### MR. GREELEY COLT TOPS AT KEENELAND

A strapping son of Gainesway stallion Mr. Greeley topped yesterday's third session of the Keeneland September Yearling Sale with a final bid of \$875,000 from Zayat Stables' manager Sohby Sonbol. Sonbol, bidding

from the back of the sales pavilion, had to see off a determined Rick Nichols of Shadwell Estate to land hip 712 (video). "He was a little bit small for a January foal, but he looked exactly like his father," Sonbol said. "There's room for improvement; he looks like a horse that's going to get better. He was a neat, well-balanced horse, and clean--there were no problems." The chestnut colt, consigned by Gainesway, Agent XXI, is the first foal out of unraced Chinoe Road (Old

Trieste). A daughter of champion juvenile filly Epitome (Summing), Chinoe Road is a half-sister to multiple graded stakes winner Essence of Dubai (Pulpit). Asked if the price tag was around what he expected, Sonbol said, "When you find the right one, you have to stretch a bit to get it. I thought he would be about \$750,000. I thought he'd be about as expensive as a horse can be today." Sonbol has signed the ticket for 12 yearlings through three sessions of the September sale, including a son of Distorted Humor for \$900,000, and admits he is looking for more. "Every year we start with 70 new ones--some of them are homebreds, some are foal [purchases], some are two-year-olds--and I think we've got 30 right now," he explained. Cont. p2

## Hip 712 - Wednesday's Topper cont. Go On, Young Man...

Yesterday's sale was a pinhooking success for Crone Stud, which, through Gainesway, purchased the colt for \$220,000 at last year's Keeneland November sale. "Crone Stud is a long-standing Gainesway client that pinhooks with us on an annual basis," according to Gainesway's Michael Hernon. Explaining the colt's merits last fall, Hernon said, "He was a Mr. Greeley and he didn't cost a huge amount of money. He's got a nice pedigree behind him. His second dam was a champion.

She won the Breeders' Cup [Juvenile Fillies] and she's already produced Essence of Dubai. This was a horse that looked like he might improve, and he certainly did that." The yearling was also helped by the popularity of his sire, who, through Tuesday, had 27 yearlings sell this year for an average of \$240,428. "Mr. Greeley has found gainesway.com favor here across the board at Keeneland." said Hernon. "He's bred a tremendous book

of mares this year. He is well-positioned going on, and this was a lovely colt who struck a good resemblance to the stallion." Hernon indicated the colt's price tag was well over his reserve. "We were delighted with the price," he said. "It did exceed our expectations. The colt was on the market way earlier than the final bid. And we are appreciative to Sohby Sonbol and to Rick Nichols of Shadwell, who put on a brave show." The Irish-based Crone Stud's success continued just a few hips later when hip 720, another son of Mr. Greeley, sold for \$250,000. The colt was purchased through Gainesway for \$160,000 out of this year's January sale. -JM



# Quick Off the Blocks: Ghostzapper Filly at \$600K...

Hip 496, the first offering through the ring during

yesterday's third session of Keeneland September, got things off to a fast start when eliciting a bid of \$600,000 from Shadwell's Rick Nichols. A filly from the first crop of Horse of the Year Ghostzapper (Awesome Again), the Apr. 21-foaled bay is a half-sister to another champion in Action This Day (Kris S.), winner of the 2003

GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile. "Physically, she's a very nice filly, and from the female [family] looks like she could possibly go in Europe," Nichols said just after signing the ticket. "And I really like Ghostzapper as a young sire." Hip 496, consigned by Taylor Made Sales Agency, is a daughter of the multiple graded stakesplaced Najecam (Trempolino), a full-sister to the dam of the good European performer Lord Admiral (El Prado {Ire}). The sale of the Ghostzapper filly marked a very profitable pinhook for Lee Rogers, who had acquired her for \$300,000 as a short yearling at this year's Keeneland January Sale. -LM

## Mosses Looking for a Perfect Ten...

Jerry and Ann Moss, who campaign the super filly Zenyatta, had their hearts stolen by another filly yesterday at Keeneland. The couple went to \$725,000 to purchase hip 625, a filly from the first crop of multiple Grade I winner Rock Hard Ten (Kris S.). "She really

captured our hearts," Jerry Moss explained. "She is a game-looking filly. We don't have that much by the sire and we thought we'd take the plunge." Consigned by Lane's End, the yearling is out Unsurpassed (Unbridled), a daughter of multiple graded stakes winner Squan Song (Exceller) and from the family of Symboli Indy, Omega Code and Tempest Fugit. The \$725,000 price tag did surprise Moss. "It was a little more than we were expecting, but we loved this filly and we went for it," he said. It

was the second time during the three-day old sale that the Mosses purchased a yearling by Lane's End stallion Rock Hard Ten. The imposing dark bay, now seven, captured the 2005 GI Santa Anita H. and the 2004 GI Malibu S. The Mosses purchased a colt by Rock Hard Ten out of Storm Alert (Storm Cat) for \$400,000 during Tuesday's session of the sale. "He was a tremendous racehorse," Moss said of the stallion. "We just decided we didn't have any by him, although we do have a mare in foal to him." Asked about the strength of the market, Moss laughed, "This turned out to be a pretty expensive horse, so I think the market is pretty good." In addition to the two Rock Hard Ten yearlings, the Mosses also purchased a filly by Maria's Mon out of Tafcar (Forestry) yesterday for \$150,000. -JM

#### Rabbah Rouser...

While Darley and Shadwell are familiar names at Keeneland September, another operation with ties to the Maktoum family, Rabbah Bloodstock, has been quietly making its presence felt here.

Through the third session, Rabbah has acquired 20 yearlings for \$3,900,000, an average of \$195,000. Rabbah's highest-priced purchase at September came

early yesterday, when it landed hip 525, a handsome daughter of Dynaformer--Re-nowned Cat (Storm Cat), for \$350,000. Consigned by Three Chimneys Sales, agent for Stonestreet, the filly is the first foal

from an unraced half-sister to champion Escena (Strawberry Road {Aus}).

Rabbah was launched by Sheikh Mohammed in 2006 as a way to help friends and associates involved in the racing game.

"Rabbah is just a management company on behalf of

these individuals," explained Jono Mills, stud director at Rabbah. "We're a separate company from Darley and Godolphin, but very much within the Maktoum family. We look after both racing and breeding interests, and we're there to help in whatever his friends need."

Some, like Jaber Abdullah, have long had ties with racing; others are new to the game.

"There's a good mix of people," said Mills. "Some have race horses, some have broodmares. But I'd say there's about 20 people that are actively involved in some manner."

Every customer, or nominee, at Rabbah is an individual entity, meaning that horses are bred and/or race in that person's name--not under the Rabbah banner.

"If a horse belongs to an individual, it is his horse and runs in his colors; we just act as a management company to help them make his life a little easier," said Mills.

Rabbah has two bases, at Gainsborough Stud in

Berkshire and at Aston Upthorpe Stud in Oxfordshire in England. Because the nominees race primarily in Europe, Rabbah does most of its yearling shopping overseas. But Mills, along with Rabbah's racing director, Bruce Raymond, have found plenty to like at September, too. Scan through the their purchases, and you'll quickly notice a

trend: they like Dynaformer a little bit. Seven of Rabbah's 20 purchases are by the Three Chimneys stallion, ranging in price from a \$75,000 colt to yesterday's \$350,000 filly.

"The guys are very keen on the sire, and it just happens that, this year, they all want a Dynaformer," laughed Mills when asked about their buying preferences. "He's a great stallion, and he's one that can work on both surfaces. You can bring them to Europe, and if they're good enough, possibly race during the Dubai Carnival on either the turf or dirt. He's a universal sire--he matches us very well. Plus he's a Roberto-line horse, so he goes with Northern Dancer well--most of those sire lines in Europe are from Northern Dancer. Of course, we buy racehorses first, but they do have residual value."

Some successful horses with ties to Rabbah include Youmzain (Ire) (Sinddar {Ire}), runner-up in last year's G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe; Majestic Roi (Street Cry {Ire}), who captured the G1 Sun Chariot S. in 2007; and the unbeaten juvenile Desert Phantom (Arch), winner of the Listed Ripon Champion 2YO Trophy S. Aug. 25. -LM

## Goff Gets Proud...

Tom Goff, who formed Blandford Bloodstock in 2001 with the late Joss Collins, has been a familiar face on the sales grounds in recent days,

and has kept himself busy.
Through Blandford, which is coowned by Richard Brown, Goff
has signed the ticket on nine
horses for gross receipts of
\$3,810,000, an average of
\$423,333. Blandford is the fifthleading buyer at Keeneland.

Goff nabbed four yesterday, the most expensive of which was hip 763, a Proud Citizen--Fair Settlement (Easy Goer) colt from the draft of Eaton

Sales, agent. Goff, sitting just in front of the sales ring, saw off all challengers to land the bay for an unnamed client for \$525,000.

"He was a very nice colt--a lot of quality, a very good walker," said Goff. "Proud Citizen's had a lovely horse in England, River Proud, and this colt's a very similar model. We hope he'll be successful back in England; that's were this colt's headed."

Hip 763 represented a sterling pinhooking score for Train Winners Bloodstock, which had purchased the colt as a Keeneland November weanling for \$100,000.

Goff's other purchases yesterday were: <a href="https://hip.574">hip 574</a>, Mr. Greeley--So Spirited filly for \$350,000; <a href="https://hip.649">hip 649</a>, a Smart Strike--Allencat colt for \$500,000; and <a href="https://hip.678">hip 678</a>, a Dixie Union--Belterra filly for \$400,000.

Asked to gauge the market, Goff offered, "I don't know how the average is looking today, but I think things are pretty solid, given the background of what's going on in the banking, housing and construction sectors worldwide. Most vendors, if told the average was going to be down 10, 15 percent, I think they would have grabbed it with both hands before the sale. And the median's held up very well, which means the middle market's there. I think it's held up remarkably well." -LM



## Briggs & Cromartie Enjoy Keeneland Success...


Briggs and Cromartie Thoroughbred Consultants are in the midst of relocating from Florida to Lexington, but still found time to make a statement at Keeneland September. During Monday's opening session of the auction, the agency signed the ticket at \$1-million for a son of Giant's Causeway out of Voodoo Dancer (Kingmambo). Bob Cromartie declined to name the colt's new owner, but said, "It was somebody who


headed for England, we think." Switching to the selling side yesterday, Briggs and Cromartie, through Legacy Bloodstock, enjoyed a notable pinhooking success when hip 643, a yearling colt from the first crop of Closing Argument (Successful Appeal), attracted a final bid of \$330,000 from the omnipresent Legends Racing. Alan Briggs picked the mare Accountess (Private Account), with her Closing Argument foal in utero, out of the 2006 OBS October sale for a bargain \$37,000 on behalf of Silverleaf. "We owned that mare privately and I regretted having sold her [privately in 2004]," Briggs said of the mare. "When she popped up at the OBS sale, I was happy to get her back. I always loved

cessful Appeal), winner of the 2006 GIII Stuyvesant H., and Briggs admitted Accountforthegold's achievements were a factor in the decision to reacquire the mare. "We had been watching Accountforthegold on the track and thought his best races were still to come," he explained. "And she was in foal to the right stallion. We got the Closing Argument colt out of her and bred her back to Successful Appeal." Accountess is currently not in foal, and Briggs said it was a possibility the mare would be sold, particularly in light of yesterday's results. "We're not sure yet if we will sell her. But this result will probably bring a little more clarity in the decision-making process." Briggs and Cromartie's Keeneland success comes as the company completes its relocation from Ocala to Versailles. "Because of the regional market development and our breeding operation, we felt like being in Florida put us at the distant end of the regional market we were breeding in, which is Kentucky, New York, Pennsylvania and Canada," explained Cromartie. "That is where we are shipping mares to and we have to come right back through Lexington to get to Florida and then we come back here to sell, we come back here to breed with some of them, and it was just a logical business decision for us to relocate our breeding operation here."



Cromartie continued, "We're still considering keeping yearlings in Florida and raising yearlings there." The company's new property, named Ardmore Stud, is located on 125 acres in Versailles. Aside from the new location, Cromartie is not expecting any change to operations. "We've never been big," he said. "We've always been sort of a boutique farm, and the property that we bought here is the same size property which we had in Florida, which we sold." The stallions managed by the company will not change either. "All of the stallions our agency manages will stay in place," Cromartie confirmed. "We don't have any hands-on contact with them; we just do all of the paperwork and promotion on them." -JM

#### Chevenne Stables Gaining Steam...

Born in Chevenne, Oklahoma, some 140 miles west of Oklahoma City, Everett Dobson was a star golfer on the team at Southwestern Oklahoma State University in the late 1970s, playing in one U.S. Amateur Golf Championship and two British Amateurs before turning his attention to a professional career, not in golf, but in telecommunications.

In 1988, Dobson Communications was born from a single cellular tower in rural Chickasha, serving custom-

ers in Oklahoma at first, but eventually expanding its cellular coverage into 17 states, and it became a publicly traded company in 1996. Dobson reportedly made more than 30 acquisitions in his 20 years of ownership, growing the company from \$1 per share to over 11 times that when he entered into an agreement for his company to be acquired by AT&T last summer. The value of the deal, which closed in November 2007, was reportedly \$5.1 billion.

Dobson got into the Thoroughbred business in the mid-1990s, and has been active at yearling sales in Central Kentucky over the past few years. The 49-yearold married father of three was active during Book 1 at Keeneland, leaving with four horses, all fillies.

"We're buying to race," Dobson said yesterday from Lexington while "packing up and heading home" to Oklahoma City. "They're all the kind of pedigree and conformation that would also make for good broodmares in the future and I do have some commercial broodmares currently and expect to expand that down the road,"

The most expensive of his purchases came during Monday's opening session, when he went to \$575,000 for hip 131, a Taylor Made-consigned daughter of A.P. Indy--Banshee Winds (Known Fact). What impressed Dobson most about the half-sister to champion Banshee Breeze?

"She's a pretty good-sized A.P. Indy," Dobson commented. "She certainly had all the A.P. Indy characteristics, including the big hip. She has especially strong bone and a good walk and, more importantly, I thought she was a good value at the number we bought her at. And clearly she's from an outstanding family."

Dobson's other successful bids came on hip 212, a Fusaichi Pegasus filly from the family of champion Pleasant Stage for \$285,000; hip 453, an Afleet Alex half-sister to GSP Tenfold (Tiznow)--from the family of Chaposa Springs and You and I--for \$200,000; and hip 457, an Unbridled's Song half-sister to SW Beautiful Daniele (A.P. Indy) who is out of a half-sister to champion Countess Diana. The hammer price was \$400,000.

Dobson currently has six two-year-olds in training, including Abigail's Gold (Mineshaft), a filly owned in partnership with Don McNeill, who debuted with a runner-up effort for Todd Pletcher at Saratoga Aug. 3. Along with McNeill and Jim Wells, Dobson is co-owner of Candy Meadows Farm in the Bluegrass.

Dobson was pleased with his purchases this week, but it wasn't always easy to buy.

"I wouldn't go so far as to say it's a buyers market," he explained. "There were a few 'relative bargains' to be had compared to the last couple of years here. That's a hard way of putting it when you're talking about \$500,000 Thoroughbreds, but relatively speaking, there were good bargains. It will be interesting to see what happens in the next four or five days, but my guess is the real bargains will be from Book 3 on."

Dobson said he expects to return to Lexington in November to add to his growing collection of highquality bloodstock. However, he'll likely have one ear on the sales and the other on the progress of the Oklahoma City Thunder, the relocated Seattle Supersonics of the National Basketball Association, in which he has an ownership interest. -AC

#### Shah Stable Growing...

Kaleem Shah, founder and president of the Virginiabased consulting firm Calnet, has been building his racing stable at the September sale. Shah, sitting next to trainer Dale Capuano, signed the ticket for hip 584 during yesterday's third session of the auction, taking home the son of Tiznow for \$435,000. "I liked his overall conformation and his attitude," Shah said of the purchase. "He looked very racey." The bay colt, consigned by Hill 'n' Dale Sales Agency, agent, is out of Storm Celine (Storm Cat) and his a half brother to stakes winners Black Rock Road (Bertrando) and Intact (Sepoy {Arg}). A native of India, Shah's interest in racing comes from his father, who was a trainer. "I just started buying horses recently," Shah commented. "Once I came to the U.S., I built my business out here and then I decided to starting buying horses. Last year, I bought 12 horses and I have some nice two-year-olds now. I bought four horses out here right now." Prior to purchasing hip 584, Shah paid \$140,000 for a colt by Unbridled's Song out of Proud Ciel (Septieme Ciel), \$320,000 for a daughter of A.P. Indy out of Friendly Michelle (Artax) and \$340,000 for a colt by Tiznow out of Pola (Strawberry Road {Aus}). He purchased five yearlings at last year's September sale. Although still new to the game, Shah said he is enjoying the experience. "So far, so good," he said. "But you've got to get the big one. That is what the dream is." He is hoping to enjoy that success with Capuano. "If you know any-

thing about Dale, he has done very well on the Maryland circuit with relatively cheap horses. So it's an opportunity for him to shine, to take his game to the next level." This season, Capuano has campaigned stakes horses Seeyouinthecity, who captured the Aug. 16 Humphrey S Finney S. at Laurel and

was fourth in the GIII Kent S.; and Heros Reward, winner of the GIII Highlander S. at Woodbine in June. Shah would not rule out expanding his stable further. "It will depend on what kind of success we get," he said. "It will be proportional to that." -JM

## The Partial Dispersal of Joan Phillips's Stock...

Following the death Darby Dan matriarch Joan Phillips in April, her son John Phillips has the unenviable

task of selling some of the horses she bred in partnership, many of whom hail from families that helped make the nursery famous. Joan Phillips' father, John W. Galbreath, founded Darby Dan, which has been operating in Lexington since 1949.

This Saturday, Darby Dan consigns <a href="https://hip.1635">hip 1635</a>, a colt by Aldebaran--Jody G.; and <a href="https://hip.1682">hip 1682</a>, a filly by Maria's Mon--Merit Wings. On Monday, Sept. 15, Darby Dan offers <a href="https://hip.2487">hip 2487</a>, a filly by Dixieland Band--Makethemostofit. <a href="https://hip.5158">Hip 5158</a>, the ninth and final horse from the partial dispersal, has been scratched.

Just after watching hip 518 sell yesterday, John Phillips admitted it's been tough watching the yearlings go.

"But it'll be harder in November," he said. "That's when the broodmares will sell, and that's what we've always prided ourselves in--raising these great families."

Phillips said his mother owned about 15 broodmares. "Some of those will be sold, but we haven't decided on which ones," he said.

As for the yearlings that have gone under the hammer at September, Phillips characterized the prices as "respectable."

"They're intended to be sold," added Phillips. "Some of the family members--the fillies--we'll try to bring back, but all the colts will be sold." -LM

### TIZNOW COLT REPRESENTS AT MILESTONE

When John O'Meara struck out on his own a few years ago, the Irishman named his operation Milestone Farm, a nod to his father, who had a draft horse by that

name when John was a young boy. Yesterday, Milestone lived up to its name, selling its highest-priced yearling ever, a strapping son of Tiznow, for \$340,000. The colt was purchased by Kaleem Shah.

The sale took on a somber tone, as the man with whom O'Meara consigned the horse, David Mullins, passed away a month ago at the age of 51.

"I was going to sell the horse here, so I called David, who was sick, and said, 'Why don't we consign the horse in your


name?" explained O'Meara. "It was good, because it would bring him to the farm and it kind of picked him up a little bit."

Catalogued as hip 513, the Mar. 15-foaled bay is out of the Strawberry Road (Aus) mare Pola. He is a half-brother to stakes winner Pola's Place (Out of Place) and stakes-placed Bola Soup (Alphabet Soup), as well as to Going Wild (Golden Missile), who was on the Kentucky Derby trail in 2005 after winning the San Miguel S. and Sham S. and finishing second by a nose to Declan's Moon in the GII Santa Catalina S. Each of those horses was bred by O'Meara and his New York City-based business partners Charlie Goldberg and Richard Rosee, who purchased the dam, Pola, for \$55,000 at the Adena Springs bloodstock sale in 2000.

"The story actually begins before that, though," related O'Meara. "I'd first seen the mare in the Paulson Dispersal [at the 1999 Keeneland November Sale]. I was hoping to buy her then, but I was sitting there and in came a Storm Cat mare, called Joying, who was in foal to French Deputy. The bidding was locked up for a bit, but I finally was able to get her for \$85,000. The problem was that I didn't have enough to buy Pola."

(Joying produced a few profitable horses for O'Meara before he sold her, through David Mullins, for \$190,000 three years later. "Ever since then, David gave me a hard time, because I didn't have another horse with him until this one.")

Luckily for O'Meara, Pola reappeared the following year at the Adena Sale, with an Alphabet Soup colt in utero. The resulting foal was Bola Soup, who became a stakes-placed runner for O'Meara.



Even better, Pola sold with a complimentary season to Adena's Golden Missile, which O'Meara made good use of. From that season, he bred Going Wild and sold him for \$140,000 as a September yearling; Going Wild later sold as a two-year-old for \$600,000 to Bob and Beverly Lewis.

Pola's Place (Out of Place), Pola's fourth foal, was offered at the 2005 September Sale, but O'Meara bought her back for \$55,000. The five-year-old is now a stakes winner of nearly \$140,000 for O'Meara, and is currently being pointed toward at stakes at Turfway at the end of the month.

In 2006, O'Meara sent another of Pola's foals, the Golden Missile filly Pola Garden, through the November Sale as a weanling, where she was sold to Mark Dedomenico for \$65,000.

O'Meara used the same strategy with this Tiznow colt, but he went unsold as a weanling last year at November for \$40,000.

"We had a reserve of \$59,000 on him, but we had a \$40,000 stud fee in him, so we didn't want to sell him for less than that," O'Meara explained. "He X-rayed good at the time and was a big, strong colt, so we said, 'To hell with it; we'll take him back and bring him home and let him grow up.' He did have epiphysitis at the time, and a lot of the prospective buyers thought I had screws put in his ankles. But I hadn't.'" Cont. p10



O'Meara continued, "Anyone who's been around horses knows that epiphysitis comes and epiphysitis goes, and if you worry about it you'll die, and if you don't worry about it you'll die anyway. So why worry about it? So I took him home and he outgrew it."

Coming into this sale, O'Meara was optimistic, but set a reasonable reserve on the colt nonetheless.

"We had a \$99,000 reserve on him--so he would have sold at \$100,000," said O'Meara. "I'm not saying I would have been happy with that, but he would have been gone."

O'Meara first came to the States in 1982 to work at Spendthrift Farm. He proceeded to put together an extensive resume. O'Meara worked at Gainesway, was assistant trainer to Carl Nafzger in the mid-1980s, broke and trained horses as Richard Duchossois's private trainer, worked for four years at Country Life Farm in Maryland, and worked as yearling manager at Prestonwood Farm in Kentucky.

Finally, he decided it was time for his own business, and he started Milestone, which sits on 165 acres and is primarily a boarding operation. O'Meara has, however, dabbled in the stallion business, too. Milestone currently stands Mancini, a full-brother to leading sire Unbridled's Song. O'Meara purchased the son of Unbridled off the track when he was a three-year-old, and typically breeds 15 to 20 of his own mares to the 10-year-old each year.

Mancini stood the 2008 season for \$4,000. From 41 starters, he has three stakes winners, including Whatsitgonnatake, who has banked \$242,014; B. B. Mancini (\$179,349); and Hurry Home Warren (\$148,914). O'Meara owns the latter.

As far as Pola goes, O'Meara reports the mare has a Quiet American filly on the ground and is back in foal to Darley's first-year stallion Hard Spun (Danzig).

"Next year, we hope to breed her to Bernardini (A.P. Indy)," he said. O'Meara added that the Quiet American weanling has been entered in the Keeneland November Sale, while Pola's Place, has been entered at Fasig-Tipton November.

"But with this horse selling so well, if Pola's Place sells, we won't sell the filly. We'll just keep our options open."


## September Ship Steadies...

While numbers remained down during the third session of the September sale, the market seemed to have stablized as the auction moved into Book 2 at Keeneland Wednesday. "Some smart person told me today that more people can afford Fords than Ferraris," explained Keeneland Director of Sales Geoffrey Russell. "Those high-pedigree, high-physical horses come with a high price. And this market [today] is a lot broader." Russell declared himself satisfaction with the day's business. "I thought today was very, very good," he said. "I thought it started off with a bang with a \$600,000 horse straight in the ring, and continued on solid all through the day." For the session, the average fell 7.4 percent from 2007 to \$188,174, while the median was unchanged at \$160,000. The buy-back rate for the day fell for the first session this year. The rate was 25.4 percent, down 8.6 percent from a year ago. "It was good to see the not-sold rate down today," commented Russell. "That means that consignors are looking at the market and adjusting to it." Through three sessions, the average fell 7.4 percent to \$288,007. The median was down 4.3 percent to \$220,000. For the sale, the buy-back rate is up 8.9 percent to 28.2 percent. The Keeneland September sale continues today at 10 a.m. -JM





#### LONELY AT THE TOP?

It's a pretty steep drop, not just from 2007, when Book 1 grossed \$145 million, but even more from 2006, when Sheikh Mohammed went on a near \$60million shopping spree and Book 1 grossed almost \$183 million. The 22-percent drop in gross from last year is probably more reflective of the real market; nonetheless, it's a little sobering to realize the Book 1 gross is down almost \$70 million (38 percent) since the heady days of 2006.

What's happening to Book 1 is not so different from the fate that befell the July sale: too many breeders have too much invested in stud fees, and there simply aren't enough buyers for all those expensively produced horses. Last year, I think I'm correct in saying, every single session of Books 2-5 was up over 2006 totals. It would be far too much to hope for a repeat of that scenario this year; breeders will simply be hoping the drop will be less than the Book 1 declines: 22 percent in gross, 11 percent in number sold, and 12 percent in average.

Especially noteworthy is that four entities which can definitely be defined as Maktoum-related (John Ferguson, Shadwell, Rabbah, and Darley Stud) signed for a total of 52 yearlings totaling \$28,755,000 on Monday and Tuesday. That's more than one of every six yearlings sold, and over a quarter of the total amount spent in Book 1. They bought 10 times as many horses as Coolmore representative Demi O'Byrne (he signed for five yearlings, totaling \$2,865,000), and spent almost exactly 10 times as much money. Mind you, as we said last year, there will be such a prevalence of Coolmoresired yearlings at the upcoming European sales that as long as the Maktoums observe their self-imposed boycott (or whatever they choose to call it, if it's not a boycott) of Coolmore stallions at the yearling sales, they will always have many more 'neutral' sires to choose from at the American sales. Since the boycott does not extend to horses in training, they have still

been able to acquire the likes of Teofilo (Galileo), New Approach (Galileo), and Authorized (Montjeu) to stand at stud and presumably breed to, so they do have access to the most successful Coolmore sires. Those who forget that Sheikh Mohammed is willing to play 'the long game' might

overlook the certainty that Street Cry will not be the last world-class stallion they develop from within their own ranks and from their own breeding.

There were eight stallions with five or more sold in Book 1 which averaged over \$400,000; seven of them may be called 'neutral' sires, meaning they're not owned outright by Darley or Coolmore. But ranking in this top eight was no guarantee of making money. A.P. Indy (21 sold in Book 1, averaged \$647,143) bested Storm Cat (18 sold, averaged \$586,667) in

Book 1; though including all sales so far this year, Storm Cat has had 21 yearlings average \$693,809, while A.P. Indy has had 24 sell, which averaged \$673,541. Keeneland's Geoff Russell rightfully found solace in



the Book 1 median of \$300,000 being exactly the same as last year's, but Storm Cat's \$600,000 median doesn't leave much of a profit margin if you had to pay the \$500,000 stud fee in 2006.

The situation was even worse for Giant's Causeway, who stood for \$300,000 in 2006, but had dropped to \$125,000 for 2008. After Book 1, his 27 yearlings sold so far this year (we really mean since July) have averaged \$415,001 (these averages all from Insta-tistics), but his median was \$270,000--below his 2006 stud fee, with nearly 50 yearlings still to come just in the September Sale. It would be fine if these yearlings had been bred on his 2008 stud fee, but of course they weren't. Cont. p15

Even Distorted Humor, who stood for \$150,000 in 2006, but was up to \$300,000 for 2008, is facing a big commercial challenge in the future. For this year, though, breeders had a shot to make money, as his 25 sold through Tuesday have averaged \$497,050, with a median of \$450,000--three times his 2006 fee.

There's not a lot of mercy for first-year sires among the buyers, either. I expected Ghostzapper to be much further out in front of his contemporaries than he is. Through Tuesday he had 22 yearlings sell, for an average of \$310,227 and a \$272,500 median, which again doesn't leave a lot of room to maneuver from his \$200,000 stud fee in 2006. It did drop to \$150,000 after that first year; but, based on these results, breeders will no doubt be looking for it to drop further to justify breeding to him in 2009. At that point (through the end of Book 1), his two close commercial pursuers are both \$50,000 stallions, or were, in the case of Saint Liam (five sold, of 10 offered, averaging \$292,000), who died after siring just this one crop. Rock Hard Ten, also a \$50,000 stallion, had eight sell of nine offered, averaging \$289,375. To be fair, though, both will have a lot more to sell in the 'back books' than Ghostzapper will. Afleet Alex, who averaged \$299,000 in Book 1, ranked fourth through Tuesday, among first-year sires, with 13 sold (of 23 offered), for an average of \$212,959. However, he has something like 75 left to sell. Not far behind him were Eddington, who had five sell from five offered, for an average of \$199,400; and European-based Shamardal, who (including Deauville), has had eight sell of 12 offered for an average of \$196,940. All these figures are through the end of Book 1, through Tuesday, please remember.

Whatever happens in the rest of the sale, the profitability returns for Book 1 are going to make grim reading, and make it imperative that all six-figure stud fees must come under urgent review; with these kinds of returns, breeders simply won't be able to pay them. Hopefully, like last year, as prices drop (to a certain point), the picture will improve.





It peaked at \$372-million in 2006 (Sheikh Mohammed's \$60-million year), but was back down to \$347-million last year. That orange line says \$293-million. # THE LEGENDS OF TOWN MOOR By Tom Frany

As the world's oldest Classic, the creation of Anthony St. Leger bows to no other in terms of heritage. Preceding the Epsom Oaks by three years and the Epsom Derby by four, the Leger has stood firm since 1776 at Doncaster, which staged racing as early as the 16th century. While the annual centrepiece on the racecourse known as Town Moor has survived two World Wars and temporary moves to Newmarket, Thirsk, Manchester, York and Ayr, the Leger faced its sternest test in the greater emphasis on breeding for speed in recent times. Its distance of one mile, six furlongs and 132 yards has remain unchanged, despite various calls to cull and chop, and it sits proudly in its unmoving way at the culmination of the once sought-after Triple Crown.

It is 38 years since the last Triple Crown winner, when Vincent O'Brien saddled Nijinsky to complete that incredible trio of victories. That the great master of Ballydoyle was willing to run the legendary son of Northern Dancer despite a bout of ringworm which had affected his preparation, speaks volumes for how the race was perceived in that day. The three-race sweep is barely spoken of as a concept now, but it might be worth remembering that Nijinsky was himself ending a 35-year wait for another Triple Crown hero.

Since Nijinsky, only Nashwan has been in the position to attempt the feat, but he did not compete in the St Leger. Just last year, Jim Bolger was making noises about the Triple Crown for Teofilo (Ire) before that talented colt sustained his injury.

Despite its waning importance in that triumvirate of races, the Leger as a serious test is something to cherish in its own right. Many of the best middle-distance horses have graced this circuit, and it remains more than just an antiquated charm with an over-sized cap for the winning jockey's head. Reading the list of winners, it is hard to escape its mesmeric pull. Taking it from 1977, there is The Queen's filly Dunfermline (GB), who beat Alleged during that year's Silver Jubilee celebration; and Touching Wood's victory five years later, which provided the Maktoum family with their first English Classic.

Ballymacoll's flashy Sun Princess (GB), who prevailed in 1984, was followed by another brilliant female in when Sheikh Mohammed's Oh So Sharp augmented her 1000 Guineas and Oaks triumphs. There was also the dominating performance of Louis Freedman's Derby and King George winner Reference Point (GB) in 1987; Bill Gredley's User Friendly (GB), another Epsom heroine to beat up the boys; and the grey Silver Patriarch (Ire), who atoned for his narrow Epsom reversal to provide Pat Eddery with a golden parting moment from the saddle in 1997.

In the last 10 years, there have been memorable encounters to deny any doubters, such as the lung-bursting battle between Godolphin's ultimately successful and exhausted Mutafaweq and the triple Oaks heroine Ramruma in 1999; and the defeat of Quiff (GB) by that operation's Rule of Law in 2004. There have also been moments of sheer class, typified by the 2001 success of Milan (GB), who initiated a resurgence of Ballydoyle in the race's history and who was followed by Brian Boru (GB) and Scorpion (Ire).

The last two winners Sixties Icon (GB)--who won at York during the track's redevelopment phase--and Lucarno would stand comparison with many of the past victors.

Where the status of the St Leger sits nowadays is a matter of conjecture, but it looks likely to draw this year's Irish Derby and Oaks winners. It may be significant that the last hero of the former Curragh Classic to line up was Shergar (GB) in 1981. That giant of turf legend was only fourth here, and he remains the highest-profile reversal suffered by Sir Michael Stoute during his painful wait for a first renewal. His story of winless tries year upon year has almost become the stuff of folklore, and you can bet that the Leger sits pretty high on the agenda of the Freemason Lodge trainer. Five times second in the event, Sir Michael fields the trio of G3 Gordon S. winner Conduit (Ire) (Dalakhani {Ire}), G1 Epsom Derby fourth Doctor Fremantle (GB) (Sadler's Wells) and Warringah (GB) (Galileo {Ire}), as the quest continues...

Everything is normal with him, but he hasn't been out for three-and-a-half months. He doesn't do much in the morning, but has been working well and will be running in the Prix Niel." Ioritz Mendizabal is set to renew his partnership with Vision d'Etat, whose likely opponents include the Wertheimer brothers' G1 Grand Prix de Paris runner-up Prospect Wells (Fr) (Sadler's Wells) and Michael O'Flynn's G2 Great Voltigeur S. scorer Centennial (Ire) (Dalakhani {Ire}).

Mr. Caulfield (TDN, Tuesday, Sept. 9) should remember that not only was Unbridled's Song behind in training prior to the Derby, he also ran in a full egg bar shoe due to the quarter crack that had limited his training. Some would liken running in full eggbars to running in wellie boots. Had Unbridled's Song been in other hands he likely would not have started in the Derby. The distance certainly was not a problem.

I would also take issue with his opinion of distance limitations for the progeny of Unbridled's Song. While Eight Belles never officially won at a mile and a quarter, she certainly showed the distance was well within her ability. The history recited to support his claim does not consider the limited number of 1 1/4-mile races available--it would be interesting to see if the horses he mentions as being successful at 1 1/8 miles were ever even tried at 1 1/4 miles. Most of Unbridled's Songs show early brilliance and are campaigned accordingly. Why would one wait to make a 1 1/4-mile horse out of a horse showing the ability to compete at the highest level as a juvenile (and therefore at shorter distances)? The distance limitation Mr. Caulfield suggests is in my opinion more a reflection of today's racing than of blood.



# NTRA REPORT FROM CAPITOL HILL

#### SAVE ON YOUR TAXES WITH THESE TAX CODE REVISIONS

#### Conomic Stimulus Act

The Economic Stimulus Act includes two tax incentives that would allow a much bigger write-off for horses and other property <u>purchased and placed in service during 2008</u>. You must act this year.

- Increase in expensing allowance for horses, farm equipment and most other depreciable property to \$250,000 from \$128,000
- 50% bonus first-year depreciation for property placed in service in 2008

#### Farm Bill

Buyers and tax planners should note an important provision in the Farm Bill that benefits the equine industry <u>beginning in 2009</u>.

- New, uniform depreciation schedule for all young racehorses including yearlings
- After two-year-old year, 62.5% can now be depreciated compared to only 29.5% under previous, seven-year schedule

#### Sadler and Mullins Take Leave of CTT Board:

Southern California trainers John Sadler and Jeff Mullins have voluntarily stepped aside from the board of directors after horses under their care were found by the California Horse Racing Board to have tested positive for illegal substances, according to *Thoroughbred Times*. Sadler, who serves as board president, agreed to take a leave following CHRB allegations that 18 of his horses have tested positive for anabolic steroids since July 1. Also taking a leave of absence from the CTT board is Mullins, who, according to the CHRB, had one of his horses was found to have exceeded the allowable amount of carbon dioxide (TCO2) levels in an Aug. 8 race at Del Mar. Trainers Jack Carava and Clifford Sise Jr. will serve as interim directors. Board member Jim Cassidy replaces Sadler as president.



#### WALLACE GOES DOWN UNDER

Trainer Mark Wallace is to quit Britain and head to Australia next month, where he will take up a post at Warwick Farm in Sydney. The 35-year-old conditioner of the multiple group-winning sprinter Benbaun (Ire) (Stravinsky) cited the falling levels of prizemoney in Britain as the main issue influencing his decision. "If you have a good horse, you tend to look at it all through rose-tinted glasses, but prizemoney is a major issue here," Wallace said yesterday. "We are running for £1,500 here, whereas in Australia they wouldn't." Currently based at Sefton Lodge Stables in Newmarket, Wallace will be moving quickly to the country where he once spent a spell at Yarraman Park Stud. "I will give in my licence at the end of October or start of November and be out of my yard by the end of November," he added. "I will be down there for the Magic Millions in January, and between then and the next yearling sales will try and get hold of some older horses so I can have a few runners. It's a long way from home, but I'm from Ireland anyway and so haven't lived at home for the last 15 years, and I'm young enough to do it." Alongside the flagbearer Benbaun, who captured last year's G1 Prix de l'Abbaye de Longchamp, Wallace reflected on some other highlights. "In my first year of training, I had a Group 3 winner in Clifden (Ire)," he said. "I had other pretty good days in Italy, where I once won two listed races in a day with Kieren Fallon riding them, but Benbaun put me on the map."
