LEGENDS IN THE MAKING

A new buying force emerged on the scene in earnest yesterday. Legends Racing, the new racing partnership launched by Olin Gentry and Thomas Gaines in June,

made themselves known during Monday's opening session of the Keeneland September Sale. But yesterday, the operation really kicked it into gear. During Tuesday's second session, Legends acquired five yearlings for \$4,650,000, in-


cluding four at \$1 million or more. Legends' top-priced yearling was hip 331, a Storm Cat half-brother to Horse of the Year Point Given, which went for \$1.2 million. Taylor Made Sales Agency consigned the colt.

Also on the ledger was hip 317, an El Prado (Ire) colt from Tom Evans's Trackside Farm; and hip 323, a Mr. Greeley colt offered by Gainesway, both of which went for \$1 million, as well as an Unbridled's Song colt from Taylor Made which elicited a \$1.15 million bid. Cont. p2

Shadwell Shopping Spree Continues...

Sheikh Hamdan's Shadwell Estate Company was busy during Monday's opening session of the Septem-

ber sale, purchasing 12 lots, and the operation stayed busy on Tuesday. Shadwell Vice President and General Manager Rick Nichols saw off the team from WinStar Farm to bring home the session-topping son of A.P. Indy for \$1.5 million. The bay colt, consigned as hip 318, is out of Taegu (Halo) and is a half-brother to multiple graded stakes winner Classic Elegance. "It's a nice upcoming pedigree, Rick Nichols a very nice individual and he's by A.P.Indy," Nichols explained. "He's a nice strong colt; very correct. He's got good bone to him." The yearling will likely be heading to the barn of

trainer Kiaran McLaughin in New York. The seven-figure price tag wasn't a complete surprise to Nichols. "I didn't know what he would do," he commented. "He could have gone on if somebody hooked up, but we expected about what we got." Shadwell was the second leading buyer Monday, purchasing 12 yearlings for \$6,220,000. Tuesday, Shadwell bought five yearlings for \$3.5 million and was the third leading buyer. During the first two sessions of last year's sale, Shadwell purchased 11 head for \$6.15 million. Cont. p2

Legends Gets Going...

On June 9, Olin Gentry and Thomas Gaines, along with investment banker Tripp Hardy, announced the inception of the Thoroughbred Legends Racing Fund, a sort of uber-racing partnership that aimed to raise substanital funds from high-end investors to buy young horses. Hall of Fame trainers Nick Zito and D. Wayne Lukas, as well as three-time Kentucky Derby winner Bob Baffert, signed up to help select and to train the horses.

While Legends \$1,200,000 Racing made its presence known at Saratoga, where its purchases included a \$700,000 colt by Rock Hard Ten, it wasn't until Keeneland that things really got rolling. On Monday, Legends purchased five head for just

over \$2 million. Yesterday, Legends showed it wasn't afraid to clash with the industry titans by going after, and securing, a quartet of seven-figure prospects. Legends purchased five overall on Tuesday for \$4.65 million, second only to John Ferguson's purchases on the day of \$6.83 million Over the first two days of the sale, Legends spent a total of \$6,655,000--third to Ferguson (\$15,655,000) and Shadwell (\$9,720,000)--accounting for 5.9 percent of Keeneland's Book 1 receipts.

"They played a very important role today," said Keeneland Director of Sales Geoffrey Russell. "Not only were they successful bidders at the top end, but they also played the underbidder role several times, too."

The emergence of Legends helps fill a void left by the death of Bob Lewis, traditionally a big spender in the yearling markets, and the more recent scaled-back spending B. Wayne Hughes, Zayat Stables and others in 2008.

"Any time you get a new investor or owner into the game that plays at the top level, it's very important," said Russell. -Lucas Marquardt

Nichols said the flurry of activity did not reflect a change in direction for Shadwell. "It's no different from any other year," he said. "We had a very good day yesterday, got everything within budget. We set our prices--if they go higher we leave them. We come to the sales to buy what we like. There is no change in policy or anything like that; we just had a good day." -JM

Brilliant Result on A.P. Indy Colt...

Greg Goodman, who owns and operates the Lexington-based Mt. Brilliant Farm, has had bigger sales, but you might not have guessed from Goodman's broad smile after watching hip 318, an A.P. Indy--Taegu colt bred by Mt. Brilliant, sell for \$1.5 million. Shadwell's Rich Nichols signed the ticket. It was the

top price for a yearling during yesterday's second session of the September Sale.

"We've sold Pavarotti (A.P. Indy) to Coolmore for \$2.8 million, we've sold a Seeking the Gold filly for \$1.9 million to Sheikh Mohammed, but, in a market like this, this is an awesome sale," Goodman enthused from his barn shortly after the transaction.

The dam of the colt is the 12year-old Halo mare Taegu, who was carrying this fellow when she was offered by Brereton Jones, agent, at the 2006 Keeneland November Sale. Taegu Hip 318 was was led out of the ring unsold at \$975,000, but shortly

after, Mike Ryan, acting on behalf of Mt. Brilliant, offered \$950,000 and completed the purchase privately.

Based on Taegu's first foal, Goodman was confident he'd made a good buy.

"This colt was great from the time he was born; he was awesome," said Goodman. "He was always strong--really strong--and he was a smart horse."

"He was always composed. The most excited I ever saw him was his first day out here--it took him a while to get used to it. But after a little bit, he just put his head down and did everything he was supposed to."

Mt. Brilliant's farm manager, Jody Alexander, admitted he wasn't quite sure what to expect when they led the colt into the ring.

> "We knew he was a good colt and a real nice individual, but once we saw the prices, we thought, boy, the colts aren't selling so well," he said. "I knew we had a lot of play on him, but I wasn't sure about the price."


> Goodman, a resident of Houston, Texas, started Mt. Brilliant 11 years ago, but has long had ties with the sport--including some to his colt's sire. Goodman's father was Harold Goodman, who purchased--along with Will Farish and W.S. Kilroy--a significant interest in A.P Indy shortly after the colt's win in the GI Belmont S.

"My dad was also the leading owner in Texas over the last three or four years of his life," said Goodman. "He stood the leading stallion in Texas, a horse named Manzotti, and he was a

leading breeder in Texas for a long time. And he raced one of the best Texas-breds of all time, a filly named Two Altazano (Manzotti)."

Goodman reports that while Taegu did not have a foal in 2008, she is back in foal carrying a 3/4-brother to this colt by Bernardini. -LM

Giant's Causeway Filly Heading to Europe...

Australian bloodstock agent Troy Steve, acting on behalf of an unnamed European client, went to \$1.25

million to secure hip 360, a daughter of Giant's Causeway. Steve had one word to explain his attraction to the filly. "Pedigree," he said. The chestnut is out of Alidiva (Ire) (Chief Singer) and is a full sister to graded stakes winner Oonagh Maccool (Ire). Alidiva is also the dam of English 1000 Guineas winner Sleepytime (Ire) (Royal Academy), multiple Group 1 winner Taipan (Last Tycoon)

and English Group 1 winner Ali-Royal (Royal Academy). Steve added the filly was purchased with an eye towards her future as a broodmare. "She will go into training in the UK, and look for her to be a racehorse and then carry on with her as a broodmare in the future," Steve said. "Touch wood, she can come out and perform. The family is already there on the page for everyone to see." According to Steve, his client is wellaquainted with the family. "He is already involved in the family, so we've been keeping track of a fair bit of it," the agent said. "We had a good look at her in the fall, and she wasn't far away from being a singular model. So, hopefully, she can come out and do what Oonagh Maccool did." Steve, who has been based in England since 2002, spent time at Lanwades Stud and Mead Goodbody Ltd, before opening his own bloodstock agency. He cited the exchange rate as a factor in making more Keeneland more attractive to European buyers and added, "You don't neccessarily collide on as many horses as you would, at, say, Tattersalls." Of his overall impression of the market, Steve said, "Wandering around yesterday, I thought it looked like it was going very well. But then when you got the results sheet and the amount of RNAs that were there, I suppose the credit crunch is hitting. Those good animals with the big pedigrees, they're always going to sell themselves-that's not a problem. I think people in the middle market are finding it a little bit tough to get their horses shifted if they have faults, or are just a little bit lacking." -JM

One In, One Out for WinStar...

WinStar Farm was the underbidder on an A.P. Indy colt earlier in the session, but the team got its colt Tuesday when Elliott Walden signed the \$1.2-million ticket as Maverick Racing for hip 413, a son of the farm's resident stallion Distorted Humor. "We obviously

think Distorted Humor is the best stallion in the world," Doug Cauthen admitted. "So we like to support him." The stallion aside, Cauthen said the yearling stood out on his own. "This horse just had it all," he said. "He was a great physical, he's out of a Grade I winner and he's by a great sire. So we were just happy to take a shot." The bay colt is out of G1 Meon Valley Stud Fillies' Mile S. heroine Crystal Music (Nureyev), a half-sister to group winners

Dubai Success (Sadler's Wells), State Crystal (High Estate {Ire}) and Solar Crystal (Alzao). Cauthen thinks WinStar has purchased a versatile runner. "Now, with Polytrack, this horse looks like a horse that could run on dirt or turf or Poly," he explained. "And the Distorted Humors seem to run on any surface. We have a nice group of trainers that have done really well for us, so hopefully they can do well with this colt."

WinStar didn't have to wait long to recoup cash, as a colt bred by the farm sold just five hips later for an identical \$1.2 million. The son of Giant's Causeway, consigned by Four Star Sales, agent, as hip 418, was purchased by Satish Sanan's Padua Stables. "We thought he was the best horse in the sale, and I'm not just saying that because everyone says that," Sanan said, pointing to the colt's page in the catalogue, on which he had clearly written, "Best in sale." Padua is in the process of restructuring their operation, moving from their Florida base to the Lexington area.

"We are transititioning from the old program to the new program," Sanan explained. "We are trying to focus on the high end, both in terms of the broodmares

and the colts, and we thought this is a colt that really fits the profile. If he goes on to win, and I hope he does, he becomes a stallion. He's got the pedigree, he's got the page, he's got the athleticism. So let's hope he does that." The purchase was a bright spot in an otherwise frustrating day for Sanan. "We haven't been able to buy a horse all day today," he said. "We bought one yesterday

and were underbidders on five today. It is very competitive for the good horses." The Padua tradition is already being passed on to the next generation, as Sanan's grandson Cullen helped mom Nadia sign the ticket on the colt. -JM

What They're Saying At The Sales...

Doug Cauthen, WinStar Farm

"I think there is some restraint by everyone. I think it's the function of the market and a function of the economy, but good horses are selling well. I think we're going to see more of that for the rest of the sale. Just a little bit of a restriction. Everyone is being a little price sensitive. If there is a good-looking horse that walks out there, they're going to bring plenty of money. And then, based on the pedigree, that dictates how much they can bring. Everybody has to be sensible with their reserves or start a racing stable. But, it's pretty healthy when you can get \$1.2 million for an unproven racehorse."

Seven-Figure Success for Bill Farish...

It was fitting that Bill Farish's first Grade I winner would provide him his first million-dollar yearling, too. Yesterday, an A.P. Indy daughter of Farish's Shadow

Cast (Smart Strike) made an even \$1 million off a bid from Darley representative John Ferguson. It was the first foal out of Farish's homebred Shadow Cast, who earned a big 112 BRIS figure winning the GI Personal Ensign H. in August of 2005. It was Farish's first Grade I win as an owner, and his second as breeder.

Farish, whose family owns Lane's End Farm, had high hopes for the Feb. 4-foaled bay, but said he was satisfied with the final price.

"I loved her, personally, but maybe I'm biased," he said of hip

288. "She could have broken out, I thought, but in this market, a million dollars for a horse is just fine."

Asked if it was indeed his first million-dollar yearling as breeder, he took a second, smiled, and said, "Yes, I guess it is. I didn't think about it. But I always thought she could do it."

Farish said Shadow Cast dropped a Storm Cat colt this spring and is back in foal to Bernardini. Asked if the plan was to sell everything out of the mare, Farish quipped, "I don't know. If a couple more sell like this, hopefully we won't have to."

It was the second A.P. Indy yearling Ferguson had bought during September. Ferguson also walked away with Monday's session topper, the \$3.1-million filly out of Chimichurri. -LM

Big Brown Sis RNAs...

Hip 484 entered the Keeneland ring yesterday with some big shoes to fill. The chestnut, by Touch Gold, is a half sister to GI Kentucky Derby and GI Preakness S. winner Big Brown (Boundary). She was offered by her, and Big Brown's breeder, Monticule. Bidding reached \$200,000, but it wasn't enough and the filly was led out unsold.

Wygod Scratches Storm Cat--Tranquility Lake Colt...

Prominent owner Marty Wygod made the last-minute decision to scratch the Storm Cat--Tranquility Lake colt he bred with his wife Pam from the Keeneland September Sale. The colt was slated to sell from Lane's End's consignment as hip 329.

The Wygods have previously had plenty of success both breeding and selling out of their dual Grade I winner Tranquility Lake. Her son After Market, a Wygod homebred, was one of the best grass horses last year, with his wins including the GI Eddie Read H. and GI Charles Whittingham Memorial H. After Market stood his first season at Lane's End this spring.

And at the 2005 September Sale, the Wygods sold another son, Jalil, to Sheikh Mohammed for a sale-topping \$9.7 million. Jalil became a Group 2 winner in Dubai. Both horses are by Storm Cat and thus full-siblings to hip 329.

"After Market is one of Marty's favorites, and this colt looked so much like him," explained Lane's End chief Will Farish. "They're both big horses with great knees; he is just a wonderful colt." Asked what he thought the colt might have brought, Farish smiled and said, "I wouldn't even want to speculate."

Farish was philosophical about losing a potential star from his draft. "When we're at this stage of the game, it's always a disappointment not being able to sell one," he said. "But Marty will often, right before a sale, make a decision like this, and he told me in advance [he might scratch the horse]. He had been thinking about it. He's very high on this family." Wygod was in Lexington for the sale. Farish said After Market had been well received in his first year at stud, covering about 130 mares.

Balance, Zenyatta Bro Goes to Live Oak...

Brushwood Stable's Betty Moran and Live Oak Stud's Charlotte Weber, two ladies who typically don't mind going to seven figures for a filly, but perhaps less so for

a colt, locked horns for the striking Giant's Causeway half-brother to Grade I winners Balance (Thunder Gulch) and Zenyatta (Street Cry {Ire}). The pair were sitting in close proximity in the pavilion, Moran with son-inlaw Franny Abbott, Weber with a group that included Live Oak General Manager Bruce Hill. In

the end, Weber, won the battle, landing hip 340 for \$1.15 million.

"Mrs. Weber is pretty flexible, and the team liked the colt a lot and we kind of deviated from the plan a little bit," Hill explained when asked the decision to go after the colt.

The chestnut was bred by Maverick Productions and Ashford Stud as part of foal-share agreement and sold out of Don Robinson's Winter Quarter Farm consignment. He is a son of the 13-year-old Kris S. mare Vertigineux, who as emerged as a top producer with the likes of Balance and Zenyatta to her credit.

"There wasn't really a lot not to like about him," Hill added after signing the ticket. "Top and bottom, he had a great pedigree, he had great conformation, and ticked all the boxes for us."

As for what's next, Hill said, "He'll go to Live Oak Plantation in Ocala, and Mrs. Weber will figure out what trainer they'll send him to."

Day Two Numbers Down...

Figures during yesterday's second session of the Keeneland September sale continued to fall off corresponding figures in 2007, but Keeneland Director of Sales Geoffrey Russell remained upbeat. "We're in an optimistic industry, so we have to be optimistic," Russell said. The session average fell 16.4 percent and the session median decreased 9.8 percent. "Session to session, last year's second session was very strong," Russell explained, pointing out, "We had a \$3.8-million sale topper in the second session last year." Through two days, the average fell 12.4 percent to \$377,857. The median remained unchanged at \$300,000. Of the cumulative figures, Russell said, "Overall, it establishes what the market is. Everyone is here, and they have now set the table. They have established the value of these horses." This year's September sale has clearly been impacted by the uncertain economic environment. "The world today is a lot different than this time last year," Russell continued. "You have credit crunch, you have lack of easy financing, so all those things play into a lack of discretionary income to spend on Thoroughbreds. But on the positive side, our median is \$300,000, which I think is a spectacular median. The auctioneers felt, that, while the top end didn't have what you like to call fireworks, that the sale had a good rhythm to it all day." The buy-back rate continued ahead of last year's figure. During Tuesday's session, the buy-back rate was 32.1 percent, up 28.9 percent from a year ago. For the two days, the figure rose 25.4 percent to 30.6 percent. "There are several consignors who are end-users in their own right, so they have established values on their horses that they are willing to race them at their price and if they get above that, they're happy to sell," Russell said. "You run into that situation and therefore you have a high buy-back rate." The September sale continues today at 10 a.m. -JM

Trackside Rings the Bell Twice...

It doesn't happen infrequently. A breeder sells a yearling to a pinhooker for a modest price. The horse develops into a strong prospect, sells at a hefty price at a juvenile auction, then turns into a star on the track.

It's great for the breeder to have bred such a nice horse, especially if he or she still owns the dam. But that satisfaction doesn't pay the bills. Unless, of course, the dam can produce another nice prospect. That's exactly what the 12-year-old Candytuft did for Trackside Farm's Tom Evans and his partners, Macon Wilmil Equines and Marjac

Farms, the breeders of hip 391, a handsome son of the late Maria's Mon which was knocked down to Lance Robinson's Gulf Coast Farm yesterday for \$900,000.


The partnership purchased Candytuft as a three-year-old broodmare for \$55,000 at the 1999 Keeneland November Sale. The unraced daughter of Dehere was carrying an Alydeed filly at the time who would RNA as a weanling for \$19,000 and would never race. Despite that inauspicious beginning, Candytuft would redeem herself. Last year, she was put in the spotlight when her son Midnight Lute (Real Quiet) stormed down Monmouth's muddy stretch to take the GI Breeder's Cup Sprint, earning himself an Eclipse Award in the process.

As good as Midnight Lute would become, he represented only a modest score for Trackside when it sold him as a yearling for \$70,000. Consigned by Eddie Woods at the juvenile sales, Midnight Lute RNA'd for \$290,000 before being sold privately.

Similarly, Trackside has sold three other yearlings out of Candytuft which went on to do well at two-year-old sales. Meadow Soprano (Meadowlake) was a \$50,000 yearling in 2002 who went for \$370,000 at two; Tusculum Rd (Gilded Time) was a \$70,000 yearling in 2006 who sold for \$110,000 as a juvenile; and an unnamed Sir Cherokee colt, a \$150,000 yearling last year, was knocked down for \$650,000 to Stonestreet Stables earlier this year at Barretts March. That was the top price for a colt at the sale.

"The thing with Candytuft's foals is that they really get better as they get older," said Evans. "We see it on the farm. As weanlings, they're nice foals, and then by the time they're yearlings, they're getting nicer. We see it from spring to September; the pinhookers saw it from September to the two-year-old sales."

While Evans takes a pragmatic view of those yearling sale tags, he admits that his \$900,000 Maria's Mon colt was a nice change of pace.



"They were profitable sales, given what we had in the mare and in the stud fees, but it's a gratifying feeling to be rewarded for raising a good horse," said Evans.

So what about the colt made him special? "He was just a very attractive horse," said Evans. "He is a very professional horse, and a very well-balanced horse. You don't realize how big he is until you stand next to him. Not that he's huge, but he's bigger than he first seems just because he's so well-balanced."

Evans said the colt's physical attributes can be partly credited to mom.

"Candytuft's physical is what first attracted me to her," he said. "She comes from a nice family; she has [Irish champion two-year-old] Alydar's Best under the her second dam, and she was a real top-class racehorse. But I really liked Candyturf's physical. Plus I like Dehere a lot; he was a real quality racehorse."

Evans said that Candytuft has an Empire Maker weanling colt at the farm and was bred back to Unbridled's Song.

The Maria's Mon colt wasn't Trackside's biggest-ever sale--that distinction lies with the \$1.7 million Strong Hope a Fasig-Tipton Saratoga yearling 2002--and wasn't even the operation's biggest on the day. Cont. p10

winner Gold Wonder (Golden Missile) and two other stakes horses, for just \$75,000 with this colt in utero at the 2006 Keeneland November Sale, Swift and Classy produced a three-parts brother to hip 317 this spring, a colt by Stonewall's leading freshman sire Medaglia d'Oro. -LM

What They're Saying At The Sales...

John Ferguson on Darley's buying strategy:

"We will buy the horses, or try to buy the horses, that we find suit the program. We will value those horses. The advantage that we have, because we buy in number, is that you can go over your valuation on one, knowing you're going to get lucky on another one, if you know what I mean. So sometimes you can go that extra bid, because you're buying more than three or four horses for one client.

But we just buy the horses that suit us; it's not like we come in and say, we're going to buy 20 horses or buy 30 horses, or we're going to cut our budget."

BOLGER STARS READY FOR NEXT CHAL-

LENGE Trainer Jim Bolger is making plans for his Group 1-winning duo of Lush Lashes (GB) (Galileo {Ire}) and New Approach (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}), who both defeated their elders Sunday at Leopardstown. While the Oct. 5 G1 Prix de l'Opera de Longchamp is on the agenda for the former--heroine of the G1 Matron S. alongside victories in the G1 Coronation S. and G1 Yorkshire Oaks--plans are still fluid for Princess Haya of Jordan's G1 Irish Champion S. hero. "Lush Lashes is in good order and, all being well, she will now go for the Prix de l'Opera [Oct. 5]," the Coolcullen conditioner told PA Sport. "New Approach has come out of his race well, and I will talk to John Ferguson before making any firm plans. One of 20 entries remaining in the seven-furlong contest alongside 13 trained by Aidan O'Brien, His Highness the Aga Khan's G2 Futurity S. winner will have his favored soft ground as the wet weather continues. "Arazan has been fine since his last run and he has continued in his normal routine with no hitches, so all is well," Oxx told PA Sport. "Heavy ground didn't stop him the last day and he will need to go on that again, because it is going to be very soft again at the weekend. It's hard to know what will turn up in the race, but as you would expect, it will be a hot race." Of the Ballydoyle contingent are Derrick Smith, Susan Magnier and Michael Tabor's G1 Phoenix S. winner Mastercraftsman (Ire) (Danehill Dancer (Ire), G3 Tyros S. scorer Rip van Winkle (Ire) (Galileo {Ire}) and O "TDN Rising Star" O Masterofthehorse (Ire) (Sadler's Wells). BIG BROWN A SHORE THING?

Big Brown (Boundary), winner of Monmouth Park's GI Haskell Invitational Aug. 3, is set to return to the site of his most recent victory when he lines up in a nine-

furlong turf stakes at the Oceanport oval Saturday. In preparation for his follow-up on the Jersey Shore, the winner of the GI Kentucky Derby and GI Preakness S. breezed five furlongs in 1:05.38 on the turf at Aqueduct yesterday morning.

"He went beautifully," said trainer Richard Dutrow Jr. "Everything went very well and is set for him right now.

I am excited to watch him run Saturday."

With the possibility of rain in the forecast for Saturday's race, Dutrow indicated that the big bay would run, no matter what the conditions.

"If it comes off the turf, we're going to go ahead and run him because we are most concerned about the timing of the race," confirmed Dutrow. Dutrow indicated that the colt, who is being targeted toward the GI Breeders' Cup Classic Oct. 25, will be shipped to Santa Anita a couple of days before the championship day.

"I wanted a race 40 days before the Breeders' Cup," said Dutrow, explaining the desire to race the IEAH and Paul Pompa Jr. representative this weekend.

"I thought he needed that kind of time, because I like to give them plenty of time before a big race. Our primary goal has always been the Classic."

With the Classic in mind, Dutrow stressed that a start on the turf appeared to offer the colt the best route toward the Santa Anita feature.

"He's had feet issues that he's had to deal with, so we felt training on the turf was the way to go," he said. "When Big Brown is on the dirt, we have to bandage him because he runs down on all four feet. When he's on the grass, I don't even wrap him."

"That's why I prefer to keep him on his natural surface. Everyone who has ever ridden him in his morning works says that he is much better on the turf than the dirt." With the Breeders' Cup scheduled to be contested over Santa Anita's new Pro-Ride surface, Dutrow had considered giving the sophmore a run over the newly installed surface, but nixed the plan early on.

"I would have shipped him out for the [GI] Goodwood [Sept. 27], but it is just too close to the Classic." Dutrow added, "I'd rather train up to the race instead of running him too close."

Dutrow added that should Big Brown win Saturday and follow-up with a victory on Breeders' Cup day, a showdown with reigning Horse of the Year Curlin would certainly be something the colt's connections would push for.

"I think everyone will want to see these two horses race each other before they retire," offered Dutrow.

If Big Brown should win the Classic, Dutrow was unwavering about the next goal.

"We're going to be looking for Curlin," he said. "Hopefully, we get to see a match race."

The Challengers...

A race that originally looked like a custom-designed spot for Big Brown has developed into a well-supported and competitive event in its own right. With the purse inflated to \$500,000, Saturday's feature race has



drawn a solid cast of runners, including Shadwell Stable's Shakis (Ire) (Machiavellian). Trained by Kiaran McLaughlin, the eight-year-old successfully defended his title in the nine-furlong GII Bernard Baruch H., winning it most recently Aug. 23.

"He seems to do well with time in between his races and it

is the perfect distance for us," said McLaughlin, explaining the decision to face likely favorite Big Brown. "I think we have a good chance to beat [Big Brown]. I really like our chances. [Big Brown] is definitely the top horse, but I feel he is vulnerable." Cont. p15

Also looking to take down the likely divisional champ is five-year-old **Kiss the Kid** (Lemon Drop Kid). Winner of the Cozzene S. at the Meadowlands last season, the dark bay, who was a good second going a mile over the turf course here in the Bob Harding S. July 12, finished third in his most recent start in the GIII Phillip Iselin H. over the main track Aug. 16.

"When we saw this opportunity, we decided to jump on it," said trainer Amy Tarrant. "I think my horse always shows up for a race. He's a bulldog. He's as fit as he can possibly be."

Asked about her star pupil's chances of upsetting Big Brown Saturday, Tarant added,

"Big Brown is a champion, so running against him is fun, and if we pulled off the upset, I wouldn't be sad at all because Big Brown is already a champion."

And with the hometown advantage, Tarrant feels the decision to run was warranted.

"I figure life is short and I've got some nice horses and paid a lot of money for them, so I figure why not-I'm stabled here and we don't have to ship. And if he pulls off the upset--that's great."

Also expected to be shipped in for Saturday's race is GIII Bay Meadows Derby winner **Proudinsky (Ger)** (Silvano {Ger}). Trained by Bobby Frankel, the Germanbred accounted for the GII Mervin H. Muniz Jr. Memorial H. earlier this season.

IN THE HERE AND NOW

On Saturday, Ralph Beckett will have the biggest weight of expectation on his shoulders in his training career so far when saddling **Look Here (GB)** (Hernando {Fr}) in Doncaster's G1 St Leger. While the humble Whitsbury Manor-based trainer celebrated a major hike

in his profile as a result of the sensational victory of Julian Richmond-Watson's homebred in the G1 Epsom Oaks, he is no overnight sensation. Having begun training in the millennium year, he enjoyed a high-profile breakthrough as early as his third season with a licence courtesy of the G3 Fred Darling S. hero-

ine Penkenna Princess (Ire) (Pivotal {GB}), who was also beaten a short-head in the G1 Irish 1000 Guineas. In between the two flagship fillies, there has been the G3 Premio Dormello winner Celtic Slipper (Ire) (Anabaa) as well as several other smart performers to keep his name on the fringes of the headlines.

Then, in the first week of June, Look Here catapulted Beckett's stable into the limelight with that devastating burst to dispose of the subsequent Irish Oaks scorer Moonstone (GB) (Dalakhani {Ire}) and three-time Group 1 winner Lush Lashes (GB) (Galileo {Ire}). While that proved a watershed moment, Beckett is keen to put it into context.

"In many ways, the impact of Penkenna Princess was just as important then as Look Here is now on how we are perceived, as we were very much a middle-of-the-road operation at the time," he said.

Despite his short spell in training, Beckett has had

ample chance to get to know the family of Look Here, thanks to the patronage of the Richmond-Watsons.

"Julian Richmond-Watson's father sent me a filly called Researcher (GB) (Cosmonaut {GB}) when I started out and sadly died before she got off the mark, but Julian and Sarah gradually sent me more," Beckett explained. "There





was her half-sister Look So (GB) (Efisio {GB}), who although won four of her eight starts, I always felt had a little bit more in the tank than she let on, and who sadly fractured her pelvis. [Last year's Listed Lingfield Oaks Trial winner] Kayah (GB) (Kahyasi {Ire}) was a very good filly with the same second dam as Look Here, but nothing shouted the ability that this one has."

In many ways, the Look Here story follows a similar path as that of Lord Derby's Ouija Board (GB), who regenerated the bloodstock of a British owner/breeder and jumped out of a pedigree that had recently been in the minor leagues. Even the nature of her emphatic Oaks success is eerily familiar to fans of that now-legendary daughter of Cape Cross (Ire).

"I think there are definitely parallels between her and Ouija Board, and I don't think Julian would disagree," Beckett offered before turning his attention to Saturday's feature. "She didn't really develop between two and three, but has thrived through the summer and has done very well. There is more of her now than there was in June, and her Oaks performance has been rated up with Ramruma (Diesis {GB}) and the like."

Talk of the Late Fahd Salman's Ramruma, who went unbeaten through her sophomore campaign until losing out after a titanic tussle with Mutafaweq (Silver Hawk) in the 1999 Leger, brings up the issue of how a filly handles the colts in the oldest Classic.



"Part of the reason I mentioned Ramruma was that Anthony Penfold [Salman's Racing Manager] was here on Saturday, and he made two very valid points," Beckett continued. "Firstly, Ramruma had had a very busy year and danced every dance before the Leger and also she was by Diesis, who has a different profile to Hernando."

For Beckett, the build-up to Saturday is more intense than early June, but there is the comforting prospect of a new season for here in 2009, whatever the result.

"It's a Classic and that is as prestigious as it gets," he concluded. "I think there is probably more pressure on at this stage than ever, as despite there being plenty at stake at Epsom she was not expected to win. There is plenty at stake on Saturday, too, but at the same time she's already done it and if it doesn't happen, there will be plenty for her next year."



BAEZA, SCLAFANI FILE SUIT Hall of Fame jockey Braulio Baeza and former racing official Mario Sclafani filed a \$100-million civil suit against former Governor Eliot Spitzer, the New York Racing Association and several others Tuesday. The suit, which was filed in United States District Court for The Eastern District of New York, alleges that the defendants participated in a conspiracy to violate the civil rights of Sclafani and Baeza and includes allegations of false arrest, false imprisonment, malicious prosecution, defamation and a conspiracy in violation of the pair's constitutional rights. Sclafani and Baeza were racing officials working in the jockeys' quarters at Belmont Park when arrested Sept. 21, 2005, and charged with falsely reporting the weights of several riders and, therefore, defrauding the betting public. In September, 2007, the case was thrown out by Saratoga County Judge Jerry Scarano. "They ruined my reputation and they embarrassed me," Baeza said. "What they put me through was unbearable. And they went out of their way to make sure they prevented me from making a living." The incident came during a period when NYRA was battling to retain its franchise to run three New York tracks. Spitzer, then the New York Attorney General, spearheaded the investigation and subsequent prosecution.







While that Oct. 4 falls before the Breeders' Cup, Head was keen to stress that Santa Anita remains high on the agenda of the homebred, who also won Deauville's G1 Prix d'Astarte Aug. 3. "Goldikova appears to have come out of the race in good form and the plan is still to run her in either the Breeders' Cup Mile or the Filly & Mare race at Santa Anita, although there is just a slight possibility that she could turn out for the Prix de la Foret," Head told Racing Post.
