to taste defeat, and as far as Robinson's concerned, Kronfeld deserves the credit.

"These matings have all been Eric's," he said. "I have a kind of right of refusal--if I don't like the stallion, or don't like the physical match-up, or the sire has a fertility problem, I'll nix it. But boy, he doesn't need my help. We'll talk about it, but he's usually made his decision, and I'm always impressed. With For the Flag, for instance, he saw that the Roberto line was the way to go, because she'd had a good Robellino filly in Europe--Robellino being by Roberto."

Robinon added, "He lives in New York City, but he's the most astute client I've ever had from a distance. As a trader, he knows exactly what's going on from his office in New York. He's very connected and very astute. I enjoy doing business with him; he doesn't miss a trick."

As for Vertigineux, her fourth foal, a Pulpit filly named Treasure Trail, has been working toward her debut in New York. Knocked down to E.A. Cox Jr. for \$550,000 at last year's September Sale, Treasure Trail has seven recorded works, her latest a three-furlong breeze at Belmont in :37 1/5 (1/5) Sept. 1. Vertigineux didn't have a foal this spring and is currently in foal to Bernardini. *-Lucas Marquardt* Multiple Graded winner Golonel John

Horse of the Year²...

It isn't often the product of two Eclipse Award-winning Horses of the Year is offered at public auction. In fact, it has happened only twice before in the Eclipse



Award era, and not since 2000, when Vigor, a Seattle Slew colt out of 1986 Horse of the Year Lady's Secret, sold for \$250,000 at Keeneland September. It happens again today when <u>hip 127</u> steps into the ring. The handsome chestnut colt is a son of A.P. Indy out of the brilliant Azeri, who was

named Horse of the Year after an eight-for-nine 2002 season that included a dominating win in the GI Breeders' Cup Distaff. Hill 'n' Dale Sales Agency consigns the horse for The Allen E. Paulson Living Trust, which bred the horse in Kentucky. Vallenzeri is Azeri's first foal; she was barren in her first year in the breeding shed.

"I think his chances are excellent," said Allen Paulson's son Michael Paulson, who was at the Hill 'n' Dale barn Sunday enjoying the weather. "He's the only yearling in the world out of two Horses of the Year. Physically, he's perfect. He hasn't taken one step back since he was born." **Cont. p17**



Amestoys Hungry Like the Wolf...

When you see a chance, take it. Pierre and Leslie Amestoy, who operate Lobo Farm, did exactly that at the 2006 Keeneland November sale, and the decision, which has already paid huge dividends, is set to yield even more fruit--not to mention real dollars--towards the latter end of this afternoon's session.

Though the couple was shopping for mares just short of two years ago, they weren't necessarily interested in then 12-year-old Irish Cherry (Irish Open). She was already the dam of Spun Sugar (Awesome Again), the winner of the previous year's GII Black-Eyed Susan S., who really came to hand at four, winning the GI Apple Blossom H. and the GI Go For Wand H. Pierre Amestoy, 53, and his wife, Leslie, 49, took note of the mare, who was carrying a foal by none other than Storm Cat, in the rear walking ring. But surely, he thought, she'd be out of his price range.

"She was a big, beautiful mare with a lot of balance and presence," he explained. "She was already a solid producer and she was in foal to Storm Cat. I had no idea we'd be able to get her."

The hammer dropped on Irish Cherry at \$800,000, with John Sikura, who consigned the mare, the victorious bidder. Amestoy approached Sikura, made an offer and the deal was done.

Irish Cherry produced a chestnut son by the nowpensioned Overbrook stallion Apr. 16 of last year. Three days later, Daaher, a full brother to Spun Sugar, debuted somewhat inauspiciously at Keeneland, finishing a distant eighth. But the Shadwell runner began figuring things out and, with a late-season flurry, stamped himself one of the top runners of his generation, scoring in the GII Jerome H. prior to an upset of subsequent champion Midnight Lute in the GI Hill 'n' Dale Cigar Mile H.

In the meantime, given the success of Spun Sugar, the Amestoys sent Irish Cherry to Awesome Again's champion son and Horse of the Year Ghostzapper for the 2007 breeding season.

"I didn't really intend on getting rid of her that quickly," Amestoy explained, "but given that Daaher really caught fire, it just seemed the right thing to do to sell her back right away."

Consigned back to this year's Keeneland January sale, Amestoy's judgment was validated, as Irish Chery, carrying a 3/4 sibling to Spun Sugar and Daaher, was hammered down to Southern Equine Stable for \$2.7 million. Could the best be yet to come? We'll find out today in the form of hip 201.

"Well there aren't going to be too many more Storm Cats," he stated. "We see a lot of the same buyers that have been coming here for years and it seems all the big buyers are here. I think if you have a good horse with the right pedigree that the money is going to be there for that horse. We're looking forward to doing well."

The Amestoys have a broodmare band of about 15 on 132 acres near Paris.--*Alan Carasso*

Azeri was one of the last top horses bred by Allen Paulson, who passed away in 2000, and Michael views her and her foals as a tribute to his memory.

"She is like family," said Michael. "I always considered her a special gift my dad left behind for us when he passed away. She's a very special horse."

Asked about Vallenzeri's name, he explained, "I've got my dad's name in there. I was going to name him Allenzeri, but then he was born on St. Valentine's Day, so I added a 'V' to the front."

Michael said it was tough parting with a horse with such close ties to his father.

"It's very bittersweet," he said. "We were right there when he was born. We spent 17 days in the frigid cold out here after he was born. It's more for estate-planning purposes that I'm selling him. I'd love to keep him, and whoever buys him, if they'd consider it, I'd love to buy a portion of him back."

This spring, Azeri produced a Giant's Causeway filly, Michael reports. "She's the spitting image of Azeri--she has the same star and everything," he said. "She's an exceptional-looking filly. And Azeri's doing great. I spent an hour in the paddock with her and her foal at Hill 'n' Dale yesterday. She's a fabulous mother."

Azeri was bred back to Ghostzapper. "We're really excited about that--we're trying to stick with the Horse of the Year thing," said Michael. *-Lucas Marquardt*



Olly Tait has come a long way since his childhood days on his parent's farm in rural Australia. His travels



have taken him from a post-university stint in Sydney to Newmarket in Britain and back home to Australia, where he served as general manager of Darley's operation Down Under. Now, the 33year-old horseman, along with his wife Amber and three-month-old son Rupert, will plant new roots in Lexington, taking over from Dan

Pride as chief operating officer at Darley USA. Tait chatted with *TDN*'s Andy Belfiore about where he has been, and what he has ahead of him.

How did you get into the Thoroughbred business?

OT: I grew up on a sheep and cattle farm, and my father bred racehorses. That's where the interest came from. I then worked in Sydney as a chartered accountant for a few years after finishing university. I went to England in 1999 and wrote Darley a letter--I sought out a job and, luckily, I was given an opportunity there by John Ferguson, and I've been working for Darley ever since.

What gave you the idea of sending a letter of introduction, and why did you decide to send it to Darley? OT: I'm old-fashioned, and a letter seemed the appropriate way to express myself. I sent it to Darley because I was well aware of Sheikh Mohammed's position and status in the industry.


Had you considered a career as an accountant, or in any other business?

OT: No, I did accountancy because I knew it would be a good training for whichever way my life led later on. I didn't necessarily know that I'd end up in the horse business, but I always thought accountancy would be beneficial. My thoughts had always been that I'd probably end up being a farmer, but obviously I wanted to try different things before I did that, and the horse business interested me greatly, given the background I had in it. But at that time I certainly never really envisaged that I would end up in the role that I'm now in, or that my career would take the path that it has. I've been very lucky.

What was your first job with Darley?

OT: I was selling seasons for their English- and Irish-based stallions, and I spent two years based at Dalham Hall, in Newmarket. There were a couple of stallions that we were shuttling to Australia, and I got involved in the organization of that. Then, in 2001, Sheikh Mohammed decided to start an enterprise in Australia. We stood four stallions at Swettenham, Sangster's farm. We had an arrangement with them, but we were responsible for the management of the stallions; the seasons were under the Darley banner. That was the beginning of Darley in Australia. In 2003, Darley purchased a property, and we stood 10 stallions the first year, and built our own operation. My role was as the managing director. With the acquisition of Woodlands earlier this year, obviously it's now a very large operation. Darley now has four studs in Australia. It was a great challenge.





You started in England and then returned home to Australia. Did you have it in mind that you'd like to end up in Kentucky one day?

OT: I hadn't spent a lot of time in Kentucky, but I had visited on a number of occasions and, always in the back of my mind, I thought I'd love to work in Kentucky if ever given ever the opportunity. I was very lucky that this opportunity came up.

Did you have much time to prepare for the move to Darley USA?


OT: It's all transpired fairly quickly, but my wife and I are very comfortable with the decision—we're more than comfortable, we're excited about the challenges and opportunities that come with it, and also about the opportunity to come and live in America, in Kentucky and experience that.

Will it be difficult to make the transition from Australia to the U.S.?

OT: Yes and no--yes in that we're a long way from home, and we're a long way from our families and our friends. No in that Kentucky is a wonderful place to live. We've lived our lives in the horse business in Australia, which in many ways is not dissimilar to living life in the horse business in America. And also the people in Kentucky are very friendly and welcoming, and I know a number of people in Kentucky already, so that will make the adjustment easier. It's a big move, but it's very exciting. I'm going to go back and forth to Australia for a month or two--we have to organize the move--and I'll probably be here full time in Kentucky from mid-November on.

What will you miss most about Australia?

OT: My family, but they will be coming to visit. They are lined for that--that was organized on day 1.

Q&A With Olly Tait cont.

How do you feel about challenge of filling the role as chief operating officer of Darley USA?

OT: Both Dan Pride and Jimmy Bell have set up a great operation; Darley has made great progress in their operation in Kentucky and are one of the leaders in the industry here, and that's due to their hard work and their drive and direction. I've known Jimmy since he became involved in Darley and we've always got on very well, and I'm looking forward to that continuing, and drawing on his great experiences and his knowledge and getting advice from him. Dan is leaving big shoes to fill. He's a great person, he's a great personality. I think Darley in America has been very much identified with Jimmy and with Dan, but I'm confident that I'm up to the task. The experience I've had in Australia has been great grounding for this job. Darley in Australia is a large operation--we have over 1,000 horses, over 300 staff, about 11,000 acres of land, which is still a significant amount of land in Australian terms. I'm lucky enough that I have a good grounding for the job. But America is a different place, there are different people, different traditions, different customs, and that's what I've got to make sure I'm aware of and appreciative of and respectful of.

What is your first priority in your new role at Darley USA?

OT: That would be the challenge of getting to know the people in the industry--earning their respect and becoming friends with them. The industry comes together at Keeneland September and I expect to be in town to get around and try to meet as many new faces as possible. From that perspective, the timing is very important.




