A.P. INDY FILLY LEADS THE WAY AT KEESEP

When Jess Jackson's Stonestreet Mares purchased Chimichurri for \$2.1 million at the 2005 Keeneland

November Sale, it may have raised a few eyebrows. After all, the daughter of Elusive Quality had sold as a broodmare prospect at the sale two years earlier for \$675,000; the main difference the second time through the ring was that Chimichurri was in foal to Unbridled's Song. But the buy proved astute--Jackson has made back his investment, and then some. The profit margin was assured when hip 147, an A.P. Indy filly out of Chimichurri, elicited a session-topping bid of \$3.1 million from Darley's John Ferguson at yesterday's Keeneland September opener. The bay was consigned by Gainesway. "Sheikh Mohammed saw her earlier today, and both he and Princess Haya thought that she was an absolute queen--or a princess," said Ferguson. "We've been fortunate the last few years with A.P. Indy--Bernardini, Music Note, Little Belle, and some exciting two-year-olds right now. He's an absolutely exceptional sire. Chimichurri was a very fast filly and had a lot of quality, so this was a filly we were keen to have. Mr. Jackson deserves to be congratulated, because he's bred some lovely horses, and this was the highlight. It's so hard to breed fillies that look like this, and when you do, you deserve to be rewarded. She oozes class, she has a great shape, excellent conformation, and she's a real athlete." As for the final price, Ferguson commented, "I thought she was a strong-enough individual, with that pedigree, that she was going to be one of the top fillies in the sale. What you don't know is if the top filly in the sale is going to bring \$2.5 million or \$3 million. It's very hard to work that out." Added Gainesway's Michael Herson, "We felt this was the nicest filly in the sale, and the response to her indicated that." -Lucas Marquardt

THE BIGGEST BUYBACK

Vallenzeri, the A.P. Indy colt out of Horse of the Year Azeri (Jade Hunter) who was regarded by some as the potential Keeneland September topper, instead wound up topping something else altogether: the list of most expensive yearling RNAs in history. When the dust settled after a flourish of activity in the sales pavilion, it was revealed that the colt had been bought back by his breeder, The Allen E. Paulson Living Trust, at \$7.7 million.

"We were hoping to sell today, but obviously we were very aggressive with our reserve," said Michael Paulson. "He's a very unique horse. He's from two Horses of the Year, and he's the only horse on the planet you can say that about. Plus, he backed it up physically. We really feel that he's going to be the next super horse." The previous record for a buyback came at the 1985 Keeneland July Sale, when Oxford Stables' Ralph C. Wilson, owner of the NFL's Buffalo Bills, declined a \$7.4 million bid from the Maktoum family for a Northern Dancer colt he bred. Wilsons' attorney bought the colt back for \$7.5 million. A half to Group/1Grade I winners Formidable (*Forli) and Flying Partner (Hoist the Flag), Ajdal went on to become champion sprinter in England and France in 1987. -LM Cont. p2

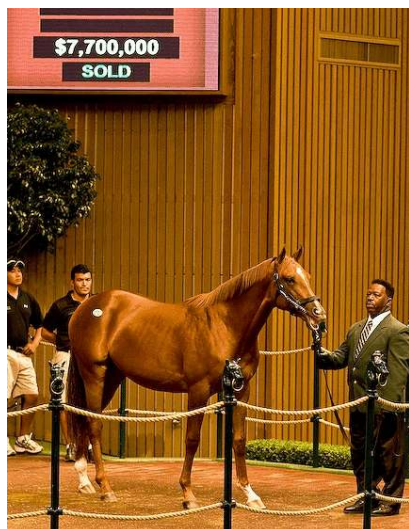

Michael Paulson said the next step would be to try and put together a partnership to race Vallenzeri.

"We were always hoping to stay in on the colt, and hopefully this will allow us to do that," he remarked.

"We've already talked to a few people, and hopefully we can put something together in the next few days. From what I understand, there were two parties bidding on him, so maybe we'll hear from them."

Paulson wouldn't say where Vallenzeri's reserve was set, but said they were "real close" to selling. "We're very emotionally attached to this horse, being Azeri's first foal," added Paulson.

"We were there when he was born in the freezing

cold--it was seven degrees here." Consigned by Hill 'n' Dale Sales Agency as hip 127, Vallenzeri stepped into the ring, and bidding almost immediately sped past the million-dollar mark. Action was focused inside the sale pavilion, and it appeared that representatives of the usual suspects--Coolmore and Darley--were not part of the scrum. Darley's John Ferguson later confirmed he did not bid. Michael Paulson, whose father Allen bred Azeri, had admitted before the sale that parting with the colt would be hard, given his family's attachment to Azeri and her foals. Azeri emerged as one of the best racemares of all time shortly after the death of Allen Paulson in 2000. She is North America's all-time female leading money earner and was named Horse of the Year in 2002. Vallenzeri's name breaks down into three parts: the 'V' because he was born on Valentine's Day, the 'allen' for Allen Paulson, and the 'zeri,' for, well, you know. -LM

From Buyers to Sellers...

B. Wayne Hughes and Jess Jackson have been recognized in recent years as buyers not afraid to dig deep

into their wallets to land a prospect. On the yearling scene, Hughes especially was a regular buyer of seven-figure prospects. But yesterday, Hughes and Jackson took on the role of sellers. Both men, Hughes through Spendthrift Farm and Jackson through Stonestreet

Farm, are taking a similar approach, pairing nicely bred mares to successful stallions, then sending their entire foal crops through the sales ring, primarily at the yearling sales.

After Day 1 results were in, both operations claimed success.

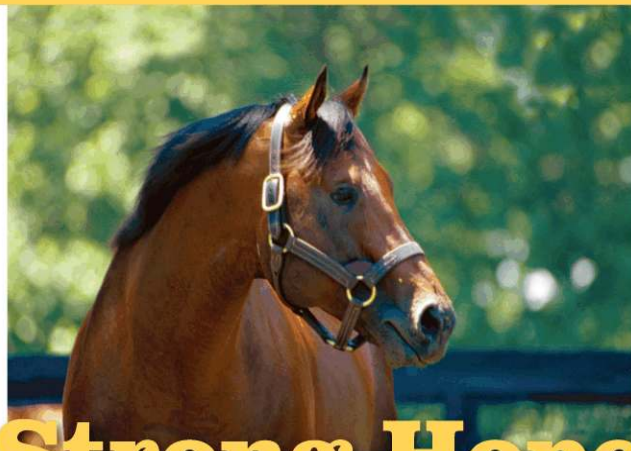
"We're real happy," said John Moynihan, chief advisor to Jackson. "We had to buy a couple back, but when you bring something to the market, you're going to have to do that sometimes. The market is what it is. The really top horses have sold beyond our expectations. In general, I think the market is holding up well. It's actually holding up better than I expected."

Stonestreet was responsible for the day's top lot, the A.P. Indy--Chimichurri filly who was purchased by Darley's John Ferguson for \$3.1 million.

"She was the best homebred filly we had since she was born," said Moynihan. "She was always drop-dead gorgeous. No problems, no issues. She was a star individual."

In addition to the A.P. Indy filly, Stonestreet was represented by [hip 90](#), a Ghostzapper--Ticket to Houston colt who made \$425,000; [hip 140](#), a Forestry--Brisquette who made \$600,000; [hip 180](#), an Elusive Quality--Forest Key filly who made \$200,000; and [hip 189](#), an A.P. Indy--Got Koko colt who made \$175,000. Stonestreet bought back two horses: [hip 222](#), a Storm Cat--Maggy Hawk half-sister to dual Classic winner Afleet Alex for \$650,000; and [hip 217](#), a Seeking the Gold--Lindy Wells colt for \$475,000. Gainesway consigned the session topper and hip 140; Warrendale Sales consigned hip 217, and Taylor Made consigned the remainder. Stonestreet will sell 74 yearlings in all at Keeneland September.

"The only things that aren't here are the horses that, for whatever veterinary reasons, weren't able to come," said Moynihan. "Mr. Jackson wanted to make a commitment to the market to bring everything we breed--both good and bad."

While Moynihan didn't sign a ticket for Stonestreet, he added that Jackson could be active later in the sale as a buyer. "We'll look at a few," he said.

Hughes, in contrast, did purchase a pair of yearlings yesterday, in addition to selling a few.

He paid \$450,000 for [hip 219](#), an Unbridled's Song--Lovely Rafaela colt; and \$250,000 for [hip 242](#), a Seeking the Gold--Munchkin colt, and said he went after several more.

"I've bid on seven or eight, and I got two," he said.

On the selling end, Hughes parted ways with [hip 14](#), a Mr. Greeley--Poetically filly for \$235,000; [hip 130](#), a Distorted Humor--Baltic Nations colt for \$700,000; and [hip 169](#), a Gone West--Dodie Mae filly for \$100,000. He bought back [hip 47](#), an Empire Maker--Sea Bloom filly for \$55,000; and [hip 167](#), an A.P. Indy--Desert Heat filly for \$180,000. Legacy Bloodstock and Taylor Made shared consigning duties.

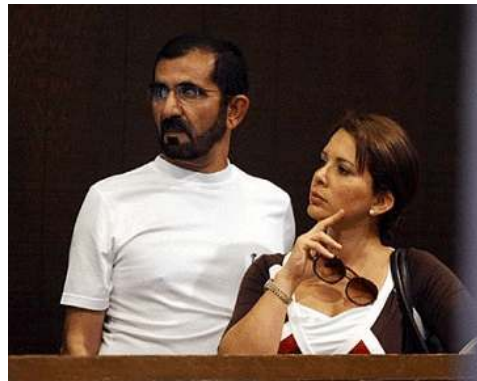
Hughes said he was selling about 30 yearlings all together at September.

"We're selling everybody, unless there's something wrong with them," he said, adding he was pleased with the results from the first session. "We've been trying to be reasonable with the reserve, and today we got all but [two] sold." -LM



Maktoum Power...

Last year, Sheikh Mohammed's reduced spending during Book 1 led to a 20-percent decrease in average for the select session. Nevertheless, after two days of selling in 2007, he had purchased 15 horses for \$16,230,000, an average of \$1,082,000. The vast majority of bloodstock agent John Ferguson's activity came on Day 1--a total of 13 buys, worth \$13,910,000 and

averaging \$1,070,000--were on Monday. Despite his curtailed spending, Ferguson represented 20.6 percent of last year's Day 1 gross.

Fast forward a year, and Ferguson is off to an even slower start in 2008. Thus far, the Darley rep has acquired nine head for \$8,825,000, an average of \$980,555. Still, he accounted for 15.7 percent of the September 2008 Day 1 gross.

Coolmore's Demi O'Byrne is off on his Day 1 spending as well. Last year, O'Byrne spent \$5,150,000 for five head on Day 1, a \$1,030,000 average. Yesterday, he bought two for \$1,375,000, a \$687,500 average.

The most significant change in spending perhaps belongs to Shadwell Farm, the operation of Sheikh Mohammed's brother Sheikh Hamdan. On Day 1 in 2007, Shadwell bought four yearlings for \$2,250,000 (\$562,500 average). By contrast, Shadwell acquired 12 yearlings yesterday, spending \$6,220,000 for them (\$518,333 average). The average price Shadwell paid for a horse was down a bit, but its gross was way up, with purchases accounting for 11.1 percent of Keeneland's Day 1 gross, compared to just 3.3 percent last term. -LM

Darley Lands Speightstown Sis For \$1.7 Mil...

The Keeneland September Sale was off to a moderate start yesterday, but an Unbridled's Song half-sister to champion Speightstown put some life into the proceedings about an hour and a half in. Selling as hip 56 from the draft of Taylor Made Sales Agency, the attractive chestnut filly sparked a bidding duel between WinStar Farm and Sheikh Mohammed's Darley operation, with John Ferguson finally securing the filly on a \$1.7 million bid. It was the co-second-highest price of the day. WinStar principals Kenny Troutt and Bill Casner sat alongside WinStar Vice President Elliot Walden in the back row of the sales pavilion, while Ferguson, with Sheikh Mohammed and his wife Princess Haya, stood in his usual spot under the spotter in back. It was Ferguson's first purchase of the day, but he quickly added two more prospects. He went to \$550,000 for [hip 59](#), an A.P. Indy--Penny's Fortune (Storm Cat) colt from the draft of Three Chimneys, agent; and then went to \$400,000 for [hip 61](#), a Street Cry (Ire)--Soundtrack (Lear Fan) colt from Denali Stud, agent for Gallagher's Stud. **Cont. p6**

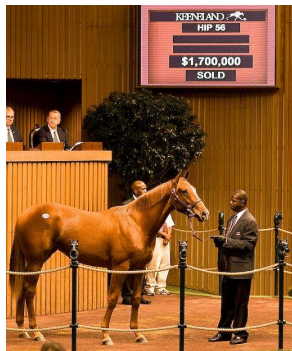

Jones acquired Silken Cat privately as a broodmare prospect upon the completion of her racing career, and she immediately hit one out of the park for the Joneses when her first foal, the Gone West colt Speightstown, was knocked down to Eugene Melnyk as a yearling for \$2 million. Silken Cat's fourth foal, a full sibling to hip 56 named Tigerline, sold for \$1.4 million in 2003, while a full sister to

Speightstown, named Gone Purrfect, was knocked down to Live Oak Plantation for \$1.5 million at this sale a year ago.

Marie Jones was on hand yesterday to watch a fourth yearling out of Silken Cat bring seven figures.

"I knew that she was going to do that, with that pedigree," she confided. "And she looked so much like her mother--I think she is going to be a real good runner. I just heard that the Sheikh bought her, so she's going to a good home. You love all of your horses, but I'm very happy with what [Silken Cat] has produced, and happy this filly is going to a good home."

Silken Cat has a weanling by Bernardini and was covered by Gone West this year.

Taylor Made's Frank Taylor is confident Sheikh Mohammed has a good one on his hands. "I think she was one of the best fillies we've ever raised," he said. "The mare's a champion, she's produced a champion, and I thought that was a good price. She's a special filly, and I think they'll do well with her."

Asked to comment on the sale's sluggish start, Taylor commented, "It's too early to tell, but we're having more RNAs than I'd like. But hopefully there'll be an after market, and get the buyers and seller in synch."

Playful Act's Filly Heading to Europe...

Playful Act (Ire) (Sadler's Wells) brought a world-record \$10.5 million when she sold at Keeneland last November, so there was plenty of hype when the mare's yearling filly by Giant's Causeway entered the ring yesterday. The bay sold for \$850,000 to the bid of British bloodstock agent John Warren. It wasn't quite the fireworks of her dam, but Warren commented, "It's still a lot of money." Warren is director of Highclere Thoroughbred Racing, but yesterday's purchase was for a different, unnamed client. "She is a lovely filly and she's going back to Europe," Warren said. "I'm very pleased to have her." Warren said options for European buyers at Keeneland can be limited. "I always say that for Europeans, if you're converting American bloodlines to Europe, obviously the catalogue is thin compared to how it used to be a number of years ago," he explained. "So, from my point of view, I have only limited options of what would suit to be taken back, that I could say could be taken back with any confidence. I'm not saying that they won't work, but I'm saying that they wouldn't be pedigrees that I would be confident about converting to turf." He thinks he's found one pedigree that will work. Racing for the legendary Sangster family, Playful Act won the G1 Meon Valley Stud Mile and was second in the G1 Irish Oaks. "It is a beautiful family," Warren said. "Obviously the dam has been very well mated, she's in foal to Street Cry (Ire), and what can you say about a family that can produce Group 1 winners. The dam was a wonderful mile filly, and I hope this filly will obviously be a great racehorse. I thought she was a very pretty, well-made attractive filly who did everything right." The yearling was consigned by Hill 'n' Dale Sales Agency as part of the Swettenham Stud dispersal. -*Jessica Martini*

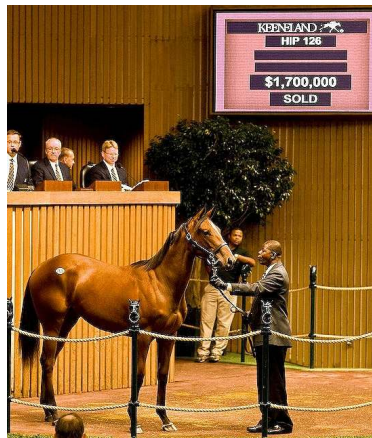

Kelly Sees the Light...

Jon Kelly made only one bid yesterday when hip 126 was in the ring, but it was the only bid that mattered.

Kelly went to \$1.7 million to bring home the daughter of GI Belmont S. winner Empire Maker out of Aurora (Danzig). The filly is a full sister to this year's GIII Dogwood S. winner Acoma. "She's got good conformation and she has a great family, and a trusted friend bred her," Kelly said. Graded-stakes placed on the track, Aurora is the dam of Grade I winner and sire Arch (Kris S.), as well as group winner

Festival of Light (A.P. Indy) and stakes winner Alisios (Kris S.). Kelly, a former television executive, owns about 70 horses. He and his wife Sarah campaigned multiple Grade I winner Borrego. Kelly went to \$2.8 million to buy Grade I winner Vacare (Lear Fan) out of the 2006 Fasig-Tipton Kentucky November sale. Now five, Vacare recently won the GII Palomar H. for the Kellys. Yesterday's seven-figure price tag was not a big surprise to Kelly. "I expected it would be about there," he confirmed. The yearling was bred by Alexander-Groves Thoroughbreds and was consigned by Helen Alexander's Middlebrook Farm. -JM

Consignors Content with Market...

An air of uncertainty surrounded the beginning of the September sale, but as Monday's opening session drew to a close, consignors seemed satisfied with the day's results. "I think it's ok," said Duncan Taylor of Taylor Made. "I don't think it's great--it's a steady market. I've heard that the average is down some, but the median is pretty close to even or even. It's a tight market. We'll see what happens for the rest of the sale." Taylor Made sold 40 yearlings for a gross of \$13,065,000 and an average of \$326,625. Reiley McDonald of Eaton Sales thought the first-day market weathered all the uncertainties. "I thought, in general, it was very strong, considering where we thought we might be at the beginning of the day," he said. "The good horses sold well, the market was a little tighter than it has been in the last couple of years, but that's what we expected going in. I think if people are realistic about their horses going in, they are selling well. Pretty much the way it's been with our clients, if you set the reserve, well, for the most part, it's been a good sale." Eaton sold 19 yearlings for a total of \$7,810,000 and an average of \$411,052. Gainesway Farm, which consigned the day's \$3.1-million top-priced yearling, was off to a strong September start, according to the farm's Michael HERNON. "I think the market is very fair," he said. "We have sold eight of nine that we've brought to the ring, so I think we are going to maintain our highest-level clearance rate of consignors, and that's our goal. We've got quite a few more to go, but we've got some very good prospects right through the sale. And we're looking forward to the balance of this week and next week." Gainesway sold seven yearlings for a total of \$5,090,000 and an average of \$727,142. -JM

What They're Saying At The Sales...

Darley bloodstock advisor John Ferguson:

"I would say the market doesn't feel too much different to last year. We're only halfway through, but we've had Fasig July and Saratoga, and I'd say the market is a little sticky. I think there is value to be had. So if somebody's thinking of buying a racehorse, this would be a good year to do it."

A Good Start, All Things Considered...

Keeneland's Director of Sales Geoffrey Russell professed himself satisfied with the results of the first day of the September sale. "I would call it very solid from start to finish," Russell said. "The world is a totally different world from this time last year. And I think the results were very favorable." While the average fell 7.7 percent to \$363,942, the median held steady from a year ago at \$300,000. But the number of million-dollar yearlings fell from 11 during 2007's first session to just five yesterday. Explaining the drop, Russell said, "We only had one major tussle on the A.P. Indy colt, but all the way through was a very consistent and solid exercise. We are in a different era all of a sudden. The world is a different place. But, based on the economic climate of the moment, I thought today was very favorable and very solid. I think it's where the market is at the moment." There were 63 horses reported not sold yesterday, for a buy-back rate of 29 percent. That is up 20.8 percent from last year's figures, when 54 horses failed to sell for a buy-back rate of 24 percent. The sale continues today at 10 a.m. -JM

Trackside's Three Amigos...

Tom Evans's Trackside Farm holds a strong hand going into Tuesday's second session of the September Sale. Trackside will send three yearlings through the ring today. "Tom has three great prospects here on Tuesday," confirmed Rob Whiteley, whose Liberation Farm co-bred two of the youngsters. "Each has a great physical and solid credentials." **Hip 391**, consigned by Trackside on behalf of Evans, Macon Wilmil Equines and Marjac Farms, is a half brother to sprint champion Midnight Lute (Real Quiet). **Hip 317**, co-bred by Liberation and Stonewall Farm, is "an impressive stallion prospect," according to Whiteley. The colt is out of Swift and Classy (Clever Trick), a half sister to Silvery Swan, the dam of Roman Ruler, El Corredor, Silver Tornado and Maimonides. **Hip 246**, a son of Hennessy out of Never is a Promise (Capote), was bred by Liberation and Oratis. "He is a great walking half brother to recent Grade I winner Ever a Friend (Crafty Friend)," said Whiteley. "He is likely to be very versatile, because he is by Hennessy. Ever a Friend was sensational in the GI Kilroe Mile, kicking away from a solid Grade I field on the grass." Whiteley added, "All three of them should perform well on every surface." -JM

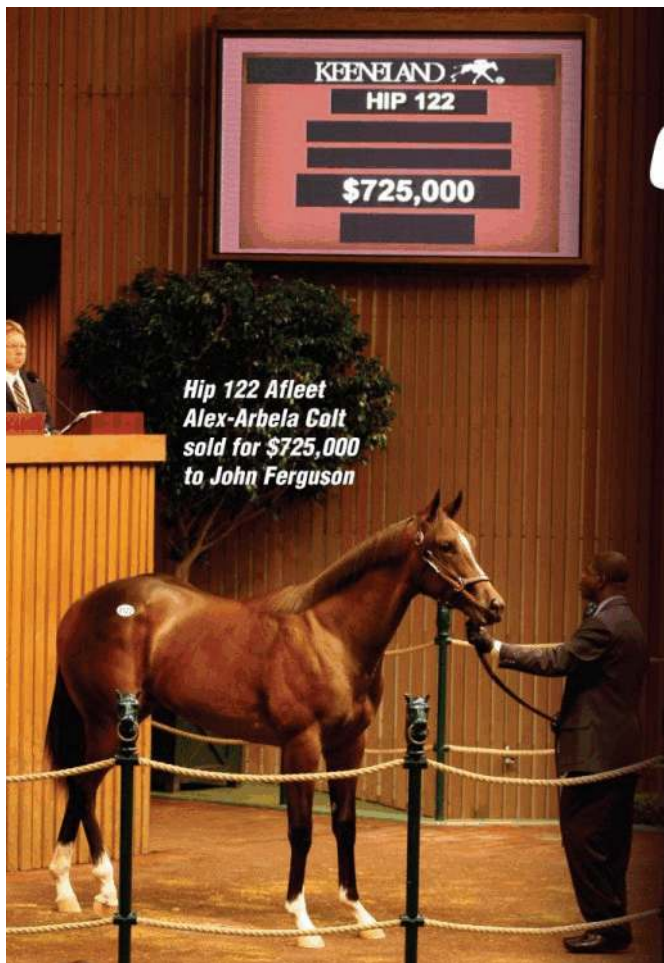

ST LEGER ATTRACTS 18 Doncaster's four-day St Leger Festival kicks off tomorrow, and the highlight of the meeting, Saturday's £500,000 G1 Ladbrokes St Leger, drew a field of 18 at the yesterday's five-day stage. The card for the world's oldest Classic will be eroded when the big guns trim the size of their St Leger teams in readiness for the extended 14-furlong contest. Aidan O'Brien, who bids for a fourth win in the race, has become accustomed to managing large raceday teams, and that statistic will not change this week. His eight remaining possibles are headed by G1 Irish Derby winner **Frozen Fire (Ger)** (Montjeu {Ire}), but

which of the octet will lead the attack hinges on upcoming workouts. The team is completed by **Alessandro Volta (GB)** (Montjeu {Ire}), **Bashkirov (GB)** (Galileo {Ire}), **Hindu Kush (Ire)** (Sadler's Wells), **King of Westphalia** (Kingmambo), **New Zealand (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}), **Washington Irving (Ire)** (Montjeu {Ire}) and **William Hogarth (GB)** (High Chaparral {Ire}). "It's a great race, we are delighted to have horses in it every year, and all of the eight are very strong," O'Brien said. "Frozen Fire and Alessandro Volta have to work before we decide whether they both run. Washington Irving ran well in the G3 Ballyroan S., and this trip should suit him. It would be great to win another St Leger."

Filly Ready to Face the Boys...

Ralph Beckett's G1 Epsom Oaks heroine **Look Here (GB)** (Hernando {Fr}) was the subject of an injury scare in the build-up, and will go to post directly off her June 6 Classic score. Her trainer doesn't think the additional distance will be beyond his star filly's scope, who bids to become the first distaffer to win since User Friendly (GB) in 1992. "I don't think the St Leger trip will be an issue, and she galloped out really well at Epsom," Beckett said. "She hasn't had a hard year, the ground should suit and Eddie Ahern will ride her." But the conditioner added, "The opposition looks strong; Frozen Fire was very impressive in the Irish Derby, and looks as if he will stay the trip."

No Shows...

Newmarket-based conditioner John Gosden, responsible for last term's hero **Lucarno** (Dynaformer), will be without a representative this time around after it was decided not to supplement **Centennial (Ire)** (Dalakhani {Ire}). The G2 Great Voltigeur S. winner will sidestep the Yorkshire marathon in favor of a tilt at the following afternoon's G2 Prix Niel at Longchamp. Joining him on the sidelines will be Ballymacoll Stud's **Patkai (Ire)** (Indian Ridge {Ire}). "Patkai was not declared, as I wasn't satisfied with his work on Saturday," revealed, trainer Sir Michael Stoute, who bids to improve upon a record of five seconds in the St Leger. The Bury Road trainer will be aided in that quest by a maximum team of three: G3 Gordon S. winner **Conduit (Ire)** (Dalakhani {Ire}), G1 Epsom Derby fourth **Doctor Fremantle (GB)** (Sadler's Wells) and **Warringah (GB)** (Galileo {Ire}). "Conduit goes so well on fast ground, so I wouldn't want the ground to be heavy, and I would be hopeful he would get the trip," Stoute remarked. "Doctor Fremantle should get the trip, but he just needs to switch off a bit. We had to miss the Voltigeur with him and he's been a bit behind schedule, but I am happy with him at the moment." The remaining St Leger entries are headed by David Brownlow's G1 Deutsches Derby third **Top Lock (GB)** (Nayef) and the unbeaten G3 Give Thanks S. victress **Unsung Heroine (Ire)** (High Chaparral {Ire}) from Tommy Stack's Co. Tipperary yard.

Twice in the past four years, the Del Mar Futurity has been won by the youngster that went on to collect the Eclipse Award for two-year-old male, so it ought to pay to keep a close eye on this year's winner, Midshipman. He has already shown he's very much at home on a synthetic surface, so it isn't hard to envisage him developing into a leading contender for the Breeders' Cup Juvenile at Santa Anita if he continues to shine in the Norfolk S. later this month.



Pedigree Insights cont.

In maintaining his unbeaten record, the Stonerside-bred colt underlined the wisdom of Sheikh Mohammed's latest block purchase, while at the same time keeping the spotlight turned squarely on his sire Unbridled's Song (himself a winner of the Breeders' Cup Juvenile). The Taylor Made stallion was scoring his second Grade I victory in the space of five days, following First Defence's impressive success in the Forego S., and the 15-year-old now has a 2008 total of six graded winners, a figure bettered by only two other American-based stallions, Giant's Causeway and Kingmambo.

For the record, Unbridled's Song's other graded winners are the much-missed Eight Belles, Honest Man, Noonmark and Thorn Song, so they cover every year group from two to five. As his progeny have also enjoyed graded success on dirt, turf and synthetic, Unbridled's Song can claim to be a versatile stallion, but he appears to be slightly less versatile when it comes to distance.

Unbridled's Song himself started favorite for the Kentucky Derby, over a distance which should have been well within the capacity of a horse sired by Unbridled from a Caro mare. However, he weakened from second to fifth in the stretch.

One theory attributed his sudden fade-out to his having done too much in his work three days before the Derby, when he covered a half mile in :46 seconds, but the chances are that the main problem was simply the final eighth. Unbridled's Song was never again asked to tackle more than a mile and an eighth during a career which ended with a victory in the Olympic H. over seven furlongs.

The majority of his 12 stakes winners this year have followed a similar path, with only Honest Man and Summer Patriot winning beyond 1 1/16 miles. His overall record shows that a mile and an eighth is no problem for many of his better progeny, and his Grade I winners Unbridled Elaine, Buddha, Magnificent Song and Splended Blended have all won prestigious races over that route, as have their fellow graded winners Eurosilver, Even The Score, Last Song, Thorn Song, Rockport Harbor, Domestic Dispute and Barracuda Boy.

It is a somewhat different story over the extended distance of 1 1/4 miles, but Political Force (GI Suburban H.), Octave (GI CCA Oaks) and Rare Gift (GIII Ladies H.) have all shown that Unbridled's Songs can occasionally last the Derby distance.

So how far can Midshipman be expected to stay?

It is interesting that the Stonerside colt is bred along similar lines to First Defence. Whereas the latter is out of a daughter of Seattle Slew, Midshipman is out of a granddaughter of the 1977 Triple Crown winner. Although First Defence has a stakes victory over 1 1/16 miles to his credit, shorter distances seem to bring out the best in this royally bred colt. It mustn't be forgotten that First Defence's dam Honest Lady never won beyond seven furlongs and was fast enough to finish second in the Breeders' Cup Sprint.

Midshipman's dam Fleet Lady was also well above average and possessed speed. However, this daughter of Avenue of Flags was very much at home over a mile and an eighth at four, as she showed with her victory in the GII La Canada S., so Midshipman should eventually stay at least that far. He is the second graded winner from Fleet Lady's first six live foals, his predecessor being the Deputy Minister filly Fast Cookie, winner of the GII Cotillion H. over 1 1/16 miles.

Although Midshipman has yet to carry the colors of his new owner, Sheikh Mohammed knows this family well. He enjoyed considerable success with Salse, a half-brother to Midshipman's second dam Dear Mimi. A tough performer with a spirited temperament, Salse rarely finished out of the first two, and achieved the notable feat of winning five group races over seven furlongs as a three-year-old, including the G2 Challenge S. and G1 Prix de la Foret.

Salse went on to sire half a dozen Group 1 winners of widely different type, ranging from the fast juvenile fillies Lemon Souffle and Bianca Nero to the top miler Air Express and the high-class stayers Classic Cliche and Luso.

Incidentally, anyone looking for a yearling colt bred to a similar pattern to Midshipman and First Defence won't have long to wait. Hip number 267, which sells on Tuesday, is an Unbridled's Song colt out of a mare by Seattle Slew's son Septieme Ciel, and has the added attraction of being a half-brother to the GI Champagne S. winner Proud Accolade (Yes It's True). There were also two colts bred along similar lines on the opening day. Hip number 218, a half-brother to that fast filly Happy Ticket (Anet), is out of another Septieme Ciel mare, while 219 is out of Lovely Rafaela, a Grade II-winning daughter of A.P. Indy.

Stall Blankenese's **Kamsin (Ger)** (Samum {Ger}) was most convincing when comfortably taking Sunday's G1 Grosser Preis von Baden from last year's German Derby victor **Adlerflug (Ger)** (In the Wings {GB}) and **It's Gino (Ger)** (Perugino) (*see Monday's TDN*). This marked Kamsin's third Group 1 win following his impressive victory in the G1 Deutsches Derby and his inheritance of the G1 Rheinland-Pokal following last week's disqualification of **Oriental Tiger (Ger)** (Tiger Hill {Ire}). Kamsin now heads his generation and could have one more outing this year. "I quickly realised this would be a fast run race, so I left Kamsin in behind to settle and then made my move in the straight," said winning jockey Johan Victoire. It was a timely victory for the sophomore and enhanced celebrations for Stall Blankenese's Franz-Gunther von Gaertner, who enjoyed his 80th birthday last week. Kamsin is the octogenarian's third German Derby and multiple Group 1 winner, the others being Kamsin's sire Samum (Ger) (Monsun {Ger}) and the latter's own brother Schiaparelli (Ger). All three were bred and raised at Gestut Karlshof, which has now bred three winners of the German Derby in eight years. Samum can also boast the Group 2-winning and the G1 Preis der Diana placed filly Baila Me (Ger) from his second crop.

Kamsin's dam is the Group 3 winning mare Kapitoll (Ger), who was bred from the Surumu (Ger) mare Karlshorst (Ger). With Samum being by Monsun out of a mare by Sadler's Wells dual Derby winning son Old Vic (GB), Kamsin features Surumu 4x3 and Sadler's Wells 4x4 in his pedigree.

Earlier in the week, the G2 Darley Oettingen-Rennen became easy prey for the four-year-old **Lovelace (GB)** (Royal Applause {GB}) (see *Wednesday's TDN*), who also scored in the G3 Supreme S. on the same day last year. The G3 Furstenberg-Rennen marked the third pattern victory for the three-year-old colt **Liang Kay (Ger)** (Dai Jin {GB}) (see *Thursday's TDN*) whose previous exploits include the G2 Oppenheim Union-Rennen and a fourth place in the German Derby. He hails from the first crop of the 2003 German Derby hero Dai Jin, a son of Peintre Celebre.

The G3 Maurice Lacroix Trophy (See *Saturday's TDN*)--one of three domestic group races for juveniles--saw the emergence of a very good filly with a plenty of potential when Gestut Wittekindshof's **Serienhoehe (Ire)** (High Chaparral {Ire}) maintained her unbeaten record in easy fashion. She is her sire's third individual group winner and is the first foal bred from the winning and listed-placed Saldenehre (Ger) (Highest Honor {Fr}), whose dam Salde (Ger) scored in listed company and is a daughter of the smart classic winning champion miler Alkalde (Ger), himself a son of Konigsstuhl (Ger), just like Germany's stellar sire Monsun (Ger). Salde produced the dual group-winning filly Saldenschwinge (Ger) to a mating with In the Wings (GB), another son of Sadler's Wells, and is also the dam of the Group 3 victress Saldentigerin (Ger).

The Baden-Baden Summer Racing Festival may have suffered a turn for the worse regarding the overall betting turnover, but the upcoming structural reform should help the country to gain new strength and be optimistic, notwithstanding the unprecedented and continued international recognition of the German Thoroughbred in the past decade.
